QUICK HITTERS

• Sophomore forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** has scored at least 15 points in each of his last three starts with 20 points at Northwestern (Jan. 22), 16 points against Maryland (Jan. 26), and 25 points at No. 10/10 Purdue (Jan. 31). The streak is tied for his career long, a feat he accomplished from Jan. 12-24, 2024, and from Nov. 16-26, 2024. The Gladstone, N.J., native has scored at least 20 points in four of his last eight Big Ten Conference road games dating back to the 2023-24 season.

• Fifth-year senior guard **Anthony Leal** has seen 20-plus minutes of run in six games for the Hoosiers. In those games, the Bloomington native has averaged 3.7 rebounds and 3.3 assists to go along with 1.0 steal per game.

• Former Hoosier **Jalen Hood-Schifino** was involved in a three-way trade that sent the 2023 Big Ten Freshman of the Year to the Utah Jazz on Saturday, Feb. 1. The deal also included Luka Doncic to the Los Angeles Lakers and Anthony Davis to the Dallas Mavericks.

NOTABLES

OPENING TIP

• Indiana University continues Big Ten Conference play in its 125th season of competition in men's basketball at No. 21/19 Wisconsin at 9 p.m. ET on Tuesday, Feb. 4, at the Kohl Center. The game will be streamed on Peacock with Noah Eagle (xp) and Robbie Hummel (analyst) on the call.

• The Badgers enter the game with a record of 17-5 (7-4 Big Ten) under 10th-year head coach Greg Gard. Wisconsin is led by 18.6 points and 4.8 rebounds per game from senior guard John Tonje. The Missouri transfer has shot 41.5% from behind the 3-point line and 92.9% from the free throw line. Sophomore guard John Blackwell has averaged 15.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per contest.

SERIES HISTORY

• The programs split the two-game series in 2024 as both teams secured wins on their respective home floors. Wisconsin claimed a 91-79 victory on Jan. 19, 2024. **Malik Reneau** (28 points) and **Mackenzie Mgbako** (17) combined for 45 points on 16-of-31 shooting. Indiana returned the favor with a 74-70 win on Feb. 27, 2024, behind 27 points, 11 rebounds, and five blocked shots from **Kel'el Ware**.

• Indiana opened the Kohl Center with a 69-59 win on Jan. 25, 1998, eight days after the building opened. **Andrae Patterson** led IU with 23 points, 12 rebounds, and two blocked shots in the victory. The Hoosiers have not secured a win in Madison since.

LAST TIME OUT

• Indiana took No. 10 Purdue down to the wire in an 81-76 loss at Mackey Arena on Friday, Jan. 31. Sophomore forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** scored a game-high 25 points on 10-of-17 shooting from the floor. The game marked his third 25-plus point game of the season.

• The Hoosier bench, led by fifth-year senior guard **Trey Gallo-way** (15 points, 5 assists) and senior forward **Luke Goode** (13 points) outscored the Boilermakers 28-14.

• Sixth-year senior center **Oumar Ballo** added 14 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the floor and eight rebounds.

BIG FELLA BALLO

• Sixth-year senior center **Oumar Ballo** has averaged 14.5 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 1.6 blocks per contest and has shot 65.5% (116-of-177) from the floor. He is one of six Division I men's basketball players (Johni Broome, Auburn; Danny Wolf, Michigan; Nelly Junior Joseph, New Mexico; Deni-jay Harris, Southern Miss; Yaxel Lendeborg) to average a double-double and 1.5 blocked shots per night, and the only player to post those numbers on 60.0% shooting or better.

• Ballo is one of seven active players to score 1,500 career points and grab 1,000 career rebounds. He joins Johni Broome (Auburn), Norchad Omier (Baylor), Ryan Kalkbreener (Creighton), Hunter Dickinson (Kansas), Christian Shumate (McNeese) and Nelly Junior Joseph (New Mexico) on the exclusive list. He recorded his 41st career double-double (14 points, 10 rebounds) against Maryland (Jan. 26). Ballo has posted six double-doubles across his last nine contests. During that stretch, he has averaged 17.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game.

• The 7-footer leads all Big Ten players and ranks 13th nationally in boards per game. Ballo has strung together 11 games with double-digit boards, including a season-high 18 against Miami (Ohio) on Dec. 6.

• Ballo scored a season-best 25 points on 11-of-13 shooting from the floor against No. 3/4 Gonzaga on day two of the Battle 4 Atlantis. He is the first IU player to finish the game shooting at least 80% from the floor on 10-or-more made field goals since **Kel'el Ware** vs. Wisconsin on Feb. 27, 2024 (91.7%, 11-12).

• He became the third IU player in the last 30 years (**Trayce Jackson-Davis** and **Jared Jeffries**) to record 10+ points, 15+ rebounds, and 5+ assists in a game after producing 14 points, 18 boards, and six assists against Miami (Ohio) on Dec. 6.

MACK ON THE ATTACK

• Sophomore forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** scored a career-high 31 points on 13-of-17 shooting from the floor and 4-of-5 shots from behind the arc in Indiana's victory over SIUE on Nov. 6 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall.

• The 31 points scored marked the most in a season debut for a Hoosier since 17-year NBA veteran **Eric Gordon** dropped 33 points in his debut against Chattanooga on Nov. 12, 2007.

• Mgbako has put together 38 double-figure scoring games in his two-year career with the Cream 'n Crimson. He has topped 20 points eight times, with six such games against Big Ten opponents.

• Over his last three starts, Mgbako has averaged a team-high 20.3 points per game on 58.1% (25-of-43) shooting from the floor and 40.0% (8-of-20) shooting from behind the arc.

LUKE PLAYING SOME GOODE BALL

• Senior forward **Luke Goode** has averaged 11.9 points and 3.1 rebounds per game while shooting 48.1% (39-of-81) from the floor, 49.1% (26-of-53) from the 3-point line, and 88.2% (15-of-17) from the free throw line over his last 10 game (8 starts).

• Since Dec. 29 (Goode's first appearance in the starting lineup) no B1G player has made more 3-pointers than Goode. He is tied for 12th (26 makes) among all major conference players over the last month.

• Goode scored a career-high 23 points at Ohio State (Jan. 17). He knocked down four triples against the Buckeyes, including the go-ahead 3-pointer with 1:07 to play in overtime.

• He has made at least one 3-point field goal in 18 of the last 19 games, including all eight games he started. The Fort Wayne native has made 127 3-pointers in 98 career collegiate games.

FOLLOWING THE GALLO-WAY

• Fifth-year senior guard **Trey Galloway** posted nine assists in 17 minutes off the bench in Indiana's 80-61 season-opening win over SIUE in Bloomington.

• In the last 25 seasons of major conference basketball, Gallo is the 10th player to have at least nine assists in 17 minutes or less. He is the first player to achieve the feat since Vanderbilt guard Carter Josephs on Feb. 22, 2014.

• The Culver Academies alum has handed out at least five helpers in 33 career games, including five-straight games.

• He has averaged 4.8 assists in his 10 appearances off the bench this season. He is atop the national leaderboard in assists per game in a reserve role.

• Galloway has made 22-of-62 shots (35.5%) from behind the 3-point line this season. He has made at least three triples in four games this season.

• He is one of four B1G players (Brock Harding, Iowa; Ja'Kobi Gillespie, Maryland; Jeremy Fears Jr., Michigan State) to average at least 4.0 assists while shooting 35.0% from the 3-point line while playing under 30.0 minutes per game.

RENEAU FOR TWO

• Junior forward **Malik Reneau** has averaged 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds per game across 17 contests. He has shot 55.0% (82-of-149) from the floor and 73.8% (45-of-61) from the free throw line in 22.6 minutes per game.

• The Miami, Fla., native missed five games (at Penn State, Jan. 5; vs. USC, Jan. 8; at Iowa, Jan. 11; vs. Illinois, Jan. 14; at Ohio State, Jan. 17) with a lower body injury. He returned to the lineup in a bench role at Northwestern (Jan. 22).

• Reneau has tallied 15-plus points 26 times in his career, including seven games this season, and topped the 20-point threshold nine times. IU holds a record of 18-8 in games Reneau scores at least 15 points throughout his career.

THE LEAL DEAL

• Fifth-year senior guard **Anthony Leal** was a team-best +39 in Indiana's 97-71 victory over Sam Houston on Dec. 3 at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. He added four points, four rebounds, four assists, and two steals in the win.

• The Bloomington South graduate has started the last four contests and has averaged 4.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 1.5 steals (steals+blocks) per game. He has been tasked with the toughest perimeter assignment each game.

• Leal, the 2020 Mr. Basketball, is a Kelley School of Business graduate is in the midst of earning his MBA from the school. He has launched MotionSports, a fully-integrated, single platform solution — all in a mobile-native, NIL-native experience.

GOING THE EXTRA MYLES

• Redshirt sophomore guard **Myles Rice** has averaged 11.5 points, 3.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.1 steals per game and has shot 43.6% (89-of-204) from the floor and 89.2% (58-of-65) from the free throw line this season.

• Rice is one of five B1G players (Kylan Boswell, Illinois; Brooks Barnhizer, Northwestern; Braden Smith, Purdue; Great Osobor, Washington) to produce at least 250 points, 65 rebounds, 65 assists, and 25 steals this season.

• The Washington State transfer was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma on Sept. 12, 2022. After undergoing chemotherapy for five hours a session twice a month for six months, Rice learned his cancer was in remission on June 1, 2023.

• Indiana dropped a 79-78 home contest against Maryland on Sunday, Jan. 26, at Simon Skjodt Assembly Hall. Indiana trailed 63-53 with 9:34 remaining in the game before mounting a furious comeback that fell just short.

• Sophomore forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** and redshirt sophomore guard **Myles Rice** each tallied 16 points on a combined 5-of-10 from the 3-point line.

NORTHWESTERN EVADES INDIANA IN EVANSTON

• Indiana suffered a road setback at Northwestern by a score of 79-70 on Wednesday, Jan. 22, at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Sophomore forward **Mackenzie Mgbako** paced the Hoosier attack with 20 points, five rebounds, and two steals. Senior forward **Luke Goode**, making his eighth-straight start, added 14 points on 4-of-5 shooting from 3-point range and four rebounds.

• Sixth-year senior center **Oumar Ballo** posted 15 points, seven rebounds, and a career-high seven assists, while redshirt sophomore guard **Myles Rice** chipped in 11 points, four rebounds, and two helpers.

The Indiana men’s basketball program will square off with the Kansas Jayhawks as part of the 2027 Hall of Fame Series in Las Vegas, the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Sunday. Arizona will play Duke as part of the doubleheader.

The game will be played on Friday, Nov. 12, 2027, at Allegiant Stadium, home of the Las Vegas Raiders. The state-of-the-art, multi-purpose stadium will play host to the 2028 NCAA Men’s Final Four later that season. Both games will be showcased on TNT Sports’ networks and platforms, with additional programming information to be announced at a later date.

“We are excited to play in such a prestigious event,” head coach Mike Woodson said. “I look forward to testing our ballclub that early in the season against a high-level opponent like Kansas. Our staff has always prioritized playing the best competition out there and getting this opportunity in Allegiant Stadium should be a lot of fun for both the program and the fan base.”

The two storied programs have met 16 times on the hardwood, and both teams have claimed eight victories. The Hoosiers topped the Jayhawks in each of the first six meetings, which included the 1940 and 1953 NCAA Championship bouts. IU (5 national titles) and KU (4) have combined to win nine national championships.

“I am excited to support the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame doubleheader to be played at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas in November 2027,” NCAA Senior Vice President of Men’s Basketball Dan Gavitt said. “Starting the college basketball season where it will end on the Road to the 2028 Final Four in Las Vegas is a rare opportunity to celebrate the game. Duke, Indiana, Kansas, and Arizona have combined to win 15 men’s basketball national championships. Congratulations to the Hall of Fame, the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, and the Las Vegas Raiders for arranging such an incredible tip-off to the 2027-28 college basketball season where a national champion will be crowned only 5 months later.”
