UCF will go with a pair of junior right-handed pitchers for the second straight week in Braden Smith (1-0, 0.00 ERA) Friday against Notre Dame and Joey Trombley (1-0, 1.50 ERA) Saturday versus Indiana. Sunday's starter for the Knights against LSU is to-be-announced. Both Smith and Trombley are 1-0 on the year after each recording wins against Siena last weekend.

## KNIGHT NOTES

### LAST TIME OUT

- The Knights will enter the top-tier tournament with a 3-1 record on the young season after falling in extra innings at No. 20 Miami on Tuesday. UCF held a 5-0 lead over the Hurricanes on Tuesday behind six no-hit innings from starter Matt Sausser. But back came Miami in the late innings with two runs in the eighth and three in the ninth to tie it up and force extras.
- The Black and Gold regained a 6-5 lead in the 10th on a sacrifice fly from senior DeAmez Ross. Miami then tied it in the last of the 10th on a solo homer from All-American Daniel Cuvet to send it to the 11th.
- After scoreless 11th and 12th frames that featured a number of stellar defensive plays from UCF, the Knights took a 7-6 lead in the top of the 13th on a clutch two-out go-ahead RBI single from Javier Crespo. The Hurricanes then picked up a leadoff hit in the last of the 13th and won it on the walk-off home run from Vance Sheahan.
- Despite the setback, Andrew Williamson paced UCF at the plate by going 3-for-6 with a double, a homer, a walk, two runs scored and three runs batted in. Ross was next with a 2-for-5 performance with two RBIs and a run scored, while Rogers too finished with a 2-for-5 outing with a double and two runs scored.
- In his first start of the season, the right-hander Sausser tossed 6.0 shutout innings in which he didn't allow a hit, struck out six and walked just one. The UCF starter faced the minimum in five of his dominant six innings in the contest but took the no-decision on the night.
- Prior to Tuesday's contest, the Knights opened the season with a dominant three-game sweep over Siena. The Black and Gold recorded a trio of run-rule victories over opening weekend and shut out the Saints in two of the three ballgames. In all, UCF allowed just one run on the weekend, as it outscored Siena 44-1 over the opening series. The senior Ross leads UCF on the season with a .471 batting average and eight hits. Catcher Zak Skinner is right behind him with a .462 average, two doubles, a triple, a home run and seven RBIs. Williamson and freshman Jordan Lodise are each batting an even .400 while Landon Moran leads the way in RBIs with eight. Sausser fronts the team from the mound with a 0.00 ERA, six strikeouts, and no hits over 6.0 innings pitched. Fellow starters Braden Smith and Camden Wicker are each 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA, while fellow weekend starter Joey Trombley is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA. Evan Jones and Michael Gillen front the bullpen with 0.00 ERAs over a combined 3.0 innings of work.

### A SEASON AGO

- The Knights posted a 29-26 overall record a season ago and finished 9-21 in Big 12 Conference play. UCF led the Big 12 in batting average, on-base percentage, ERA, and WHIP. The Black and Gold's impressive .319 batting average not only led the Big 12 but also ranked sixth in the nation. UCF's notable offensive stats did not stop there, as its .409 on-base percentage again topped the league and ranked 46th nationally.
- The Black and Gold's pitching staff also delivered a big performance last season by leading the conference with a 4.29 ERA and a 1.30 WHIP. Nationally, the Knights ranked 19th in ERA and 16th in WHIP, showcasing the program's all-around strength on the mound.

### RETURNING KNIGHTS

- The 2025 Knights return many of their key contributors on both sides of the ball this season. Among those returning is senior outfielder DeAmez Ross, who paced the Knights with a .359 batting average, totaling 84 hits, 35 RBIs, 15 doubles, and 53 runs scored. Ross earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors for his standout 2025 campaign. Also back for the Black and Gold is junior outfielder Andrew Williamson, who ranked second on the team with a .352 average. Williamson recorded 75 hits, 19 doubles, 13 home runs, 53 RBIs, and 58 runs scored, establishing himself as one of UCF's most productive bats last season. After his stellar sophomore campaign a season ago, too was named All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and recently earned both Preseason All-Big 12 and Preseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List honors. Rounding out UCF's returning offensive core is redshirt senior infielder Braden Calise, who hit .301 with 55 hits, six doubles, 35 runs, 29 RBIs, and a .739 OPS.
- On the mound, the Black and Gold return a strong core of starting pitchers in Grant Siegel (RHP, 3.88 ERA, 5-2, 44 SO), Matt Sausser (RHP, 4.58 ERA, 3-2, 31 SO), and Camden Wicker (RHP, 4.59 ERA, 31 SO). UCF also welcomes back key bullpen contributors Kevin Schoneboom (RHP, 3.67 ERA, 24 SO) and Kris Sosnowski (RHP, 5.22 ERA, 3-4, 24 SO). The Knights also return sophomore LHP Drew Bellis, sophomore RHP Mateo Gray, and redshirt freshman RHP Anthony Lariz, who have all shown promise early in their careers.
- In total, UCF returns three starting pitchers, three position player starters, and 12 returners in all from the 2025 squad.

### NEW KNIGHTS

- Of the 2026 newcomers, redshirt freshman transfer Austin Jacobs (INF from Clemson) is one of the top portal grabs for the Knights. Jacobs was ranked the No. 9 shortstop in the state of Florida (Perfect Game) and looks to be a key contributor to the Knights infield this season. Also joining UCF, from the SEC, is redshirt senior JD Rogers (OF from Vanderbilt). The Black and Gold also expect to see big things from redshirt seniors Zak Skinner (C from Lamar), Javier Crespo (INF from FIU) and Mason Wilson (C/OF from Rollins), as well as senior Landon Moran (1B/OF from Stetson) and redshirt sophomore James Hankerson Jr. (1B from Florida State).
- Joining the pitching staff, the Knights will look to redshirt senior RHP Roman Kimball (South Carolina), senior RHP Chandler Dorsey (LSU), and redshirt junior Evan Jones (Western Kentucky) to be key contributors on the mound in relief. Juniors Braden Smith (RHP, Maryville) and Joey Trombley (RHP, Sacred Heart) have also looked strong and will look to break into UCF's pitching rotation. Further strengthening their bullpen, the Knights also welcome junior Matthew Heyl (LHP, Stetson) and senior Michael Gillen (RHP, Clemson).
- True freshman Jordan Lodise (Brunswick, Ga.) looks to contribute in the Knights infield, while Sebastian Hurtado (Orlando, Fla.) shows promise behind the plate. Other freshmen to keep an eye on are outfielder Stephen Chucka (Oviedo, Fla.), outfielder Zachary Malvasio, right-handed pitcher Max Murray (Winter Springs, Fla.) and left-handed pitcher Alan Soler (Miami, Fla.).
- UCF was ranked the No. 12 recruiting class according to the 2025 Perfect Game College Recruit Rankings. The Knights welcome 30 newcomers to the squad for the 2026 season, with 13 freshmen and 17 transfers. Of the 13 freshmen, three of them are top 250 recruits.

# STORYLINES - KNIGHT NOTES

## ABOUT THE OPPOSITION

♦ The Fighting Irish will come to Jacksonville with a 2-1 record on the season after taking two of three in their opening series at Florida Atlantic last weekend. After dropping the opener, Notre Dame responded by winning games two and three by a combined 21-2. The Irish were picked to finish 12th out of 16 teams in the ACC this season after going 32-21 overall a season ago and 14-16 in league play to finish 11th in the conference.

♦ Mark Quatrani paces the Fighting Irish with a .556 batting average and five runs scored while Jayce Lee is batting .385 with a double and a homer. Bino Watters is next with a .375 clip and three runs batted in. Xavier Hirsch leads Notre Dame on the mound with 1-0 record, 2.25 ERA and six strikeouts over 4.0 innings of work.

♦ The Hoosiers will enter the tournament with a 1-3 record on the season after getting swept on opening weekend at No. 11 North Carolina and following that up with a 15-3 home victory over Bradley on Tuesday. IU was picked to finish fifth out of 17 teams in the Big Ten this season. Indiana went 32-24 overall and finished sixth in the conference a season ago with a 16-14 league record.

♦ Preseason Big Ten Player to Watch Hogan Denny leads IU offensively with a .364 average and two home runs. Cooper Malamazian is next with a .357 clip, while Jake Hanley fronts the team in RBIs with six and Will Moore leads in runs scored with six. Tony Neubeck fronts the pitching staff with a 0.00 ERA and having allowed just one hit over 4.0 innings. Reagan Rivera paces the team in strikeouts with five.

♦ The defending College World Series champion and top-ranked LSU Tigers will enter the Jax Classic with an unblemished 5-0 record. LSU first swept Milwaukee at home on opening weekend before picking up home midweek victories over Kent State and Nichols. The Tigers went 53-15 a season ago en route to winning the national championship. After taking third in the SEC last season, LSU was picked to win the league this season.

♦ Jake Brown leads the Tigers in nearly every offensive category on the young season with a .500 batting average, four home runs, three doubles, eight runs scored and 12 RBIs. K-State transfer Seth Dardar is next with a .417 clip and four extra-base hits, while Trent Caraway is batting .375 with a trio of extra-base knocks and 10 RBIs. Kansas transfer Cooper Moore leads the LSU rotation with a 1-0 record, 1.50 ERA and 11 strikeouts over 6.0 innings pitched.

## ANDREW WILLIAMSON TABBED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

♦ A season removed from earning All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors, junior outfielder Andrew Williamson has been named to the 2026 Preseason All-Big 12 Baseball Team. He enters the season off a stellar sophomore campaign in which he slashed .352/.662/.448 for the Black and Gold. The native of St. Petersburg, Florida led the Knights in nearly every offensive category a season ago in which he batted .352 with team-leading tallies of 13 home runs, 19 doubles, four triples, 58 runs scored and 53 runs batted in. Williamson also led the way in walks (34), on-base percentage (.448), slugging (.662), and finished second in stolen bases by going a perfect 13-for-13.

## DORSEY & JONES NCBWA STOPPER PRESEASON WATCH LIST

♦ Right-handed pitchers Chandler Dorsey and Evan Jones have been named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List. Both are new to the Knights this season, as Dorsey is a senior transfer from LSU while Jones is a redshirt junior from Western Kentucky.

♦ A season ago in Baton Rouge, Dorsey posted an ERA just over five over 5.0 innings of work. He struck out four and tossed scoreless outings in three of his five appearances to help the Tigers claim the 2025 National Championship. During his sophomore campaign at South Florida, he had a stellar season in which he went 2-1 with eight saves and a 3.60 ERA. Over 30.0 innings of work that season, the 6-4 right-hander struck out 41 batters and limited opposing hitters to a .180 average.

♦ During the 2025 season at WKU, Jones compiled a 1-1 record with four saves and a 3.18 ERA. He also limited opposing hitters to a .227 average in 11.1 innings of work. Over 14 appearances, he tossed 10 scoreless outings which included a stretch that spanned over seven consecutive games.

## TRIPS TO THE TOURNAMENT WITH WALLY

♦ In his first season at the helm of his alma mater in 2024, Rich Wallace led the Knights back to an NCAA Regional appearance. But that wasn't the first time Wallace has helped UCF reach the postseason. As a player, Wallace helped the team make the NCAA tournament three times (2000, '01, '02) and he also aided in the Knights' making the 2004 tournament as an assistant coach. Wallace is the first person in program history to make the NCAA Tournament as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

♦ Rich Wallace is no stranger to UCF after playing for the Knights from 2000-03, and coaching with the squad from 2004-08. He's the first UCF alum to lead the Black and Gold in an NCAA-sponsored men's sport since 1988. Wallace grew up in Orlando and attended Bishop Moore High School here in the City Beautiful.

♦ During his playing career, Wallace led the Knights in batting average (.380) and on base percentage (.529) during the 2000 season. The OBP represents the sixth highest single season mark in the Knights' history. He was also tabbed an honorable mention Freshman All-American that season. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.

♦ In all, Coach Wallace has advanced to the NCAA tournament eight times. He now has one appearance as a head coach (2024), four as an assistant coach and three as a player. He also helped Notre Dame to a College World Series run while in South Bend in 2022.

## SPACE GAMES

### WHAT IS UCF'S SPACE GAMES?

- On select home games this season, the UCF baseball team will take on the persona of the Citronaut. Made whole with canaveral blue and black colors, Citronaut logos, special-edition uniforms and space-themed in-stadium marketing and promotions, the baseball team fully embraces the name of the 'Nauts on select games.

- In 2014, UCF baseball debuted as the 'Nauts with their first-ever special-edition "Citronaut" jerseys. The white and black kits featured the Citronaut script logo and the throwback Citronaut logo on the hats and the sleeve.

- The 'Nauts will donn canaveral blue jerseys with black and white piping, complete with white numbers and the polaris star for a handful of games throughout the season.

### WHO ARE THE 'NAUTS?

- We are so glad you asked. The Citronaut was the first mascot of Florida Technological University (FTU), which later became the University of Central Florida (UCF). The mascot appeared on the first student handbook in 1968-1969. After one year, the students petitioned the student government to establish a new mascot. In 1970, students approved "Knights of the Pegasus" as the second official university mascot, which remains to this day. The space themed uniforms and constellation named streets around campus remember the times when FTU was founded to provide personnel to support NASA at the Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Air Force Station.



# KNIGHT NOTES - UCF BASEBALL HISTORY

## WILLIAMSON NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST

✦ In an award given to the top amateur baseball player in the nation, UCF junior outfielder Andrew Williamson was named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List. Jimenez was one of 55 players from both the college and high school ranks and five from the Big 12 Conference to make the cut. Williamson slashed .352/.662/.448 in 2025 with 13 HRs, 19 2Bs, 58 runs and 53 RBIs.

## TRIO OF KNIGHTS NAMED TO D1BASEBALL'S PRESEASON PLAYER LIST

✦ A trio of Knights were named to D1Baseball's Preseason Player Lists prior to the season in outfielders Andrew Williamson and DeAmez Ross, and catcher Zak Skinner. The junior OF Williamson led the group by checking in at No. 14 on D1Baseball's Top 150 Outfielders. The senior transfer Skinner was next by being ranked No. 47 on the Top 50 Catchers List, while the senior Ross was right behind him by coming in at No. 53 on the Outfielders List.

## OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

✦ As voted on by the players, UCF named four captains prior to the 2026 season in outfielders DeAmez Ross (Sr.) and Andrew Williamson (Jr.), as well as pitchers Kris Sosnowski (RSr., RHP) and Kevin Schoneboom (Sr., RHP). Of the group, Sosnowski is a repeat captain for the Knights, as he was one of six team captains in 2025. The other three will join him as captains for the Black and Gold for the first time. The four captains bring a wealth of knowledge to the team, as they combine for 12 seasons of prior collegiate experience. Sosnowski and Williamson were also key in helping the Knights to the program's last NCAA Regional appearance in 2024.

## SUNSHINE STATE SUCCESS

✦ Under head coach Rich Wallace, the Black and Gold have had success against in-state opponents. Under Wallace, UCF is 23-8 in games against teams from the state of Florida. Wallace's 2024 squad went 14-4, which included beating the then ranked No. 4 Florida in Gainesville, a series win over USF, and a win over Stetson in the Tallahassee Regional.  
 ✦ UCF then posted a 9-4 record against in-state opponents in 2025. Those wins include two victories to earn a series win over USF, a 13-3 win over No. 6 Florida, and a 14-4 victory over Miami. This marked the second year in a row that the Knights under head coach Rich Wallace have knocked off the Gators, as well as the sixth consecutive victory over the Gators. Two more of those wins came over Stetson, as UCF has shut out the Hatters twice on the season.

## NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

✦ The Knights have a total of 30 newcomers on the squad this season, which includes 17 transfers and 13 freshmen. Of the 17 transfers, seven of them have Power 4 experience, with two apiece coming from Clemson and South Carolina, and one each from Florida State, LSU, and Vanderbilt. Senior right-handed pitcher Chandler Dorsey helped lead LSU all the way to the National Championship last season, while senior RHP Michael Gillen and redshirt freshman infielder Austin Jacobs both made the NCAA Tournament last season for Clemson, while senior outfielder JD Rogers did for Vandy, and redshirt sophomore infielder James Hankerson Jr. for Florida State.

## THE LUCKY 13: UCF'S NEW ERA BEGINS

✦ Of the Knights 30 newcomers, 13 are incoming freshmen. Eleven hail from the state of Florida while one is from Georgia and another from Maryland. The 11 from the Sunshine State are Zach Beyra (RHP), Elijah Buffaloe (INF), Stephen Chucka (OF), Wyatt Dion (LHP), Sebastian Hurtado (C), Zachary Malvasio (OF), Brady Montrowl (LHP), Max Murray (RHP), Kiernan O'Neill (INF), Kaniel Rosado (LHP), and Alan Soler (LHP). Infielder Jordan Lodise comes to UCF from Georgia, while catcher Dallas Brooks is from Maryland. Big things are expected from the group, as Lodise is projected to be a starting infielder while Hurtado and a number of others are anticipated to be key contributors.

## #BUILTBYUCF

✦ Knights that move on to play in the professional ranks are said to be #BuiltByUCF. In the 2025 season, four former Knights, Dylan Moore (UTL, Mariners), Ben Lively (RHP, Guardians), Colton Gordon (RHP, Astros), and Alex Freeland (INF, Dodgers) were on Big League rosters during the 2025 MLB campaign. UCF had five players drafted a season ago in SS Antonio Jimenez (3rd Rd., Mets), C Edian Espinal (10th Rd, Tigers), RHP Alex Galvan (13th Round, D-Backs), C Dylan King (17th Rd., Reds) and RHP Angelo Smith (18th Rd., Angels).

## 13 NCAA REGIONAL APPEARANCES - 131 MLB DRAFT PICKS

✦ The 2026 season marks the 53rd year for the UCF baseball program. UCF's first year of competition on the baseball diamond came in 1973 as an NCAA Division II institution. After 12 years at the Div. II level, the Knights then moved to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1985 under head coach Jay Bergman.

✦ In its history, the Knights have won 12 conference titles with six regular season conference championships (SSC in 1979; ASUN in '00, '01, '02, '04; and AAC in '17) and six conference tournament championships (ASUN in 1993, '95, '96, '97, '01, '02).

✦ UCF has advanced to an NCAA Regional 13 times in the program's history at the NCAA Div. I level (1989, '93, '95, '96, '97, '00, '01, '02, '04, '11, '12, '17, '24). The Knights hold an 18-26 all-time record in NCAA Tournament play and will be looking to return to a Regional for the second straight year as well as advance to the program's first NCAA Super Regional under head coach Rich Wallace in 2025.

✦ All-time the Knights have had a total of 131 players selected in the MLB Draft. Over the years, UCF has had four first round selections with outfielder Chad Mottola marking the highest selection by being picked fifth overall in the 1992 draft, one spot ahead of Hall of Famer Derek Jeter. Of the 131 draftees, 14 have played in the big leagues in Chad Mottola (OF, drafted in 1992), Mike Maroth (LHP, drafted in 1998), Esix Snead (OF, drafted in 1998), Matt Fox (RHP, drafted in 2004), Clay Timpner (OF, drafted in 2004), Drew Butera (C, drafted in 2005), Chasen Bradford (RHP, drafted in 2011), Beau Taylor (C, drafted in 2011), Danny Winkler (RHP, drafted in 2011), Darnell Sweeney (INF, drafted in 2012), Ben Lively (RHP, drafted in 2013), Eric Skoglund (LHP, drafted in 2014), Dylan Moore (INF/OF, drafted in 2015), and Thad Ward (RHP, drafted in 2018). In 1998, UCF had its most draft selections with 10 that season. Mike Marroth (LHP) and Kevin Gordon (RHP) were both selected in the third round, while Matt Lubozynski (LHP) rounded out UCF's selections that year (42nd round). In 2025, UCF had five players drafted led by SS Antonio Jimenez being taken in the third round by Mets.

## 39 RICH WALLACE

Rich Wallace, an Orlando native and former UCF baseball player and Knight assistant coach, brings two decades of experience as a Division I baseball coach with him in his return to Orlando as UCF's seventh head baseball coach. The 2024 season marked Wallace's first season as UCF's head coach as well as the program's inaugural year of competition in the Big 12 Conference.

During his first season at the helm of his alma mater in 2024, Wallace led his Knights to a 37-21 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017—with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. He also led the Black and Gold to six conference series victories in the program's inaugural season of competition in the Big 12 Conference to finish eighth in the league with a 14-15 conference record.

With a possible postseason bid on the line, Wallace then led the Knights to a deep run at the 2024 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round. UCF then received an at-large selection as a No. 3 seed at the NCAA Tallahassee Regional and the Black and Gold went on to record wins over Alabama and Stetson to reach the finals of the regional before falling to the host and No. 8 Florida State Seminoles.

Wallace helped his 2024 squad enter the Top 25 national rankings for the first time since February of 2021, as the team spent two weeks in early April in the national rankings. The Knights were ranked as high as 16th by the NCBWA and 17th by DIBaseball. Wallace also guided the Knights to a 19-3 non-conference record during the regular season, which included an impressive 11-1 record in midweek action. The 2024 Knights also finished the season with a 14-4 record against in-state opponents as well as posted the nation's 31st-best RPI. His 2025 team again spent a week in the Top 25 by being ranked 25th by Perfect Game in mid-March.

By recording the NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024, Wallace became the first person in program history to have appeared in NCAA postseason play as a player (2000, 2001, 2002), an assistant coach (2004), and a head coach (2024).

In 2025, Wallace led the Black and Gold to a 29-26 record, going 9-21 in the Big 12. In his second season leading UCF, he has recorded back-to-back winning seasons. His Knights defeated No. 6 Florida and secured a series win against No. 15 TCU. Not only did the Knights defeat a trio of ranked foes, they also picked up seven wins against 2025 NCAA Tournament qualifiers.

Wallace's squad posted impressive stats in 2025 by leading the Big 12 Conference in batting average, on-base percentage, sacrifice bunts, double plays per game, ERA, and WHIP. The Black and Gold's impressive .319 batting average not only led the Big 12 but also ranked sixth in the nation. UCF's notable offensive stats did not stop there, as it posted an on-base percentage of .409 leading the conference once again and ranking 46th nationally. Also contributing to the Knights' productive offense, they led the Big 12 in sacrifice bunts, with 34, putting them in the 42nd spot in the nation.

The Black and Gold continued to impress defensively under Wallace's guidance, ranking sixth nationally and leading the Big 12 with 0.95 double plays per game. UCF's pitching staff also delivered a strong performance, leading the conference with a 4.29 ERA and a 1.30 WHIP. Nationally, the Knights ranked 19th in ERA and 16th in WHIP, showcasing the program's all-around strength on the mound.

The UCF head man has had a total of seven Knights drafted in the MLB Draft under his tutelage with a pair getting drafted in 2024 (RHP Naje Victor, Angels, 14th Rd.; RHP Chase Centala, Marlins, 20th Rd.) and five drafted in 2025 (SS Antonio Jimenez, Mets, 3rd Rd.; C Edian Espinal, Tigers, 10th Rd.; RHP Alex Galvan, Diamondbacks, 13th Rd.; C Dylan King, Reds, 17th Rd.; RHP Angelo Smith, Angels, 18th Rd.). He has also had a pair of free-agent signings in RHP Ben Vespi in 2024 (Orioles) and INF Kendrey Maduro (Angels) during his tenure.

Wallace spent the 2023 season as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida State. He previously coached at Notre Dame (2020-22), Jacksonville (2018-19), Creighton (2015-17), High Point (2009-14) and UCF (2004-08). Wallace helped teams at UCF in 2004, Jacksonville in 2018 and Notre Dame in 2021 and 2022 to NCAA Championship appearances.

A 2004 UCF graduate, Wallace becomes the first alumnus to be named head coach of an NCAA-sponsored men's sport at UCF since 1988. He played four seasons of baseball for the Knights from 2000-03, helping those teams reach the NCAA Championship in 2000, 2001 and 2002. As a freshman, he led UCF with a .380 batting average and .529 on-base percentage. He played a key role as UCF won the ASUN regular season in 2000-02 and the ASUN conference tournament in 2001 and 2002. Wallace helped the 2001 UCF squad win a school-record 51 games.

His combined NCAA Championship experience includes three times as a UCF player and four times as an assistant coach (two Super Regional appearances and one College World Series berth), along with one more as a head coach.

Wallace spent four seasons working with head coach Link Jarrett at Notre Dame (2020-22) and Florida State (2023). In South Bend, he served as recruiting coordinator and third-base coach while also working with Irish hitters and catchers. He oversaw defensive alignments, managed opposing pitcher video scouting reports, helped coordinate baserunning instruction and assisted with game management during his tenure in South Bend. His role in Tallahassee also featured the recruiting coordinator assignment.

In Wallace's three years at Notre Dame the Irish were 86-32 (.729), second-best winning percentage in the country over that span. Notre Dame's 44-21 (.677) three-year ACC record was the best in the league, and the Irish won the conference's regular-season title (their first ACC crown) by 4.5 games in 2021. Notre Dame finished 41-17 in 2022 (most wins for the Irish since 2006) and set a single-season home run record with 79.

Wallace helped guide the Irish to back-to-back NCAA Super Regionals (first time at Notre Dame) and the 2022 College World Series in the third trip to Omaha in program history. Throughout his career Wallace's teams have produced 55 Major League Baseball draft selections and coached more than 60 all-conference performers.

He spent the 2018-19 seasons back in his home state as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Jacksonville under head coach Chris Hayes. In 2018 Wallace and the Dolphins finished 40-21 and reached the NCAA Championship as a two seed, highest in program history. That season, the Dolphins led the ASUN in batting average, on-base percentage, runs scored and fielding percentage.

Wallace was the recruiting coordinator at Creighton (2015-17 under head coach Ed Servais) and High Point (2009-14 under head coach Craig Cozart). He was named the Big East Recruiter of the Year by DIBaseball in 2016 at Creighton.

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF (2004-08 under head coach Jay Bergman), coaching the catchers and outfielders while coordinating the camps. UCF won the ASUN regular-season title in 2004 and reached the NCAA Championship.

He remains in UCF's top 10 in single-season on-base percentage (.529 in 2000) and career hit by pitch (46). Wallace in 2000 was an honorable mention Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American and a third-team All-ASUN selection as designated hitter. In his four seasons with the Knights, UCF won a combined 166 games (51-14 in 2001, 43-19 in 2000, 41-22 in 2002), including a combined 67-17 mark in ASUN play in 2000-02.

After his playing career as a 6-1, 220-pound infielder with the Knights concluded, Wallace earned his degree in 2004 from UCF's College of Undergraduate Studies with a major in interdisciplinary studies and a minor in criminal justice. He graduated from Bishop Moore High School in Orlando.



### QUICK FACTS

#### THE ULTIMATE HOMECOMING

Wallace began his coaching career at UCF as assistant coach in 2004 following his four-year playing career as a Knight (2000-2003).

In June 2023, Wallace became the first-ever UCF graduate to be named head coach of the Knights baseball team. The Orlando native returned to UCF for the 2024 season in his first head coaching role.

#### FIRST ONE TO DO IT

By recording an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024, Wallace became the first person in program history to have appeared in NCAA postseason play as a player (2000, 2001, 2002), an assistant coach (2004), and a head coach (2024).

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

Including his playing days, Wallace has made a total of eight NCAA Tournament appearances during his playing and coaching career. He first made a trio of appearances as a player, followed by NCAA Regional berths in 2004 (UCF), 2018 (Jacksonville), 2021 and 2022 (Notre Dame) as an assistant and 2024 as a head coach.

#### HOMETOWN HERO

Wallace's outlook on recruiting means starting with Orlando and bringing hometown kids home to UCF.

## 0 NORBERTO LOPEZ

### ASSISTANT COACH / RECRUITING COORDINATOR

#### THIRD YEAR

In his second year at UCF in 2025, Lopez played a key role in guiding the Black and Gold to a 29-26 overall record for back-to-back winning seasons for the program.

Lopez's work with the Knights hitters was showcased in the 2025 season. The Knights posted impressive offensive stats leading the Big 12 Conference in batting average, on-base percentage, sacrifice bunts, double plays per game, ERA, and WHIP. The Black and Gold's impressive .319 batting average not only led the Big 12 but also ranked sixth in the nation. UCF's notable offensive stats did not stop there, they posted an on-base percentage of .409 leading the conference once again and ranking number 46 nationally.

As UCF's recruiting coordinator, Lopez helped the Knights check in at No. 12 on Perfect Game's 2025 Recruiting Class Ranking. Of the 13 freshmen the Black and Gold welcome to the squad, three of them are top 250 recruits. UCF's No. 12 spot is second in the Big 12 Conference and second in the state of Florida.

In Norberto Lopez's first season of coaching at UCF (2024), he helped lead the Knights to a 37-21 overall record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017 with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. Lopez also helped UCF win six Big 12 Conference series in the program's first year in the league to finish eighth with a 14-15 conference mark, as well as to a deep run at the 2024 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round.

Prior to UCF, Lopez began working with the Miami baseball program prior to the 2016 season, working with the Canes' hitters and catchers, and adding responsibilities as recruiting coordinator after the 2018 campaign. Miami made NCAA Championship appearances in five of his seasons in Coral Gables, including each of the last three years after an ACC regular-season crown and 2022 appearance in 2016. The Canes played host to NCAA regionals in both 2022 and 2023.

From Hialeah, Florida, Lopez played collegiately at Broward College (Davie, Fla.) and Nova Southeastern (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.). Drafted by the Los Angeles Angels in 1999, he spent three years in the organization. He served on the Texas-Pan American coaching staff from 2009-15 and was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2015 season. Lopez was an assistant coach for Florida Atlantic in 2007 and 2008.

Lopez spent two years at Broward CC from 2004-06 when he led the team to a third-place finish at the 2006 NJCAA World Series.

Lopez graduated from Nova Southeastern University with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1999. In 2006, he earned a master's in exceptional student education from Nova Southeastern.



## 22 DREW THOMAS

### PITCHING COACH

#### THIRD YEAR

As the Knights' pitching coach, Drew Thomas has made an immediate impact by helping the staff lower its team ERA by more than a run and half—from 5.80 in 2023 to 4.29 in 2025. The 4.29 ERA not only led the Big 12 Conference but also ranked 19th nationally. Thomas also guided the pitching staff to a 1.30 WHIP, the best mark in the Big 12 and the 16th best in the country, underscoring his ability to elevate the staff into one of the nation's top-performing units.

In his first season of coaching at UCF, Thomas helped lead the Knights to a 37-21 overall record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017 with a trip to the 2024 NCAA Tallahassee Regional. Thomas also helped UCF win six Big 12 Conference series in the program's first year in the league to finish eighth with a 14-15 conference mark, as well as to a deep run at the 2024 Big 12 Championship by going 2-1 and reaching the semifinal round.

The UCF pitching coach has helped see a total of seven Knights drafted in the MLB Draft over his first two seasons, which includes four pitchers with two drafted in 2024 (RHP Najer Victor, Angels, 14th Rd.; RHP Chase Centala, Marlins, 20th Rd.) and two drafted in 2025 (RHP Alex Galvan, Diamondbacks, 13th Rd.; RHP Angelo Smith, Angels, 18th Rd.). He has also helped see another pitcher signed as a free-agent in RHP Ben Vespi in 2024 (Orioles).

Thomas spent 16 years with Coastal Carolina—including a 2016 College World Series title—then worked as pitching coach for Brewers affiliate Wisconsin Timber Rattlers of the Midwest League in 2023 after a season in the same role with the franchise's Carolina Mudcats team in the Carolina League in 2022.


In addition to the 2016 CWS crown, Thomas' Coastal Carolina coaching resume includes 11 NCAA Championship regional appearances, three super regionals, nine conference regular-season championships and nine conference championship tournament titles.

His pitching staffs finished among the NCAA top 40 in ERA eight times, including three top-10 finishes (10th in 2009, eighth in 2010, third in 2012). Coastal ranked among the NCAA top 15 in fewest hits allowed per nine innings four times. His teams led the conference in ERA six times, strikeouts seven times and saves five times.

His work at Coastal helped produce 13 MLB draft picks. Thomas came to Coastal Carolina from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., where he had worked since 2003.

Thomas pitched in the San Diego Padres organization in 1998-99 and played for the Canton Crocodiles of the Frontier League in 1999-2000. He was the 2000 Frontier League Relieff Pitcher of the Year, a Frontier League All-Star and a second-team Baseball America All-Independent team member.

Thomas graduated from Illinois State University, where he earned a degree in history.



## 12 SHANE GIERKE

### ASSISTANT COACH

#### FIRST YEAR (3B COACH)

Shane Gierke joined the UCF baseball program in July 2025 as an assistant coach.

Gierke brings a wealth of coaching experience to UCF, as he has 20-plus years of collegiate coaching experience under his belt. He comes to Orlando after spending the past four seasons (2022-25) at neighboring foe Stetson, where he most recently served as the Hatters' associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. Prior to Stetson, Gierke spent six seasons (2016-21) as the lead assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Troy. He got his start at West Florida, where he worked 12 years as the assistant head coach at his alma mater (2004-15).

During his time in DeLand, he helped the Hatters to back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances as Stetson competed in the NCAA Tournament in each of the past two seasons (2024 and 2025). He also helped the Hatters surpass the 40-win plateau twice, as the team went 41-22 in both 2024 and 2025. Gierke helped a total of four Hatters get drafted in the 2025 MLB Draft, which included fourth-round selection Lorenzo Meola (Giants).

Gierke led the offense to new heights during his time in DeLand, as the team eclipsed every major category offensively in 2024 except for home runs. Having excelled in his role as an assistant coach, his efforts were recognized as he was named one of the top 100 assistant coaches by D1Baseball ahead of the 2024 campaign. His 2022 recruiting class was also recognized by Perfect Game, as his class was ranked in the Top 40 nationally by the organization.

During his time at Troy, Gierke quickly established his recruiting ability by signing talented players from both the high school and junior college ranks. His 2018 signing class was ranked in the top 50 nationally and the second-best in the conference.

Gierke recruited a freshman All-American in four consecutive seasons. Additionally, Gierke coached back-to-back All-American catchers. During his six seasons at Troy, the Trojans produced nine All-Americans and 17 All-Sun Belt Conference players. He recruited and coached 10 players who signed with a professional organization.

For 12 years, Gierke served as the assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator for the University of West Florida and oversaw catcher development and hitting instruction. Gierke's recruiting efforts at UWF were highlighted by several major league prospects and five NCAA Regional appearances. He recruited all 11 Argonauts that have been drafted by Major League teams.

In 2011, the Argonauts won the NCAA Division II national championship and set school records in runs (449), hits (638) and walks (267). As a team, UWF batted .326 and averaged 7.4 runs per game.

Gierke played two seasons for the Argonauts from 2002-03. Prior to his time at UWF, he was a first team all-state and all-conference selection in 2001 at Lake Sumner. Gierke was also an inaugural state championship team at Dr. Phillips High School in Orlando while playing for his father, Chip.

Gierke is a native of Apopka, Florida, and is the son of Carolyn and Chip Gierke. His father was a legendary high school baseball and football coach in the Central Florida area for over 40 years.


