### DEFENDING SWAC CHAMPIONS TO FACE TENNESSEE STATE IN MEMPHIS

- The Jackson State University Tigers, the defending 2021 Southwestern Athletic Conference Champions, return to action in the Southern Heritage Classic against Tennessee State.
- This will be the 55th meeting between the teams, with Tennessee State holding a 30-22-2 advantage. Jackson State has won the last two matchups in the series, winning 49-44 in 2019 and 38-16 last season.
- Last year, QB Shedeur Sanders passed for 362 yards and three touchdowns, with his 30 completions setting a Southern Heritage Classic record.

### LAST WEEK

- Jackson State scored on offense, defense, and special teams early, often and late in a 59-3 win over Florida A&M in the Orange Blossom Classic.
- QB Shedeur Sanders was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week, the Stats Perform FedEx Ground FCS National Offensive Player of the Week, and the BOXTOROW National Player Of The Week while also earning College Football Performance Awards' honorable mention acclaim as National Performer of the Week. Sanders completed his first 17 pass attempts in throwing more touchdown passes than interceptions. Sanders threw a career-high five touchdown passes with only four incompletions in passing for 323 yards in completing 29 of 33 attempts. It was the 10th career multi-TD passing game for Sanders, and the fourth career 300-yard passing game of his 14-game career.
- The JSU offense gained 471 yards total offense (332 passing / 139 rushing), gaining 27 first downs.
- Defense and special teams also got in on the action, combining for three touchdowns. Ke'Vric Wiggins returned a third-quarter interception 35 yards for a touchdown. In the fourth quarter, LB Aubrey Miller returned a fumble 19 yards for a touchdown. Later in the period, Herman Smith III scooped up a blocked punt and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown.
- The Tigers limited FAMU to 155 total yards (34 rushing / 121 passing) and 13 first downs.

### NOTABLES VS. FLORIDA A&M

- JSU's 471 yards total offense is the fourth highest total of the Coach Prime era. JSU gained 528 vs. Texas Southern (11/6/21) 496 vs. Alabama A&M (10/9/21), and 473 at Grambling (3/6/21).
- The 27 first downs is the most since gaining 27 vs. Grambling (9/20/14).
- QB Sanders' 5 TD passes is one shy of the school record of 6 TDs, accomplished by Mark Washington vs. Alcorn in 1999 and Robert Kent vs. Alabama State in 2001.
- WR Kevin Coleman caught four passes for 41 yards and returned four punts for 39 yards in his first career game. A total of 12 different receivers caught a pass for JSU.
- The 155 yards allowed by the Tigers is the second fewest of the Coach Prime era and the third time in the Sanders era that the defense allowed fewer than 200 yards. JSU yielded 104 yards to Edward Waters on 2/21/21, and 157 to Alabama St. on 10/16/21.
- The 13 first downs allowed is tied for the fourth fewest allowed in the Coach Prime era. JSU yielded only eight first downs twice (vs. Edward Waters, vs. Alabama St.), and 10 first downs to Delta St. (9/25/21). JSU allowed 13 first downs to Bethune-Cookman last season (10/23/21).
- JSU made four sacks against FAMU, with Cam'ron Silmon-Craig, Jurriente Davis, Nyles Gaddy, and Antonio Doyle each getting home on Rattler QBs.
- CB Travis Hunter had two pass breakups in his first collegiate game.
- Anthony Petty's blocked punt was the first by JSU since Keith Lopez' blocked a punt vs. Tennessee St. (9/11/21).
- LB Aubrey Miller's fumble return for touchdown was the first since Al Young's 26 yard fumble return for touchdown at Miss. Valley St. (10/30/21).

### EYE ON TENNESSEE STATE

- Tennessee State opened the season with a 36-29 loss at Eastern Washington. QB Draylen Ellis gained 339 yards (257 passing / 82 rushing) and accounted for three touchdowns. RB Devon Starling rushed 25 times for 208 yards and one touchdown.
- The Tigers 547 yards total offense (290 rushing / 257 passing), and allowed 474 yards to EWU (126 rushing / 348 passing).
- Former NFL running back Eddie George is in his second season as head coach. He led TSU to 5-6 last season, 3-3 in OVC play.

## 2021-22 JACKSON STATE ATHLETICS YEAR IN REVIEW

**ACADEMIC SUCCESS:** Jackson State University student-athletes combined for a 3.2 grade point average during the 2021-22 season, with 55 students earning degrees. A total of 12 teams attained at least a 3.0 GPA.

In the latest Academic Progress Rate report, all 16 JSU teams achieved above the NCAA benchmark of 930, highlighted by the JSU volleyball and bowling teams each earning a perfect score of 1000.

**8 CHAMPIONSHIPS WON; SECOND IN COMMISSIONER'S CUP:** Jackson State athletics teams combined to win eight championships during the athletics season, with five teams earning postseason play.

- Men's cross country won its second SWAC Championship for the second time in the last four years. They competed in the NCAA Regional meet in Huntsville, Ala.

- Women's volleyball won its second straight SWAC Regular Season title. Finishing as the runners-up in the SWAC Tournament, JSU earned a berth in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship tournament.

- Football won the SWAC Eastern Division title for the first time since 2013, and won the SWAC Championship for the first time since 2007. JSU earned its first-ever berth in the Cricket Celebration Bowl.

- Women's basketball won its third consecutive SWAC Regular Season championship and its second consecutive SWAC Tournament title. JSU became the first women's team to go 18-0 in league play and nearly pulled off an historic NCAA Tournament win.

- Women's tennis won its second straight SWAC Regular Season title and won the SWAC Championship for the first time since 2005. JSU went on to compete in the NCAA Tournament.

JSU finished second in the Commissioner's Cup Standings as the best overall sports program in the SWAC, the program's best since 2011.

**WHITE, WILLIAMS-HOLLIDAY NCAA WOMEN OF THE YEAR NOMINEES;**

**WILLIAMS-HOLLIDAY NAMED SWAC WOMAN OF THE YEAR:** Jackson State University standouts Hannah White of track and field and Ameshya Williams-Holliday of women's basketball are nominees for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. Established in 1991, the award recognizes female student-athletes who have exhausted their eligibility and distinguished themselves in their community, in athletics and in academics throughout their college careers. Williams-Holliday was named as the SWAC Woman of the Year.

White (right) earned a 3.5 GPA in the classroom and was a dominant field performer for JSU Track, as White was the 2022 SWAC Indoor and Outdoor Champion in the shot put, won the SWAC Outdoor Championship in the discus, finished second in SWAC Indoors in the weight throw, and finished fourth in SWAC Outdoors in the hammer throw. White was named the Outstanding Field Performer at the SWAC Outdoor Championship and was an NCAA Outdoor Regional qualifier in both the shot put and discus.



Williams-Holliday (second column, top right) also earned a 3.5 GPA in the classroom while leading Jackson State to its third straight SWAC Regular Season crown and second straight SWAC Tournament title.

**WNBA DRAFT PICK, NFL DRAFT PICK, AND DEAF OLYMPIAN:** Jackson State University had a student-athlete selected in both the WNBA and NFL Drafts, and also had a student-athlete to compete in the Deaflympics in 2022.

- Ameshya Williams-Holliday was selected in the WNBA Draft by the Indiana Fever. A third-round pick / #25 overall, Williams-Holliday became the first HBCU player selected in the WNBA since 2002, and the second Southwestern Athletic Conference player and only the sixth player from an HBCU selected in the history of the league. Williams-Holliday was the second highest drafted HBCU player in league history.



Williams-Holliday was a three-time first-team All-SWAC selection (2020, 2021, 2022), a three-time league Defensive Player of the Year (2020, 2021, 2022), and in 2022 became the first SWAC player since 2019 to win both SWAC Player Of The Year and Defensive Player Of The Year honors in the same season.

- DE James Houston IV was selected in the sixth round of the National Football League draft by the Detroit Lions. Houston was the 217th pick in the draft and is the 100th NFL draft pick in Jackson State history.

In his one season at Jackson State, Houston earned first-team All-SWAC, STATS FCS All-America and FCS Coaches All-America honors after recording 70 tackles (52 solo) and ranking second in the FCS in both sacks (16.5), tackles for loss (24.5) and leading the nation in forced fumbles (seven). Houston also had two fumble recoveries, one interception, eight quarterback hurries, and scored two defensive touchdowns.



- Alexis Roberts and Team USA won the gold medal in women's basketball in the Deaflympics in Brazil in May. Roberts and the American team went undefeated in six contests, winning the gold medal with a 91-77 win over Italy.

Roberts, who just completed her freshman season at JSU, was born with a percentage of hearing in both ears, but her hearing faded. Roberts played in 17 games for Jackson State in limited action, and was an all-state high school basketball player at Mississippi School for the Deaf, scoring more than 1,000 points and tallying more than 500 rebounds.





## 2021-22 JACKSON STATE ATHLETICS YEAR IN REVIEW



### JSU FOOTBALL FEATURED ON JULY COVER OF SPORTS ILLUSTRATED

The Jackson State University football program again made national headlines during the summer as the Tigers were featured on the July cover of Sports Illustrated.

The digital version of the cover debuted June 9 before a national television audience on Good Morning America and at si.com before hitting newsstands and mailboxes one week later starting June 16.

The cover featured Coach Prime with sophomore QB Shedeur Sanders and freshman CB/WR Travis Hunter. The story profiles Coach Prime's revival of the JSU football program to championship prominence while enhancing and elevating the profile of HBCU football nationwide.

It is the third time an HBCU has been featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated, with all three featuring the Southwestern Athletic Conference. Iconic Grambling State University head football coach Eddie Robinson was on the cover in 1985, and legendary Alcorn State University quarterback Steve McNair graced the cover in 1994.



### ROBINSON NAMED NACDA ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR

Jackson State University Vice President / Director of Athletics Ashley Robinson was honored for his leadership as he received the prestigious 2021-2022 Cushman & Wakefield Athletic Director of the Year Award by the National Association of College Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

The elite recognition spans seven collegiate divisions (NCAA FBS, FCS, Division I-AAA, II, III, NAIA/Other Four-Year Institutions and Junior College/Community Colleges).

Completing his fourth year as athletic director at Jackson State, Robinson has continued to improve JSU athletics in the classroom and in competition. JSU student-athletes combined to post a 3.2 grade-point average for the 2021-22 academic year, with 12 teams earning 3.0 GPAs with 55 graduates.

Among the on-field highlights during the past year, Jackson State won its first Southwestern Athletic Conference football championship since 2007. Women's basketball became the first SWAC team in more than a decade to win three consecutive league regular season championships while also winning back-to-back conference tournament titles. JSU men's cross country won the SWAC Championship, women's volleyball won its second consecutive SWAC Regular Season championship, and women's tennis won its second straight SWAC regular season title and first conference championship since 2005.





## HEAD COACH DEION SANDERS

Deion Sanders has always been a game-changer. In his tenure as Head Football Coach of Jackson State University, Sanders has again changed the game for the Tiger Football, the Department of Athletics, the University as a whole, the Southwestern Athletic Conference, College Football, and the Nation.

An unprecedented calendar year of 2021 showed the power of the influence of Sanders and the brand of Jackson State University coming together as one, seemingly in perfect alignment.

As the Southwestern Athletic Conference played a spring 2021 football season due to the coronavirus, the number 21 Sanders donned on his way to a Pro Football Hall of Fame career became immersed at Jackson State.

Sanders, named as the 21st head coach in the proud history of JSU football on September 21, 2020, led the Tigers in his first game as head coach on February 21, 2021. A 53-0 win began the Coach Prime era that was a touch point of the elevation of JSU football and the University into becoming one of the most impactful and recognizable brands nationwide.

With viewership for the first two games surpassing more than 200,000 online views on ESPN3, the power of Coach Prime and JSU transformed the network and led to the final four contested games of the spring season televised on linear television on ESPN or ESPN2 as Jackson State posted a 4-3 record.

In Fall 2021, Sanders led Jackson State back to championship glory with a school-record 11-win season and the first SWAC football championship since 2007. JSU went undefeated in conference play (8-0) and won nine consecutive games to complete the regular season en route to the SWAC Championship and the program's first-ever berth in the Celebration Bowl.

JSU set an FCS record for attendance in Fall 2021, averaging more than 42,000 fans per home game.

Coach Prime was named SWAC Coach of the Year, the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year, BOXTOTOW National Coach of the Year, and Black College Hall of Fame Coach of the Year. Freshman QB Shedeur Sanders shone brightly in the national spotlight as his father, as he was named as the FCS Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year after passing for 3,231 yards and 30 TDs with only eight interceptions.

A fierce advocate for additional exposure and a level playing field for all HBCU's, Sanders has continued to push for opportunities to highlight talent in the SWAC and across the culture. In March 2022, Sanders held a Pro Day featuring athletes from four other schools in the state of Mississippi to provide a platform in front of 22 National Football League teams and the Canadian Football League.

In April 2022, Jackson State became the first HBCU to have its spring football game televised live nationally on ESPN2.



The influence of Coach Prime has directly impacted Jackson State football, as several of the nation's best players have made their way into the program. University of Florida transfer James Houston IV was a dominant player for JSU in 2021, earning All-SWAC and All-America accolades as he ranked second in the nation in both sacks (16.5) and tackles for loss (24.5). In Spring 2022, Houston became the 100th NFL Draft selection in the illustrious history of the Jackson State University football program, selected in the sixth round by the Detroit Lions.

Houston was one of seven Tigers to earn a professional football opportunity in the NFL, CFL, or USFL. CB C.J. Holmes and TE Kyland Richey (New Orleans Saints), WR Keith Corbin III (Buffalo Bills), CB Al Young (New York Giants), WR Warren Newman (Montreal Alouettes), and DE Antwan Owens (Philadelphia Stars) all signed pro contracts.

Further shining a light on JSU and HBCUs, the XFL held one of six showcase camps on the Jackson State campus in July 2022.

In December 2021, wide receiver / cornerback Travis Hunter, the top high school prospect in the nation, signed a national letter of intent with Jackson State football and enrolled at JSU in spring 2022. The JSU Football impact and influence continued into Summer 2022 as Coach Prime, Shedeur, and Travis were featured on the cover of the July issue of Sports Illustrated.

In partnership with Barstool Sports, "Coach Prime," a behind-the-scenes documentary highlighting the student-athletes, coaches, and staff of JSU Football and Jackson State University, averaged nearly 400,000 viewers per show in 12 episodes over two seasons.

An eight-time Pro Bowler, nine-time All Pro, and two-time Super Bowl champion, Sanders played 14 NFL seasons for the Atlanta Falcons, San Francisco 49ers, Dallas Cowboys, Washington Redskins, and

Baltimore Ravens. Sanders, who also played nine seasons of Major League Baseball with the New York Yankees, Atlanta Braves, San Francisco Giants, and Cincinnati Reds, is the only athlete to play in both a Super Bowl and a World Series.

Among his accolades, Sanders set an NFL record with 19 return touchdowns in his career and was the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 1994.

A two-time football All-American at Florida State whom also played baseball and ran track, Sanders was a first-round draft choice (5th overall) of the Atlanta Falcons in 1989. In 2020, in celebration of the 100th season of the National Football League, Sanders was named to the NFL's All-Time Team.

In 2011, Sanders was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. In that same year, Sanders was also inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame.

Sanders began his broadcasting career with CBS, co-hosting the NFL Today pregame show from 2001-2003. He spent the next 14 years as an analyst for the NFL Network, headlining popular shows like GameDay Prime and Thursday Night Football.

Prior to leading Jackson State, Sanders had been coaching for over a decade. Sanders was the offensive coordinator at Trinity Christian School in Cedar Hill, Texas, leading the Tigers to three straight Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) titles and a 42-3 record. Sanders has also been part of the coaching team for the annual Under Armour All-America Game for the past decade. In February 2022, Sanders was named as an HBCU legacy coach for the NFL Pro Bowl.

Success – both on the field and in the classroom – has always been at the forefront for Sanders. In 2007, upon retirement from the NFL, Sanders founded TRUTH, a youth organization serving over 1,100 kids throughout Dallas, Texas and Memphis, Tennessee, utilizing sports and education as a platform for success and leadership.

Following through on a long-standing goal, in 2020 Sanders graduated from Talladega College with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in Organizational Management.

He is the proud father of five children: sons Deion Jr., Shilo, and Shedeur, and daughters Deiondra and Shelomi. Jackson State is a family affair for Coach Prime, as sons Shilo (safety) and Shedeur are both starters on the JSU football team, while Deion Jr. oversees the social media engagement. His youngest daughter Shelomi is an incoming freshman on the JSU women's basketball team.

Deion Sanders continues to be represented by Constance Schwartz-Morini at SMAC Entertainment and Tabetha Plummer of Plummer Law Group. Jordan Bazant of WME was instrumental in the development of this partnership.

### 2022 - THE SEASON

- SWAC Preseason Offensive Player Of The Year QB Sanders Highlights Eight On All-SWAC Team** QB Shedeur Sanders, the 2022 SWAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, was one of five JSU players to earn 2022 SWAC Preseason All-SWAC first-team accolades (OL Tony Gray, LB Aubrey Miller Jr., S Shilo Sanders, RS Isaiah Bolden). Last season, QB Sanders was named SWAC Freshman Of The Year, second-team All-SWAC, and the Stats Perform FCS Jerry Rice Freshman of the Year after tying a school record with 272 completions and set a school record with 65.9 percent completion percentage in passing for 3,231 yards and 30 touchdowns in leading JSU to a school-record 11 wins.
- Gray earned second-team All-SWAC honors in 2021, helping JSU rank fourth in scoring at 27.5 yards per game. The offense had a pair of 200-yard rushing games (247 at Alabama A&M; 223 vs. Texas Southern) and gained a season-high 528 yards against Texas Southern, including 305 yards through the air.
- Miller Jr. earned first-team All-SWAC honors after leading the league with 109 tackles (53 solo) with 11.5 TFL (7th/SWAC), 6.5 sacks (t-4th/SWAC), three passes defended, one forced fumble, and one fumble recovery. Miller posted 7+ tackles in a game nine times, including three 10+-tackle games vs. Tennessee St. (10 tackles / 8 assisted with 2.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks), at Louisiana-Monroe (16 tackles / 9 assisted with 2.0 TFL), and vs. Delta St. (career-high 19 tackles / 13 assisted with 1.0 TFL and one PBU). Miller earned SWAC Defensive Player of the Week honors vs. Florida A&M after recording nine tackles (seven solo), including 1.0 TFL, one sack, and one pass breakup.
- S Sanders was a second-team All-SWAC selection after tying for second in the league with four picks. He made 39 tackles (28 solo) with 1.5 TFL and had INTs against Bethune-Cookman, Southern, Alcorn, and South Carolina St.
- Bolden was a first-team All-SWAC selection who led the nation (both FBS and FCS) in kickoff return average at a school-record 36.9 yards per attempt, tied for the FCS lead with two KOR touchdowns, and averaged 10.1 yards on seven punt returns. Bolden returned KORs for TDs vs. Bethune-Cookman (94 yds) and Prairie View A&M in SWAC Championship (91 yds).
- WR Malachi Wideman, DT Devonta Davis, and S Cam'ron Silmon-Craig earned 2022 second-team preseason All-SWAC honors. Wideman tied for the SWAC lead in touchdown receptions with 12 while catching 34 passes for 540 yards.
- Davis was disruptive in the middle, recording 24 tackles, 9.5 TFL, 3.0 sacks, one forced fumble, and one quarterback hurry.
- Silmon-Craig ranked fifth on team with 48 tackles (34 solo) with 2.5 sacks and 4.5 TFL. He also was second on team with three interceptions while registering five pass breakups, one forced fumble, and one fumble recovery.

### BARTOLONE, BREWSTER, SIMS JOIN TIGERS' COACHING STAFF

- Brett Bartolone is the Tigers' new offensive coordinator, Tim Brewster is the tight ends coach, and Maurice Sims is the program's new Director of Strength and Conditioning.
- Bartolone (pronounced bar-to-lone-ee) brings the Air Raid offense to JSU. He played in the system in 2012 at Washington State under Head Coach Mike Leach (now at Mississippi State), as Bartolone led the team in receptions as true freshman in 2012. Bartolone has coached at Nevada (2020-21), Carleton College (2018-19), St. Lawrence University (2017), The Flash Football Club (2017 France) and Whittier College (2016) after starting his coaching career at WSU under Leach (2013-15).
- Brewster brings 30+ years of experience in the high school, collegiate and professional ranks. Brewster joins the staff from the University of Florida (2020-21) serving as tight ends coach, where he helped Kyle Pitts become the winner of the John Mackey Award as the nation's best tight end. After beginning his career as a graduate assistant at Purdue, Brewster has been a head coach at Lafayette (Ind.) Central Catholic HS (1987-88) while also serving as an assistant coach at North Carolina (1989-97) and Texas (1998-01). Brewster moved to the NFL ranks as an assistant with San Diego (2002-05) and Denver (2005-07) before returning to the college as head coach at Minnesota (2007-10). He has also been an assistant coach at Mississippi State (2012-13), Florida State (2013-17), Texas A&M (2018) and a second stint at North Carolina (2019) before Florida. Brewster was a two-time All-Big 10 selection at tight end at Illinois.
- Sims comes to Jackson State after two seasons at reigning College Football National Champion Georgia as associate director of strength and conditioning. Sims has also been an assistant at North Carolina (2019), Army (2017-19), Indiana (2014-15), and North Carolina A&T (2012-14). Sims was an all-conference defensive back at Concord University prior to transferring to Tennessee-Chattanooga.

**2021 JSU OFFENSIVE NOTES** Jackson State was seventh in the SWAC in total offense, averaging 337.6 yards per game. The Tigers ranked 12th in the SWAC in rushing offense, averaging 89.1 yards per game. JSU ranked second in the SWAC in passing offense, averaging 248.5 yards per game. J-State ranked fourth in the SWAC in scoring, averaging 27.5 points per game.

Jackson State ranked seventh in the SWAC in first downs, gaining 18.3 per game. The Tigers ranked sixth in third down conversions at 38.1 percent (64/168). JSU ranked 12th in fourth-down conversions at 21.4 percent (3 of 14). J-State was sixth in the SWAC in red-zone scoring percentage (71.4%; 30 of 42) with 27 TDs (3rd in SWAC) and three FGs.

- **All In The Video:** Santee Marshall was second on the team last season in carries (186), yards (449) and touchdowns (three). His top game in Fall 2021 was a 12-carry, 122-yard, career-high two TD game at Alabama A&M. Marshall, who was on the football video crew at the start of the Spring 2021 season, earned his way onto the roster with a career-high 19-carry, career-high 126-yard, 1-TD game vs. Alabama A&M in April 2021.
- **Wideman, Rucker Highlight Returning Receiving Corp:** Malachi Wideman was a touchdown machine for the JSU offense last season. He tied for the conference lead and tied for 8th in the FCS in touchdown receptions with 12, including back-to-back 2-TD games vs. Texas Southern and Southern. Wideman's scoring receptions of 13 and 50 yards in the fourth quarter at SU helped JSU win the SWAC East Title. WR Trevonte Rucker averaged nearly 20 yards per reception in with 26 catches for 515 yards and two touchdowns (19.8 ypc).

**2021 JSU DEFENSIVE NOTES** Jackson State was 1st in the SWAC (2nd/FCS) in total defense, allowing 257.4 yards per game. The Tigers ranked 2nd in the SWAC (10th/FCS) in rushing defense, yielding 100.3 yards per game. JSU led the SWAC (3rd/FCS) in passing defense, allowing 157.1 yards per game. J-State led the SWAC (4th/FCS) in scoring defense, allowing 14.8 points per game.

Jackson State ranked second in the SWAC in fewest first downs allowed at 15.5 per game. The Tigers were first in the SWAC (2nd/FCS) in third down conversions allowed at 26.7 percent (54 of 202). JSU ranked sixth in the SWAC in fourth down conversions allowed at 46.4 percent (13 of 28). J-State was eighth in red-zone scoring percentage allowed (85.2%; 23 of 27), but allowed the fewest TDs (12), tied for first in most fourth-down stops (four), and ranked second in field goals forced (11).

- **Defense Ranked In Top 11 in 13 FCS Categories:** In addition to the rankings above, JSU led the nation in total sacks (55), sacks per game (4.23), tackles for loss per game (8.8), and pass efficiency defense (95.9), ranked second in total tackles for loss (114), t-3rd in fumble recoveries (13), t-6th in takeaways (26), and t-11th in defensive touchdowns (3).
- **Sacks, TFL From Anyone At Anytime:** A total of 15 different players had at least 1/2 sacks, with 11 making at least 1.5 sacks. Additionally, 21 different players at least 0.5 TFL, with 14 making at least 2.0 in 2021.
- **Ragin, Davis Lead D-Line:** Justin Ragin (5.0 sacks, 6.0 TFL) proved to be efficient and effective, racking up key stops in only six games last season. Devonta Davis (3.0 sacks, 9.5 TFL) also tallied 24 tackles (14 solo) in 2021.
- **Who's Your Gaddy?:** LB Nyles Gaddy was second on the team in quarterback hits (five) last season while also tallying 34 tackles, 4.0 sacks, 5.0 TFL, one interception, and two pass breakups.
- **Silmon-Craig, Huggins Return In Secondary:** Cam'Ron Silmon-Craig and John Huggins return to a secondary unit that tied for the SWAC lead with 13 interceptions. Silmon-Craig was second on the team with three INTs along with five pass breakups, and is the second-leading returning tackler with 48 stops, 2.5 sacks and 4.5 TFL. Huggins is the third leading returning tackler with 43 stops, 3.0 TFL, and six pass breakups.

**2021 JSU SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES** Jackson State ranked 2nd in the SWAC (5th/FCS) in punt returns, averaging 14.2 yards per return. The Tigers led the SWAC (14th/FCS) in kickoff returns, averaging 24.3 yards per return. JSU was 10th in the SWAC in net punting, averaging 32.1 yards per attempt. J-State allowed 6.6 yards per punt return and 21.0 yards per kickoff return.

- **Be Sound In The Kicking Game:** JSU converted 46 of 49 PATs last season, with returner Glenn Misiak (28-29) leading the way.
- **Return Of The Mac:** P Lane McGregor averaged just under 35 yards on 32 punts, with nine downed inside the 20 with 13 fair catches.
