TWO-TIME DEFENDING SWAC CHAMPIONS TO FACE SOUTHERN IN NON-CONFERENCE MATCHUP

- The two-time defending Southwestern Athletic Conference Champion Jackson State Tigers return to action this weekend in a matchup against SWAC rival Southern. The game does not count toward the league standings.
- Saturday's game is a rematch of the 2022 SWAC Championship game, won by Jackson State 43-24, one of two wins last season by JSU over SU, both in #THEEVet. Jackson State shutout Southern 35-0 in the regular season meeting.
- This is the 70th matchup on the gridiron between these two fierce SWAC rivals, with Southern leading the series 37-32. Jackson State has won the last three matchups in the series, including a 21-17 win in Baton Rouge on Nov. 13, 2021 that clinched the SWAC East Title for the Tigers.

LAST WEEK'S RECAP

- Both teams are coming off of losses away from home. Jackson State lost to Florida A&M 28-10 in the Denny's Orange Blossom Classic in Miami Gardens, Fla. Zy McDonald came off the bench to complete 10-of-14 passes for 149 yards and one touchdown, a 66-yard scoring pass to Rico Powers. Powers had four receptions for 119 yards and the TD, while Irv Mulligan rushed for 77 yards on 16 carries. Southern lost at Alabama State, 14-10.

TIGERS STILL ON DOMINANT RUN

- Despite last week's loss to Florida A&M, Jackson State football has been the dominant program in the SWAC over the past two+ seasons. Sunday's loss ended a 17-game SWAC winning streak and a 20-game conference win streak over league opponents. The Tigers are 24-4 since Fall 2021 with back-to-back SWAC Championships and consecutive Celebration Bowl appearances.

TAYLOR CONTINUES HISTORIC TREND IN WINNING FIRST GAME AS HEAD COACH

- First-year head coach T.C. Taylor became the third straight coach and eighth in the last 10 JSU head football coaches since 1976 to win his first game as head coach.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU

- Graduate transfer QB Jason Brown leads the SWAC and is third in the FCS in passing yards with 438. His 356-yard, 3-TD effort in the win vs. South Carolina State earned him BOXTOROW HBCU National Player of the Week honors. Late week, Brown completed 10 of 19 passes for 82 yards against Florida A&M. On the season, Brown has completed 36 of 50 passes (72.0 percent) with 3 TDs and 0 INTs.

BIG IRV

- RB Irv Mulligan leads the SWAC in rushing with 187 yards on 29 carries (6.4 avg) with one touchdown. His 46-yard TD run on his first carry of the season against South Carolina State gave the Tigers the lead for good as Mulligan finished the game with 109 yards on 14 carries in the win. In last week's game vs. Florida A&M, Mulligan rushed 16 times for 77 yards.

POWERS UP

- WR Rico Powers scored the Tigers' lone touchdown against Florida A&M, catching a 66-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter as he finished the game with four receptions for 119 yards against the Rattlers. Powers has emerged as the big-play threat in the passing attack, as he caught four passes for 95 yards against South Carolina State. Powers leads the SWAC in receiving yards (214) and is second in yards per catch (26.8) on only eight receptions.

PEP WITH POP

- LB Isaac Peppers has emerged as a the top tackler for the Tigers' defense. After recording six tackles and JSU's first sack of the season and a tackle for loss against South Carolina State, Peppers led JSU with nine tackles, including one TFL against Florida A&M. Peppers has 15 tackles, including 3.0 TFL, and sack this season.

BLOCK PARTY

- CB Jaheem Hazel has made an immediate impact on the JSU defense and special teams units. Hazel had three pass breakups in game one against South Carolina State. In last week's game against Florida A&M, Hazel blocked a pair of field goals, a 46-yard attempt in the second quarter, and a 39-yard attempt in the fourth quarter.

2022-23 JACKSON STATE ATHLETICS YEAR IN REVIEW

It was another banner year for Jackson State University athletics, as championships in men's cross country, soccer, football, and women's basketball, highlighted by individual accomplishments, accentuated the last 12 months for Tiger Athletics.

JSU won the C.D. Henry Award as the best men's athletics program in the Southwestern Athletic Conference for the 2022-23 season. It is the first time JSU Athletics has won the award since the 2010-11 season, as the Tigers become the first conference team to win the award with only seven sports, one less than the eight men's sports the SWAC sponsors.

For the second straight year, JSU Athletics finished second in the Commissioner's Cup standings for the James Frank Award as the best all-around athletics program in the conference. The Jackson State women's programs combined for a fourth-place finish for the Sadie Magee / Barbara Jacket Award which recognizes the top women's program in the SWAC.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The JSU men won the league championship in cross country for the second straight year and third time in five years. Football won both the SWAC Eastern Division championship and SWAC Championship for the second straight year. Men's indoor track and men's tennis each finished second in the conference, while men's outdoor track and men's basketball finished third.

- Women's soccer won the regular season title for the first time since 2011, and the SWAC Tournament Championship for the first time since 2013. Women's basketball won the regular season title for the fourth straight year, and advanced to the SWAC Tournament semifinals for the fifth consecutive year. Women's tennis finished second, and softball finished tied for third in its division.

- Jackson State football player CB Isaiah Bolden (below) was drafted in the seventh round of the 2023 National Football League Draft by the New England Patriots. Bolden, the 245th overall selection, is the 101st NFL Draft pick in Jackson State football history. It is the second consecutive year a JSU football player has been selected in the NFL Draft (James Houston IV in 2021 by the Detroit Lions).

In 2022, Bolden made 44 tackles (30 solo), with 2.5 tackles for loss, one fumble recovery, and seven pass breakups while averaging 26.0 yards on kickoff returns.

Bolden was named to All-Southwestern Athletic Conference teams by the SWAC (second team CB) and Phil Steele (fourth team kick returner), and was selected to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

In 2021, Bolden Led the nation (both FBS and FCS) in kickoff return average at 36.9 per attempt and tied for FCS lead with two KOR touchdowns, and averaged 10.1 yards on seven punt returns.



- Vice President / Director of Athletics Ashley Robinson was named Athletic Director of the Year by the Black Student-Athlete Summit, becoming the first HBCU Athletic Director to be named for the award.

ACADEMICS

In the most recent NCAA Report, Jackson State Athletics posted a Graduation Success Rate of 90, the highest in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and tied for the highest of all schools in the state of Mississippi.

JSU student-athletes combined for a 3.06-grade point average, with more than 150 students attaining a 3.0 GPA, with 41 producing a 4.0 GPA or higher. A total of 66 student-athletes and student-athletics staff earned degrees.

A total of six programs posted cumulative team GPAs of 3.0 or higher during the 2022-23 academic year: volleyball (3.570), men's tennis (3.543), soccer (3.533), softball (3.329), women's tennis (3.204), and women's basketball (3.087).

CHAMPIONSHIPS

- **Men's Cross Country:** Under Head Coach Mark Thorne, the program won its second consecutive SWAC title. A total of four Tigers earned All-SWAC honors, and Thorne was named SWAC Coach of the Year for the second straight year.

- **Women's Soccer:** The Lady Tigers of Head Coach Dr. Ted Flogaites won the SWAC Regular Season title for the first time since 2011, and the SWAC Tournament Championship for the first time since 2013. A total of seven players earned league honors, and Coach Flogaites was named SWAC Coach of the Year.

- **Football:** Jackson State posted the first 12-0 season in program history in winning the SWAC East Title and SWAC Championship for the second straight year to earn its second consecutive berth in the Celebration Bowl. JSU went undefeated in conference play for the second straight year, with 13 players earning SWAC accolades as Coach Prime named Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

- **Women's Basketball:** Head Coach Tomekia Reed led JSU to its fourth consecutive SWAC Regular Season Championship, becoming the first SWAC team since 1997-2000 to win four straight regular season crowns. A total of four student-athletes earned All-SWAC honors as Coach Reed was named SWAC Coach of the Year for the second straight year and third time in the last four years while guiding JSU to its third straight national tournament appearance.



NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

- **12 Football Games Shown On ESPN Platforms:** Nearly every Jackson State football game in 2022 was televised or video streamed on ABC, ESPN2, ESPNU, ESPN3, or ESPN+. Every football radio broadcast was also available on SiriusXM Radio.

- **60 Minutes, Good Morning America On Campus:** A pair of iconic shows made their way to the JSU Campus.

In mid-October, Coach Prime and JSU football were spotlighted on 60 Minutes. Only five days later, Good Morning America broadcast live from campus on Homecoming Friday.

- **College Gameday:** The eyes of the college football world were fixated on Jackson only one week later as ESPN's College Gameday broadcast live from The Vet. It was only the fourth time that the show originated from an HBCU football game, and the first at an HBCU home venue since 2008.

- **Basketball Teams On HBCUGo, ESPU, ESPN+:** The Jackson State women's and men's basketball teams were featured on four nationally televised doubleheaders on HBCUGo, while both teams had nationally televised games on ESPNU and ESPN+.

- **Softball On ESPNU:** For the second straight year, the Jackson State softball team hosted a live nationally televised game on ESPNU.

2023 JSU OFFENSIVE NOTES Jackson State is fourth in the SWAC in total offense, averaging 398.5 yards per game. The Tigers rank sixth in the SWAC in rushing offense, averaging 105.0 yards per game. JSU is second in the SWAC (10th in FCS) in passing offense, averaging 293.5 yards per game. J-State is fifth in the SWAC in scoring, averaging 23.5 points per game.

Jackson State is second in the SWAC in first downs, gaining 20.5 per game, and third in the FCS in first downs gained (41). The Tigers rank 11th in third down conversions at 25.0 percent (6/24). JSU is second in fourth-down conversions at 80.0 percent (4/5). J-State is 12th in the SWAC in red-zone scoring percentage (57.1%; 4 of 7) with 4 FGs. JSU is 12th in the SWAC in sacks allowed (six).

- **Stevens, Powers Earn SWAC Preseason Honors:** TE D.J. Stevens was named first-team Preseason All-SWAC by the league and Phil Steele, named a BOXTOROW Preseason All-American, and to the Black College Player of the Year Watch List. Stevens caught 37 passes for 376 yards and four touchdowns in earning 2022 second-team all-conference accolades by the SWAC and Phil Steele. Stevens caught at least one pass in every game, including 12 games with multiple receptions and six games with at least three receptions.
- WR Rico Powers was named third-team Preseason All-SWAC by Phil Steele after catching 23 passes for 219 yards and three touchdowns.

2023 JSU DEFENSIVE NOTES Jackson State is third in the SWAC in total defense, allowing 279.0 yards per game. The Tigers rank fifth in the SWAC in rushing defense, yielding 172.0 yards per game. JSU leads the SWAC (14th in FCS) in passing defense, allowing 107.0 yards per game. J-State is fourth in the SWAC in scoring defense, allowing 17.5 points per game.

Jackson State is third in the SWAC in fewest first downs allowed at 16.0 per game. The Tigers are seventh in the SWAC in third down conversions allowed at 44.4 percent (12/27). JSU ranks T-1st in the SWAC in fourth-down conversions allowed at 0.0 percent (0/2). J-State is 10th in red-zone scoring percentage allowed (66.7%; 4 of 6), allowing four touchdowns with one fourth-down stop, and one field goal attempt. JSU is tied for fifth in the SWAC in sacks (two).

- **Guthrie Earns Preseason Honors:** S Esaias Guthrie was named a third-team Preseason All-SWAC selection by Phil Steele, and was named to the inaugural Aeneas Williams Award Preseason Watch list as the top defensive back in HBCU football. The 2021 first-team All-MEAC selection and HERO Sports Freshman All-American from Delaware St. led the league with four interceptions along with 32 tackles (27 solo).

2023 JSU SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES Jackson State ranks fourth in the SWAC in punt returns, averaging 5.0 yards per return. The Tigers rank third in the SWAC in kickoff returns, averaging 19.0 yards per return. JSU is sixth in the SWAC in net punting, averaging 34.1 yards per attempt.

- **Big Leg:** Graduate transfer P Matt Noll leads the league in punting average (47.7), punts downed inside the 20 (four), and 50+ yard kicks (three), tying for the conference long with a 56-yard effort. Noll averaged 49.3 yards on six punts vs. FAMU, with three 50+ yard punts (56, 51, 51) and three downed inside the 20.
- **Fresh Legs:** Freshman WR Isaiah Spencer is third in the SWAC in kickoff returns, averaging 34.0 yards per return. Spencer had returns of 37 and 31 yards vs. Florida A&M.



JACKSON STATE FOOTBALL HEAD COACH T.C. TAYLOR

One of the greatest Jackson State Football Tigers to ever don the Blue and White has ascended to the position of Head Coach at his alma mater.

T.C. Taylor was named the 22nd head coach in JSU Football history on December 13, 2022. He officially took the reins of the program following the conclusion of the Celebration Bowl.

The former JSU quarterback and wide receiver has been a part of the Jackson State football staff since 2019, coaching tight ends and wide receivers, and has played a key role in an historic run over the past two seasons of Tiger football.

JSU has posted a 23-3 record over the past two seasons, winning back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference championships and posting consecutive undefeated conference seasons.

As an assistant coach at JSU, Taylor has helped develop some of the best receivers in the SWAC. During the abbreviated Spring 2021 season, he tutored WR Daylen Baldwin, who led the SWAC in receiving yards (540) and touchdowns (seven). During the Fall 2021 season, Malachi Wideman tied for the conference lead with 12 touchdown receptions, while Keith Corbin ranked second in both receptions (69) and yards (921) and tied for seventh in touchdowns.

In 2022, Dallas Daniels ranks second in the SWAC in receptions (60), third in receiving yards (666), and fourth in touchdowns (six). Shane Hooks ranks third in the SWAC in receptions (59) and third in both receiving yards (705) and receiving touchdowns (10). Prior to the 2022 season, Taylor was selected for an NFL coaching fellowship with the Tennessee Titans.

A native of McComb, Miss., Taylor played quarterback and wide receiver at Jackson State from 1998-2001, starting off as a signal caller for two-and-a-half seasons before switching to wide receiver. In just 19 games as a receiver, he amassed 188 catches for 1,793 yards.

As a senior, Taylor set the JSU single-season receptions mark with 84 catches for 1,234 yards and 11 TDs, earning NCAA Division I-AA Third-Team All-America honors from The Sports Network and First-Team Black College All-America recognition from Sheridan Broadcasting Network. He was also the runner-up for the 2001 Conerly Trophy, presented to Mississippi's top college football player, behind Eli Manning.

Prior to returning to JSU as assistant coach in 2019, Taylor coached at North Carolina Central



from 2014-18, where he coached quarterbacks and served as offensive coordinator.

At NCCU, Taylor helped guide the Eagles to three MEAC championships (2014, 2015, 2016), and in 2016 went unbeaten in conference play and qualified for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

In 2016 and under Taylor's guidance, NCCU set a record for total offense in a single season (4,614). Also, in 2014, Taylor's unit set a program record for passes completed in a season (227).

From 2014 to 2018, Taylor coached 28 All-MEAC offensive players and five All-Americans. In 2016 and under Taylor's tutoring, Malcolm Bell was a finalist for the 2016 Black College Football Player of the Year. Bell was also a three-time All-MEAC quarterback (2014, 2015, 2016) and set the program record for total offense (7,844 yards) and career completion percentage (56.6 percent) and was second in passing yards (6,340).

Taylor spent the prior two seasons (2012-13) at Texas Southern University as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator.

From 2005-11, he coached at Coahoma Community College in Clarksdale, Miss., starting as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach and spending the final six years as offensive coordinator. His offenses ranked among the top five in Mississippi junior colleges in total yards for four straight seasons from 2007-10.

Taylor signed as a rookie free agent with the New England Patriots in 2002, played wide receiver for the NFL Europe World Bowl XI champion Frankfurt Galaxy in 2003, and participated in the 2003 NFL preseason with the Detroit Lions before a nagging injury ended his playing career.

Taylor graduated from Jackson State with a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation in 2005. He is married to Dawn, and they have two sons, Tre and Tylan.

- All JSU football games in 2023 will be televised on an ABC/ESPN platform, as the remaining nine games are scheduled for ESPN+.

In the last two seasons, Jackson State football has set FCS marks for attendance. In 2021, the Tigers averaged 42,293 fans at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. Topping that mark last year, JSU averaged 43,563 at #THEEVet.

High attendance wasn't limited to home games. In 2022, JSU Football set stadium attendance records at Alabama St. (31,334), and in the Celebration Bowl (49,670), with a sellout crowd at Texas Southern (21,092).

Already in 2023, Tiger Nation helped set an attendance record for the MEAC-SWAC Challenge Game in Atlanta, with 24,238 fans (third-highest ever).

Sean "Diddy" Combs, one of the most successful entrepreneurs and cultural icons of all-time, presented a check to Jackson State Football during the Cricket MEAC-SWAC Challenge Kickoff in Atlanta.

"As someone who went to Howard University and understands the invaluable experience of attending historically Black colleges and universities, it's important that we all do our part to protect and preserve their legacy," said Sean "Diddy" Combs. "This contribution to Jackson State isn't just about making a financial donation, it's about giving back to a part of our culture that has changed countless lives and assuring HBCU's receive the support they deserve."

"Investing in our students' higher education experience is the key to transforming their lives, and this is why the generous philanthropy of Sean Combs is so important," Dr. Anthony said. "These funds will significantly benefit our student-athletes and encourage them to strive for excellence in all walks of life. We could not be more appreciative of his giving spirit."

"This contribution by one of the world's greatest and most influential entertainers and businessmen is another historic moment in the legendary history of Jackson State University," said Robinson. "Beyond the financial investment, it's what it represents that is paramount - the belief in the value of our football student-athletes both on and off the field, which provides an elite pathway to current and future successes."

Sean "Diddy" Combs, the epitome of a mogul, began his remarkable journey as the Director of A&R at Uptown Records, where he played a crucial role in propelling the careers of iconic artists like Mary J. Blige and Jodeci. Later, he founded Bad Boy Records, a groundbreaking label that not only nurtured talent but also launched the successes of renowned artists such as The Notorious B.I.G., Faith Evans, 112, Mase, Total, Jonelle Monet, French Montana, MGK among others and became sought-after producer of Mariah Carey, Method Man, Boyz II Men, Lil' Kim, and more. In 1997, Combs embarked on his own solo music career with the release of "Can't Nobody Hold Me Down," followed by a Grammy Award-winning debut album that achieved platinum status seven times over.
