NICE NIGHT FOR JACOBIAN MORGAN

Junior Jacobian Morgan turned in a nice night for the Tigers in the opener against ULM. He is ranked in the top 10 in the nation in completion percentage and completions after just one game. He finished the night completing 82.1 of his passes in the loss.

OFFENSE RETURNS WEAPONS

Jackson State dressed several new players against ULM in the season opener, playing 19 new players including Day Day Bright who started at corner. He finished the night with four tackles including a tackle for loss.

NOLL BOOMS THE BALL AT ULM

Matt Noll lived up to expectations in the season opener after all of the preseason accolades. He finished the night averaging 50.5 yards per punt after four punts including a long of 57 yards. He finished with one punt inside the 20 and two 50-plus yard punts.

SERIES HISTORY

Jackson State and Lane have met twice in school history with the last coming in 1972. Both games have been played in Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium with the only other meeting taking place in 1970 with Jackson State winning both. The Tigers have combined to defeat Lane 93-14, including a 72-0 victory in 1972.

TIGERS vs. TENNESSEE

The Tigers have played 56 games against teams from the state of Tennessee since 1956. They have faced four different teams over that span and have a 25-29-2 record. They have played games against Lane (2-0), Middle Tennessee (0-2), Tennessee A&T (3-2), and Tennessee State (20-25-2).

ON THIS DATE IN HISTORY

Jackson State has played five times since 1956 on this date (September 7). The Tigers are 2-3 all-time on this date including a pair of wins at home - both over Alabama State. The Tigers lost to Morgan State 10-6 (1974 in Philadelphia), defeated Alabama State 28-14 (1985 home), lost to North Carolina A&T 42-36 (2002 in Greensboro), defeated Alabama State 30-23 (2013 home), and lost to South Alabama 37-14 (2018 in Mobile).

TIGERS NAB THREE FROM EASTERN MICHIGAN AHEAD OF SEASON

Jackson State hit the transfer portal after the 2023 season and landed three teammates from Eastern Michigan, an FBS team who played in a bowl game last season. All three are skill position players who will add to the depth of the Tigers including quarterback Cam'Ron McCoy – a two-sport athlete – who passed for 73 yards and rushed for another 73 in the bowl game against South Alabama. He was joined in the portal by running back Bryson Moss and defensive back Cameron James who played in 13 games with 45 tackles last season.

SPEAKING OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN

The trio was not the only additions to the roster from the state of Michigan this summer with the Tigers adding former Western Michigan defensive lineman Joshua Nobles.

He played in 23 games the last two seasons including 12 last season when he made 13 tackles.

TIGERS STAY BUSY IN THE MAC

Not only did Jackson State add four players from a pair of Michigan schools, but they also added defensive back Micah Cherry from Toledo to an already deep defensive backfield. They also added Jameel Gardner Jr. from Kent State to bolster a deep receiving corps. He hauled in 24 receptions for 298 yards and a touchdown last year.

FORMER SOUTHERN MISS PLAYERS LAND AT JACKSON STATE

Tyquan Henderson and Richard Mays Jr. will team up again this year, after being teammates at Southern Miss - a Sun Belt Conference school. Both receivers will figure into the mix for the Tigers with recording nine catches last season for the Golden Eagles, while Mays did not see action at Southern Miss before transferring to Co-Lin Community College.

RETURNING "HOME" THIS WEEK

Offensive lineman Evan Henry and defensive back Ke'Vric Wiggins made a return trip to Monroe for the season opener, a place where both started their collegiate careers. Wiggins played in 13 total games during his time at ULM, making 15 tackles during his sophomore season. Meanwhile, Henry was an honorable mention All-Sun Belt pick on the offensive line after playing in 10 games in 2020 when he led the offensive line in total plays (565) and pancakes (16).

MCCRAY NAMED TO HBCU+ PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Fabian McCray was one of 20 players named to the inaugural Urban Edge Network HBCU+ FCS National Player of the Year Award Preseason Watch List, released by the organization on Thursday morning.

McCray hauled in 41 receptions for 584 yards and four touchdowns including a season-long 47-yard reception. He recorded a season-high eight receptions for 79 yards against Alabama State, and another seven against UAPB.

McCray recorded a season-high 109 yards against Alcorn State with a pair of touchdowns. He was named Preseason All-SWAC earlier this month before being named a Preseason BOXTOROW All-American.

The award will honor the nation's best HBCU player – regardless of position – from 21 programs spread across the FCS, including in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

A national panel of voters will select the winner after the regular season. The recipient will be announced on Dec. 9 and invited to the Stats Perform FCS National Awards Banquet on Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas.

MCDANIEL NAMED TO A TRIO OF WATCH LISTS THIS PRESEASON

Transfer defensive back Robert McDaniel found his way on to a pair of Watch Lists entering the season after returning to the Tigers. He was on the team previously before landing at Alcorn State and returning this year to be named to the Aeneas Williams Preseason Watch List and the East-West Shrine 1000 – recognizing the top 1000 seniors heading into the season.

McDaniel totaled 30 tackles for the Braves as a defensive back in 2023 with 21 solo stops. He also recorded a pair of tackles for loss. McDaniel accounted for six turnovers last season causing three fumbles and was among the league leaders with three interceptions. He also recorded five pass breakups.

He was added to the Senior Bowl Watch List just eight days before the season opener against ULM.

WASHINGTON NAMED TO AENEAS WILLIAMS AWARD WATCH LIST

B.J. Washington joined Robert McDaniel on the Aeneas Williams Preseason Watch List after a season when he recorded 25 total tackles including 19 solo stops. He also recorded four tackles for loss and a pair of pass breakups, while he also forced a fumble and recorded three interceptions. He recorded multiple tackles in six games.

The Aeneas Williams Award is presented by the Chickasaw Nation and awarded to the best defensive back in Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Division I college football based on performance on the field, athletic ability and character.

NOLL NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Matt Noll was one of 13 student-athletes named to the FCS Punter of the Year Award Preseason Watch List, released by the Augusta Sports Council.

Noll finished the year recording 34 punts for 1,507 yards. He averaged 44.3 yards per punt and recorded a season-high 65-yard punt. He ended the season with three touchbacks and a pair of fair catches. He has earned Preseason All-Conference honors from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) and has been named to two

All-American teams this month.

The list was compiled based on the 2023 FCS Punter of the Year Watch List, the 2023 All-Conference teams, and the 2023 All-American teams. The FCS Punter of the Year Award will be determined by the FCS Punter of the Year Award national voting body which consists of FCS sports information directors and national sports writers.

This year's list consists of Noll, Austin Trusler (Richmond), Brendan Hall (Montana State), Caleb Brickhouse (North Carolina A&T), Clayton Taylor (Stony Brook), Grant Burkett (Missouri State), Kaedin Steindorf (North Dakota State), Logan Leftrick (Southeast Missouri State), Luke Schabel (Monmouth), Shane Messenger (Morgan State), Shelby Pruett (Colgate), Trey Wilhoit (Florida A&M), and Will Lynch (LIU).

MORE AWARDS FOR NOLL

Noll continued to bring in preseason honors after he was named a First Team FCS Football Central All-American as punter, a First Team All-SWAC selection, a BOXTOROW Preseason All-American, and a Phil Steele All-SWAC pick. He was joined on the BOXTOROW All-American team by Evan Henry and Fabian McCray.

FIVE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SWAC ON VOTE BY COACHES AND SIDS

Five players including McCray and Noll were named Preseason All-SWAC on a vote of the league's head coaches and communications professionals. Evan Henry returns as a First Team selection after earning Second Team honors last season after helping the offense average 161.6 yards per game running 227.7 yards passing. He helped amass 389.4 yards per game offensively.

He was joined on the first team by McCray and Noll. Meanwhile, defensive lineman Jeremiah Williams who finished the season with 45 tackles including 20 solo stops. He also finished the season with 5.5 tackles for loss and three sacks (against Southern, Mississippi Valley State, and UAPB). He recorded a tackle in all 11 games last season.

He was joined on the Second Team by defensive back Esaias Guthrie who finished the season with 52 tackles including 34 solo stops. He recorded a season-high 10 tackles against Texas Southern and eight against Texas State. Guthrie finished with multiple tackles in 10 of the 11 games last season.

EIGHT NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SWAC BY PHIL STEELE

Eight players including the five named preseason All-SWAC were named Phil Steele All-SWAC prior to the season. Irv Mulligan was named First Team after he finished the year with 674 yards on 122 carries in eight games including five games. He averaged 5.5 yards per carry and averaged 84.3 yards per game. He also caught five passes for 42 yards last season. Mulligan recorded three 100-plus yard games including a season-high 174 yards on 21 carries against Bethune-Cookman. He also ran for 115 yards against Ala-

bama A&M and another 110 against South Carolina State. He was joined by Kirk Ford and Robert McDaniel who were named third team. Ford helped the offense average 161.6 yards per game running 227.7 yards passing. He helped amass 389.4 yards per game last season.

DENT INDUCTED INTO BLACK COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

Kevin Dent was named to the Black College Football Hall of Fame earlier this season and is the only Jackson State player in school history to be named a three-time All-American, and was also a two-time Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Defensive Player of the Year. He finished his career with 21 interceptions and during his sophomore season tied for the nation's lead with 10 interceptions – including returning a pair for touchdowns. Dent also helped the Tigers win 27 of 28 conference games.

Following his collegiate career, he was signed as an NFL free agent before playing in the World Football League and the Arena Football League.

He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2006.

JIMMY SMITH INDUCTED INTO STATE HALL OF FAME

Jimmy Smith was inducted into the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame this past summer. Smith, who moved to Jackson at a young age, attended Callaway High School and played his collegiate career as a wide receiver for Jackson State. Smith was drafted as the No. 36 overall pick by the Dallas Cowboys in 1992, where he won two Super Bowls. He had a stint with the Philadelphia Eagles and was later picked up by the Jacksonville Jaguars, being selected for five Pro Bowls upon finishing his 12-year career in 2005.

50 YEARS SINCE WALTER PAYTON'S FINAL SEASON AT JACKSON STATE

Walter Payton played his last game at Jackson State in 1975 after setting several records along the way. He set an NCAA scoring record with 464 points, while also leading the nation in scoring with 160 points (1973). Payton holds 9 Jackson State records including most career rushing yards of 3,563, while earning All-American honors.

THE VET ... 75 YEARS IN THE MAKING

Constructed in 1950, War Veterans Memorial Stadium (its original name) was built as a 21,000-seat municipal stadium, with many different schools using the stadium as an alternate or neutral site.

On December 9, 1950, the first-ever game in the new stadium featured a matchup between the Holmes Junior College Bulldogs and the Kilgore College Rangers. In front of a crowd of 18,000, Holmes JC got dominated by the Rangers 32-13. While that was a junior college game, the stadium would host its first Division-I game on November 22, 1952, when the Louisville Cardinals traveled to face the Mississippi Southern Southerners (Southern Miss Golden Eagles today).

The 8-1 Southerners thumped the 3-4 Cardinals 55-26.

Ole Miss would hold their first game in the stadium the following year, when the Rebels beat the Chattanooga Mocs (Mockingbirds) by a score of 39-6. Halloween day of the same year saw Mississippi State host their first game when they were beat 27-20 by the Texas Tech Red Raiders.

Jackson State played its first game at the stadium in 1967 when they took on fellow SWAC member Grambling State in front of 20,000 fans. JSU left the stadium with a win and a future with the stadium; in just a few short years, the stadium would become the home of the JSU Tigers football team.

By the 1980s, Southern Miss and Mississippi State returned to their home fields, while Ole Miss waited until 1996 to make their final move back home. In 1996, Jackson State was able to claim the stadium all to themselves, as well as occasional SWAC Championships and MHSAA Football Championships.

MARTIN AND MULLIGAN RETURN AFTER INJURIES IN 2023

Jackson State returns its top two running backs from a season ago, a season that both were injured in and missed significant time for the Tigers.

Irv Mulligan returns after a season in which he was headed to all-conference honors before his injury. He finished the season with 674 yards on 122 carries including five touchdowns, and he also averaged 5.5 yards per carry and recorded a season-best rush of 66 yards. He also caught five passes for 42 yards. Mulligan finished with a season-high 174 yards on 21 carries with one touchdown against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 23), and also finished with 115 yards on 23 carries against Alabama A&M (Oct. 14).

The Tigers also return J.D. Martin to give them more experience in the backfield. He played in just four games and ran the ball 31 times for 204 yards. He recorded a season-long 36 yard rush and averaged 6.6 yards per carry. Martin also hauled in six passes for 66 yards.

QUINN PROMOTED TO DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Torenzo Quinn was elevated to the defensive coordinator position, just one year after being brought in as the defensive backs coach. Last season, he helped lead the nation in interceptions at the end of regular season with 17. The Tigers also only allowed 187.6 yards passing per game. He is no stranger to running a defense as he served as Assistant Head Coach and Passing Game Coordinator at UAPB.

While at UAPB, he guided the emergence of Shawn Steele into one of the SWAC's top defensive backs. In 2019, Steele was tied for sixth in the SWAC in interceptions (three) and tied for the league lead in pass breakups with 18. Also, in 2019, Blake Conner led the team in both solo tackles (43) and total tackles (77) while also recording two interceptions and two forced fumbles.

T.C. TAYLOR WILL CALL PLAYS THIS SEASON FOR JACKSON STATE

Head coach T.C. Taylor will be in a place he is comfortable in this season, calling plays for the Tigers. And he is no stranger to doing so, having done it at multiple stops along the way including at North Carolina Central.

At NCCU, Taylor helped guide the Eagles to three MEAC championships (2014, 2015, 2016), and in 2016 went unbeaten in conference play and qualified for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl. In 2016 and under Taylor's guidance, NCCU set a record for total offense in a single season (4,614). Also, in 2014, Taylor's unit set a program record for passes completed in a season (227).

From 2014 to 2018, Taylor coached 28 All-MEAC offensive players and five All-Americans. In 2016 and under Taylor's tutoring, Malcolm Bell was a finalist for the 2016 Black College Football Player of the Year. Bell was also a three-time All-MEAC quarterback (2014, 2015, 2016) and set the program record for total offense (7,844 yards) and career completion percentage (56.6 percent) and was second in passing yards (6,340).

NEW ADDITIONS TO STAFF THIS YEAR INCLUDING FORMER JSU PLAYERS

The coaching staff will have a different look to it this year with several new faces coming to the Tigers, including a few former players returning home.

Joining the staff this year for the first time including Manny Ramirez (offensive line), Eric Gallon (running backs), Vincent Marshall (wide receivers), Chris Orr (linebackers), Kali James (defensive line), and Javancy Jones (special teams coordinator).

Ramirez comes to the Tigers from Texas Southern where he coached for two years and has experience at all levels of football including a nine-year NFL playing career. James comes to the Tigers from Florida where he served as a defensive line assistant after an award-winning career at Tuskegee.

Orr comes from Baylor where he served as a defensive assistant after playing at Wisconsin and finishing with 187 tackles. Marshall comes from Norfolk State after playing at Houston in the early 2000s and graduated as the school's all-time leading receiver. Gallon comes back to Jackson State after a brief stint with North Carolina A&T, and played collegiately at Kansas State.

Meanwhile, Jones - a former All-American at Jackson State - returns to his alma mater as the special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach.

JACKSON STATE IN SEASON OPENERS

Since 1956, Jackson State has recorded 47 wins in the season opener, putting together a 47-24-4 record over that span. The Tigers have won their last four season openers dating back to the Spring of 2021 after dropping five

consecutive openers from 2015 to 2019.

MULLIGAN AND MARTIN MISS THE SEASON OPENER

The teams top two rushers returning from a season ago sat out the season opener against ULM as they continue to rehab from injuries suffered last season. Irv Mulligan was injured against Alabama State and did not play the remainder of the season, while J.D. Martin played just four games for the Tigers last season.

NICE DEBUT FOR TERRELL

Travis Terrell Jr. made his collegiate debut against ULM and responded with a team-high six receptions for 45 yards in the loss. He also ran for 12 yards and returned a kick for 21 yards in the loss.

TWICE AS NICE FOR MORGAN

Jacobian Morgan was responsible for a pair of touchdowns for Jackson State against ULM. The junior quarterback recorded a 41-yard touchdown pass to Joanes Fortilien to tie the game up in the first half and then ran for another in the third quarter to tie it up yet again.

SPEAKING OF MORGAN

Morgan finished 23-of-28 with an interception and a touchdown against ULM. He finished with 228 yards and a staggering 82.1 completion percentage, good for third in the country after the opening week. He also completed 23 of his passes that ranked him ninth in the country after the opening week.

NICE DEBUT FOR LANDY

Marvin Landy made his debut at tight for Jackson State against ULM and responded with four receptions for 51

yards including a long of 27 yards.

PLAYERS FROM TENNESSEE

Jackson State has three players on its roster from the state of Tennessee this season with all three from the city of Memphis which is only 87 miles from the city of Jackson, Tennessee (the home of Lane). Both Ahmad Miller and Zyon Walker played at Whitehaven High School, while Brandon Mitchell played at Middle Georgia.

W.C. GORDEN CLASSIC

Jackson State has won the last four W.C. Gorden Classics played at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium dating back to the Spring of 2021. The last loss came against Grambling State in 2019.

The classic is named after W.C. Gorden who was the head coach at Jackson State from 1976 to 1991, compiling a record of 119-48-5. Gorden joined the Jackson State football staff as an assistant coach in 1966, and was named interim head coach during the 1976 season after the firing of Robert Hill. His appointment as head coach was made permanent following the 1976 season.

Gorden was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame as a coach in 2008.

WALKER BLOCKS A KICK IN OPENER

Allen Walker recorded a blocked kick in the opener against ULM, blocking an extra point attempt.

CAPTAINS FOR THE OPENER

Jackson State named four different players as captains for the season opener against ULM, a pair on offense and a pair on defense. The captains for the game were Esaias Guthrie, Evan Henry, Fabian McCray, and Jeremiah Williams. Speaking of Guthrie, he recorded a big sack in the first half that ended a drive for ULM and took the Warhawks out of field goal range.

NOT THE START THE TIGERS WANTED

Jackson State faced uncertainty in the opener against ULM and it wasn't with the opponent. The Tigers were delayed for two hours prior to kickoff due to weather, pushing kick back to 8 pm.

TIGERS IN HOME OPENERS

Since 1956, Jackson State has a 51-15-2 all-time record at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. The Tigers have played 68 total games in home openers.

HOME ATTENDANCE IN 2023

HEAD COACH T.C. TAYLOR

One of the greatest Jackson State Football Tigers to ever don the Blue and White has ascended to the position of Head Coach at his alma mater. T.C. Taylor was been named the 22nd head coach for JSU football. He officially took the reins of the program following the conclusion of the Celebration Bowl.

The former JSU quarterback and wide receiver has been a part of the Jackson State football staff since 2019, coaching tight ends and wide receivers, and has played a key role in an historic run over the past two seasons of Tiger football. JSU posted a 23-3 record over the previous two seasons prior to Taylor taking over the program, winning back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference championships and posting consecutive undefeated conference seasons before finishing 7-4 in 2023.

In his first season at the helm of the Tigers, Taylor led the team to a second-place finish in the East Division. They finished fourth in the conference in scoring at 27.3 points per game and third in rushing with 1,778 yards on 397 attempts for an average of 161.6 yards per game. They also finished second in passing at 227.7 yards per game, and were the best team offensively in the conference at 389.4 yards per game. Defensively, the team finished fifth in the conference in scoring and fourth in total defense.

As an assistant coach at JSU, Taylor has helped develop some of the best receivers in the SWAC. During the abbreviated Spring 2021 season, he tutored WR Daylen Baldwin, who led the SWAC in receiving yards (540) and touchdowns (seven). During the Fall 2021 season, Malachi Wideman tied for the conference lead with 12 touchdown receptions, while Keith Corbin ranked second in both receptions (69) and yards (921) and tied for seventh in touchdowns. In 2022, Dallas Daniels ranked second in the SWAC in receptions (60), third in receiving yards (666), and fourth in touchdowns (six). Shane Hooks ranked third in the SWAC in receptions (59) and third in both receiving yards (705) and receiving touchdowns (10). Prior to the 2022 season, Taylor was selected for an NFL coaching fellowship with the Tennessee Titans.

A native of McComb, Miss., Taylor played quarterback and wide receiver at Jackson State from 1998-2001, starting off as a signal caller for two-and-a-half seasons before switching to wide receiver. In just 19 games as a receiver, he amassed 188 catches for 1,793 yards. As a senior at Jackson State, Taylor broke the JSU single-season record with 84

receptions for 1,234 yards and 11 touchdowns, earning NCAA Division I-AA Third-Team All-America honors from The Sports Network and First-Team Black College All-America recognition from Sheridan Broadcasting Network. He was also the runner-up for the 2001 Conerly Trophy, presented to Mississippi's top college football player, behind Eli Manning.

Prior to returning to JSU as assistant coach in 2019, Taylor coached at North Carolina Central from 2014-18, where he coached quarterbacks and served as offensive coordinator.

At NCCU, Taylor helped guide the Eagles to three MEAC championships (2014, 2015, 2016), and in 2016 went unbeaten in conference play and qualified for the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

In 2016 and under Taylor's guidance, NCCU set a record for total offense in a single season (4,614). Also, in 2014, Taylor's unit set a program record for passes completed in a season (227). From 2014 to 2018, Taylor coached 28 All-MEAC offensive players and five All-Americans. In 2016 and under Taylor's tutoring, Malcolm Bell was a finalist for the 2016 Black College Football Player of the Year.

Bell was also a three-time All-MEAC quarterback (2014, 2015, 2016) and set the program record for total offense (7,844 yards) and career completion percentage (56.6 percent) and was second in passing yards (6,340).

Taylor spent the prior two seasons (2012-13) at Texas Southern University as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. From 2005-11, he coached at Coahoma Community College in Clarksdale, Miss., starting as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach and spending the final six years as offensive coordinator. His offenses ranked among the top five in Mississippi junior colleges in total yards for four straight seasons from 2007-10.

Taylor signed as a rookie free agent with the New England Patriots in 2002, played wide receiver for the NFL Europe World Bowl XI champion Frankfurt Galaxy in 2003, and participated in the 2003 NFL preseason with the Detroit Lions before a nagging injury ended his playing career.

Taylor graduated from Jackson State with a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation in 2005. He is married to Dawn, and they have two sons, Tre and Tylan.



