WE'RE BACK

The Dolphins battled to a 14-18 record in 2019-20, posting a 7-9 mark in ASUN play to finish in a tie for sixth. The season came to a close with a three-point loss at North Florida in the ASUN Quarterfinal following multiple historic efforts. David Bell earned ASUN Defensive Player of the Year honors after securing the first 300-rebound season since Tim Burroughs in 1991-92. Bell also became the first Dolphin to average a double-double since Artemus McClary in 1995-96. Mo Arnold was named to the ASUN All-Freshman team.

Returning to the lineup in 2020-21 will be Tyreese Davis, who missed the 2019-20 season after suffering a knee injury at the end of his freshman campaign. He was named to the ASUN All-Freshman team for 2018-19 after posting 10.1 points per game and 4.2 rebounds per game. He is the returning stat leader in eight major categories for the Dolphins.

The men's basketball contest vs. Coastal Georgia on Wednesday night will be the first athletic competition on Jacksonville's campus since March 11, just prior to athletic activities being shut down nationwide due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As a precaution, Swisher Gymnasium will host an extremely limited fan capacity. The maximum number of fans allowed at a given game will be 180.

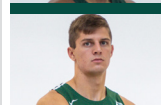

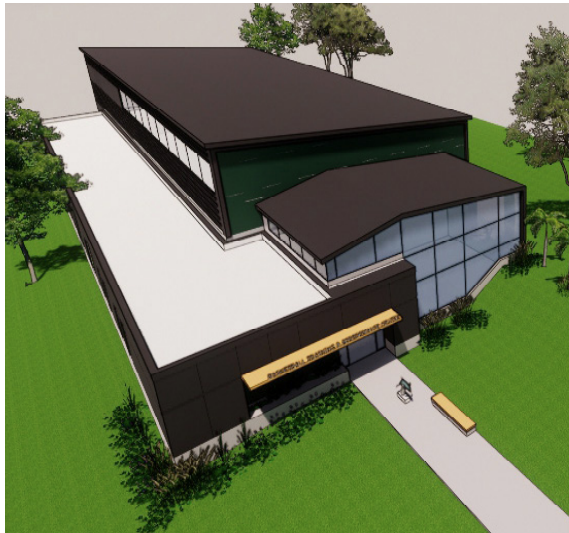

JACKSONVILLE ATHLETICS ANNOUNCES PLANS TO BUILD BASKETBALL PERFORMANCE CENTER



Jacksonville University Athletics announced Nov. 19, 2019 plans to begin construction of a basketball performance center on campus that will serve as the future home of Jacksonville basketball's day-to-day operations. Construction began in late spring of 2020 with completion scheduled for fall of 2021.

Senior Vice President and Athletics Director Alex Ricker-Gilbert has prioritized facility upgrades for the intercollegiate programs and the basketball practice facility, which will house both the men's and women's basketball programs, has been at the top of that list.

"This project has been a top priority for our University and athletics department for several years," Ricker-Gilbert said. "Facilities matter, and in the sports of men's and women's basketball, the landscape is increasingly competitive. This facility is about our student-athletes and coaches. The Basketball Performance Center will provide a new home for our student-athletes, will enhance our ability to recruit quality individuals, and will allow them to be better prepared academically and athletically. This is a major component of a larger scale plan to chart our successful future in men's and women's basketball."

The 26,000 square foot practice facility will feature coaches offices, weight room, training room and a full court and a half of playing surface which will serve as the new practice venue for both programs. The building will be constructed immediately adjacent to Historic Swisher Gymnasium and will have direct access to the home game venue.

"This basketball facility will have a significant impact on our student-athletes' welfare and experience at Jacksonville University," men's basketball head coach Tony Jasick said. "Having a space with unlimited access for their individual growth as students and players is significant in creating a culture of improvement and development. Additionally, having a weight room directly off the practice floor for daily use will improve our performance and injury prevention programs as well."

"A new centrally-located facility will impact our programs' culture tremendously," women's basketball head coach Darnell Haney said. "A one-stop shop where we can train, build team camaraderie, and attract top recruits will help us compete at a high level and carry out the mission of our program to positively impact the lives of our student-athletes, the JU community, & the city of Jacksonville through winning basketball and quality education. This new facility will certainly allow us to do so."

In 2018, JU celebrated the successful completion of its ASPIRE Campaign, the largest, boldest fundraising initiative in the history of Jacksonville University. ASPIRE helped establish the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences; completed the 8,600 sq. ft. Jacksonville Lacrosse Center (JLC) and the 11,750 sq. ft. Frisch Welcome Center; introduced new scholarships; and enhanced students' residential experience by revitalizing living areas.

Additionally, a multi-million-dollar investment was made for improvements to D.B. Milne Field, Historic Swisher Gymnasium, Sessions Stadium, and the Pruitt Softball Complex including an updating of branded graphics throughout the campus. In recent years, Historic Swisher Gymnasium received a new roof, new playing surface, renovated locker rooms and new electronic video boards. Swisher Gym is quickly re-establishing itself as one of the toughest places to play in the ASUN.

"Since I began in spring 2016, our goal has been to find ways to enhance the experience of our student-athletes. From nutritional enhancements, to a new weight room, to an updated fieldhouse, to the Jacksonville Lacrosse Center, and now the Basketball Performance Center, we are finding innovative ways to create a high-level four-year experience for our student-athletes," Ricker-Gilbert concluded.

Jacksonville has been working with Balfour Beatty, a leading international infrastructure group, to develop this project. Balfour Beatty functions in the UK, US and Hong Kong with 26,000 employees worldwide.

MO ARNOLD - ASUN ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

Mo Arnold joined the starting lineup early in the 2019-20 season making two starts and left it, only to return in ASUN play at Lipscomb in a big way. Arnold scored 18 points in his return to the starting lineup to lead his team to an overtime victory over the eventual No. 3 seed. Arnold closed the regular season with his first-career double-double at FGCU (18 points, 10 rebounds) and guided the Dolphins to victory at Stetson, earning ASUN Newcomer of the Week honors. He averaged 5.4 points, 3.2 rebounds, 2.1 assists and had 18 steals and four blocks from a guard spot. He's the 14th different Dolphin all-time to earn ASUN All-Freshman Team honors.

BUDDING STAR

Diante Wood emerged in ASUN play as a reliable scoring option off the bench for the Dolphins. The Anniston Ala. native and Alabama transfer averaged 6.8 points and 3.1 rebounds in ASUN play and posted a trio of career-best 13-point efforts in ASUN play - all on the road. All of that led up to Wood scoring a team, game, career and team season high 27 points on 7-14 shooting to go with a 13-18 effort from the free throw line and seven boards at North Florida in the ASUN Quarterfinal. In one night, by shooting what is now tied for the seventh-most free throws in a game in program history, Wood raised his free throw percentage from 52.7 percent to 56.5 percent. He had not attempted more than seven free throws in any game prior to this one while also logging a career-high 25 minutes.

THAT'S MY QUARTERBACK

Jacksonville sophomore guard Trey Sides came to campus with plenty of pedigree, not just as a superb guard that can shoot it from anyone on the floor, but as an all-around athlete that experienced success on all fields in high school. Most notably, the Phillipsburg, Kansas native led his school to a pair of State Championships on the football field as the starting quarterback. To cap his senior season, Sides completed 10 of 15 passes for 156 yards and two touchdowns in the title game.

TEAMMATES AGAIN

The Dolphins boast a two pairs of individuals that came from the same high school. Kevion Nolan and Diante Wood paired up as one of the best backcourt duos in the state of Alabama at Sacred Heart Catholic HS in 2016-17. Upon Nolan's graduation, Wood went on to have a stellar high school career, earning four-star recruit status. The Boozer twins, Cameron and Zameron, also from Alabama, join the Dolphins roster as freshmen in 2020-21.

DONTARIUS JAMES

Dontarius transferred in from Xavier where he logged a combined 27 minutes over the last three games of the 2019-20 campaign after logging just two minutes in the month of February and the first game of March combined. He played well off the bench at Providence on March 4, logging 14 minutes with a 3-pointer to go with two rebounds, an assist and two steals. He played a career-high 25 minutes vs. St. John's on Jan. 5, contributing career highs of six points, eight rebounds and two assists. James grabbed five rebounds in 11 minutes of action vs. Lipscomb on Nov. 30. He logged seven minutes in the opener vs. Jacksonville on Nov. 5, scoring a basket.

KEVION NOLAN

After sitting out the 2019-20 campaign due to transfer rules, Nolan returns to the floor this season and is expected to be the floor general for the Dolphins. As a sophomore at Samford he averaged 6.8 points per game to go with 1.7 rebounds while handing out 41 assists and knocking down 23 triples. He was tabbed a three-star recruit by ESPN out of high school and was listed as the sixth-best player in Alabama. As one of the top players in the state, Nolan averaged 19.2 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.3 assists per contest as a senior.

HOME OF THE DOLPHINS

Since opening, Swisher Gymnasium has undergone multiple restorations and renovations and was even vacated by the men's basketball program for a time. In 2016 the venue introduced two 18-foot videoboards, mounted on the walls at either end of the court as well as a 40-foot video scorer's table that sits at center court on the sideline. In 2018, with extensive damage having been done unto the building by Hurricane Irma, a brand-new roof and floor were installed. With that came a new paint job of the basketball court that included the Athletic Department's new branding. The locker rooms housed in the building were completely re-done with new layouts, bathrooms, furniture and graphics during this time as well.

The venue currently seats 1,500 people for sporting events with one side being fixed seating and the other side retractable, creating space for multi-purpose events. In addition to sporting events, several concerts have been held at Swisher Gymnasium including appearances by Billy Joel in 1975 and K.C. and the Sunshine Band in 1979. Vice President Lyndon Baines Johnson addressed students there in 1963.

Swisher Gymnasium briefly served as a practice facility for the men's team while they played at Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena from 2004-15, but became the official home of the Dolphins once again at the end of the 2014-15 season. The Dolphins strung together 13 wins in a row after returning to the Gym, and finished 12-3 in the 2015-16 season. In the 2016-17 season the Dolphins finished 7-7, hosting a postseason national tournament for the first time in its history.

HEAD COACH TONY JASICK

Tony Jasick, the 2014 Mid-Major National Coach of the Year, enters his seventh season leading the Dolphins. Jasick's first season rebuilding the program saw a complete overhaul of the roster with only one of the eight top scorers returning from the previous season. In his second season he led Jacksonville to its most non-conference wins in 24 years, secured the first winning season for the program in five years, and had a 13-game home winning streak, the longest in 42 years. In Jasick's third season, the coaching veteran again improved upon his win total from the previous year, making him one of only two coaches in the nation (Michigan's John Beilein (at the time) the other) over the last six years to improve their win total over a three-year span twice.

2019-20

The Dolphins battled to a 14-18 record in 2019-20, posting a 7-9 mark in ASUN play to finish in a tie for sixth. The season came to a close with a three-point loss at North Florida in the ASUN Quarterfinal following multiple historic efforts. David Bell earned ASUN Defensive Player of the Year honors after securing the first 300-rebound season since Tim Burroughs in 1991-92. Bell also became the first Dolphin to average a double-double since Artemus McClary in 1995-96. Mo Arnold was named to the ASUN All-Freshman team.

2018-19

The 2018-19 Dolphins faced quite a bit of turnover on the roster from 2017-18 to 2018-19 and welcomed nine newcomers. The team posted a 12-20 record but gave the top teams in the ASUN everything they could handle, playing eventual NIT runner-up Lipscomb within 12 points combined across two games. Freshman guard Tyreese Davis averaged over 10 points per game and went on to be named to the ASUN All-Freshman team. JD Notae was selected as an All-Conference honoree while Jace Hogan earned All-Academic Team recognition.

2017-18

The 2017-18 edition of the Jacksonville Dolphins men's basketball program finished with an overall record of 15-18 but does little to tell the whole story about this season. The Dolphins went on to post an 8-6 mark in ASUN play to finish third in the standings and then advanced to the ASUN semifinals before falling to eventual champion Lipscomb on the road. Devin Harris was chosen as the ASUN Defensive Player of the Year and named to the All-Conference Second Team, freshman guard JD Notae was honored as the ASUN Freshman of the Year, Jalyn Hinton joined Notae on the All-Freshman Team and Cody Helgeland was selected to the ASUN All-Tournament Team and All-Academic Team.

2016-17

His 2016-17 Dolphin squad had a resurgent non-conference season, finishing 12-4 in games outside of ASUN Conference play. That tied JU with Baylor, Creighton, Florida State, Gonzaga, Louisville, Maryland, Minnesota, North Carolina and Villanova for the secondmost non-conference wins in the country. The Dolphins then capped a 17-15 regular season by hosting a national postseason tournament for the first time at Swisher Gym, the Hugh Durham Classic game of the CollegenInsider.com Tournament. After the season ended, Jasick had seven members of the team graduate, and five of those former Dolphins then signed professional contracts overseas. Only three other schools in the country had four or more players graduate and sign pro contracts.

2015-16

Kori Babineaux earned All-ASUN honors for the second time in his career in the 2015-16 season, and became the fifth Dolphin ever to score over 1,000 points in just two years. The Dolphins had several other memorable moments, including a 31-point outburst from Darien Fernandez in the ASUN Conference Tournament's first round, the most a Dolphin has ever scored in an ASUN playoff game. 2015-16 was also the first time JU has hosted an ASUN men's basketball conference tournament game.

2014-15

The Dolphins finished Jasick's first campaign strongly, winning three of their final five games. The 2014-15 Dolphins also garnered wins over three of the top four teams in the final ASUN Conference standings. As a result of their on-court success, two Dolphins earned postseason honors. Junior Kori Babineaux was voted the ASUN Newcomer of the Year in addition to earning All-Conference second team honors. Freshman Antwon Clayton was named to the conference All-Freshman Team. Jasick was hired as the 16th head coach in Jacksonville men's basketball history on April 9, 2014. Jasick comes to JU after spending three seasons as the head coach of Indiana-Purdue Fort Wayne (IPFW). In all, Jasick spent the past nine seasons as a member of the IPFW coaching staff.

IPFW

Jasick was named the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year by CollegenInsider.com as the top Division I Mid-Major coach in college basketball in 2014. A nine-year veteran of the IPFW program, Jasick oversaw the Mastodons as the school transitioned from a Division I independent into one of the Summit League's elite. In late March 2014, he was named one of 15 finalists for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, given annually to a head coach who achieves success on the court while displaying moral integrity off it. Other finalists for the year's award include such coaching luminaries as Mike Krzyzewski of Duke, Phil Martelli of Saint Joseph's and Jay Wright of Villanova.

Prior to IPFW

Before joining the staff at IPFW in 2005-06, Jasick spent the 2004-05 season at Middle Tennessee State, coaching two All-Sun Belt Conference selections and helping the Blue Raiders to 19 wins. In 2003-04, he was an assistant at Newberry (S.C.) helping the team to the South Atlantic Conference title game for the first time in program history. Jasick began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at North Alabama.

A 2000 graduate of Mars Hill (N.C.) with a Bachelor of Science in Biology Education, Jasick went on to earn his Master's in Education from Lincoln Memorial (Tenn.) in 2002 before entering the coaching field. A native of Whitehall, Mich., Jasick attended Whitehall High School. Tony and his wife, Melissa, have two daughters, Rohen and Reece.
