JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY

Jacksonville University is a premier private institution in one of the fastest growing cities in the U.S. (Forbes). Founded in 1934 and named one of "America's Best Colleges" in the South for 10 consecutive years (U.S. News and World Report), Jacksonville offers more than 100 majors, minors, and programs that challenge, inspire and cultivate tomorrow's leaders and world changers.

While JU offers degrees in a wide range of traditional fields such as Business, Marine Science, Engineering, Physics, and Nursing, this established university is intensely focused on defining the next generation of education and creating an engaging learning environment. The school's core curriculum combines a strong liberal arts foundation with pre-professional programs, undergraduate research, and leadership opportunities -- all in a supportive but challenging atmosphere that encourages students to make a meaningful impact on their world.

In 2018, JU launched an innovative academic initiative called BOLD Beyond Ordinary Learning Design -- a collaborative project that aims to adapt educational programs to the rapidly changing landscape of careers and emerging fields. As part of the BOLD initiative, this spring JU announced the newly developed Pathways of Distinction, which allows students to create their own distinct programs of study by bundling a variety of majors, minors and areas of focus.



Reaching beyond its 240-acre riverfront campus shaded by mossy oaks, JU focuses on positively impacting the surrounding community and building strong partnerships with local, national and global businesses. This outside-in approach has positioned the school as a catalyst for growth in one of Jacksonville's oldest neighborhoods and has unlocked a season of exciting new opportunities that bridge the divide between education and career -- between learning and doing.

In 2018, JU celebrated the successful completion of its ASPIRE Campaign, the largest, boldest fundraising initiative in the history of Jacksonville University. Thousands of investors believed so much in the university's work and collective potential that the contributions surpassed the original \$85 million goal by more than \$36 million -- and two years ahead of schedule. This unprecedented achievement launched JU into a thrilling new chapter in the school's history. With the help of ASPIRE, JU established the Brooks Rehabilitation College of Healthcare Sciences; completed the 8,600 sq. ft. Jacksonville Lacrosse Center and broke ground on the 11,750 sq. ft. Frisch Welcome Center; introduced more than \$12 million in new scholarships that connect students with donors who support and encourage them; and enhanced students' residential experience by revitalizing living areas to create more collaborative and engaging spaces on campus.

The Jacksonville University Athletic Department is home to 17 Division I sports making nearly one in four JU students a competitor in an intercollegiate sport. The mission of the Athletic Department is to foster a relationship-driven, student-athlete centered, culture of development for academic, athletic, and social growth. As ambassadors for the University, the department rises collectively and competitively to enhance and elevate the profile of the institution.

The rich history of the JU Athletic Department has close ties to the NCAA Tournament, where its men's basketball program made its mark on a national stage. The 1969-70 men's basketball team, led by 1971 National Player of the Year and future National Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Artis Gilmore, became one of the first Cinderella stories in Tournament history when it advanced to the National Championship game. That team achieved a national ranking as high as No. 4 and set the standard for Jacksonville athletics for years to come.

Since then, the school has forged its own path to success, attracting some of the best and brightest young coaches in the nation, who challenge convention and push forward in the pursuit of excellence. The last two academic years alone have been full of impressive team accomplishments, including seven NCAA Tournament or Championship appearances, five conference championship titles, and three conference regular season titles, all while achieving unprecedented academic success in 2017-18. More than 80 percent of JU student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA or better for the 2017-18 academic year -- an ASUN-conference best. Jacksonville was honored with the ASUN Presidents' Academic Trophy for the first time in the 26-year history of the award.

HEAD COACH MAURICIO B. RUIZ

Jacksonville University welcomed Mauricio Ruiz as its 11th head men's soccer coach on February 13, 2014.

In the third season at the helm of his own program, Ruiz guided the Dolphins to their first ASUN Conference Championship in eight years. The 2016 campaign saw Jacksonville amass eight wins including a 2-0 shutout at South Florida, a 2015 and 2016 NCAA Tournament participant.

Two players earned all-conference honors and three were named to the ASUN All-Tournament Team.

En route to becoming the fourth No. 5 seed to advance to the league championship, the Dolphins defeated the New Jersey Institute of Technology, 2-1, in the opening round of the ASUN Tournament and shutout the top-seeded, reigning champions North Florida, 1-0, in the semifinals.

Ruiz joined the Dolphins after spending six seasons at UCF, where he assisted in developing the Knights into one of the top programs in the nation.

After serving as a volunteer assistant coach at UCF in 2008, Ruiz was promoted to assistant coach in the summer of 2009 and recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2010. Securing the No. 1 recruit in the state of Florida and No. 20 recruit nationally two years in a row, Ruiz's second recruiting class in 2012 was ranked as one of the top 30 in the country by TopDrawerSoccer and College Soccer News. The 2013 and 2014 recruiting classes also shared some of the same high-caliber recruits, including the No. 2 player in the state of Florida and four players in the top 150 in the country.

Under his recruiting and coaching efforts, UCF advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2010 after a five-year absence and has been a fixture in national rankings since then. That year, UCF hosted its first-ever NCAA Tournament game against USF in the first round, beating its in-state rivals, 3-0. The Knights then took eventual College Cup semifinalist Michigan into overtime in Ann Arbor, before falling, 2-1, in the Round of 32.

Ruiz also helped players earn individual accolades in 2010 with Warren Creavalle named as a third-team All-American. A program-record six players were named to the All-C-USA Teams, including three on the first team. The Knights also had three players named to the NSCAA All-South Region teams in 2010, with Creavalle landing a spot on the first team. In 2011, the team once again made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and was ranked as high as No. 6 nationally during the campaign. In its finest season in school history, UCF defeated a pair of nationally-ranked squads and opened the season 6-0-1 while advancing to the Conference USA Championship semifinals for the third consecutive year. Heading into the 2012 season, Ruiz was promoted to Associate Head Coach. UCF recorded plenty of highlights in 2012. The Knights posted a 1-0 win over No. 17 SMU during the year and also had big road victories at Kentucky and Marshall in league play. Deshorn Brown and Andrew Quintana garnered all-league first team honors and Brown was named to the NSCAA All-South Region first team.

Ruiz not only attracted some of the top recruits in the country to come to Central Florida, he was also instrumental in helping many of his players go on to professional careers. Under his direction, Brown, Kevan George, Creavalle and Sean Johnson were selected in the MLS SuperDraft. Chosen as the 6th overall pick in 2013 in the SuperDraft, Brown was also selected to join the Jamaican Senior national team. Johnson currently suits up for the U.S. Senior national team while George plays with the Trinidad and Tobago Senior National team.

Off the field, the men's soccer team posted the highest grade point average for any men's team at UCF, and the Knights had 16 players gain spots on the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better. Personally, he helped mentor student-athletes, assisting a few of them in obtaining the C-USA Jim Castaneda Post Graduate Scholarship.

Highly involved with the Greater Central Florida youth soccer community, he worked as the Director of Coaches for the Florida Soccer Alliance in Lake Mary, Fla. from 2010-12. Currently he holds a US Soccer Academy staff coach role with Orlando City, working with some of the top players in the Orlando area. In 2019 he received his US Soccer A License.

In his playing days, Ruiz starred at UCF before finishing his collegiate career at Stetson. As a Knight, he was part of the conference championship team that reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history. Playing two seasons with the Hatters, he captained the team to an Atlantic Sun Championship during his senior year.

During the 2007-08 season, he suited up with the Orlando Sharks of the Major Indoor Soccer League, playing 27 out of 30 games and recording seven goals and four assists as a rookie.

Ruiz earned a bachelor's degree in Management Information Systems from Stetson in 2005 and master's degree in Sports Business from Jacksonville University in 2019. Born and raised in Sao Paulo, Brazil, he moved to the United States in 1996 with his parents, Rosely and Miguel Ruiz, and two older sisters.

Ruiz and his wife Milena live in Jacksonville with their son Maddox.
