NATIONAL RECOGNITION

The Jacksonville Men's Lacrosse program earned national recognition Monday morning, as it was ranked in numerous polls for the second consecutive weeks.

The Dolphins were ranked 10th in the USA Lacrosse Magazine weekly ranking, 13th by Inside Lacrosse and 19th in the USILA Coaches Poll following Tuesday's victory against Mercer and Saturday's triumphant effort against Marquette.

WESTERN FEEL

The Dolphins' next three opponents are, Denver (Feb. 26), Air Force (Feb. 27) and Utah (March 6).

Jacksonville is one of two programs this season that will face all three of the Division I programs that reside west of the Mississippi River (Marquette).

NEW FACES JOINING THE DUVAL MISSION

There are a total of 25 new faces joining the Jacksonville Men's Lacrosse program this spring, 15 freshmen and 10 transfers.

Freshmen Colin Baez, Matthew Brenner, Ryan Della Rocco, Nick DiDomizio, Charlie DiGennaro, Jackson Intrieri, Theo Kostakos, Jack Lovelace, Mason Maxsim, Garrett Moore, Trevor Natalie, Gordon Ogden III, Gavin Osteen, Bryce Wojnovich and Steven Woolery look to make an immediate impact in their first season of eligibility.

Transfers Otto Bergman (Canisius), Tyler Corpora (Hartford), Cam Johnson (UMass), Marshall McGuire (Syracuse), Luke Millican (North Carolina), Davis Smith (Utah), Reid Smith (Florida State), Devon Sullivan (Syracuse), Luke Talago (Syracuse) and Max Waldbaum (Tufts) join the Dolphins after beginning their collegiate careers elsewhere.

SOCON PRESEASON POLLS

As a team, the Dolphins were picked to finish third in the 2022 Preseason Southern Conference Coaches Poll. Defending SoCon Tournament champion High Point was the favorite, earning four first-place votes and 24 points in total. Defending regular season champion Richmond was tabbed second, earning two first-place votes and 22 points, followed by the Dolphins with 17 points. Mercer (12), VMI (10), and Hampton (5) rounded out the poll.

SOCON PRESEASON HONORS

A total of five Dolphins were named to the 2022 Preseason All-Southern Conference Team, the conference announced in January. Jacksonville lead the SoCon with five choices, followed by Richmond (four), High Point (two) and Mercer (two).

Graduate students Jack Dolan, Colin Hinton, Dixon Smith, Jason Yoquinto, as well as redshirt junior Jordan Young were recognized with preseason honors.

THE LEADERSHIP PANEL

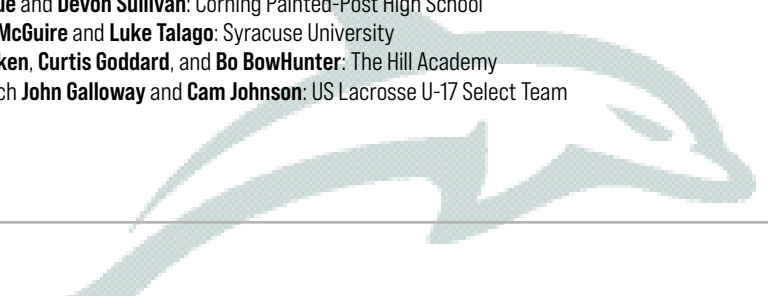

DEAKEN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Redshirt-junior **Zack Deaken** was named to the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association 2022 Preseason All-American list, it was announced on Tuesday, Feb. 1st. The Orangeville, Ontario native was the only Southern Conference student-athlete to be named to the preseason award list.

"I am really proud of Zach, as he is a guy that is deserving of the national praise," head coach **John Galloway** said. "My favorite part though is that I know this will mean very little to him, as I know Zack's sole focus is on helping this team reach new heights. That is the type of young man that he is."

In 31 career games for the Dolphins, Deaken has recorded 69 groundballs and 35 caused turnovers. A 2021 All-SoCon First Team selection, Deaken was named to the College Crosse/SB Nation All-Freshman Second Team and All-SoCon Second Team in 2019. In the classroom, Zack has been named to the SoCon Academic Honor Roll three-straight years.

JACKSONVILLE LACROSSE CLASSIC

One year after the Dolphins made their debut as the first - and only - Division I men's lacrosse program in the state of Florida in 2010, the Moe's Lacrosse Classic, now known as the Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic, was launched as a way to build the lacrosse community in Florida, garner interest in the sport, and showcase the diversity of sporting events welcomed in Jacksonville and north Florida.

Featuring some of the nation's top programs, the first four Classics from 2011 to 2014 were played at EverBank Field, home of the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. With a rematch of the 2010 National Championship game between Duke and Notre Dame supplementing the inaugural Moe's Lacrosse Classic, the annual event brought nationally-ranked opponents to the First Coast and aided Jacksonville's goal of bringing lacrosse into the sporting conversation in Florida.

Generally known as a "hotbed" sport with talent traditionally rising from New York, Maryland, Virginia, and the Northeast, the Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic has delivered an exciting, high-level lacrosse experience to a region of the country that would not typically get to experience it. However, with events like this held in nontraditional regions, the sport continues to gain popularity across the country with each successive year, with additional hotbeds appearing in areas like Colorado, Texas, California, and Florida.

For the first time in 2021, the Dolphins hosted a conference opponent in the event and earned their second victory in the Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic. The last came in Feb. 19, 2012 when the team knocked off Navy, 13-7.

The Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic returns in 2022 on March 6, as the Dolphins host Utah at Rock Stadium. The contest will be televised on CBS Sports Network.

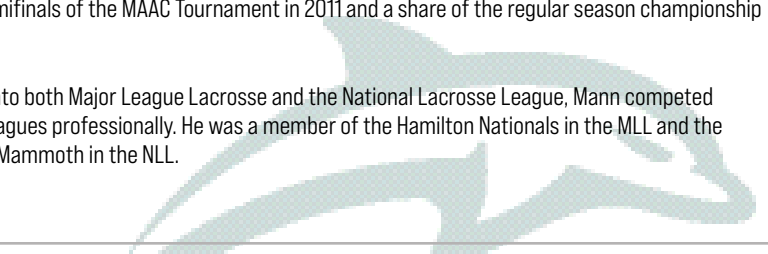
CAMERON MANN MAKES HISTORY, ONCE AGAIN

On January 8th, Cameron Mann '13 became the first member of the Jacksonville Men's Lacrosse Program to be inducted in the Jacksonville Athletics Hall of Fame.

A four-year captain and founding member of the program, Mann's accomplishments have held up over time as the program has grown since its inception in 2010, and he becomes the first men's lacrosse player to enter the Hall. He is second all-time in points, goals, man-up goals, assists and ground balls, and led the team in points in a season twice (2011, 2012) and in groundballs and assists once.

His strong performances were recognized publicly once JU joined a conference in 2011. A three-time all-MAAC selection and two-time MAAC All-Tournament team performer, he helped lead the Dolphins to the semifinals of the MAAC Tournament in 2011 and a share of the regular season championship in 2013.

Drafted into both Major League Lacrosse and the National Lacrosse League, Mann competed in both leagues professionally. He was a member of the Hamilton Nationals in the MLL and the Colorado Mammoth in the NLL.





HEAD COACH JOHN GALLOWAY

Entering his six season leading the Dolphins in 2022, John Galloway was named head coach of the Jacksonville University men's lacrosse team in June 2016.

The 2018 Southern Conference Coach of the Year has transcended the team's culture and brought national attention to the program after trading a 3-11 season in 2017 for an 8-7 mark and the program's first-ever appearance in the SoCon Tournament championship game a year later.

Back in action after the coronavirus ended the previous season early, the team finished the season with a 7-7 overall record and a 4-2 conference record. The seasons biggest highlight was the teams 11-5 victory in the nationally aired contest against Air Force in the Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic. Jason Yoquinto shined in the net this season for JU, his best performance came against Air Force where he accumulated 16 saves and was later named to the USILA team of the week for his efforts. The awards for Yoquinto did not stop there, as he and Matt Stagnitta were named the Southern Conference men's lacrosse defensive and offensive players of the week, respectively, for their work during the competition. Halfway through the season, Jack Dolan was among the names added to the Tewaaron Award watch list for his outstanding play. Dolan finished the season with 29 goals, 20 assists, 22 ground balls and four caused turnovers. After the season, nine athletes were placed on the SoCon All-Conference list. The list was highlighted by three first team selections; Dolan, Evan Tyler and Zack Deaken and four second team selections; Yoquinto, Conor Shears, Jordan Young and Colin Hinton. Rounding out the All-Conference awards, Nathan Kapp and Jacob Greiner were listed on the SoCon All-Freshman team. Off the field, multiple student-athletes dominated in the classroom. The program landed 44 players on the SoCon Academic Honor Roll list and nine to the SoCon Academic All-Conference team. Additionally, nine garnered the Commissioner's Medal honor, and two achieved a 4.0 GPA.

COACHING EXPERIENCE

In the shortened 2020 season due to the coronavirus pandemic, the veteran-led Dolphins had showed signs of being well-balanced and versatile throughout non-conference play. After a difficult start to the season, big wins in three of the next four games highlighted the campaign. Dixon Smith became the program's all-time leader in Caused Turnovers during the win over Hampton and freshman Jacob Greiner was named SoCon Offensive Player of the Week after the team's win at Marquette and earned a spot on the College Crosse/SB Nation All-Freshman Team for his outstanding debut season. A total of eight players made the SoCon Academic Team at the end of the season, and the stretch of professional success continued, with former JU face-off man and graduate assistant Hunter Forbes joining the Chrome of the Premier Lacrosse League and LSM Hayden La Vangie signing with the Connecticut Hammerheads of Major League Lacrosse.

While the Dolphins finished 2019 just 6-9 overall, several notable milestones were achieved. A trio of program records were broken as Jack Dolan set the single-season points record (55), Evan Tyler set the single-season goals record (37), and

Eric Applegate '19 became just the third player in program history to reach 100+ career points before he finished his career as the Dolphins' all-time leading scorer with 143 points. Jacksonville also picked up its first-ever win against a top-10 opponent - a 12-10 win over No. 10 High Point during the regular season.

The 2018 season saw the Dolphins reach an unprecedented level of success. As a team, Jacksonville ranked in the top five nationally in face off winning percentage (3rd - .701), ground balls per game (4th - 33.20), and matched the program's record for wins in a season (8).

After spearheading the revitalization of the Moe's Lacrosse Classic, Galloway guided the Dolphins to a near upset in overtime of 2017 National Runner-Up and then-No. 4 Ohio State in the first nationally-broadcasted (CBS Sports) sporting event held on Jacksonville University's campus.

Under Galloway's direction, the program saw it's first-ever USILA Scholar All-American - Hunter Forbes '18. The 2018 SoCon Defensive Player of the Year and JU's career leader in ground balls and face off wins, Forbes finished his record-setting season ranked third nationally in face off win percentage (.703) behind NCAA single-season leader TD lerlan (.791) and NCAA career leader Trevor Baptiste (.744).

In total, six players have earned nine All-SoCon postseason honors during Galloway's tenure, while a trio of players - Jeremy Winston, Dixon Smith, and Jack Dolan - earned recognition nationally after being named to the SB Nation/College Crosse All-Freshman Team in 2018.

Additionally, four players have been drafted to play professionally: Forbes (Atlanta Blaze), Ryan Beville '18 (Florida Launch), and McLean Chicquen '18 (Dallas Rattlers) in the 2018 Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Collegiate Draft; and Chase McIntyre '18 (Calgary Roughnecks) in the 2018 National Lacrosse League (NLL) Entry Draft.

Along with the team's on-field accomplishments, Galloway has structured a vision of community involvement including the World's Largest Outdoor Lacrosse Party, a fall exhibition against professional lacrosse players that benefits Nemours Children's Specialty Care, and the JU: Lacrosse Capital of the South High School Series that features local high school lacrosse games played at D.B. Milne Field before and after the Dolphins' home games throughout the season.

Galloway also played an instrumental role in revitalizing efforts in both fundraising and designing the Dolphins' \$1.875 million, 8,600-square-foot facility housing the men's and women's lacrosse teams' locker rooms, film room, lounge, coaches offices, athletic training center, conference room, game room, and nutritional center.

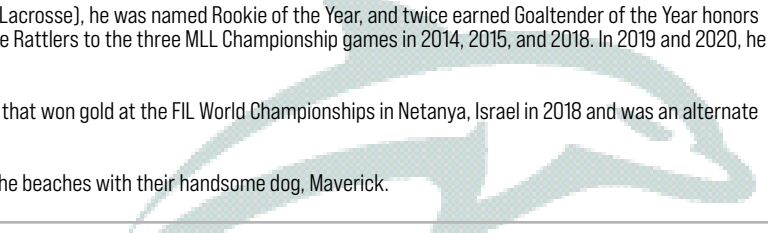
One of the young legends in the sport, Galloway joined the Dolphins following a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Providence College. While at Providence, Galloway helped coach Peter Badgley to Big East Goalkeeper of the Year and All-Big East First Team honors. It was the first time in program history that a Friar had earned the accolade. He also mentored Jarrod Neumann to an All-Big East First Team selection.

A native of Syracuse, N.Y., Galloway played goalkeeper for Syracuse University and ended his college career with an NCAA-record 59 wins while playing a record 3,776 minutes. A two-time First Team All-American at the position and the only goalie in Orange history to earn the honor twice, Galloway is also the only goalie in NCAA history to win national championships in his freshman and sophomore years. A Tewaaron Award Finalist, he also earned the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalkeeper in 2010 and 2011. In addition to his on-field presence, Galloway was a two-time national Academic All-American and was twice named Big East All-Academic.

In his first season as a professional with the Rochester Rattlers (Major League Lacrosse), he was named Rookie of the Year, and twice earned Goaltender of the Year honors (2014, 2016). A two-time MLL All-Star in 2015 and 2016, Galloway helped lead the Rattlers to the three MLL Championship games in 2014, 2015, and 2018. In 2019 and 2020, he has played in goal for the Chrome of the PLL.

In addition to playing professionally, he captained the U.S. Men's National Team that won gold at the FIL World Championships in Netanya, Israel in 2018 and was an alternate member of Team USA in 2014.

Galloway married the former Christina Decker in October 2019. They reside at the beaches with their handsome dog, Maverick.

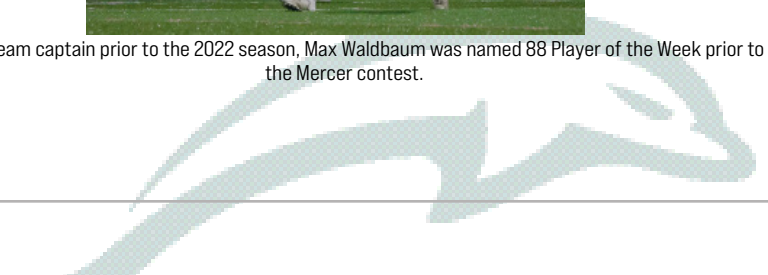

THE ROCK LACROSSE CENTER



In 2010, Jacksonville University made history as the only institution in Florida to offer Division I men's and women's lacrosse teams. Opening prior to the 2019 season, The Rock Lacrosse Center is set to join just a handful of lacrosse-only facilities across the country.

The 8,600-square-foot building serves as the new home for both the men's and women's lacrosse programs and is located adjacent to the grandstand on the north end of D.B. Milne Field. The \$1.875 million facility includes locker rooms for both the men's and women's teams, a film room, lounge area, coaches offices, an athletic training room, conference room, game room and nutritional center.

HISTORY OF THE JACKSONVILLE LACROSSE CLASSIC

One year after the Dolphins made their debut as the first - and only - Division I men's lacrosse program in the state of Florida in 2010, the Moe's Lacrosse Classic was launched as a way to build the lacrosse community in Florida, garner interest in the sport, and showcase the diversity of sporting events welcomed in Jacksonville and north Florida.

Featuring some of the nation's top programs, the first four Jacksonville Lacrosse Classics from 2011 to 2014 were played at EverBank Field, home of the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. With a rematch of the 2010 National Championship game between Duke and Notre Dame supplementing the inaugural Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic, the annual event brought nationally-ranked opponents to the First Coast and aided Jacksonville's goal of bringing lacrosse into the sporting conversation in Florida.

Generally known as a "hotbed" sport with talent traditionally rising from New York, Maryland, Virginia, and the Northeast, the Jacksonville Classic delivered an exciting, high-level lacrosse experience to a region of the country that would not typically get to experience it. However, with events like the Jacksonville Lacrosse Classic held in nontraditional regions, the sport continues to gain popularity across the country with each successive year, with additional hotbeds appearing in areas like Colorado, Texas, California, and Florida.

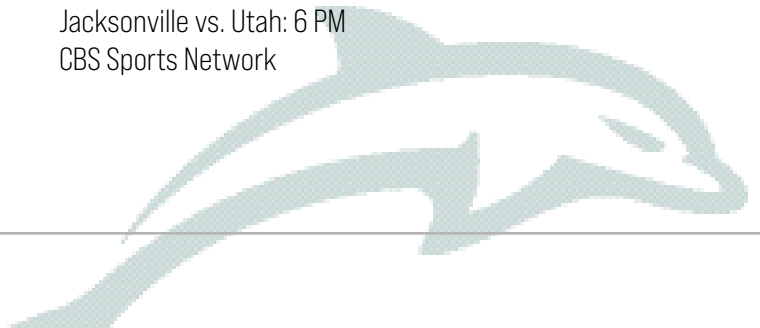

Jacksonville University Men's Lacrosse retired the #88 in 2013 following the passing of Dolphin defenseman Corey Lovrich.

A member of Jacksonville's inaugural team in 2010, Lovrich was named a team captain for the 2011 season and was diagnosed with stage 3 colon cancer just six games into his sophomore campaign. After being diagnosed and treated, the disease went into remission and a year later, Lovrich was given permission to resume athletic training with hopes of returning to the field to rejoin his teammates. However, just weeks after watching his teammates defeat Navy, 13-7, in the Moe's Southwest Grill Classic at EverBank Field, Lovrich became ill once again and shortly thereafter, lost his battle with the disease.

Lovrich's fighting attitude and positive spirit became an inspiration for many, both in and out of the lacrosse community. Drawing on Corey's contagious approach to life and determined to keep his memory and spirit alive, the Dolphins have held several yearly 88 and Sunny fundraisers to benefit the Colon Cancer Alliance, along with continuing Corey's legacy through the 88 Win The Day Club, an annual fundraising initiative that aims to improve and enhance the student-athlete experience for every player who is privileged to become part of the Jacksonville Lacrosse family.
