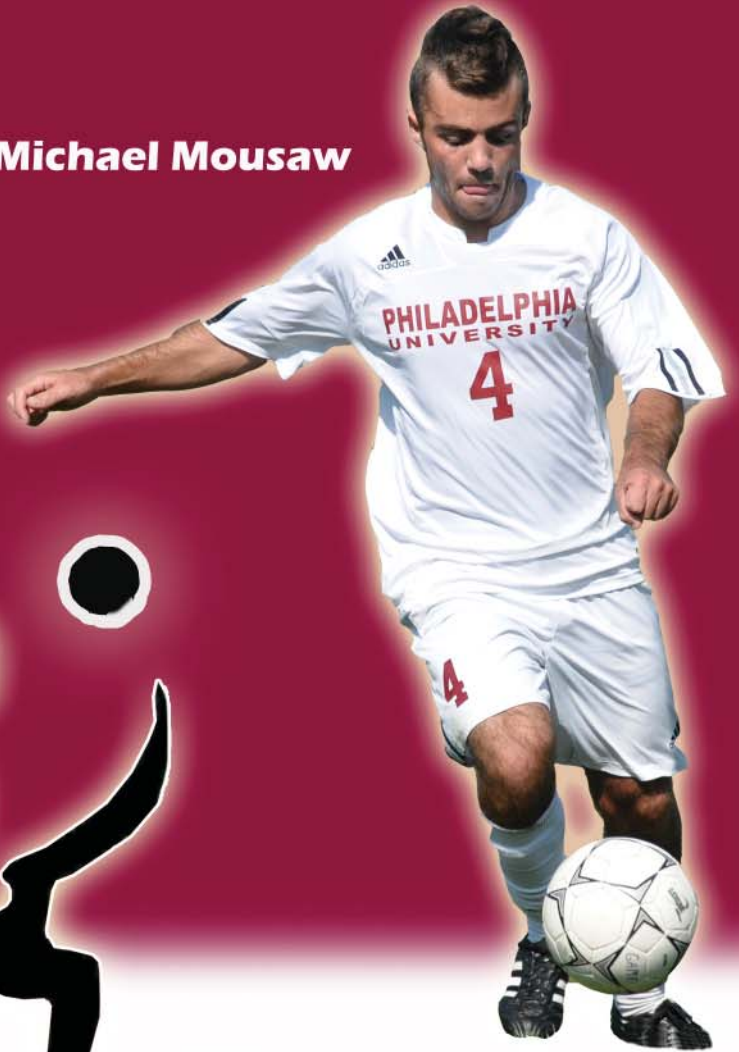

Head Coach Matt Digney enters his fourth season at the helm of the Philadelphia University men's soccer program in 2009-10. The program recently entered a

During his tenure at his alma mater, the Profs won five conference championships and qualified for the NCAA Division III Tournament each year. This included a Final Four berth in 1998 and a national championship appearance in 2000. That year he was recognized as the AFLAC National Assistant Coach of the Year.

new era in Ram history beginning in 2008-09 as the team joined the Division II ranks and the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) after playing at the Division I level since 1956. Digney was named head coach on May 24th, 2006. He succeeded Greg Wilson to become the 11th coach in the program's storied history.

A resident of Cinnaminson, NJ, Digney also served as the head coach at NCAA Division II Wilmington College (DE) in 2003, where he earned CACC Coach of the Year honors. He led the Wildcats to a 10-7-3 overall record including an 8-1-0 mark in the league one year after the team finished with a 5-14-1 overall record and a 1-8-0 league record.

The 2009-10 season will be the first that the Rams are eligible for CACC and NCAA post-season competition as a NCAA Division II institution.

Digney holds a 20-30-6 overall record at Philadelphia University at the completion of the 2008 season, as the Rams finished the year with 11 wins- more than doubling their wins total from the previous two seasons combined.

During the 2008-09 season, Digney had three student-athletes named CACC All-Conference and two selections on the CACC All-Academic Team (fall).

Before joining the CACC, Digney led the Rams to their second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Division I Atlantic Soccer Conference (ASC) Tournament.

Digney's previous coaching experience includes a pair of stints as an assistant coach at Rowan from 1997 through 2002 and once again in 2004.

Assistant Coaches



John Witherington

John Witherington is set to begin his fifth season as an assistant for the Philadelphia University men's soccer team this fall. A native of Cranford, NJ., Witherington's duties with the staff focus on player development, recruiting, fundraising and alumni relations. As Associate Director in the Office of Admissions at the University, he also coordinates campus visits and serves as head counselor for incoming student-athletes.

Prior to his arrival at the University, Witherington enjoyed a successful high school coaching career in New Jersey, serving on the staff at Cranford High, his alma mater, as well as at the Solomon Schechter Day School in West Orange, NJ. In addition, he has also participated in numerous camps and clinics throughout the tri-state area, serving as a scout for the New Jersey Olympic Development Program (NJODP) while obtaining his NSCAA National Coaching Diploma in January 2000.

As a player, Witherington was an accomplished performer at the NCAA Division I level at Fairfield University, playing with the Stags from 1993-97. He was also a member of a regionally ranked club team in New Jersey that captured multiple state championships. He currently resides in Philadelphia, PA.



Nick Martinelli

Nick Martinelli enters his fourth season as a member of the Philadelphia University men's soccer coaching staff, serving as an assistant for Head Coach Matt Digney. Martinelli was a standout player at Rowan University, playing under Digney who was an assistant coach with the Profs.

As a student-athlete at Rowan, the Lancaster, PA native enjoyed a stellar career with the Profs, earning Adidas NCAA Division III All-America honors in 2002 and 2004. In addition, he was a three-time NSCAA first-team All-Metro Region selection as well as a four-time New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) All-Conference first-team pick. In 2002, he was tabbed the NJAC Rookie of the Year while being named NJAC Defensive Player of the Year in 2003 and the NJAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2004.

Prior to Rowan, Martinelli enjoyed an outstanding prep career at Manheim Township High School, leading the Blue Streaks to the Lancaster-League Championship. Along the way, Martinelli was a two-time Section One first-team All-Star for Head Coach Dave Ammon. He currently resides in Glassboro, NJ.





Season Outlook

The Philadelphia University men's soccer team opened a new chapter in program history last season as they joined the NCAA Division II after playing at the Division I for over 50 years. This season, fourth year Head Coach Matt Digney's squad will be eligible for postseason competition after receiving an NCAA waiver.

"Last year was educational for the team and for myself, as we played our first season in the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) but due to NCAA rules were not eligible to compete in any postseason competition (CACC or NCAA tournaments)," said Digney.

This year the team has 18 letterwinners returning, including last year's top scorer in senior forward Svetozar Gladic (Novi Sad, Serbia). Gladic was an '08 CACC All-Conference 2nd Team selection, scoring 12 goals and two assists on the year.

The Rams will look to improve on their fifth-place overall finish in the CACC last season after losing five starters to graduation. The team will be focused on their annual objective of qualifying for the CACC Tournament and advancing to the NCAA Tournament- this is the first year the CACC will have an automatic bid to the NCAA's.

"This is a big year for us, but it's no different from the rest in that we want to go to the NCAA's," said Digney.

The team will be led by three captains: goalie Buddy Custer (Cinnaminson, NJ), forward Kristoffer Perez (Parlin, NJ) and junior midfielder Michael Mousaw (Marmora, NJ). Custer, a fifth-year senior, returns as a CACC All-Conference 1st Team selection and brings a wealth of veteran experience to the PhilaU roster.

Joining Perez at the forward position will be Gladic and junior Ian Martin (Beachwood, NJ). Martin tallied seven points last season for the Rams.

Two spots are up for grabs at midfield to join Mousaw, and Coach Digney expects junior Ryan Flaherty (West Chest, PA) and sophomore Ryan Purnell (Hamilton, Bermuda) to contend for starting positions.



Defenders include juniors Greig Edwards (Freeport, Trinidad) and Wojciech Sliwinski (Kenilworth, NJ), with one spot to be determined.

A freshmen class of seven will be expected to compete for starting positions, including Purnell, defender Travis Lobb and midfielder Sean Crossland.

"I only recruit players that I expect to contribute right away," said Digney.

PhilaU opens up the '09 campaign on a two game road trip, including perennial powerhouse Millersville University (8/28). CACC action begins with an away contest at Felician College (9/12), with the home-opener vs. Holy Family University (9/17, 4:30 p.m.) at Ravenhill Field.

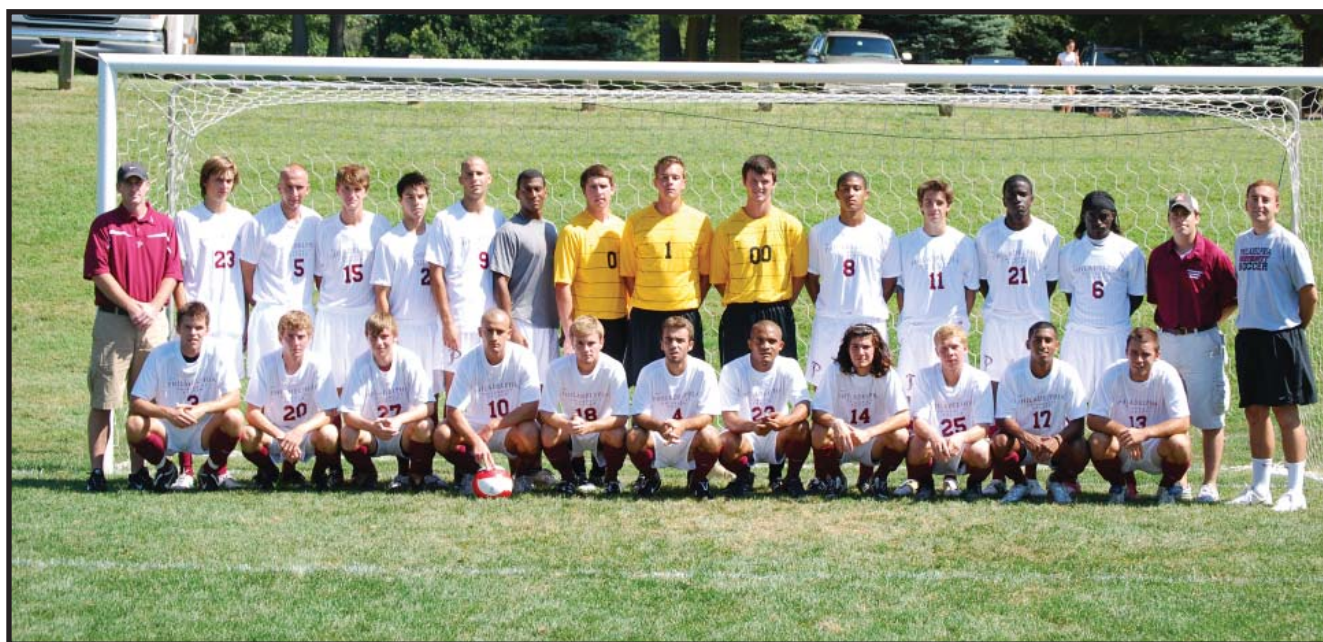
