LAST TIME OUT

Bellarmine University (12-2, 4-0 GLVC) defeated William Jewell College (3-9, 0-5 GLVC), 93-51, in Great Lakes Valley Conference Play (GLVC) men's basketball action on Saturday afternoon.

Patrick Whelan and Jorge Perez-Laham were the only Cards to score in double figures with 10 points each.

The Cards got out to an early 4-2 lead only to see the No. 13 Knights come alive with a 10-0 run. The Cards cut the lead to five points at the 12:56 mark of the half but Bellarmine would take control over the next four minutes off an 11-2 run and built a 46-31 lead at the half.

Coming out of halftime, the Knights scored the first six points in the half to bring the score to 52-31.

Bellarmine quickly found its rhythm on offense once again in the second half and continued to stretch out its lead and led by as many as 41 with just over seven minutes to play.

The Knights put five players in double figures as they went on to win 93-51.

Holley Moves Up on All-Time List

Coach Holley has guided the Cardinals to twenty-four 20-win seasons (fourteen of his teams have had 25 or more wins and four have won 30 or more games). His 37-year record at Jewell is 793-414 (.656). His overall record in 43 years is 880-536. His 880 career wins ranks him:

- #1 all-time among Missouri 4-year college coaches
- #3 among all active NCAA Division II coaches
- #10 all-time among NCAA coaches at all levels (Divisions I, II, III)
- #13 all-time among NCAA and NAIA coaches at all levels (nearly 1300 schools) his next win will tie him with former North Carolina Tarheels coach Dean Smith.

Series With UIS

The Prairie Stars lead the all-time series 4-3 and defeated the Cards 79-63 last season in Springfield.

Triple Threat

The Cardinals have cooled down from behind the arc in the last four games. Jewell has slipped to 14th in the GLVC in three-point percentage at .347.

Whelan and Dealin

Junior Guard Patrick Whelan is sixth in the GLVC in scoring thus far in 2016-17. He is averaging 17.1 and is 11th and sixth in field goal percentage and three-point percentage respectively.

Conference Games

The Cards return home to GLVC action for the next two games. Jewell will wrap up non-conference play with a makeup game vs. Avila on January 16.

Dishing Out

Senior guard Jorge Perez-Laham is 12th in the GLVC in assists averaging 3.9 a game.

BY THE NUMBERS

SCOUTING THE PRAIRIE STARS

Both Eddie Longmeyer and Paxton Harmon scored career-highs but it wasn't enough at the Quincy Hawks (15-1, 5-0) best the Prairie Stars (5-8, 0-4) by a score of 81-71. Longmeyer scored a game-high 24 points on 9-of-15 from the field while senior forward Harmon also netted a career-high, notching 20 points on the night.

UIS fell behind 11-2 in the first minute and a half due to the Hawks connecting on their first four shots, three of which came from deep. Vince Walker responded by hitting his first two attempts from three, cutting the deficit to 15-12 at the first media timeout.

The Prairie Stars trimmed the Hawks lead to just one at 21-20 at the 12-minute mark but couldn't tie the game as Quincy went on a 7-0 run to push the lead back to eight. Continuing to fight back from their early deficit, UIS trailed 39-31 with 4:24 remaining in the before going on an 8-0 run, capped by an emphatic baseline dunk from Longmeyer.

This tied the game at 39 but a late bucket to end the half, gave Quincy a 41-39 advantage.

In the second half, Quincy upped their lead back to 11 after seven minutes had passed and then to 14 at the 11-minute mark. UIS cut the lead to seven on multiple occasions but couldn't hit the shot they needed to push the game to a two-possession affair.

Quincy --- who is currently ranked 27th in the nation --- pulled out their 14th consecutive victory as UIS fell for the third straight game.

Longmeyer hit the 20-point mark for the second time this season and the 24-point effort is the second highest scoring output from a UIS player all season and highest against a Division II team. Three players had three assists on the night, including Walker who for the fourth time this season hit at least four three's.

The **Cardinals** are 53-72 overall since officially joining NCAA Division II in the fall 2011. As an NAIA member, Holley guided eleven Jewell squads to HAAC Regular Season Conference Titles, and fourteen teams to the NAIA National Tournament with four of them reaching the Final Four (1993, 1995, 1996, 1997) and three reaching the Elite Eight (1988, 1992, 2004).

A win for the Cardinals would mean their fourth victory of the 2016-17 season and would stop an eight game losing skid. It would also be the Cardinals first GLVC win of the season.

A loss for the Cardinals would mean their tenth loss of the year and their ninth straight.

CARDINALS ON THE AIR

Live video streaming of Cardinal home events in football, soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, softball and baseball became a reality in 2011-12, as well as the live broadcast of Jewell's graduation in May of 2012 and 2013.

During the winter of 2012, live swimming was added to the production schedule, with the first Jewell tennis match broadcast in January of 2015.

There have also been nearly 1200 videos posted to the Jewell athletic website, www.JewellCardinals.com, produced by Rick Cole, director of broadcasting and community engagement, and the William Jewell College Sports Network.

Jewell also was named winner of the Great Lakes Valley Conference 2011-12 Award of Excellence for their participation and coverage of a significant community engagement activity during their first year in the conference.

In 2012 through 2014, Jewell home events that are streamed on the Jewell athletic website were also seen on Time-Warner Cable Sports Channel throughout the region.

Beginning in the 2013-14 school year, the WJCSN has featured as many as six different cameras to cover events, and has expanded to slow-motion replays and on-screen graphics as well.

Workers on the live broadcast staff are mainly Jewell work-study students who train and work as part of their financial aid package at Jewell.

"I think our online telecasts are the best in the GLVC," said Cole. "It's a tribute to the College for allowing me to produce coverage in the way I think suits us best, and to the students at Jewell for executing the plan."

Cole is also an intricate part of the development of the GLVC Sports Network and helps broadcast multiple conference championship events.

Larry Holley has been the Head Men's Basketball Coach at William Jewell for 37 years (1979-80 was his first season) where the basketball court is named in his honor. He has received 14 Coach of the Year Awards including the prestigious Sears/NABC NAIA National Coach of the Year Award in 1996 (he was the first NAIA coach to receive this award from the NABC). He has also been selected to five Halls of Fame: the Greater Kansas City Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the William Jewell College Athletic Hall of Fame, the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) Hall of Fame and the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. In 2011 he was honored by the Kansas City Sports Commission with the Earl Smith Award inducting Coach Holley into the Greater Kansas City Amateur Sports Hall of Champions. In May of 2003 he was a court coach at the USA Basketball Pan American Trials in Colorado Springs, CO. He was also recently a recipient of the Gary Filbert 'Legacy' Award for lifetime achievement in basketball in the state of Missouri. It is the highest honor given by the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association.

Holley's coaching background includes: one year at Harrisburg, MO High School (he was the head coach of 6 teams: varsity, JV and JH boys and girls – he coached 91 games – record of 65-26 – varsity boys were 17-11, varsity girls 24-2); six years at Central Methodist College (record of 61-93 – named HAAC Coach of the Year in 1971-72, the first year of the HAAC Conference), and four years at Northwest Missouri State University (two as the top assistant and two as the head coach: record of 26-26 – set an NCAA record in his final year at Northwest by going 15-0 at home and 0-11 on the road – which included wins over 5 nationally ranked teams).

Since his return to his alma mater in the fall of 1979 he has guided eleven Jewell squads to HAAC Regular Season Conference Titles, and fourteen to the NAIA National Tournament with four of them reaching the Final Four (1993, 1995, 1996, 1997) and three reaching the Elite Eight (1988, 1992, 2004). Holley's teams have had two winning streaks that will be hard to top: a 43-game home court winning streak (began with an 89-66 win over Missouri Valley – 1/21/84 - through a 73-65 win over Cameron, OK – 1/7/87) and a 45-game Heart of America Athletic Conference winning streak that included 21 road wins in a row (began with a 77-57 win over Missouri Valley – 1/28/85 - through a 71-61 win over Tarkio – 2/4/88).

Coach Holley has guided the Cardinals to twenty-four 20-win seasons (fourteen of his teams have had 25 or more wins and four have won 30 or more games). His 37-year record at Jewell is 793-416 (.656). His overall record in 43 years is 880-533 (.622). His 877 career wins ranks him:

- #1 all-time among Missouri 4-year college coaches
- #3 among all active NCAA Division II coaches
- #11 all-time among NCAA coaches at all levels (Divisions I, II, III)
- #13 all-time among NCAA and NAIA coaches at all levels (nearly 1300 schools)

There have been numerous outstanding wins in his tenure at Jewell but three stand out: the first was Jewell's 1988 NAIA District 16 Championship Game win over Drury that propelled the Cardinals into Holley's first ever NAIA National Tournament while the other two occurred at Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium: the Cardinals win over NCAA Division I UMKC in 2004 and Jewell's win in the opening round of the NAIA Division I Tournament in 2009 over #1 ranked Rogers State, OK.

In February of 2014 Coach Holley's Cardinals took on Harry Statham and the McKendree Bearcats. Statham came into the game with 1077 wins, best all time in any division of college basketball) Coach Holley came in at 852 wins. Together, never had so many wins by head coaches (1929) been represented in a meeting between those coaches. That night belonged to the Cards and Coach Holley, who won is third game against Statham with no losses in head-to-head matchups.

Holley has coached 24 NAIA All-Americans including six 1st team selections and one who was named NAIA II National Player of the Year (Brook Russell: 1996). Twenty-six of his players have been named NAIA Academic All-Americans. While at Jewell 145 out of 151 of his fourth year players have graduated (96%)! Coach Holley's teams were consistently ranked in the NAIA's Top 25 including #1 rankings in 1996 and 2004. They also received the #1 seed in the National Tournament in 2004.

Holley is a 1967 Jewell graduate. He lettered four times in each of three sports (cross country, basketball & track). He was captain of each sport and capped his career by being named Jewell's Athlete of the Year as a senior. He scored 1122 points in his basketball career at Jewell (#7 on the scoring chart at the time – currently #37) and was an All-Conference and All-District selection as a senior. Off the court he was: President of his fraternity (Lambda Chi Alpha); President of the J Club (letter winner's organization); Vice-President of the senior class; a member of Aeos (senior men's honorary fraternity); selected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities; and he was the recipient of the Colonel Alexander Doniphan Award that goes to the senior man deemed most likely to succeed. He was also a member of the Concert and Pep Bands and Chapel Choir all four years.

Larry is a graduate of Jameson, MO High School where his dad was Superintendent of Schools (and coached basketball) and his mother was a teacher (and Principal of the school). During his days at Jameson he was involved in numerous activities: he traveled to Columbia, MO for five State Events as a senior (Basketball, Indoor Track, Outdoor Track, Music and Speech):

Basketball (he was Jameson's first ever 1st Team All State Selection as a senior after leading the Huskies to a record of 33-1 and 3rd Place in the Missouri Class S State Tournament – Fritz Krisler of the Kansas City Star named him the Best Class S Player in the State – his jersey is now retired); Track (he was the State Indoor Champion in the Class S Mile Run and placed 4th in the State Outdoor Meet); Music (he received I ratings in Trumpet and Vocal Solos as a junior and senior at the State Music Contest); Speech (he received I ratings in Poetry Reading and Radio Speaking at the District Contest and competed at the State Contest as a senior)...he was also Valedictorian of his graduating class.

Larry and his wife Linda reside in Liberty. Larry has three daughters (Lindsay – a 1998 William Jewell graduate; Lauren, a 2002 William Jewell graduate; and Lacey, a 2003 graduate of Drake University) and three grandchildren (Lindsay's children: Reagan, 9 and Evan, 7) and Lacey's daughter, Brea (born 12/6/14).

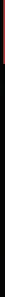
