


SETTING THE SCENE

The William Jewell women's basketball team looks to get back on track this weekend as they open Great Lakes Valley Conference play, hosting Maryville on Saturday afternoon before McKendree comes to town on Monday.

THE SERIES

The Cardinals are 6-10 against Maryville in the NCAA era and are seeking their first win over the Saints since January 2021. Jewell has gone back and forth with the Bearcats of McKendree, holding a 6-5 lead in the NCAA era series and winning four of the last six.

CARDINAL NOTES

Ayden Shannon has dished out a team best 11 assists through five games this season for an average of 2.2. Meanwhile, the freshman point guard has committed just four turn-overs for one of the top assist-to-turnover ratio in the conference at 2.75.

The Cardinals are young this winter but also long and athletic which has accounted for an average of 3.2 blocks per game, second best in the GLVC, led by five from Rachel Senn. Senn, Chloe Frank and Abigail Jones are each in the top-10 in the league in total blocks while Shannon and Elizabeth Ernsting also have two apiece.

Jewell is looking for their first conference win since a 72-66 victory over Rockhurst to close the regular season in February 2021.

Chloe Frank has presented a match up problems for each of the Cardinals first five opponents. The six-foot freshman has the size of a power forward but the shooting touch of a small guard. Frank enters the week ranked fifth in the GLVC in three point field goal percentage of 43.5% while hitting 10 total, highest on the team and sixth best in the league.

Ten different players has appeared in all five games this season, for an average of at least seven minutes. The Cardinals have been relatively well balanced in minutes played with only three, Frank, Ayden Shannon, and Emree Zars, averaging better than 20 minutes per game.

The competition area was renamed to Larry Holley Court to honor the legendary men's basketball coach who served the College for 40 years. After returning to his alma mater in the fall of 1979 he has guided 11 Jewell squads to HAAC regular season conference championships, and 14 to the NAIA National Tournament appearances. Four of those teams reached the Final Four (1993, 1995, 1996, 1997) with three finishing in the Elite Eight (1988, 1992, 2004). In total, Holley coached 24 NAIA All-Americans including six first team selections and one NAIA-II National Player of the Year (Brook Russell, 1996). Twenty-six of his players were named NAIA Scholar-Athletes and more than 98% of fourth year players earned their degree.

A 1967 Jewell graduate, Holley scored 1,122 points in his career and was an All-Conference and All-District selection as a senior. Off the court he was president of his fraternity (Lambda Chi Alpha); president of the J Club (letter winner's organization); Vice-President of the senior class, a member of Aeons (senior men's honorary fraternity), selected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, and he was the recipient of the Colonel Alexander Doniphan Award (now named for Bill Summers) that goes to the senior man deemed most likely to succeed. He was also a member of the Concert and Pep Bands and Chapel Choir all four years. Coach Holley passed away on May 12, 2022 at the age of 77.

The Mabee Center, which can seat approximately 2,400 fans, is home to the William Jewell basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams as well as Kregse Pool, home of the Jewell swimming team. # Jill SLOMINSKI

## Head Coach • 27th Season

Jill Slominski is now in her 27th year as the head coach of the women's basketball program at William Jewell. During her time at Jewell she has amassed an overall record

of 460-345, entering the 2022-2023 season, making her the winningest active coach in the GLVC and 21st in NCAA Division II.

Slominski has coached nine teams to 20 or more wins with four having won 25 or more and the 2004-05 team holding the program record for wins in a season with 28. Her teams have qualified for nine of the last 10 GLVC Tournaments, while mentoring 14 All-GLVC performers, with four first teamers and two All-Freshman Team members.

In total, Slominski has coached 67 All-Conference selections, including four Freshmen of the Year, along with nine players to 17 All-America honors, with the first in the NCAA era coming in 2021 in forward Kiara Bradley. During the NAIA era, Slominski was a three-time conference Coach of the Year (2003, 07, 10), won three conference championships and made seven appearances in the national tournament, reaching the Sweet 16 three times. Along with their success on the court, Slominski's teams have long been standouts in the classroom as well with 102 players having been named to the Academic All-GLVC list over the last 10 years, including back-to-back season of 100% of the roster earning the honor. The Cardinals have finished in the top-10 in team GPA in Division II during each of the last two years, including a spot at No. 7 in 2022. Fourteen players have earned the prestigious GLVC Council of Presidents' Academic Excellence Award while 13 were named NAIA Scholar All-Americans.

Prior to coming to Jewell, she was the interim head coach at Ottawa University (Kan.) in the spring semester of 1996 after previously serving as an assistant at Jewell from 1993-1995.

Slominski was a four-year starter in both basketball and softball at Northwestern College (Iowa), earning All-Conference honors on the hardwood in her final season. She was inducted into the Vinton-Shellsburg High School Hall of Fame after

earning First Team All-State honors in basketball as a senior as the third leading scorer in Iowa. She was also an All-State honoree as a utility player on the diamond and earned 11 total letters across three sports.

A native of Vinton, Iowa, Slominski is a 1993 graduate of Northwestern (IA) with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and a 1997 graduate of the University of Missouri-Kansas City with a master's in curriculum and instruction of physical education.

She is married to husband Josh and has four children, daughters Rylan and Addisyn, a 2021 William Jewell graduate and Cardinal track & field athlete, along with sons Tyson and Leighton. She also has two step children, Cooper and Isabella.

William Jewell is a private college in Liberty, Mo., with a long history of cultivating thought leaders and innovators who have pursued meaningful lives throughout the world. Founded as a Baptist college, we are proud of our rich history and heritage, and today are an independent, four-year college.

As settlers migrated West in the 1830s, a group of Baptists who lived along the Missouri River envisioned a college at the edge of the American wilderness in Liberty. Many towns in Missouri wanted the college, but Clay County Baptists, joined by Mexican War veteran Colonel Alexander Doniphan and Dr. William Jewell, a physician, legislator and Baptist layman who donated land for a college, persevered with grassroots fundraising.

The General Association (forerunner of the Missouri Baptist Convention) approved a proposal, and the Missouri Legislature granted a charter to found a college in 1849. Named for its key founder, William Jewell College's relationship with the Baptist Convention continued through 2003.

Challenging times in Missouri's frontier days forced a number of colleges to close, but strong leadership enabled Jewell to forge ahead, honoring the founders who believed in the power of education to change the world. As students entered the Civil War, classes were suspended and Federal troops occupied campus, using Jewell Hall as a lookout point, an infirmary and a stable.

When Jewell reopened, enrollment began to steadily climb. World War I and the burning of a nearby women's college brought female students to Jewell, where they were admitted on the same terms as men beginning in 1920. The GI Bill created another influx of students post-World War II. In the decades that followed, Jewell strengthened its academic profile, adding numerous new programs. In 1982, the College invested in study abroad programs and developed partnerships with Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England to create the Oxbridge Honors Program. Jewell emerged as a national liberal arts college, garnering attention for rigorous curriculum and outstanding student outcomes.

Today, Jewell sits at the edge of both urban and rural landscapes. In one direction lie rolling hills and Midwestern countryside, reminiscent of the College's rustic beginnings. From another vantage, the Kansas City skyline graces the horizon. Our prime location in a thriving metropolis means rich cultural offerings for student, while Jewell's partnerships with Kansas City corporations, entrepreneurs and alumni yield internships, mentors, research programs, dynamic lecturers and career possibilities.

Jewell has been called "the campus of achievement" in recognition of students' prestigious scholarships and fellowships, placement in the country's finest graduate schools and contributions to their professions and communities beyond The Hill. Recognition is an outcome of Jewell's investment in students, inspiring them to become lifelong learners, teaching them to think critically, challenging them to ask tough questions, encouraging them to pursue spiritual development, engaging them in the world and preparing them for lives of leading and serving.
