DUKES HOST RAMS FOR 2016 HOMECOMING

- Game eight of the 45th season of JMU football takes place Saturday, Oct. 29 when the Dukes host Rhode Island at Bridgeforth Stadium for a 3:30 p.m. kick.
- It is the first game in the second half of the conference slate, as JMU looks to build on a 4-0 start in CAA play. JMU also looks to improve on a 4-0 record at home this season.
- The game will be streamed live on MadizONE HD SportsNet, presented by the JMU Alumni Association, and can be heard on the JMU/Sprint Broadcast Network. The Homecoming matchup is sponsored by the Virginia Lottery and the 2016 season is presented by CarMax.

THE SERIES

- Saturday marks the 12th meeting all-time between JMU and Rhode Island, but the first since 2012.
- JMU owns an 8-3 record versus URI in the series and have won six straight -- by a combined 196-108.
- JMU is 5-1 all-time against the Rams at home, with the lone loss in Harrisonburg coming back on Sept. 22, 2001 - a 16-12 setback. It was also URI's last win against JMU.
- Last time the teams met, JMU cruised to a 32-7 victory at Rhode Island on Sept. 22, 2012. In that game, Justin Thorpe was 26-for-40 for 340 yards and two touchdowns. JMU led 8-7 but reeled off 24 straight, including two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to put the game away.

CAA RACE TIGHTENING UP AS SECOND HALF BEGINS

- Entering the second half of conference play, JMU and Stony Brook are the two teams tied atop the CAA standings, holding identical 4-0 marks. Four other teams are in the hunt for a CAA championship this year, as a combined six teams are separated by just one game.
- Following the Dukes and Seawolves are Richmond, Villanova and New Hampshire, all of which are 4-1, and Maine, which is 3-1.
- JMU has already notched wins at Maine and New Hampshire and plays at Richmond and Villanova next month. JMU and Stony Brook do not play this season, which means there's a mathematical chance for two teams to finish 8-0 in league play for the first time ever.
- Since the league schedule expanded to an eight-game conference slate in 1988, only seven teams have gone unbeaten, most recently in 2014 when New Hampshire won the league title.

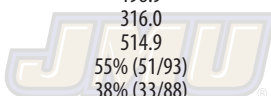
SCHOR COLLECTS SECOND PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

- Following a career performance and a conference road win, Bryan Schor was named Colonial Athletic Association Football Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season on Oct. 17.
- Schor amassed career bests of 334 yards of total offense and five total touchdowns in JMU's 42-39 win at New Hampshire on Oct. 16. He completed 18 of 27 passes for 264 yards and four touchdowns, both career highs. Schor also rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries (5.8 ypc).
- He has thrown for more than 200 yards in four games this season and has scored touchdowns through the air and on the ground on three occasions. Through seven games, Schor is 103-for-152 (67.8 percent) for 1,324 yards and 10 touchdowns, and he has run for 385 yards and eight scores.
- Schor leads the CAA in total offensive touchdowns (18) and pass efficiency (158.6 rating) and is second in total offense per game (244.1), tied for third in rushing touchdowns (8) and fourth in passing yards per game (189.1).

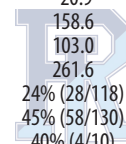

SCOUTING RHODE ISLAND

- The Rams enter Saturday's game with a 1-7 record, including an 0-5 mark in CAA play.
- They have lost three straight after falling 28-21 to Maine last weekend at home.
- Rhody averages 12.9 points per game while conceding 33.8 to its foes. During conference play it has been limited to 9.6 points per game and just three total points in its two CAA road games.
- Jordan Vazzano has passed for 692 yards, three touchdowns and eight interceptions, completing 38 percent of his passes.
- T.J. Anderson and Harold Cooper have combined for 566 rushing yards and five touchdowns, while Harold Buckner III and Khayri Denny have collectively produced 44 receptions for 601 yards.
- Jim Fleming is in his third season at the helm of the URI program and is 3-28 during his time in Kingston. He also led Sacred Heart in the early 2000's, going 21-1 in two seasons for a 24-29 career record as a head coach.

ABDULLAH A TOP-FIVE RUSHER

- Khalid Abdullah ran into the top five all-time at JMU in career rushing, as he passed Alvin Banks (2,694) in JMU's Oct. 15 win at New Hampshire.
- Abdullah now stands at 2,723 yards, which is just 60 yards off fourth-place Curtis Keaton (2,783, 1998-99).
- He is also tied for fourth in career rushing touchdowns and sixth in rush attempts (490).

TWO TD DAY FOR PAIR OF RECEIVERS

- Terrence Alls and Brandon Ravenel each recorded their first career game with two receiving touchdowns at New Hampshire.
- It was the first time since Sept. 19, 2009, that two receivers achieved the feat when Mike Caussin and Rockeed McCarter each caught a pair of touchdowns.
- That also came from two different quarterbacks, as Justin Thorpe had the first and Drew Dudzik reeled off the next three.
- This season, Alls and Ravenel lead the receiving corps, combining for 40 receptions, 545 yards and six touchdowns.

HOLDING STEADY IN THE NAT'L RANKS

- Following the bye, JMU held on to its national rankings in both major polls, coming in at No. 8 in the STATS FCS Top 25 and No. 5 in the FCS Coaches Poll.
- JMU is one of four teams in the CAA to be ranked, as the Dukes were joined by Richmond (#6/6), Villanova (#11/13) and Stony Brook (#22/20).
- New Hampshire and Albany received votes in both polls, while Maine was recognized in the media poll.
- JMU is also ranked sixth in the Athlon Sports Power Poll and eighth in the HERO Sports Media Top 25.

KHALID CLOSING IN ON TD RECORD

- Khalid Abdullah has quickly surged as one of the most effective backs in JMU history, ranking in the top 8 of five separate offensive categories.
- Through 40 career games, Abdullah ranks tied for fourth with 30 rushing touchdowns, needing just two to tie for the record and three to own it outright.
- He is also tied for fourth in total touchdowns (32), fifth in rushing yards (2,723), sixth in rush attempts (490) and eighth in in scoring (192).

JMU AMONG ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

- Four JMU players currently rank in the top 20 of the NCAA FCS career active leaders.
- Khalid Abdullah ranks ninth in career rushing touchdowns (30) among the nation's active standouts. He is 10th in rushing yards (2,723), 11th in total touchdowns (32), 12th in rush attempts (490) and 16th in yards per carry (5.6).
- Defensively, Taylor Reynolds is tied for fifth in interceptions (10) and seventh in passes defended (36), and Andrew Ankrah is 10th in forced fumbles (6).
- Gunnar Kane's career punt average (40.6) is 19th amongst the FCS leaders.

JMU, HOME OF THE BEST RB DUO

- This season, both Khalid Abdullah and Cardon Johnson have proved to be elite running backs in the FCS, despite splitting carries.
- Abdullah runs for 122.0 yards per game, and Johnson averages 90.0 per outing. The duo has combined for 17 rushing touchdowns and 19 total scores.
- They rank first and fourth in the CAA, respectively, in rushing yards per contest.
- Abdullah turned in five consecutive 100-yard rushing performances, while Johnson has tallied three.
- Adding in Bryan Schor's two 100-yard games and Trai Sharp's one, JMU has gone over 100 rushing on 11 occasions.

UP NEXT FOR THE DUKES

- JMU opens a two-game road trip on Nov. 5 when it travels down the road to face CAA rival Richmond at Robins Stadium.
- Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. and will be televised on Comcast SportsNet.
- It will be the 34th meeting all-time, with UR leading 18-15. JMU is 8-8 in games played in Richmond, including four of the previous six road matchups.
- Last time they met, the Spiders snapped JMU's seven-game win streak with a 59-49 victory in Harrisonburg on Oct. 24, 2015.
- The game was played in front of a Bridgeforth Stadium record 26,069 fans following ESPN College GameDay's visit to the Quad and Wilson Hall on JMU's campus.
- It was the most points scored in a single game in the series as the teams combined for 1,305 yards of total offense, including 782 passing.
- Vad Lee racked up 418 total yards, passing for 294 and two touchdowns and running for 124

EXTENDING DRIVES A STRENGTH

- JMU is off to a 6-1 start this year, not by just producing one of the nation's top rushing attacks. A constant throughout has been the Dukes' ability to convert on third down.
- JMU ranks second nationally in third-down offense, as it moves the chains a CAA-best 55 percent of the time.
- Defensively, the Dukes are much improved in their third-down defense. Through seven games, JMU ranks 49th in FCS and sixth in the CAA, allowing teams to convert 38 percent of their third-down tries. Last year, JMU was last in the CAA and 108th in the country (46%).

DUKES MOVIN' ON FIRST POSSESSIONS

- JMU has been solid in the first quarter all year long, reeling off touchdowns on its opening possession in the first four games. Up until the second drive at Maine, the Dukes were 11-for-11 on first-quarter drives.
- The Dukes have only given up points on the first defensive appearance in one game, conceding a touchdown at North Carolina.
- In two of the past four games the JMU defense has forced a turnover on downs.

OFFENSIVE FIRE POWER

- JMU's offense has been a force for nearly three years now and the rushing attack has allowed the Dukes to be a prominent name amongst the NCAA leaders.
- The Dukes rank third in the country in rushing (316.0), total offense (514.9) and turnovers lost (6). They are fourth in scoring (44.4), first downs (189) and tackles for loss allowed (3.57) while ranking fifth in fumbles lost (2) and eighth in completion percentage (65.7%).

NATION'S LEADERS

- Aside from the team categories, numerous players rank highly in FCS statistics.
- Khalid Abdullah is second in total touchdowns

(12), third in rushing (854) and scoring (10.3), fourth in rushing scores (11) and fifth in rushing per game (122.0) and yards per carry (7.43).

- Bryan Schor is sixth in completion percentage (67.8%), 11th in pass efficiency (158.7), 14th in yards per pass attempt (8.71), 16th in rushing scores (8) and 17th in point responsibility (15.4).
- Cardon Johnson is 16th in yards per carry (6.12), 25th in rushing (630) and 28th in rushing per game (90.0).
- Rashard Davis is still the lone player in FCS with two punt returns for touchdowns and Charles Tutt is eighth in fumble recoveries (2).

RAVENEL CONTINUES TO MOVE ON UP

- On Oct. 15, Brandon Ravenel turned in his first career game with two receiving touchdowns.
- The senior ranks in the top 10 in three career categories following the New Hampshire game.
- He is fifth in career receptions (135), seventh in receiving yards (1,795) and tied for eight in receiving touchdowns (13).
- Only five yards shy of 1,800 for his career, he needs just 113 to enter the top five and two more receiving scores will also be good for fifth.

JMU WINS WILD ONE IN DURHAM

- Terrence Alls and Brandon Ravenel reeled in two touchdown catches each and JMU was able to hold off New Hampshire's furious rally for a 42-39 win on Oct. 15.
- JMU led 42-12 with 10 minutes to play before UNH scored 27 straight to trim the lead to three. After successfully recovering an onside kick, JMU kneeled down to snap the Wildcats' 17-game, regular-season win streak at home.
- Bryan Schor had a career-high five total touchdowns, as he passed for 264 yards and four touchdowns, both career highs. He also ran for 70 yards and a score.
- Jordan Brown made a career-high 16 tackles, while Gage Steele tallied 15. Curtis Oliver had nine stops, including 1.5 sacks.

WINS TOUGH TO COME BY AT UNH

- On Oct. 15, JMU snapped New Hampshire's 17-game, regular-season home win streak with a 42-39 win in Durham.
- It was just the seventh home loss for the Wildcats since the start of the 2007 season and was JMU's first win there since 2006.
- The Dukes also came closer to evening the odds in Durham, improving to 4-5 all-time at UNH. It also tied the overall series at 8-8.

TWO TOUCHDOWNS, FOUR SECONDS

- JMU used big passing plays to open up a lead at New Hampshire but a stretch of just four seconds allowed JMU to go up by 30.
- Bryan Schor connected with Terrence Alls on a 26-yard touchdown pass to extend JMU's lead to 35-12 with 10:04 to play.
- On the ensuing kickoff, UNH's Garette Craig struggled to handle the ball and Marcell Johnson forced a fumble. Charles Tutt recovered the fumble and scampered in from six yards out for the team's second touchdown in only four seconds, upping the lead to 42-12.

DUKES THRILL FANS IN W&M WIN

- JMU improved to 3-0 in CAA play with a thrilling 31-24 triumph against William & Mary on Oct. 8.
- Khalid Abdullah rushed for a career-high 194 yards and three touchdowns, including a 74-yard score in the final minute to ice the game. Abdullah produced five runs of at least 10 yards, adding in rushes of 22 and 29, to go with the long touchdown.
- Taylor Reynolds made two of the biggest defensive stops in the ballgame. First, he stuffed Kendall Anderson at the one with a loss of four on third and goal in the first quarter. He capped his Saturday with an interception in the end zone with only 1:22 to play, preserving JMU's seven-point lead.
- On the opening drive of the second half, Curtis Oliver made his first career sack, dropping Steve Cluley for a 17-yard loss. Later in the third, Cluley put the ball on the ground in the red zone, allowing for Darrious Carter to fall on it for his first fumble recovery.

LONG DRIVE PAYS DIVIDENDS

- Leading 17-10 late in the third, Darrious Carter recovered a fumble in the red zone, setting up for what would be a lengthy drive.
- JMU churned 8:08 off the clock on 19 plays, the longest drive by nearly three minutes, and the end result was a Cardon Johnson two-yard touchdown to make it 24-10 with 10:55 to play.
- It was JMU's longest drive in over five years and best since a 19-play possession that spanned 10:06 at North Carolina back on Sept. 3, 2011.

ABDULLAH ADDED TO POTY LIST

- Khalid Abdullah was named to the Watch List for the STATS FCS National Offensive Player of the Year.
- Abdullah produced a stretch of five straight 100-yard rushing games and is one of the nation's top backs, ranking second in total touchdowns (12) and third in rushing touchdowns (11).
- He is third in rushing (854) and scoring (10.3) and fifth in rushing per game (122.0) and yards per carry (7.43).
- This is the third straight season a JMU offensive player has made the list, as Vad Lee was on the Watch List a year ago and was a finalist for the former Walter Payton Award in 2014, finishing fourth in the final voting.

HEREFORD MAKING MOST OF OPP

- Gage Steele was hindered by injury early in the season, allowing for another player to step up - Brandon Hereford.
- He's taken full advantage of the reps, leading JMU this season in tackles (58).
- He ranks tied for fifth in the CAA in tackles per game (8.7) and fourth in solo stops (5.0).
- Hereford made a season-high 12 tackles against Central Connecticut State and followed it up with 11 at North Carolina, which included a career-high 10 solo stops.
- He has at least five tackles in every game, and has tallied seven or more in five. Hereford also has 4.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack this season.

SCHOR'S NETS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Quarterback Bryan Schor produced career highs of 312 yards of offense and four total touchdowns to lead JMU to a 43-20 victory against Delaware on Oct. 1. Two days later, he was honored by being named CAA Co-Offensive Player of the Week.
- Schor was 19-for-25 for 209 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 103 yards and three touchdowns, tying his career best. It was his second 100-yard rushing performance.
- In the first half, he completed 14 of 17 attempts for 148 yards and a touchdown while running for 63 yards and two scores to help JMU build a

26-7 halftime lead. He finished the game going 5-for-9 through the air in the second half for his third 200-yard passing game of the season.

RUSHING ATTACK KEYS JMU IN WIN

- JMU nearly turned in its second 400-yard rushing performance of the year versus Delaware with 398 rushing yards and five scores.
- Khalid Abdullah led the way with 159 yards and two touchdowns on just 10 carries. Bryan Schor had 103 yards and tied his career high with three scores, and Cardon Johnson added 93.
- The Dukes ranks second in FCS, averaging 339.8 rushing yards per game, being only bested by Mike Houston's former school - The Citadel - which averages 388.8.

DUKES ROLL OVER UD FOR CAA WIN

- Bryan Schor accounted for four total touchdowns and over 300 yards of offense to lead JMU to a 43-20 win against Delaware.
- Schor combined for 312 yards, passing for 209 and a touchdown and rushing for 103 and three scores, tying his career high.
- Khalid Abdullah had his fourth straight 100-yard game with 159 and two touchdowns on 10 carries. Cardon Johnson added 93 on the ground and Terrence Alls made four catches for 70 yards and a score.
- With the game tied at 7-7, JMU reeled off 33 straight points in the middle quarters to build a 40-3 lead. During that run, JMU's defense forced Delaware into four punts, made one interception and had a turnover on downs.
- It was the second-biggest win for JMU in the series, coming just one point shy of the single-game scoring record versus UD. The 607 yards of offense was also the most gained by JMU against the Hens. It was just the seventh time in UD's history it allowed more than 600 yards to an opponent.

DUKES RALLY FOR WIN IN CAA OPENER

- Khalid Abdullah and Cardon Johnson combined for 282 rushing yards and three touchdowns to lead JMU to a 31-20 comeback victory to open CAA play at Maine on Sept. 24.
- The defense thwarted Maine's offense in the second half, limiting the Black Bears to 120 yards of offense, including just 21 in the fourth quarter. The Dukes also forced four turnovers - three by interceptions and one via turnover on downs - while producing four sacks.
- Abdullah ran for a career-high 172 yards and two touchdowns, while Johnson tallied 110 yards and a score. The duo had a pair of long touchdown runs - an 85 yards by Abdullah and a 52 yarder by Johnson. Abdullah's career-long TD was the fifth-longest rush in JMU history.
- Brandon Hereford led the Dukes in tackles for the third straight game, making nine stops. Jimmy Moreland and Simeyon Robinson both had seven tackles. Robinson was a force in the trenches with a career-best 4.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. It was the most tackles by a defensive lineman this season and the most in 13 games.

ABDULLAH NAMED CAA'S TOP PLAYER

- Following the win at Maine, the CAA named Khalid Abdullah Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 27.
- Abdullah had a career day, rushing for 172 yards and two touchdowns. His performance including a career-long 85-yard touchdown - the fifth longest rush in JMU football history.
- It was his third straight 100-yard game.

DEFENSE OVERWHELMS MAINE

- Down at halftime, JMU's defense came out strong in the second half, holding a solid Black Bear team to just seven points and 120 yards of offense in the second half.

- Simeyon Robinson led the charge with his career-best 4.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- JMU produced three interceptions, two of which later turned into points on the ensuing offensive drives. The Dukes, who had gone three games without a sack, was fierce at the line in the second half, making four sacks, including three straight in the fourth.

TWO-GAME SCORING RECORD

- JMU set a two-game scoring record to open 2016 with 136 points in the first two games.
- JMU amassed 562.0 yards of offense on average in the wins over Morehead State and Central Connecticut State.
- The Dukes broke their single-game scoring record in the opener on Sept. 3, putting up 80 points against the Eagles, and tacked on 56 more points in the five-touchdown win in week two versus the Blue Devils.
- In the MSU win, the 73-point triumph was the largest in the 45-year history of the program, as JMU produced 10 rushing touchdowns, just one off the FCS record of 11 by Georgia Southern in 2004. It was also a CAA record for most points against a Division I team.

JMU AGAINST FBS OPPOSITION

- Week three's matchup at UNC was JMU's 25th meeting all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents.
- JMU is now 5-20 all-time against FBS teams, after the 56-28 defeat. However, the 28 total points was the second-most JMU had scored against an ACC team, only being bested by the 35 scored in an OT loss at Maryland in 2009.
- JMU last won against FBS competition in 2015, downing SMU 48-45 last September in Dallas. In the win, Vad Lee became the first Division I player to run and pass for over 275 yards in the same game.
- JMU has won twice against ACC squads. The first ACC win came back in 1982 - a 21-17 win at Virginia. The latter and most notable FBS win in JMU history occurred six seasons back - a 21-16 triumph at Virginia Tech in 2010.
- The Dukes also picked up a pair of wins in back-to-back season at Navy - a 24-20 victory in 1989 and a 16-7 win in 1990.
- JMU has played one FBS team a year each season since 2007, going 2-8 in those matchups.

ABDULLAH SURPASSES 2,000 RUSH YDS

- Running back Khalid Abdullah joined an elite group in the 45-year history of JMU football as he is the 14th player to gain 2,000 career rushing yards,
- He did so in the win over CCSU, gaining 113 yards for his fifth career 100-yard game.

RUSHING PROWESS IN GAME ONE

- JMU used the ground game to power itself past Morehead State. The Dukes ran for a program-record 10 rushing touchdowns, one off the FCS record set by Georgia Southern in 2004.
- Though Khalid Abdullah and Cardon Johnson started things for the Dukes, it was all four running backs and the quarterback who nearly broke the team record for rushing in a game.
- JMU tallied 498 rushing yards against MSU, just three off the record. It was led by Bryan Schor, who accrued 129 yards and three touchdowns, as he takes his nation-leading 12.9 yards per carry into week two.
- Trai Sharp posted 110 yards and a score, while Johnson had 104 and two touchdowns. Taylor Woods had a strong outing too, going for 89 yards and three scores, the first touchdowns of his career.
- Abdullah, who carried the ball first, was able to enjoy everyone's contribution as he tallied 43 yards and a TD. The senior needs just 88 yards to reach 2,000 rushing yards for his career.

CONTROLLING THE FIELD VS. MSU

- JMU mustered 11 touchdowns and a field goal versus Morehead State due in large part to the distinct advantage on special teams.
- The Dukes' average starting field position was at their own 47-yard line, as opposed to MSU beginning drives on average at its own 17.
- JMU only had two drives beginning at or inside its own 20. JMU began four drives in enemy territory while also taking back a 76-yard punt return for a score, all by the midway point of the third quarter.

FIRST DRIVE OF YEAR - LIKELY RUSH TD

- Since 2010, JMU is 5-2 in season openers. In the five wins, there are quite a few similarities to how the first offensive drive ends.
- In the five wins, JMU has scored a rushing touchdown on the opening drive, as opposed to 3-and-outs in the two defeats, both by FBS opponents.
- The five rush scores have been by five different players (3 RBs, 2 QBs) and have all been one-yard touchdown carries.

COACHING FIRSTS

- In just his first game at the helm, Mike Houston coached the Dukes to a program-record score and margin of victory.
- That point total broke the previous mark of 76, set back in the season opener in 1995.
- Ironically, in 1995, JMU welcomed a new head - Alex Wood. Wood and the Dukes downed Morgan State 76-7 to open that year.
- There must be something with first-year head coaches facing teams named MSU in their inaugural game at home, eh?

RAVEN WITH THE TAKEAWAYS

- Senior Raven Greene was part of two of JMU's five takeaways in the season-opening win, as he recovered a fumble and picked off a pass, both resulting in JMU touchdowns.
- It was Greene's first two-takeaway game of his career. He also led the squad with a team-best seven tackles.

PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN CAA

- The Dukes were selected to finish third in the Colonial Athletic Association this season in a voting by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, as announced on July 26 at CAA Football Media Day in Baltimore.
- Five players were named Preseason All-CAA selections in Mitchel Kirsch, Andrew Ankrah, Brandon Ravenel, Taylor Reynolds and Raven Greene. The five preseason picks were the most since 2007 when four were awarded the accolades.

ANKRAH ON NATIONAL WATCH LIST

- Returning All-American Andrew Ankrah was named to the Watch List for the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year award, honoring the nation's top defender in the subdivision.
- It's the first time since 2013 a player has been honored on this watch list, as former star Stephon Robertson was on the 2012 and 2013 lists for the former Buck Buchanan Award.
- Ankrah was a STATS Second Team All-American and First Team All-CAA honoree a year ago after he produced 56 tackles (11.0 for loss), 10.5 sacks and five forced fumbles.
- He ranked third nationally in forced fumbles and eighth in sacks.

THREE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- JMU had three players honored as Preseason All-Americans this summer, including a pair of returning All-Americans from a year ago.
- Mitchell Kirsch was an Athlon Sports FCS Preseason All-American and a STATS FCS Second Team Preseason All-American.
- Andrew Ankrah joined Kirsch on the Athlon Sports All-America list and was a First Team Preseason All-American by STATS.
- Taylor Reynolds was also recognized by STATS as a Third Team Preseason All-American.
- Kirsch and Ankrah were both named All-Americans in 2015, as they were both named STATS Second Team All-Americans, while Kirsch was an Associated Press Third Team All-American.

WATCH OUT FOR CARDON!

- JMU's rushing attack combined for over 3,000 yards last season, led by Cardon Johnson's 1,037 yards.
- The Dukes' top-returning back was honored amongst the top weapons in FCS, being named to the CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy Watch List.
- He ranked sixth nationally in yards per carry (6.44), while also ranking 37th in rushing yards (86.4) and 38th in rushing touchdowns (10).

DIGGING DEEPER INTO THE OPENER

- The Dukes are 24-20-1 all-time in season openers, dating back to 1972's inaugural season.
- JMU's last five season-opening defeats have all come at the hands of FBS programs, while the last FCS to beat JMU to open the year was Hampton's 31-28 win at JMU.
- Since that defeat, JMU is 9-0 at Bridgeforth Stadium on the opening weekend of the season.
- JMU is also 34-11 in home openers and have won 14 straight openers at Bridgeforth and 23 of the last 25.

HOUSTON REELS IN TRANSFERS

- In addition to the 33 true freshmen on the 2016 roster, Head Coach Mike Houston brought in quite a few transfers this season.
- A total of 10 players are first-year JMU players after transferring to the University either last winter or during the summer.
- Most notably, JMU has four power-five transfers new to the program in South Carolina quarterback Connor Mitch, Duke wide receiver Terrence Alls, Virginia defensive lineman Darrious Carter and Connecticut offensive lineman Zach Rugg.
- Fifteen current Dukes are transfers from other colleges while three came in after attending prep school for a year out of high school.



A NEW YEAR, A NEW BREED

- JMU enters the 2016 season under new leadership as Mike Houston was hired as JMU seventh head football coach on January 18.
- Houston spent the previous two seasons at The Citadel, leading the Bulldogs to a Southern Conference championship and FCS playoffs appearance a year ago. He was also head coach at Division II Lenoir-Rhyne for three seasons (2011-13), where he guided the Bears to three straight South Atlantic Conference crowns and a trip to the 2013 NCAA Division II championship.
- Following his hire, Houston hired an all-star coaching staff to lead the Dukes into 2016, highlighted by Defensive Coordinator Bob Trott (former Richmond DC) and Offensive Coordinator Donnie Kirkpatrick (former Chattanooga HC).
- The coaching staff also includes Bryan Stinespring (former Virginia Tech OC) and Byron Thweatt (former Virginia State HC). The staff now has three alumni in Stinespring, John Bowers and Drew Dudzik. Jeff Hanson also returned to coach the defensive line, a role he held for the 2013 season.

JMU VERSUS RANKED TEAMS

- Since 1985, the Dukes have played 138 games against ranked opponents and hold a 58-79-1 record in those contests.
- JMU's most notable win wasn't against a FCS foe, but that to FBS power Virginia Tech. On Sept. 11, 2010, Madison stunned then-No. 13 Virginia Tech 21-16 in Blacksburg.
- The Dukes have captured 27 victories against top-10 teams and three against a No. 1 team.
- JMU picked up its first win over a top-ranked team on Sept. 26, 1992 -- a 52-49 win at Youngstown State. Fourteen years later, on Oct. 14, 2006, JMU downed New Hampshire on the road, 42-23. More recently, the Dukes claimed a 35-32 triumph versus Appalachian State at home on Sept. 20, 2008.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY IN THE 'BURG

- Last October, JMU was chosen as a host for ESPN's College GameDay, marking the eighth time a non-FBS site hosted the iconic pregame show.
- James Madison was the 65th school and Harrisonburg was the 73rd different city to host the show.
- There was a total audience reach of 65,833,008 between Friday's live programming all the way through Saturday's premier show.
- A total of 12,000 spectators attended GameDay, which broadcasted live from the Quad and Wilson Hall on JMU's campus.

- That resulted in a Bridgeforth Stadium-record 26,069 fans being in attendance for JMU's Homecoming game versus Richmond.
- Duke Dog was the 53rd different mascot head Lee Corso donned at the end of the show.
- ESPN College GameDay's senior coordinating producer, Lee Fitting, is a 1996 graduate of JMU.
- Lee Corso described JMU's College GameDay as "one of the greatest shows we ever put on." He later added, "I hope we can return again to Harrisonburg!"
- On Saturday, Oct. 8, Lee Corso was honored for 20 years of his theatrical selections, to which JMU was highlighted in when he dressed as President Madison on the steps of Wilson Hall.

#NFLDUKES

- Six former James Madison stars are currently affiliated with franchises in the National Football League.
- Four players made the 53-man rosters while another was designated to the practice squad.
- All five Dukes have previous experience in the league, as three advanced to the playoffs a year ago, including one making the Super Bowl as a rookie.
- The group of Dukes consists of left outside linebacker Arthur Moats (Steelers), strong safety (Dean Marlowe (Panthers) offensive linemen Earl Watford (Cardinals) and Josh Wells (Jaguars) and tight end Daniel Brown (Bears).
- Moats is the veteran of the group, entering his seventh season in the NFL and the third in Pittsburgh.
- Last season, Marlowe won the NFC championship and advanced to the Super Bowl with the Panthers.
- Two other Dukes went to the playoffs as Watford's Cardinals fell to Carolina in the NFC title game, Moats' Steelers made it to the AFC divisional round.
- Brown was elevated from the practice squad to the active roster prior to week five, and he deflected a Redskins punt in the second half. After being waived by the Ravens, he was snagged by the Chicago Bears.
- Coaching in the NFL is John DeFilippo, who serves as the quarterbacks coach with the Philadelphia Eagles.
- Additionally, quarterback Vad Lee spent a short time with the CFL's Saskatchewan Roughriders, seeing action in three games.

ABOUT CAA FOOTBALL

- CAA Football has raised the profile of what was once the Yankee Conference, and later the Atlantic 10 Conference, since the league came under the CAA banner in 2007.

- Over the past nine years, CAA Football has established itself as one of the nation's premier FCS power conferences with regard to on-field success, television exposure, marketability and the achievements of its student-athletes in the classroom, in the community and at the next level.
- 2015 saw CAA Football once again send four programs to the FCS Championship, including a pair of national seeds for the second-straight year. Richmond went on to reach the national semifinal round, becoming CAA Football's 22nd all-time playoff semifinalist.
- Additionally, a total of 10 CAA Football student-athletes and coaches were named finalists for the prestigious STATS FCS national awards.
- CAA Football continued its success against non-conference opponents in 2015, finishing 19-11 against non-league foes. On Sept. 26, James Madison tallied the CAA's 32nd all-time win over an FBS opponent by upsetting SMU on the road, 48-45.
- For the second-straight season, a total of 17 CAA Football players were named to one or more All-America teams in 2015, led by consensus All-America cornerback DeAndre Houston-Carson of William & Mary. Five more student-athletes earned spots on the CoSIDA and FCS ADA Academic All-America lists.

KINGSTON, R.I. - Redshirt senior quarterback Justin Thorpe had his first career 300-yard passing game to lead #6/7 James Madison football team to a 32-7 victory in their Colonial Athletic Association opener at Rhode Island, Sept. 22. The Dukes are now 11-3 in CAA openers under head coach Mickey Matthews and move to 3-1 and 1-0 in the CAA, while the Rams fall to 0-3 and 0-2 in league play.

On its opening possession, JMU moved down the field, starting with a 37-yard completion from Thorpe to redshirt freshman tight end Derek Hart. Two plays later, Thorpe connected across the middle with redshirt senior tight end Brian Barlow for a 22-yard touchdown pass. JMU then went for two with an off-set formation, where redshirt junior Quintin Hunter ran it in to make it 8-0 JMU with just over 11 minutes to go in the first quarter.

The teams exchange possessions, and the Dukes took the ball over at its own 44 yard line. On third-and-7 from the JMU 48, Thorpe hit Robinson for a 40-yard completion. Two plays later Smith scored on end around from 8 yards out, with redshirt junior Cameron Starke's PAT making it 15-7 with 3:11 in first quarter.

On its second drive of the second half, the Dukes started out in good shape at the URI 40. JMU was able to get it down to the 6-yard line before the drive stalled. Starke came in and hit a 23-yard field goal with 5:40 to go in the third quarter to put Madison up 18-7.

After a 70-yard punt backed up the Dukes to their own 8-yard line, Madison put together a stellar drive., marching all 92 yards in 11 plays over 4:40. A pair of big third-down conversions through the air and a pass interference call in the end zone set up redshirt senior running back Hykeem Brodie's 1-yard touchdown run. Starke hit the PAT and Madison was in control at 25-7.

The Dukes sealed the game away on its next possession, as a mix of running and passing to move the ball. Thorpe went up top and hit Robinson with a 37-yard strike for a touchdown to seal the victory with a 32-7 lead with 10:44 to play in the game.

Madison had 498 yards of total offense while limiting the Rams to just 183 yards, including 95 yards after URI's first two possessions of the game. JMU converted 11-of-20 third-down opportunities while holding URI to just 1-of-10. The Dukes were also 2-of-3 on fourth-down chances as compared to the Rams being unsuccessful on both of theirs.

Brodie was the leading ground gainer for the contest with nine carries for 58 yards and one touchdown. Barlow also had five catches for 62 yards and a score among the receiving leaders for JMU.

Bentsen was 15-for-28 for 164 yards and one score through the air for the Rams, with Johnson-Farrell leading the URI receiving corps with 71 yards and a touchdown on three receptions.

Mike Houston was hired as James Madison University's seventh head coach on January 18, 2016.

"I am thrilled to welcome Mike Houston as the next football head coach at James Madison," Director of Athletics Jeff Bourne said. "Mike has been a fast riser in the coaching ranks, with success turning programs around at the Division II and FCS levels. His pedigree for winning and his ability to lead young men make him the perfect fit to build upon the foundation already in place at JMU."

"I'm honored to have the opportunity to be the next head football coach at James Madison University," Houston said. "James Madison is a special place and my family and I look forward to becoming integral parts of the community."

Possessing 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five as a head coach, Houston comes to Harrisonburg from The Citadel. He led the Bulldogs to a 14-11 record in his two seasons as head coach and is the only coach in The Citadel's history to win a Southern Conference championship within his first two seasons.

Houston's offense produced 27 individual 100-yard rushing performances, including a program-record 14 in 2015. The 27 100-yard rushers was a two-year record for The Citadel.

In 2015, he guided the Bulldogs to the program's fourth winning season since 1995 with

a 9-4 record and a share of the 2015 SoCon title. The Citadel boasted a conference-best +117 scoring margin, including a +100 edge during league play, and Houston went on to be named SoCon Coach of the Year and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year. They also defeated Southeastern Conference member South Carolina 23-22 in the regular-season finale and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs after upsetting ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

In the first-round playoff victory, Houston's run game broke a school record with four 100-yard rushers as it piled up 524 yards on the ground, the most in a NCAA playoff game since 2012 and the second-highest in 2015 for FCS, only behind the Bulldogs' nation-best 535 rushing yards in the season opener.

The Citadel broke school records for all-purpose yards, total offense, rushing yards and interception return yards. The Bulldogs led the nation with a school-record 515 interception return yards and five interception return touchdowns. The Citadel led the Southern and ranked second nationally with 346.9 rushing yards per game, an average of 17.21 yards per completion and just 0.62 sacks allowed per game. The Bulldogs also led the league in interceptions, tackles for loss allowed, turnovers forced, yards per rush, rushing touchdowns, punt return defense, passing touchdowns allowed, fumble recoveries, third-down defense, tackles for loss and kickoff return defense.

Four players earned All-America status and 13 garnered All-Southern Conference honors. Senior defensive lineman Mitchell Jeter was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Year and junior defensive lineman Joe Crochet was The Citadel's first CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American since 1989.

In his first season at the helm, he led the Bulldogs to a 5-7 record, which was tied for the second-highest win total for a first-year coach at The Citadel. Three of the Bulldogs' losses came by a total of nine points, including two in the final seconds. The Citadel

rushed for over 4,166 yards, ranking third-best in single-season program history, and their 347.2 rushing averaged led the SoCon and ranked second nationally.

Prior to The Citadel, Houston was head coach at Lenoir-Rhyne, an NCAA Division II school in the South Atlantic Conference, for three seasons. He accumulated a 29-8 record at the helm and directed the Bears to three consecutive SAC championships, a stretch that included a school-record 13 wins in his final year. Houston was named SAC Coach of the Year each season and was also the Don Hansen Super Region II Coach of the Year in 2013. In his final season at LRU, the Bears advanced to the Division II national championship game and ranked No. 2 in the final polls.

Before his elevation to head coach, Houston served as Lenoir-Rhyne's defensive coordinator and secondary coach from 2007-10. He spent the 2006 year as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Brevard College.

Houston began his coaching career in the high school ranks. He coached for a decade at T.C. Roberson High School in Asheville, N.C., including the last five as head coach, where he went 42-18 and guided the team to its first-ever conference championship. He spent his first five seasons at T.C. Roberson as the defensive coordinator after leading the defense at Forbush High School in East Bend, N.C. in his first two years out of college.

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill University, where he played tight end for the Lions and earned a bachelor's degree in biology. In 2014, Houston was inducted into the Franklin High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He is married to the former Amanda Owen and they have two sons, Owen Michael and Reid Wilson.

#12 Dukes Tally Program-Record 80 Points in Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison broke its program record for points scored in a single game, as the 12th-ranked Dukes opened the 2016 football season with an 80-7 victory against Morehead State Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

JMU scored a touchdown on each of its first seven drives and produced points on the first 11 drives to mount a massive 73-7 lead after three quarters. The Dukes' final scoring drive, a 14-yard rush by junior running back Taylor Woods, gave them 80 points to break the previous record of 76 points, scored back on Sept. 2, 1995 against Morgan State.

The 73-point triumph was the largest margin of victory as well, surpassing the 16-year old record of 72 (72-0) versus Lock Haven back in 2000. Ten of JMU's 11 touchdowns came on the ground, also a school record, and was one rushing score shy of the FCS record, set by Georgia Southern in 2004.

Junior quarterback Bryan Schor rushed for a game-high 129 yards and three touchdowns, both career highs, while throwing for 109 more on 8-of-11 passing. The Dukes had three players rush for 100 yards, as sophomore Trai Sharp ran for a career-high 110 yards and redshirt junior Cardon Johnson added 104 yards with a pair of scored. Nearing the century was Woods, who produced 89 rushing yards and three touchdowns, both career bests.

Senior safety Raven Greene led the defense with a team-best seven tackle while recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass. Both turnovers later produced JMU scores. Junior safety Marcell Johnson and redshirt sophomore corner Jimmy Moreland also notched interceptions in the win. JMU forced MSU into five turnovers, resulting in 28 points off takeaways. The Dukes limited the Eagles to just 182 yards of total offense, including 57 rushing yards against.

JMU gained 607 yards of total offense on 498 yards rushing and 109 passing. The 498 rushing yards were just three shy of tying the program record. It was, however, JMU's Division I record, surpassing the previous record of 442 against Towson State on Oct. 12, 1991.

The Dukes opened the game scoring four rushing touchdowns, two by Schor, to take a 28-0 lead. The 28 points in the opening 15 was the most scored by JMU in first-quarter history. JMU added three more rushing scores and a Tyler Gray field goal to take a program-best 52-7 advantage into the locker room.

After the break, JMU added three more touchdowns, including a 76-yard punt return by Rashard Davis to take a commanding 73-7 lead after three quarters. Woods capped off his career night by scoring his third touchdown with 11:17 remaining, which gave JMU the program record for points in a game.

#12 Dukes Top CCSU 56-21 To Improve To 2-0

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison football continued its record-breaking offensive performance as the 12th-ranked Dukes topped Central Connecticut State 56-21 on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

Scoring 136 points over the first two games of the season, JMU set a new program record for points scored over a two-game span, topping the previous record of 118 set between the Dukes' 2015 FCS playoff loss to Colgate and the 2016 record-breaking season opener against Morehead State.

JMU had a pair of running backs eclipse the century mark as redshirt junior Cardon Johnson rushed for a game-high 121 yards on 16 carries with two touchdowns. Senior Khalid Abdullah racked up 113 yards over 18 carries for a touchdown while also adding an 11-yard touchdown reception. Johnson went over 100 for the second straight game and sixth time of his career, while Abdullah, who became the 14th Duke in program history to run for over 2,000 career yards, hit 100 in a game for the fifth time at JMU.

JMU scored a touchdown on each of its first five drives to mount a 35-7 lead at halftime. The Dukes tacked on 21 additional points in the second half, which included back-to-back punt returns for touchdowns by senior wide receiver Rashard Davis and junior wide receiver John Miller. The two returns for scores tied the Dukes' single-game record for punt returns, originally set against Virginia back in 1983.

Junior quarterback Bryan Schor sparked the Dukes to a 21-0 lead with a pair of first-quarter touchdown passes as JMU outgained the Blue Devils 193-61 in the opening stanza. Schor opened Saturday's contest 12-for-12 and had a career-high three passing touchdowns by the break. The Milford, Pa., native closed the night 17-for-21 for 205 yards, three touchdowns and one interception, while adding 33 rushing yards on six carries.

CCSU closed the gap in the third quarter with two touchdowns, including a 15-yard Schor interception return by Najae Brown for a score. The Dukes capped the fourth quarter with two scores, including Miller's 56-yard punt return. With Davis and Miller's returns, JMU has punt returns for touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time since the 2008 season and has scored on all three returns this year.

Defensively, JMU was led by junior linebacker Brandon Hereford, who racked up a 12 tackles (seven solo) with two tackles for loss. Sophomore linebacker Dimitri Holloway added eight tackles. The JMU defense limited CCSU offense to 224 total yards, while holding it to 3-for-15 on third downs. JMU outgained CCSU by nearly 300 yards after rushing for 312 yards on 55 carries, averaging 5.7 per run.

First-Quarter Surge Not Enough For Dukes In 56-28 Loss At UNC

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. – James Madison football's offense got out to a fast start, scoring touchdowns on its first three possessions, but was unable to stay with North Carolina, falling 56-28 in the non-conference finale on Saturday afternoon at Kenan Stadium.

The loss, the first of the season for the 11th-ranked Dukes, dropped them to 2-1 this season, while the Tar Heels improved to 2-1. UNC also moved to 3-0 all-time in the series.

Senior running back Khalid Abdullah rushed for a game-high 116 yards and two touchdowns, as he moved into a tie for ninth on JMU's all-time rushing touchdown list (23). He led all players with 154 all-purpose yards, adding a pair of receptions for 38 yards. Junior quarterback Bryan Schor finished 14-for-22 for 218 yards and a touchdown, both in the air and on the ground.

Redshirt junior running back Cardon Johnson tallied 140 all-purpose yards, with 72 rushing and a 68 on a single touchdown reception. Senior Domo Taylor led the receiving corps with a career-high six receptions for 66 yards. The Dukes gained 495 yards of total offense, rushing for 209 yards and passing for 286 more.

The first quarter was nothing short of offensive fireworks as JMU reeled off 222 yards of total offense to take a 21-14 lead. Abdullah scored both of his touchdowns and ran for 62 yards in the opening 15 to pace the offense. The Dukes moved the ball 82 yards on nine plays during the initial possession, with Abdullah's first score giving JMU the early 7-0 lead. After UNC answered back with a touchdown, JMU recaptured the lead at 14-7 when Abdullah punched his second in from a yard out to cap off an 11-play, 75-yard drive with 3:44 to go in the quarter.

UNC answered again, but only three plays later, Schor found a wide-open Johnson in the flats for a 68-yard touchdown. It was a career-long pass and catch for both Schor and Johnson. UNC produced back-to-back touchdowns to take its first lead at 28-21 and later grabbed a 35-21 advantage at halftime. JMU scored on its first drive of the second half, a Schor three-yard touchdown run, to trim the deficit to 42-28, but it would be the closest JMU would get as Carolina added two more scores in the home-opening win for the Heels.

Mitch Trubisky passed for a career-high 432 yards and three touchdowns while Elijah Hood rushed for 106 yards and two scores. T.J. Logan also had three runs for touchdowns, while Ryan Switzer made five catches for 101 yards and a score.

KHALID RUNS WILD

For the second consecutive game and for the sixth time in his career, Khalid Abdullah surpassed the century mark, rushing for 116 yards on 18 carries, averaging 6.4 yards per touch. He also scored two rushing scores against the Tar Heels, moving him into a tie for ninth place on JMU's all-time rushing touchdowns list, with 23, tying Ron Stith (1973-76).

Second-Half Surge Lifts #11 Dukes Over Maine, 31-20

ORONO, Maine – Running backs Khalid Abdullah and Cardon Johnson combined for 282 rushing yards and three touchdowns to lead 11th-ranked James Madison (3-1, 1-0 CAA) to a 31-20 comeback victory at Maine (0-3, 0-1) to open Colonial Athletic Association Football play on Saturday afternoon at Alford Stadium.

Trailing 13-10 at the break, the defense produced four sacks and three interceptions, allowing JMU to outscore the Black Bears 21-7 over the final 30 minutes, including a 14-0 ledger in the fourth quarter. JMU limited UM to just 120 yards of total offense in the second half.

Abdullah, a senior, rushed for a career-high 172 yards and two touchdowns while Johnson, a redshirt junior, joined him over the century mark with 110 yards and a score. The rushing attack produced a pair of scoring plays over 50 yards, including an 85 yarder by Abdullah in the third. Junior quarterback Bryan Schor also passed 11-for-22 for 137 yards and a touchdown. Junior receiver John Miller made five catches for 55 yards and a touchdown, while senior Brandon Ravenel reeled in three receptions for a team-best 58 yards, which including a long of 34.

Defensively, junior linebacker Brandon Hereford had a team-best nine tackles while redshirt sophomore cornerback Jimmy Moreland and redshirt junior Simeyon Robinson each had seven stops. Robinson led the charge up front, with a career-best 4.5 tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks. Robinson's tackle-for-loss total was the most since Stephon Robertson had 5.0 for loss on Oct. 26, 2013. The Dukes forced four second-half turnovers, three by way of interceptions and a turnover-on-downs after JMU had three consecutive sacks.

Down 13-10 entering the second half, redshirt junior corner Jordan Brown intercepted a pass deep downfield on the first play of the third quarter. Three plays later, Abdullah found a hole in the middle and ran 85 yards, a career long, for the touchdown. The fifth-longest run in JMU history put JMU ahead 17-13.

Maine regained the lead on the ensuing drive, but JMU took it back early in the fourth when Schor found a wide-open John Miller over the middle for a 19-yard touchdown pass to make it 24-20. Later in the fourth, senior safety Raven Greene made a one-handed interception to set up JMU near midfield. On the next play, Johnson scampered 52 yards for the score to close the scoring. Maine moved the ball on the next drive but JMU put the game away with three straight sacks to give the ball back to the Dukes.

SECONDARY PARAMOUNT IN ROAD WIN

JMU thwarted two Maine drives in the third quarter, thanks to the secondary. On the initial play of the second half Jordan Brown intercepted a deep pass, leading to a JMU touchdown three plays later. Later in the third, Rashad Robinson picked off his second career pass to keep it a three-point game. Raven Greene made a spectacular one-handed pick in the fourth quarter, leading to a Duke touchdown on the following offensive play.

#7 Dukes Use Fourth-Quarter Dramatics to Top Tribe, 31-24

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Redshirt senior cornerback Taylor Reynolds intercepted William & Mary quarterback Steve Cluley in the end zone with 1:22 to play to preserve James Madison's lead, as the seventh-ranked Dukes topped the Tribe 31-24, in front of 20,354 fans on a rainy Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

James Madison improved to 5-1 overall and 3-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Tribe fell to 2-4 and 0-3.

Clinging to a 24-17 lead, Cluley had led W&M 75 yards down to the JMU 16, but a pass intended DeVonte Dedmon in the corner of the end zone was picked off by Reynolds, giving JMU the ball back with 82 seconds left. On third and short, senior running back Khalid Abdullah capped off his career day with a 74-yard touchdown run to double the lead and clinch the game. W&M quickly answered with three seconds left but an unsuccessful onside kick secured JMU's win.

Abdullah entered the day as the nation's leading rusher and led the attack with his fifth straight 100-yard game, going for a career-high 194 yards and three scores on 25 carries (7.8 ypc). Redshirt junior running back Cardon Johnson neared the century mark with 90 yards on 17 carries, including a touchdown of his own. Junior quarterback Bryan Schor went over 200 yards of offense, going 15-for-24 for 182 yards and rushing for 43 yards.

JMU out-gained W&M 511-362, including a 329-205 advantage in the run game. The Dukes were 11-for-17 on third down, as compared to the Tribe's 5-for-12. They won the turnover battle, scoring 14 points off two takeaways, while the Tribe tallied three off of JMU's lone giveaway. The JMU defense held a 3-0 lead in team sacks.

Defensively, senior safety Raven Greene led the team with 11 tackles, while redshirt senior linebacker Gage Steele added 10 total tackles with seven solo stops. Reynolds finished with six stops, including a tackle-for-loss at the one-yard line, and had two pass breakups to go with his interception.

Kendell Anderson led W&M with 149 rushing yards and a touchdown, while Cluley was 14-for-20 for 157 yards and a touchdown and ran for 52 more and a score.

QUOTING COACH HOUSTON

"I'm really proud of these kids and the way they came out and played. We felt like we would get William & Mary's best shot with their backs against the wall a little bit in league play. I went back and told the kids that all-time, today was the 39th meeting, and the total score differential in the series was a one-point lead for JMU. That shows what kind of rivalry this game is and how every year you got to throw out the records and get ready to play because it's going to be a nail bitter, and it was."

ABDULLAH KEEPS RISING

Another career outing for Khalid Abdullah led to his continued surge up the rushing charts in the 45-year history of JMU football. After going for a career-best 194 yards and three touchdowns on 25 carries. He now ranks tied for third in rushing touchdowns (30), tied for fourth in total touchdowns (32), sixth in rushing yards (2,666) and rushing attempts (478) and eighth in scoring (192).

#7 JMU Survives Late Score for 42-39 Triumph at UNH

DURHAM, N.H. - Wide receivers Terrence Alls and Brandon Ravenel reeled in a career-high two touchdown catches each and a big second-half run lifted seventh-ranked James Madison to a 42-39 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory at New Hampshire on Saturday afternoon at Wildcat Stadium.

The Dukes (6-1, 4-0 CAA) led 42-12 with 10 minutes to go in the fourth quarter when the Wildcats (4-3, 3-1 CAA) strung together 27 straight points to cut the lead to 42-39. After successfully recovering an onside kick with 1:15 remaining, JMU was able to take two knees to run out the clock, ending UNH's 17-game home win streak during the regular season. JMU also snapped a three-game skid the 'Cats, notching its first win in the series since 2007 and the first victory in Durham since 2006.

Junior quarterback Bryan Schor had a career-high five total touchdowns in the win. He was 18-for-27 for 264 yards and four touchdowns, both career highs. He added a game-high 70 rushing yards and a score. Alls, a junior, had career highs of 95 yards and two touchdowns on just four receptions, while Ravenel, a senior, had three grabs for 55 yards and two scores. Senior running back Khalid Abdullah rushed for 57 yards, picking up the majority of his yards in the second half. Senior receiver Rashard Davis also tallied five catches for 57 yards.

Though JMU was out-gained 569-437 in total offense, the Dukes dominated the run game by a 195-57 ledger. JMU was 7-for-13 on third down, as compared to UNH's 10-for-19. Redshirt junior safety Jordan Brown turned in a career-best 16 tackles and two pass breakups, and redshirt senior line-backer Gage Steele accrued a season-best 15 total stops. JMU had its first special teams touchdown since week two when sophomore corner Charles Tutt picked up a fumble on a fourth-quarter kickoff and returned it for his first score of the year.

JMU opened up a two-touchdown lead in the first half, by virtue of back-to-back touchdown passes from Schor to Ravenel. The Dukes led 7-0 just over six minutes on a 30-yard touchdown throw and doubled the lead to 14-0 a minute into the second quarter on a 20-yard pass-and-catch. UNH answered with its first touchdown of the game less than three minutes later to make it 14-6 but Schor capped off an 11-play, 77-yard drive, scampering in from five yards out for this first rushing score and third total touchdown to make it 21-6 with 7:03 to play. A late Wildcat field goal made it 21-9 at the break.

Leading 21-12 in the third, JMU reeled off three straight touchdowns, including two just four seconds apart, to take a commanding 42-12 lead. Schor found Alls twice on long scoring passes of 54 and 26 yards, respectively, and Tutt capped off the team's scoring with his six-yard fumble recovery on the ensuing kickoff following Alls' second score. Over the next 10 minutes, UNH scored 27 straight, utilizing a fumble recovery and an onside recovery to create additional offensive possessions.

UNH was led by Trevor Knight, who passed for 314 yards and a touchdown and Adam Riese, who threw for 198 yards and a pair of scores. Malik Love had 12 catches for 127 yards and Neil O'Connor has 192 yards on 10 catches.
