DUKES TO CLASH WITH JACKRABBITS IN NATIONAL SEMIFINALS

- Game 14 of the 46th season of JMU football takes place Saturday, Dec. 16 when No. 1 James Madison hosts fifth-ranked South Dakota State in the semifinal round of the NCAA FCS playoffs.
- Kickoff is set for 4:30 p.m. at Bridgeforth Stadium and will be nationally televised on ESPNU. It will also be streamed on ESPN3 and ESPN app and can be heard on the JMU/Sprint Broadcast Network, with pregame coverage starting at 3:30 p.m.
- Saturday marks the first meeting between JMU and SDSU and just the fifth game all-time for the Dukes against a team from the Missouri Valley Football Conference.
- The Dukes are 2-2 versus the Valley, which includes wins at North Dakota State in the 2016 semifinals and against Youngstown State in last year's national championship game.
- JMU's run through the 2017 FCS playoffs is presented by Excel Heating and Cooling.

JMU'S PLAYOFF HISTORY

- The Dukes are making their 14th FCS playoff appearance, which includes a program-record fourth straight berth. They have gone 15-11 overall with a pair of national championships - 2004 and 2016.
- JMU has won multiple playoff games in four postseason trips, going 4-0 in both national title runs, 2-0 this year and 2-1 in 2008 where it reached the national semifinals.
- The Dukes are 7-4 all-time at home in the playoffs, including four straight wins at Bridgeforth.
- They are also 6-7 on the road and 2-0 in neutral-site matchups.
- In last year's run to the championship, JMU outscored its four opponents 175-60 (43.75 to 15.0 avg).
- That included back-to-back games recording program bests for scoring, with 55 against New Hampshire and 65 versus Sam Houston. The 65-7 win over SHSU was the second-largest margin-of-victory by any team in FCS playoff history.

RATKE KICKS JMU TO NATIONAL SEMIS

- Ethan Ratke drilled a career-long 46-yard field goal as time expired to lift JMU to a 31-28 come-from-behind win against 11th-ranked Weber State on Dec. 8.
- Trailing 28-20, JMU scored on a 40-yard touchdown pass by Bryan Schor to Riley Stapleton to make it 28-all with 2:08 to play. After forcing Weber into a three-and-out, JMU got in field-goal range where Ratke converted the longest field goal in JMU playoff history to send the Dukes to the semifinals.
- Marcus Marshall rushed for 128 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 9.1 yards per rush.
- Bryan Schor passed for 359 yards and two touchdowns, which was the second-most passing yards of Schor's career and in JMU postseason history.
- Riley Stapleton had a career night with eight catches for 189 yards and a score, while Terrence Alls had six grabs for 117 yards.
- JMU out-gained the Wildcats 549-329, which included 359-238 through the air.
- The Dukes improved to 2-1 all-time against the Big Sky Conference, winning for the first time at home.

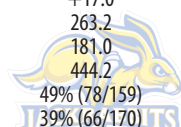
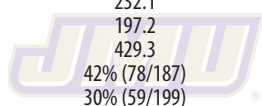

SCOUTING SOUTH DAKOTA STATE

- The Jackrabbits come to town sporting an 11-2 record as they make the first FCS semifinal appearance in school history.
- Fifth-seeded SDSU beat Northern Iowa 37-22 in the second round before rolling 56-14 against New Hampshire in last week's quarterfinals.
- Much like JMU's last opponent, the Jacks enter the semis riding a seven-game win streak and are 4-1 in road games this year.
- SDSU averages 38.8 points per game while conceding 21.8 per outing. It ranks third nationally in scoring offense.
- The Jackrabbits are led by First Team All-MVFC receiver Jake Wieneke and tight end Dallas Goedert. Wieneke is second in the country with 15 receiving touchdowns, while Goedert has six touchdowns and over 1,000 receiving yards.
- Second Team All-MVFC quarterback Taryn Christian has thrown for 3,281 yards and 33 touchdowns, which ranks second in the FCS.
- Chase Vinatieri, nephew of Indianapolis Colts kicker Adam Vinatieri, leads the country in field goal percentage (92.3%).
- John Stiegelmeier is in his 21st season at the helm of his alma mater, holding a 147-96 record. He's led the Jacks to seven FCS playoff appearances since 2009, including a string of six straight (2012-17).

ROAD TO FRISCO GOES THROUGH JMU

- After going undefeated during the regular season and holding a No. 1 ranking in both polls all season long, the FCS Selection Committee awarded JMU the No. 1 seed for the 2017 NCAA FCS playoffs.
- It's the second time in school history the Dukes earned the top seed (2008) and a program-record third straight year they garnered a national seed and first-round bye.
- JMU is making its program-record fourth straight playoff appearance in 2017.

WIN STREAK AT 25, 2ND IN FCS HISTORY

- JMU's 31-28 triumph in the FCS Quarterfinals marked JMU's program-record 25th consecutive triumph, which extended the CAA record and longest mark in all of Division I.
- The win also moved the Dukes into second place all-time in FCS history.
- JMU is one of three FCS teams with active double-digit win streaks. Celebration Bowl participants Grambling and N.C. A&T have each won 11 consecutive games.
- Only one FBS level, the lone unbeaten team in UCF has won 12 straight.
- The Dukes have also won a CAA-record 18

straight league games and became the league's first team ever to go 8-0 back-to-back years.

- The Dukes last saw defeat on Sept. 24, 2016 - a 56-28 setback at ACC-foe North Carolina.
- JMU has also won 26 straight games against FCS opponents, with the last loss coming on Dec. 5, 2015 versus Colgate in the second round of the playoffs.
- The Dukes have won 16 straight at Bridgeforth Stadium and hold a program-record 10-game road win streak.

GAME-WINNER CAPS ETHAN'S CAREER NIGHT

- Until mid-October, Ethan Ratke had only taken a few reps. Now he's 11-of-14 on field goals and had the game of his young career in the 31-28 win over Weber State.
- Ratke converted three field goals, setting a career high and tying the program's single-game record.
- It was the 16th time in school history a kicker made three field goals, and the second this year, as Tyler Gray made three against Villanova on Oct. 14.
- Just one week later, Gray injured his hip at William & Mary and Ratke took over kicking roles, making two field goals.
- His 11 field goals are already one shy of ranking in the top 10 of JMU single-season history.

SCHOR HOLDS FOUR JMU CAREER MARKS

- Back in October, Bryan Schor broke the career record for passing touchdowns.
- He followed that up by setting completions record in the second round of the playoffs.
- Fast forward one more week, and Schor moved into first place all-time in both passing yards and total offense.
- Schor leads the Dukes all-time with 60 passing touchdowns, 6,727 passing yards, 527 completions and 7,859 yards of total offense.
- Schor is also second in career pass attempts, at 770. He needs 94 more for that record.

STAPLETON COULD NOT BE STOPPED

- You knew he was in for a big night against Weber State from the start.
- By the end of the night, Stapleton tied one career-high, shattered another and nearly broke a JMU single-game record.
- The redshirt sophomore corralled eight receptions (tie CH) for a career-best 189 yards and a touchdown in the 31-28 triumph.
- His 40-yard touchdown catch set up the Dukes to tie it on a 2-point conversion.
- His 189 receiving yards was a JMU postseason record and just three yards shy of the JMU single-game record for any game.

BENT BUTNOT BROKEN

- JMU was in uncharted waters in its quarterfinal game against Weber --- trailing in the fourth.
- The Dukes had only trailed once in the second half all year (CAA opener vs. Maine) and was tied in the fourth quarter just once (vs. Richmond).
- Weber State scored a touchdown with 3:14 remaining to extend its lead to 28-20.
- The Dukes fired back with a four-play touchdown drive, as Riley Stapleton went 40 yards to the house to make it 28-26 with 2:08 left. Needing two more, Trai Sharp made a sharp cut and dove across the goal line to convert, tying it at 28-all.
- A defensive stop set up JMU's walk-off win on the Ethan Ratke 46-yard field goal.
- JMU led for just 21:41 in the quarterfinal while trailing for a season-high 20:03.
- Until the quarterfinals, JMU had trailed for only 15:12 all year - 4:00 vs. Maine; 7:22 at Delaware; 3:50 vs. Richmond.

ANKRAH TOP-3 FINALIST FOR BUCHANAN

- Andrew Ankrah was voted a top-three finalist for the nation's top defensive award, the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award.
- The CAA Defensive Player of the Year and three-time First Team All-CAA member ranks tied for second in the CAA in tackles for loss, tied for third in forced fumbles, tied for fifth in recoveries and seventh in sacks.
- He is the 10th JMU finalist all-time and the first since Stephon Robertson did so in back-to-back years in 2012 and 2013.
- The Dukes have won the Buchanan twice - Derrick Lloyd (2001) and Arthur Moats (2009).

GREENE TIES RECORD, TWO LEAD FCS

- Raven Greene tied a program record for interceptions while two Dukes are tied for the FCS lead in picks.
- In JMU's second-round win against Stony Brook, Raven Greene capped off JMU's five interception day in the fourth with his 13th career pick, which tied the program's career record.
- He matched Clint Kent (2002-05) and Bob Logan (1975-78) on JMU's career interception chart.
- Earlier in the game, Jordan Brown produced his seventh interception of the season, which ties him for first place among all FCS players in 2017.
- A week later against Weber State, Rashad Robinson matched Brown with his seventh pick.
- Brown and Robinson are tied for second in JMU single-season history, needing just one more to reach Tony Booth's 1997 record of eight.

BEST START EVER... OBVIOUSLY

- JMU improved to 13-0 on Dec. 8, extending its best start to a season in its 46-year history.
- The Dukes began 2015 with a 7-0 record. Historically, JMU does have one unbeaten season, going 9-0-1 in 1975. The Dukes opened that year with a tie before reeling off nine straight wins.
- JMU had not allowed any team to score more than 14 points through the first 12 games until Weber State scored 28 in the FCS quarterfinals
- Nine of 12 foes have been limited to less than 300 yards of total offense.

DEFENSE LEADING THE FCS

- JMU's defense has risen to the occasion week in and week out since the start of the season and has quickly turned into one of the tops in FCS.
- The Dukes lead the FCS in three categories, including scoring defense (10.3), interceptions (25) and pass efficiency defense (82.27 rating).
- They rank in the top 10 in 15 areas, as they're also second in both takeaways (33) and punt-return defense (2.89) and third in both total defense (242.3) and first-down defense (13.9).
- Other top-10 areas include sixth in rushing defense (84.8), sacks (3.31), turnover margin (1.23) and defensive touchdowns (4), eighth in both third-down defense (29.6%) and red-zone defense (66.7%), ninth in passing defense (157.5) and 10th in blocked punts (2).
- Jordan Brown and Rashad Robinson lead the country with seven interceptions each, while Jimmy Moreland has five.

SCHOR, JMU DEFENSE LEAD WAY IN SBU WIN

- JMU tied a D-I program record with five interceptions and Bryan Schor threw two TDs to help JMU to a 26-7 victory against Stony Brook in the Second Round on Dec. 2.
- Terrence Alls hauled in a career high 10 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown. His performance marked the first time in over 13 years a JMU player has had double-digit receptions. D.D. Boxley snatched 11 on Oct. 16, 2004 at Maine.
- Schor was 26-of-35 for 255 yards and two touchdowns in the win. He moved into first place all-time at JMU in career completions, which now stands at 506. He surpassed Justin Rascati (487) after starting the game 10-for-10 through the air.
- JMU's defense tied a postseason record, holding Stony Brook to just seven points. That matched the 2016 FCS quarterfinal total when the Dukes rolled Sam Houston State 65-7. It was a season-low scoring output for the Seawolves, as they hadn't tallied less than 17 in a single game.

BALL HAWKS RACK UP FIVE PICKS

- JMU tied a program record at the Division I level after making five interceptions in the win over Stony Brook. SBU had thrown just three picks all year prior to the FCS Second Round.
- The five interceptions was just one off the program record, as the Dukes had six against Gallaudet as a Division III school in 1973.
- It was a season high for interceptions and all five starting defensive backs produced one interception, marking the first time in school history five DBs had a pick the same game.
- The five takeaways led to 13 points off turnovers and JMU's first of two fourth-quarter interceptions stymied a drive deep in JMU territory.

SCHOR SETS COMPLETIONS RECORD

- Bryan Schor broke another program record in JMU's playoff win over Stony Brook, setting a new benchmark in career completions.
- Needing just eight to take over first place, Schor opened the game completing his first 10 passes to surpass Justin Rascati (487).
- Schor completed 26 passes to move over 500 for his career, as he now stands at 506 completions.
- Earlier this year, he set the passing TD record (59) and he is only 115 passing yards and 205 total offense shy of program records in those respective categories.

JMU SETS BRIDGEFORTH PLAYOFF RECORD

- JMU saw a game attendance of 16,449, which was the most in Bridgeforth Stadium postseason history.
- It surpassed the 2008 playoff semifinal attendance of 15,976 against Montana.
- JMU has brought in over 15,000 spectators in three of its last four home playoff games.

JMU AGAINST CAA FOES IN PLAYOFFS

- The FCS Second Round marked JMU's fourth game ever in the postseason against a conference opponent.
- The Dukes stayed unbeaten against CAA teams in the FCS playoffs with a 26-7 win over SBU.
- It was the second straight year beating a CAA foe in the postseason, as the Dukes rolled to

a 55-20 win over New Hampshire in the 2016 Second Round.

- JMU also owns postseason wins at William & Mary and against Villanova.
- The Dukes advanced to their first national title game with a 48-34 victory at W&M on Dec. 10, 2004. They also downed Nova 31-27 at home in the 2008 quarterfinals on Dec. 6, 2008.
- Additionally, JMU won its first-ever playoff game on Nov. 30, 1991 in a 42-35 double-overtime win at Delaware - two seasons before joining the league.

UNDISPUTED CAA CHAMPS

- JMU won its third straight CAA title and the second consecutive outright crown with its 31-3 win at Elon.
- It's the first time in CAA history a team has gone 8-0 in back-to-back season.
- It's also the first time JMU has won three straight titles and the first for the CAA since Boston University won three in a row from 1982-84.
- The Dukes are the first CAA team to go 8-0 three times, as New Hampshire has accomplished the feat twice. JMU is also the first team since UMass in 1977-78 to go unbeaten in back-to-back conference seasons.

HOUSTON UP FOR ROBINSON AWARD

- After guiding JMU to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the CAA outright championship, Mike Houston was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award.
- It's the third straight year Houston has been in consideration for the award, now in its 31st year.
- Since his hire, he's led JMU to a 25-1 record, which includes a program-record 23-game win streak. He's never lost to a FCS team at the helm, going 24-0, which includes a 16-0 mark during conference play.

SCHOR & ANKRAH ALSO AWARD FINALISTS

- Bryan Schor and Andrew Ankrah were both named finalists for major national awards, honoring the top offensive and defensive players in the FCS.
- Ankrah was named a top-3 finalist and has been invited to the STATS Legacy Awards Banquet on Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas.
- Schor finished eighth in the 2017 voting after finishing 12th a season ago for the Payton.
- JMU has won the Buchanan two times, with Derrick Lloyd taking it in 2001 and Steelers linebacker Arthur Moats winning it in 2009.

DUKES WIN THREE MAJOR CAA AWARDS

- JMU won three major CAA yearly awards after going 11-0 in the regular season.
- Andrew Ankrah was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year. He's the ninth JMU player to win the accolade and the first since 2013.
- John Miller was voted CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. It marked the second straight year a JMU player won the award and the third time since winning its first one in 2008.
- Bryan Schor garnered the Chuck Boone Leadership Award, as he became JMU's first winner of the prestigious laurel.
- Since joining the league in 1993, JMU players have claimed 21 end-of-year awards.
- A total of 16 players were named All-CAA.

16 PLAYERS NAMED ALL-CAA

- The Dukes tied the program record with 16 All-CAA honorees, matching the 2006 season.
- They led all teams with total selections and eight First Team All-CAA members.
- In addition to Ankrah and Miller, the six other Dukes to earn First Team All-CAA honors were Aaron Stinnie, Simeyon Robinson, Kyre Hawkins, Rashad Robinson, Jimmy Moreland and Raven Greene.
- Four player were named to the All-CAA Second Team in Schor, Jahee Jackson, Jordan Brown and Harry O'Kelly.
- Also earning Third Team All-CAA accolades were Trai Sharp, Terrence Alls, Darrious Carter and Brandon Hereford.

ANOTHER YEAR, ANOTHER CAA TITLE

- The Dukes went unbeaten in the CAA once again this year to claim the CAA championship.
- It's the program's third straight conference title, marking the first time in school history that JMU has won the title three years in a row. Prior to last season, JMU had never won back-to-back league crowns.
- JMU has now won a conference title seven times (1975, 1999, 2004, 2008, 2015, 2016, 2017).
- The Dukes won their second straight outright championship and the third in program history.
- JMU is also the first CAA team to go 8-0 three times, passing New Hampshire's two. Teams have gone 8-0 in CAA play nine times.

SCHOR, AMOS GRAB WEEKLY AWARDS

- Two Dukes were awarded CAA Player of the Week accolades on Nov. 20, as Bryan Schor was Offensive Player of the Week and D'Angelo Amos was Special Teams Player of the Week.
- The two accounted for all four of JMU's touchdowns in the win at Elon. Schor tied his career high with three rushing touchdowns, and Amos blocked a punt, scooped it up and ran it in to cap off JMU's scoring.
- It was Schor's fifth career weekly award and his first of 2017, while Amos won an honor for the first time as a collegian.
- JMU finished the regular season with eight weekly honors.

DUKES TROUNCE ELON TO GO 11-0

- Bryan Schor rushed for three touchdowns and D'Angelo Amos blocked a punt for a touchdown to lead JMU to a 31-3 triumph at Elon on Nov. 18 to cap the regular season.
- JMU completed its first unbeaten and untied regular-season, moving to 11-0 on the year and capturing the outright CAA title with an 8-0 record.
- Schor had 290 yards of offense, with 214 through the air and 76 on the ground, leading all players.
- Trai Sharp rushed for 68 yards, as the Dukes ran for a 190 as a team. John Miller reeled in a career-high seven catches for 59 yards, and Terrence Alls had five grabs for 73 yards.
- Kyre Hawkins led the defense with 11 tackles, and Cornell Urquhart had a career-high nine.
- The Dukes held a team scoreless in the first half for the fifth time in 2017, the fourth of which occurred in CAA play.

IT WAS A SCHOR THING AT ELON

- In JMU's 31-3 win at Elon, Bryan Schor tied his career high of three rushing scores and had a game-high 76 rushing yards to lead the attack.
- He combined for 290 yards of offense, going 22-of-29 for 214 yards.
- Schor moved into second place on a pair of JMU career categories, including passing yards (6,113) and completions (480). He's the second JMU quarterback to surpass 6,000 career passing yards.

SHARP TD LIFTS JMU PAST RICHMOND

- Trai Sharp accumulated 54 of his 60 rushing yards on JMU's final drive, and he capped it off with a seven-yard touchdown with 44 seconds left to lift JMU to a 20-13 win over Richmond on Nov. 11.
- The win kept JMU's win streak alive, at 22 straight, and clinched a share of the CAA championship.
- Bryan Schor threw for 229 yards on 18-of-32 passing. He moved into third all-time in career completions (458) and needs just 14 more passing yards to claim second all-time at JMU.
- David Eldridge had 81 receiving yards while Ishmael Hyman contributed 70 receiving yards.
- Raven Greene tied his career high with 11 tackles, and Rashad Robinson had eight stops. Jordan Brown tallied his team-leading sixth interception of the year, which leads all CAA players.
- JMU limited UR to only 20 rushing yards and 324 total yards, which is nearly 150 yards lower than its season average. The Spiders also had averaged 33.3 points per game, scoring just 13.

DUKES "SHARP" ON FINAL DRIVE

- Richmond knotted the game at 13-13 with 4:04 remaining but the Dukes put together a 71-yard drive to capture the win.
- Trai Sharp led the way by carrying the ball seven times for 54 yards, setting the Dukes up for the go-ahead score.
- After a third-down conversion by Bryan Schor, Sharp capped off the 10-play drive with a seven-yard TD with only 44 seconds remaining.
- After the game, Sharp tweeted, "This one is for you Dad! I love you!"

ROAD WARRIORS MAKE IT TEN

- JMU set a program record on Oct. 21 at William & Mary with its eighth straight true road win.
- After extending it to nine on Nov. 4 at Rhode Island, the Dukes made it double digits with its triumph at Elon on Nov. 18.
- The Dukes have won 10 straight in true road games dating back to Sept. 24, 2016. That includes nine straight CAA road wins during the stretch.

HONORING THE SENIORS

- On Nov. 11, JMU honored its 23 seniors prior to kick off versus Richmond. It was the 50th game of the senior class.
- Since the beginning of the 2014 season, JMU has gone 45-8 (.849), which includes a stellar 28-4 mark (.875) during CAA play.
- This class is the first in JMU history to make four straight FCS playoff appearances and the first ever claim at least nine overall wins and six league wins in every season.
- JMU captured the CAA title, marking the first time the Dukes have won three conference titles in a row.

UNANIMOUSLY VOTED #1 AGAIN

- Since the preseason, the defending champions have been ranked No. 1 by both the coaches and the media.
- JMU collected all 153 first-place votes in the final STATS FCS Top 25 while garnering all 26 first-place votes in the FCS Coaches Poll.
- The Dukes finished the regular season bringing in all votes in six weeks of the coaches poll and in three weeks of media poll.

ROBINSON TAKES HOME DEF. AWARD

- Rashad Robinson was named CAA Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 30, marking the third time this year a JMU player has won the league's top defensive award.
- In JMU's win over UNH, Robinson recorded his league-leading fifth interception 82 yards for a touchdown, which helped seal JMU's shutout victory.
- That return was the third-longest pick-six in school history.

DUKES ROLL IN SECOND HALF AT URI

- Leading 7-3 at the break, JMU shut down any chance of an upset, reeling off 31 straight points and dominating all three phases in the second half for a 38-3 win at Rhode Island on Nov. 4.
- JMU gave up only 18 yards and -13 rushing yards in the second half.

- Bryan Schor was 14-of-17 for 150 yards and four touchdowns while Percy Agyei-Obese rushed for 95 yards.
- JMU forced two turnovers and created seven sacks, as it ranks fourth nationally with 4.00 sacks per game (36).

HEREFORD COMES UP BIG AT RHODY

- Brandon Hereford, playing in just his fifth game this season, tallied nine tackles, 1.5 sacks to lead JMU's defensive dominance at Rhode Island.
- The 1.5 sacks was a career high. He also recovered a key fumble early in the third quarter, leading to a JMU score on the next play.
- Hereford nearly corralled his second career interception, as he was credited with a pass breakup.
- This season, he averages 6.4 tackles per game while garnering 2.5 sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Bryan Schor recorded four touchdown passes in JMU's rout of Rhode Island and found four different receivers in the process.
- Terrence Alls, who led the game with five catches for 73 yards, scored on a 20-yard touchdown on a third-and-long.
- David Eldridge had three grabs for 41 yards and a score, while both Jonathan Kloosterman and Ishmael Hyman had TDs on their only reception.

BLANKING UNH ON HOMECOMING

- Bryan Schor threw two touchdown passes to set the all-time program record and JMU shut out No. 17 New Hampshire 21-0 on Homecoming.
- JMU limited UNH to only 193 yards, marking the fourth time this season the Dukes have allowed less than 200 yards. No FCS team has gained 300 during the 2017 season.
- Rashad Robinson picked off a pass and returned it 82 yards for the third-longest pick-six in school history.
- JMU has now won three straight versus New Hampshire, which is the longest win streak for the Dukes in the series.

FIRST SHUTOUT IN TWO YEARS

- JMU's 21-0 win over New Hampshire marked the first time in just over two years JMU blanked an opponent.
- The Dukes beat Elon on the road, 51-0, back on Oct. 27, 2015, which was the largest road win margin in school history.
- It was the 27th time in program history JMU has held a team scoreless.
- It was JMU's fourth shutout against a CAA school. In addition to Elon in 2015, JMU also blanked Hofstra (56-0) in 2008 and Villanova (17-0) on the road in 2006.

SCHOR BREAKS PASSING TD RECORD

- On Oct. 28, Bryan Schor threw two touchdowns in the New Hampshire win, and he set JMU's all-time passing touchdown record in the process.
- He entered the game tied with Vad Lee and Justin Rascati with 51 passing touchdowns.
- Early in the second quarter, Schor found Ishmael Hyman on a 13-yard pass for the record-setting 52nd touchdown pass.
- He also added a second TD to Clayton Cheatham, upping his record total to 53.

DEFENSE EQUALS OFFENSE AT W&M

- Six takeaways and 33 points off turnovers led JMU to a dominant 46-14 win at William & Mary on Oct. 21 in Williamsburg.
- It was JMU's largest win ever versus W&M in the 40-game history of the series.
- Bryan Schor tied the program record with his 51st touchdown pass.
- JMU forced a season-best six turnovers, including four interceptions and a pick-six.
- Jordan Brown had a career-high two interceptions and the defense accounted for six sacks for the second straight week.
- The Dukes led by as many as 43 in the game.

SIX TAKEAWAYS, RESULTING IN 33 PTS

- Four interceptions and two fumble recoveries turned into 33 of JMU's 46 points in the rout at William & Mary.
- JMU's defense also didn't allow the Tribe to pass midfield the entire first half and held them scoreless through three quarters.
- Jordan Brown (2 INT), Rashad Robinson (1 INT) and Jimmy Moreland (1 INT, pick-six) each led the CAA with four interceptions this season.
- Eight different players accounted for the team's six sacks, as JMU has matched the 2016 sacks total - 24.0.

DUKES SET FIELD GOAL RECORD

- Amidst the defensive dominance, JMU set a program record on special teams, as Tyler Gray and Ethan Ratke combined for four field goals.
- Each kicker hit two field goals on four tries, as Ratke's two attempts were the first of his career.
- Gray hit a game-high 42 yarder, while Ratke drilled a career-long 39 yarder.

HAWKINS EARNS 2ND CAA HONOR

- Following a standout performance in JMU's 30-8 win over Villanova, Kyre Hawkins was named CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week for the second time on Oct. 16.
- Hawkins turned in a game-high 10 tackles, as well as 3.0 tackles for loss in the win. He also matched his career highs with 2.0 sacks and two pass breakups.
- JMU limited the Wildcats to just 174 yards of offense and 30 passing yards. Nova only passed midfield one time in the game, coming on their lone scoring drive.

DEFENSE POWERS JMU PAST 'NOVA

- JMU held No. 11 Villanova scoreless for three quarters and used a 14-0 run late in the game to pull out a 30-8 win on Oct. 14.
- The Dukes held 'Nova to just 174 yards, including 30 passing. They also had three takeaways, including Brandon Hereford's pick-six late in the fourth.
- Kyre Hawkins had 10 tackles, including 3.0 for loss and 2.0 sacks, while Andrew Ankrah had 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- Bryan Schor threw for 271 yards and two touchdowns, as he became the fifth JMU quarterback to surpass 5,000 career yards.
- Terrence Alls tied a career high with seven catches, leading the game with 83 yards.

GAMEDAY A HUGE SUCCESS AGAIN

- For the second time in three seasons, ESPN's College GameDay made its way to the Quad, broadcasting its iconic pregame show.
- After drawing 12,000 fans in its initial broadcast from JMU in 2015, JMU Nation topped that on Oct. 14, with an estimated 14,000 fans converging on the Quad.
- In turn, that led to the second-largest crowd in Bridgeforth Stadium history, as 25,993 were in attendance for JMU's 30-8 win over Villanova.
- That trailed the 26,069 who watched JMU's matchup with Richmond on Oct. 24, 2015, after College GameDay's first broadcast at JMU.

GRAY MATCHES INDY KICKING MARK

- In last week's win over Villanova, kicker Tyler Gray tied an all-time JMU record, with three made field goals.
- He converted from 22, 36 and 17 yards out to set his career high.
- It was the 15th time a JMU kicker made three field goals in a game.

SHARP GARNERS CAA WEEKLY HONOR

- Trai Sharp had a career afternoon in JMU's win at Delaware to earn CAA Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2.
- Sharp rushed for a career-high 185 yards and a touchdown, helping JMU extend its win streak.
- He averaged 5.1 yards per carry against a UD team which had only allowed 62.0 rush yards per game entering that week.
- Adding in his 13 receiving yards, Sharp tallied a career-best 198 all-purpose yards.

DUKES GRIND OUT WIN AT UDEL

- Behind a career-high 185 rushing yards from Trai Sharp, JMU used stout defense to down Delaware, 20-10, on Sept. 30 in Newark.
- The Dukes rallied from deficits twice in the first half, as Andrew Ankrah's 23-yard fumble recovery for a TD put JMU up for good (14-10).
- Tyler Gray hit a pair of second-half field goals, including a career-long 48 yarder in the fourth.
- JMU limited UD to 229 yards of offense and blanked the host Hens for the final 42:07.

WINS IN NEWARK TOUGH TO COME BY

- JMU earned just its fifth win at Delaware on Sept. 30, improving to 5-8 in the series on the road all-time.
- It marked the second time the Dukes have only won back-to-back road games (2015, 2017) joining the double OT win in the 1991 playoffs and a 20-point triumph in 1994.

NO DOUBT FOR DEFENSE VS. HENS

- JMU's defense held Delaware scoreless in the second half and for the final 42:07.
- The defense gave up just 79 yards of offense and only four first downs over the final two quarters. That also included three straight three-and-outs.
- It was the fourth straight game JMU held its opponent to less than 300 total yards.

DUKES POWER PAST MAINE

- JMU briefly trailed by four points, but a 21-0 run in the second half proved to be the difference in JMU's 28-10 victory against Maine in front of a sold-out crowd of 25,330 on Sept. 23.

- Bryan Schor passed for 281 yards and four touchdowns, coming to within three passing scores of the all-time JMU record of 51, held by both Vad Lee and Justin Rascati.
- Ezra Archie made an impact in his second career game, making eight catches for 90 yards and a touchdown.
- Marcus Marshall turned in his first 100-yard performance at JMU, rushing for 135 yards and averaging 7.1 per carry. In the fourth alone, he rushed for 84 yards on just four touches.
- JMU's defense limited Maine to 299 yards of offense and only 137 rushing yards. It made three interceptions in the win.

MARSHALL OVER THE CENTURY MARK

- For the first time as a Duke, Marcus Marshall used a big fourth quarter against Maine to go over 100 yards for the first time as a Duke.
- Marshall rushed four times for 84 yards in the fourth quarter to finish with 135 yards, averaging 7.1 yards per carry.

ARCHIE NABS ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Making his second appearance and earning his first career start, Ezra Archie had a breakout game to earn CAA Rookie of the Week honors.
- He led all players with eight catches for 90 yards and a touchdown in JMU's 28-10 win over UM.
- He made a career-long, 31-yard catch in the first quarter and his performance was capped off by a three-yard touchdown catch to seal the win.

JMU TROUNCES NORFOLK STATE

- JMU improved to 3-0 with a 75-14 victory against Norfolk State on Sept. 16.
- The Dukes gained 728 yards, just one shy of the program record, which included 472 rushing.
- Trai Sharp had 175 total yards and two touchdowns, which included 130 on the ground. Playing in his first game, Percy Agyei-Obese ran for 102 yards and a score in the fourth quarter alone.
- It was the third-highest point total by any FCS team this season, as JMU turned its best total offense margin in school history, out-gaining NSU by 631 yards (728-91).
- Eight different players found the end zone in what was the program's third game over 70 points since the start of the 2016 season.

3-0 START DOESN'T COME OFTEN

- JMU improved to 3-0 to start a season with the NSU win, but that feat has not come often.
- It was only the fifth time JMU has started 3-0, due in large to playing a FBS school each season.
- JMU last won its first three in 2015 when it reeled off a program-record seven straight wins to start the season.

RUN DUKES! RUN!

- The run game was impactful in week three against Norfolk State, as the Dukes piled on 472 rushing yards, averaging 7.3 per carry.
- The Dukes had six different players score rushing touchdowns in the win.
- Trai Sharp, who played just over a quarter, rushed nine times for 130 yards (14.4) and a touchdown while also tallying 45 receiving yards and a score.

- In the fourth quarter, Percy Agyei-Obese ran for his entire 103 yards, scoring his first career TD.
- Three other Dukes ran for over 50 yards in Marcus Marshall (64, 2TD), Cardon Johnson (57) and Bryan Schor (54, TD).

ALMOST ECLIPSING OFFENSE RECORD

- The Dukes surpassed its all-time total offense record but then it didn't. Say what now?
- JMU had reached 730 yards of total offense late in the fourth quarter, beating the 729 it gained in 2015 at FBS-foe SMU.
- But that record quickly went away when the Dukes took a pair of kneel downs to end the game with 728 yards.
- However, having only given up 91 yards to NSU, the Dukes set a program record for total offense margin, at 637 yards.

SCHOR POWERS DUKES PAST ETSU

- Playing in their first home game in 274 days, Bryan Schor tied the program record for passing touchdowns in the Dukes' 52-10 win over ETSU on Sept. 9.
- Schor passed for 304 yards and five touchdowns, marking the third time he's reached five touchdown tosses and the fifth time a JMU quarterback has done so.
- Ishmael Hyman and Riley Stapleton both turned in their first career two-touchdown games.
- JMU out-gained ETSU 426-175, which included holding the Bucs to just 57 rushing yards (1.8).

SCHOR TIES PROGRAM RECORD...AGAIN

- He had done it twice before. On Sept. 9, Bryan Schor connected with his receivers for five touchdown passes, tying the program record.
- On the day, Schor completed 76 percent of his passes, going 25-of-33 for 304 yards.
- Schor found Ishmael Hyman twice in the first quarter, and later had touchdown tosses to Riley Stapleton in the middle quarters for his first career scores.
- He wrapped up his outing with a touchdown to U.Va. transfer David Eldridge in the fourth to complete his five-TD day.

RILEY'S BIG DAY

- Entering the ETSU game, redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton had never caught a pass. He changed that in a big way.
- Stapleton led JMU with eight receptions, finishing with 64 yards and two touchdowns.
- His first career touchdown came with 6:06 remaining in the first half on a three-yard pass to cap a 16-play drive.
- The latter touchdown catch occurred with just over six minutes to go in the third on a four-yard grab, which put JMU up 42-7 at the time.

DUKES THRASH FBS ECU TO OPEN 2017

- Cardon Johnson rushed for a career-high 265 yards and two touchdowns, and JMU beat ECU 34-14 in the season opener on Sept. 2.
- Johnson's rushing total was the second most in JMU single-game history, falling just 11 yards shy of Vad Lee's 2015 record (276 at SMU).
- It was JMU's sixth-ever win against a FBS opponent, as the Dukes improved to 2-0 against the American Athletic Conference, joining the

48-45 win over SMU two seasons ago.

- JMU out-gained ECU 614-362, which included a dominant rushing performance (410-70).
- Kyre Hawkins led the defensive attack with 13 tackles, while Jimmy Moreland had a career-high 11. JMU produced three interceptions, two of which came by Rashad Robinson.

JOHNSON, KYRE EARN CAA AWARDS

- Following the FBS win at ECU, both Cardon Johnson and Kyre Hawkins were honored by the CAA for the first time in their careers.
- Johnson was named CAA Offensive Player of the Week, while Hawkins was tabbed CAA Defensive Player of the Week.
- Johnson rushed for 265 yards and two touchdowns on just 17 carries (15.6 avg), which included scoring runs of 85 and 80 yards. His output was 100 yards better than his previous career high, set back in 2015.
- Hawkins led the defense with 13 tackles, which was the second-most tackles of his career. He also recorded a tackle-for-loss, as the Dukes built a lead as big as 27 points in the fourth.

DUKES TAKE ANOTHER FBS WIN

- For the second time in three years, JMU defeated a FBS team, improving to 2-0 against the American Athletic Conference in the process.
- The Dukes improved to 6-20 all-time in these games and have now won three of their past seven outings against the subdivision.
- Prior to Saturday's 34-14 win at ECU, JMU downed SMU 48-45 back on Sept. 26, 2015.
- The Dukes also have a pair of wins against the Atlantic Coast Conference, taking a 21-17 win at Virginia in 1982 and claiming a historic 21-16 triumph at Virginia Tech in 2010.
- JMU also produced back-to-back wins at Navy with a 24-20 win in 1989 and a 16-7 win in 1990.

ROBINSON PICKS OFF TWO AT ECU

- JMU forced four turnovers in the season opener, including three interceptions.
- Rashad Robinson led the Dukes with a career-best two interceptions. The first came in the end zone and the latter late in the fourth quarter.

LONG RUSHES POWER JMU AT ECU

- The Dukes established the run early, allowing them to never trail in the 34-14 win at ECU.
- The Dukes racked up 410 yards on 42 carries, averaging 9.8 yards per rush.
- Cardon Johnson reeled off a career-best 265 yards, which included TD runs of 85 and 80.
- Late in the fourth, Marcus Marshall, who ran for 88 yards on 10 touches, capped his day with a 70-yard touchdown scamper. Bryan Schor also had 48 yards and a score.

.500 OR BETTER 15 STRAIGHT YEARS

- JMU's success from year to year has come to be expected, as the Dukes recorded a .500 record or better for a league-best 15th consecutive season in 2017.
- JMU also produced its 13th winning season during the timeframe.
- The Dukes have now had a winning record in 28 of 46 seasons and tallied nine wins for the third straight year in 2016 - a first for the program.

PICKED TO WIN THE CAA

- Winners of two straight Colonial Athletic Association championships, JMU will seek its third in a row in 2017 and is the overwhelming favorite to do so.
- JMU received 21 of 24 first-place votes from the league's head coaches and SIDs.
- The Dukes captured their second national championship after going 14-1 overall, winning their final 12 games to finish the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I.
- JMU completed the CAA gauntlet with a perfect 8-0 record to win the league crown for the second straight year before earning the No. 4 seed for the FCS playoffs.
- Should the Dukes win the league this season, it would mark the first time in program history they claimed three straight CAA titles.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA FOR FOUR

- Four JMU players were named Preseason All-Americans ahead of the 2017 season.
- They were Aaron Stinnie, Raven Greene, Andrew Ankrah and Jonathan Kloosterman.
- Stinnie was a First Team Preseason All-American from both STATS and HERO Sports, while Greene was a STATS Third Team selection and HERO Sports First Team honoree.
- Ankrah was a STATS Second Team pick, while Kloosterman earned a STATS Third Team spot.

SIX DUKES VOTED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

- In addition to Bryan Schor being named Preseason Player of the Year, he was one of six players to be voted Preseason All-CAA.
- That number led all schools for most selections.
- Joining Schor were tight end Jonathan Kloosterman, offensive lineman Aaron Stinnie, defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah, safety Raven Greene and special teams player Robert Carter Jr.
- This is the first season the league has added a special teams player, which features long snappers, holders and gunners on kickoff coverage.

RECAPPING JMU'S TITLE RUN

- JMU was able to put all the pieces together in all three phases en route to winning the 2016 NCAA Division I title.
- The Dukes earned wins against No. 22 New Hampshire, No. 5 Sam Houston State, No. 1 North Dakota State and No. 13 Youngstown State.
- In the second-round win vs. UNH, Bryan Schor passed for a career-high 371 yards and five touchdowns, tying the passing touchdown record, in a 55-22 triumph.
- Rashard Davis also connected with Brandon Ravenel on a touchdown pass for a JMU single-game record six total touchdown passes.
- In the quarters, JMU dominated SHSU 65-7, marking the second-largest margin of victory in FCS playoffs history.
- JMU gained over 600 yards of offense, including 356 rushing yards. Khalid Abdullah ran for 141 and three scores.
- JMU outscored top-seeded NDSU 10-0 in the fourth quarter to upend the five-time defending national champions 27-17.
- Khalid Abdullah rushed for 180 yards and finished with a career-high 231 all-purpose yards. Tyler Gray kicked a 45-yard field goal with 11:46 to go and Bryan Schor found John Miller on a 25-yard touchdown late in the fourth.
- JMU surged out to a 21-0 lead in the first half and limited YSU to only 21 rushing yards to win the national championship 28-14.
- Khalid Abdullah was named Most Outstanding Performer with 101 yards and two scores, as the Dukes became the eighth FCS team to win multiple national titles.
- They are also the first to achieve the feat in the Colonial Athletic Association.

NCAA GRANTS RAVEN A FIFTH YEAR

- Mike Houston announced prior to the 2016 regular-season finale that Raven Greene was granted a medical waiver for a fifth season of eligibility for the 2017 season.
- He was a First Team All-CAA safety and later earned All-America honors.

- His sophomore season was cut short in 2014 after suffering a season-ending injury at Albany, just four games in.
- In his return back in 2015, he was a Second Team All-CAA member.

JMU VERSUS RANKED TEAMS

- Since 1985, the Dukes have played 142 games against ranked opponents and hold a 63-79-1 record in those contests.
- JMU's most notable win wasn't against a FCS foe, but that to FBS power Virginia Tech. On Sept. 11, 2010, Madison stunned then-No. 13 Virginia Tech 21-16 in Blacksburg.
- The Dukes have captured 27 victories against top-10 teams and three against a No. 1 team.
- JMU picked up its first win over a top-ranked team on Sept. 26, 1992 -- a 52-49 win at Youngstown State. Fourteen years later, on Oct. 14, 2006, JMU downed New Hampshire on the road, 42-23. More recently, the Dukes claimed a 35-32 triumph versus Appalachian State at home on Sept. 20, 2008.
- This season, JMU is 5-0 against top-25 opponents with a 30-8 win over No. 11 Villanova, a 21-0 shutout against No. 17 New Hampshire on Homecoming and a 31-3 blowout at No. 11 Elon in the regular-season finale.
- In the postseason JMU rolled 26-7 against No. 10 Stony Brook before rallying past No. 11 Weber State, 31-28 in the quarters.

FCS No. 1 JMU Runs Past FBS ECU 34-14

GREENVILLE, N.C. - Redshirt senior running back Cardon Johnson rushed for 265 yards and two scores as FCS No. 1 James Madison stormed past FBS ECU 34-14 on Saturday night at Bagwell Field at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

JMU increased the longest winning streak in all of Division I football to 13 games while improving to 2-0 all-time against American Conference teams (48-45 at SMU in 2015). The Dukes also snapped a 25-game winning streak for ECU against FCS opponents.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU rushed for 422 yards, its second most on the road in program history, as part of a 614-yard offensive performance
- The Dukes led 7-0 at the half thanks to a rushing score from senior quarterback Bryan Schor
- Johnson rushed 85 yards on the first offensive play of the second half to make it 14-0
- ECU responded with a short drive after an interception to make it 14-7, but JMU responded with three scores in succession to move ahead 34-7 before the Pirates struck one last time in the final minute
- Bryan Schor was 15-for-22 passing for 192 yards along with 48 yards on the ground with one score each

HAVE A DAY CARDON JOHNSON

- Johnson's 265 yards were a career high and the second most in JMU history
- He hit paydirt on runs of 85 and 80 yards
- Both of JMU's top rushing performances have come against AAC opponents as Vad Lee's program record came at SMU in 2015 (276)
- Johnson became the first opposing running back to eclipse 200 yards against ECU in 76 games
- Johnson's 85-yard burst was the fourth-longest run in JMU history

DEFENSE ON THE RISE

- JMU limited ECU to 372 total yards and 14 points
- The 20-point margin of victory was JMU's largest ever against a FBS opponent
- In JMU's last five games (four ranked foes in FCS playoffs and FBS ECU), the Dukes have allowed 74 total points (14.8/game) with 28 of those points with the victory clearly in hand
- JMU had three interceptions and a fumble recovery on defense
- Kyre Hawkins led the defense with 13 tackles while Jimmy Moreland added 11
- The defense limited ECU to 80 yards rushing
- ECU was shut out at the half for the first time since trailing Southern Miss 14-0 in 2007

MORE NOTES

- JMU improved to 25-20-1 all-time in season openers and won its season opener for the third straight season
- The Dukes played a game as the No. 1 team in the national polls for the first time since a loss to Montana in the 2008 NCAA playoffs
- JMU posted the second win of the year nationwide by a FCS team over a FBS team

Schor, #1 JMU Rolls Past ETSU, 52-10, in Home Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor tied the program record with five touchdowns and top-ranked James Madison cruised to a 52-10 victory in its football home opener on Saturday night in front of 24,722 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes extended their nation-leading win streak to 14 straight games, improving to 2-0 on the young season, while the Buccaneers fell to 1-1.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Schor was 25-of-33 for 304 yards and five touchdowns, marking the third time in his career he tied the school passing TD record.
- JMU out-gained ETSU 426-175, which included 304-118 through the air. JMU's defense limited the Bucs to only 57 rushing yards in the win.
- Senior Ishmael Hyman and redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton each hauled in two touchdown receptions – a career-high for both players. Junior David Eldridge caught a fourth-quarter touchdown for his first score since transferring from Virginia.
- Entering Saturday, Stapleton was yet to make a reception, but he finished with eight catches for 64 yards and his two scores. Hyman tied his career high with six receptions, finishing with 93 receiving yards. Eldridge also had 80 yards on a career-best six grabs.

SCHOR SURGING UP CAREER CHARTS

With tonight's performance, Schor moved up in three career statistical categories, including passing touchdowns, completions and attempts.

- 42 passing TD (tied for 3rd w/ Mike Cawley; passed Eriq Williams' 40)
- 330 completions (6th place; passed Eriq Williams' 326)
- 4,364 passing yards (7th place)
- 467 pass attempts (9th place; passed Michael Birdsong's 453)

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE ONCE AGAIN

JMU's defense is proving week in and week out it is one of the premier units in FCS football. In the home-opening win, the Dukes held ETSU to just 175 total yards, which included 57 on the ground. JMU allowed just 1.8 yards per carry, and the Bucs were just 5-of-15 on third down.

The Dukes were in the backfield often, tallying 8.0 tackles for loss, two of which were sacks. Redshirt junior Darrius Carter had 2.5 tackles for loss, while Ron'Dell Carter added a pair of TFLs. Since the national title game last season, JMU has given up just 148 rushing yards to its foes.

Dukes Rush Past Norfolk State, 75-14

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-ranked James Madison bulldozed its way to over 400 rushing yards and seven touchdowns on the ground en route to a dominant 75-14 victory against Norfolk State in its football non-conference finale on Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (3-0) amassed 472 rushing yards, averaging 7.3 yards per carry. They were led by junior running back Trai Sharp who ran for 130 yards and a touchdown on just nine touches (14.4 ypc) and freshman Percy Agyei-Obese, who finished with 103 yards and a score in his first career game. Three other Dukes ran for over 50 yards in junior Marcus Marshall (64 yards, 2 TD), redshirt senior Cardon Johnson (57 yards) and senior Bryan Schor (54 yards, TD).

QUICK HITS

- JMU gained 728 yards of total offense, which was just one yard shy of the program-record 729 yards gained back on Sept. 26, 2015 at SMU.
- The Dukes limited the Spartans to only 91 yards of offense, marking the largest margin of total offense difference between two teams in JMU's 46-year history.
- The team had six different players score rushing touchdowns, led by Marshall's two.
- The Dukes scored 35 points in the second quarter, tying the program mark for most points in a single quarter.
- Schor passed for 149 yards and two touchdowns, while Cole Johnson had 99 passing yards and a touchdown.
- Two freshmen Dukes scored first career touchdowns in tight end Clayton Cheatham (rec. TD) and Agyei-Obese (rush TD).
- Dukes had a pair of points in special teams when Bryce Maginley blocked a punt in the end zone, resulting in a safety.

DEFENSE CONTINUES PROMINENCE

The Dukes' defense had another sterling afternoon, holding Norfolk State to just 91 total yards of offense, 28 of which came in the final quarter, and without an offensive touchdown. JMU surrendered just 1.9 yards per play and only allowed the Spartans to cross midfield on three offensive drives.

3-0 START FOR THE DUKES

- Fifth time in school history JMU starts a season 3-0
- First time since 2015 when the Dukes began 7-0 - program best start to a year
- Win extended JMU's D1-leading win streak to 15 straight games, which is just two shy of Richmond's CAA-record 17 straight (2008-09)

No. 1 Dukes Rally Past Maine 28-10 in CAA Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw four touchdown passes, and top-ranked James Madison outscored Maine 21-0 over the final 24 minutes to rally for a 28-10 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The win came in front of a sold out crowd of 25,330, which was the third-highest attendance in stadium history.

The Dukes improved to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in CAA play while the Black Bears dropped to 1-2 and 0-2. JMU's Division-I leading win streak remained intact as it extended to 16 consecutive games. That mark is just one shy of Richmond's 17-game streak (2008-09).

QUICK HITS

- Bryan Schor passed for 281 yards and four touchdowns and is now three passing scores shy of the JMU all-time record (51 - Vad Lee & Justin Rascati).
- Ezrah Archie, playing in his second career game, had eight receptions for 90 yards – both career highs. His final catch, a three-yard touchdown, capped his performance.
- Marcus Marshall had a strong second half, finishing with 135 rushing yards and averaging 7.1 yards per carry. It was his first career 100-yard game at JMU.
- JMU had seven players catch at least one pass, including touchdown grabs by Archie, David Eldridge, Jonathan Kloosterman and Taylor Woods.
- JMU out-gained Maine 472-299, holding the league's second-best rushing offense to only 137 rushing yards.
- Curtis Oliver led all players with a career-high 12 tackles, and Kyre Hawkins made two sacks with a pair of pass breakups. JMU's defense tallied 4 total sacks and 7 tackles for loss. The Dukes produced three interceptions, two of which came in the second half by Rashad Robinson and Jimmy Moreland.

WHEN THE GAME TURNED

- After Maine took a 10-7 lead early in the third quarter on a 60-yard Josh Mack run, JMU answered four minutes later with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Schor to Eldridge to make it 14-10.
- Maine's next three possessions consisted of 17 total yards, two three-and-outs and an interception by Robinson.
- On the ensuing drive, JMU went 48 yards, capped off by a Schor touchdown to a wide-open Woods for his first career receiving touchdown.
- After another three-and-out, JMU put the game away with an 86-yard drive, which included a 22-yard rush by Marshall, a 26-yard pass to Riley Stapleton and a three-yard passing score to Archie.

ARCHIE HAS CAREER DAY

Ezrah Archie stepped into the starting in just his second career game Saturday, and he made an immediate impact. The rookie corralled eight receptions for 90 yards, leading all players in both categories. His day was highlighted by his first career touchdown, coming on a three-yard grab in the fourth quarter.

MARSHALL SURPASSES CENTURY MARK FOR FIRST TIME AT JMU

Marcus Marshall eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time since transferring to JMU from Georgia Tech last spring. He ran for 135 yards on 19 carries, with a 7.1 yards per carry average. His day was capped off with a 49-yard run late in the fourth to put the Dukes in scoring position. In the final stanza, Marshall went off, going for 84 yards on just four carries (21.0 ypc).

#1 Dukes Tie CAA Win-Streak Record with 20-10 Win at UD

NEWARK, Del. – Junior running back Trai Sharp rushed for a career-high 185 yards and top-ranked James Madison forced three turnovers to grind out a 20-10 Colonial Athletic Association football victory at Delaware on Saturday at Delaware Stadium.

The Dukes increased the nation's longest win streak to 17 games, which tied the all-time CAA record - set by Richmond in 2008-09. That is also tied for the 13th-longest win streak in FCS history.

JMU improved to 5-0 on the year and 2-0 in CAA play, while the Blue Hens fell to 2-2 and 0-1.

QUICK HITS

- Sharp ran for 185 yards on 36 carries, tallying a 5.1 yards per carry average. His long of 59 set up his six-yard touchdown carry in the first quarter.
- Redshirt senior Andrew Ankrah recorded his first career touchdown on a 23-yard fumble recovery in the second quarter. He finished with five tackles, including two for loss, and a sack.
- Playing in his first game this season, senior linebacker Brandon Herford recorded a team-high 11 tackles and a sack.
- JMU's defense held Delaware to just 229 yards of offense and blanked the host Hens for the final 42:07.
- Redshirt senior Raven Greene collected his third takeaway of the season with his second interception of the season in the second quarter. He also forced a fumble early in the second half when UD was driving in JMU territory.
- Junior kicker Tyler Gray sealed the win with a career-long, 48-yard field goal with 2:50 remaining.

WHERE THE GAME TURNED

- Trailing 10-7 after having just punted to Delaware, Andrew Ankrah picked up a fumble on a backwards pass and ran it 23 yards for his first career touchdown, giving the Dukes a 14-10 lead with 6:53 to go in the first half.
- On the ensuing drive, Raven Greene picked off UD quarterback Joe Walker with 3:46 to go in the second, resulting in three points off a Tyler Gray field goal in the closing seconds.
- That fueled JMU's defense into the second half, where it did not give up any points to the host Blue Hens.

THE DAGGER

- After forcing UD into a three-and-out with just under seven minutes to go, Trai Sharp rushed for 23 yards on five consecutive plays to set up a Tyler Gray field goal.
- Gray drilled a career-long, 48 yarder from the left hash to put the Dukes up 10, at 20-10 with only 2:50 to play.

TRAI HAS A DAY

Trai Sharp carried the load on offense, tallying 36 of the Dukes' 54 rushes on the day, as he finished with 185 yards. He began his career performance by ripping off a massive 59-yard rush to put the dukes inside the 10. On the very next play, he pounded it in the end zone from six yards out to give JMU a 7-3 lead. It was Sharp's second 100-yard rushing performance of the year and the fourth of his career.

NO DOUBT ON DEFENSE

In the second half, JMU's defense gave up just 79 yards of total offense while holding the Hens scoreless. JMU gave up just four first downs the entire half, along with three straight three-and-outs. This was the fourth consecutive game JMU has held its opponent to under 300 total yards of offense.

Strong Defense Propels #1 JMU Past #11 Villanova, 30-8

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-ranked James Madison held 11th-ranked Villanova scoreless for three quarters and scored 14 straight points down the stretch to grind out a 30-8 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon in front of 25,993 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The attendance was the second-largest in school history, trailing the 26,069 at JMU's Oct. 24, 2015 matchup against Richmond.

JMU broke the CAA win-streak record, extending its nation-leading wins mark to 18 wins. That leads all teams both at the FBS and FCS levels. The win was also the 300th for the program.

QUICK HITS

- Defense was the name of the game, as the Dukes limited Villanova to 174 yards of total offense. It was the fifth straight game conceding less than 300 yards and the third time allowing under 200. It was also the fifth straight game they gave up 10 points or less.
- JMU had three takeaways, including two interceptions. The latter was a pick-six on a 5-yard return by senior linebacker Brandon Hereford with 1:57 to play. It was his first career interception.
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah was a force up front, making 2.5 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks to move into ninth place all-time at JMU with 21.0 career sacks.
- Redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown paced the defense with a game-high 12 stops (8 solo), and redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had a pass breakup and sack at a crucial juncture in the fourth quarter.
- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor was 20-of-28 for 271 yards and two touchdowns, as he reached 50 career passing touchdowns. He is one shy of Vad Lee and Justin Rascati, who each had 51.
- Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls tied his career high with seven catches for 83 yards. Freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham had two grabs for a career-high 57 yards and a score. Junior receiver David Eldridge also had four receptions for 43 yards and a touchdown.
- JMU out-gained the Wildcats, 316-174, which included a 271-30 advantage in the passing game.

SCHOR SURPASSES PASSING MILESTONE

- Late in the second quarter, Bryan Schor threw his 49th career touchdown pass, but not before reaching a career milestone.
- Needing just 113 passing yards, Schor surpassed 5,000 career yards, becoming the fifth JMU quarterback in history to reach the feat. He now has 5,158 yards for his career.
- He joins an elite list consisting of: Mike Cawley (6,482), Justin Rascati (5,912), Vad Lee (5,652) and Eriq Williams (5,356).

DEFENSE STANDS TALL...AGAIN

The Dukes defense combined for 6 total sacks and 11 tackles for loss, both of which were season highs. JMU has tallied at least 5.0 tackles for loss in each game and it was the third straight outing the defense registered three or more sacks. JMU also forced three turnovers, including a pick-six late in the fourth. Villanova did not cross midfield until late in the third quarter, which led to its only score of the night.

GRAY MATCHES KICKING RECORD

- Tyler Gray hit three field goals, setting a career-high for most in a single game. This was the 15th time in JMU history that a player made three FG.
- Gray opened the game with two field goals to put the Dukes up 6-0, and his third came midway through the third quarter. On the day, he made field goals from 22, 36 and 17 yards out.

Defense Equals Offense in #1 JMU's 46-14 Rout of W&M

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. – Six takeaways and 33 points off turnovers led top-ranked James Madison to a 46-14 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory at William & Mary on Saturday afternoon in a sold-out crowd at Zable Stadium.

The Dukes increased the nation's longest win streak to a CAA-record 19th straight victory. JMU is now 7-0 on the year and 4-0 in league play, while the Tribe fell to 2-5 and 0-4. The Dukes have also won eight in a row on the road – their longest in program history.

The 32-point win was also the largest margin-of-victory for the Dukes in the 40-year history of the series, as JMU improved to 23-17 all-time against the Tribe.

QUICK HITS

- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor tied the JMU record for career passing touchdowns (51) on a two-yard connection with freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham for the first score of the game. That touchdown toss ties him with Vad Lee and Justin Rascati.
- JMU's defense record a season-best six takeaways and scored a season-high 33 points off turnovers. The Dukes out-gained the Tribe 389-298, which marked the sixth straight game JMU has held an opponent to under 300 yards.
- The Dukes tallied six sacks to bring their season total to 24.0, which matches their 2016 total.
- Redshirt senior Jordan Brown tallied a career-best two interceptions, while both junior corners Jimmy Moreland and Rashad Robinson each had one.
- Senior receiver Terrence Alls matched his career high for the second straight week, making seven receptions. He also tallied 113 yards (long of 39) for his second career 100-yard game.
- Junior running back Marcus Marshall led JMU's rushing attack with 65 yards and two touchdowns, marking his second two-TD game of 2017.
- The Dukes set a program record with four made field goals, as both junior kicker Tyler Gray and redshirt freshman Ethan Ratke combined to go 4-for-4. Gray hit a game-long 42 yarder, while Ratke knocked down a career-long 39 yarder.

DEFENSE... JUST DEFENSE

We've stopped trying to name this section, because they continue to impress week in and week out. Here are the tidbits on the Dukes' defense.

- The Dukes limited the Tribe to 298 yards of offense and only 122 yards through three quarters. This was the sixth game in a row JMU has held an opponent to under 300 yards of total offense.
- Redshirt junior Darrious Carter registered a strip-sack and recovered the fumble in the second.
- Brown intercepted his third and fourth passes of the season for the first multi-interception game of his career. He now has eight during his tenure with JMU.
- W&M did not cross midfield in first half, gaining just 53 yards with two first downs.
- The Dukes never allowed the Tribe to reach the red-zone, forced 6 three-and-outs and held them to 3-of-13 on third down.
- Moreland had a pick-six in the second half, marking the third time he's scored in his career on an interception. He is now tied for 10th all-time with nine interceptions.

Schor Breaks Career Passing TD Record in JMU's 21-0 Shutout Over #17 UNH

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw two touchdowns to set the program record for career passing scores, and top-ranked James Madison shut out No. 17 New Hampshire for a 21-0 Homecoming victory on Saturday in front of a sold-out Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The attendance of 25,298 was the third sell out of the season and the fifth-most attended game in Bridgeforth history.

The Dukes (8-0, 5-0 CAA) extended their NCAA Division I-best win streak to 20 straight games and tied the Colonial Athletic Association record with their 15th straight league win, while the Wildcats (5-3, 3-2 CAA) were shut out for the first time since Sept. 3, 2016 at San Diego State.

QUICK HITS

- With the win, the Dukes improved to 8-0 on the season, marking the best-start to a season in program history.
- JMU's 20-game win-streak is currently ranked second in all of NCAA college football, trailing just Division III's Mary Hardin-Baylor (23).
- For the first time since Oct. 17, 2015 (at Elon - 51-0), the Dukes pitched a shutout performance. The shutout marked the third consecutive game where the opposition was held scoreless in the first, second and third quarters.
- Bryan Schor's two passing touchdowns moved his career total to 53, surpassing Vad Lee and Justin Rascati for first all-time in JMU history.
- Freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham scored his fourth touchdown of the year and has scored in three straight games.
- Junior cornerback Rashad Robinson returned an interception 82-yards to the house to increase the Dukes lead to 21-0, inevitably sealing the win. It was the third-longest interception return in JMU history.
- Redshirt junior cornerback Jimmy Moreland picked up an Andrew Ankrah forced fumble late in the second quarter after UNH had driven the ball deep into JMU territory. This marked Moreland's fifth game in a row with a takeaway and his sixth takeaway of the season.

DEFENSE SWARMS WILDCATS FOR SHUTOUT

- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah led the way with eight total tackles, one tackle for a loss, one pass break-up, and two forced fumbles.
- Redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins had a team-high 10 tackles and a sack, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had a career-best two sacks.
- The Dukes conceded just 193 yards of total offense on the day. This marks the fourth time this season JMU has held its opponent to under 200 yards of total offense, along with the seventh consecutive game allowing under 300 yards of total offense.
- Rashad Robinson's interception was JMU's second straight game with 0a pick-six, following Jimmy Moreland's last week at W&M.
- For the first time since the second round playoff win in 2016, UNH QB Trevor Knight was held without a touchdown pass.

SPREADING THE FIELD

Bryan Schor finished the afternoon going 20-of-27 for 176 yards while targeting and completing passes to nine different receivers. Six of those receivers hauled in multiple receptions, with senior receiver John Miller leading the way with five catches for 65 yards.

#1 Dukes Roll in Second Half to Earn 38-3 Win at URI

KINGSTON, R.I. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw four touchdown passes and No. 1 James Madison used a 31-0 run in the second half to roll past Rhode Island 38-3 in Colonial Athletic Association football on Saturday afternoon at Meade Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 9-0 on the year and 6-0 in CAA play, while the Rams fell to 2-7 and 1-5. It was JMU's 16th straight conference victory, setting a new CAA record. That passed UMass' 50-year old record, set between 1965-67.

QUICK HITS

- With the win, the Dukes picked up their ninth straight road, and extended their CAA-record and Division I-leading win streak to 21 games.
- Bryan Schor threw three of his four touchdown passes in the second half, as JMU outscored the hosts 31-0 over the final 30 minutes. He was 14-of-17 for 150 yards on the afternoon.
- JMU limited URI to only 18 yards in the second half, while scoring on each of its first five drives of the second stanza.
- Four different receivers caught a touchdown pass, led by redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls, who had five receptions for 73 yards and a score. It was Alls' first score of 2017.
- Freshman running back Piercy Agyei-Obese led the Dukes in rushing with 95 yards (9.5/carry), which included a career-long 40 yarder. Senior Taylor Woods was also solid with 75 yards on the ground (6.2/carry).
- Ethan Ratke hit a career-long 42-yard field goal late in the third to give the Dukes a 24-3 advantage at the end of three quarters.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene tallied his 12th career interception in the fourth quarter, and is now tied for third all-time at JMU with Dean Marlowe.
- JMU now leads Rhode Island 10-3 in the series record with its eighth straight win over the Rams, and the Dukes are now 4-2 when traveling to URI.

SWARMING THE BACKFIELD, SHUTTING DOWN THE RUN

- JMU accumulated 8.0 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks, holding Rhode Island to only 143 yards (18 in the second half). JMU limited URI to only 29 total rushing yards and swarmed the hosts to -13 rushing in the second half.
- Senior linebacker Brandon Hereford led JMU with eighth tackles and a 0.5 tackle for loss, to go with a fumble recovery.
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah had five stops, including 2.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks. He is now tied for sixth all-time at JMU with 24.5 career sacks – matching Kevin Winston.
- Redshirt senior Simeyon Robinson also had 1.5 sacks, while three others had at least 1.0 sack.

SCHOR NOW THIRD PLACE IN PASSING

- Schor added 150 yards to his career ledger, and now sits at 5,670 career passing yards.
- He passed Vad Lee for third place all-time at JMU and extended his own JMU record, with 57 career touchdown passes.
- Schor is only 300 passing yards shy of second place and just over yards off the career record.

#1 JMU Scores in Final Minute to Top UR in Thriller, 20-13

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Junior running back Trai Sharp scored the game-winning touchdown with 44 seconds remaining and top-ranked James Madison survived a Colonial Athletic Association thriller, 20-13, against rival Richmond in front of 24,586 on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The win extended JMU's win streak to a Division I-best 22 straight games and a CAA-record 17th straight conference win. The Dukes moved to 10-0 on the year and 7-0 in CAA play to clinch at least a share of the conference title for the third straight season. The Spiders fell to 5-5 overall and 3-4 in league play.

QUICK HITS

- Tied up at 13-13, JMU ventured on a 10-play, 71-yard drive in which Sharp accounted for 54 rushing yards, capped off by his fourth rushing score of the year. He finished the game with a team-high 60 rushing yards.
- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw for 229 yards, with 18 completions on 32 attempts. He moved into third all-time at JMU in career completions, with 458. Schor needs 14 more passing yards to move into second all-time in program history.
- Junior receiver David Eldridge and redshirt senior receiver Ishmael Hyman led the way by combining for over 150 receiving yards. Eldridge had a career-high 81 yards off four catches, and Hyman also had four grabs for 70 yards.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene paced the defense with 11 tackles, while junior corner Rashad Robinson had eight stops and a half-sack. Senior defensive lineman Cornell Urquhart had a team-high 1.5 sacks and redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown collected his team-leading sixth interception of the year.

- JMU tallied four sacks in the win, marking the fifth straight week JMU produced four or more sacks.
- Richmond, which entered Saturday leading the CAA in total offense (470.3) and ranking second in scoring offense (33.3), was limited to 324 yards of offense and just 13 points. The Spiders managed only 20 rushing yards, averaging 1.1 per carry.
- The win was the first by a home team in the series since JMU's 38-31 win in 2013. The Dukes have won four of the past five meetings against the Spiders.

#1 Dukes Capture Outright CAA Championship with 31-3 Win at #11 Elon

ELON, N.C. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor rushed for three touchdowns and redshirt freshman safety D'Angelo Amos blocked a punt for a score, as top-ranked James Madison rolled to a 31-3 victory at No. 11 Elon to win the outright Colonial Athletic Association Football championship Saturday afternoon at Rhodes Stadium.

The Dukes completed the regular-season slate unbeaten, improving to 11-0 on the year and 8-0 in CAA play. JMU won its second straight outright CAA championship and third overall conference crown. The Dukes also became the first team in CAA history to go 8-0 in league play in consecutive seasons. The Phoenix dropped to 8-3 and 6-2 and will likely earn an at-large bid to the FCS playoffs.

QUICK HITS

- Schor finished with 290 yards of total offense, going 22-of-29 for 214 yards, as well as rushing for 76 yards and three touchdowns on just nine carries (8.4/rush).
- Junior running back Trai Sharp also ran for 68 yards on 11 carries (6.2/rush), as the Dukes tallied 190 yards, going for 5.4 per carry.
- Senior receiver John Miller reeled in a career-high seven receptions, going for 59 yards on the day. Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls added five catches for a game-best 73 receiving yards.
- Defensively, the Dukes were led by redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins, who had a game-high 11 tackles. Senior defensive linemen Cornell Urquhart had a career-high nine tackles, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had eight stops.
- JMU racked up 6.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks while not conceding a single sack on the offensive side of the ball.
- Special teams recorded points, as Amos blocked a third-quarter punt and picked up the loose ball, running it in from six yards out to make it 24-0.
- In JMU's two games ever at Rhodes Stadium, the Dukes have outscored Elon 82-3. They also won 51-0 back in 2015.

The Dukes also held a team scoreless in the first half for the fifth time this season, and the fourth in CAA play.

SCORING SUMMARY

- Redshirt freshman kicker Ethan Ratke opened the scoring with 1:27 remaining in the first. After the Elon defense kept JMU out of the end zone, Ratke kicked it through the uprights on a 19-yard try to make it 3-0.
- After a turnover-on-downs, JMU marched 64 yards on a touchdown drive. After converting twice on third down, Schor rushed around the Elon defense for a 21-yard touchdown scamper to make it 10-0 with 10:15 left in the second.
- After a stop late in the first half, JMU had to go only 45 yards, capped off by a Schor two-yard touchdown run to make it 17-0 at the break.
- Early in the second half, the Dukes brought the house on an Elon punt and Amos blocked it off the punter's foot. He picked up the loose ball at the six and ran it in for his first career touchdown, putting JMU up 24-0 with 9:23 to go in the third.
- Elon got on the board with a 30-yard field goal by Owen Johnson with 9:14 left in the game. It is the only points Elon has scored against JMU in games played at Rhodes Stadium.
- JMU capped off the game's scoring with 5:17 left when Schor rushed for his third score from six yards out.

UNDISPUTED CHAMPIONS

- JMU won its third straight CAA title and the second straight outright crown with its win today.
- It's the first time in CAA history a team has gone 8-0 in back-to-back season.
- It's also the first time JMU has won three straight titles and the first for the CAA since Boston University won three in a row from 1982-84.
- The Dukes are the first CAA team to go 8-0 three times, as New Hampshire has accomplished the feat twice. JMU is also the first team since UMass in 1977-78 to go unbeaten in back-to-back conference seasons.

#1 Dukes Advance to FCS Quarterfinals with 26-7 Victory Against #10 Stony Brook

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-seeded James Madison tied a Division I program record with five interceptions and senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw a pair of touchdown passes, as the Dukes advanced to the quarterfinal round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs with a 26-7 victory against 10th-ranked Stony Brook on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improved to 12-0 on the season to extend their NCAA Division I-leading win streak to 24 straight games, while the Seawolves saw their season end at 10-3, which matched their highest win total in school history.

JMU will host 11th-ranked Weber State next Friday at 7 p.m. on ESPN2.

QUICK HITS

- Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls hauled in a career high 10 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown. His performance marked the first time in over 13 years a JMU player has had double-digit receptions. D.D. Boxley snatched 11 on Oct. 16, 2004 at Maine.
- Schor was 26-of-35 for 255 yards and two touchdowns in the win. He moved into first place all-time at JMU in career completions, which now stands at 506. He surpassed Justin Rascati (487) after starting the game 10-for-10 through the air.
- JMU's defense tied a postseason record, holding Stony Brook to just seven points. That matched the 2016 FCS quarterfinal total when the Dukes rolled Sam Houston State 65-7. It was a season-low scoring output for the Seawolves, as they hadn't tallied less than 17 in a single game all year.
- The Dukes matched a program record at the Division I level, tallying five interceptions. The takeaways came from five separate defensive backs, marking the first time in school history five different players had an interception.
- Stony Brook quarterback Joe Carbone had entered Saturday's second round with only three interceptions this year before his five-interception afternoon. He was 15-of-36 for 207 yards and a score.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene capped off JMU's five-interception day on defense, as he reeled in his 13th career interception to tie the program record for most in history. Redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown picked up his seventh interception of the year, tying him for first place in the FCS in 2017. Just behind Brown is junior corner Rashad Robinson, who produced his sixth interception of the year.

BALL HAWKS

The JMU defense tied a program record at the Division I level in the playoff win over Stony Brook, with five interceptions. The Dukes last had five picks in 2016 against Rhode Island. Prior to today, SBU's Carbone had just thrown three picks all year. The five interceptions bested JMU's four interceptions it had at William & Mary on Oct. 21. JMU's five takeaways led to 13 points off turnovers and the first of two fourth-quarter interceptions helped to end a SBU drive early in the fourth deep in JMU territory.

TOP HOME PLAYOFF ATTENDANCE

- JMU saw a game attendance of 16,449, which was the most in Bridgeforth Stadium postseason history.
- It surpassed the 2008 playoff semifinal attendance of 15,976 against Montana.
- JMU has brought in over 15,000 spectators in three of its last four home playoff games.

ALLS ABOUT TERENCE

- Terrence Alls pulled in a career-high 10 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown
- He was the first JMU receiver to go for 10+ catches since the 2004 season
- His performance was tied for fourth in JMU single-game history for receptions

Ratke's Game-Winning Field Goal Sends #1 JMU to FCS Semis with 31-28 Win

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Redshirt freshman kicker Ethan Ratke kicked the game-winning field goal as time expired to send top-seeded James Madison to the national semifinals with a thrilling 31-28 triumph against 11th-ranked Weber State in the NCAA FCS quarterfinals on Friday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (13-0) will face No. 5 seeded South Dakota State on Saturday, Dec. 16 at 4:30 p.m. on ESPN. The Wildcats ended their program-best season with an 11-3 overall record.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Trailing 28-20 with 3:14 to play, JMU needed only four plays to go 52 when senior quarterback Bryan Schor connected with redshirt sophomore receiver Riley Stapleton on a 40-yard touchdown with 2:08 remaining. Junior running back Trai Sharp tied it up with a successful 2-point conversion rush.

JMU forced Weber into a three-and-out, giving the Dukes the ball back with 1:06 left. Schor found Stapleton on a 17-yard pass, setting them up at the WSU 39. Three plays later, Head Coach Mike Houston called timeout with one second left, setting up Ratke's game-winner, which was not just his career long but also the longest field goal in JMU postseason history.

QUICK HITS

- JMU scored 11 unanswered points in the final 2:08, sending the Dukes to the national semifinals for the fourth time in program history.
- Ethan Ratke tied a program record with a career-best three field goals, including his 46-yard boot as time expired to win the game.
- Junior running back Marcus Marshall eclipsed the century mark, rushing for 128 yards and two touchdowns. He averaged 9.1 yards per rush on 14 carries. It was his second 100-yard game at JMU and the sixth of his collegiate career.
- Bryan Schor was 21-of-45 for 359 yards and a touchdown, as he became JMU's all-time leader in career passing yards (6,727) and total offensive yards (7,859).
- His top-two receiving targets both went over 100 yards on the night, as redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton had a career-high 189 yards and a score on eight catches, and redshirt senior Terrence Alls added 117 yards on six grabs. Stapleton tied his career high in receptions and his receiving yards total was the second-most in school history.
- Defensively, redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins tallied a game-high 13 tackles and a tackle-for-loss, and senior linebacker Brandon Hereford finished with 11 stops.
- Redshirt junior corner Jimmy Moreland also had eight tackles and two pass breakups, with his second breakup forcing the punt which set up JMU's game-winning drive. Junior corner Rashad Robinson intercepted his seventh pass of the season while also breaking up a pair of passes. He is now tied for the FCS lead in interceptions with Jordan Brown.
- WSU quarterback Stefan Cantwell tallied three total touchdowns, passing for 238 yards and two score while leading the team with 47 rushing yards and a touchdown. Two receivers had over 80 yards, led by Kevin Smith's 85. That included his 81-yard touchdown in the second half.
- JMU out-gained Weber State 549-329, including 359-238 through the air.

Mike Houston was hired as James Madison University's seventh head football coach on January 18, 2016.

In his first season at the helm, he guided the Dukes to heights they hadn't seen in over a decade, winning the program's second-ever national championship.

JMU finished the 2016 season with a 14-1 record, setting a program record for wins. The Dukes won their final 12 games to end the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I. During the regular season, Houston led JMU to a perfect 8-0 mark in Colonial Athletic Association play to clinch the outright conference title. It was the second time the Dukes went unbeaten in league play and won the CAA outright.

After going 10-1 in the regular season, JMU earned the No. 4 seed for the FCS playoffs and a first-round bye. The Dukes notched convincing victories at home against New Hampshire (55-22) and previously-unbeaten Sam Houston State (65-7) before conquering five-time defending national champion North Dakota State (27-17) in the national semifinals in Fargo, N.D. The win at NDSU ended the Bison's 22-game playoff win streak and a string of 18 straight home playoff wins.

On Jan. 7, 2017, JMU completed its title run with a 28-14 triumph against Youngstown State in the national championship game at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Khalid Abdullah was named the Most Outstanding Player for the championship, and the Dukes limited a strong run team in YSU to only 21 rushing yards in the win.

Houston reeled in numerous accolades in 2016, as he was named the American Football Coaches Association FCS National Coach of the Year. He also earned AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second straight year and was voted Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year, marking the fifth time in his six-year head coaching career that he was tabbed his conference's top coach. Houston reeled in a pair of state coach of the year accolades, as he was named the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and was voted Virginia Sports Information Directors University Division Coach of the Year. He was also presented with with Bob Ford FCS Coach of the year from the Metro New York Football Writers, the Washington Metro College Coach of the Year from the DC Touchdown Club and the J. Roy Rodman Award from the Norfolk Sports Club.

He coached 14 players to All-CAA status, which included Bryan Schor being named CAA Offensive Player of the Year and Rashard Davis being recognized as CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. JMU had 10 of those 14 make the All-CAA First Team, while seven of the 14 eventually became All-Americans. That list included Abdullah, Schor, Davis, Raven Greene, Mitchell Kirsch, Taylor Reynolds and Aaron Stinnie.

JMU set several conference records, including marks for scoring (700), rushing offense (4,125), total offense (7,612) and first downs (380). Nationally, JMU led the FCS in winning percentage (93.3%), completion percentage (70.8%), team pass efficiency (181.69), first downs (380), defensive interceptions (21) and punt return average (26.65).

The Dukes also ranked second in scoring (46.7), fourth in third down conversions (50%), fifth in both rushing (275.0) and turnovers gained (30), sixth in fumbles lost (4), eighth in turnover margin (1.13) and 10th in turnovers lost (13). Offensively, JMU produced 18 100-yard rushing performances from it strong rushing attack, including Abdullah, who had a team-high 11 games with more than 100 yards.

Defensively, JMU saw a drastic improvement from the previous two seasons, as it ranked 17th in scoring defense (21.2) and 30th in total defense (344.3). The Dukes allowed 7.5 fewer points per game this season and nearly 60 yards fewer per outing from 2015 to 2016. JMU forced seven more turnovers and nearly doubled its interception production, going from 11 in 2015 to a nation-leading 21 in 2016.

During conference play, JMU completed its road gauntlet with victories at Maine, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova. Those four teams finished second through fifth in the CAA standings and three made the postseason in UNH, UR and VU. It was JMU's first win at New Hampshire since 2006 and the first at Villanova since 2008.

Possessing 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five as a head coach, Houston came to Harrisonburg after serving two years as head coach at The Citadel (2014-15). He led the Bulldogs to a 14-11 record in his two seasons and is the only coach in The Citadel's history to win a Southern Conference championship within his first two seasons.

Houston's offense produced 27 individual 100-yard rushing performances, including a program-record 14 in 2015. The 27 100-yard rushers was a two-year record for The Citadel.

In 2015, he guided the Bulldogs to the program's fourth winning season since 1995 with a 9-4 record and a share of the 2015 SoCon title. The Citadel boasted a conference-best +117 scoring margin, including a +100 edge during league play, and Houston went on to be named SoCon Coach of the Year and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year. They also defeated Southeastern Conference member South Carolina 23-22 in the regular-season finale and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs after upsetting ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

In the first-round playoff victory, Houston's run game broke a school record with four 100-yard rushers as it piled up 524 yards on the ground, the most in a NCAA playoff game since 2012 and the second-highest in 2015 for FCS, only behind the Bulldogs' nation-best 535 rushing yards in the season opener.

The Citadel broke school records for all-purpose yards, total offense, rushing yards and interception return yards. The Bulldogs led the nation with a school-record 515 interception return yards and five interception return touchdowns. The Citadel led the Southern and ranked second nationally with 346.9 rushing yards per game, an average of 17.21 yards per completion and just 0.62 sacks allowed per game. The Bulldogs also led the league in interceptions, tackles for loss allowed, turnovers forced, yards per rush, rushing touchdowns, punt return defense, passing touchdowns allowed, fumble recoveries, third-down defense, tackles for loss and kickoff return defense.

Four players earned All-America status and 13 garnered All-Southern Conference honors. Senior defensive lineman Mitchell Jeter was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Year and junior defensive lineman Joe Crochet was The Citadel's first CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American since 1989.

In his first season at the helm, he led the Bulldogs to a 5-7 record, which was tied for the second-highest win total for a first-year coach at The Citadel. Three of the Bulldogs' losses came by a total of nine points, including two in the final seconds. The Citadel rushed for over 4,166 yards, ranking third-best in single-season program history, and their 347.2 rushing averaged led the SoCon and ranked second nationally.

Prior to The Citadel, Houston was head coach at Lenoir-Rhyne, an NCAA Division II school in the South Atlantic Conference, for three seasons. He accumulated a 29-8 record at the helm and directed the Bears to three consecutive SAC championships, a stretch that included a school-record 13 wins in his final year. Houston was named SAC Coach of the Year each season and was also the Don Hansen Super Region II Coach of the Year in 2013. In his final season at LRU, the Bears advanced to the Division II national championship game and ranked No. 2 in the final polls.

Before his elevation to head coach, Houston served as Lenoir-Rhyne's defensive coordinator and secondary coach from 2007-10. He spent the 2006 year as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Brevard College.

Houston began his coaching career in the high school ranks. He coached for a decade at T.C. Roberson High School in Asheville, N.C., including the last five as head coach, where he went 42-18 and guided the team to its first-ever conference championship. He spent his first five seasons at T.C. Roberson as the defensive coordinator after leading the defense at Forbush High School in East Bend, N.C. in his first two years out of college.

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill University, where he played tight end for the Lions and earned a bachelor's degree in biology. In 2014, Houston was inducted into the Franklin High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He is married to the former Amanda Owen and they have two sons, Owen Michael and Reid Wilson.
