JMU FACES OFF WITH NDSU FOR THE NATIONAL TITLE

- Game 15 of the 46th season of JMU football takes place Saturday, Jan. 6 when No. 1 James Madison battles No. 2 North Dakota State in the 2018 NCAA Division I Football Championship Game.
- Kickoff is set for noon ET at Toyota Stadium and will be nationally televised on ESPN2. It will also be streamed on ESPN3 and ESPN app and can be heard on the JMU/Sprint Broadcast Network, with pregame coverage starting at 11 a.m.
- Saturday marks the third meeting between JMU and NDSU, as all three games have occurred in the FCS playoffs. NDSU won the initial meeting in the 2011 FCS Second Round (26-14), and JMU won the latter meeting in the 2016 FCS Semifinals (27-17). Both of those games were played in Fargo, N.D.
- This is the second straight playoffs that JMU will face Missouri Valley Football Conference teams in both the semifinals and championship game.
- JMU's run through the 2017 FCS playoffs is presented by Excel Heating and Cooling.

DUKES SEEK BACK-TO-BACK TITLES

- Making their 14th FCS playoff appearance, JMU looks to repeat as the NCAA Division I national champion.
- The Dukes won titles in 2004 in Chattanooga and 2016 in Frisco.
- JMU is amidst its program-record fourth straight playoff berth. It is 16-11 overall in the playoffs.
- This is the fourth time JMU has won multiple postseason games, having gone 4-0 in both national title runs, 3-0 this year and 2-1 in the 2008 playoffs.
- JMU is 2-0 on neutral ground, as both have occurred in JMU's national championship victories. The Dukes are also 8-4 at home and 6-7 in true road games.
- In last year's championship season, JMU outscored its four opponents 175-60 (43.75 to 15.0 avg).
- This year, the Dukes have outscored the three opponents 108-51 (36.0 to 17.0 avg).
- Over the past two years, JMU has had the three largest scoring outputs in the playoffs. It scored 65 against Sam Houston State and 55 versus New Hampshire in 2016, and tallied 56 against South Dakota State.

DEFENSE FORCES 10 TURNOVERS, JMU ROUTS JACKS IN FCS SEMIS

- JMU tied a FCS playoff record by forcing 10 turnovers, as it routed South Dakota State 51-16 in the FCS semifinals on Dec. 16 at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- The Dukes used a 30-point burst in the third quarter to pull away, and Marcus Marshall led the charge with a career-high 203 rushing yards and two touchdowns in only three quarters of work. His touchdown runs came from 65 yards and 87 yards, which was a career-long rush.
- JMU's defense produced six interceptions, tying a program record, while also recovering four fumbles. The Dukes had five takeaways in the first quarter alone, with three fumbles and two picks.
- Jimmy Moreland tied a program record with three interceptions, Jordan Brown had two to break the JMU single-season record and Raven Greene had a 59-yard pick-six to break the JMU career INT record.
- Bryan Schor passed for 203 yards and two touchdowns, both of which went to Riley Stapleton.

SCOUTING NORTH DAKOTA STATE

- The second-seeded Bison head to Frisco sporting a 13-1 record, with their lone defeat coming at rival South Dakota State.
- NDSU breezed through the playoffs by outscoring opponents 135-26 (45.0 to 8.7 avg).
- It took home wins from San Diego (38-3), Wofford (42-10) and Sam Houston State (55-13).
- For the year, NDSU leads the FCS in scoring margin, as it averages 40.3 points for while conceding 11.5 to its foes, ranking second in both categories.
- NDSU ranks third nationally in passing defense (147.9), fourth in interceptions (20) and seventh in rushing defense (89.2).
- On the other side of the ball, the Bison are fourth in rushing (282.1) and eighth in total offense (462.1).
- Easton Stick is one of the country's most efficient passers this year, as he's third in yards per completion (15.47), 10th in passing touchdowns (27) and 11th in point responsibility (16.7).
- All-American Nick DeLuca leads the charge in the trenches for the Bison, while Robbie Grimsley has 11 passes defended this year to earn All-America laurels.
- Chris Klieman has been part of all five NDSU national championships, with two as the head coach and three as either the defensive backs coach or defensive coordinator. He's 53-6 at the helm in Fargo, having won the MVFC every year.

ROAD TO FRISCO WENT THRU JMU/ND SU

- All season, FCS fans wondered if we were on a collision course for a JMU vs. NDSU national championship game.
- Both squads earned the right to host until Frisco and got the job done, going 3-0 on home soil.
- For the first time since 2011, the national championship will be decided in a No. 1 vs. No. 2 matchup.
- NDSU beat top-ranked Sam Houston 17-6 to win its first of five straight national championships.
- No. 2 Villanova claimed the 2009 championship with a 23-21 win over No. 1 Montana.

26-GAME WIN STREAK LEADS ALL NCAA

- JMU's 51-16 triumph in the FCS Semifinals marked JMU's program-record 26th consecutive win, extending the CAA record and longest active streak in all of NCAA Division I.
- With Mary Hardin-Baylor's loss in the Division III title game, JMU took over as the win-streak leader at every NCAA division.
- JMU's streak currently ranks second all-time in FCS history. The Dukes are one of two teams with active double-digit win streaks, as Celebration Bowl champion N.C. A&T has won 12 straight.
- As of Dec. 31, only two teams at the FBS level have won 10 or more in a row, as UCF has claimed 12 straight and FAU has won 10 consecutive.
- The Dukes have also won a CAA-record 18 straight league games and became the league's first team ever to go 8-0 back-to-back years.
- The Dukes last saw defeat on Sept. 24, 2016 - a 56-28 setback at ACC-foe North Carolina.
- JMU has also won 27 straight games against FCS opponents, with the last loss coming on Dec. 5, 2015 versus Colgate in the second round of the playoffs.
- The Dukes have won 17 straight at Bridgeforth Stadium and hold a program-record 10-game win streak in true road games.

ANKRAH A CONSENSUS ALL-AMERICAN

- Andrew Ankrah was voted a Consensus All-American this season, having earned First Team spots on all six major All-America teams.
- Ankrah is a top-3 finalist for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award and a finalist for the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year honor. Winners for both will be announced this week in Frisco.
- He has already won CAA Defensive Player of the Year and Touchdown Club of Richmond Division I Defensive Lineman of the Year honors.
- Ankrah has tallied 54 tackles, 15.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and a defensive touchdown.
- He currently ranks fourth all-time at JMU with 26.0 career sacks.

EIGHT ALL-AMERICAN DUKES

- Consensus All-American Andrew Ankrah was joined by seven of his teammates on the 2017 All-America list.
- Aaron Stinnie garnered five All-America awards, with four coming on the First Team.
- Rashad Robinson earned four All-America awards. Jordan Brown, a Second Team All-CAA selection, was a First Team All-American by both the AP and HERO Sports.
- Raven Greene was a Second Team All-American on two lists, Kyre Hawkins earned Third Team honors from HERO and both Jahee Jackson and Harry O'Kelly were Sophomore and Freshman All-Americans, respectively.

HOUSTON SIGNS 10-YEAR EXTENSION

- Jeff Bourne announced on Dec. 12 a 10-year contract extension for Head Coach Mike Houston that will run through the 2027 season.
- Houston is 28-1 in his two seasons with the Dukes, having won the 2016 national championship and back-to-back CAA outright championships, to go with a NCAA-best 26-game win streak.
- The Dukes have been ranked No. 1 since the preseason. JMU is 12-0 against ranked teams since the start of 2016 and the Dukes opened this season with a 20-point win at FBS-foe ECU.

RECORDS BROKEN IN SEMIFINAL WIN

- Program-record 10 takeaways (5 in first quarter)
- Tied program-record with 6 interceptions
- Jimmy Moreland tied single-game program record with 3 interceptions
- Marcus Marshall had second-most rushing yards in JMU postseason game, with 203
- Marshall's 87-yard touchdown was longest rush in JMU playoff history
- Raven Greene's pick-six set the JMU career interceptions record, with 14

DEFENSE RATTLES CHRISTION

- Taryn Christion was a victim of nine of his team's 10 turnovers in JMU's semifinal win.
- He threw six interceptions while fumbling three times in the 51-16 loss. Both of his first quarter picks went to Jimmy Moreland.
- Turnovers helped JMU run away, as the Dukes accounted for 44 points on six drives between the second and third quarters.

STAPLETON'S RISE IN POSTSEASON

- Riley Stapleton has been a key component in JMU's offensive success in the playoffs.
- After making just 19 catches for 187 yards and two scores in the regular season, he has exploded for 16 grabs for 321 yards and three touchdowns.
- In the quarterfinals, Stapleton caught eight passes for a career-high 189 yards and a touchdown. That total set a JMU postseason record and his 40-yard touchdown catch late in the fourth set up the game-tying two-point conversion.
- In the semifinals, he made two first-half touchdown catches to lead JMU to a rout victory against South Dakota State.

DEFENSE ONE OF THE BEST IN FCS

- JMU's defense has risen to the occasion week in and week out since the start of the season and has quickly turned into one of the tops in FCS.
- The Dukes lead the FCS in five categories, including scoring defense (10.7), interceptions (31), takeaways (43), turnover margin (+1.71) and pass efficiency defense (81.01 rating).
- They rank in the top 10 in 14 areas, as they're also third in both total defense (251.1) and defensive touchdowns (5) and fifth in sacks (3.43), first-down defense (14.7) and punt-return defense (3.4).
- Other top-10 areas include sixth in rushing defense (87.4), eighth in third-down defense (29.7%) and 10th in both blocked punts (2) and red-zone defense (68.2%).
- Jordan Brown leads the country with a single-season record nine interceptions and Jimmy Moreland is second in the FCS with eight picks, while Rashad Robinson has seven.

SCHOR HOLDS FOUR JMU CAREER MARKS

- Back in October, Bryan Schor broke the career record for passing touchdowns.
- He followed that up by setting completions record in the second round of the playoffs.
- Fast forward one more week, and Schor moved into first place all-time in both passing yards and total offense.
- Schor leads the Dukes all-time with 62 passing touchdowns, 6,930 passing yards, 545 completions and 8,074 yards of total offense.
- Schor is also second in career pass attempts, at 795. He needs 69 more for that record.

BEST START EVER... OBVIOUSLY

- JMU improved to 14-0 on Dec. 16, extending its best start to a season in its 46-year history.
- The Dukes began 2015 with a 7-0 record. Historically, JMU does have one unbeaten season, going 9-0-1 in 1975. The Dukes opened that year with a tie before reeling off nine straight wins.
- JMU had not allowed any team to score more than 14 points through the first 12 games until Weber State scored 28 in the FCS quarterfinals.
- South Dakota State added 16 in the semifinals.
- Nine of 14 foes have been limited to less than 300 yards of total offense and five failed to reach 200 yards of total offense.

RATKE KICKS JMU TO NATIONAL SEMIS

- Ethan Ratke drilled a career-long 46-yard field goal as time expired to lift JMU to a 31-28 come-from-behind win against 11th-ranked Weber State on Dec. 8.
- Trailing 28-20, JMU scored on a 40-yard touchdown pass by Bryan Schor to Riley Stapleton to make it 28-all with 2:08 to play. After forcing Weber into a three-and-out, JMU got in field-goal range where Ratke converted the longest field goal in JMU playoff history to send the Dukes to the semifinals.
- Marcus Marshall rushed for 128 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 9.1 yards per rush.
- Bryan Schor passed for 359 yards and two touchdowns, which was the second-most passing yards of Schor's career and in JMU postseason history.
- Riley Stapleton had a career night with eight catches for 189 yards and a score, while Terrence Alls had six grabs for 117 yards.
- JMU out-gained the Wildcats 549-329, which included 359-238 through the air.
- The Dukes improved to 2-1 all-time against the Big Sky Conference, winning for the first time at home.

GAME-WINNER CAPS ETHAN'S CAREER NIGHT

- Until mid-October, Ethan Ratke had only taken a few reps. Now he's 11-of-14 on field goals and had the game of his young career in the 31-28 win over Weber State.
- Ratke converted three field goals, setting a career high and tying the program's single-game record.
- It was the 16th time in school history a kicker made three field goals, and the second this year, as Tyler Gray made three against Villanova on Oct. 14.
- Just one week later, Gray injured his hip at William & Mary and Ratke took over kicking roles, making two field goals.
- His 11 field goals are already one shy of ranking in the top 10 of JMU single-season history.

STAPLETON COULD NOT BE STOPPED

- You knew he was in for a big night against Weber State from the start.
- By the end of the night, Stapleton tied one career-high, shattered another and nearly broke a JMU single-game record.
- The redshirt sophomore corralled eight receptions (tie CH) for a career-best 189 yards and a touchdown in the 31-28 triumph.
- His 40-yard touchdown catch set up the Dukes to tie it on a 2-point conversion.
- His 189 receiving yards was a JMU postseason record and just three yards shy of the JMU single-game record for any game.

BENT BUTNOT BROKEN

- JMU was in uncharted waters in its quarterfinal game against Weber --- trailing in the fourth.
- The Dukes had only trailed once in the second half all year (CAA opener vs. Maine) and was tied in the fourth quarter just once (vs. Richmond).
- Weber State scored a touchdown with 3:14 remaining to extend its lead to 28-20.
- The Dukes fired back with a four-play touchdown drive, as Riley Stapleton went 40 yards to the house to make it 28-26 with 2:08 left. Needing two more, Trai Sharp made a sharp cut and dove across the goal line to convert, tying it at 28-all.
- A defensive stop set up JMU's walk-off win on

the Ethan Ratke 46-yard field goal.

- JMU led for just 21:41 in the quarterfinal while trailing for a season-high 20:03.
- Until the quarterfinals, JMU had trailed for only 15:12 all year - 4:00 vs. Maine; 7:22 at Delaware; 3:50 vs. Richmond.

ANKRAH TOP-3 FINALIST FOR BUCHANAN

- Andrew Ankrah was voted a top-three finalist for the nation's top defensive award, the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award.
- The CAA Defensive Player of the Year and three-time First Team All-CAA member ranks tied for second in the CAA in tackles for loss, tied for third in forced fumbles, tied for fifth in recoveries and seventh in sacks.
- He is the 10th JMU finalist all-time and the first since Stephon Robertson did so in back-to-back years in 2012 and 2013.
- The Dukes have won the Buchanan twice - Derrick Lloyd (2001) and Arthur Moats (2009).

SCHOR, JMU DEFENSE LEAD WAY IN SBU WIN

- JMU tied a D-I program record with five interceptions and Bryan Schor threw two TDs to help JMU to a 26-7 victory against Stony Brook in the Second Round on Dec. 2.
- Terrence Alls hauled in a career high 10 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown. His performance marked the first time in over 13 years a JMU player has had double-digit receptions. D.D. Boxley snatched 11 on Oct. 16, 2004 at Maine.
- Schor was 26-of-35 for 255 yards and two touchdowns in the win. He moved into first place all-time at JMU in career completions, which now stands at 506. He surpassed Justin Rascati (487) after starting the game 10-for-10 through the air.
- JMU's defense tied a postseason record, holding Stony Brook to just seven points. That matched the 2016 FCS quarterfinal total when the Dukes rolled Sam Houston State 65-7. It was a season-low scoring output for the Seawolves, as they hadn't tallied less than 17 in a single game.

BALL HAWKS RACK UP FIVE PICKS

- JMU tied a program record at the Division I level after making five interceptions in the win over Stony Brook. SBU had thrown just three picks all year prior to the FCS Second Round.
- The five interceptions was just one off the program record, as the Dukes had six against Gallaudet as a Division III school in 1973.
- It was a season high for interceptions and all five starting defensive backs produced one interception, marking the first time in school history five DBs had a pick the same game.
- The five takeaways led to 13 points off turnovers and JMU's first of two fourth-quarter interceptions stymied a drive deep in JMU territory.

SCHOR SETS COMPLETIONS RECORD

- Bryan Schor broke another program record in JMU's playoff win over Stony Brook, setting a new benchmark in career completions.
- Needing just eight to take over first place, Schor opened the game completing his first 10 passes to surpass Justin Rascati (487).
- Schor completed 26 passes to move over 500 for his career, as he now stands at 506 completions.
- Earlier this year, he set the passing TD record (59) and he is only 115 passing yards and 205 total offense shy of program records in those respective categories.

JMU AGAINST CAA FOES IN PLAYOFFS

- The FCS Second Round marked JMU's fourth game ever in the postseason against a conference opponent.
- The Dukes stayed unbeaten against CAA teams in the FCS playoffs with a 26-7 win over SBU.
- It was the second straight year beating a CAA foe in the postseason, as the Dukes rolled to a 55-20 win over New Hampshire in the 2016 Second Round.
- JMU also owns postseason wins at William & Mary and against Villanova.
- The Dukes advanced to their first national title game with a 48-34 victory at W&M on Dec. 10, 2004. They also downed Nova 31-27 at home in the 2008 quarterfinals on Dec. 6, 2008.
- Additionally, JMU won its first-ever playoff game on Nov. 30, 1991 in a 42-35 double-overtime win at Delaware - two seasons before joining the league.

UNDISPUTED CAA CHAMPS

- JMU won its third straight CAA title and the second consecutive outright crown with its 31-3 win at Elon.
- It's the first time in CAA history a team has gone 8-0 in back-to-back season.
- It's also the first time JMU has won three straight titles and the first for the CAA since Boston University won three in a row from 1982-84.
- The Dukes are the first CAA team to go 8-0 three times, as New Hampshire has accomplished the feat twice. JMU is also the first team since UMass in 1977-78 to go unbeaten in back-to-back conference seasons.

HOUSTON UP FOR ROBINSON AWARD

- After guiding JMU to a perfect 11-0 regular season and the CAA outright championship, Mike Houston was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award.
- It's the third straight year Houston has been in consideration for the award, now in its 31st year.
- Since his hire, he's led JMU to a 25-1 record, which includes a program-record 23-game win streak. He's never lost to a FCS team at the helm, going 24-0, which includes a 16-0 mark during conference play.

SCHOR&ANKRAH ALSO AWARD FINALISTS

- Bryan Schor and Andrew Ankrah were both named finalists for major national awards, honoring the top offensive and defensive players in the FCS.
- Ankrah was named a top-3 finalist and has been invited to the STATS Legacy Awards Banquet on Jan. 5 in Frisco, Texas.
- Schor finished eighth in the 2017 voting after finishing 12th a season ago for the Payton.
- JMU has won the Buchanan two times, with Derrick Lloyd taking it in 2001 and Steelers linebacker Arthur Moats winning it in 2009.

DUKES WIN THREE MAJOR CAA AWARDS

- JMU won three major CAA yearly awards after going 11-0 in the regular season.
- Andrew Ankrah was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year. He's the ninth JMU player to win the accolade and the first since 2013.
- John Miller was voted CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. It marked the second straight year a JMU player won the award and the third time since winning its first one in 2008.

- Bryan Schor garnered the Chuck Boone Leadership Award, as he became JMU's first winner of the prestigious laurel.
- Since joining the league in 1993, JMU players have claimed 21 end-of-year awards.
- A total of 16 players were named All-CAA.

16 PLAYERS NAMED ALL-CAA

- The Dukes tied the program record with 16 All-CAA honorees, matching the 2006 season.
- They led all teams with total selections and eight First Team All-CAA members.
- In addition to Ankrah and Miller, the six other Dukes to earn First Team All-CAA honors were Aaron Stinnie, Simeyon Robinson, Kyre Hawkins, Rashad Robinson, Jimmy Moreland and Raven Greene.
- Four player were named to the All-CAA Second Team in Schor, Jahee Jackson, Jordan Brown and Harry O'Kelly.
- Also earning Third Team All-CAA accolades were Trai Sharp, Terrence Alls, Darrious Carter and Brandon Hereford.

ANOTHER YEAR, ANOTHER CAA TITLE

- The Dukes went unbeaten in the CAA once again this year to claim the CAA championship.
- It's the program's third straight conference title, marking the first time in school history that JMU has won the title three years in a row. Prior to last season, JMU had never won back-to-back league crowns.
- JMU has now won a conference title seven times (1975, 1999, 2004, 2008, 2015, 2016, 2017).
- The Dukes won their second straight outright championship and the third in program history.
- JMU is also the first CAA team to go 8-0 three times, passing New Hampshire's two. Teams have gone 8-0 in CAA play nine times.

SCHOR, AMOS GRAB WEEKLY AWARDS

- Two Dukes were awarded CAA Player of the Week accolades on Nov. 20, as Bryan Schor was Offensive Player of the Week and D'Angelo Amos was Special Teams Player of the Week.
- The two accounted for all four of JMU's touchdowns in the win at Elon. Schor tied his career high with three rushing touchdowns, and Amos blocked a punt, scooped it up and ran it in to cap off JMU's scoring.
- It was Schor's fifth career weekly award and his first of 2017, while Amos won an honor for the first time as a collegian.
- JMU finished the regular season with eight weekly honors.

DUKES TROUNCE ELON TO GO 11-0

- Bryan Schor rushed for three touchdowns and D'Angelo Amos blocked a punt for a touchdown to lead JMU to a 31-3 triumph at Elon on Nov. 18 to cap the regular season.
- JMU completed its first unbeaten and untied regular-season, moving to 11-0 on the year and capturing the outright CAA title with an 8-0 record.
- Schor had 290 yards of offense, with 214 through the air and 76 on the ground, leading all players.
- Trai Sharp rushed for 68 yards, as the Dukes ran for a 190 as a team. John Miller reeled in a career-high seven catches for 59 yards, and Terrence Alls had five grabs for 73 yards.
- Kyre Hawkins led the defense with 11 tackles,

and Cornell Urquhart had a career-high nine.

- The Dukes held a team scoreless in the first half for the fifth time in 2017, the fourth of which occurred in CAA play.

IT WAS A SCHOR THING AT ELON

- In JMU's 31-3 win at Elon, Bryan Schor tied his career high of three rushing scores and had a game-high 76 rushing yards to lead the attack.
- He combined for 290 yards of offense, going 22-of-29 for 214 yards.
- Schor moved into second place on a pair of JMU career categories, including passing yards (6,113) and completions (480). He's the second JMU quarterback to surpass 6,000 career passing yards.

SHARP TD LIFTS JMU PAST RICHMOND

- Trai Sharp accumulated 54 of his 60 rushing yards on JMU's final drive, and he capped it off with a seven-yard touchdown with 44 seconds left to lift JMU to a 20-13 win over Richmond on Nov. 11.
- The win kept JMU's win streak alive, at 22 straight, and clinched a share of the CAA championship.
- Bryan Schor threw for 229 yards on 18-of-32 passing. He moved into third all-time in career completions (458) and needs just 14 more passing yards to claim second all-time at JMU.

- David Eldridge had 81 receiving yards while Ishmael Hyman contributed 70 receiving yards.
- Raven Greene tied his career high with 11 tackles, and Rashad Robinson had eight stops. Jordan Brown tallied his team-leading sixth interception of the year, which leads all CAA players.
- JMU limited UR to only 20 rushing yards and 324 total yards, which is nearly 150 yards lower than its season average. The Spiders also had averaged 33.3 points per game, scoring just 13.

DUKES "SHARP" ON FINAL DRIVE

- Richmond knotted the game at 13-13 with 4:04 remaining but the Dukes put together a 71-yard drive to capture the win.
- Trai Sharp led the way by carrying the ball seven times for 54 yards, setting the Dukes up for the go-ahead score.
- After a third-down conversion by Bryan Schor, Sharp capped off the 10-play drive with a seven-yard TD with only 44 seconds remaining.
- After the game, Sharp tweeted, "This one is for you Dad! I love you!"

ROAD WARRIORS MAKE IT TEN

- JMU set a program record on Oct. 21 at William & Mary with its eighth straight true road win.
- After extending it to nine on Nov. 4 at Rhode Island, the Dukes made it double digits with its triumph at Elon on Nov. 18.
- The Dukes have won 10 straight in true road games dating back to Sept. 24, 2016. That includes nine straight CAA road wins during the stretch.

HONORING THE SENIORS

- On Nov. 11, JMU honored its 23 seniors prior to kick off versus Richmond. It was the 50th game of the senior class.
- Since the beginning of the 2014 season, JMU has gone 45-8 (.849), which includes a stellar 28-4 mark (.875) during CAA play.
- This class is the first in JMU history to make four straight FCS playoff appearances and the first ever claim at least nine overall wins and six league wins in every season.
- JMU captured the CAA title, marking the first time the Dukes have won three conference titles in a row.

UNANIMOUSLY VOTED #1 AGAIN

- Since the preseason, the defending champions have been ranked No. 1 by both the coaches and the media.
- JMU collected all 153 first-place votes in the final STATS FCS Top 25 while garnering all 26 first-place votes in the FCS Coaches Poll.
- The Dukes finished the regular season bringing in all votes in six weeks of the coaches poll and in three weeks of media poll.

ROBINSON TAKES HOME DEF. AWARD

- Rashad Robinson was named CAA Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 30, marking the third time this year a JMU player has won the league's top defensive award.
- In JMU's win over UNH, Robinson recorded his league-leading fifth interception 82 yards for a touchdown, which helped seal JMU's shutout victory.
- That return was the third-longest pick-six in school history.

DUKES ROLL IN SECOND HALF AT URI

- Leading 7-3 at the break, JMU shut down any chance of an upset, reeling off 31 straight points and dominating all three phases in the second half for a 38-3 win at Rhode Island on Nov. 4.
- JMU gave up only 18 yards and -13 rushing yards in the second half.
- Bryan Schor was 14-of-17 for 150 yards and four touchdowns while Percy Agyei-Obese rushed for 95 yards.
- JMU forced two turnovers and created seven sacks, as it ranks fourth nationally with 4.00 sacks per game (36).

HEREFORD COMES UP BIG AT RHODY

- Brandon Hereford, playing in just his fifth game this season, tallied nine tackles, 1.5 sacks to lead JMU's defensive dominance at Rhode Island.
- The 1.5 sacks was a career high. He also recovered a key fumble early in the third quarter, leading to a JMU score on the next play.
- Hereford nearly corralled his second career interception, as he was credited with a pass breakup.
- This season, he averages 6.4 tackles per game while garnering 2.5 sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Bryan Schor recorded four touchdown passes in JMU's rout of Rhode Island and found four different receivers in the process.
- Terrence Alls, who led the game with five catches for 73 yards, scored on a 20-yard touchdown on a third-and-long.
- David Eldridge had three grabs for 41 yards and a score, while both Jonathan Kloosterman and Ishmael Hyman had TDs on their only reception.

BLANKING UNH ON HOMECOMING

- Bryan Schor threw two touchdown passes to set the all-time program record and JMU shut out No. 17 New Hampshire 21-0 on Homecoming.
- JMU limited UNH to only 193 yards, marking the fourth time this season the Dukes have allowed less than 200 yards. No FCS team has gained 300 during the 2017 season.
- Rashad Robinson picked off a pass and returned it 82 yards for the third-longest pick-six in school history.
- JMU has now won three straight versus New Hampshire, which is the longest win streak for the Dukes in the series.

FIRST SHUTOUT IN TWO YEARS

- JMU's 21-0 win over New Hampshire marked the first time in just over two years JMU blanked an opponent.
- The Dukes beat Elon on the road, 51-0, back on Oct. 27, 2015, which was the largest road win margin in school history.
- It was the 27th time in program history JMU has held a team scoreless.
- It was JMU's fourth shutout against a CAA school. In addition to Elon in 2015, JMU also blanked Hofstra (56-0) in 2008 and Villanova (17-0) on the road in 2006.

SCHOR BREAKS PASSING TD RECORD

- On Oct. 28, Bryan Schor threw two touchdowns in the New Hampshire win, and he set JMU's all-time passing touchdown record in the process.
- He entered the game tied with Vad Lee and

Justin Rascati with 51 passing touchdowns.

- Early in the second quarter, Schor found Ishmael Hyman on a 13-yard pass for the record-setting 52nd touchdown pass.
- He also added a second TD to Clayton Cheatham, upping his record total to 53.

DEFENSE EQUALS OFFENSE AT W&M

- Six takeaways and 33 points off turnovers led JMU to a dominant 46-14 win at William & Mary on Oct. 21 in Williamsburg.
- It was JMU's largest win ever versus W&M in the 40-game history of the series.
- Bryan Schor tied the program record with his 51st touchdown pass.
- JMU forced a season-best six turnovers, including four interceptions and a pick-six.
- Jordan Brown had a career-high two interceptions and the defense accounted for six sacks for the second straight week.
- The Dukes led by as many as 43 in the game.

SIX TAKEAWAYS, RESULTING IN 33 PTS

- Four interceptions and two fumble recoveries turned into 33 of JMU's 46 points in the rout at William & Mary.
- JMU's defense also didn't allow the Tribe to pass midfield the entire first half and held them scoreless through three quarters.
- Jordan Brown (2 INT), Rashad Robinson (1 INT) and Jimmy Moreland (1 INT, pick-six) each led the CAA with four interceptions this season.
- Eight different players accounted for the team's six sacks, as JMU has matched the 2016 sacks total - 24.0.

DUKES SET FIELD GOAL RECORD

- Amidst the defensive dominance, JMU set a program record on special teams, as Tyler Gray and Ethan Ratke combined for four field goals.
- Each kicker hit two field goals on four tries, as Ratke's two attempts were the first of his career.
- Gray hit a game-high 42 yarder, while Ratke drilled a career-long 39 yarder.

HAWKINS EARNS 2ND CAA HONOR

- Following a standout performance in JMU's 30-8 win over Villanova, Kyre Hawkins was named CAA Football Defensive Player of the Week for the second time on Oct. 16.
- Hawkins turned in a game-high 10 tackles, as well as 3.0 tackles for loss in the win. He also matched his career highs with 2.0 sacks and two pass breakups.
- JMU limited the Wildcats to just 174 yards of offense and 30 passing yards. Nova only passed midfield one time in the game, coming on their lone scoring drive.

DEFENSE POWERS JMU PAST 'NOVA

- JMU held No. 11 Villanova scoreless for three quarters and used a 14-0 run late in the game to pull out a 30-8 win on Oct. 14.
- The Dukes held 'Nova to just 174 yards, including 30 passing. They also had three takeaways, including Brandon Hereford's pick-six late in the fourth.
- Kyre Hawkins had 10 tackles, including 3.0 for loss and 2.0 sacks, while Andrew Ankrah had 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- Bryan Schor threw for 271 yards and two touchdowns, as he became the fifth JMU quarterback to surpass 5,000 career yards.
- Terrence Alls tied a career high with seven catches, leading the game with 83 yards.

GAMEDAY A HUGE SUCCESS AGAIN

- For the second time in three seasons, ESPN's College GameDay made its way to the Quad, broadcasting its iconic pregame show.
- After drawing 12,000 fans in its initial broadcast from JMU in 2015, JMU Nation topped that on Oct. 14, with an estimated 14,000 fans converging on the Quad.
- In turn, that led to the second-largest crowd in Bridgeforth Stadium history, as 25,993 were in attendance for JMU's 30-8 win over Villanova.
- That trailed the 26,069 who watched JMU's matchup with Richmond on Oct. 24, 2015, after College GameDay's first broadcast at JMU.

GRAY MATCHES INDY KICKING MARK

- In last week's win over Villanova, kicker Tyler Gray tied an all-time JMU record, with three made field goals.
- He converted from 22, 36 and 17 yards out to set his career high.
- It was the 15th time a JMU kicker made three field goals in a game.

SHARP GARNERS CAA WEEKLY HONOR

- Trai Sharp had a career afternoon in JMU's win at Delaware to earn CAA Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 2.
- Sharp rushed for a career-high 185 yards and a touchdown, helping JMU extend its win streak.
- He averaged 5.1 yards per carry against a UD team which had only allowed 62.0 rush yards per game entering that week.
- Adding in his 13 receiving yards, Sharp tallied a career-best 198 all-purpose yards.

DUKES GRIND OUT WIN AT UDEL

- Behind a career-high 185 rushing yards from Trai Sharp, JMU used stout defense to down Delaware, 20-10, on Sept. 30 in Newark.
- The Dukes rallied from deficits twice in the first half, as Andrew Ankras' 23-yard fumble recovery for a TD put JMU up for good (14-10).
- Tyler Gray hit a pair of second-half field goals, including a career-long 48 yarder in the fourth.
- JMU limited UD to 229 yards of offense and blanked the host Hens for the final 42:07.

WINS IN NEWARK TOUGH TO COME BY

- JMU earned just its fifth win at Delaware on Sept. 30, improving to 5-8 in the series on the road all-time.
- It marked the second time the Dukes have only won back-to-back road games (2015, 2017) joining the double OT win in the 1991 playoffs and a 20-point triumph in 1994.

NO DOUBT FOR DEFENSE VS. HENS

- JMU's defense held Delaware scoreless in the second half and for the final 42:07.
- The defense gave up just 79 yards of offense and only four first downs over the final two quarters. That also included three straight three-and-outs.
- It was the fourth straight game JMU held its opponent to less than 300 total yards.

DUKES POWER PAST MAINE

- JMU briefly trailed by four points, but a 21-0 run in the second half proved to be the difference in JMU's 28-10 victory against Maine in front of a sold-out crowd of 25,330 on Sept. 23.
- Bryan Schor passed for 281 yards and four

touchdowns, coming to within three passing scores of the all-time JMU record of 51, held by both Vad Lee and Justin Rascati.

- Ezra Archie made an impact in his second career game, making eight catches for 90 yards and a touchdown.
- Marcus Marshall turned in his first 100-yard performance at JMU, rushing for 135 yards and averaging 7.1 per carry. In the fourth alone, he rushed for 84 yards on just four touches.
- JMU's defense limited Maine to 299 yards of offense and only 137 rushing yards. It made three interceptions in the win.

MARSHALL OVER THE CENTURY MARK

- For the first time as a Duke, Marcus Marshall used a big fourth quarter against Maine to go over 100 yards for the first time as a Duke.
- Marshall rushed four times for 84 yards in the fourth quarter to finish with 135 yards, averaging 7.1 yards per carry.

ARCHIE NABS ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Making his second appearance and earning his first career start, Ezra Archie had a breakout game to earn CAA Rookie of the Week honors.
- He led all players with eight catches for 90 yards and a touchdown in JMU's 28-10 win over UM.
- He made a career-long, 31-yard catch in the first quarter and his performance was capped off by a three-yard touchdown catch to seal the win.

JMU TROUNCES NORFOLK STATE

- JMU improved to 3-0 with a 75-14 victory against Norfolk State on Sept. 16.
- The Dukes gained 728 yards, just one shy of the program record, which included 472 rushing.
- Trai Sharp had 175 total yards and two touchdowns, which included 130 on the ground. Playing in his first game, Percy Agyei-Obese ran for 102 yards and a score in the fourth quarter alone.
- It was the third-highest point total by any FCS team this season, as JMU turned its best total offense margin in school history, out-gaining NSU by 631 yards (728-91).
- Eight different players found the end zone in what was the program's third game over 70 points since the start of the 2016 season.

3-0 START DOESN'T COME OFTEN

- JMU improved to 3-0 to start a season with the NSU win, but that feat has not come often.
- It was only the fifth time JMU has started 3-0, due in large to playing a FBS school each season.
- JMU last won its first three in 2015 when it reeled off a program-record seven straight wins to start the season.

RUN DUKES! RUN!

- The run game was impactful in week three against Norfolk State, as the Dukes piled on 472 rushing yards, averaging 7.3 per carry.
- The Dukes had six different players score rushing touchdowns in the win.
- Trai Sharp, who played just over a quarter, rushed nine times for 130 yards (14.4) and a touchdown while also tallying 45 receiving yards and a score.
- In the fourth quarter, Percy Agyei-Obese ran for his entire 103 yards, scoring his first career TD.
- Three other Dukes ran for over 50 yards in Marcus Marshall (64, 2 TD), Cardon Johnson (57) and Bryan Schor (54, TD).

ALMOST ECLIPSING OFFENSE RECORD

- The Dukes surpassed its all-time total offense record but then it didn't. Say what now?
- JMU had reached 730 yards of total offense late in the fourth quarter, beating the 729 it gained in 2015 at FBS-foe SMU.
- But that record quickly went away when the Dukes took a pair of kneel downs to end the game with 728 yards.
- However, having only given up 91 yards to NSU, the Dukes set a program record for total offense margin, at 637 yards.

SCHOR POWERS DUKES PAST ETSU

- Playing in their first home game in 274 days, Bryan Schor tied the program record for passing touchdowns in the Dukes' 52-10 win over ETSU on Sept. 9.
- Schor passed for 304 yards and five touchdowns, marking the third time he's reached five touchdown tosses and the fifth time a JMU quarterback has done so.
- Ishmael Hyman and Riley Stapleton both turned in their first career two-touchdown games.
- JMU out-gained ETSU 426-175, which included holding the Bucs to just 57 rushing yards (1.8).

SCHORTIES PROGRAM RECORD...AGAIN

- He had done it twice before. On Sept. 9, Bryan Schor connected with his receivers for five touchdown passes, tying the program record.
- On the day, Schor completed 76 percent of his passes, going 25-of-33 for 304 yards.
- Schor found Ishmael Hyman twice in the first quarter, and later had touchdown tosses to Riley Stapleton in the middle quarters for his first career scores.
- He wrapped up his outing with a touchdown to U.Va. transfer David Eldridge in the fourth to complete his five-TD day.

RILEY'S BIG DAY

- Entering the ETSU game, redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton had never caught a pass. He changed that in a big way.
- Stapleton led JMU with eight receptions, finishing with 64 yards and two touchdowns.
- His first career touchdown came with 6:06 remaining in the first half on a three-yard pass to cap a 16-play drive.
- The latter touchdown catch occurred with just over six minutes to go in the third on a four-yard grab, which put JMU up 42-7 at the time.

DUKES THRASH FBS ECU TO OPEN 2017

- Cardon Johnson rushed for a career-high 265 yards and two touchdowns, and JMU beat ECU 34-14 in the season opener on Sept. 2.
- Johnson's rushing total was the second most in JMU single-game history, falling just 11 yards shy of Vad Lee's 2015 record (276 at SMU).
- It was JMU's sixth-ever win against a FBS opponent, as the Dukes improved to 2-0 against the American Athletic Conference, joining the 48-45 win over SMU two seasons ago.
- JMU out-gained ECU 614-362, which included a dominant rushing performance (410-70).
- Kyre Hawkins led the defensive attack with 13 tackles, while Jimmy Moreland had a career-high 11. JMU produced three interceptions, two of which came by Rashad Robinson.

JOHNSON, KYRE EARN CAA AWARDS

- Following the FBS win at ECU, both Cardon Johnson and Kyre Hawkins were honored by the CAA for the first time in their careers.
- Johnson was named CAA Offensive Player of the Week, while Hawkins was tabbed CAA Defensive Player of the Week.
- Johnson rushed for 265 yards and two touchdowns on just 17 carries (15.6 avg), which included scoring runs of 85 and 80 yards. His output was 100 yards better than his previous career high, set back in 2015.
- Hawkins led the defense with 13 tackles, which was the second-most tackles of his career. He also recorded a tackle-for-loss, as the Dukes built a lead as big as 27 points in the fourth.

DUKES TAKE ANOTHER FBS WIN

- For the second time in three years, JMU defeated a FBS team, improving to 2-0 against the American Athletic Conference in the process.
- The Dukes improved to 6-20 all-time in these games and have now won three of their past seven outings against the subdivision.
- Prior to Saturday's 34-14 win at ECU, JMU downed SMU 48-45 back on Sept. 26, 2015.
- The Dukes also have a pair of wins against the Atlantic Coast Conference, taking a 21-17 win at Virginia in 1982 and claiming a historic 21-16 triumph at Virginia Tech in 2010.
- JMU also produced back-to-back wins at Navy with a 24-20 win in 1989 and a 16-7 win in 1990.

ROBINSON PICKS OFF TWO AT ECU

- JMU forced four turnovers in the season opener, including three interceptions.
- Rashad Robinson led the Dukes with a career-best two interceptions. The first came in the end zone and the latter late in the fourth quarter.

LONG RUSHES POWER JMU AT ECU

- The Dukes established the run early, allowing them to never trail in the 34-14 win at ECU.
- The Dukes racked up 410 yards on 42 carries, averaging 9.8 yards per rush.
- Cardon Johnson reeled off a career-best 265 yards, which included TD runs of 85 and 80.
- Late in the fourth, Marcus Marshall, who ran for 88 yards on 10 touches, capped his day with a 70-yard touchdown scamper. Bryan Schor also had 48 yards and a score.

.500 OR BETTER 15 STRAIGHT YEARS

- JMU's success from year to year has come to be expected, as the Dukes recorded a .500 record or better for a league-best 15th consecutive season in 2017.
- JMU also produced its 13th winning season during the timeframe.
- The Dukes have now had a winning record in 28 of 46 seasons and tallied nine wins for the third straight year in 2016 - a first for the program.

PICKED TO WIN THE CAA

- Winners of two straight Colonial Athletic Association championships, JMU will seek its third in a row in 2017 and is the overwhelming favorite to do so.
- JMU received 21 of 24 first-place votes from the

league's head coaches and SIDs.

- The Dukes captured their second national championship after going 14-1 overall, winning their final 12 games to finish the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I.
- JMU completed the CAA gauntlet with a perfect 8-0 record to win the league crown for the second straight year before earning the No. 4 seed for the FCS playoffs.
- Should the Dukes win the league this season, it would mark the first time in program history they claimed three straight CAA titles.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA FOR FOUR

- Four JMU players were named Preseason All-Americans ahead of the 2017 season.
- They were Aaron Stinnie, Raven Greene, Andrew Ankrah and Jonathan Kloosterman.
- Stinnie was a First Team Preseason All-American from both STATS and HERO Sports, while Greene was a STATS Third Team selection and HERO Sports First Team honoree.
- Ankrah was a STATS Second Team pick, while Kloosterman earned a STATS Third Team spot.

SIX DUKES VOTED PRESEASON ALL-CAA

- In addition to Bryan Schor being named Preseason Player of the Year, he was one of six players to be voted Preseason All-CAA.
- That number led all schools for most selections.
- Joining Schor were tight end Jonathan Kloosterman, offensive lineman Aaron Stinnie, defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah, safety Raven Greene and special teams player Robert Carter Jr.
- This is the first season the league has added a special teams player, which features long snappers, holders and gunners on kickoff coverage.

RECAPING JMU'S 2016 TITLE RUN

- JMU was able to put all the pieces together in all three phases en route to winning the 2016 NCAA Division I title.
- The Dukes earned wins against No. 22 New Hampshire, No. 5 Sam Houston State, No. 1 North Dakota State and No. 13 Youngstown State.
- In the second-round win vs. UNH, Bryan Schor passed for a career-high 371 yards and five touchdowns, tying the passing touchdown record, in a 55-22 triumph.
- Rashard Davis also connected with Brandon Ravenel on a touchdown pass for a JMU single-game record six total touchdown passes.
- In the quarters, JMU dominated SHSU 65-7, marking the second-largest margin of victory in FCS playoffs history.
- JMU gained over 600 yards of offense, including 356 rushing yards. Khalid Abdullah ran for 141 and three scores.
- JMU outscored top-seeded NDSU 10-0 in the fourth quarter to upend the five-time defending national champions 27-17.
- Khalid Abdullah rushed for 180 yards and finished with a career-high 231 all-purpose yards. Tyler Gray kicked a 45-yard field goal with 11:46 to go and Bryan Schor found John Miller on a 25-yard touchdown late in the fourth.

- JMU surged out to a 21-0 lead in the first half and limited YSU to only 21 rushing yards to win the national championship 28-14.
- Khalid Abdullah was named Most Outstanding Performer with 101 yards and two scores, as the Dukes became the eighth FCS team to win multiple national titles.
- They are also the first to achieve the feat in the Colonial Athletic Association.

NCAA GRANTS RAVEN A FIFTH YEAR

- Mike Houston announced prior to the 2016 regular-season finale that Raven Greene was granted a medical waiver for a fifth season of eligibility for the 2017 season.
- He was a First Team All-CAA safety and later earned All-America honors.
- His sophomore season was cut short in 2014 after suffering a season-ending injury at Albany, just four games in.
- In his return back in 2015, he was a Second Team All-CAA member.

JMU VERSUS RANKED TEAMS

- Since 1985, the Dukes have played 143 games against ranked opponents and hold a 64-79-1 record in those contests.
- JMU's most notable win wasn't against a FCS foe, but that to FBS power Virginia Tech. On Sept. 11, 2010, Madison stunned then-No. 13 Virginia Tech 21-16 in Blacksburg.
- The Dukes have captured 28 victories against top-10 teams and three against a No. 1 team.
- JMU picked up its first win over a top-ranked team on Sept. 26, 1992 -- a 52-49 win at Youngstown State. Fourteen years later, on Oct. 14, 2006, JMU downed New Hampshire on the road, 42-23. More recently, the Dukes claimed a 35-32 triumph versus Appalachian State at home on Sept. 20, 2008.
- This season, JMU is 6-0 against top-25 opponents with a 30-8 win over No. 11 Villanova, a 21-0 shutout against No. 17 New Hampshire on Homecoming and a 31-3 blowout at No. 11 Elon in the regular-season finale.
- In the postseason JMU rolled 26-7 against No. 10 Stony Brook before rallying past No. 11 Weber State, 31-28 in the quarters. In the semis, JMU used a 30-point third quarter to roll past No. 5 South Dakota State, 51-16.

Mike Houston was hired as James Madison University's seventh head football coach on January 18, 2016.

The Dukes have played championship-caliber football since Houston took over the program, winning the NCAA Division I championship last season and making a return trip to Frisco, as they look to cap off an undefeated season in 2017.

Houston is 28-1 at the helm and his squad holds the longest active win streak in any division of the NCAA, at 26 straight victories. JMU's lone defeat came at North Carolina in 2016. The Dukes are 27-0 against FCS competition while also taking a win at FBS competition in ECU to open the 2017 season.

JMU has claimed back-to-back Colonial Athletic Association outright championships, going 8-0 in both seasons, marking the first time a team in the CAA has won eight conference games in consecutive seasons.

Year one under Houston saw offensive prowess with the defense shining bright late in the season and all throughout the postseason. That carried over into 2017, as JMU's defense is considered one of the best in the FCS.

The Dukes lead the country in scoring defense, holding teams to just 10.7 points per game. They also lead the FCS in interceptions (31), takeaways (43), turnover margin (+1.71) and pass efficiency defense (81.08 rating).

Eight players were voted All-Americans in 2017, including Andrew Ankrah, who was named a Consensus All-American after being tabbed to six different All-America First Teams. Ankrah is also a top-three finalist for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award and a finalist for the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year honor.

JMU's journey to this year's championship went through Bridgeforth Stadium, as the No. 1 overall seed claimed victories against No. 10

HEAD COACH MIKE HOUSTON

Stony Brook (26-7), No. 11 Weber State (31-28) and No. 5 South Dakota State (51-16).

Last season, JMU captured its second national championship, going 14-1 overall, setting the program record for wins that would be matched by the 2017 team. The Dukes won their final 12 games to end the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I. During the regular season, Houston led JMU to an unblemished 8-0 league mark as the Dukes took home the outright CAA title for the second time ever.

In the 2016 FCS Playoffs, the Dukes, seeded fourth, notched convincing victories at home against New Hampshire (55-22) and previously-unbeaten Sam Houston State (65-7) before conquering five-time defending national champion North Dakota State (27-17) in the national semifinals in Fargo, N.D. The win at NDSU ended the Bison's 22-game playoff win streak and a string of 18 straight home playoff wins. On Jan. 7, 2017, JMU completed its title run with a 28-14 triumph against Youngstown State in the national championship game at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Khalid Abdullah was named the Most Outstanding Player for the championship, and the Dukes limited a strong run team in YSU to only 21 rushing yards in the win.

Houston reeled in numerous accolades in 2016, as he was named the American Football Coaches Association FCS National Coach of the Year. He also earned AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second straight year and was voted CAA Coach of the Year, marking the fifth time in six years that he was tabbed his conference's top coach. Houston reeled in a pair of state coach of the year accolades, as he was named the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and was voted Virginia Sports Information Directors University Division Coach of the Year. He was also presented with with Bob Ford FCS Coach of the Year from the Metro New York Football Writers, the Washington Metro College Coach of the Year from the DC Touchdown Club and the J. Roy Rodman Award from the Norfolk Sports Club.

In his two seasons, JMU has had players earn a combined 30 All-CAA honors, with 14 in 2016 and 16 in 2017. In 2016, Bryan Schor was named CAA Offensive Player of the Year and Rashard Davis was voted CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. This season Ankrah was joined on the major awards list by John Miller, the Special Teams Player of the Year and Schor, who was the winner of the Chuck Boone Leadership and Excellence Award.

In last season's national-title run, JMU set several conference records, including marks for scoring (700), rushing offense (4,125), total offense (7,612) and first downs (380). Nationally, JMU led the FCS in winning percentage (93.3%), completion percentage (70.8%), team pass efficiency (181.69), first downs (380), defensive interceptions (21) and punt return average (26.65).

The Dukes also ranked second in scoring (46.7), fourth in third down conversions (50%), fifth in both rushing (275.0) and turnovers gained (30), sixth in fumbles lost (4), eighth in turnover margin (1.13) and 10th

in turnovers lost (13). Defensively, JMU saw a drastic improvement from the previous two seasons, as it ranked 17th in scoring defense (21.2) and 30th in total defense (344.3). JMU forced seven more turnovers and nearly doubled its interception production, going from 11 in 2015 to a nation-leading 21 in 2016.

Houston came to Harrisonburg after spending two seasons as head coach at The Citadel (2014-15), where he went 14-11. He became the first coach to lead the Bulldogs to a Southern Conference championship within his first two seasons, as they finished 2015 with a 9-4 record to earn a share of the conference crown.

Houston earned SoCon Coach of the Year and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Bulldogs to the second round of the FCS Playoffs. That season was highlighted by 23-22 triumph at South Carolina in the regular-season finale and a FCS first round win against ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

In his first season at the helm, he led the Bulldogs to a 5-7 record, which was tied for the second-highest win total for a first-year coach at The Citadel.

Prior to The Citadel, Houston was head coach at Lenoir-Rhyne, an NCAA Division II school in the South Atlantic Conference, for three seasons. He accumulated a 29-8 record at the helm and directed the Bears to three consecutive SAC championships, a stretch that included a school-record 13 wins in his final year. Houston was named SAC Coach of the Year each season and was also the Don Hansen Super Region II Coach of the Year in 2013. In his final season at LRU, the Bears advanced to the Division II national championship game and ranked No. 2 in the final polls.

Before his elevation to head coach, Houston served as Lenoir-Rhyne's defensive coordinator and secondary coach from 2007-10. He spent the 2006 year as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Brevard College.

Houston began his coaching career in the high school ranks. He coached for a decade at T.C. Roberson High School in Ashville, N.C., including the last five as head coach, where he went 42-18 and guided the team to its first-ever conference championship. He spent his first five seasons at T.C. Roberson as the defensive coordinator after leading the defense at Forbush High School in East Bend, N.C. in his first two years out of college.

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill University, where he played tight end for the Lions and earned a bachelor's degree in biology. In 2014, Houston was inducted into the Franklin High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He is married to the former Amanda Owen and they have two sons, Owen Michael and Reid Wilson.
