DUKES FACE OFF WITH LOUISVILLE IN NCAA FIRST ROUND

- · Coming off the team claiming the 2017 CAA Women's Lacrosse Championship, JMU earned the league's automatic qualifier for the NCAA Championship and will take on No. 18 Louisville in the first round on Friday, May 12 at the Penn State Lacrosse Field in University Park, Pa.
- First draw is set for 6 p.m. and the game will be streamed live on GOPSUNow at www.gopsusports.com. Live stats are also available through GameTracker on PSU's athletics website.
- The Dukes rolled past Elon 15-7 to win the CAA tournament title on May 7, while the Cardinals last played on April 27, falling 13-12 in overtime to Virginia in the ACC Championship quarterfinals.
- The 2017 season is presented by O'Neill's Grill.

BREAKING DOWN THE SERIES

- This is the first meeting ever between JMU and Louisville.
- The Dukes have faced three ACC opponents this season, beating Virginia Tech (9-6) in Blacksburg, while falling at then-No. 1 North Carolina (14-16) in the season opener and at home to Virginia (6-9).
- Though a new opponent, JMU is very familiar with the Cardinals' head coach. Kellie Young led the Dukes from 2003-06, going 51-24 with three CAA championships and three NCAA tournament appearances, including a pair of quarterfinal berths.

JMU'S HISTORY IN NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- · JMU is making its third straight trip to the NCAA Championship and its 14th al-time following its CAA
- The Dukes are 7-13 in their NCAA history, having advanced to the quarterfinals seven times, including a trip to the 2000 Final Four.
- JMU has lost its last three NCAA tournament games, with its last postseason win coming back in 2010 with a 9-8 victory over Stanford.
- This will mark JMU's fourth NCAA Championship game played in its history, as the Dukes are still seeking their first win on neutral ground (3-0).
- Should the Dukes advance past Louisville, they will face No. 4 Penn State in the second round.
- JMU is 1-7 all-time in true road games, while winning 6-of-9 home games in the tournament.

DUKES VERSUS THE ACC IN THE TOURNEY

- · Friday's first-round game against Louisville marks the program's seventh meeting with an ACC team in the NCAA Championship, and the first since 2006.
- JMU is 2-4 all-time versus the ACC in the postseason, including wins in back-to-back seasons over Virginia in 2000 and 2001. The Dukes also faced Maryland twice and Duke twice, falling in each of those outings.
- This is the first-ever neutral-site match-up with an ACC opponent, having gone 1-0 at home and 1-4 in true road games.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE

- The Cardinals enter the NCAA Championship with an 11-7 record, including a 3-4 ACC mark.
- · Louisville last played April 27, falling 13-12 in overtime to Virginia.
- · UL is led by goalie Brittany Read, who was named ACC Defensive Player of the Year. She leads the ACC in saves (186), save percentage (.518) and saves per game (10.33), and is second in goals against average (9.58).
- The First Team All-ACC selection was joined by Hannah Koloski (First Team) and Meghan Siverson (Second Team) on the All-ACC teams.
- Koloski ranks third in the ACC in goals (3.33) and seventh in points (3.44). Siverson was sixth in goals (3.00) and tied Koloski in points (3.44).
- Kellie Young is in her 10th season at the helm, owning a 106-67 record in Louisville. Previously JMU's head coach from 2003-06, she has a 14year career record of 157-91 at the DI level.
- The Cards have now gone to four straight NCAA Championships under Young.

JMU ROLLS ELON TO WIN CAA TITLE

- · Following a thrilling overtime win in the semifinals, JMU dominated in the championship game, cruising to a 15-7 victory against Elon to win the CAA tournament title.
- · It was JMU's 10 CAA crown and secured the program's 14th berth in the NCAA Championship.
- The Dukes jumped out to a 6-0 lead and three players recorded hat tricks in the win.
- · Hanna Haven had a career day with four goals and three assists, while Haley Warden and Margaret Tucker Fogarty each scored three times.

WARDEN NAMED CAA'S MOP

- Immediately following the Dukes' 15-7 win over Elon to win the CAA title, four Dukes were honored for play during the CAA Championship.
- · Haley Warden, who scored three goals in the title game and netted the overtime gamewinner in the semifinals, was named the Most Outstanding Performer.
- Warden also contributed five draw controls, four caused turnovers and three ground balls. She was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Leah Monticello, Emily Poelma and Caroline Sdanowich.

JMU WINS SEMIFINAL ON WARDEN OT WINNER

· Haley Warden scored 1:04 into overtime to lift JMU to a thrilling 11-10 win against Delaware in the CAA semifinals on May 5.

- · The Dukes led 10-6 before the Blue Hens used a furious 4-0 rally down the stretch to force overtime. Hannah Jablonski stick checked Becky Gohsler to win the draw for JMU.
- The Dukes cashed in on their first shot of the extra frame after Hanna Haven fed Warden the ball inside.
- Leah Monticello, Kristen Gaudian and Elena Romesburg each had two goals and an assist while Haven and Katie Kerrigan both had a goal and an assist. Jablonski led the midfield with five draw controls.
- · It was JMU's fourth overtime game in CAA Championship history, improving to 3-1 in those games.

WARDEN BREAKS RECORD IN SEMIS

- · In addition to her game winner in overtime, Haley Warden broke a JMU single-season record during the game.
- She caused two turnovers to surpass Alivian Coates for first on JMU's single-season list.
- · Coates had 41 in 2000, while Warden, who ranks in the top 15 nationally in the category, has 44.

WARDEN, KLAES-BAWCOMBE REEL IN MAJOR CAA AWARDS

- For the second straight season, JMU brings home the CAA's top player and coach of the year accolades, as Haley Warden was voted Player of the Year, and Shelley Klaes-Bawcombe was named Coach of the Year.
- JMU has now won CAA Player of the Year 13 times and in five of the past six seasons, while Klaes-Bawcombe earned her fourth CAA Coach of the Year nod, including her third at JMU.
- · Warden scored 22 goals, to go with seven assists, but her play in the midfield and defensive third makes her the complete player. She led the Dukes with 56 draw controls, 47 ground balls and 40 caused turnovers, ranking in the CAA's top three in all hustle categories.
- · Warden ranks 12th nationally in caused turnovers per game (2.35), as she is one shy of JMU's single season record. She is also third in JMU single-season history in draw controls and tied for 14th in ground balls.
- · Klaes-Bawcombe earned her fourth career CAA Coach of the Year award, and third at JMU. She was first named the CAA's top coach in 2005 at Hofstra, and has earned the laurel in 2010, 2016 and 2017 while at the helm of the Dukes.
- She guided JMU to JMU's sixth outright CAA regular-season title and the program's 11th overall regular-season crown since the league's formation in 1992.

SEVEN DUKES ON ALL-CAA TEAMS

- JMU had seven individual garner All-CAA accolades, led by three First Team members.
- Earning First Team All-CAA honors were attacker Kristen Gaudian and midfielders Elena Romesburg and Haley Warden.
- · Joining the trio on the Second Team were attacker Katie Kerrigan and defender Rebecca Tooker, Emma Johnson and Maddie McDaniel were also named to the All-Rookie Team.
- All seven players will return in 2017 and this is the sixth straight season JMU has had at least three players named First Team All-CAA.

CAA ONCE AGAIN PREMIER IN RPI

- James Madison's body of work this season has provided for a top-20 RPI ranking, as it came in at No. 14 in this week's ranking.
- · Following JMU's wins in the CAA Championship, it moved up two spots from No. 16 to No. 14.
- CAA foes Towson (No. 16) and Elon (No. 17) also rank in the top 20, while Delaware (No. 27) holds a top-30 spot.
- The CAA ranks fourth nationally in conference RPI, trailing the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big Ten and Ivy League.
- The ACC boasts four top-20 RPI teams, including No. 1 North Carolina and No. 5 Syracuse. The Big Ten also has four top-20 teams, headlined by No. 2 Maryland, which owns the No. 1 overall seed for the NCAA Championship.
- JMU is 3-4 against the top-20 this season, with its win over Towson and pair of victories over the Phoenix.

JMU AWAY FROM HOME

- The Dukes have been solid outside of Harrisonburg, earning a 8-3 record, including a 5-3 mark in true road games.
- In the 11 outings, JMU outscores opponents 13.55 to 9.64, on average.
- The Dukes lead the hustle stats, with advantages in draw controls (150-126), caused turnovers

- (106-103) and ground balls (194-192).
- · JMU's pressure has been solid, as its clear percentage is 64 points higher than opponents.
- Hanna Haven leads JMU on the road with 27 goals and 12 assists, while four other Dukes have scored at least 20 goals.

CLINCHING NO. 1 FOR CAA TOURNEY

- For the second straight season, JMU secured the top seed for the CAA Championship in the Drexel road win.
- The Dukes finished CAA play at 5-1, marking the seventh straight year JMU has only lost one conference game.
- The Dukes clinched the outright regular-season crown for the sixth time since 1992 and has now won at least a share in 11 seasons.
- Since the creation of the CAA lacrosse conference, JMU is 121-48 (.716) during CAA play in the regular season.

JMU DROPS LONE CAA GAME AT UDEL

- Delaware led wire-to-wire to hand JMU its only CAA loss in a 15-12 decision on April 23.
- The Hens, who used an 8-1 run to bridge the halves, were led by Coley Ricci's five goals. Becky Gohsler and Megan Santoleri each tallied four scores.
- Margaret Tucker Fogarty led JMU with three goals and an assist while three other Dukes scored twice.
- · It was JMU's second straight season losing at Delaware to mark the team's lone CAA defeat.

DUKES ROLL DREXEL, CLAIM TOP SEED

- Kristen Gaudian tallied career highs of five goals and seven points and JMU erupted for a 14goal first half to cruise to a 19-7 victory against Drexel on April 21 in Philadelphia.
- · Gaudian, who also struck for a career-best three free-position goals, was one of four Dukes to record hat tricks. Elena Romesburg had three goals and an assist, and Margaret Tucker Fogarty and Maddie McDaniel each tallied three scores.

Halle Duenkel led the defense with a careerhigh four caused turnovers, two draw controls and a ground ball. Haley Warden tallied four draws and three ground balls. JMU opened the game with three straight goals and used a five-goal run late in the half to up the lead to 14-4 before halftime. The Dukes scored the final five goals of the game to extend the margin to double digits.

DUKES DOMINATE HOFSTRA

- Haley Warden scored a career-high six goals, and JMU used three big scoring runs to roll past Hofstra 17-9 on April 14 in Hempstead, N.Y.
- It was JMU's fourth straight win, as they clinched a spot in the CAA Championship.
- Warden tied her career high for scoring in the first half alone, notching four goals in a span of less than 11 minutes. She also had six draw controls - one off her career high. Kristen Gaudian scored three goals while adding an assist, and both Hanna Haven and Elena Romesburg scored twice.
- After conceding the first goal of the game, JMU scored six in a row. Leading 6-4, the Dukes closed the half with five straight to build an 11-4 advantage. The Dukes used another five-goal run to lead by as many as 10 in the second half.

WARDEN SHARES CAA TOP HONOR

- Following a career performance in the win at Hofstra, Haley Warden was named CAA Co-Player of the Week on April. 17.
- She scored a career-best six goals while winning six draw controls in JMU's 17-9 thrashing of Hofstra. She scored four goals in a span of 10:35 of the first to help JMU build a seven-goal advantage at the break.
- This is Warden's third CAA weekly award, as she's won Defensive Player of the Week twice (Mar. 7; Apr. 10).

HOT START LIFTS DUKES PAST TRIBE

- JMU scored the game's first six goals, as the Dukes beat William & Mary 11-5 on April 9.
- Katie Kerrigan scored six points off a goal and a career-high five assists, and both Margaret Tucker Fogarty and Maddie McDaniel recorded
- · Outside of JMU's three free-position goals, its other eight scores were all assisted.
- · Haley Warden finished off her strong week by causing five turnovers, tying her career high, to go with two ground balls.
- Rebecca Tooker caused three turnovers and had four ground balls, while Corinne Schmidt had two caused turnovers and a career-high five ground balls.

WARDEN EARNS SECOND CAA AWARD

- · Following a pair of dominant defensive wins, Haley Warden earned her second CAA Defensive Player of the Week award on April 10.
- In JMU's wins over Elon (14-5) and William & Mary (11-5), she tallied nine caused turnovers six ground balls and six draw controls.
- In the Elon win, she recorded 13 hustle stats off five draws, four caused turnovers and four ground balls. She followed that up by tying her career high with five caused turnovers, to go with two ground balls and a draw control

JMU ROLLS PAST ELON

- JMU used three big scoring runs and a stout defensive effort to earn a 14-5 win on April 7 against Elon.
- · The Dukes dominated every stat category, outshooting Elon 34-13, including 28-3 in shots on goal. JMU also led in caused turnovers (18-8), draw controls (14-6) and ground balls (22-11).
- · All three starting attackers recorded hat tricks, led by Kristen Gaudian's four goals. Katie Kerrigan had five points off three goals and two assists, and Leah Monticello added three scores and a helper.
- Elena Romesburg had a career day, causing six turnovers while winning five ground balls. Haley Warden also had five draw controls, four caused turnovers and four ground balls.

DUKES UPEND TOWSON TO OPEN CAA PLAY

- Kristen Gaudian scored four times and JMU used a seven-goal run in the first half to claim a 9-5 victory against #13 Towson in the CAA opener on April 1.
- Gaudian scored three of her four goals in the first half, as the Dukes held TU scoreless for over 33 minutes after conceding the first goal.
- Elena Romesburg had two goals while Haley Warden tallied one goal, one assists, a careerhigh five ground balls, two draw controls and two caused turnovers.
- · Emily Poelma made seven saves, to go with a career-best five ground balls.

GAUDIAN TAKES HOME CAA POTW

- Junior Kristen Gaudian was honored by the CAA for the first time in her career on April 3, as she was named the conference's Player of the Week following the Towson win.
- · She tied her career high of four goals, which included three in the first half. She added one draw control and a ground ball.
- It was the first time since April 4, 2016, that a Duke was named CAA Player of the Week, and it is the fifth CAA weekly accolade for JMU in '17.

STRONG FINISH IN LOSS TO TERPS

- · Maddie McDaniel scored a career-high four goals, including three during an eight-minute span in the second half. Katie Kerrigan tied her career high with four assists, and Leah Monticello added three points.
- · Haley Warden became the 12th JMU player in history to reach 100 career draw controls, as she won four to up her total to 102. She also tied her career best of four ground balls.
- Leading 5-2, UM limited JMU to just two goals in nearly 23 minutes while scoring nine goals to up its lead to 13-4 with just over 20 minutes to go. JMU outscored UMD 7-3 in the last 17:24.

JMU STUMBLES VERSUS VIRGINIA

- Despite surging out to a 3-1 lead, JMU managed just three more goals over the final 47:30, falling 9-6 to No. 19 Virginia on March 22.
- Kelly Reese and Besser Dyson each had three goals and Rachel Vander Kolk made nine saves on JMU's 15 shots on goal.
- No JMU player was able to score more than a goal, but hustle stats is where JMU saw positives. Rebecca Tooker and Caroline Sdanowich each had a career-high four ground balls. Tooker also had three caused turnovers and two draw controls, while Sdanowich added two caused turnovers.
- · UVa used scoring runs of 3-0 in both the first and second halves to earn the road win.

DUKES CONTROL ALL PHASES AT UR

- · Hanna Haven had a career night and JMU controlled every facet of the game to earn a 14-8 win at Richmond on March 15.
- · Haven scored a career-high six points off a career-best four goals and two assists, which matched her single-best total. Elena Romesburg and Haley Warden each had hat tricks. Hannah Jablonski produced a career-high six draws.
- JMU used a 4-0 run over the final 12 minutes of the first half to take an 8-4 lead at the break. Leading 10-7, the Dukes scored four straight in five-and-a-half minutes to put the game away.

20-GOAL WIN FOR THE DUKES

- A total of 12 players scored and JMU dominated all phases in a 21-1 win against Longwood on March 3.
- · It was JMU's sixth win all-time by 20 or more goals and was just one goal off the program's win-margin record.
- Katie Kerrigan had a career-high seven points off three goals and a career-high four assists. Elena Romesburg had a hat trick and an assist, to go with four ground balls and three draws.
- · Kristen Gaudian also produced a hat trick.
- · Both goalies played a half each, with Emily Poelma making four saves on five shots on goal and Ellie Harmeyer making one stop on the lone shot she faced.
- It was the first time winning by 20 since a 22-2 victory against American on April 13, 1999.

- Haley Warden was one of 25 women's players selected to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List, which recognizes the top male and female lacrosse players in the NCAA. Last season, Warden was a Second Team All-CAA selection. She led the Dukes in ground balls and was second on the team and third in the CAA in draw controls.
- This season, she's one of the league leaders in draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers.

COACH SHELLEY SETS WINS RECORD

- On Feb. 25, Shelley Klaes-Bawcombe became JMU's all-time winningest coach with her 119th win at the helm of the Dukes.
- She passed JMU Hall of Famer Dee McDonough, who won 118 games in 15 seasons.
- Now in her 11th season, she has guided JMU to four NCAA Championship appearances, has been named CAA Coach of the Year twice and is a three-time CAA champion.
- · The Dukes have been ranked in nine of her 11 seasons while leading the program.

DUKES ROLL IN HOME OPENER

- · Five players scored two or more goals, as JMU cruised to a 15-4 win over High Point on Feb. 25.
- Maddie McDaniel produced her first career hat trick, while Kristen Gaudian had two goals and
- · Hanna Haven and Elena Romesburg both had two goals and an assist. Katie Kerrigan also had three helpers.
- JMU dominated defensively, led by Haley Warden's four caused turnovers and four ground balls.

TOOKER NAMED CAA'S TOP DEFENDER

- Following a road win at Virginia Tech and neutral-site win versus UConn, Rebecca Tooker was named CAA Defensive Player of the Week.
- She tallied six caused turnovers, four draw controls and three ground balls in the sweep.
- In the two wins, JMU's defense forced its foes into long scoring droughts.
- The Dukes held VT without a goal for 19:08 in the second half, and UConn went spans of 21 and 17 minutes without scoring.

DUKES BEAT UCONN AT US LAX COMPLEX

- In the first NCAA women's lacrosse game at the new US Lacrosse Complex, JMU held off UConn's late rally for an 11-10 win on Feb. 19.
- JMU led 11-6 before the Huskies scored four straight over the final four minutes. In a lastditch effort to force overtime, UConn's shot with two seconds left went just wide of the cage.
- Elena Romesburg was the all-round best player on the field, producing two goals, one assist, five ground balls, two draw controls and a caused turnover.

DEFENSE POWERS DUKES AT TECH

- JMU overcame a deficit, scoring four straight goals and holding Virginia Tech without a score for over 19 minutes in a 9-6 triumph on Feb. 15.
- Hanna Haven had a career-high five points off three goals and two assists, while Elena Romesburg had three goals and an assist.
- Defensively, Rebecca Tooker had four caused turnovers, and Corinne Schmidt tallied two caused turnovers and three ground balls.
- Haley Warden won seven draw controls, and Romesburg added three draws and four ground balls.

DUKES ROLL MICHIGAN FOR 1ST WIN

- Three Dukes recorded hat tricks, as JMU rolled to an 18-6 victory at Michigan on Feb. 11.

HALL OF FAMERS MEET IN ANN ARBOR

- JMU's game in Ann Arbor featured a pair of JMU Hall of Famers with JMU Head Coach Shelley Klaes-Bawcombe and Michigan Head Coach Jen Ulehla.
- Klaes-Bawcombe played for Ulehla in the mid-90's, winning the CAA in 1997 and making a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Ulehla coached JMU to its lone Final Four appearance in 2000, tallying a 90-56 overall record from 1995 until 2002.
- Klaes-Bawcombe was enshrined in the JMU Hall of Fame in 2011, while Ulehla followed her in the 2013 class.

JMU TAKES #1 CAROLINA TO THE LIMIT

- JMU led 8-5 in the first half before a surge to bridge the halves lifted UNC to a 16-14 win.
- Down 14-9, JMU mounted a comeback, coming to within a goal at 15-14 with under six minutes left. UNC added insurance and neither team scored in the final five minutes.
- Kristen Gaudian and Margaret Tucker Fogarty both scored four goals. Haley Warden and Hanna Haven each had four points (2g, 2a).
- Emily Poelma made a career-best 16 saves, which was the most stops dating back to the start of the 2009 season.
- The 14 goals were the most ever by JMU in the UNC series.

DUENKEL NAMED CAA'S TOP ROOKIE

- In her first career game, Halle Duenkel recorded two goals within the first 15 minutes at No. 1 North Carolina.
- For her efforts, she was named CAA Rookie of the Week. It was the first time since 2015 that a JMU player earned the league's Rookie of the Week laurel.

DUKES PICKED SECOND IN CAA

- JMU was predicted in a vote by the head coaches to finish second in the seven-team Colonial Athletic Association.
- The Dukes won a share of the regular-season title last season and advanced to the CAA title game before receiving an at-large bid to the NCAA Championship.

- Madison finished 2016 with a 10-10 overall record and 5-1 mark in the CAA.
- The Dukes return four starters, including Preseason All-American Haley Warden.

FOUR DUKES PRESEASON ALL-CAA

- Four players earned Preseason All-CAA status in a vote by the league's head coaches.
- Leah Monticello is set to return in March after suffering a season-ending injury early in 2016
- In three games, she scored one goal and added six assists.
- Haley Warden ranked third in the CAA in draw controls (52) and scored 19 goals and 11 assists as a sophomore.
- Rebecca Tooker is JMU's leading defender, having accrued 16 caused turnovers, 15 draw controls and 14 ground balls last year.
- Elena Romesburg scored 23 goals and added five assists while winning 39 draw controls and tallying 14 ground balls.
