After a 13-year hiatus, the ETSU football team made its return to the Southern Conference in 2016 ... The Bucs – who played as an FCS Independent their first season during the 2015 campaign – went 5-6 with two conference wins in 2016 ... ETSU defeated Western Carolina at Bristol Motor Speedway and No. 18 Samford on a walk-off 28-yard field goal by JJ Jerman in the season finale.

BUCS OPEN NEW STADIUM WITH A WIN OVER LIMESTONE

After playing off campus its first two seasons, the ETSU football team returned home to play in its newly built on-campus stadium in 2017 ... The Buccaneers opened play inside William B. Greene Jr. Stadium with a 31-10 win over Limestone College last Saturday ... Last Saturday marked ETSU's first game on campus since Nov. 22, 2003 and its first game outdoors on campus since Nov. 25, 1972

NOTES ON LIMESTONE WIN

The Buccaneers opened William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium with a 31-10 victory over Limestone in front of a sellout crowd of 9,530 on Saturday night ... **The Bucs outgained the Saints 379 to 222 and posted 20 first downs compared to just 13 for Limestone** ... ETSU totaled 239 yards passing and 140 yards rushing, while Limestone finished with 193 rushing yards and 29 passing yards ... **ETSU dominated the first half – outgaining the Saints 264 to 65 – en route to taking a 21-3 lead into halftime Of ETSU's 264 yards of total offense in the first half, 180 came via the pass and 84 came on the ground ... Limestone was held to 49 rushing yards and 16 passing yards in the opening 30 minutes ... The Buccaneer defense held Limestone to 2-of-15 on third down chances, while holding them to 0-of-5 on third down in the first half** ... ETSU was 4-of-9 on third down for the contest, along with going 4-of-6 in the first half ... The Bucs were a perfect 3-of-3 on third down conversions in the second quarter – where ETSU outscored the Saints, 14-3 ... **Austin Herink tied a career high with three touchdown passes, as he has now accomplished the feat three times in his career ... Herink also set a new single-game program record by completing 15 straight passes to start a game ... The redshirt junior quarterback was 13-for-13 with 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half ... Herink completed passes to eight different receivers** ... On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive lineman **Nasir Player** had a team and career high 10 tackles, while junior linebacker **Dylan Weigel** had eight stops. Senior defensive back **Paul Hunter** also had a strong game with six tackles and an interception ... Following Hunter's interception, the Bucs have now forced at least one turnover in six straight games, while accomplishing the feat in 16 of their last 19 contests ... **JJ Jerman** has made nine of his last 11 field goal attempts, while his previous career long was a 46-yard make, which came in the 2015 season opener against Kennesaw State (Sept. 3) ... Jerman has now made 21 career field goals placing him fifth all-time in program history ... The preseason all-SoCon kicker is 44-for-45 in career PATs, making Jerman three shy of passing Ron Harrold (1968-70) for seventh all-time ... The Bucs scored on four of their first six possessions ... ETSU's average starting field position was at its own 28-yard line; however, in the second half the Bucs' average start was at their own 37.

SERIES HISTORY

Tonight marks the 10th all-time meeting between ETSU and James Madison ... The Dukes have won six of the nine meetings in the series, including four straight ... The Bucs are searching for their first win over James Madison since defeating the Dukes, 9-6, back on Oct. 27, 1984 in Harrisonburg ... The Blue and Gold won the first two meetings in the series by a combined score of 59-23 following back-to-back wins in 1979 (Sept. 8) and 1980 (Nov. 8) ... George Cimadevilla made the longest field goal in program history against James Madison as he connected on a 52-yarder in the 34-3 setback in 1986.

2017 Buccaneer Football GAME NOTES

ETSU VS. NO. 1 RANKED TEAMS

Tonight marks the first time ETSU is taking on a No. 1 ranked team since Oct. 27, 2001 when the Bucs defeated top-ranked Georgia Southern, 19-16 ... That win marked the first-ever victory over a No. 1 ranked team for the Blue and Gold as Matt Wilhjelm connected on a pair of touchdown passes to Cecil Moore ... After trailing 9-0 at halftime, the Bucs scored 19 straight points in the third quarter to ignite the comeback ... Overall, the Bucs were outgained 316-182, but the Buccaneer defense forced four turnovers (three fumbles and one interception) and turned two of the miscues into touchdowns ... Gerald Sensabaugh sealed the game with an interception on Southern's final drive, which allowed Corey Carter to run three straight times en route to picking up a first down and allowing the Bucs to get into the victory formaton ... Prior to that win, ETSU was 0-3 all-time against No. 1 ranked foes – lost to Marshall 34-10 on Nov. 9, 1996, and to Georgia Southern on Oct. 31, 1998 and on Oct. 28, 2000.

HERINK MAKES HISTORY IN SEASON OPENER

Redshirt junior quarterback Austin Herink made history in the Bucs' season-opening win over Limestone on Saturday ... The Buccaneer left-hander completed his first 15 passes to start the game, including going 13-for-13 with 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half ... Herink's first incomplete pass came with three minutes remaining in the third quarter ... The Cleveland, Tenn. native tied a career high with three touchdown passes in the 31-10 victory to open up William B. Greene Jr. Stadium.

TO 30 AND BEYOND...

ETSU put up 31 points in last Saturday's win over Limestone, marking just the fifth time in 23 games the Blue and Gold reached the 30-point mark ... When the Bucs reach that number, ETSU is 5-0 in those contests since restarting the program in 2015 ... Furthermore, ETSU has won its last 14 games when scoring at least 30 points with the last setback coming on Nov. 4, 2000 when Wofford defeated the Bucs, 35-31.

BIG PLAYS FOR CASH IN FOR THE BUCS

The Bucs came through with a handful of big plays last Saturday against Limestone ... Three of the Bucs' four touchdowns came on plays 25 yard or longer ... Austin Herink found Andrew Heyward for a 43-yard score on the opening series of the game, while following that up with a 45-yard strike to Anthony Spagnoletti in the second quarter ... Herink capped off the touchdown plays when he connected on a 25-yard score to Vincent Lowe with 11:39 remaining in the third quarter ... Overall, the Blue and Gold had five plays go for over 20 yards (four offense/one kickoff return) ... Last season, the Bucs only scored touchdowns on two plays over 20 yards – 69-yard touchdown reception to Drake Powell and 29-yard reception to Jajuan Stinson.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Austin Herink did a tremendous job sharing the wealth with his Buccaneer receivers last Saturday ... Herink – who threw for 239 yards in the 31-10 win over Limestone – completed passes to eight different wide receivers ... Senior Vincent Lowe led the group as he tied a career high with five receptions ... Redshirt junior Drake Powell finished with three receptions, while Quan Harrison and Braxton Richburg both hauled in two catches in their first ever collegiate game.

O'CAIN RETURNS TO OLD STOMPING GROUNDS

ETSU offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Mike O'Cain returns to his old stomping grounds this weekend in Harrisonburg ... O'Cain was JMU's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2013.

WELCOME BACK TO CAMPUS

Last Saturday marked the first time in 5,034 days where ETSU football played a home game on campus ... Prior to the Limestone game, the Bucs' last game on campus was back one Nov. 22, 2003, when the Blue and Gold defeated The Citadel, 16-13, inside the Mini Dome ... The last time ETSU played a home game outdoors on campus before last Saturday was back on Nov. 25, 1972 when the Bucs defeated Chattanooga, 35-0, at Memorial Stadium, which is currently where the MSHA Athletic Center now stands ... The last time ETSU opened a new, on-campus stadium was on Sept. 10, 1977 when the Bucs hosted North Alabama inside the Mini-Dome ... Prior to William B. Greene Jr. Stadium, ETSU also played home games at Kermit Tipton Stadium (2015 and 2016), Mini-Dome (1977-2003), Roosevelt Stadium (1973-76), Memorial Stadium (housed the Bucs until 1972) and the Bucs' original home was beside University High, where Brown Hall currently stands.

THIS DATE IN ETSU HISTORY

ETSU is searching for its first ever win on Sept. 9 ... The Bucs are 0-3 all-time on this date with setbacks to Colorado State (41-7, in 2000), Toledo (41-20, in 1995) and Middle Tennessee State (41-6, 1989).

A WIN TONIGHT WOULD...

A win tonight at James Madison would mark ETSU's 342nd victory in program, while it would be just the Bucs' second win over a No. 1 ranked team in school history ... A win would also mark the first victory over James Madison since 1984 and be the 29th career victory for head coach Carl Torbush.

BUCS LOOK TO OPEN 2-0 FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

The ETSU football team is looking to open 2-0 for the second straight year ... Last season, the Bucs won at Kennesaw State (20-17 in 2 OT) and versus Western Carolina (34-31) at Bristol Motor Speedway ... Should the Blue and Gold win tonight, it would mark the first time since 1993-94 when the Bucs opened 2-0 in consecutive seasons.

NAMING RIGHTS ANNOUNCED FOR FOOTBALL STADIUM

During a called meeting on Aug. 24, the Board of Trustees for East Tennessee State University approved the naming of the William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium, which is located on the southwest corner of campus ... According to ETSU President Dr. Brian Noland, this naming recognizes the longstanding and generous support of William B. Greene, Jr., Dr. Linda Latimer and the Bank of Tennessee. For over four decades, Greene has been a tireless champion for supporting students and student athletes through scholarships as well as enhancing facilities. The Warren-Greene Golf Center at ETSU, which opened in 2004, was dedicated in honor of Greene in recognition of his support of the ETSU golf program.

ABOUT WILLIAM B. GREENE, JR. STADIUM

On March 25, 2015, the ETSU Department of Athletics revealed specific details about the location, amenities, and funding model of William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium. The stadium – is being built in two phases and ultimately cost approximately \$26.615 million – and has been built on property located between the Basler Center for Physical Activity and the ETSU Physical Plant Building. The stadium can ultimately seat over 10,000 fans, which includes a field turf playing surface, a Westside Tower that houses a press box and skybox seating, and a South end zone video board. A historic groundbreaking ceremony was held on Nov. 16, 2015, on the site of the new facility.

ETSU TO PLAY TENNESSEE IN 2018

In February of 2015, ETSU announced the Buccaneers will play Tennessee on Sept. 8, 2018 at Neyland Stadium ... ETSU will earn a game guarantee of \$500,000 for playing the Volunteers in Knoxville.

MORE FUTURE OPPONENTS FOR THE BUCS

In addition to playing Tennessee in 2018, the ETSU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced on April 8, 2016, that the Buccaneers will be playing both Vanderbilt and Appalachian State starting in 2019 ... The Bucs will also play at Vanderbilt in 2021 and at Appalachian State in 2024 ... ETSU also announced in June that the Blue and Gold will travel to Athens in 2020 to take on Georgia in Sanford Stadium ... The Buccaneers will earn a game guarantee of \$550,000 against Georgia.

THREE BUCCANEERS EARN PRESEASON SOCON HONORS

Redshirt junior linebacker Dylan Weigel, senior offensive lineman Alex Rios and junior kicker JJ Jerman were all placed on the 2017 Preseason All-SoCon Team.

2017 ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2017 ETSU football roster features 119 players ... 54 players are from Tennessee, while the remaining players are from Georgia (15), Ohio (10), North Carolina (8), Virginia (8), Alabama (7), Florida (6), South Carolina (6), Texas (2), and one each from Arizona, New York, and West Virginia ... Meanwhile 74 of the 119 players (62-percent) are underclassmen (30 true freshman, 12 red-shirt freshman, 9 sophomores, 23 redshirt sophomores), while the rest of the roster is made up of 14 juniors, 22 redshirt juniors, six seniors, and three redshirt seniors.

Following his 48-yard rushing game at Mercer, running back Jajuan Stinson eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark for his career ... Stinson has carried the ball 265 times in his career en route to totaling 1,267 rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) ... Linebacker Dylan Weigel has totaled 241 career tackles in 23 games played ... Weigel is 62 tackles shy of entering the top 10 all-time ETSU leaders ... Kicker JJ Jerman is 44-for-45 in PATs for his career ... Jerman's 44 PATs rank eighth all-time in ETSU history and he's three away of passing Ron Harrold (1968-70) for sixth ... Jerman also ranks fifth all-time with 21 field goals and needs four more to pass Bobby Neff (1974-77) for fourth.

Several Bucs are among the FCS career active leaders list ... Dylan Weigel leads all FCS players in total tackles per game (10.48), while ranking third in solo tackles per game (5.65) and 14th in total tackles (241) ... JJ Jerman ranks 11th among FCS active kickers in field goal percentage (.700) and 14th in field goals made (21) ... Austin Herink ranks 16th among FCS active quarterbacks in total offense plays per game (29.22), 23rd in completions per game (12.74), 24th in total plays (3,469) and 35th in passing efficiency (122.03) ... Jajuan Stinson ranks 25th among FCS running backs in rushes per game (12.05) and 32nd in all-purpose plays per game (12.82) ... Dominique Williams ranks second among FCS returners in kickoff returns per game (3.1), fifth in kickoff return yards per game (63.0) and 13th in kickoff return yards.

BUCS PICK UP VOTES IN FCS TOP 25

ETSU has received votes in the first two STATS FCS Preseason Top 25 Polls ... The Buccaneers, who finished the 2016 season with an overall record of 5-6 in their second season as a program, received three votes in the poll. ETSU finished its 2016 campaign with a 15-14 victory over then-No. 18 Samford, while the Blue and Gold opened the year with a 20-17 double-overtime win at Kennesaw State – another team who was ranked throughout the season ... This marks the second time in the last two seasons ETSU has received votes in the poll, as the Bucs also picked up votes last year following the wins over Kennesaw State and Western Carolina to open the season.

ABOUT ETSU'S OPPONENTS IN 2017

Of the 11 opponents on ETSU's schedule this season, five are currently ranked in the top-25 – No. 1 James Madison, No. 10 Wofford, No. 13 Chattanooga, No. 14 Citadel and No. 17 Samford ... Four of the opponents ranked in the top-30 of the FCS in defense a year ago – Wofford (5th, 287.2 yards per game), UTC (6th, 293.2), The Citadel (8th, 302.6) and James Madison (30th, 344.3) ... ETSU also faces four offenses that ranked in top-30 in 2016 – James Madison (3rd, 507.5 yards per game), Samford (14th, 446.2), The Citadel (27th, 416.5) and UTC (30th, 412.5 yards per game) ... In addition, the Blue and Gold also face four rushing offenses in the top-30 – Citadel (1st, 348.2), Wofford (4th, 279.6), James Madison (5th, 275.0) Chattanooga (24th, 206.3).

BUCS TO FACE REIGNING FCS NATIONAL CHAMPION IN 2017

This season, ETSU will take on five teams who made the 2016 FCS Playoffs, including playing at reigning FCS National Champion James Madison on Saturday, Sept. 9 ... The Dukes capped off a 14-1 season by winning their final 12 games to capture their second title in program history ... JMU's lone setback on the season came to North Carolina ... JMU led the FCS in team passing efficiency (181.69), ranked second in scoring offense (46.7), third in total offense (507.5), fourth in third down conversion (50.0) and fifth in turnovers gained (30).

SOCON PLAYING THE BEST IN 2017

The SoCon is the only conference in college football that will take on both the reigning FCS and FBS national champions this season. In addition to ETSU squaring off against JMU this weekend, The Citadel will face Clemson on Nov. 18.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

ETSU has enjoyed a lot of red zone success since the start of the 2016 season ... Since 2016, ETSU is 29-of-32 (91%) in red zone scoring ... The Bucs have scored 158 points during these 32 trips (18 TDs/11 FGs) ... Of the 18 TDs, 11 have been rushing and seven passing.

ETSU IN OVERTIME GAMES

Last season, ETSU played its fifth overtime game in program history as the Bucs defeated Kennesaw State, 20-17 in double-overtime to start the 2016 season ... Overall, the Blue and Gold are 3-2 in overtime games in program history ... Last year, the SoCon played six overtime games, which matched its record that was also set in 2006.

FOUR BUCS EARN ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS IN 2016

The ETSU football team had four Buccaneers earn all-conference honors in 2016 ... Sophomore linebacker Dylan Weigel (Pickerington, Ohio) earned second team all-conference honors by the media, while offensive lineman Ben Blackmon (Newberry, S.C.) and defensive linemen Jason Maduafokwa (Seymour, Tenn.) and Nasir Player (Columbia, S.C.) were placed on the all-freshman team.

BUCS IN THE CLASSROOM

ETSU football excelled in the classroom in 2016-17 ... Eleven Buccaneers earned fall academic all-conference honors in 2016, while placing 41 on the SoCon Honor Roll this past season.

FEED STINSON

Jajuan Stinson has posted over 100 all-purpose yards seven times in his young Buccaneer career ... When the rising junior running back goes over 100 all purpose yards, the Bucs are 6-1 in those contests ... The lone loss came in 2015 (Maryville) when the Knoxville native ran for 114 yards ... In 2016, Stinson totaled over 100 all-purpose yards against Kennesaw State (91 rushing/10 receiving), Western Carolina (91 rushing/16 receiving), West Virginia Wesleyan (127 rushing/24 receiving), and Cumberland (114 rushing/29 receiving).

POWELL PILING UP THE NUMBERS

Drake Powell piled up the numbers in his last four games of the 2016 season ... Over the four-week stretch, Powell has recorded 18 receptions for 328 yards and one touchdown ... His touchdown reception came at Mercer, which was a 69-yard play ... The 69 yards marked the longest play by the Bucs since restarting their program in 2015 ... Powell finished with career highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (143) at Mercer, becoming just the second player to go over 100 receiving yards in a game since last season ... The week prior, Powell had three receptions for 70 yards at The Citadel ... In his first seven games this season, Powell totaled 11 catches for 103 yards.

2017 Buccaneer Football GAME NOTES

NUMBERS DON'T LIE

ETSU's two common opponents from 2015 to 2016 were Kennesaw State and Mercer ... In 2015, the Bucs lost by a combined score of 108-16 to the two programs (56-16 vs. KSU and 52-0 to Mercer), resulting in a 92-point differential ... In 2016, ETSU went 1-1 against the two programs as the Bucs defeated Kennesaw State, 20-17 and fell to Mercer, 21-13, resulting in a five-point differential in the two games ... In the two years, ETSU went from being negative-92 to negative-5 against the two foes, resulting in an 87-point turnaround in the two games.

SENIORS LOST

ETSU lost four Buccaneer seniors from its 2016 roster ... Defensive backs Tavian Lott and Ryan Powers, wide receiver Chad Pritchard and defensive lineman Royce Turnbull played their final collegiate game in the 15-14 win over No. 18 Samford last November ... Lott started all 22 games as Buccaneer, while totaling 66 tackles (2.5 TFL), three interceptions, 10 pass break ups and one forced fumble ... Powers – who played his first three seasons at Stetson – transferred to ETSU as a graduate student ... Powers started 10 games for the Blue and Gold, while registering 70 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, seven pass break ups and one forced fumble ... The Jupiter, Fla. native recorded double-digit tackles four times in 2016 – including a season-high 12 at Mercer ... Like Lott, Pritchard also played the last two seasons for ETSU ... The Elizabethton, Tenn. native played in all 22 games, making three starts and totaling 24 receptions for 368 yards ... Pritchard had a career-high three receptions in ETSU's win over Western Carolina at Bristol Motor Speedway and posted a career-best 57 receiving yards at #21 Montana State in October of 2015 ... Turnbull played in 13 games over the last two seasons, while his 2016 campaign was cut short due to injury ... In his 13 career games, Turnbull posted eight tackles, including at least one tackle in seven games.

RECAPPING THE 2016 SEASON

ETSU started the 2016 season with a pair of key wins as the Buccaneers opened the year with a thrilling 20-17 double-overtime win at Kennesaw State, while following that up with a 34-31 victory over Western Carolina in front of a record-setting crowd of 13,863 fans at Bristol Motor Speedway ... At Kennesaw State, JJ Jerman connected on a walk-off 24-yard field goal in the second overtime stanza to lift the Blue and Gold to victory ... The Buccaneer defense held a potent Owl rushing attack to 166 rushing yards and 338 total yards of offense, which also included two sacks and three forced fumbles (two recoveries) ... After its bye week, ETSU overcame an 18-point, first-half deficit to score 24 unanswered points, taking the lead in the second half and defeating Western Carolina 34-31 in the Food City Bucs at Bristol game at Bristol Motor Speedway ... The turning point of the game came as ETSU trailed 21-3 with two minutes left in the first half and Western Carolina was driving on offense. A 43-yard pass to the Catamounts' Spearman Robinson took the ball to the ETSU 30-yard line, but as he was tackled, the Bucs' Daren Ardis punched the ball loose and teammate Kevin Ferguson recovered with 1:23 left before the intermission. ETSU then took the ball 71 yards in eight plays to close the half with a touchdown to make it 21-10. Instead of trailing by as much as 25 points at 28-3, the Bucs were back in the ball game at 21-10 and outscored the Catamounts 31-10 the rest of the game to take the victory.

Following the back-to-back wins to start the season, ETSU dropped four consecutive games, which included consecutive games against Wofford and No. 3 Chattanooga – a pair of FCS Playoff participants in 2016.

The Blue and Gold then bounced back by winning three of their final five games of the season to finish with five wins and two in SoCon play ... ETSU ended the season with a dramatic 15-14 victory over No. 18 Samford on Jerman's 28-yard walk-off field goal in Johnson City. It was the Bucs first win over a ranked opponent since dropping No. 1 Georgia Southern 19-16 back on Oct. 27, 2001, inside the ETSU/MSHA Athletic Center. The Bucs, who fell behind 14-3 and scored 12 unanswered points to pick up the win, capped their second season since returning to the gridiron in 2015 with a 5-6 overall record (2-6 in the SoCon) and a pair of wins over teams that either are or were eventually ranked in the Top 25, as Kennesaw State was ranked No. 22 in the nation. ETSU won the time of possession - 43:47 to 16:13, which set a new Buccaneer single-game record ... The previous record of 40:37 was set on Oct. 25, 1997 versus #16 Furman. ETSU out-gained Samford, 329 to 265, as the Bucs threw for 238 yards and ran for 91 ... The 265 total offensive yards by the Bulldogs marked their second-lowest output of the season (257 at Central Arkansas), while it was the lowest total yards allowed by the Buccaneer defense this season ... Samford's 122 yards passing marked a season-low. The Bucs ran 21 more plays than the Bulldogs, 70-49. In the second half, ETSU held Samford to 49 offensive yards (28 rushing/21 passing), while the Bucs racked up 206 of total yards on offense (34 rushing/172 passing) ... The Blue and Gold ran 40 plays in the second half, compared to the Bulldogs' 16.

JERMAN'S STREAK SNAPPED

JJ Jerman had his streak of perfection snapped in the win over Cumberland last November ... Jerman – who had made 40 straight PATs to start his collegiate career – had attempt No. 41 blocked and returned for two points ... The Buccaneer kicker – who was 22-for-22 in PATs a year ago – had made his first 18 attempts this season (two at KSU/four vs. WCU/one vs. UTC/one at VMI/one vs. Furman/five vs. WWC/one at The Citadel/one at Mercer) before missing his final attempt against the Phoenix.

JERMAN'S CAREER KICK AGAINST LIMESTONE

Despite battling damp and chilly elements, junior kicker JJ Jerman nailed a career-best 48-yard field goal last Saturday against Limestone ... Jerman's previous best came from 46 yards in his first collegiate game against Kennesaw State back in 2015 ... The 48-yard make by Jerman marked the fifth longest make in program history.



2017 Buccaneer Football GAME NOTES

BUCS RUSH FOR 300 YARDS AND 5 TDS VS. BOBCATS

ETSU rushed for over 300 yards and five touchdowns in its 38-7 win over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 20 ... As a unit, ETSU rushed for 323 yards, marking the most by an ETSU team since totaling 343 yards on the ground in a 38-3 win over VMI on Sept. 16, 2000 ... In addition, the Bucs rushed for five touchdowns, resulting in the most by ETSU since recording six rushing scores in the 68-7 win over Chattanooga back on Nov. 15, 2003.

SLOW STARTS

In ETSU's 11 games last season, the Bucs were outscored 87-14 in the first quarter ... ETSU scored its first points in the first quarter in the win over West Virginia Wesleyan on Oct. 20 ... The Bucs have run 152 total plays in the first quarter, resulting in 576 yards and 33 first downs ... ETSU was also outscored 189-67 in the first half in 2016.

WINS TO LOSSES

ETSU finished the 2016 season with a 5-6 mark ... In ETSU's five wins, the Bucs averaged 26.0 points per game (130 total) and 389 yards per contest (192.6 rushing/196.4 passing) ... The Blue and Gold converted on 46 percent (33/71) of their third down chances and were 21-of-22 in red zone scoring ... ETSU's defense limited the opposition to 17.0 points per game (85 total points) in the five wins, while holding them to 317.4 yards on offense (111 rushing/206.4 passing) ... The opponents were also converting on only 31 percent (19/62) on their third down chances in ETSU's wins ... The Bucs also forced eight fumbles (recovered six) and turned those turnovers into 24 points ... ETSU's defense also totaled 10 sacks (-45 yards) and has held two of its four opponents to 100 yards rushing or less in the five wins ... Individually, running back Jajuan Stinson averaged 90.6 rushing yards (453 total) and scored six touchdowns in ETSU's wins, while quarterback Austin Herink completed 65 percent (80-of-123) of his passes for 977 yards and five touchdowns ... In ETSU's six setbacks, the Bucs were outscored, 223-44, while allowing 433.5 yards per game (270.0 rushing/163.5 passing) ... Offensively, ETSU only averaged 219.3 yards per game in the losses (85.2 rushing/134.2 passing), while converting on 33 percent (30/92) of its third down chances, whereas, the opponents converted on 44 percent (33/75) of those chances ... ETSU's defense only recorded four sacks (-18 yards) in the six losses and surrendered 200 yards rushing in four of the six games (Furman 198 and Mercer 195 yards) ... The Bucs were also outscored 169-23 in the first three quarters of their six losses ... ETSU forced seven turnovers in the six setbacks ... Individually, Jajuan Stinson only averaged 23.3 rushing yards per game (140 total) in the six contests, while Austin Herink is completed 55.1 percent (81-of-147) of his passes with four interceptions.

STREAKING

Despite playing its second year of FCS football, five Buccaneers carry start streaks into the 2017 season ... Austin Herink (QB), Matt Pyke (C), Chris Bouyer (DL), Dylan Weigel (LB) and Trey Quillin (LB) have started all 23 games for the Bucs since the program was restarted in 2015.

WEIGEL THE 2015 NATIONAL LEADER IN TACKLES

Red-shirt freshman linebacker Dylan Weigel caught the attention of both the local and national media in 2015 ... The Pickerington, Ohio native was named a finalist for the STATS FCS Freshman of the Year Award, while also being the FCS national leader in solo tackles with 7.2 per game (79 total) ... Weigel's 20-tackle performance against Emory & Henry marked the sixth highest total by an FCS player this season, while it tied for the second-most in ETSU single-game history ... Weigel posted double-digit tackles in nine games in 2015, including six straight games to end the season.

WILLIAMS AND THE RETURN RECORD

Defensive back Dominique Williams broke the ETSU single-season kickoff return record in 2015 ... Williams totaled 850 yards on 42 returns, which broke Ronnie Horton's record of 796 yards (30 attempts) back in 1980 ... Williams ranked ninth in the FCS in kickoff return yards, while Missouri State's Deion Holliman led the country with 1,233 yards.

HERINK BREAKS RECORD IN WIN OVER KENTUCKY WESLEYAN

Sophomore Austin Herink broke the ETSU single-game rushing record for a quarterback in the 2015 season finale win over Kentucky Wesleyan ... Herink totaled 134 yards on 20 attempts and scored two touchdowns in the 42-27 victory ... Herink's rushing total broke Todd Wells' mark of 108-yards, which was set against VMI in 2000.

COACH TORBUSH AND COACH O'CAIN REUNITE

Head Coach Carl Torbush turned to a familiar face and friend when it came to filling ETSU's offensive coordinator position as Mike O'Cain was named the OC for the Bucs on May 15, 2014 ... O'Cain, who was a head coach at NC State when Torbush was the head coach at UNC, served as Torbush's offensive coordinator at UNC in 2000 ... Following his stint at UNC with Torbush, O'Cain served as the offensive coordinator at Clemson (2001-04), quarterbacks coach at Virginia Tech (2006-12) and offensive coordinator at James Madison (2013).

NFL CONNECTIONS

Robert Williams, the father of freshman kickoff returner/defensive back Dominique Williams, played defensive back for Coach Torbush at North Carolina and was a fifth round draft pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 1998 ... Williams played two seasons with the Chiefs and one for Seattle ... In 18 career games (one start), Williams had 17 tackles and recovered one fumble ... Sophomore running back Dontavius Monroe is cousins with Super Bowl champion and current Detroit Lions wide receiver Anquan Boldin.

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. (Sept. 2, 2017) – A sold out crowd was treated to a triumphant return to campus in the inaugural game at William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium on Saturday night, as the ETSU football team opened its 2017 season with a historic 31-10 win over Limestone College.

With 9,530 fans looking on, the Buccaneers played their first game on the ETSU campus since Nov. 22, 2003 and their first game outdoors on campus since Nov. 25, 1972. The moment was not lost on junior quarterback Austin Herink (Cleveland), who played an inspired game by completing his first 15 passes of the night and throwing for 239 yards in all, including three touchdowns.

The Bucs (1-0) now brace for a matchup with defending Football Championship Subdivision national champion and No. 1-ranked James Madison next Saturday at 6 p.m. in Harrisonburg, Va., The Dukes will enter the game coming off a win as well, having defeated Football Bowl Subdivision opponent East Carolina, 34-14, on Saturday. Meanwhile, Limestone heads home with a 0-1 record following the loss in Johnson City.

Along with Herink, the Bucs got a game high 88 yards rushing and a score from junior tailback Jajuan Stinson (Knoxville), while senior wide receiver Vincent Lowe had a game high five receptions for 48 yards and a touchdown. Along with Lowe, fellow wide out Anthony Spagnoletti (Bealeton, Va.) and Andrew Heyward (Powder Springs, Ga.) each collected touchdown catches.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive lineman Nasir Player (Columbia, S.C.) had a team and career high 10 tackles, while junior linebacker Dylan Weigel (Pickerington, Ohio) had eight stops. Senior defensive back Paul Hunter (Denton, Texas) also had a strong game with six tackles and an interception.

The Bucs outgained the Saints 379 to 222 and posted 20 first downs compared to just 13 for Limestone. For Limestone, a bright spot was quarterback Ivan Corbin, Jr., who finished with 80 yards rushing and the Saints' lone scoring run.

HARRISONBURG, Va. (Sept. 13, 1997) - Despite posting five scores and 412 yards of total offense, the Buccaneers could not overcome four missed PAT conversions or 265 return yards by James Madison as the Dukes upset No. 6 ETSU, 32-27.

Fullback Brian Edwards was a bright spot for the Blue and Gold as he was named the Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week following his 142-yard performance. The Bucs finished the game with 260 yards on the ground.

JMU jumped out to a 14-0 first-quarter lead, but watched the Bucs pull within 14-12 following a Todd Wells one-yard touchdown run. The Dukes led 23-12 at halftime and 29-18 in the fourth quarter before Edwards scored on a two-yard run to pull ETSU within five. The Bucs went for the two-point conversion but were unable to find the end zone.

ETSU's defense forced JMU to go three-and-out and punt on its next possession, which allowed the Bucs to march down field and kick a field goal. Taking over at its own 23, ETSU drove it down to the Dukes' 14-yard line in eight plays, resulting in Jerry Chapman's 31-yard field goal to pull the Bucs within two with 8:16 remaining in the contest.

On the ensuing drive, JMU drove 60 yards on 12 plays with Nelson Gardner hitting a 29-yard field to give the Dukes a 32-27 lead with 3:30 left on the clock.

The Bucs took over on their own 20 yard line - and despite a 7-yard first down run by Edwards followed by a 2-yard sput - ETSU was unable to gain the one yard to keep its drive alive and turned the ball over on downs.

Carl Torbush was named head coach of the East Tennessee State University football program on June 21, 2013, and tasked with resurrecting a program that kicked off a new era of play in the fall of 2015.

In his two seasons on the field at ETSU, Torbush has posted seven wins, which includes victories over No. 18 Samford to end the 2016 season, along with season-opening wins at Kennesaw State (20-17, 20T) and versus Western Carolina (34-31) at Bristol Motor Speedway in front of a record crowd 13,863 fans. Torbush - who recorded his first win at ETSU back on Oct. 31, 2015 against Warner - went from a two-win season in 2015 to a five-win campaign in the Bucs' first season in the Southern Conference. Following a 2-0 start in 2016, the Buccaneers were receiving votes of the STATS FCS Top 25.

Torbush coached four all-Southern Conference performers in 2016 as sophomore linebacker was named second team all-conference, while defensive linemen Nasir Player and Jason Maduafokwa, along with offensive lineman Ben Blackmon earned all-freshman team honors. Weigel - who has totaled 233 tackles in his first two seasons - led all FCS players in solo tackles (79) and was named a Finalist for the STATS FCS Freshman of the Year Award.

Torbush and the Bucs enter the third year of the program in 2016 as ETSU opens its brand new on-campus stadium against Limestone on Sept. 2, 2017.

With the success on the field, Torbush's teams have excelled off the field as 75 Buccaneers have been placed on the Southern Conference Honor Roll over the last two seasons.

Torbush, whose career includes head coaching stops at North Carolina and Louisiana Tech, has built a strong reputation as an outstanding defensive strategist after having served as a defensive coordinator at six FBS programs, including Alabama, Mississippi, Mississippi State, Kansas, Texas A&M and UNC.

The most notable coaching stop on Torbush's resume was at North Carolina, where he served as defensive coordinator from 1988-97 before being promoted to head coach for three seasons (1998-2000).

While at North Carolina, Torbush's defenses led the ACC in 1995, 1996 and 1997 and he was named National Defensive Coordinator of the Year in 1996. As head coach of the Tar Heels, Torbush guided UNC to a pair of bowl wins, capturing the 1997 Gator Bowl and the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl. In total, Torbush has been a part of 11 teams that have made bowl appearances.

A 1974 graduate of Carson-Newman College, Torbush spent the 2012 season as linebackers coach at Liberty University under the direction of head coach Turner Gill. In 2010, Torbush also worked under Gill as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Kansas.

rior to joining Gill at Kansas, Torbush spent six out of the previous nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2009), Texas A&M (2003-05) and Alabama (2001-02). During each stop, Torbush had direct oversight of each program's linebacking corps.

During his time at Alabama, Torbush helped guide the Crimson Tide to a No. 3 final national ranking in total defense during 2002 and he was named SEC Assistant Coach of the Year in 2002.

Sandwiched between his three FBS defensive coordinator stops, Torbush returned to his alma mater and served as assistant head coach and linebackers coach at Carson-Newman for three seasons (2006-08). During that three-year span, Carson-Newman posted a 25-8 record, spotlighted by a 10-1 record in 2007.

Prior to his days at North Carolina, Torbush served one season as head coach at Louisiana Tech (1987).

Torbush got his coaching start at Carter High School in Knoxville in 1974 before joining Baylor's staff as a graduate assistant in 1975.

Torbush received his first full-time coaching position in 1976 at Southeastern Louisiana, where he spent four years as a linebackers and defensive ends coach (1976-79). He also served as the head baseball coach at the school from 1976 to 1979. While at Southeastern Louisiana, his teams won a Gulf South Conference Championship and he was named the league's coach of the year in 1978.

Following a three-year stint at Louisiana Tech (1980-82), Torbush was named the defensive coordinator at Mississippi for four seasons (1983-86). During his final year, the Rebels led the SEC in total defense.

During his playing days at Carson-Newman, Torbush was a letterwinner in both football and baseball, earning NAIA All-America first team honors in both sports. The success of his collegiate playing days has earned him a spot in both the Carson-Newman and Knoxville Sports Halls of Fame.

Prior to starting his football coaching career, Torbush played one year of minor league baseball in the Kansas City Royals organization (1975).

Torbush, a native of East Spencer, N.C., earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Carson-Newman in 1974. He would go on to earn a master's degree from Baylor in physical education in 1976. He and his wife, Janet, have one son, Trey.

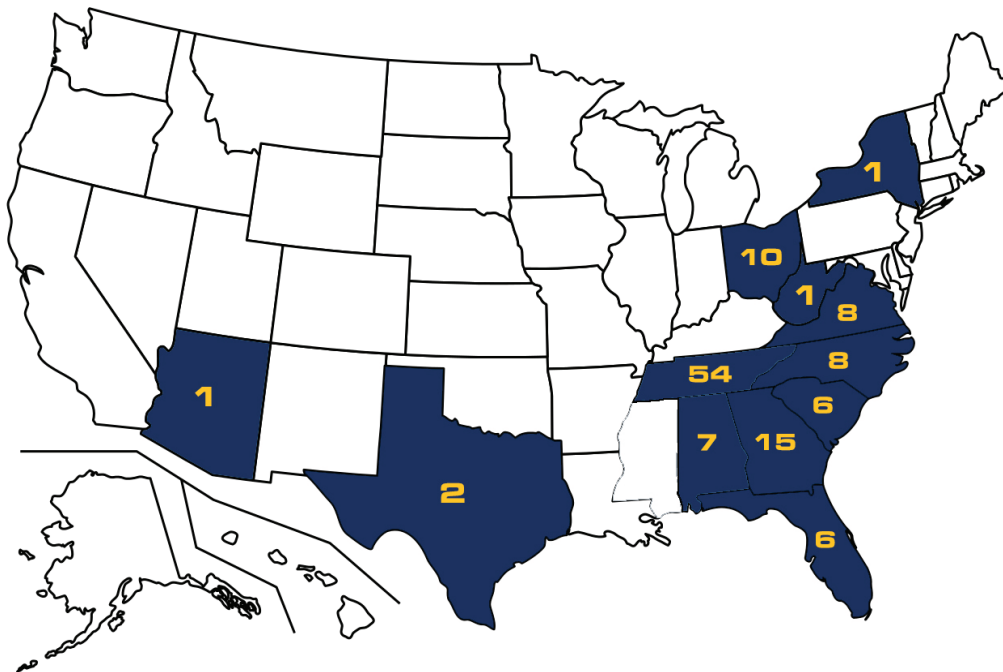

Jan. 28, 2016 -- The ETSU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics and Bristol Motor Speedway held a joint press conference on Thursday afternoon to announce they have reached an agreement to host ETSU's 2016 Southern Conference football opener at the Last Great Colosseum. The Buccaneers, who are playing a full SoCon schedule this upcoming season, will host Western Carolina on Saturday, Sept. 17.

Feb. 3, 2016 - ETSU football head coach Carl Torbush and his staff announced its 2016 signing class as the Bucs landed 23 commitments on Wednesday during National Signing Day. Ten different states are represented in the 2016 recruiting class as nine commits hail from Tennessee, four from Ohio, two from Georgia and North Carolina and one each from Alabama, Arizona, New York, Florida, Texas and Virginia. Of the 23, 12 are defensive players, eight are offensive players and three are athletes, while 15 players have a GPA above a 3.0. Furthermore, 14 commits are all-state selections, 10 played multiple sports in high school and the class consisted of 10 football state championships.

April 8, 2016 - The ETSU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced Friday that the Buccaneers have reached multi-year agreements to play FBS opponents Vanderbilt and Appalachian State starting in 2019. ETSU, which announced last February it would travel to Knoxville and take on the University of Tennessee in 2018, will play both at Vanderbilt and Appalachian State in 2019. The Bucs will then face the Commodores again in 2021 and the Mountaineers in 2024.

June 30, 2016 - The ETSU football program announced Thursday that the Buccaneers have reached an agreement to play the University of Georgia in 2020. The Buccaneers will earn a game guarantee of \$550,000, and the game will be played at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga. ETSU and Georgia have never met on the gridiron. This marks the third future Southeastern Conference opponent scheduled for the Buccaneers, as ETSU plays at Tennessee in 2018 and at Vanderbilt in 2019 and 2021. The Blue and Gold also play at FBS foe Appalachian State in 2019 and 2024.

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. (Sept. 2, 2017) – A sold out crowd was treated to a triumphant return to campus in the inaugural game at William B. Greene, Jr. Stadium on Saturday night, as the ETSU football team opened its 2017 season with a historic 31-10 win over Limestone College.

With 9,530 fans looking on, the Buccaneers played their first game on the ETSU campus since Nov. 22, 2003 and their first game outdoors on campus since Nov. 25, 1972. The moment was not lost on junior quarterback Austin Herink (Cleveland), who played an inspired game by completing his first 15 passes of the night and throwing for 239 yards in all, including three touchdowns.

The Bucs (1-0) now brace for a matchup with defending Football Championship Subdivision national champion and No. 1-ranked James Madison next Saturday at 6 p.m. in Harrisonburg, Va., The Dukes will enter the game coming off a win as well, having defeated Football Bowl Subdivision opponent East Carolina, 34-14, on Saturday. Meanwhile, Limestone heads home with a 0-1 record following the loss in Johnson City.

Along with Herink, the Bucs got a game high 88 yards rushing and a score from junior tailback Jajuan Stinson (Knoxville), while senior wide receiver Vincent Lowe had a game high five receptions for 48 yards and a touchdown. Along with Lowe, fellow wide outs Anthony Spagnoletti (Bealeton, Va.) and Andrew Heyward (Powder Springs, Ga.) each collected touchdown catches.

On the defensive side of the ball, sophomore defensive lineman Nasir Player (Columbia, S.C.) had a team and career high 10 tackles, while junior linebacker Dylan Weigel (Pickerington, Ohio) had eight stops. Senior defensive back Paul Hunter (Denton, Texas) also had a strong game with six tackles and an interception.

The Bucs outgained the Saints 379 to 222 and posted 20 first downs compared to just 13 for Limestone. For Limestone, a bright spot was quarterback Ivan Corbin, Jr., who finished with 80 yards rushing and the Saints' lone scoring run.

The Bucs are now 2-1 in season openers since reinstating the program in 2015 . . . In the previous two openers, the Bucs split contests with Kennesaw State, falling 56-16 in 2015 before avenging that loss with a 20-17 double-overtime win over the Owls in 2016 . . . Overall, the Bucs are now 40-40-3 all-time in season openers . . . Austin Herink tied a career high with three touchdown passes, as he has now accomplished the feat three times in his career . . . Herink also set a new single-game program record by completing 15 straight passes to start a game . . . The redshirt junior quarterback was 13-for-13 with 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half . . . Andrew Heyward and Anthony Spagnoletti both posted their first collegiate touchdown receptions in Saturday's 21-point win . . . Herink completed passes to eight different receivers . . . Redshirt sophomore offensive lineman Myles Smith (Chattanooga, Tenn.) got the start at right guard, marking his first collegiate start . . . Nasir Player finished with his first double-digit tackle game of his career after finishing with 10 tackles . . . The Buccaneer defense held Limestone to 2-of-15 on third down chances, while holding them to 0-of-5 on third down in the first half . . . ETSU was 4-of-9 on third down for the contest, along with going 4-of-6 in the first half . . . ETSU's defense held the Saints to 65 yards of total offense on 21 plays (49 rushing yards/16 passing yards) . . . On the flip side, the Bucs' offense generated 264 yards on 35 plays in the first half (180 yards passing/84 rushing yards) . . . Fifteen of the Bucs' 20 first downs came in the first half . . . Limestone was held to three first downs in the first 30 minutes, while the Saints totaled eight in the second half.
