DUKES HEAD TO UPSTATE NEW YORK FOR SECOND ROUND

- JMU continues postseason play on Saturday afternoon when it flies to Hamilton, N.Y. to face No. 8 seed Colgate in the second round of the 2018 NCAA FCS Playoffs.
- Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. and will be streamed live on ESPN3 and Watch ESPN. Pregame coverage on the JMU Sprint Broadcast Network begins at noon.
- Saturday marks the second meeting all-time, with Colgate winning the only previous meeting. On Dec. 5, 2015, the Raiders won 44-38 in Harrisonburg in the second round of the 2015 playoffs.

JMU IN THE POSTSEASON

- JMU is making 15th FCS playoff appearance in 2018, which includes a program-record fifth straight berth.
- The Dukes are 17-12 in the playoffs with a pair of national championships - 2004 and 2016. They also advanced to the title game in 2017, falling just short (17-13 vs. North Dakota State).
- JMU has won multiple playoff games in four postseason trips, going 4-0 in both national title runs and 3-1 in last year's playoff and 2-1 in 2008 when it reached the semifinals.
- The Dukes are 6-7 in true road games in the playoffs, while also posting a 9-4 home record and 2-1 mark in neutral-site matchups.

DEFENSE SHUTS DOWN DELAWARE IN OPENING-ROUND WIN

- JMU held Delaware to 185 total yards and a pair of field goals to grind out a 20-6 victory in the first round.
- The Dukes allowed just 69 rushing yards (2.8 per carry) and UD converted just 2-of-14 third-down attempts.
- The defense registered five sacks and 10 tackles for loss, with a pair of fourth-quarter interceptions.
- JMU limited the Hens to 52 yards in the first half and took a 12-3 halftime lead after getting a touchdown from Marcus Marshall, while adding a safety and field goal.
- After UD made it a 12-6 game, JMU answered with a 13-play drive, capped off by a Ben DiNucci touchdown pass to Jake Brown. JMU converted the two-point try on a pass from DiNucci to Dylan Stapleton to extend the lead to 20-6 in the third, completing the game's scoring.
- In the fourth, JMU forced two turnovers on downs and interceptions by Charles Tutt and Wayne Davis sealed the win, which extended JMU's home playoff win streak to six games.

SCOUTING COLGATE

- The Raiders completed the regular season with a 9-1 overall record and won the Patriot League championship outright to earn the No. 8 overall seed for the NCAA FCS Playoffs.
- This marks Colgate's first home playoff game since 2003, the year they finished runner-up for the national championship.
- It's also the program's 11th appearance in the playoffs, as it seeks its fourth berth in the quarterfinals.
- Colgate has posted five shutouts and leads the FCS in scoring defense, at 5.7 points per game.
- It has not trailed in a game this year vs. a FCS opponent and has outscored those foes 67-0 in the first quarter and 195-9 in the first half.
- The Raiders rank second nationally in pass defense (124.6) and third in rush defense (77.1) to lead the country in total defense (201.7).
- James Holland Jr. was voted the Patriot Offensive Player of the Year and T.J. Holl was Defensive Player of the Year.
- Dan Hunt is in his fifth season at the helm, where he's 35-22 as head coach at Colgate. He's won three Patriot League Coach of the Year honors and has been a part of the coaching staff since 1995.

RECAPING LAST JMU-CU MEETING

- JMU and Colgate's only other meeting came on Dec. 5, 2015, with the Raiders winning 44-38 in the NCAA Second Round.
- Colgate scored the go-ahead touchdown with 9:15 remaining in the fourth quarter and the defense kept JMU out of the end zone deep in the red zone to secure the win.
- James Holland Jr. and Jake Melville combined for 328 rushing yards and five total touchdowns to lead Colgate.
- Bryan Schor threw for 141 yards and two touchdowns, both of which went to Rashard Davis. Khalid Abdullah ran for 73 yards and a score and Schor added a rushing TD.

FAMILIARITY IN TOP LEFT OF BRACKET

- JMU played its second postseason game against Delaware last Saturday, improving to 2-0 against the Hens in the playoffs.
- Aside from this weekend being a rematch of the 2015 FCS Second Round, JMU is a win away from a potential national championship rematch.
- A win by the Dukes and for North Dakota State would pit last year's finalists in the quarterfinal in Fargo, N.D.
- It would mark the fourth different round the teams have faced as NDSU won the 2011 Second Round and 2017 national title, while JMU claimed the 2016 semifinal.

DUKES ONE OF TWO CAA TEAMS LEFT

- The CAA placed a FCS-record six teams in the tournament, but with five times playing on the opening weekend, only one advanced (JMU) as the league went a collective 1-4.
- Aside from JMU besting Delaware, Elon fell at Wofford, Towson dropped a home decision to Duquesne and Stony Brook lost at SEMO.
- JMU and Maine are the lone two CAA teams remaining as JMU faces Colgate on the road and No. 7 seed Maine hosts Jacksonville State.

INT FOUR YEARS IN THE MAKING

- In the fourth quarter of JMU's win over Delaware, Charles Tutt intercepted his first career pass, ending his four-year wait for his first pick.
- Tutt also had a career-high three pass breakups.

RATKE RETURNS, TIES SEASON MARK

- Ethan Ratke kicked his first field goal since week seven last week, knocking down his 15th kick of the season.
- That ties him with Cameron Starke (2011), John Coursey (1994) and Scott Norwood (1980) for most field goals in JMU single-season history.
- Ratke is 15-of-17 for the season and is tied for sixth all-time at JMU with 29 career field goals. That is matched by senior kicker Tyler Gray.

DAKA WITH THE SAKA

- Over the past two weeks, John Daka has emerged as one of the league's top threats up front, registering two sacks against both Towson and Delaware.
- He now leads the team with 8.5 sacks this season, which is tied for third in the CAA.
- He has a TFL in each of the past 10 games and a sack in the past four.

MORELAND HEADLINES ALL-CAA TEAM

- Jimmy Moreland was named 2018 CAA Defensive Player of the Year in a vote by the league's 12 head coaches.
- A Buck Buchanan Award finalist, he leads the CAA with five interceptions, which is also seventh nationally.
- Moreland set the program and CAA record with three interceptions for a touchdown in a season and has tallied a JMU single-season record 217 interception return yards.

- JMU has produced one former winner of the CFPA National Player of the Year. Bryan Schor won the trophy back in 2016 after leading JMU to the program's second national championship.
- The goal of the CFPA awards is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

CARDON A COMEBACK PLAYER NOMINEE

- Cardon Johnson was selected as a Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award nominee.
- He is one of 30 nominees eligible for the award, which recognizes a player for has overcome injury, illness or other challenges and returned to the gridiron in 2018.
- Johnson received a sixth year of eligibility after suffering a season-ending Achilles injury for the

second straight season in 2017. He was also injured in the spring of 2014, which forced him to miss the entire 2014 season.

- Despite his setbacks, Johnson rushed for 1,037 yards and 10 touchdowns in 2015.
- He ranks ninth all-time in rushing yards and total touchdowns and tied for 10th in rushing touchdowns.
- The three winners will be honored at the 2019 Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz.

SENIORS SENT OFF RIGHT WAY

- Last Saturday marked the final regular-season home game for JMU's 11 seniors.
- With the win, the group is now 44-8 since the start of the 2015 season.
- In 29 career games at home, the senior Dukes have gone 26-3 over the past four seasons at Bridgeforth Stadium.

AMOS EARNS NATIONAL AWARD

- D'Angelo Amos not only earned CAA Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Villanova but was also tabbed National Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Amos had two punt returns for a score over a span of 2:10 in the third, scoring from 89 and 81 yards, respectively.
- He tied Gary Clark for three JMU records in the process, as the duo are the only players to ever have two punt return TDs in the same game.
- Amos also matched Clark with 183 punt return yards, which was also a CAA record, and his 89 yarder was tied for the longest return at JMU.

RATKE SETS SINGLE-GAME FG RECORD

- Ethan Ratke converted all four field-goal attempts to set the JMU single-game record.
- He hit from 35, 32, 39 and 35 to break the record of three set many times.
- Ratke now ranks sixth all-time at JMU with 28 career field goals.
- JMU also made four field goals as a team just once, as Ratke and Tyler Gray each made two last season at William & Mary.

MORELAND SETS FOUR RECORDS AT UR

- Jimmy Moreland set four records in the Richmond win.
- Leading 14-3, Moreland intercepted a pass at the goal line and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown to make it a 21-3 ballgame.
- It was Moreland's sixth career pick-six and defensive touchdown, becoming the first JMU defender to score six touchdowns.
- He now has 318 interception return yards, surpassing Raven Greene for the all-time record.
- Moreland's 100-yard return matched the longest touchdown in school history, as it was the school's second 100-yard pick-six.
- Moreland also holds the single-season record for pick-sixes, with three.
- He is currently one interception for a TD shy of the FCS single-season (4) and career (7) records.

HISTORY MADE ON THE ROAD AT UR

- JMU registered its second 50-point win on the road in school history, as the Dukes' 53-point win set the single-game record for largest margin of victory away from home.
- The 63 points were also as road-game record.
- The Dukes also set records in the series with Richmond for most points scored (63) and

largest win (+53).

- The previous record for largest win came against Elon, when JMU topped the Phoenix 51-0 on Oct. 17, 2015.
- JMU also set a three-game scoring record, having tallied 187 points the last three weeks.

ETHERIDGE CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIS

- Hunter Etheridge is one of 179 semifinalists across all divisions nationwide for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy®.
- The Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete.
- Etheridge holds a 3.608 GPA and will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.
- He has twice been an NCAA Elite 90 nominee at the NCAA Division I national championship and earned a spot on the President's or Dean's List every semester as a student-athlete.
- The National Football Foundation will announce 12 to 14 finalists on Oct. 31 and each will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 50th NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class.
- The winner of the Campbell Trophy receives a \$25,000 scholarship for graduate school.

ONE OF THE BEST SHUTOUTS VS. TRIBE

- JMU's 51-0 win over William & Mary was tied for second-biggest margin (Elon - 2015) all-time in a shutout victory.
- It was just shy of a 2008 win over Hofstra - 56-0.

JMU AGAINST COMMONWEALTH FOES

- The Dukes have faced 15 teams from the Commonwealth since beginning their football program in 1972.
- In 148 games, JMU has racked up an 87-61 record against teams from around the state.
- The Dukes have played William & Mary (24-17) more than any other state team, at 41 games, and have faced Richmond (18-18) 36 times and Liberty (12-6) on 18 occasions.

#NFLDUKES - JMU TIED FOR FCS LEAD

Mike Houston was hired as James Madison University's seventh head football coach on January 18, 2016.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has guided the Dukes to a 28-2 overall record, with back-to-back 14-1 seasons in 2016 and 2017. The 14 wins set a program record for single-season victories. JMU set a CAA- and program-record 26-game win streak between the two seasons, which ranks second all-time in FCS history.

In his first season, Houston and the Dukes won the NCAA Division I Football Championship with a 28-14 win against Youngstown State. JMU made a return trip to the national title game in 2017, falling 17-13 to North Dakota State.

In year two at JMU, Houston led the team to its first-ever undefeated and untied regular season, going 11-0, which included its second straight 8-0 Colonial Athletic Association record to earn a second straight outright championship and a program-record third consecutive CAA title. The Dukes earned the No. 1 seed for the FCS Playoffs for just the second time and earned home playoff wins against Stony Brook (26-7), Weber State (31-28) and South Dakota State (51-16) before falling in the title game to NDSU.

The Dukes led the country in scoring defense, holding teams to just 11.1 points per game. They also paced the FCS in interceptions (31), takeaways (44) and team pass efficiency defense (83.12 rating).

JMU ranked in the top 10 nationally in 14 categories, as it was also third in total defense (252.0), turnover margin (1.47), defensive touchdowns (5) and first downs (325), fourth in punt-return defense (3.33), fifth in sacks (3.4), seventh in rushing defense (90.5), eighth in fumble recoveries (13), ninth in completion percentage (64.9%) and net punting (38.77) and 10th in passing defense (161.5), third-down defense (30.1%), punt-return average (13.0) and blocked punts (2).

Eight players were voted All-Americans in 2017, including Andrew Ankrh, who was named a Consensus All-American after being tabbed to six different All-America First Teams. Ankrh won the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year award and finished third for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award.

Joining Ankrh on the All-America list were Aaron Stinnie, Jordan Brown, Rashad Robinson, Raven Greene, Kyré Hawkins, Jaheé Jackson and Harry O'Kelly. The Dukes also had 16 All-CAA honorees, which included three players garnering top-league awards. Ankrh was voted Defensive Player of the Year, John Miller tabbed Special Teams Player of the Year and Bryan Schor became JMU's first winner of the Chuck Boone Leadership and Excellence Award.

HEAD COACH MIKE HOUSTON

Following the season, Houston was voted state coach of the year from three organizations. He was voted Touchdown Club of Richmond Bobby Ross Coach of the Year, Virginia Sports Information Directors University Division Coach of the Year and the J. Roy Rodman Award from the Norfolk Sports Club, marking the second straight season he garnered each award. The team was also presented with its second straight ECAC Lambert FCS Division Cup.

JMU finished the 2016 season with a 14-1 record, setting a program record for wins. The Dukes won their final 12 games to end the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I. During the regular season, Houston led JMU to a perfect 8-0 mark in Colonial Athletic Association play to clinch the outright conference title. It was the second time the Dukes went unbeaten in league play and won the CAA outright.

After going 10-1 in the regular season, JMU earned the No. 4 seed for the FCS playoffs and a first-round bye. The Dukes notched convincing victories at home against New Hampshire (55-22) and previously-unbeaten Sam Houston State (65-7) before conquering five-time defending national champion North Dakota State (27-17) in the national semifinals in Fargo, N.D. The win at NDSU ended the Bison's 22-game playoff win streak and a string of 18 straight home playoff wins.

On Jan. 7, 2017, JMU completed its title run with a 28-14 triumph against Youngstown State in the national championship game at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Khalid Abdullah was named the Most Outstanding Player for the championship, and the Dukes limited a strong run team in YSU to only 21 rushing yards in the win.

Houston reeled in numerous accolades in 2016, as he was named the American Football Coaches Association FCS National Coach of the Year. He also earned AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second straight year and was voted Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year, marking the fifth time in his six-year head coaching career that he was tabbed his conference's top coach. Houston reeled in a trio of state coach of the year accolades, as he was named the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year, voted VaSID Coach of the Year and was presented the J. Roy Rodman Award. He was also presented with the Bob Ford FCS Coach of the Year from the Metro New York Football Writers and the Washington Metro College Coach of the Year from the DC Touchdown Club.

He coached 14 players to All-CAA status, which included Bryan Schor being named CAA Offensive Player of the Year and Rashard Davis being recognized as CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. JMU had 10 of those 14 make the All-CAA First Team, while seven of the 14 eventually became All-Americans. That list included Abdullah, Schor, Davis, Raven Greene, Mitchell Kirsch, Taylor Reynolds and Aaron Stinnie.

JMU set several conference records, including marks for scoring (700), rushing offense (4,125), total offense (7,612) and first downs (380). Nationally, JMU led the FCS in winning percentage (93.3%), completion percentage (70.8%), team pass efficiency (181.69), first downs (380), defensive interceptions (21) and punt return average (26.65).

The Dukes also ranked second in scoring (46.7), fourth in third down conversions (50%), fifth in both rushing (275.0) and turnovers gained (30), sixth in fumbles lost (4), eighth in turnover margin (1.13) and 10th in turnovers lost (13). Offensively, JMU produced 18 100-yard rushing performances from its strong rushing attack, including Abdullah, who had a team-high 11 games with more than 100 yards.

Defensively, JMU saw a drastic improvement from the previous two seasons, as it ranked 17th in scoring defense (21.2) and 30th in total defense (344.3). The Dukes allowed 7.5 fewer points per game this season and nearly 60 yards fewer per

outing from 2015 to 2016. JMU forced seven more turnovers and nearly doubled its interception production, going from 11 in 2015 to a nation-leading 21 in 2016.

During conference play, JMU completed its road gauntlet with victories at Maine, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova. Those four teams finished second through fifth in the CAA standings and three made the postseason in UNH, UR and VU. It was JMU's first win at New Hampshire since 2006 and the first at Villanova since 2008.

Possessing 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five as a head coach, Houston came to Harrisonburg after serving two years as head coach at The Citadel (2014-15). He led the Bulldogs to a 14-11 record in his two seasons and is the only coach in The Citadel's history to win a Southern Conference championship within his first two seasons.

In 2015, he guided the Bulldogs to the program's fourth winning season since 1995 with a 9-4 record and a share of the 2015 SoCon title. The Citadel boasted a conference-best +117 scoring margin, including a +100 edge during league play, and Houston went on to be named SoCon Coach of the Year and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year. They also defeated Southeastern Conference member South Carolina 23-22 in the regular-season finale and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs after upsetting ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

In the first-round playoff victory, Houston's run game broke a school record with four 100-yard rushers as it piled up 524 yards on the ground, the most in a NCAA playoff game since 2012 and the second-highest in 2015 for FCS, only behind the Bulldogs' nation-best 535 rushing yards in the season opener.

The Citadel broke school records for all-purpose yards, total offense, rushing yards and interception return yards. The Bulldogs led the nation with a school-record 515 interception return yards and five interception return touchdowns. The Citadel led the Southern and ranked second nationally with 346.9 rushing yards per game, an average of 17.21 yards per completion and just 0.62 sacks allowed per game.

The Bulldogs also led the league in interceptions, tackles for loss allowed, turnovers forced, yards per rush, rushing touchdowns, punt return defense, passing touchdowns allowed, fumble recoveries, third-down defense, tackles for loss and kickoff return defense.

Prior to The Citadel, Houston was head coach at Lenoir-Rhyne, an NCAA Division II school in the South Atlantic Conference, for three seasons. He accumulated a 29-8 record at the helm and directed the Bears to three consecutive SAC championships, a stretch that included a school-record 13 wins in his final year.

Houston was named SAC Coach of the Year each season and was also the Don Hansen Super Region II Coach of the Year in 2013. In his final season at LRU, the Bears advanced to the Division II national championship game and ranked No. 2 in the final polls.

Before his elevation to head coach, Houston served as Lenoir-Rhyne's defensive coordinator and secondary coach from 2007-10. He spent the 2006 year as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Brevard College.

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill University, where he played tight end for the Lions and earned a bachelor's degree in biology. In 2014, Houston was inducted into the Franklin High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He is married to the former Amanda Owen and they have two sons, Owen Michael and Reid Wilson.

Dukes Drop Opener, 24-13, at NC State

RALEIGH, N.C. – Second-ranked James Madison scored the game's first touchdown and limited NC State to only 2.9 yards per rush, but a 17-point spurt in the second quarter gave way for a 24-13 Wolfpack win on Saturday afternoon at Carter-Finley Stadium.

NCSU improved to 1-0 on the young season while the Dukes fell to 0-1, marking their first season-opening loss since the 2014 campaign at Maryland.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU passed for 202 yards, 197 of which came from junior Ben DiNucci, who also threw a touchdown pass in his debut with the Dukes.
- DiNucci also led JMU in rushing, going for 79 yards, which included a game-long 24-yard run
- Redshirt junior Riley Stapleton led the team with a career-high nine catches for 88 yards and a touchdown, which put JMU up 7-0 late in the first.
- Senior Marcus Marshall ran for 65 yards, including a long of 26 yards, while playing against his hometown team.
- The Wolfpack overcame the early deficit with three scoring plays in the second quarter, with a field goal and two passing touchdowns by Ryan Finley – the latter coming with only 18 seconds to go in the first half.
- Redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke cut into NC State's lead with a pair of second-half field goals – both from 19 yards out – to make it 17-13 with 6:59 to play.
- NCSU answered with an 84-yard drive over 11 plays, capped off by a rushing touchdown by Reggie Gallaspy with just over a minute to go.

STARTING ON A HIGH

- Three receivers – redshirt junior Mack Cullen and redshirt freshmen Josh Sims and Kyndel Dean – all made their first career catches. Sims was second for JMU with four catches for 32 yards and Cullen and Dean each reeled in a pair of passes.
- Junior Adam Smith led the Dukes with a career-high 10 tackles (7 solo) in his first start at safety, while four others produced at least seven stops.
- Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter paced the defense up front, with career bests of seven tackles and three tackles-for-loss. He also added the team's lone sack.
- Redshirt junior Dimitri Holloway tallied nine tackles and a forced fumble in his first game since last year's opener, and redshirt freshman KeShaun Moore put together a career-high eight stops and a tackle for loss in his first career game.
- Redshirt sophomore D'Angelo Amos also registered a career-high seven tackles at safety while adding a breakup.
- Also making his first start at defensive line, sophomore Mike Greene recovered a fumble in the first quarter off the Holloway force.
- Freshman Mateo Jackson came off the bench to record five stops in his first career outing.

DINUCCI EFFICIENT IN START

- DiNucci completed a career-best 23 passes on 27 attempts (85.2%) with a touchdown after earning the starting job for the Dukes.
- He completed his first 15 passes of the game and also ran the ball 14 times – a career high.
- His 197 passing yards was 31 shy of his career high from last season's game against Oklahoma State when he played at Pitt.
- DiNucci was only four yards off his career mark in rushing – he had 83 last season against North Carolina.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- JMU, playing in its 47th year, is now 25-21-1 all-time in season openers.
- The Dukes nearly doubled NC State in the run game, out-rushing the Pack 163-83.
- NCSU had 25 first downs, to JMU's 23, and held a 392-365 total yards advantage
- Finley threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns, and Jakobi Meyers had a huge receiving game, with 14 catches for 161 yards. CJ Riley and Thayer Thomas each caught second-quarter touchdowns.
- The teams were even in yards per play, at 5.4 per snap.
- JMU won the time-of-possession battle, with the offense on the field for 31:42, and each team forced one turnover, later resulting in a touchdown.

JMU Claims 17-0 Victory in Lightning-Shortened Game at NSU

NORFOLK, Va. – Multiple lightning delays and three scoring drives in the first quarter is all that was in store for second-ranked James Madison, as the Dukes claimed a 17-0 victory at Norfolk State after the teams agreed to end the game following lengthy weather delays on Saturday night at William “Dick” Price Stadium.

The Dukes evened their record to 1-1 on the year, while the Spartans fell to 1-1. JMU is now 2-0 all-time against NSU with wins in consecutive seasons. It's the second straight season the Dukes registered a shutout win, as it beat New Hampshire 21-0 on Oct. 28, 2017.

QUICK SUMMARY

- The Dukes opened the game's scoring on their opening drive on a 5-yard touchdown run by redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci.
- The drive, which spanned 8 plays, 69 yards and only 2:37 of action, was highlighted by DiNucci's 56-yard run during the drive.
- Two plays later, redshirt senior cornerback Jimmy Moreland tied JMU's all-time interceptions record with his 14th career pick on a deep pass.
- With 4:24 to play in the quarter, redshirt sophomore returner D'Angelo Amos returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown, marking the second straight year he records a punt for a score.
- Redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke added a 28-yard field goal with 36 seconds to play.

WEATHER NOT COOPERATING

- JMU and Norfolk State sat through numerous delays before being able to kick off Saturday night.
- Lightning forced a 90-minute delay to start the game, with the opening kick coming at 7:35.
- At 8:20, the game was delayed again until the teams agreed to end the game 50 minutes later.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- DiNucci registered his second career rushing touchdown and his first in a JMU uniform, as he led the team in rushing for the second straight week with four carries for 67 yards (16.8 per carry).
- Moreland is now tied with former JMU safety Raven Greene with 14 career interceptions after his first-quarter pick.
- Amos averaged 51.5 yards per return, as he added a 27-yard punt return after his 76 yarder.
- The Dukes came out on top despite the Spartans maintaining possession for 9:04 during the 15 minutes of play.
- JMU out-gained Norfolk State 118 to 29 in the game, including 106 to 24 on the ground.

Dukes Cruise Past Robert Morris 73-7 in Home Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Second-ranked James Madison exploded for 52 first-half points and gained more than 650 yards of offense en route to a decisive 73-7 home-opening victory against Robert Morris on Thursday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 2-1, utilizing 11 scoring drives to catapult past the Colonials, who fell to 1-2 on the year.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci accounted for a career-high five total first downs in the first half alone, with three passing and two rushing. He was 14-of-17 for 184 yards and ran for 39 yards on seven carries.
- A JMU record was set Thursday night, as redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland picked off a pass and ran it back 20 yards for a touchdown. It was Moreland's 15th career interception, surpassing Raven Greene, who had 14. Ironically, both Moreland and Greene set the interceptions record with a pick-six.
- JMU rushed for 386 yards as a team, with five players accounting for at least 40 yards. Senior Marcus Marshall led the way with six carries for 95 yards (15.8 avg.) and a touchdown, while also making a 39-yard touchdown reception to open the scoring. His 81-yard scamper to open the second-half scoring was the second-longest run of his career and tied for 10th longest in school history.
- Sophomore Percy Agyei-Obese had five rushes for 93 yards (18.6 avg.), which included an 80-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Also finding the end zone on the ground were redshirt sophomores Jawon Hamilton and Eric Kirlew – their first career scores with the Dukes.
- Redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton reeled in a game-high seven receptions for 67 yards and a score, which was one better than the entire RMU team, which had six catches. Redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean also scored his first career touchdown on a 15-yard catch in the first.
- The Dukes scored on 10 of their 11 first drives to take a commanding 66-0 lead in the third quarter. JMU's 66-point win was the fifth largest in school history.
- In addition to Moreland's interception, two players recorded their first career interceptions, as junior safety Adam Smith tallied his in the second and freshman defensive lineman Drew Painter came up with his first late in the fourth.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- Following a stellar first half, JMU led in both rushing yards (207-42) and passing yards (184-40).
- With 52 first-half points, JMU tied the program record for most points in a half. The previous record was set against Morehead State in the 2016 season opener.
- JMU's 73 is the most points ever allowed by Robert Morris and the fifth-most ever produced by the Dukes.
- Five Dukes ran in touchdowns in tonight's victory, while eight total players made it to the end zone.
- Head Coach Mike Houston has now led JMU to four of its five top-scoring performances since his hire before the 2016 season.
- JMU outgained RMU in total offense by a margin of 667 to 223.
- The Dukes successfully completed their first fourth down conversion of the season – the lone conversion of the night.
- JMU had three interceptions, spanning 43 yards on returns, while RMU did not produce a single interception. RMU's lone takeaway came on a fourth-quarter fumble.

Defense Powers #2 JMU to 51-0 Win Over W&M in CAA Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – No. 2 James Madison used an excellent defensive performance and a three-touchdown third quarter to blow past William & Mary, 51-0, in Colonial Athletic Association football on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (3-1, 1-0 CAA) won their 19th straight home game, which leads all of the FCS, and also claimed their 19th consecutive conference victory, extending the CAA record. The Tribe (1-2, 0-1 CAA) dropped their second straight outing, as JMU turned in the biggest win in the 41-game series.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU turned in its second shutout in three weeks, and the first in the series versus William & Mary. It was tied for the second-highest shutout win in school history, falling just short of its 56-0 romp of Hofstra in 2008.
- The Dukes forced four turnovers in the game, with a pair of interceptions for a touchdown and two fumble recoveries. Redshirt senior cornerback Jimmy Moreland had a 56-yard pick-six for his 16th career interception and fifth defensive touchdown, and junior linebacker Bryce Maginley had 24-yard pick-six late in the game for his first career interception.
- Redshirt sophomore safety D'Angelo Amos tallied both fumble recoveries for a new career high.
- JMU allowed the visitors to reach the first-down marker just once on third down, holding the Tribe to a 1-for-15 conversion rate.
- The Dukes out-gained W&M 444-132, including a 247-55 advantage in the run game.
- For the first time in school history, siblings scored a touchdown in the same game for the Dukes, as redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton and junior tight end Dylan Stapleton each found the end zone. R. Stapleton had a game-high eight catches for 78 yards, while D. Stapleton made three grabs for 20 yards. D. Stapleton struck first, opening the scoring on a 5-yard reception late in the first quarter, and R. Stapleton opened the second half with an 11-yard TD to make it 24-0 at that point.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 17-of-23 for 160 yards and two touchdowns with an interception.
- Graduate student running back Cardon Johnson led the ground game with 83 yards, while senior Marcus Marshall gained 65 yards with a touchdown. Senior Trai Sharp also added 42 rushing yards and a score.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway led the team with nine tackles (1.0 for a loss) and a forced fumble, and Moreland made five stops (1.0 for a loss) and his interception for a score. Junior defensive linemen Ron'Dell Carter and Matt Terrell each had 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack in the win. In the kicking game, redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke matched the program record with three made field goals, marking the 17th time in school history the Dukes had a player with three makes in a game.

ADDITIONAL GAME NOTES

- With 25,130 fans in attendance, this was the eighth largest attendance in Bridgeforth Stadium history.
- For the second time since 2015, JMU scored over 50 points in a shutout. Today's score matched JMU's win back on Oct. 17, 2015, when the Dukes beat Elon 51-0 on the road.
- This was JMU's biggest win over the Tribe, besting the 46-14 win last season, and was the biggest margin of victory by either team in the series, besting W&M's 33-0 win back in 1979.
- W&M did not convert a third down until late in the second half, going 0-for-12 to start.
- Of JMU's seven offensive scoring drives, it had great field position, needing to go over 50 yards on just two of them. JMU's average starting field position was on the positive side of the field, at the William & Mary 49.
- On the flip side, the Tribe had a starting field position average of its own 21.

#2 JMU Blasts Richmond in Largest Road Win Ever

RICHMOND, Va. – Second-ranked James Madison turned in the biggest road win in school history, amassing 543 yards of offense along with five takeaways in a 63-10 triumph over Richmond on Saturday afternoon at Robins Stadium.

The Dukes improve to 4-1 on the year and 2-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Spiders fall to 2-3 and 0-2. It was JMU's biggest win in the 36-game history against the Spiders, as it registered its third straight win at UR.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 19-of-26 for 248 yards and three touchdowns with an interception.
- The Dukes averaged 5.3 yards per carry, rushing for 200 yards, led by senior running back Marcus Marshall, who had 99 yards and two scores on just 10 carries. Marshall had a game-long run of 55 yards on his second touchdown, and senior Trai Sharp, who gained 62 yards, had a long of 45.
- JMU scored in all three phases Saturday, as redshirt sophomore receiver Jawon Hamilton took the opening kickoff 93 yards for his first career return for a score. The Dukes forced five turnovers, including a 100-yard interception for a touchdown by redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland, who set the JMU all-time record with his sixth defensive touchdown.
- Three receivers had over 80 receiving yards, led by redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean, who finished with career highs of five catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns.
- Redshirt junior Riley Stapleton had a game-high six catches for 98 yards and a score and redshirt sophomore Jake Brown made two catches for a career-high 91 yards and a touchdown – the first of his JMU career.
- Defensively, junior defensive lineman John Daka registered a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss with a sack and forced fumble while tallying five tackles.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway had 11 tackles including a half tackle for loss. Junior safety Adam Smith and redshirt sophomore safety Wayne Davis each recorded interceptions, as Smith tacked on seven tackles and Davis contributed four stops, a tackle for loss and two pass breakups.
- Also making a sack each on the defensive line were sophomore Mike Greene, redshirt senior Darrious Carter and redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Dukes scored four touchdowns in the second and three in the third to pull away for their third straight win while scoring at least 50 points.
- JMU out-gained Richmond 543-337, which including a 200-83 margin in the run game and a season-best 343 passing yards, as opposed to UR's 256.
- JMU had a plus-4 turnover margin, making three interceptions with a pair of fumble recoveries. The Dukes also had four sacks in the win.
- JMU has scored at least 47 points in each of its last three road matchups against Richmond, averaging 55.0 points per game.
- The Dukes and Spiders are now tied at 18-18 through 36 meetings, as JMU is now 10-8 all-time in Richmond.

DEFENSE EQUALS OFFENSE

- JMU forced five turnovers, resulting in 21 points against the Spiders.
- The Dukes tallied three interceptions, a strip sack resulting in a fumble recovery and another recovery on a kickoff return.
- Jimmy Moreland turned in his third straight game with a touchdown, with a 100-yard pick-six in the second quarter.
- JMU scored back-to-back offensive possessions with touchdowns off fumble recoveries, as John Daka had a strip sack and sophomore running back Percy Agyei-Obese had a force and a recovery on the ensuing kickoff.
- In all, the JMU defense racked up four sacks, 10 tackles for loss, three interceptions, five pass break-ups and three forced fumbles, holding Richmond to 55 yards in the second half.

Last-Minute Touchdown Lifts #10 Elon Past #2 JMU, 27-24

HARRISONBURG, Va. – A Davis Cheek 15-yard touchdown pass to Avery Jones with 1:17 to play sent 10th-ranked Elon past No. 2 James Madison 27-24 in Colonial Athletic Association football action on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes fell to 4-2 on the year and 2-1 in CAA play, while the Phoenix improved to 4-1 and 2-0. The loss snapped JMU's 20-game conference win streak and 19-game home win streak. It was also Elon's first win in the seven-game series history.

The game was seen in front of 25,484 spectators, which was the fourth-largest crowd in Bridgeforth history.

A WILD FOURTH QUARTER

- Elon trailed 12-10 before a Skyler Davis 33-yard field goal gave them the lead early in the fourth, and a Malcolm Summers 59-yard touchdown rush put the Phoenix ahead 20-12 with 11:26 to play.
- Quarterback Ben DiNucci completed a 47-yard pass to receiver Riley Stapleton, setting up a Trai Sharp six-yard touchdown run with 9:39 to go. JMU trailed 20-18 after a failed two-point conversion.
- After a defensive stop, DiNucci went to the air again, connecting with receiver Kyndel Dean for a 39-yard gain. Two plays later, DiNucci found Stapleton in the end zone for a 10-yard score, giving the Dukes the lead back at 24-20 with 7:22 to go.
- JMU stopped Elon, but a fumble gave the visitors the ball back on its own 26 with 4:16 to play. Elon proceeded to go on a 10-play, 74-yard drive, which was capped off by Cheek's touchdown toss to Jones.
- On the ensuing drive, DiNucci was intercepted by Connor Christiansen to seal the game.

QUICK STATS SUMMARY

- DiNucci finished 24-of-41 for a career-high 316 yards and a touchdown. His completion total and attempts were also single-game highs.
- Stapleton led all players with seven receptions for 99 yards and a touchdown. Receiver Kyndel Dean set new career highs for the second straight week, with six catches for 96 yards, including a career-long 39 yarder.
- Kicker Ethan Ratke set the program record for field goals in a game, with four. It was the third time in his career he had made three or more.
- Defensively, linebacker Dimitri Holloway paced the unit with a season-best 12 tackles, marking the fourth time this season he's had nine or more.
- Safety D'Angelo Amos had nine stops and a tackle for loss, to go with a 27-yard punt return, and linebacker KeShaun Moore made six tackles while recording his first career sack.
- For Elon, Cheek threw for 286 yards and a touchdown, and Summers led the game with 186 rushing yards and a score. Corey Joyner led the game with 109 receiving yards, including a long of 51.
- Zack Monson led the Phoenix defense with 12 tackles, including 2.0 for loss and 1.5 sacks. Matt Baker and Warren Messer each had 4.0 tackles for loss, combining for 3.0 sacks.

END ZONE TOUGH TO FIND THROUGH THREE QUARTERS

- After three quarters, JMU and Elon had combined for five field goals and just one touchdown. The Dukes led 12-10, before the teams produced a 29-point fourth quarter.
- At the break, JMU led 9-7, and it was the first time the Dukes were held out of the end zone in a first half since last season's national championship game.
- It was also the first time since Sept. 14, 2013 against St. Francis (Pa.) that the Dukes failed to score a first-half touchdown.

Dukes Dominate All Three Phases in 37-0 Shutout Win at Villanova

Villanova, Pa. – Sixth-ranked James Madison used two punt return touchdowns from redshirt sophomore D'Angelo Amos and its second four-quarter shutout of the season to race past Villanova 37-0 in Colonial Athletic Association Football action on Saturday afternoon at Villanova Stadium.

JMU improves to 5-2 on the year and 3-1 in CAA play, while Villanova falls to 3-4 and 0-4. It was the second-largest victory against the Wildcats and the second time JMU has shutout VU, joining a 17-0 win on the road in 2004. It also marked JMU's fourth straight win in the series.

It was JMU's 13th straight true road win against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Amos tied JMU single-season records for punt return touchdowns (2), longest punt return (89) and total punt return yards (183), as he matched JMU Hall of Famer Gary Clark, who accomplished each of these stat lines back on Sept. 17, 1983 at Virginia.
- Redshirt sophomore receiver Jake Brown hauled in a career-high eight receptions for 72 yards, while redshirt junior Riley Stapleton and redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean each tallied three catches on the afternoon.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 21-of-31 for 171 passing yards while also scoring a one-yard rushing touchdown late in the fourth quarter.
- On the ground, senior running back Trai Sharp rushed for 62 yards and graduate running back Cardon Johnson added 46.
- For the third time in the last four weeks, redshirt sophomore kicker Ethan Ratke converted at least three field goals, going 3-for-3, as he's now tied for fourth in JMU single-season history with 14. It also matches his 2017 total and he's one shy of tying the single-season mark.
- JMU's defense registered season highs of 13.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks, as the Dukes held Villanova to 157 total yards. VU also went 0-for-2 on fourth down and JMU forced five three-and-outs.
- Redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland was active both defensively and on special teams, as he had a strip sack, which was recovered by JMU and blocked a punt – the sixth of his career and first since 2014.
- Sophomore defensive lineman Mike Greene made five tackles, including 2.5 for loss and was one of six JMU players to make a sack in the win.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Adeeb Atariwa had 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack, and redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway tied for game-high honors with nine tackles and 2.0 for loss. Junior safety Adam Smith also made nine total stops, including seven solo.

MORE TEAM STATISTICS

- JMU converted on all five red-zone opportunities, with three Ratke field goals and a pair of rushing touchdowns.
- For the game, JMU out-gained Villanova 302-157, which included limiting the hosts to 94 passing yards and 63 rushing yards (1.5 per carry).
- The Dukes were 9-of-17 on third down, while Villanova was held to a 6-of-16 conversion rate.
- JMU also committed just one penalty.

D'ANGELO'S HOUSE

- D'Angelo Amos accomplished three things in the punt-return game that only a former JMU star and Super Bowl champion had done before for the program – and that man is Gary Clark.
- Amos took back-to-back punt returns to the house for scored over a span of 2:10 in the third quarter.
- His first was from 89 yards, tying for the longest punt return in school history. His second went for 81 yards, as he now has three punt return touchdowns this season and four for his career.
- His 89 yarder surpassed his former career long of 76, in which he achieved week two at Norfolk State.
- He tallied 183 punt return yards over his three returns, matching Clark's total from the 1983 game at Virginia.

Stout Defense Leads #3 JMU to 13-10 Victory Against #15 SBU

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Third-ranked James Madison shut out 15th-ranked Stony Brook in the second half and used one final defensive stand in the last two minutes to secure a 13-10 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

Leading 13-10 with 2:06 to play, Stony Brook converted twice on fourth down to keep the drive alive, reaching the JMU 33-yard line with two seconds remaining. The Dukes were able to hold on as Alex Lucansky's 51-yard field goal fell short to put the Dukes in a four-way tie atop the CAA standings.

With the win, JMU improves to 6-2 overall and 4-1 in CAA play, while the Seawolves fall to 6-3 and 4-2.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU limited Stony Brook to 120 yards in the second half over its seven drives.
- Five of SBU's seven second-half possessions resulted in punts, as the Seawolves were only 1-of-8 on third down. Another drive resulted in a tipped pass that produced a Landan Word interception and the final drive ended with the missed kick as time expired.
- Dimitri Holloway set a new career high with 18 tackles, to go with 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Landan Word turned in a career-best 10 tackles, including one for a loss and his first career interception. Wayne Davis also tallied career highs of six solo tackles and two tackles for a loss, to go with his first career sack.
- Adam Smith added six stops and intercepted a first-quarter pass, the second of his career, and Jimmy Moreland had five tackles and two pass breakups.
- Offensively, Ben DiNucci threw for 140 yards and a touchdown. Kyndel Dean had four catches for 45 yards and a first-quarter touchdown, and Jake Brown also added for catches for 30 yards.
- Cardon Johnson led the ground attack with 60 rushing yards, including a long of 23.
- Despite being out-gained 305-243 on the afternoon, JMU held the CAA's top-rushing offense to only 113 yards, which is over 100 yards below Stony Brook's season average. SBU's Joe Carbone threw for 192 yards and two interceptions. Donald Liotine ran for 71 yards and a score and Jordan Gowins, who entered the week as the CAA's leading rusher, ran for just 54.

SCORING PLAYS

- Johnson converted three first downs on the ground before DiNucci connected with Dean, who muscled off multiple defenders for a 15-yard touchdown. That put JMU ahead 7-0 with 1:47 left in the first.
- Stony Brook tied it at 7-7 with 10:14 left in the first half on a 30-yard rushing touchdown by Liotine.
- SBU took advantage on a DiNucci fumble late in the half and hit a 37-yard field goal right before halftime to take a 10-7 lead.
- After a scoreless third, JMU tied it at 10-10 with 13:51 remaining on a 41-yard field goal by Tyler Gray - his first field goal of the season.
- On the ensuing possession, JMU forced Stony Brook into a three-and-out, which included a big third-down sack by Davis, giving the Dukes the ball back. The Dukes ran six of the next eight plays, setting up Gray's go-ahead and eventual game-winning 24-yard field goal with 8:56 to go.

BALL HAWKS

- JMU intercepted two Joe Carbone passes, including one on Stony Brook's first possession.
- With the Seawolves driving, Adam Smith corralled his second career pick inside the 10, which set up JMU's first scoring drive.
- In the third, Mike Greene tipped a pass at the line of scrimmage and Landan Word came down with it for his first career interception.

Dukes Drop Road Contest at New Hampshire

DURHAM, N.H. – New Hampshire forced six turnovers, returning two first-half interceptions for a touchdown and third-ranked James Madison was unable to overcome the deficit, falling 35-24 on Saturday afternoon at Wildcat Stadium.

The Wildcats won for the second straight week, improving to 3-6 overall and 2-4 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Dukes fell to 6-3 and 4-2. The loss snapped JMU's 13-game win streak in true road games against FCS opponents, as well as its 11-game win streak in CAA road matchups.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU threw a season-high four interceptions, allowing multiple defensive touchdowns for the first time since 2002.
- JMU out-gained UNH 486-315, but the Wildcats had a plus-six turnover margin, producing four picks and two fumble recoveries.
- JMU did outscore the Wildcats 21-14 in the second half, including 14-0 over the final 9:21.
- UNH's Trevor Knight passed for 181 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 76 yards and one score to lead the offense.
- The Wildcats scored two of their three first-half touchdowns on a pick-six. Rick Ellison had a 44-yard interception for a touchdown just over four minutes into the game, and Evan Horn had a 75-yard score early in the second to give UNH a 21-3 lead.
- Junior quarterback Cole Johnson was 31-of-48 for a career-high 398 yards, as he replaced junior Ben DiNucci in the first quarter.
- Johnson's passing total was the third highest in school history, trailing only Vad Lee's 433 and 406 back in 2014. He also added a fourth-quarter rushing touchdown.
- Redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton made a game-high eight catches for 116 yards, redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean tied his career high with six receptions for 77 yards and senior David Eldridge had four grabs for a season-best 84 yards.
- JMU's running backs found the end zone twice in the second half, as graduate Cardon Johnson scored from a yard out in the third and senior Trai Sharp added a two-yard score in the fourth.
- Defensively, JMU was led by redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway, who had 11 tackles and one for loss. Junior defensive lineman John Daka added eight tackles and a sack.

#9 Dukes Win Offensive Slugfest on Senior Day

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Behind a five-touchdown performance by redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci, ninth-ranked James Madison outlasted Rhode Island for a 48-31 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 7-3 on the year and 5-2 in CAA play while the Rams fell to 5-5 and 3-4. It also marked JMU's ninth straight win over URI in the series.

QUICK SUMMARY

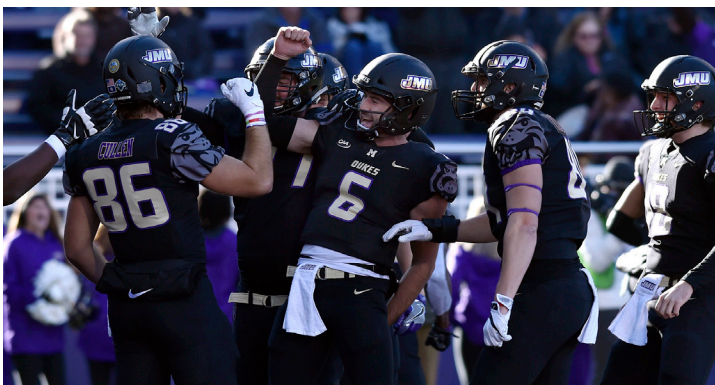
- JMU scored three straight touchdowns to bridge the first and second quarters and added two late field goals in the first half to grab a 27-14 lead at the break.
- URI and JMU traded scores all through the second half and the Rams never drew closer than 10 down the stretch.
- DiNucci was 18-of-25 for 227 passing yards and a career-high four touchdowns, to go with a pair of interceptions. He also rushed for 44 yards and a score, marking his second career game with five total touchdowns.
- The Dukes rushed for 192 yards, averaging 4.5 yards per rush. Seniors Cardon Johnson and Trai Sharp led the way with 73 and 62 rushing yards, respectively. Johnson added a third-quarter touchdown to move into 10th place all-time in career rushing touchdowns.
- Three Dukes had at least four receptions, led by redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean, who had a JMU-best five catches for 86 yards and a touchdown.
- Redshirt junior Riley Stapleton tallied four receptions for 35 yards and two touchdowns, while redshirt sophomore Jake Brown made four grabs for 55 yards.
- Defensively, JMU was led by junior linebacker Landan Word, who made a game-high 10 tackles, matching his career best. Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter and redshirt senior Darrious Carter each made 1.5 sacks, and junior John Daka added a sack of his own in the win.
- Redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland picked off his fifth pass of the season to tie himself atop the CAA leaders in the interceptions department.
- URI was led by JaJuan Lawson, who passed for 255 yards and three touchdowns, with Marvin Beauvais reeling in all three passing scores.

MEMORIES MADE AT BRIDGEFORTH

- Saturday marked the final regular-season home game for JMU's 11 seniors, as the group won for the 44th time in 52 games. The JMU seniors have gone 26-3 over the past four seasons at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- Tabb Patrick was commissioned into the Army during halftime of Saturday's game and later made his first career fumble recovery in the second half on special teams.
- After the win, senior kicker Tyler Gray stood at midfield, surrounded by his teammates, and proposed to his girlfriend Abby.

CAREER WATCH

- Jimmy Moreland nearly returned an interception for a touchdown right before halftime, as he has five in 2018 and 18 for his career, extending his JMU career record.
- Cardon Johnson ran in a third-quarter touchdown to up his career total to 24, as he now ranks tied for 10th all-time at JMU in rushing scores.
- Tyler Gray converted two field goals to move into a tie for sixth with Ethan Ratke with 28 career field goals. He also tacked on six extra points to slide up into fifth place with 216 career points.

Strong Rush Attack Powers #7 JMU to 38-17 Win at #15 Towson

TOWSON, Md. – Seventh-ranked James Madison rushed for a season-high 395 yards as a team and the defense shut down No. 15 Towson over the final three quarters to earn a 38-17 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Johnny Unitas Stadium.

The Dukes conclude the regular season with an 8-3 record and finish second in the CAA standings with a 6-2 conference mark. The Tigers fall to 7-4 and 5-3 with the defeat.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU produced a trio of 100-yard rushers in the win, led by graduate Cardon Johnson, who notched a game-high 162 yards on 13 carries (12.5 avg.), which included a season-long 76-yard touchdown in the first.
- Senior Trai Sharp ran for 107 yards and score with a long of 40. He averaged 7.1 yards on 15 carries.
- Redshirt junior Ben DiNucci accounted for 285 yards of total offense in the win. He was 15-of-22 for 181 passing yards while also rushing for 104 yards and three touchdowns, marking his first career 100-yard game. The three rushing scores were also a career best.
- On the receiving end, redshirt sophomore Jake Brown led the team with six catches for 41 yards, and redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean had three grabs for 56.
- Defensively, redshirt junior Dimitri Holloway led the way with a game-high 14 tackles, the second-highest tackle total for him this season. Junior Landan Word turned a career-high 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss and a sack.
- JMU forced four sacks as a team, as junior John Daka registered a career-high two sacks and a forced fumble. Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter also had a sack to up his season total to 7.5, leading all JMU defenders during the regular season.
- The Dukes also had a season-best seven pass breakups, led by redshirt senior Jimmy Moreland's two. He also recovered his second career fumble recovery late in the first half.
- Towson's Tom Flacco was 31-of-50 for 372 yards and two touchdowns while leading the team with 52 rushing yards. Shane Leatherbury had a game-best 10 catches for 88 yards and a score and Jabari Allen led all receivers with 135 receiving yards.

FINAL GAME STATS

- JMU out-gained Towson 576-515, marking the Dukes' second-highest yards gained in a game this season.
- The Dukes dominated the run game, with a 395-143 advantage. JMU averaged 8.4 yards per rush while the Tigers were held to 4.2 per carry.
- JMU's kicking and punting units shined Saturday, as Towson's starting field position was its own 18. The Dukes average starting field position was their own 25.
- After allowing 10 points and 207 yards through Towson's first three drives, JMU's defense clamped down, forcing eight straight empty possessions, including a pair of three-and-outs, a fumble and two turnovers on downs.

THREE OVER 100 FOR JUST THE THIRD TIME EVER

- JMU achieved a feat it had only done one other time in program history, as three players rushed for over 100 yards in the same game.
- Cardon Johnson (162) turned in his ninth career 100-yard game. Trai Sharp (107) went over the century mark for the fifth time at JMU and Ben DiNucci (104) eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career.
- Ironically, back on Sept. 3, 2016 against Morehead State, JMU's quarterback, as well as Sharp and Johnson were the first three to earn the mark. Bryan Schor ran for 129 yards in that game, while Sharp and Johnson added 110 and 104, respectively.
- The first occurrence came in the 2015 in the opener against Morehead.

Defensive Dominance Propels JMU Past Delaware in First Round

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Sixth-ranked James Madison limited Delaware to a pair of field goals and 185 total yards en route to a 20-6 triumph in the first round of the 2018 NCAA FCS Playoffs on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 9-3 on the year after conceding the fewest points in a single playoff game in program history. The Blue Hens season ends at 7-5.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU allowed just 69 rushing yards, limiting Delaware to just 2.8 yards per carry. The Blue Hens converted just 2-of-14 on third down and the Dukes registered five sacks and 10 tackles for loss with a pair of interceptions.
- The Dukes dominated the first half defensively, as UD gained just 52 yards of offense with two first downs, grabbing a 12-3 halftime lead.
- In the second half, JMU forced two turnovers on downs and produced a pair of fourth-quarter interceptions to seal the win.
- Jimmy Moreland posted a season-high 10 tackles with 2.5 for loss and a half sack. Landan Word and Dimitri Holloway each had eight stops and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- John Daka tied his career high with 2.0 sacks, while Paris Black and Darrius Carter both added another.
- Charles Tutt recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter and added a career-high three pass breakups, while Wayne Davis secured the win with a late-game interception, the second of his career.
- Offensively, Ben DiNucci was 23-of-31 for 223 yards and a touchdown.
- Three receivers tallied five catches in the win, as Kyndel Dean had a game-high 64 yards, while Riley Stapleton and Jake Brown each had 43 yards. Brown tacked on his second career touchdown catch in the third quarter and Stapleton's second grab was the 100th of his career.
- Trai Sharp led the game with 42 rushing yards, DiNucci had 29 and Marcus Marshall ran for 28 yards and a score.

- 1:48 (1st): JMU opened the scoring with an Ethan Ratke 23-yard field goal
- 10:31 (2nd): The Dukes extended the lead to 5-0 after John Daka sacked Pat Kehoe in the end zone, registering JMU's first safety since Sept. 16, 2017 against Norfolk State.
- 1:58 (2nd): Returning from injury, Marcus Marshall bulldozed his way in from four yards out, making it 12-0 in favor of JMU
- :27 (2nd): Delaware trimmed the JMU lead to 12-3 at the break with a Jake Roth 48-yard field goal.
- 9:10 (3rd): Frank Raggo drained a 37-yard field goal to make it a one-score game, bringing UD to within 12-6.
- 4:09 (3rd): JMU answered with a 13-play, 75-yard drive spanning over five minutes to make it a two-touchdown lead. Ben DiNucci capped off the drive with an eight-yard touchdown pass to Jake Brown. The Dukes converted the two-point try, as DiNucci hooked up with Dylan Stapleton.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- JMU dominated the time of possession, possessing the ball for 37:04, compared to UD's 22:56.
- The Dukes held Delaware to only six yards in the first quarters and the Hens did not achieve a first down until their seventh offensive drive.
- JMU had 23 first downs, compared to 12 for the visitors.
- Ethan Ratke's first-quarter field goal was the 15th of his season, tying him for the JMU single-season record with three other players.
- UD's Pat Kehoe was 13-of-32 for 116 yards and two interceptions. Vinny Papale had 44 receiving yards and Charles Scarff added 36. Troy Reeder paced the UD defense with a game-high 16 tackles.

JMU POSTSEASON NOTES

- JMU is now 9-4 all-time at home in the playoffs, including six-straight wins at Bridgeforth.
- Improved to 5-0 vs. CAA teams in the postseason and 2-0 against Delaware in the playoffs
- The six points allowed was the fewest JMU has given up in a playoff game, besting the seven points allowed in the 2017 Second Round against Stony Brook and in the 2016 Quarterfinals versus Sam Houston State.
