#CAALAX POSTSEASON HONORS

PLAYER OF THE YEAR

KRISTEN GAUDIAN | JAMES MADISON SENIOR | MIDFIELDER | FAIRFAX STATION, VA./LAKE BRADDOCK

Senior Kristen Gaudian, a Tewaaraton Award Finalist, leads the CAA with 89 points this season, scoring 74 goals and connecting with teammates 15 times. Gaudian's 74 goals are the most by any CAA player since 2005 and are the second-most in CAA single season history. She's among the national leaders in several offensive categories, including free position shooting, going 27-for-38 at the eight-meter. Gaudian also added 75 draw controls. She was named as an IL Women Media First Team All-American.

DEFENSIVE CO-PLAYER OF THE YEAR

OLIVIA CONTI | TOWSON SOPHOMORE | DEFENDER | WANTAGH, N.Y./ST. ANTHONY'S

Sophomore Olivia Conti is the fifth player in CAA history to be named Defensive Player of the Year in consecutive seasons. For the second consecutive season, she's set the CAA single season record for caused turnovers, posting 52 in 2018. She also had 51 ground balls and posted 47 draw controls. Conti added to the offense with three goals and two assists. Conti was named a top-25 nominee for the Tewaaraton, the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year and to the IWLCA All-Mid-Atlantic First Team and the IL Women Media All-America Second Team.

DEFENSIVE CO-PLAYER OF THE YEAR

HALEY WARDEN | JAMES MADISON SENIOR | MIDFIELDER | GLEN MILLS, PA./GARNET VALLEY

Senior Haley Warden is the first player in CAA history to have received both a Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honor at any point during her career. Warden, a defensive midfielder, has caused 43 turnovers, picked up 46 ground balls and won 95 draw controls. Her hustle has also helped the Dukes on offense as she's netted 37 goals and assisted on 11. Warden was named a top-25 nominee for the Tewaaraton and to the IL Women Media All-America Second Team.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

COLLEEN GRADY | DREXEL FRESHMAN | MIDFIELDER | GLEN RIDGE, N.J./GLEN RIDGE

Freshman Colleen Grady, who earned spots on the All-CAA Second Team and the All-Rookie Team, is the first Drexel player ever to receive a major award. She led the Dragons in goals (32), assists (24) and points (56) and ranked among the top-10 in the CAA in all three categories. She was named CAA Rookie of the Week three times in 2018.

COACH OF THE YEAR

SHELLEY KLAES-BAWCOMBE | JAMES MADISON

James Madison Head Coach Shelley Klaes-Bawcombe picked up her fifth CAA Coach of the Year honor after guiding the nationally-ranked Dukes to a 20-1 overall mark, a 6-0 league record and the CAA Regular Season and Tournament Championships. James Madison leads the CAA in every offensive category and is nationally ranked in 11 categories. Klaes-Bawcombe, JMU's all-time winningest coach, was previously named CAA Coach of the Year in 2005, 2010, 2016 and 2017.

#CAALAX IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- For the first time since 2001, a CAA team has advanced to the NCAA Semifinals.
- Since 1994, a CAA squad has appeared in seven national semifinals. Loyola has five of those appearances (1994, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2001) and James Madison has two (2000, 2018).
- The Dukes look to become only the second CAA team to advance to the NCAA Championship game. The CAA's only national final appearance came in 1997. Loyola defeated North Carolina, 10-8, in the semifinals before falling to Maryland, 9-8, in the title game.
- For the first time since 2001, the CAA has had multiple teams earn national seedings, with JMU receiving the No. 3 Seed and Towson receiving the No. 7 Seed.
- The Dukes have received the most seeds in CAA history with five. They were last seeded in 2011 and were previously seeded as high as fifth (2010).
- For the third straight season, CAA has had multiple team earns NCAA bids, with James Madison getting the automatic and Towson receiving an at-large.
- The CAA has had 11 multi-bid seasons since 1994.

- Since 1994, the CAA has advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals on 11 occasions, with JMU making eight of those appearances. The CAA is 4-7 in the quarters.
- The CAA has had a team in the second round in three straight seasons, including 2018.
- Since 1994, six different CAA members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Since 2008, the CAA has been represented by either Towson or James Madison, or both, in every season.
- NCAA First Round Recap:** Towson's **Emily Gillingham** set the tone early, scoring just nine seconds into the contest, tying an NCAA Tournament record, as the Tigers surged by Wagner, 16-6. Gillingham finished with three goals, two assists and five draw controls. **Kaitlyn Montalbano** posted a team-high four goals. **Sami Chenoweth** had three caused turnovers while **Olivia Conti** added a pair of caused turnovers to take sole possession of the CAA single season record.
- NCAA Second Round Recap - Towson:** The Tigers saw their season come to a close at Johnny Unitas Stadium with a tough 21-17 loss to Northwestern. **Natalie Sulmonte** led Towson with seven points (5g, 2a) while **Emily Gillingham** scored four goals and handed out one assist. The No. 9 Wildcats received 16 of their 21 goals from Selena Lasota and Sheila Nesselbush.
- NCAA Second Round Recap - JMU:** James Madison trailed early, but used a big 6-0 run to bridge the halves and tilt momentum in the 15-12 win over Virginia in Harrisonburg. **Haley Warden** and **Kristen Gaudian** each tallied four goals. **Elena Romesburg** led the team seven draws and also had three goals and an assist.

- NCAA Quarterfinal Recap:** Third-seeded James Madison knocked off sixth-seeded Florida, 11-8, at Sentara Park to move on to the national semifinals. James Madison was paced by Tewaaronat finalist **Kristen Gaudian** who had three goals. Three other Dukes - **Hanna Haven**, **Elena Romesburg**, **Morgan Hardt** - each had a pair of goals. It was a one-goal game at halftime but Florida turned it into a two-goal lead, 5-4, early in the second half. Romesburg tied it up at 25:56. The Dukes then struck twice more in the 98-second span to pull away. Florida cut it to, 7-6, at 17:53 but JMU countered with four unanswered goals to cruise to the win. James Madison caused 10 of Florida's 16 turnovers and had a 21-13 advantage in ground balls. Florida had the upperhand, 13-8, in draw controls. In the cage, **Molly Dougherty** made nine saves while Haley Hicklen had 12 stops for Florida.

#2 NORTH CAROLINA VS. #3 JAMES MADISON

- The Tar Heels enter NCAA Semifinals on an 11-game winning streak while the Dukes have won their last 12.
- James Madison and North Carolina are meeting for the second time this year and for the first time since their season openers. In that contest, the Dukes pulled out a 15-14 double overtime win in Harrisonburg. The Dukes trailed 14-12 with five minutes remaining and scored twice to force OT. JMU received five goals from both **Kristen Gaudian** and **Elena Romesburg** while **Katie Kerrigan** had four helpers. JMU out-shot UNC 34-31, including a 27-24 edge in shots on goal. For UNC, Marie McCool had four goals before carding out while Katie Hoeg had a hat trick. JMU also forced 11 caused turnovers, to UNC's six and the Dukes held a 17-14 advantage in ground balls.
- JMU's win was the first over North Carolina since 2000. The Tar Heels are 6-3 all-time against the Dukes.
- Statistically, the two teams are similar with JMU having 11 more goals (331-320) and UNC having 14 more points (490-476) and 21 more draws (323-302). James Madison holds a hefty advantage in caused turnovers (235-152) and ground balls (408-347). The Dukes have 71 free position goals (.444) while the Tar Heels have 55 (.420).
- The Dukes and the Tar Heels have six common opponents this season in No. 17 High Point, No. 2 Maryland, No. 6 Florida, No. 18 Virginia, No. 13 Virginia Tech and Elon.
- Both teams defeated High Point, Virginia (JMU twice), Elon and Virginia Tech (UNC thrice). North Carolina defeated Maryland in overtime while JMU fell to the Terps by three goals. JMU topped Florida while UNC lost by seven goals.

#CAALAX AGAINST THE REST

- The CAA is 41-37 against non-league opponents.
- The CAA has nine wins against nationally-ranked opponents, including two against the top-five and four wins against the top-10.
- During opening weekend, the CAA squared off against four nationally-ranked opponents, including three in the top-five.
- The CAA is 4-7 against the ACC this season, with JMU picking up all four of those wins.
- The CAA is 5-9 against the Big Ten this season, with JMU accounting for two of those wins.

JAMES MADISON NOTABLES

- James Madison is the first-ever CAA team to record a 20-win season.
- This is the fourth consecutive NCAA Championship appearance for the Dukes.
- The Dukes received its highest-ever seeding and received a first round bye. James Madison hosted the first, second, and quarterfinal rounds at Sentara Park.
- James Madison has broken the CAA single season records for points (476), goals (331), goals per game (15.76), assists (145) and draw controls (302). *For more record information, see page 7.*
- The Dukes have two players with 60+ goals in **Kristen Gaudian** and **Elena Romesburg**. It's the first time in league history in which two teammates had notched 60+ goals in the same season.
- Senior **Katie Kerrigan** is currently sixth nationally in assists (52) and ninth assists per game (2.52). She's two assists shy of tying the CAA single season record. With 100 career assists, Kerrigan is sixth all-time in the CAA and just the sixth player in CAA history to reach the 100-career assist mark.
- Senior **Kristen Gaudian** leads the CAA with 74 goals, a mark which ranks her ninth in the nation, and 89 points, which ranks her 19th nationally. Her 74 goals are the most by any CAA player since 2005 and are the second-most in CAA single season history. Former JMU Duke **Gail Decker** owns the single season record (81, 2004). Her 89 points are the fifth-most in CAA single season history.
- Gaudian also is national leader in shot percentage (.655), fifth in free position percentage (.692) and seventh in FP goals per game (1.29).
- As a team, James Madison is nationally ranked in 11 categories. Notably, the Dukes are fourth in scoring margin (6.90/g), 12th in scoring offense (15.76/g), ninth in points (22.67/g), fourth in scoring defense (8.86) and ninth in caused turnovers (11.19/g).
- Senior **Haley Warden** made history twice this postseason. She's the first player in league history to be named Defensive Player of the Year and Player of the Year at any point during her career. She also became the first player in league history to be named Most Outstanding Performer of the CAA Championship in consecutive seasons.

#CAALAX REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- James Madison captured the 2018 CAA Regular Season Championship by going 6-0 this season, defeating Towson, 17-16, in overtime, on the final day of the regular season.
- James Madison has earned at least a share of the regular season title in six of the last nine years and has 12 regular season titles overall.

#CAALAX IN THE RPI

- The CAA is ranked fourth in the NCAA RPI, behind the ACC, Big Ten and Ivy League.
- James Madison has an RPI of four while Towson's RPI is seven.

#CAALAX IN THE RANKINGS

- Inside Lacrosse Cascade Media Poll:** Two CAA squads were ranked in the top-10 for the eighth time this season. James Madison remained at No. 5 while Towson moved down a spot to No. 8.
- IWLCA Coaches Poll:** James Madison remained at No. 5 for the second straight week while Towson stayed at No. 8 for the fifth straight week. It is the eighth time this season in which both programs were simultaneously ranked in the top-10. On February 26, JMU and Towson's inclusion in the top-10 marked the first time since the final poll of the 2010 season in which two CAA squads were ranked in the top-10.
- Nike/US Lacrosse Magazine Top-20:** The Dukes remained at No. 3 while Towson moved up to No. 8.

TEWAARATON AWARD

- James Madison senior **Kristen Gaudian** was named one of five finalists for the 2018 Tewaaraton Award.
- Gaudian is only the third CAA player to be named a finalist, joining former Dukes **Gail Decker** (2004) and **Lisa Staedt** (2003).
- Gaudian, along with teammate **Haley Warden** and Towson's **Olivia Conti** were included among the Top-25 nominees. Gaudian and Warden were the first Dukes to be selected as nominees since 2013. Conti, was the only sophomore on the list of nominees and is the first Tiger to be named as a nominee since 2012.
- In total, seven CAA women's lacrosse players were placed on the 2018 Tewaaraton Award Watch List.
- On the initial list, JMU had three student-athletes recognized in Gaudian, Warden, and **Elena Romesburg** along with Conti and Elon's **Stephanie Asher**.
- Towson's **Natalie Sulmonte** was included in the first round of additions on March 22 while teammate **Emily Gillingham** was added on April 12.

IL WOMEN MEDIA ALL-AMERICANS

- Seven student-athletes earned Inside Lacrosse Media All-American status. James Madison had four selections while Towson received three selections.
- Headlining the group was James Madison senior **Kristen Gaudian**, who was named to the First Team.
- The CAA Defensive Co-Players of the Year, **Olivia Conti** of Towson and **Haley Warden** of JMU landed a spot on the Second Team.
- JMU's **Elena Romesburg** was on the Third Team.
- Towson defenders **Tianna Wallpher** and **Sami Chenoweth**, and Dukes defender **Rebecca Tooker** each received honorable mentions.

IWLCA ALL-REGION

- Ten CAA student-athletes earned IWLCA All-Mid-Atlantic Region honors. They are now eligible for inclusion on the IWLCA All-America teams.
- Towson led the way with six selections, including four on the first team, while Delaware had three honorees and Hofstra had one.
- Towson's **Olivia Conti**, **Tianna Wallpher**, **Sami Chenoweth**, and **Kiley Keating** all earned spots on the Mid-Atlantic First Team. Junior **Natalie Sulmonte** and **Emily Gillingham** were named to the Second Team.
- Rounding out the Mid-Atlantic Region Second Team were Delaware's **Taylor Carpentier**, **Chatae Simmsv** and **Becky Gohsler** and Hofstra sophomore **Alyssa Parrella**. Gohsler & Parrella earned the honor for the the second straight season.

FOUR TAKEN IN WPLL DRAFT

- Four CAA women's lacrosse seniors were taken in the Women's Professional Lacrosse League Collegiate Draft, on May 7. The quartet joins six former CAA players who were taken in the inaugural draft.
- James Madison's **Kristen Gaudian**, the CAA Player of the Year, was the 12th overall pick in the draft, taken by the Baltimore Brave. Teammate **Elena Romesburg** was the 16th overall pick by the Upstate Pride. Towson teammates **Emily Gillingham** and **Kaitlyn Montalbano** went 18th and 19th, respectively. Gillingham was selected by the Philadelphia Fire while Montalbano will join Gaudian in Baltimore.
- The Baltimore Brave is guided by current Towson Head Coach **Sonia LaMonica**. The Brave roster also consists of former Tigers **Samantha Brookhart**, **Kelly McQuilkin** and **Kelsea Donnelly**.
- Two Hofstra Pride were selected by the New York Fight while a third was selected by the New England Command in the inaugural draft in August. The Fight, which will be led by current Hofstra Head Coach **Shannon Smith**, selected attack **Lindsay Scott** and goalie **Kelsey Gregerson**. The Command selected **Katie Hertsch**, who was a defensive standout for the Pride.

ON THE DRAW

- Towson's **Natalie Sulmonte** set the CAA single game record for draw controls with 14 against Georgetown on February 18. The previous standard was 12 set by former Hofstra standout **Brittain Altomare** in 2015.
- Sulmonte, a junior, recorded her 200th draw control on April 8 against Delaware and is third all-time in CAA history with 215 career draw controls list.
- JMU senior midfielder **Haley Warden** recorded her 200th draw control on April 15 against Elon and is second all-time in league history with 232. She became JMU's all-time leader on March 3, notching her 165th draw control against Temple.
- Warden has 95 draw controls this season, which second all-time in CAA single season history.
- Delaware senior **Becky Gohsler** shattered her career high with 81 draw controls in 2018, good for sixth all-time in CAA single season history. She finished her career with 186, tying her for fifth in CAA history.
- Former Towson Tiger and current William & Mary Head Coach **Hillary Fratzke** owns the CAA career record (327) and the CAA single season record (107).

CAUSING THOSE TURNOVERS

- Towson sophomore **Olivia Conti** has broken own CAA single season record with 51 caused turnovers.
- Conti has 101 caused turnovers in 40 career games, which ranks her 15th all-time in CAA history.
- James Madison's **Haley Warden** has 117 caused turnovers for her career, which is eighth all-time.
- Towson senior **Tianna Wallpher** finished her career with 107 caused turnovers, which ranks her 12th all-time in CAA history.
- Former Towson Tiger and current William & Mary Head Coach **Hillary Fratzke** owns the CAA record with 144 career caused turnovers.

WELL, THAT WAS FAST

- Towson's **Emily Gillingham** tied an NCAA Tournament record by scoring nine into the Tigers' first round game against Wagner. It's also the second-fastest goal in CAA history. Former Towson Tiger **Stephanie Howell** holds the CAA record, scoring eight seconds into a contest against Mount St. Mary's in 2002.
- William & Mary had back-to-back goals in an eight-second span at Hofstra on April 8. **Meredith Hughes** accounted for both goals for the second-fastest span in league history. Her coach, **Hillary Fratzke** is the only other player to post consecutive goals eight seconds apart.

#CAACHAMPS RUNDOWN

- The 2018 CAA Women's Lacrosse Championship was held May 4-6 and hosted by James Madison at Sentara Park. All three games aired exclusively on LaxSports Network.
- James Madison, Towson, Elon and Delaware was comprised the field for the second consecutive year. As was the case last year, JMU is the top seed, Towson is the No. 2 Seed, Elon is the No. 3 Seed and Delaware is the No. 4 Seed.
- James Madison has been the No. 1 seed eight times. The Dukes are 14-2 as the top seed, winning titles in 1999, 2004, 2006, 2010, 2017, and 2018.
- Towson has been a No. 2 seed five times. The Tigers are 6-3 as the second seed, winning titles in 2005 and 2016.
- Elon made its third straight CAA Championship appearance as the No. 3 seed. The Phoenix is 1-3 all-time in CAA Championship action, advancing to the title game in 2017.
- Delaware has been the No. 4 seed three times. The Blue Hens are 0-4 as the fourth seed.

#CAACHAMPS SEMIFINAL RECAPS

- James Madison 17, Delaware 5:** Senior **Kristen Gaudian** scored five goals to lead an efficient offensive attack as top-seeded James Madison defeated fourth-seeded Delaware, 17-5, at Sentara Park. The defending CAA champs punched their title game for the fifth consecutive season. Coming out strong on a defensive front, junior **Caroline Sdanowich** produced five caused turnovers for a new career high, and senior **Rebecca Tooker** had the same to match her career high. The Blue Hens were led in defeat by **Becky Gohsler**, who scored two goals and finished the season with 37.
- Towson 9, Elon 7:** Junior **Natalie Sulmonte** scored four goals while senior **Emily Gillingham** and junior **Carly Tellekamp** each scored twice to send second-seeded Towson past third-seeded Elon, 9-7. Tiger sophomore goalkeeper **Kiley Keating** played lights out in the cage, making 14 saves and turning the Phoenix away down the stretch as Towson held on from being outscored 3-0 in the final 10:45 of the game. **Kelsey Dupere**, **Stephanie Asher** and **Abby Godfrey** all accounted for Elon's final scores as part of a comeback that came up just short.

#CAACHAMPS FINAL RECAP

- James Madison 16, Towson 10 Top-seeded James Madison captured its second straight CAA Women's Lacrosse Championship, and the program's 11th all-time, with a 16-10 victory over second-seeded Towson at Sentara Park. Madison senior **Haley Warden** became the first player in conference history to earn back-to-back CAA Championship Most Outstanding Performer honors, scoring one goal in the victory. Classmate **Kristen Gaudian**, the 2018 CAA Player of the Year, led all players with five goals, and also dished out one assist, while fellow senior **Elena Romesburg** had a career day with four goals. Senior **Katie Kerrigan** had a seven-point day as well with one goal and six assists. For Towson, **Natalie Sulmonte** had four goals while **Emily Gillingham** had a pair.

- Elon senior **Stephanie Asher**, the CAA's active career leader in goals, finished with 179, good for tenth all-time in CAA history. She finished with 211 career points, tying her for 18th all-time.

- Hofstra sophomore **Alyssa Parrella** scored her 100th career goal on April 22 against James Madison. Parrella has 156 career points in just two seasons for the Pride.

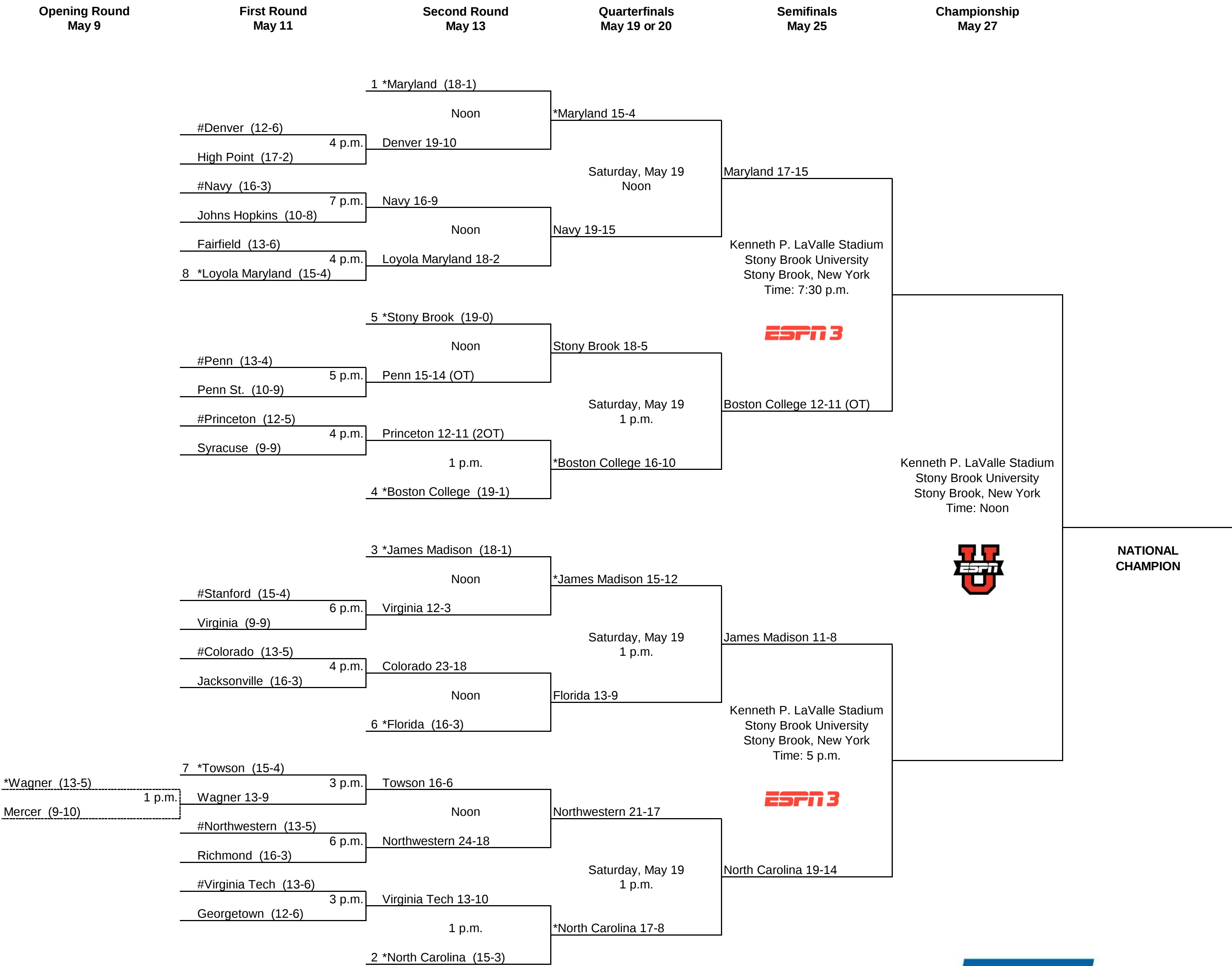
