Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field was built in 1975, enlarged in 1981, and in 2011, completed a major \$62 million renovation that increased the capacity to 24,877, added multiple amenities and made it one of the premier facilities in the Football Championship Subdivision.

The stadium was named for William E. Bridgeforth, a long-time supporter and board of visitor member whose family remains very active with JMU.

The playing surface was named for Harrisonburg-area businessman Zane Showker, a long-time supporter and university board of director and for whom the JMU business school facility is named.

The JMU Sprint Broadcast Network

JMU's entire 2018 football schedule is broadcast on the JMU Sprint Broadcast Network. JMU Athletics, Learfield Sports and Harrisonburg Radio Group have teamed up to manage each live broadcast.

Harrisonburg Radio Group is a partner after acquiring 92.1 FM and 550 AM WSVA in Harrisonburg on August 1, 2015. WSVA continues its longrunning service as the flagship station. Fans are able to enjoy a more crisp sound quality with the FM signal, which began transmitting in January 2015. For the past two seasons, the pregame show for football has been expanded to 60 minutes and provides even more comprehensive coverage to prepare JMU fans for the day's





Dave Thomas is in his fourth season as the radio play-by-play voice of the Dukes, while Clint Estes provides color commentary both at home and on the road.

Thomas began his broadcasting career as a senior at McDowell High School (N.C.) and has been in the industry for 29 years. He moved to Harrisonburg in 2014 and filled in on several JMU broadcasts that year before moving to the primary role in 2015. Prior to his move to the Valley, Thomas was the play-by-play announcer for Lenoir-Rhyne in Hickory, N.C., covering football, men's basketball and women's basketball. Thomas and JMU Head Football Coach Mike Houston were at Lenoir-Rhyne during the same time. He also provided the playby-play talent for two seasons of cable television coverage of Western Carolina and served as the backup for an NBA D-League team in Asheville, N.C.

A Marion, N.C., native, Thomas is a 1992 graduate of Isothermal Community College with a concentration in radio broadcasting. He is the brand manager for Harrisonburg Radio Group's Q-101, MORE 96.1 and REWIND 105.1, all FM music stations. He is also host of The Daily Sports Feed, a locally-focused sports talk show, which airs Monday through Friday on ESPN Radio.

Estes is in his ninth season on the network and has 30plus years of radio sports broadcasting experience from the central Virginia area, working for WJMA in Orange, and WINA and ESPN 840 in Charlottesville.

Estes, a Charlottesville, Va., native and graduate of Emory & Henry College and the University of Virginia, has hosted numerous sports talk shows in addition to broadcasting games. He is in his 40th year of working with Virginia public schools.

WSVA's signal on 550 AM and 92.1 FM translator broadcasts to listeners in the Shenandoah Valley and surrounding areas. The broadcasts are simulcast on MadiZONE HD SportsNet presented by the JMU Alumni

The Sprint Broadcast Network also produces JMU men's and women's basketball games.

2018 Football Media Guidelines

The 2018 James Madison University football prospectus is designed to assist media with its coverage of JMU football. Additional information, statistics and photographs may be acquired by contacting Chris Brooks in the JMU Athletics Communications Office at brookscp@jmu.edu or at (540) 568-3702. For score updates on game days, call the press box phone at (540) 568-6521.

Press Credentials

Requests for working press space must be made in writing to the James Madison Athletics Communications Office by Wednesday at noon prior to the date of the home contest. The request should be made in writing via e-mail by the sports director of the newspaper, magazine, radio or television outlet wishing to send reporter(s) and/or photographer(s) to the game. Confirmation of the request will be made by James Madison Athletics Communications personnel. Press credentials WILL NOT be issued to spouses, friends or children, in accordance with the working code of the College Sports Information Directors of America and the Football Writers Association of America. The press box is a working area, and cheering will be grounds for removal.

Photographers

Photographers are issued similar credentials to press box media, though any media representatives working at field level must check in at the press box for a vest allowing access. Due to HIPAA regulations, we ask all photographers, both television and print, not to photograph any injury evaluations done in the bench/sidelines area. Add tionally, per the credential policy, there is no selling of game photos taken by media members without the express written agreement from lames Madison University.

Parking

Media parking is located in the Champions Drive Parking Deck and R1 Lot near the old baseball stadium. Season media members will be issued season parking passes. Single-game parking passes should be requested with media passes and will need to be requested at least a week in advance to allow arrival prior to the game. If a single-game press pass is left at the Will Call window, parking arrangements are the responsibility of the media member. There is no "Will Call" list for parking or credentials requested less than a week in advance, as media parking is limited.

Entering Bridgeforth Stadium

Press credentials can be picked up in the James Madison Athletics Communications Office on or after Wednesday during the week of a home contest. If credentials are approved they will only be mailed if the request is granted at least two weeks prior to the game. Any credentials not picked up will be left at the Will Call window at the south end of the stadium near Gate A.

Field Access

Field access for media is limited at JMU. For video, photo and radio media (no writers allowed on sidelines), you are required to show your media credential and sign in at the desk in the press box to obtain a media vest. That provides sideline access and access to the closer white dotted lines running from the 25-yard lines to the end zones. Vested media are allowed to move behind the dotted line behind the benches, but no images are allowed from those positions and no filming nor photography of injury evaluations are allowed in compliance with HIPAA. We ask that you return the vest to the same desk after the game.

Visting Radio

Visiting radio stations have a separate booth on the top floor in the press box at Bridgeforth Stadium. Visitors receive one reciprocal phone line for their game broadcasts. Should more lines or ISDN be needed, please contact Chris Brooks for arrangements at least three weeks prior to the game.

Telephone/Internet Access

If media are in need of a phone line for the game or season, please inform Chris Brooks at time of credential request of those needs. For those media that can file over the World Wide Web with laptop computers that can automatically select an IP address, there are hardwire Internet connections as well as wireless access available in the press box. For Comrex units, please provide your MAC address at least two weeks in advance to clear the MAC through JMU's firewall.

Media Information

The James Madison Athletics Communications staff will provide game notes and updated cumulative statistics for both teams to credentialed media prior to all games via JMU's DropBox. Game notes are no longer printed on game days, however flip cards will still be provided. Statistical summaries and play-by-play sheets will be distributed throughout the game and will be available at the conclusion of the contest. Media members will be provided with a pre-game meal at least one hour prior to the game, while water and soft drinks will be available throughout the game.

Game Day Interview Policy

James Madison's post-game interviews will be conducted in the press box at Bridgeforth Stadium and streamed on Facebook Live. Following the 10-minute NCAA-mandated cooling off period, the visiting head coach and requested/approved players will be brought to the press box for the press conference. After that, the requested/approved JMU players will be brought to the press box for the press conference, followed by Head Coach Mike Houston. No individual postgame interviews, outside of live TV broadcasts previously agreed upon, will be permitted with any JMU personnel. In addition, the JMU locker room is closed to the media.

Non-Game Day Interview Policy

Head Coach Mike Houston will be available to the media by phone during the CAA Teleconference on Mondays at 10:30 a.m. Other phone requests for radio and TV purposes will be handled on an individual basis. Coach Houston will be available on Tuesdays at noon for the weekly Fan/Press Luncheon at O'Neill's Grill, located on University Blvd. An archive of the video will be posted on JMUSports.com later in the day.

Individual approved players and coaches are available for interviews on select days following practice. All player and coach interviews must be cleared with Chris Brooks by 10 a.m. on Mondays. This policy allows us to arrange interviews that do not conflict with any post-practice schedules (i.e. class, meetings), which have top priority. If unavailable for interview, the press will be notified ahead of time. There will be no freshmen available for any interviews until otherwise notified.

One note to the media: Personal phone numbers for players and coaches WILL NOT be given out by the James Madison Athletics Communications Office. During preseason camp and the regular season, media members will be e-mailed a schedule for the week of approved days for interviews.

The Head Coach

Mike Houston was hired as James Madison University's seventh head football coach on January 18, 2016.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has guided the Dukes to a 28-2 overall record, with back-to-back 14-1 seasons in 2016 and 2017. The 14 wins set a program record for single-season victories. JMU set a CAA- and program-record 26-game win streak between the two seasons, which ranks second all-time in FCS history.

In his first season, Houston and the Dukes won the NCAA Division I Football Championship with a 28-14 win against Youngstown State. JMU made a return trip to the national title game in 2017, falling 17-13 to North Dakota State.

In year two at JMU, Houston led the team to its first-ever undefeated and untied regular season, going 11-0, which included its second straight 8-0 Colonial Athletic Association record to earn a second straight outright championship and a program-record third consecutive CAA title. The Dukes earned the No. 1 seed for the FCS Playoffs for just the second time and earned home playoff wins against Stony Brook (26-7), Weber State (31-28) and South Dakota State (51-16) before falling in the title game to NDSU.

The Dukes led the country in scoring defense, holding teams to just 11.1 points per game. They also paced the FCS in interceptions (31), takeaways (44) and team pass efficiency defense (83.12 rating).

JMU ranked in the top 10 nationally in 14 categories, as it was also third in total defense (252.0), turnover margin (1.47), defensive touchdowns (5) and first downs (325), fourth in punt-return defense (3.33), fifth in sacks (3.4), seventh in rushing defense (90.5), eighth in fumble recoveries (13), ninth in completion percentage (64.9%) and net punting (38.77) and 10th in passing defense (161.5), third-down defense (30.1%), punt-return average (13.0) and blocked punts (2).

Eight players were voted All-Americans in 2017, including Andrew Ankrah, who was named a Consensus All-American after being tabbed to six different All-America First Teams. Ankrah won the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year award and finished third for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award.

Joining Ankrah on the All-America list were Aaron Stinnie, Jordan Brown, Rashad Robinson, Raven Greene, Kyre Hawkins, Jahee Jackson and Harry O'Kelly. The Dukes also had 16 All-CAA honorees, which included three players garnering top-league awards. Ankrah was voted Defensive Player of the Year, John Miller tabbed Special Teams Player of the Year and Bryan Schor became JMU's first winner of the Chuck Boone Leadership and Excellence Award.

Following the season, Houston was voted state coach of the year from three organizations. He was voted Touchdown Club of Richmond Bobby Ross Coach of the Year, Virginia Sports Information Directors University Division Coach of the Year and the J. Roy Rodman Award from the Norfolk Sports Club, marking the second straight season he garnered each award. The team was also presented with its second straight ECAC Lambert FCS Division Cup.

JMU finished the 2016 season with a 14-1 record, setting a program record for wins. The Dukes won their final 12 games to end the year with the longest active win streak in all of Division I. During the regular season, Houston led JMU to a perfect 8-0 mark in Colonial Athletic Association play to clinch the outright conference title. It was the second time the Dukes went unbeaten in league play and won the CAA outright.

After going 10-1 in the regular season, JMU earned the No. 4 seed for the FCS playoffs and a first-round bye. The Dukes notched convincing victories at home against New Hampshire (55-22) and previously-unbeaten Sam Houston State (65-7) before conquering five-time defending national champion North Dakota State (27-17) in the national semifinals in Fargo, N.D. The win at NDSU ended the Bison's 22-game playoff win streak and a string of 18 straight home playoff wins.

On Jan. 7, 2017, JMU completed its title run with a 28-14 triumph against Youngstown State in the national championship game at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Khalid Abdullah was named the Most Outstanding Player for the championship, and the Dukes limited a strong run team in YSU to only 21 rushing yards in the win.

Houston reeled in numerous accolades in 2016, as he was named the American Football Coaches Association FCS National Coach of the Year. He also earned AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year for the second straight year and was voted Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year, marking the fifth time in his six-year head coaching career that he was tabbed his conference's top coach. Houston reeled in a trio of state coach of the year accolades, as he was named the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year, voted VaSID Coach of the Year and was presented the J. Roy Rodman Award. He was also presented with the Bob Ford FCS Coach of the year from the Metro New York Football Writers and the Washington Metro College Coach of the Year from the DC Touchdown Club.

He coached 14 players to All-CAA status, which included Bryan Schor being named CAA Offensive Player of the Year and Rashard Davis being recognized as CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. JMU had 10 of those 14 make the All-CAA First Team, while seven of the 14 eventually became All-Americans. That list included Abdullah, Schor, Davis, Raven Greene, Mitchell Kirsch, Taylor Reynolds and Aaron Stinnie.

JMU set several conference records, including marks for scoring (700), rushing offense (4,125), total offense (7,612) and first downs (380). Nationally, JMU led the FCS in winning percentage (93.3%), completion percentage (70.8%), team pass efficiency (181.69), first downs (380), defensive interceptions (21) and punt return average (26.65).

The Dukes also ranked second in scoring (46.7), fourth in third down conversions (50%), fifth in both rushing (275.0) and turnovers gained (30), sixth in fumbles lost (4), eighth in turnover margin (1.13) and 10th in turnovers lost (13). Offensively, JMU produced 18 100-yard rushing performances from it strong rushing attack, including Abdullah, who had a team-high 11 games with more than 100 yards.

Defensively, JMU saw a drastic improvement from the previous two seasons, as it ranked 17th in scoring defense (21.2) and 30th in total defense (344.3). The Dukes allowed 7.5 fewer points per game this season and nearly 60 yards fewer per outing from 2015 to 2016. JMU forced seven more turnovers and nearly doubled its interception production, going from 11 in 2015 to a nation-leading 21 in 2016.

During conference play, JMU completed its road gauntlet with victories at Maine, New Hampshire, Richmond and Villanova. Those four teams finished second through fifth in the CAA standings and three made the postseason in UNH, UR and VU. It was JMU's first win at New Hampshire since 2006 and the first at Villanova since 2008.

Possessing 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five as a head coach, Houston came to Harrisonburg after serving two years as head coach at The Citadel (2014-15). He led the Bulldogs to a 14-11 record in his two seasons and is the only coach in The Citadel's history to win a Southern Conference championship within his first two seasons.

Houston's offense produced 27 individual 100-yard rushing performances, including a



program-record 14 in 2015. The 27 100-yard rushers was a two-year record for The Citadel.

In 2015, he guided the Bulldogs to the program's fourth winning season since 1995 with a 9-4 record and a share of the 2015 SoCon title. The Citadel boasted a conference-best +117 scoring margin, including a +100 edge during league play, and Houston went on to be named SoCon Coach of the Year and AFCA Region 2 Coach of the Year. They also defeated Southeastern Conference member South Carolina 23-22 in the regular-season finale and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs after upsetting ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

In the first-round playoff victory, Houston's run game broke a school record with four 100-yard rushers as it piled up 524 yards on the ground, the most in a NCAA playoff game since 2012 and the second-highest in 2015 for FCS, only behind the Bulldogs' nation-best 535 rushing yards in the season opener.

The Citadel broke school records for all-purpose yards, total offense, rushing yards and interception return yards. The Bulldogs led the nation with a school-record 515 interception return yards and five interception return touchdowns. The Citadel led the Southern and ranked second nationally with 346.9 rushing yards per game, an average of 17.21 yards per completion and just 0.62 sacks allowed per game. The Bulldogs also led the league in interceptions, tackles for loss allowed, turnovers forced, yards per rush, rushing touchdowns, punt return defense, passing touchdowns allowed, fumble recoveries, third-down defense, tackles for loss and kickoff return defense.

Four players earned All-America status and 13 garnered All-Southern Conference honors. Senior defensive lineman Mitchell Jeter was named the SoCon Defensive Player of the Year and junior defensive lineman Joe Crochet was The Citadel's first CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American since 1989.

In his first season at the helm, he led the Bulldogs to a 5-7 record, which was tied for the second-highest win total for a first-year coach at The Citadel. Three of the Bulldogs' losses came by a total of nine points, including two in the final seconds. The Citadel rushed for over 4,166 yards, ranking third-best in single-season program history, and their 347.2 rushing averaged led the SoCon and ranked second nationally.

Prior to The Citadel, Houston was head coach at Lenoir-Rhyne, an NCAA Division II school in the South Atlantic Conference, for three seasons. He accumulated a 29-8 record at the helm and directed the Bears to three consecutive SAC championships, a stretch that included a school-record 13 wins in his final year. Houston was named SAC Coach of the Year each season and was also the Don Hansen Super Region II Coach of the Year in 2013. In his final season at LRU, the Bears advanced to the Division II national championship game and ranked No. 2 in the final polls.

Before his elevation to head coach, Houston served as Lenoir-Rhyne's defensive coordinator and secondary coach from 2007-10. He spent the 2006 year as associate head coach and defensive coordinator at Brevard College.

Houston began his coaching career in the high school ranks. He coached for a decade at T.C. Roberson High School in Ashville, N.C., including the last five as head coach, where he went 42-18 and guided the team to its first-ever conference championship. He spent his first five seasons at T.C. Roberson as the defensive coordinator after leading the defense at Forbush High School in East Bend, N.C. in his first two years out of college.

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill University, where he played tight end for the Lions and earned a bachelor's degree in biology. In 2014, Houston was inducted into the Franklin High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He is married to the former Amanda Owen and they have two sons, Owen Michael and Reid Wilson.

CAA Football

CAA Football has established itself as one of the nation's premier FCS power conferences for more than a decade due to its on-field success, national exposure and the achievements of its student-athletes in the classroom, in the community and at the next level.

James Madison capped an outstanding 2017 season for the conference by reaching the FCS national championship game for the second year in a row. CAA Football sent four programs to the NCAA Division I Football Championship for the fourth straight season and they combined to win six games. In addition to the Dukes' advancing to the national title game, New Hampshire extended the nation's longest FCS playoff streak with its 14th straight appearance, while Stony Brook and Elon earned playoff berths for the first time as members of CAA Football. Nine different CAA teams have made the playoffs over the past five years. the past five years.

CAA Football continued its success against non-conference opponents in 2017, finishing 26-6 against FCS foes and 28-15 overall. The non-conference winning percentage (.813) vs. FCS opponents was the best of any FCS conference. The league posted two victories over FBS competition for the second year in a row as James Madison rolled past East Carolina, 34-14, and New Hampshire defeated Georgia Southern, 22-12. CAA Football teams have now recorded 36 wins over FBS'opponents in its history.

A strong presence in the national rankings remained another constant for CAA Football in 2017. James Madison finished the year as the #2 team in the country, while Stony Brook, New Hampshire and Elon were also ranked in the final FCS Top 25 polls. All 12 CAA teams were either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls at some point during the 2017 season.

A total of 14 CAA Football players were named to one or more All-America teams in 2017, while nine players and two coaches were selected as finalists for national Player/Coach of the Year awards from

CAA Football continues to provide a path to the next level, with three players selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Richmond quarterback Kyle Lauletta was picked in the fourth round by the New York Giants, Delaware defensive tackle Bilal Nichols was chosen in the fifth round by the Chicago Bears and Maine offensive lineman Jamil Demby went to the Los Angeles Rams in round six. The conference has now had multiple players picked in each NFL Draft since 2006.

CAA Football received tremendous broadcast exposure through conference agreements with FOX Sports and CBS Interactive (SportsLive) as well institutional packages with several regional sports networks. In addition, numerous games were distributed on CAA.TV. The CAA's national appeal was showcased last season when ESPN's iconic College Gameday show aired live from James Madison on Oct. 14 prior to the Dukes' conference showdown with Villanova. It was College Gameday's second trip to Harrisonburg in the past three years vears

CAA Football's emphasis on its players' off-the-field achievements was evident again in 2016. James Madison's Bryan Schor was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award, which honors the player who best embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, teamwork and sportsmanship in his academic and athletic pursuits. New Hampshire's Kyle Reisert was selected as CAA Football's Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was honored as a first-team Academic All American Academic All-American.

Showing a desire to unite behind a common cause, all 12 CAA Football schools partnered with the Be the Match Foundation and its "Get in the Game, Save a Life" program in 2017. Former Villanova coach Andy Talley has been a driving force nationally for the program, which raises awareness of the need for bone marrow donors.

CAA Football has enjoyed a tremendous record in the postseason, earning 102 total playoff berths and at least three in every year since 2006. The league's 105 all-time wins in the NCAA playoffs are second-most of any FCS conference, and the conference has further established its presence at the national level by placing 13 teams in the national semifinals over the past 12 seasons.

James Madison took home the national championship in 2016 with a 28-14 victory over Youngstown State. It was the third title in the past decade and sixth overall for CAA Football. Villanova captured the 2009 national championship and Richmond claimed its first FCS crown in 2008. In 2004, JMU won the national championship, becoming the first team since the field expanded to 16 teams in 1986 to reach the final after winning three road playoff games. Delaware rolled past Colgate, 40-0, to capture the first title-game shutout in 2003. Former league member Massachusetts earned a national championship in 1998.

CAA Football boasts a total of 28 individual national award winners in league history. Villanova quarterback John Robertson (2014), Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke (2012), New Hampshire quarterback Ricky Santos (2006), William & Mary quarterback Lang Campbell (2004), Villanova running back Brian Westbrook (2001), Nova wide receiver Brian Finneran (1997), UNH running back Jerry Azumah (1998) and Towson running back Dave Meggett (1998) all



earned the Walter Payton Award as the top offensive player in FCS under the league banner. UNH linebacker Matt Evans (2011), James under the league banner. UNH linebacker Matt Evans (2011), James Madison defensive lineman Arthur Moats (2009), and JMU linebacker Derrick Lloyd (2001) each received the Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in FCS, while JMU defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah was chosen as the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year in 2017. Robertson (2012) and Towson's Terrance West (2011) are past recipients of the Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in FCS. New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell (2005 and 2014), Towson's Rob Ambrose (2011), JMU's Mickey Matthews (1999 and 2008), Villanova's Andy Talley (1997) and Boston University's Dan Allen (1993) are past Eddie Robinson Award winners from the league as the top coach in FCS. JMU's Mike Houston (2016), McDonnell (2014), Matthews (2004), Talley (1997 and 2009), Delaware's K.C. Keeler (2010), Richmond's Mike London (2008), and Massachusetts' Mark Whipple (1998) have all garnered the AFCA National Coach of the Year honor as well.

The league remains successful beyond the collegiate playing field. CAA Football has had 116 players drafted by NFL franchises dating back to 1948. A total of 38 players have been selected in the draft over the last 13 years, including 2013 Super Bowl MVP Joe Flacco of Delaware (18th overall to the Baltimore Ravens in 2008). More than 30 players currently join Flacco on active NFL rosters.

CAA Football's geographic footprint extends up and down the East Coast, with schools located from Maine to North Carolina. Members include UAlbany, Delaware, Elon, James Madison, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Richmond, Stony Brook, Towson, Villanova and William and Mary. Joe D'Antonio is in his third year as commissioner of CAA Football and the Colonial Athletic Association.

While CAA Football officially began March 1, 2007, its roots date back more than 60 years. On December 3, 1946, the Code of the Yankee Conference went into effect. Established as an all-sports conference for the New England land grant colleges, the six charter members included Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. Upon the formation of Division I-AA football in 1978, the league disbanded all sports except for football. Delaware and Richmond were admitted to the conference in 1986, Villanova was added in 1988 and James Madison, Northeastern and William and Mary joined the league in 1993. The Atlantic 10 assumed operational control of the conference from 1997-2006, with Hofstra becoming part of the league in 2001 and Towson joining the group in 2004. With the conference under the CAA Football banner, UAlbany and Stony Brook were welcomed in 2013, followed by Elon in 2014.

FCS No. 1 JMU Runs Past FBS ECU 34-14

GREENVILLE, N.C. - Redshirt senior running back Cardon Johnson rushed for 265 yards and two scores as FCS No. 1 James Madison stormed past FBS ECU 34-14 on Saturday night at Bagwell Field at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

JMU increased the longest winning streak in all of Division I football to 13 games while improving to 2-0 all-time against American Conference teams (48-45 at SMU in 2015). The Dukes also snapped a 25-game winning streak for ECU against FCS opponents.

QUICK SUMMARY

- \bullet JMU rushed for 422 yards, its second most on the road in program history, as part of a 614-yard offensive performance
- \bullet The Dukes led 7-0 at the half thanks to a rushing score from senior quarterback Bryan Schor
- \bullet Johnson rushed 85 yards on the first offensive play of the second half to make it 14-0
- ECU responded with a short drive after an interception to make it 14-7, but JMU responded with three scores in succession to move ahead 34-7 before the Pirates struck one last time in the final minute
- \bullet Bryan Schor was 15-for-22 passing for 192 yards along with 48 yards on the ground with one score each

HAVE A DAY CARDON JOHNSON

- Johnson's 265 yards were a career high and the second most in JMU history
- He hit paydirt on runs of 85 and 80 yards
- Both of JMU's top rushing performances have come against AAC opponents as Vad Lee's program record came at SMU in 2015 (276)
- Johnson became the first opposing running back to eclipse 200 yards against ECU in 76 games
- Johnson's 85-yard burst was the fourth-longest run in JMU history

DEFENSE ON THE RISE

- JMU limited ECU to 372 total yards and 14 points
- The 20-point margin of victory was JMU's largest ever against a FBS opponent
- In JMU's last five games (four ranked foes in FCS playoffs and FBS ECU), the Dukes have allowed 74 total points (14.8/game) with 28 of those points with the victory clearly in hand
- JMU had three interceptions and a fumble recovery on defense
- \bullet Kyre Hawkins led the defense with 13 tackles while Jimmy Moreland added 11
- The defense limited ECU to 80 yards rushing
- ECU was shut out at the half for the first time since trailing Southern Miss 14-0 in 2007

Schor, #1 JMU Rolls Past ETSU, 52-10, in Home Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor tied the program record with five touchdowns and top-ranked James Madison cruised to a 52-10 victory in its football home opener on Saturday night in front of 24,722 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes extended their nation-leading win streak to 14 straight games, improving to 2-0 on the young season, while the Buccaneers fell to 1-1.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Schor was 25-of-33 for 304 yards and five touchdowns, marking the third time in his career he tied the school passing TD record.
- JMU out-gained ETSU 426-175, which included 304-118 through the air. JMU's defense limited the Bucs to only 57 rushing yards in the win.
- Senior Ishmael Hyman and redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton each hauled in two touchdown receptions a career-high for both players. Junior David Eldridge caught a fourth-quarter touchdown for his first score since transferring from Virginia.
- Entering Saturday, Stapleton was yet to make a reception, but he finished with eight catches for 64 yards and his two scores. Hyman tied his career high with six receptions, finishing with 93 receiving yards. Eldridge also had 80 yards on a career-best six grabs.

Dukes Rush Past Norfolk State, 75-14

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-ranked James Madison bulldozed its way to over 400 rushing yards and seven touchdowns on the ground en route to a dominant 75-14 victory against Norfolk State in its football non-conference finale on Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (3-0) amassed 472 rushing yards, averaging 7.3 yards per carry. They were led by junior running back Trai Sharp who ran for 130 yards and a touchdown on just nine touches (14.4 ypc) and freshman Percy Agyei-Obese, who finished with 103 yards and a score in his first career game. Three other Dukes ran for over 50 yards in junior Marcus Marshall (64 yards, 2 TD), redshirt senior Cardon Johnson (57 yards) and senior Bryan Schor (54 yards, TD).

- The Dukes limited the Spartans to only 91 yards of offense, marking the largest margin of total offense difference between two teams in JMU's 46-year history.
- The team had six different players score rushing touchdowns, led by Marshall's two.
- The Dukes scored 35 points in the second quarter, tying the program mark for most points in a single quarter.
- Schor passed for 149 yards and two touchdowns, while Cole Johnson had 99 passing yards and a touchdown.
- Two freshmen Dukes scored first career touchdowns in tight end Clayton Cheatham (rec. TD) and Agyei-Obese (rush TD).
- Dukes had a pair of points in special teams when Bryce Maginley blocked a punt in the end zone, resulting in a safety.

DEFENSE CONTINUES PROMINENCE

The Dukes' defense had another sterling afternoon, holding Norfolk State to just 91 total yards of offense, 28 of which came in the final quarter, and without an offensive touchdown. JMU surrendered just 1.9 yards per play and only allowed the Spartans to cross midfield on three offensive drives.

No. 1 Dukes Rally Past Maine 28-10 in CAA Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw four touchdown passes, and top-ranked James Madison outscored Maine 21-0 over the final 24 minutes to rally for a 28-10 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/ Zane Showker Field.

The win came in front of a sold out crowd of 25,330, which was the third-highest attendance in stadium history.

The Dukes improved to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in CAA play while the Black Bears dropped to 1-2 and 0-2. JMU's Division-I leading win streak remained intact as it extended to 16 consecutive games. That mark is just one shy of Richmond's 17-game streak (2008-09).

QUICK HITS

- Bryan Schor passed for 281 yards and four touchdowns and is now three passing scores shy of the JMU all-time record (51 - Vad Lee & Justin Rascati).
- Ezrah Archie, playing in his second career game, had eight receptions for 90 yards - both career highs. His final catch, a three-yard touchdown, capped his performance.
- Marcus Marshall had a strong second half, finishing with 135 rushing yards and averaging 7.1 yards per carry. It was his first career 100-yard
- JMU had seven players catch at least one pass, including touchdown grabs by Archie, David Eldridge, Jonathan Kloosterman and Taylor Woods.
- JMU out-gained Maine 472-299, holding the league's second-best rushing offense to only 137 rushing yards.
- Curtis Oliver led all players with a career-high 12 tackles, and Kyre Hawkins made two sacks with a pair of pass breakups. JMU's defense tallied 4 total sacks and 7 tackles for loss. The Dukes produced three interceptions, two of which came in the second half by Rashad Robinson and Jimmy Moreland.

WHEN THE GAME TURNED

- After Maine took a 10-7 lead early in the third quarter on a 60-yard Josh Mack run, JMU answered four minutes later with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Schor to Eldridge to make it 14-10.
- Maine's next three possessions consisted of 17 total yards, two three-and-outs and an interception by Robinson.
- On the ensuing drive, JMU went 48 yards, capped off by a Schor touchdown to a wide-open Woods for his first career receiving touchdown.
- After another three-and-out, JMU put the game away with an 86-yard drive, which included a 22-yard rush by Marshall, a 26-yard pass to Riley Stapleton and a three-yard passing score to Archie.

ARCHIE HAS CAREER DAY

Ezrah Archie stepped into the starting in just his second career game Saturday, and he made an immediate impact. The rookie corralled eight receptions for 90 yards, leading all players in both categories. His day was highlighted by his first career touchdown, coming on a three-yard grab in the fourth quarter.

MARSHALL SURPASSES CENTURY MARK FOR FIRST TIME AT JMU

Marcus Marshall eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the first time since transferring to JMU from Georgia Tech last spring. He ran for 135 yards on 19 carries, with a 7.1 yards per carry average. His day was capped off with a 49-yard run late in the fourth to put the Dukes in scoring position. In the final stanza, Marshall went off, going for 84 yards on just four carries (21.0 ypc).

#1 Dukes Tie CAA Win-Streak Record with 20-10 Win at Delaware

NEWARK, Del. – Junior running back Trai Sharp rushed for a career-high 185 yards and top-ranked James Madison forced three turnovers to grind out a 20-10 Colonial Athletic Association football victory at Delaware on Saturday at Delaware Stadium.

The Dukes increased the nation's longest win streak to 17 games, which tied the all-time CAA record - set by Richmond in 2008-09. That is also tied for the 13th-longest win streak in FCS history.

JMU improved to 5-0 on the year and 2-0 in CAA play, while the Blue Hens fell to 2-2 and 0-1.

QUICK HITS

- Sharp ran for 185 yards on 36 carries, tallying a 5.1 yards per carry average. His long of 59 set up his six-yard touchdown carry in the first quarter.
- Redshirt senior Andrew Ankrah recorded his first career touchdown on a 23-yard fumble recovery in the second quarter. He finished with five tackles, including two for loss, and a sack.
- Playing in his first game this season, senior linebacker Brandon Hereford recorded a team-high 11 tackles and a sack.
- JMU's defense held Delaware to just 229 yards of offense and blanked the host Hens for the final 42:07.
- Raven Greene collected his third takeaway of the season with his second interception of the season in the second quarter. He also forced a fumble early in the second half when UD was driving in JMU territory.
- Junior kicker Tyler Gray sealed the win with a career-long, 48-yard field goal with 2:50 remaining.

WHERE THE GAME TURNED


- Trailing 10-7 after having just punted to Delaware, Andrew Ankrah picked up a fumble on a backwards pass and ran it 23 yards for his first career touchdown, giving the Dukes a 14-10 lead with 6:53 to go in the first half.
- On the ensuing drive, Raven Greene picked off UD quarterback Joe Walker with 3:46 to go in the second, resulting in three points off a Tyler Gray field goal in the closing seconds.
- That fueled JMU's defense into the second half, where it did not give up any points to the host Blue Hens.

THE DAGGER

- After forcing UD into a three-and-out with just under seven minutes to go, Trai Sharp rushed for 23 yards on five consecutive plays to set up a Tyler Gray field goal.
- Gray drilled a career-long, 48 yarder from the left hash to put the Dukes up 10, at 20-10 with only 2:50 to play.

TRAI HAS A DAY

Trai Sharp carried the load on offense, tallying 36 of the Dukes' 54 rushes on the day, as he finished with 185 yards. He began his career performance by ripping off a massive 59-yard rush to put the dukes inside the 10. On the very next play, he pounded it in the end zone from six yards out to give JMU a 7-3 lead. It was Sharp's second 100-yard rushing performance of the year and the fourth of his career.

Strong Defensive Effort Propels #1 Dukes Past #11 Villanova, 30-8

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-ranked James Madison held 11th-ranked Villanova scoreless for three quarters and scored 14 straight points down the stretch to grind out a 30-8 Colonial Ath-letic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon in front of 25,993 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The attendance was the second-largest in school history, trailing the 26,069 at JMU's Oct. 24, 2015 matchup against Richmond.

JMU broke the CAA win-streak record, extending its nation-leading wins mark to 18 wins. That leads all teams both at the FBS and FCS levels. The win was also the 300th for the program.

QUICK HITS

- Defense was the name of the game, as the Dukes limited Villanova to 174 yards of total offense. It was the fifth straight game conceding less than 300 yards and the third time allowing under 200. It was also the fourth time in six games they gave up 10 points or less.
- JMU had three takeaways, including two interceptions. The latter was a pick-six on a 5-yard return by senior linebacker Brandon Hereford with 1:57 to play. It was his first ca-reer interception.
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah was a force up front, making 2.5 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks to move into tie for seventh place all-time at JMU with 21.0 career sacks.
- Redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown paced the defense with a game-high 12 stops (8 solo), and redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had a pass breakup and sack at a crucial juncture in the fourth quarter.
- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor was 20-of-28 for 271 yards and two touchdowns, as he reached 50 career passing touchdowns. He is one shy of Vad Lee and Justin Rascati, who each had 51.
- Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls tied his career high with seven catches for 83 yards. Freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham had two grabs for a career-high 57 yards and a score. Junior receiver David Eldridge also had four receptions for 43 yards and a touchdown.
- JMU out-gained the Wildcats, 316-174, which included a 271-30 advantage in the pass-ing game.

SCHOR SURPASSES PASSING MILESTONE

- Late in the second quarter, Bryan Schor threw his 49th career touchdown pass, but not before reaching a career milestone.
- Needing just 113 passing yards, Schor surpassed 5,000 career yards, becoming the fifth JMU quarterback in history to reach the feat. He now has 5,158 yards for his career.
- He joins an elite list consisting of: Mike Cawley (6,482), Justin Rascati (5,912), Vad Lee (5,652) and Eriq Williams (5,356).

Defense Equals Offense in #1 JMU's 46-14 Rout of William & Mary

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. - Six takeaways and 33 points off turnovers led top-ranked James Madison to a 46-14 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory at William & Mary on Saturday afternoon in front of a sold-out crowd at Zable Stadium.

The Dukes increased the nation's longest win streak to a CAA-record 19th straight victory. JMU is now 7-0 on the year and 4-0 in league play, while the Tribe fell to 2-5 and 0-4. The Dukes have also won eight in a row on the road - their longest in program history.

The 32-point win was also the largest margin-of-victory for the Dukes in the 40-year history of the series, as JMU improved to 23-17 all-time against thé Tribe.

QUICK HITS

- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor tied the JMU record for career passing touchdowns (51) on a two-yard connection with freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham for the first score of the game. That touchdown toss ties him with Vad Lee and Justin Rascati.
- JMU's defense record a season-best six takeaways and scored a season-high 33 points off turnovers. The Dukes out-gained the Tribe 389-298, which marked the sixth straight game JMU has held an opponent to under 300 yards.
- The Dukes tallied six sacks to bring their season total to 24.0, which matches their 2016 total.
- Redshirt senior Jordan Brown tallied a career-best two interceptions, while both junior corners Jimmy Moreland and Rashad Robinson each had one. • Senior receiver Terrence Alls matched his career high for the second straight week, making seven receptions. He also tallied 113 yards (long of 39) for his second career 100-yard game.
- Junior running back Marcus Marshall led JMU's rushing attack with 65 yards and two touchdowns, marking his second two-TD game of 2017.
- The Dukes set a program record with four made field goals, as both junior kicker Tyler Gray and redshirt freshman Ethan Ratke combined to go 4-for-4. Gray hit a game-long 42 yarder, while Ratke knocked down a career-long 39 yarder.

DEFENSE ... JUST DEFENSE

We've stopped trying to name this section, because they continue to impress week in and week out. Here are the tidbits on the Dukes' defense.

- The Dukes limited the Tribe to 298 yards of offense and only 122 yards through three quarters. This was the sixth game in a row JMU has held an opponent to under 300 yards of total offense.
- Redshirt junior Darrious Carter registered a strip-sack and recovered the fumble in the second.
- Brown intercepted his third and fourth passes of the season for the first multi-interception game of his career. He now has eight during his tenure
- W&M did not cross midfield in first half, gaining just 53 yards with two first downs.
- The Dukes never allowed the Tribe to reach the red-zone, forced 6 three-and-outs and held them to 3-of-13 on third down.
- Moreland had a pick-six in the second half, marking the third time he's scored in his career on an interception. He is now tied for 10th all-time with nine interceptions.

Schor Breaks Career Passing TD Record in JMU's 21-0 Shutout Over #17 UNH

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw two touchdowns to set the program record for career passing scores, and topranked James Madison shut out No. 17 New Hampshire for a 21-0 Homecoming victory on Saturday in front of a sold-out Bridgeforth Stadium/ Zane Showker Field.

The attendance of 25,298 was the third sell out of the season and the fifthmost attended game in Bridgeforth history.

The Dukes (8-0, 5-0 CAA) extended their NCAA Division I-best win streak to 20 straight games and tied the Colonial Athletic Association record with their 15th straight league win, while the Wildcats (5-3, 3-2 CAA) were shut out for the first time since Sept. 3, 2016 at San Diego State.

QUICK HITS

- With the win, the Dukes improved to 8-0 on the season, marking the best-start to a season in program history.
- JMU's 20-game win-streak is currently ranked second in all of NCAA college football, trailing just Dvision III's Mary Hardin-Baylor (23).
- For the first time since Oct. 17, 2015 (at Elon 51-0), the Dukes pitched a shutout per-formance. The shutout marked the third consecutive game where the opposition was held scoreless in the first, second and third quarters.
- Bryan Schor's two passing touchdowns moved his career total to 53, surpassing Vad Lee and Justin Rascati for first all-time in JMU history.
- Freshman tight end Clayton Cheatham scored his fourth touchdown of the year and has scored in three straight games.
- Junior cornerback Rashad Robinson returned an interception 82-yards to the house to increase the Dukes lead to 21-0, inevitably sealing the win. It was the third-longest in-terception return in JMU history.
- Redshirt junior cornerback Jimmy Moreland picked up an Andrew Ankrah forced fumble late in the second quarter after UNH had driven the ball deep into JMU territo-ry. This marked Moreland's fifth game in a row with a takeaway and his sixth takeaway of the season.

DEFENSE SWARMS WILDCATS FOR SHUTOUT

- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah led the way with eight total tackles, one tackle for a loss, one pass break-up, and two forced fumbles.
- Redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins had a team-high 10 tackles and a sack, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had a career-best two sacks.
- The Dukes conceded just 193 yards of total offense on the day. This marks the fourth time this season JMU has held its opponent to under 200 yards of total offense, along with the seventh consecutive game allowing under 300 yards of total offense.
- Rashad Robinson's interception was JMU's second straight game with 0a pick-six, fol-lowing Jimmy Moreland's last week at W&M.
- For the first time since the second round playoff win in 2016, UNH QB Trevor Knight was held without a touchdown pass.

SPREADING THE FIELD

Bryan Schor finished the afternoon going 20-of-27 for 176 yards while targeting and completing passes to nine different receivers. Six of those receivers hauled in multiple receptions, with senior receiver John Miller leading the way with five catches for 65 yards.

#1 Dukes Roll in Second Half to Earn 38-3 Win at Rhode Island

KINGSTON, R.I. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw four touchdown passes and No. 1 James Madison used a 31-0 run in the second half to roll past Rhode Island 38-3 in Colonial Athletic Association football on Saturday afternoon at Meade Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 9-0 on the year and 6-0 in CAA play, while the Rams fell to 2-7 and 1-5. It was JMU's 16th straight conference victory, setting a new CAA record. That passed UMass' 50-year old record, set between 1965-67.

QUICK HITS

- With the win, the Dukes picked up their ninth straight road, and extended their CAA-record and Division I-leading win streak to 21 games.
- Bryan Schor threw three of his four touchdown passes in the second half, as JMU out-scored the hosts 31-0 over the final 30 minutes. He was 14-of-17 for 150 yards on the afternoon.
- JMU limited URI to only 18 yards in the second half, while scoring on each of its first five drives of the second stanza.
- Four different receivers caught a touchdown pass, led by redshirt senior receiv-er Terrence Alls, who had five receptions for 73 yards and a score. It was Alls' first score of 2017.
- Freshman running back Percy Agyei-Obese led the Dukes in rushing
- with 95 yards (9.5/carry), which included a career-long 40 yarder. Senior Taylor Woods was also solid with 75 yards on the ground (6.2/carry).
- Ethan Ratke hit a career-long 42-yard field goal late in the third to give the Dukes a 24-3 advantage at the end of three quarters.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene tallied his 12th career interception in the fourth quarter, and is now tied for third all-time at JMU with Dean Marlowe.
- JMU now leads Rhode Island 10-3 in the series record with its eighth straight win over the Rams, and the Dukes are now 4-2 when traveling to Kingston.

SWARMING THE BACKFIELD, SHUTTING DOWN THE RUN

- JMU accumulated 8.0 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks, holding Rhode Island to only 143 yards (18 in the second half). JMU limited URI to only 29 total rushing yards and swarmed the hosts to -13 rushing in the second half.
- Senior linebacker Brandon Hereford led JMU with eighth tackles and a 0.5 tackle for loss, to go with a fumble recovery.
- Redshirt senior defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah had five stops, including 2.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks. He is now tied for sixth all-time at JMU with 24.5 career sacks match-ing Kevin Winston.
- Redshirt senior Simeyon Robinson also had 1.5 sacks, while three others had at least 1.0 sack.

#1 JMU Scores in Final Minute to Top Richmond in Thriller, 20-13

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Junior running back Trai Sharp scored the game-winning touchdown with 44 seconds remaining and top-ranked James Madison survived a Colonial Athletic Association thriller, 20-13, against rival Richmond in front of 24,586 on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The win extended JMU's win streak to a Division I-best 22 straight games and a CAA-record 17th straight conference win. The Dukes moved to 10-0 on the year and 7-0 in CAA play to clinch at least a share of the conference title for the third straight season. The Spiders fell to 5-5 overall and 3-4 in league play.

QUICK HITS

- Tied up at 13-13, JMU ventured on a 10-play, 71-yard drive in which Sharp accounted for 54 rushing yards, capped off by his fourth rushing score of the year. He finished the game with a team-high 60 rushing yards.
- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw for 229 yards, with 18 completions on 32 attempts. He moved into third all-time at JMU in career completions, with 458. Schor needs 14 more passing yards to move into second all-time in program history.
- Junior receiver David Eldridge and redshirt senior receiver Ishmael Hyman led the way by combining for over 150 receiving yards. Eldridge had
- a career-high 81 yards off four catches, and Hyman also had four grabs for 70 yards.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene paced the defense with 11 tackles, while junior corner Rashad Robinson had eight stops and a half-sack. Senior defensive lineman Cornell Urquhart had a team-high 1.5 sacks and redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown collected his team-leading sixth interception of the year.
- JMU tallied four sacks in the win, marking the fifth straight week JMU produced four or more sacks.
- Richmond, which entered Saturday leading the CAA in total offense (470.3) and ranking second in scoring offense (33.3), was limited to 324 yards of offense and just 13 points. The Spiders managed only 20 rushing yards, averaging 1.1 per carry.
- The win was the first by a home team in the series since JMU's 38-31 win in 2013. The Dukes have won four of the past five meetings against the Spiders.

#1 Dukes Capture Outright CAA Championship with 31-3 Win at #11 Elon

ELON, N.C. – Senior quarterback Bryan Schor rushed for three touchdowns and redshirt freshman safety D'Angelo Amos blocked a punt for a score, as top-ranked James Madison rolled to a 31-3 victory at No. 11 Elon to win the outright Colonial Athletic Association Football championship Saturday afternoon at Rhodes Stadium.

The Dukes completed the regular-season slate unbeaten, improving to 11-0 on the year and 8-0 in CAA play. JMU won its second straight outright CAA championship and third overall conference crown. The Dukes also became the first team in CAA history to go 8-0 in league play in consecutive seasons. The Phoenix dropped to 8-3 and 6-2 and will likely earn an at-large bid to the FCS playoffs.

QUICK HITS

- Schor finished with 290 yards of total offense, going 22-of-29 for 214 yards, as well as rushing for 76 yards and three touchdowns on just nine carries (8.4/rush).
- Junior running back Trai Sharp also ran for 68 yards on 11 carries (6.2/rush), as the Dukes tallied 190 yards, going for 5.4 per carry.
- Senior receiver John Miller reeled in a career-high seven receptions, going for 59 yards on the day. Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls added five catches for a game-best 73 receiving yards.
- Defensively, the Dukes were led by redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins, who had a game-high 11 tackles. Senior defensive linemen Cornell Urquhart had a career-high nine tackles, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson had eight stops.

- JMU racked up 6.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks while not conceding a single sack on the offensive side of the ball.
- Special teams recorded points, as Amos blocked a third-quarter punt and picked up the loose ball, running it in from six yards out to make it 24-0.
- In JMU's two games ever at Rhodes Stadium, the Dukes have outscored Elon 82-3. They also won 51-0 back in 2015.

#1 Dukes Advance to FCS Quarters with 26-7 Victory Against #10 SBU

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-seeded James Madison tied a Division I program record with five interceptions and senior quarterback Bryan Schor threw a pair of touchdown passes, as the Dukes advanced to the quarterfinal round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs with a 26-7 victory against 10th-ranked Stony Brook on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/ Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improved to 12-0 on the season to extend their NCAA Division I-leading win streak to 24 straight games, while the Seawolves saw their season end at 10-3, which matched their highest win total in school history.

QUICK HITS

- Redshirt senior receiver Terrence Alls hauled in a career high 10 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown. His performance marked the first time in over 13 years a JMU player has had double-digit receptions. D.D. Boxley snatched 11 on Oct. 16, 2004 at Maine.
- Schor was 26-of-35 for 255 yards and two touchdowns in the win. He moved into first place all-time at JMU in career completions, which now stands at 506. He surpassed Justin Rascati (487) after starting the game 10-for-10 through the air.
- JMU's defense tied a postseason record, holding Stony Brook to just seven points. That matched the 2016 FCS quarterfinal total when the Dukes rolled Sam Houston State 65-7. It was a season-low scoring output for the Seawolves, as they hadn't tallied less than 17 in a single game all year.

- The Dukes matched a program record at the Division I level, tallying five interceptions. The takeaways came from five separate defensive backs, marking the first time in school history five different players had an interception.
- Stony Brook quarterback Joe Carbone had entered Saturday's second round with only three interceptions this year before his five-interception afternoon. He was 15-of-36 for 207 yards and a score.
- Redshirt senior safety Raven Greene capped off JMU's five-interception day on defense, as he reeled in his 13th career interception to tie the program record for most in history. Redshirt senior safety Jordan Brown picked up his seventh interception of the year, tying him for first place in the FCS in 2017. Just behind Brown is junior corner Rashad Robinson, who produced his sixth interception of the year.

BALL HAWKS

The JMU defense tied a program record at the Division I level in the playoff win over Stony Brook, with five interceptions. The Dukes last had five picks in 2016 against Rhode Island. Prior to today, SBU's Carbone had just thrown three picks all year. The five interceptions bested JMU's four interceptions it had at William & Mary on Oct. 21. JMU's five takeaways led to 13 points off turnovers and the first of two fourth-quarter interceptions helped to end a SBU drive early in the fourth deep in JMU territory.

Ratke's Game-Winning Field Goal Sends #1 JMU to FCS Semis with 31-28 Win

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Redshirt freshman kicker Ethan Ratke kicked the game-winning field goal as time expired to send top-seeded James Madison to the national semifinals with a thrilling 31-28 triumph against 11th-ranked Weber State in the NCAA FCS quarterfinals on Friday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (13-0) will await the winner of No. 5 seeded South Dakota State and 21st-ranked New Hampshire in next weekend's semifinals. That game will either be played on Friday Dec. 15 at 8 p.m. on ESPN2 or Saturday, Dec. 16 at 4:30 p.m. on ESPNU. The Wildcats ended their program-best season with an 11-3 overall record.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Trailing 28-20 with 3:14 to play, JMU needed only four plays to go 52 when senior quarterback Bryan Schor connected with redshirt sophomore receiver Riley Stapleton on a 40-yard touchdown with 2:08 remaining. Junior running back Trai Sharp tied it up with a successful 2-point conversion rush.

JMU forced Weber into a three-and-out, giving the Dukes the ball back with 1:06 left. Schor found Stapleton on a 17-yard pass, setting them up at the WSU 39. Three plays later, Head Coach Mike Houston called timeout with one second left, setting up Ratke's game-winner, which was not just his career long but also the longest field goal in JMU postseason history.

QUICK HITS

- JMU scored 11 unanswered points in the final 2:08, sending the Dukes to the national semifinals for the fourth time in program history.
- Ethan Ratke tied a program record with a career-best three field goals, including his 46-yard boot as time expired to win the game.
- Junior running back Marcus Marshall eclipsed the century mark, rushing for 128 yards and two touchdowns. He averaged 9.1 yards per rush on 14 carries. It was his second 100-yard game at JMU and the sixth of his collegiate career.
- Bryan Schor was 21-of-45 for 359 yards and a touchdown, as he became JMU's all-time leader in career passing yards (6,727) and total offense (7,859)
- His top-two receiving targets both went over 100 yards on the night, as redshirt sophomore Riley Stapleton had a career-high 189 yards and a score on eight catches, and redshirt senior Terrence Alls added 117 yards on six grabs. Stapleton tied his career high in receptions and his receiving yards total was the second-most in school history.
- Defensively, redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins tallied a game-high 13 tackles and a tackle-for-loss, and senior linebacker Brandon Hereford finished with 11 stops.
- Redshirt junior corner Jimmy Moreland also had eight tackles and two pass breakups, with his second breakup forcing the punt which set up JMU's game-winning drive. Junior corner Rashad Robinson intercepted his seventh pass of the season while also breaking up a pair of passes. He is now tied for the FCS lead in interceptions with Jordan Brown.
- WSU quarterback Stefan Cantwell tallied three total touchdowns, passing for 238 yards and two score while leading the team with 47 rushing yards and a touchdown. Two receivers had over 80 yards, led by Kevin Smith's 85. That included his 81-yard touchdown in the second half.
- JMU out-gained Weber State 549-329, including 359-238 through the air.

Frisco Bound! JMU Punches Ticket to FCS Title Game Downing SDSU 51-16

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Top-seeded James Madison scored on a quick drive in the final minute of the first half and added a 30-point burst in the third quarter to cruise past No. 5 South Dakota State 51-16 in the semifinals of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoffs on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes (14-0) will compete for its second straight national championship with a match-up against No. 2 North Dakota State on Saturday, Jan. 6, 2018, at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Kickoff is set for noon ET (11 a.m. CT) on ESPN2.

QUICK HITS

- JMU tied its program record for most wins in a season, as it has now won 14 games in back-to-back years.
- The Dukes forced a program-record 10 turnovers, producing a six interceptions and four fumble recoveries, both of which were season highs. The six picks also matched a 44-year old program record when the Dukes were a Division III program.

• Junior running back Marcus Marshall exploded for a career-high 203 rushing yards and two touchdowns on just 15 carries (13.5 avg.). In the third quarter alone, he ran six times for 166 yards, which included touchdown runs of 65 yards and a career-long 87 yards.

- Senior quarterback Bryan Schor passed for 203 yards and two touchdowns. Redshirt sophomore receiver Riley Stapletoncaught both of his touchdown passes, as he had five catches for 70 yards. Junior David Eldridge also had five receptions for 75 yards.
- Both a single-season record and career record were set in Saturday's win as redshirt senior safeties Jordan Brown and Raven Greene both went to the top of the interception charts. Brown made two interceptions to set the JMU single-season record, with nine. Greene had a 59-yard pick-six late in the third for his JMU career-record 14th interception. Brown now leads all FCS players in interceptions this year.
- Redshirt junior corner Jimmy Moreland tied a program record, coming away with three interceptions, including two in the first quarter. He now has eight picks this year, which ranks second in the FCS behind his teammate, Brown.
- Junior cornerback Rashad Robinson led all players with a career-high 12 tackles while also making his first career sack. Brown also made eight stops and recovered a fumble. Redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins had two fumble recoveries, senior linebacker Brandon Hereford had a forced fumble and a recovery and redshirt junior defensive lineman Darrious Carterforced a pair of fumbles and had two of JMU's five sacks.
- The Dukes out-gained the Jackrabbits 463-366, which included a 257-120 lead in the ground game. JMU averaged 6.6 yards per rush and had a +8 turnover margin.

Dukes Edged in National Title Slugfest

FRISCO, Texas – No. 1 James Madison did not allow a point in the second half on Saturday afternoon, but could not complete the comeback as No. 2 North Dakota State handed the Dukes a 17-13 loss in the 2018 NCAA Division I National Championship Game in Toyota Stadium.

JMU (14-1) held the high-powered Bison (14-1) offense, which entered the contest ranked eighth in the country at 462.1 yards per game, in check for much of the afternoon, limiting NDSU to just 264 yards on the afternoon. However, the Bison kept the Dukes to just 241 yards, including just 93 on the ground.

After cutting into a 17-3 first-half deficit with a field goal just before half-time, the Dukes came out of the break with a stop on defense and a 33-yard punt return from redshirt freshman D'Angelo Amos to set up an 8-play, 33-yard drive that cut the lead to four.

After both defenses traded stops for much of the remainder of the contest, the Dukes kept their hopes alive when redshirt senior defensive lineman Simeyon Robinson burst through the line and blocked a 38-yard NDSU field goal attempt with 4:37 to play. JMU drove down the field, aided by a 24-yard rush by freshman Harry O'Kelly on a fake punt, but saw its fourth-down heave to the end zone fall to the turf with less than a minute to play.

Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Riley Stapleton continued his tear in

the playoffs, catching seven balls for 107 yards on the afternoon, while Robinson notched a pair of sacks in his final game, including a strip sack that gave the Dukes the ball. Amos was a constant threat on punt returns, racking up 87 yards on just four returns to flip field position multiple times.

Redshirt senior linebacker Kyre Hawkins finished with a game-high 10 tackles, finishing the year with a team-high 111 total stops. Redshirt junior defensive lineman Darrious Carter had eight stops, including 2.0 for loss and a sack, while Robinson tied his career high with 2.0 sacks.

The loss snapped JMU's NCAA-leading 26-game winning streak and dropped the Dukes to 2-1 in FCS National Championship games.

THE WINNINGEST CLASS IN HISTORY

JMU's 2017 senior class goes down as the best in school history. In JMU's 55 games over the past four years, JMU has amassed a 46-9 record, including 28-4 Colonial Athletic Association mark. These seniors became the first class in JMU history to make four straight FCS playoff appearances and the first ever to claim at least nine overall wins and six league wins each season. JMU captured the 2016 national championship, the second ever for the University.

BRYAN LEAVES LASTING LEGACY

JMU's entire senior class set the standard for JMU football, reaching back-to-back national championships. Senior quarterback Bryan Schor will go down as one of the best to ever don a JMU jersey, finishing his career with four JMU career records. Schor finished up with 7,078 passing yards, 62 passing touchdowns, 559 completions and 8,241 yards of total offense. He was a two-time All-CAA quarterback and was voted 2016 CAA Offensive Player of the Year.



Charles Haley ~ Pro Football Hall of Fame



Former football All-American Charles Haley became the first James Madison student-athlete to be enshrined into a major professional hall of fame as he took his rightful place into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Saturday, August 8, 2015, at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium.

Haley was introduced by Edward DeBartolo, Jr., former owner of the San Francisco 49ers prior to his speech to the capacity crowd in Canton. He was one of eight individuals to join pro football's most exclusive club, as he was accompanied by linebacker Junior Seau, guard Will Shields, running back Jerome Bettis, wide receiver Tim Brown, center Mike Tinglehoff and NFL executives Bill Polian and Ron Wolf.

A four-year letterwinner for the Dukes from 1982-85, he was twice named an Associated Press All-American. As a senior, Haley was named the Richmond Touchdown Club's Defensive Player of the Year and a First Team AP I-AA All-American.

"I am truly blessed," Haley said during his enshrinement speech. "I have played with some of the greatest players in the history of football and I've learned a lot. The one thing I learned from all the guys was unselfish play. Team matters — we need to go back to that. It's not about individuals, it's about team and that's the only way we can have success."

Haley capped off his speech by stating, "When I stepped out on the field, I was determined to be the best every play, not just some plays."

He is JMU's all-time leader in total tackles with 506 and led the Dukes in single-season tackles twice in his career, recording 143 in 1983 and 147 in 1984. Haley had a careerhigh 22 tackles at Shippensburg during the 1983 season, currently tied for the eighth-highest, single-game total in Madison history. A three-time JMU Defensive MVP, he was also named the JMU Male Athlete of the Year in 1985-86. Haley graduated from JMU in 1987 and in 1999 the athletic department named the Defensive MVP award after him.

Haley became the first player in JMU history selected in the National Football League Draft when he was selected by the San Francisco 49ers in the fourth round of the 1986 draft. He immediately made an impact, playing in 16 games as a rookie, recording 12.0 sacks. He played 12 seasons in the NFL, seven with the 49ers in two different stints and five with the Dallas Cowboys.



He earned five Super Bowl rings (two in San Francisco and three in Dallas), the only player in NFL history to have played on five Super Bowl champion teams. A five-time Pro-Bowler and two-time First Team All-Pro selection, Haley finished his career with 100.5 career sacks, including a career-high 16 in 1990, the first year he was honored as an All-Pro. He was also a two-time NFC Defensive Player of the Year and played on 10 division championship squads during his 12-year career.

A native of Gladys, Va., Haley was inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

The Hall of Fame committee consists of 32 votes of writers from the NFL cities, 13 at-large members and one from the Pro Football Writers of America. Each candidate was required to receive at least 80 percent approval votes from the Committee to be enshrined.


Charles Haley ~ College Football Hall of Fame

On July 15-16, 2011, former JMU All-American Charles Haley became the first player from a CAA school to be enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Haley was a four-year starter at JMU from 1982-85. He was a two-time All-American and a three-time Defensive MVP at Madison. As a senior at JMU, Haley was voted a 1985 Associated Press First-Team I-AA All-American and both the Richmond Touchdown Club and Roanoke Times & World News' State Defensive Player of the Year. He leads JMU's all-time tackles list with 506, including three seasons of more than 100 tackles, and his 22 tackles at Shippensburg during the 1983 season still ranks as the eighth-highest single-game total in JMU history. He also added three interceptions and 17 quarterback sacks to his total.

In 1986, after his senior season Haley was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers as the No. 96 pick overall.







Charles Haley shows off his College Football Hall of Fame class ring





National Champions!!! Dukes Defeat Montana 31-21

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - National champion.

That's a title that forever will be used with the 2004 JMU football team.

The Dukes earned that distinction Friday at Finley Stadium/Davenport with a 31-21 victory over Montana in the finals of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

The Dukes, as they have for most of the season, used a stingy defense, a strong running game, and good special teams play to post the biggest win in their 33-year football history.

JMU allowed a first-quarter touchdown for the only time during the 2004 season and trailed twice, but the Dukes rallied to dominate the final minutes of the game as they did for most of the season.

JMU went in front to stay 24-21 on a one-yard touchdown run by sophomore tailback Maurice Fenner with 3:25 left in the third quarter, added an insurance score on sophomore quarterback Justin Rascati's six-yard run with eight minutes left in the game, and ran the final 6:14 off the clock after getting an interception from junior cornerback Clint Kent.

The Dukes used 14 straight rushing plays in running out the clock at the end of the game and nine straight rushing plays during the 72-yard drive that put them in front to stay.

JMU ran for 314 yards overall - 257 during the second half - and had a 318-202 overall yardage advantage during the final two periods.

Fenner led JMU's attack with 164 rushing yards on 29 carries and ran for two touchdowns. Sophomore tailback Alvin Banks added 88 rushing yards on 13 carries, and Rascati ran 11 times for 57 yards and two scores. Rascati also hit on 13 of 18 passes for 132 yards and wasn't intercepted.

In addition to the score that put JMU in front to stay, Fenner scored on a one-yard run with 0:16 left in the first quarter to give JMU a 10-7 edge. Rascati ran 11 yards for a touchdown on JMU's first third-quarter series in addition to his fourth-period scoring carry.

"We went into the game planning to throw the ball, but we were making so many yards rushing that we didn't need to throw," said sixth-year JMU coach Mickey Matthews.

"Our league is great; that was Atlantic 10 football in the second half," Matthews added. "Our league is by far the best in the country. Playing in our league really prepared us to play in this environment against Montana. Our guys thought they were going to win."

The victory was JMU's fifth straight overall and its fourth in the playoffs away from home. The Dukes completed the year with a 13-2 record and became the second straight Division I-AA champion from the Atlantic 10 (Delaware was the 2003 playoff winner). No other team previously had advanced to the championship with straight road wins.

JMU's effort off set an outstanding performance by Montana quarterback Craig Ochs, a transfer from Colorado. Ochs completed 29 of 38 passes for 371 yards and three touchdowns, but the Grizzlies had only 44 rushing yards against JMU's defense.

NATIONAL CHAMPS! JMU Tops Youngstown State 28-14

FRISCO, Texas - James Madison held Youngstown State to 292 total yards on Saturday afternoon and rolled to a 28-14 victory, as the Dukes captured the 2016 NCAA Division I Football Championship, the second title in program history.

The Dukes, who finished the season 14-1 and undefeated against FCS foes, saw their defensive line dominate from start to finish, holding the Penguins (12-4) to just 21 rushing yards after YSU entered the contest averaging 257.5 yards on the ground.

Senior linebacker Gage Steele paced an all-around dominant performance by the JMU defense, racking up six tackles, including five solo stops, a pair of sacks and a pass breakup as the Dukes forced a pair of crucial turnovers in the third quarter to put the game away.

No defensive player had more tackles for the Dukes than junior defensive back Jordan Brown's seven, but nine different players had at least three, while sophomore defensive back Curtis Oliver picked off his second pass of the season and sophomore Darrious Carter scooped up a fumble.

Senior running back Khalid Abdullah ended his career in style, rushing 26 times for 101 yards and a pair of scores for an afternoon that put him atop the JMU record books in career touchdowns, single-season touchdowns and single-season rushing yards.

The Dukes needed just 12 passes to take home the trophy, as junior quarterback Bryan Schor went 7-of-12 for 112 yards with a pair of first-quarter touchdowns to junior tight end Jonathan Kloosterman and senior wide receiver Rashard Davis.

JMU put the Penguins in an early hole, as Abdullah stretched the lead to 21-0 on a 1-yard touchdown plunge with 8:17 to play before halftime, though YSU responded with a touchdown of its own less than five minutes later.

Abdullah scored from two yards out with 10:10 to play in the third quarter for an advantage that proved to be all the Dukes' defense needed, as Youngstown State managed just one more scoring drive that ended with 10 seconds left before the final whistle.

TITLE HISTORY

JMU captured its second NCAA Division I Championship in program history, joining the 2004 team that defeated Montana 31-21 in Chattanooga. The Dukes are the eighth FCS program to earn multiple national titles and the first ever with multiple in the Colonial Athletic Association. JMU ended the five-year national-title run by North Dakota State and became the first CAÁ national champion since Villanova in 2009.

HOUSTON'S HEIGHTS

Head Coach Mike Houston earned his first career national championship, having finished runner-up in the NCAA Division II title game at Lenoir-Rhyne in 2013. Houston improved to 5-1 all-time in the FCS playoffs, 4-0 at JMU thanks to the 2016 run.

FINAL NUMBERS

- JMU won its 12th game in a row for the longest active streak in FCS football and second-longest in all of Division I behind Alabama (26)
- JMU's 14-1 overall record included a perfect 14-0 mark against FCS opponents and set a new school record for victories
- JMU finished as the nation's leader in scoring margin at +25.5 points per game, second in points per game (46.7) and 16th in points allowed (21.2)
- JMU went 6-0 vs. ranked opponents this season, all during the last seven contests

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

JMU finished the season 16th nationally in points allowed after ranking 77th in 2015 in that category. In addition to allowing 21.2 points per game, the Dukes limited opponents to 16.4 points per game over the last eight games and 15 per game in the playoffs, all against ranked teams. Also, 21 of the 60 postseason points allowed came in the final two minutes of games in which the outcome was already decided.

Key Dates in JMU History

- July 17, 1972 Athletic Director Dean Ehlers announced that JMU would start football in 1972 and named Challace McMillin head coach.
- Oct. 7, 1972 JMU played its first football game, losing 6-0 to Shepherd's junior varsity team on what is now a practice field adjacent to Godwin Hall
- **Sept. 22, 1973** JMU won its first game, a 34-8 triumph over Anne Arundel Community College, held at Harrisonburg High School.
- **Sept. 21, 1974** JMU began its first varsity season with a 24-22 win at Washington and Lee.
- Oct. 12, 1974 JMU defeated Bridgewater 41-13 in the first game ever at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- **1975 Season** JMU finished 9-0-1 with a season-opening scoreless tie at Glenville (W.Va.), its only non win of the season. JMU won the Virginia College Athletic Association title and won seven straight games by seven points or fewer.
- **Sept. 18, 1976** JMU beat Towson 28-26 at home, raising its record to 3-0 and its winning streak to 12 games, earning a tie for first place with C.W. Post in the NCAA Division III poll.
- **Sept. 25, 1976** JMU played in the first Division III regular-season game televised by a major network (ABC), falling 21-14 at Hampden-Sydney.
- Oct. 16, 1976 JMU won 17-12 at Davidson, marking the program's first win against a Division I opponent.
- Oct. 14, 1978 JMU's Board of Visitors unanimously approved moving football to Division I.
- **Nov. 11, 1978** JMU won 42-12 at Emory and Henry to finish the year 8-2 and ranked ninth nationally in Division III.
- **Dec. 18, 1978** JMU announced it would offer 25 scholarships in 1979. Quarterback Frankie Walker and fullback Joe Curro, transfers from Lees-McRae College, were the team's first scholarship signees on Jan. 17, 1979.
- **1982 Season** JMU finished 8-3 and appeared in the Division I-AA top-20 poll for seven straight weeks, ranking as high as ninth at the midway point of the season.
- **Sept. 18, 1982** JMU earned its first win over a I-A opponent, defeating Virginia 21-17 in Charlottesville.
- **Jan. 4, 1984 -** Wide receiver Gary Clark became JMU's first player to be drafted to a professional football team, going as the sixth overall pick to Jacksonville in the United States Football League Draft.
- **Dec. 20, 1984 -** Joe Purzycki became JMU's second head coach, replacing Challace McMillin.
- **April 29, 1986** Linebacker Charles Haley, JMU's first Division I-AA First Team All-American, became the first Duke to be selected in the National Football League Draft, going in the fourth round to San Francisco.
- **1987 Season** JMU turned in its best record to date during the scholarship era, going 9-3 and reaching the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the first time. JMU was nationally ranked for nine straight weeks, ranking as high as third.
- **Dec. 14, 1990** Rip Scherer became JMU's third head coach, replacing Joe Purzycki.
- **1991 Season** JMU reached the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the first time, finishing 9-4 on the year. They were nationally ranked for nine straight weeks and beat four ranked teams, including three on the road.
- **1993 Season** JMU first played in the Yankee Conference after joining the league in 1991.
- **1994 Season** JMU set a team record for wins to that point, at 10-3, and reached the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the second time. JMU was nationally ranked for 10 of last 11 weeks and beat four of five ranked teams it faced.
- **Jan. 23, 1995** Alex Wood became JMU's fourth head coach, replacing Rip Scherer, who took the head coaching job at Memphis.
- **1995 Season** The 8-4 Dukes returned to the playoffs for the second straight season and were ranked in every poll during the season by The Sports Network.
- **1997 Season** The Atlantic 10 Football Conference assumed the operations of the Yankee Conference.
- March 19, 1999 Mickey Matthews became JMU's fifth head coach, replacing Alex Wood, who resigned to take an assistant job with the Minnesota Vikings.

- **1999 Season** JMU won its first Division I conference crown, tying for first in the Atlantic 10. Mickey Matthews was named Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the Sports Network and Curtis Keaton was drafted to the NFL in the fourth round by Cincinnati. Keaton was A-10 Offensive Player of the Year while Chris Morant was Defensive Player of the Year.
- **2000 Season** Delvin Joyce became the first Division I-AA player to reach 1,000 career yards in rushing (1,260), receiving (1,009), kickoff returns (1,902) and punt returns (1,488).
- **2001 Season** Derrick Lloyd won the Buck Buchanan Award, recognizing the Division I-AA's top defensive player.
- **June 6, 2003** JMU broke ground on the Robert and Frances Plecker Athletic Performance Facility, adjacent to Bridgeforth Stadium.
- **Dec. 17, 2004** JMU won the NCAA Division I-AA national title, beating Montana 31-21 in Chattanooga, Tenn. The 13-2 Dukes set a team record for wins and became the first I-AA team to win three road playoff games in the same season. Mickey Matthews was named Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.
- **2006 Season** The 9-4 Dukes made their second playoff appearance in three seasons, and held national rankings in every poll by The Sports Network, including a top-10 ranking in the final seven polls.
- **2007 Season** The Colonial Athletic Association assumed the operations of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. JMU went 8-4 and made its third NCAA appearance in four seasons, ranking in every poll by both The Sports Network and FCS coaches.
- **2008 Season** JMU won the CAA title, going 8-0 in conference play, and was the top seed for the NCAA FCS playoffs, finishing 12-2. It was JMU's fourth postseason appearance in five years and Mickey Matthews was named National Coach of the Year by The Sports Network and Liberty Mutual.
- **Sept. 11, 2010** JMU stunned No. 13 Virginia Tech 21-16 in Blacksburg, Va., outscoring the Hokies 14-3 in the second half. Drew Dudzik rushed for two touchdowns and threw for a third as the Dukes knocked off the preseason ACC favorites in the second-ever upset of a ranked FBS team by an FCS opponent.
- **July 16, 2011** Charles Haley became the first JMU and CAA player to ever be enshrined to the College Football Hall of Fame.
- **Dec. 20, 2013** Everett Withers became JMU's sixth head coach, replacing Mickey Matthews.
- **2014 Season** JMU broke nearly every passing record in program history, going 9-4 to return to the FCS playoffs for the first time since 2011. JMU won its final seven games of the regular season.
- **Aug. 8, 2015** Charles Haley became JMU's first player to be enshrined to the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- **Sept. 26, 2015** Vad Lee was the first Division I (FCS or FBS) player to pass and rush for 275 yards in the same game, leading JMU to a 48-45 win at FBS foe SMU.
- **Oct. 24, 2015** ESPN College GameDay came to James Madison's campus, broadcasting live from the Quad and Wilson Hall. The Dukes broke the Bridgeforth Stadium attendance record (26,069) for Homecoming against Richmond.

- Oct. 29, 2016 JMU scores program-record 84 points in Homecoming win against Rhode Island.
