DUKES AND WILDCATS CLASH FOR SPOT IN TITLE GAME

- Second-seeded JMU is back home once more this season on Saturday, Dec. 21 when it hosts third-seeded Weber State in the FCS Playoffs semifinals.
- Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. at Bridgeforth Stadium and will be televised nationally on ESPNU. It will also be streamed on ESPN3 and the Watch ESPN app. Pregame radio coverage on the JMU Sprint Broadcast Network begins at 5:30 p.m.
- Saturday marks the second meeting between the teams in what pits a rematch of the 2017 FCS quarterfinals. JMU rallied for a 31-28 win following a walk-off field goal by Ethan Ratke.
- JMU's run through the 2019 FCS Playoffs is presented by Excel Heating and Cooling.

JMU IN THE PLAYOFFS

- JMU is making 16th playoff appearance in 2019, which includes a program-record, sixth-straight berth this season.
- The Dukes are 19-13 in the playoffs with a pair of national championships - 2004 and 2016. They also advanced to the title game in 2017, falling just short (17-13 vs. North Dakota State).
- This year marks the fourth time JMU has earned a national seed since the field expanded to 24 teams and the fifth time ever. The Dukes were No. 1 both in 2008 and 2017, No. 2 in 2019, No. 4 in 2016 and No. 5 in 2015.
- JMU has won multiple playoff games now in five postseason trips, going 4-0 in both national title runs, 3-1 in 2017's national runner-up finish, 2-1 in 2008 when it reached the semifinals and 2-0 in the current run.
- The Dukes are 11-4 at home in the postseason, while also going 6-8 on the road and 2-1 in neutral-site games.

DUKES AGAINST THE BIG SKY

- Saturday marks JMU's fourth meeting against a Big Sky Conference team, all of which have come in the postseason.
- This marks the second time in three seasons WSU has visited Bridgeforth Stadium.
- JMU is 2-1 against the Big Sky, upending Weber State 31-28 in the 2017 quarterfinals while also splitting two playoff games against Montana. JMU defeated the Griz 31-21 in the 2004 national championship game while falling to Montana 35-27 in the 2018 national semifinals.

RECORD 10 DUKES NAMED HERO SPORTS ALL-AMERICANS

- James Madison placed a program-record 10 athletes on the 2019 HERO Sports FCS All-America Team.
- Ron'Dell Carter and Liam Fornadel earned First Team All-America status.
- Second Team members included Ben DiNucci, John Daka, Dimitri Holloway and D'Angelo Amos.
- Making the Third Team were Percy Agyei-Obese, Mac Patrick, Adam Smith and Ethan Ratke.
- JMU has never produced more than seven All-Americans on a single team, as it beat the previous records from the 1994 and 2008 Sports Network (STATS) All-America Teams and 2016 HERO Sports All-America Team.

SCOUTING WEBER STATE

- The Wildcats enter Saturday's semifinal with an 11-3 record following a 17-10 comeback win vs. Montana.
- Weber averages 28.8 points per game while conceding 20.1 to its foes.
- Offensively, WSU gains 345.4 yards per game, which is last in the Big Sky. It averages 156.6 on the ground while passing for 188.8 per outing.
- Josh Davis leads the rushing attack with 1,075 yards and 11 touchdowns, averaging 6.3 per carry.
- Jake Constantine has thrown for 2,037 yards and 13 touchdowns with 10 interceptions. Devon Cooley, who has 56 catches for 691 yards and five scores.
- Defensively, Weber leads the Big Sky in scoring defense while also ranking 14th in the FCS in rushing defense (113.5). WSU has a Big Sky-best 17 interceptions and 44 sacks and holds foes to 32.3% on third down.
- Conner Mortensen leads the Wildcats with 91 tackles, while Adam Rodriguez has 14.0 TFL and 10.5 sacks.
- Jay Hill is in his sixth year at the helm, holding a 47-29 record. He's guided Weber to three straight Big Sky titles and a school-record four straight playoff berths.

ACTIVE STREAKS ENTERING SEMIS

- 13-game win streak - second longest active in FCS
- 11 straight wins at Bridgeforth Stadium
- 8 straight home playoff wins
- 15 straight home non-conference wins
- 26 straight games with foes under 50% on third down
- Held opponents to under 100 rush yards in 8 straight
- Out-rushed opponents in 18 straight games
- Scored a rushing TD in 19 straight games

HISTORICAL REFERENCE TO START

- JMU's extended its win streak to 13 with its win versus Northern Iowa, marking a historical achievement.
- JMU has started a season with at least 13 wins in its first 14 three times, including three times since 2016.
- In each previous instance, JMU advanced to the national championship game, as it began 13-1 in 2016 and 14-0 in 2017.
- JMU also completed the CAA slate 8-0 this year for the fourth time in school history, as it also accomplished the feat in 2008, 2016 and 2017.

LAST TIME OUT FOR THE DUKES...

- JMU turned in its first postseason shutout in school history, setting multiple defensive records in a 17-0 win against #6 Northern Iowa in the quarterfinals.
- The Dukes held UNI without a rushing yard and to only 114 yards of offense - both playoff program records.
- JMU gained 189 yards on the ground, led by Percy Agyei-Obese's 124 yards and a touchdown.
- Ben DiNucci passed for 157 yards and a score. Brandon Polk had seven catches for 59 yards and a TD.
- This season is the first that JMU has ever produced a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in Agyei-Obese and Polk.
- Dimitri Holloway had a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss and John Daka made two sacks in the win.

LAST TIME JMU AND WEBER MET...

- Ethan Ratke drilled the game-winning, 46-yard field goal as time expired to lift JMU to a 31-28 win over Weber State back on Dec. 8, 2017 in the FCS quarters.
- JMU trailed 28-20 with 3:14 to play before Bryan Schor connected with Riley Stapleton on a 40-yard touchdown with 2:08 to play. After a Trai Sharp two-point conversion, JMU's defense forced Weber into a three-and-out, setting up the game-winning drive.

CARTER TOP-3 BUCHANAN FINALIST

- Ron'Dell Carter is invited to the STATS FCS Legacy Awards Banquet in Frisco after being one of the top-three vote getters for the Buck Buchanan Award.
- The Buchanan is given annually to the FCS' top defensive player.
- JMU has had two winners of the Buchanan, as Arthur Moats won in 2009 and Derrick Lloyd in 2001. JMU has

now produced 13 finalists for the award.

- Carter is joined by Nicholl's Sully Laiche and Montana's Dante Olson on the top-three list.
- The winner will be announced on January 10, the night before the national title game.

DEFENSIVE PROWESS

- Following its first postseason shutout, JMU's defense ranks in the top 10 of nine statistical categories.
- It leads the FCS in total defense (265.3), rushing defense (60.4) and first-down defense (14.1).
- The Dukes also rank second on third down (29.5%), third in both scoring defense (14.9) and tackles for loss (9.1), sixth in both pass efficiency defense (110.85) and sacks (3.29) and seventh in interceptions (17).
- John Daka is second with 1.18 sacks per game and 1.9 TFL per game.
- Ron'Dell Carter is fourth with 1.8 tackles per game and 13th with 0.82 sacks per contest.

SINGLE-SEASON RECORD WATCH

- Entering the national semifinals, JMU is nearing four single-season team records.

JMU VS. TOP-FIVE FOES ALL-TIME

- The game on Oct. 12 marked JMU's 40th game all-time against teams ranked inside the top five.
- The Dukes are now 16-24 against top-five teams, including a 7-7 record against fifth-ranked squads.
- This was also the fifth time a Villanova team played JMU ranking in the top five, with VU leading those games 3-2.
- Both JMU wins came with VU ranked #5. The first was in 2004 (17-0) and the latter this season (38-24).
- The '04 win was the first of JMU's nine ranked wins on its way to capturing the 2004 NCAA Division I-AA national title.

NUMEROUS RECORDS SET IN MONMOUTH WIN

- JMU put up big numbers en route to a 66-21 win against Monmouth, setting seven program playoff records in the process.
- The Dukes recorded the most points in a playoff game, reeling off 66, while gaining the most yards in the 31-game playoff history, with 623 yards.
- JMU had the highest team completion percentage (.852), ran the most plays (90), recorded the most first downs (36) and tied records for total touchdowns (9) and points scored in the first quarter (21).
- Percy Agyei-Obese and Ben DiNucci also turned in individual program records in a playoff game, as Agyei-Obese tied the single-game rushing touchdown mark, with three, and DiNucci completed 84% of his passes on 21-of-25 passing.

3 FINALISTS FOR STATS MAJOR AWARDS

- JMU defensive ends Ron'Dell Carter and John Daka were finalists for the 2019 Buck Buchanan Award.
- It is given annually to the FCS' top defensive player.
- Curt Cignetti was also one of 15 finalists up for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the national coach of the year in the FCS.
- Daka finished seventh in the Buchanan voting, and Cignetti was sixth for the Robinson.
- Carter is a top-three finalist for the Buchanan Award.

THE WINNINGEST SENIOR CLASS

- JMU's 2019 seniors have won more games than any class that has come before them in Harrisonburg.
- With its win over UNI in the quarters, JMU's seniors became the first group to win 50 games, as it's gone 50-7 for the Dukes.
- With JMU's win over Richmond on Nov. 16, the senior class moved into #1 on the program's all-time list.
- This group surpassed the 2017 and 2018 seniors, who both had a 46-9 record.
- The Dukes won outright conference titles in 2016, 2017 and 2019 and also captured the 2016 national title.
- They were part of JMU's program-record, 26-game win streak between the 2016 and 2017 seasons.

DINUCCI, CARTER HEADLINE CAA AWARDS

- Quarterback Ben DiNucci was voted CAA Offensive Player of the Year, and defensive end Ron'Dell Carter was named CAA Defensive Year for 2019.
- DiNucci is one of the nation's most efficient passers, leading in completion percentage (71.5%) and ranking second in efficiency (177.5). He has passed for 2,825 yards and 24 scores with just four interceptions.
- Carter is one of the top defenders in FCS, as he ranks third with 24.0 tackles for loss and 15th with 10.5 sacks.

RECORD 18 ALL-CAA HONORS

- In addition to Ben DiNucci and Ron'Dell Carter, the Dukes reeled in 18 all-conference honors from 17 different players, setting a program record.
- JMU also set a school record with 11 First Team All-CAA selections
- Joining DiNucci and Carter on the First Team were Percy Agyei-Obese, Liam Fornadel, Mac Patrick, Ethan Ratke, D'Angelo Amos (both PR and S), John Daka, Dimitri Holloway and Adam Smith.
- Second Team members included Brandon Polk, Dylan Stapleton and Rashad Robinson.
- Making the Third Team were Jawon Hamilton, Truvell Wilson, Mike Greene and Landan Word.

UNDISPUTED CAA CHAMPS

- JMU went unbeaten in Colonial Athletic Association play, winning the 2019 conference title by two games.
- The Dukes have won three outright titles in four years, four overall crowns in five seasons.
- Since joining the CAA in 1993 for football, JMU has won seven conference titles, which is tied with rival Richmond. JMU has eight total in program history, adding in the 1975 VCAA championship as a Division III program.
- The Dukes have won the conference outright on four occasions, which is more than any other CAA squad. New Hampshire and Maine have two outright crowns during the time span and seven others have one.
- JMU has also gone 8-0 in CAA play four seasons (2008, 2016, 2017, 2019). It has only been accomplished 10 total times since 1993, as UNH did it twice (1994, 2014) and four others achieved it once.

RATKE 4TH IN CAA HISTORY

- Ethan Ratke is already JMU's all-time leader in made field goals and now sets his sights on the CAA record.
- He's currently fourth with 53 field goals.
- Towson's Aidan O'Neill is the current leader with 64 career field goals.
- He's one of six in CAA history to make at least 50.

CARTER, FORNADEL TOP LINEMEN IN STATE

- Ron'Dell Carter and Liam Fornadel were named the top players in the position in the state of Virginia.
- The Touchdown Club of Richmond named Carter the Division I Defensive Lineman of the Year and Fornadel the Division I Offensive Lineman of the Year.
- The duo were honored on Sunday, Dec. 15 at the Dudley & Lanier Awards Banquet in Richmond.
- Additionally, Carter was one of three finalists for the Bill Dudley Award, given to the top Division I player in the state.
- He is the 13th finalist in school history.

CARTER ACCEPTS BOWL BID

- CAA Defensive Player of the Year Ron'Dell Carter has accepted an invitation to compete in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.
- The game will be played on Jan. 18 at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.
- Carter is the third JMU player to compete in the Collegiate Bowl, joining Stephon Robertson and Josh Wells in 2013.

DUKES RANK #2 IN EVERY POLL

- JMU was ranked #2 in every STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches Poll during the regular season.
- North Dakota State was the consensus #1 team in both the polls and the national seed for the postseason.
- The Dukes have been nationally ranked every week since Nov. 10, 2014 and inside the top 15 every week since the start of the 2015 season.
- It's also been top 10 every week since Sept. 26, 2016.

DUKES 7-0 VS. RANKED TEAMS

- JMU completed the regular season with an unblemished record against ranked opponents, going 5-0 during conference play.
- With its playoff wins against #14 Monmouth and #6 UNI, JMU moved to 7-0 vs. ranked foes in 2019.
- JMU rallied for a win against #5 Villanova while also notching top-25 wins against #16 Towson, #23 New Hampshire, at #24 Elon and at #24 Stony Brook.
- Three of JMU's four home conference games were against teams who ranked in the top 25. Richmond was also receiving votes for the Nov. 16 game.

LOPSIDED NUMBERS IN CAA PLAY

- JMU dominated statistically during CAA play, outscoring its eight league foes by a 350-135, averaging wins by 43.8 to 16.9.
- The Dukes outrushed CAA foes by over 1,500 yards, averaging 256.0 rushing yards per league game, as opposed to conceding 59.6 per outing.
- JMU scored 45 touchdowns in CAA play, allowing 16. It scored on 95% of red-zone trips (38/40), with 73% coming by way of touchdowns (29).
- Third down also heavily favored the Dukes, as it converted 56% (62/110) and holding opponents to 34% on third down (37/110).
- JMU is also +11 in the turnover margin in CAA play, forcing 19 turnovers (13 INT, 6 FR).

.500 OR BETTER NOW 17 STRAIGHT YRS

- JMU's success from year to year has come to be expected, as the Dukes have secured at least a .500 record or better for a league-best 17 straight seasons.
- JMU also produced its 15th winning season during the timeframe this season, the only team in the CAA to achieve the feat.
- The Dukes have now secured a winning record in 30 of their 48 seasons since beginning football in 1972.
- JMU has tallied nine wins in a program-record five consecutive seasons from 2015-19.

DINUCCI ON TO CFPA WATCH LIST

- Ben DiNucci was one of 34 named to the CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year Midseason Watch List.
- The winner is selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.
- This is the second straight year he is up for the award.

JMU AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- The Dukes have faced 15 teams from the Commonwealth since beginning football in 1972.
- In 150 games, JMU has racked up an 89-61 record against teams from around the state.
- The Dukes have played William & Mary (25-17) more than any other state team, at 42 games, and have faced Richmond (19-18) 37 times and Liberty (12-6) on 18 occasions.

DAKA REELS IN NATIONAL HONOR

- Senior defensive end John Daka had a career outing in JMU's win over Villanova, resulting in him being awarded CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Week and STATS FCS National Defensive Player of the Week.
- Daka contributed career highs of nine tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. He also forced a fumble that set up a game-tying touchdown early in the fourth quarter. His 5.0 tackles for loss were the most by a CAA player this season until Ron'Dell Carter registered 6.0 the following week.
- It was first career CAA weekly honor for Daka. He also became JMU's first national player of the week since Oct. 15, 2018 when D'Angelo Amos was named STATS FCS Special Teams Player of the Week after last season's Villanova game.

RATKE THE KICKING KING OF JMU

- Ethan Ratke sits alone atop the record books for JMU career field goals, as he's made 53 career field goals.
- He surpassed John Coursey, who made 39 from 1993-96. Ratke made his 40th on a 44 yarder at Elon.
- Ratke is also first at JMU in career scoring (299), which he became the leader at Rhode Island.

FUTURE GAMES ANNOUNCED

- JMU Athletics announced a home-and-home series with another FCS power, as well as a big matchup against an FBS state foe for future seasons.
- The Dukes will face Weber State out of the Big Sky in the 2021 and 2022 seasons. JMU will travel to Ogden, Utah on Sept. 18, 2021, marking JMU's furthest trip in school history. The two will open the 2022 season in Harrisonburg on Sept. 3, 2022.
- JMU also announced a future game at Virginia Tech, which will take place on Sept. 20, 2025 in Blacksburg. It will be the eighth meeting ever between the two and the first since JMU's historic 21-16 victory in 2010.
- The Dukes have played 28 games against the FBS since 1979, going 6-22 in those contests.
- Prior to the FCS Second Round, JMU announced a future home-and-home with Monmouth in 2024 at home and 2025 up in New Jersey.

JMU HISTORY IN OVERTIME

- JMU held off Stony Brook in overtime on Oct. 5 in a 45-38 win on Long Island, marking the first overtime game for JMU in more than five years.
- The last time JMU went beyond 60 minutes, Delaware upended the Dukes 30-23 on Sept. 27, 2014 at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- It also marked JMU's first overtime win since Oct. 13, 2012, when it downed William & Mary 27-26 in double OT at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- Since 1991, JMU has played in 14 overtime games, going 7-7. Saturday's triumph at Stony Brook was JMU's first road overtime win in 17 years when the Dukes won 24-21 at Hofstra on Sept. 21, 2002.

15TH ANNIVERSARY OF FIRST TITLE

- The last time JMU stepped foot in Finley Stadium, history was made. Simply put: National Champions.
- It was Dec. 17, 2004 and the Dukes became the first and only team to win four playoff games away from home en route to a national championship, which was capped off by their 31-21 win over Montana.
- JMU trailed twice but scored the game's final two touchdowns and used a final drive that spanned 6:14 to run out the clock.
- The Dukes rushed for 314 yards, including 257 in the second half. Justin Rascati and Maurice Fenner each had two rushing scores, as Fenner put the Dukes up for good late in the third and Rascati put the icing on the cake midway through the fourth.

- Two are also coaches in the NFL in John DeFilippo (Jacksonville Jaguars off. coordinator) and Justin Rascati (Denver Broncos off. quality control coach).

WELCOME TO THE XFL!

- Vince McMahon is back for round two of football, as the XFL preps for its first season back in 2020.
- Five former Dukes were drafted during the two-day draft event, highlighted by Rashard Davis being the #1 overall pick to the DC Defenders. Davis later signed on the practice squad with the Tennessee Titans.
- Ish Hyman and Andrew Ankrah were both taken by the St. Louis BattleHawks, though Hyman was resigned to the Buccaneers' practice squad that same day.
- The following day, the Defenders selected two more Dukes in Terrence Alls and Khalid Abdullah.
- Aside from players, former JMU head coach Mickey Matthews is an assistant for the Dallas Renegades.

Curt Cignetti became the eighth head coach in JMU football history on December 14, 2018.

Cignetti has climbed the ladder throughout a 36-year football coaching career that has included multiple Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) stops and a 67-26 record (.720) in eight years as a head coach, six at NCAA Division II Indiana University of Pennsylvania followed by the last two at Elon.

Most recently, Cignetti paced the sidelines as head coach at Elon, amassing a 14-9 record in two seasons after inheriting a program that went 12-45 in the previous five campaigns. The Phoenix qualified for the FCS Playoffs in both 2017 (8-4) and 2018 (6-5) to attain just the second and third Division I playoff appearances in program history (2009).

The Phoenix achieved a six-win turnaround in Cignetti's first season, going 8-4 after a 2-9 ledger the year prior. Cignetti was named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year as Elon finished second in the CAA, at 6-2, dropped a tough 28-27 decision to Furman in the First Round of the FCS Playoffs and finished 20th in the national rankings.

In 2018, Elon went 6-4 in the regular season before dropping a 19-7 decision at #12 Wofford in the playoffs to finish 6-5. Elon's other losses came to FBS South Florida and

against three CAA teams that qualified for the playoffs. All three losses also came after injuries impacted key performers at quarterback and running back. Elon's season was highlighted by the ninth-ranked Phoenix winning at No. 2 JMU 27-24 in October to achieve the program's first-ever win over an FCS top-five opponent and becoming the first CAA team to beat the Dukes following a streak of 22 straight JMU wins over league foes.

Walking in the footsteps where his father coached for 20 years, Cignetti earned his first head coaching job at IUP and went 53-17 in six seasons with three appearances in the Division II playoffs and four top-25 finishes in the national rankings. The Crimson Hawks went 33-11 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference after going 4-10 in the two seasons prior to Cignetti's arrival. IUP was 4-3 in its three NCAA appearances during his tenure and finished as high as 12th in the 2016 final rankings.

An offensive-minded assistant coach at the FBS level for 27 seasons, Cignetti was an original member of Nick Saban's first coaching staff at Alabama, filling the role of recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach for 2007 through 2010. He was part of a staff that returned the Crimson Tide to national prominence, going 12-2 in their second season in 2008 while Cignetti concurrently compiled the nation's top-ranked recruiting class. Alabama went undefeated as national champions the following season in 2009, the only undefeated final record during Saban's run in Tuscaloosa, pending the conclusion of the 2018 campaign. Alabama went 10-3 in Cignetti's final season before he earned his first head coaching job at IUP.

Cignetti joined the staff at Alabama after spending seven seasons (2000-06) as the recruiting coordinator at North Carolina State while also coaching tight ends from 2000-02 and 2005-06 and quarterbacks during the 2003 and 2004 campaigns. NC State qualified for five bowl

games during that time, including the 2002 Gator Bowl, when the team set a school record with 11 victories. One of his last recruits before moving to Alabama was quarterback Russell Wilson, who played at NC State before moving on to Wisconsin as a senior.

The first recruiting coordinator role for Cignetti came during a seven-year stint (1993-99) at Pittsburgh. He also coached the Panthers' tight ends and quarterbacks at various times under College Football Hall of Fame head coach Johnny Majors. Cignetti began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pitt during the 1983 and 1984 seasons and was part of the team's Fiesta Bowl participant his first year. He coached quarterbacks and receivers at Davidson in 1985 and was the quarterbacks coach at Rice (1986-88) and Temple (1989-92).

A quarterback letter winner at West Virginia, Cignetti is a 1982 graduate of WVU with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He is married to the former Manette Lawer. Curt and Manette have three children: Curtis John, Carly Ann and Natalie Elise, who was an honorable mention All-American in volleyball at IUP.

The sport of football runs deep in the Cignetti family. His father, Frank Cignetti, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame after playing at IUP and compiling a coaching record of 199-77-1 at West Virginia (1976-79) and IUP (1986-2005). The field at IUP is named in his honor (Frank Cignetti Field @ George P. Miller Stadium). Nick Saban coached under Frank Cignetti before later employing Curt Cignetti at Alabama. Curt's younger brother, Frank, Jr., was most recently the quarterbacks coach for the Green Bay Packers and has also held positions with the Giants, Rams, 49ers, Saints and Chiefs.

WVU Uses Quick Scores in Fourth to Push Past JMU in Opener

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – West Virginia scored 10 points in a span of 1:43 of the fourth to hold off James Madison 20-13 in the 2019 football opener on Saturday afternoon at Milan Puskar Stadium.

WVU moved to 1-0 on the young season in front of a capacity crowd of 61,891, while the Dukes, ranked No. 2 in the STATS FCS Top-25, fell to 0-1.

With the game all square at 10-10, the Mountaineers nailed a 43-yard field goal with 10:26 to play to take a 13-10 lead. On the next play, JMU turned the ball over on an interception, and WVU connected on a 22-yard touchdown pass three plays later to Tevin Bush. JMU added a field goal later in the fourth and forced WVU into a punt with 58 seconds to play, but was unable to muster a game-tying scoring drive to fall by a score.

The Dukes dominated the line of scrimmage, holding the Mountaineers to only 34 rushing yards and 1.4 yards per carry. JMU also produced eight tackles for loss, led by 2.0 apiece from redshirt junior safety Wayne Davis and redshirt senior defensive end Ron'Dell Carter. Redshirt senior linebacker Dimitri Holloway paced the defense with 13 tackles (8 solo), while six others tallied four tackles.

The Dukes held a 328-294 advantage in total offense, though the Mountaineers finished +3 turnover margin, committing no giveaways on the day. The Dukes ran for 172 yards, led by redshirt freshman running back Solomon Vanhorse, who had 12 carries for 55 yards and his first college touchdown.

Redshirt senior quarterback Ben DiNucci had 192 yards of offense, going 13-of-20 for 156 yards, adding 36 more on the ground. Two receivers tied for team-high honors, with four receptions, as redshirt senior Brandon Polk had 66 yards and redshirt sophomore Kyndel Dean had 63, which included a team-long, 29-yard grab.

The Dukes got on the board first, taking a 7-0 lead with 1:47 left in the first on a nine-yard touchdown by Vanhorse, capping a seven-play, 80-yard drive. WVU added a field goal before the half to bring the margin to 7-3.

The Mountaineers opened the third quarter with a quick score on a 28-yard touchdown pass by Austin Kendall to George Campbell to give WVU a 10-7 advantage. A 29-yard field goal by Ratke knotted it up at 10-10 heading to the fourth.

GAME FACTS

- JMU limited West Virginia to only 107 total yards in the first half, including 18 rushing (1.8 per carry).
- Redshirt junior safety D'Angelo Amos recorded the team's lone sack, the first full sack of his career.
- Redshirt junior kicker Ethan Ratke was 2-of-3 on field goals, knocking down a 29 yarder in the third and a 31 yarder in the fourth. He now stands at third place all-time at JMU with 33 career field goals.
- Junior punter Harry O'Kelly averaged 42.8 yards per punt on his five attempts, which is nearly three yards higher than his career average. That included a long of 51.
- JMU finished 5-of-14 on third down, while WVU was just 6-of-18. The Dukes were also 3-of-4 in the red zone, with WVU's stop coming on a blocked field goal.
- Kendall was 27-of-42 passing for 260 yards and two touchdowns, finding Sam James and Kennedy McKoy six times each. Bush led all players with 74 yards receiving, which including the game-clinching touchdown.

Dukes Breeze Past Saint Francis, 44-7, for Home-Opening Victory

HARRISONBURG, Va. – No. 2 James Madison football rushed for nearly 300 yards and used a stifling defensive effort to upend Saint Francis 44-7 in Saturday night's home opener at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

JMU improved to 1-1 on the season, while the Red Flash's record was evened to 1-1. The Dukes improved to 4-0 all-time against SFU and 7-0 against teams from the Northeast Conference.

The Dukes' defense limited SFU to only 69 yards of offense through the first three quarters, scoring the game's first 37 points to lead wire-to-wire.

Redshirt senior quarterback Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack with 221 yards and two touchdowns. The signal caller also added 51 yards on the ground.

Redshirt freshman running back Solomon Vanhorse rushed for a career- and game-high 86 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half, averaging 6.1 yards on his 14 carries. Two other JMU running backs surpassed 50 on the ground, as redshirt junior Jawon Hamilton and junior Percy Agyei-Obese had 54 and 51 yards, respectively. JMU's fourth back, freshman Austin Douglas ran for 33 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown on a 19-yard catch.

DiNucci's top target, redshirt senior receiver Brandon Polk, caught six passes for 95 yards, both career highs. That included catches of 28 yards and a season-long 29 yards. Redshirt junior receiver Jake Brown tallied four catches for 52 yards, which included a 45-yard touchdown strike, and senior tight end Dylan Stapleton added three receptions for 39 yards.

Three defenders recorded at least six tackles in the win, paced by redshirt sophomore safety Sam Kidd, who had a career-high seven tackles. Senior safety Adam Smith and junior safety MJ Hampton each had six, as Hampton's tackles total was a career high while also forcing his first fumble. Up front, junior defensive lineman Adeeb Atariwa had 1.5 tackles for loss with a pass breakup, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Ron'Dell Carter and redshirt junior safety Wayne Davis each had 1.0 TFL.

JMU tallied 533 yards of offensive in the win, with 295 on the ground and 238 more through the air, averaging 6.7 yards per play. SFU was held under 100 yards both in passing and rushing, being limited to 175 yards of total offense.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU scored a pair of first-quarter touchdowns on its way to tallying the first 37 points of the game. Saint Francis had a pair of first downs on its opening drive but was held to 10 consecutive three-and-outs, failing to move the chains until the fourth quarter.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- DiNucci completed 76.2% of his passes, including 80% in the first half. He also surpassed 3,000 career yards at JMU, moving to 3,172 yards.
- Redshirt junior kicker Ethan Ratke was perfect in the kicking game, going 3-for-3 on field goals and 5-for-5 on PATs. Ratke is only four field goals off the JMU all-time record.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Cole Johnson was also 4-for-4 in relief, passing for 17 yards and a touchdown, which he threw to junior tight end Clayton Cheatham in the fourth quarter.
- The Dukes won the time of possession battle by a margin of 34:59 to 25:01.
- JMU scored 37 unanswered points to start the game, before Saint Francis finally scored with 9:14 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- James Madison recorded 29 first downs, with 20 on the ground and nine in the air. SFU moved the chains just nine times.

Seven Players Score in #2 JMU's 63-12 Win Over Morgan State

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Seven different players scored touchdowns to lead second-ranked James Madison to a convincing 63-12 triumph over Morgan State on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

JMU improved to 2-1 on the year, while the Bears fell to 0-2.

Senior Ben DiNucci threw for a career-high four touchdown passes, going 18-of-23 for 240 yards in just over two quarters of action. He also ran three times for 35 yards, averaging 11.7 per carry.

Junior Percy Agyei-Obese and sophomore Devin Ravenel each produced their first career two-touchdown games. Agyei-Obese ran for 25 yards and two touchdowns, and Ravenel set new personal bests with three catches for 40 yards and a touchdown, adding a 43-yard kickoff return for a score on a failed outside kick attempt by MSU.

Freshman Latrelle Palmer led the ground attack with 58 rushing yards on eight carries, averaging 7.2 per rush. Redshirt freshman Solomon Vanhorse had 48 rushing yards and caught his first career receiving touchdown on a 19-yard grab.

Six different players caught a touchdown pass in the win, as redshirt senior Brandon Polk pulled in six catches for 67 yards and one score. Joining Ravenel, Vanhorse and Polk with touchdown grabs were redshirt juniors Jawon Hamilton and Eric Kirlew and freshman Kevin Curry Jr., who each nabbed their first career receiving scores.

Defensively, redshirt senior Dimitri Holloway led the way with nine tackles, a half tackle for loss, one forced fumble, and one fumble recovery. Redshirt junior D'Angelo Amos had seven stops, 1.0 TFL and a blocked extra point, and five others had at least five stops.

JMU produced 3.0 sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss, as 12 total players were involved in at least a half tackle for loss. JMU was also +3 in the turnover margin, forcing two interceptions in addition to Holloway's fumble. Senior Adam Smith caught his first pick of the season in the first quarter, and redshirt freshman Que Reid produced his first career interception in the fourth.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU forced a pair of first-quarter turnovers, with a fumble recovery and interception, setting up its first two touchdowns of the game. The Dukes produced four second-quarter touchdowns for their second straight wire-to-wire victory.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- JMU racked up 507 yards of total offense, with 209 rushing and 298 passing to average 7.0 yards per play.
- The Dukes converted 67% of third-down tries, moving the chains on 10-of-15 attempts. They were also 1-of-1 on fourth down for the second straight week.
- JMU's three quarterbacks combined for six touchdown passes, tying the program record for most touchdown tosses in a single game.
- JMU out-rushed the Bears 209-79, holding MSU to just 2.3 yards per carry.
- The Dukes scored six touchdowns in the red zone, going 6-of-7 inside the 20. JMU's only time not scoring in the red zone came down the stretch, taking a knee to run the clock out.
- Morgan State scored just six points on three red-zone trips.
- JMU's offensive line did not allow one sack on the night.

Second-Half Surge Propels #2 JMU Past Chattanooga, 37-14

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. – Ben DiNucci accumulated more than 300 yards of offense and Percy Agyei-Obese turned in a career day on the ground with over 100 yards and two scores to lead second-ranked James Madison to a 37-14 win at Chattanooga on Saturday evening at Finley Stadium.

The Dukes closed non-conference play with a 3-1 record, while the Mocs fell for the third straight outing, dropping to 1-3.

DiNucci threw 19-of-25 for 264 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 49 more to pace the offense with 313 yards of offense. Agyei-Obese had 19 carries for a career-high 114 yards (6.0 avg.) and a pair of touchdowns, marking his second career game over 100 yards.

Six receivers had multiple receptions, led by Brandon Polk, who hauled in four receptions for a game-high 84 yards and a touchdown, which came on a 48-yard strike in the third. Riley Stapleton had a team-best five catches for 73 yards, and his brother, Dylan Stapleton, added three receptions for 36 yards.

In the kicking game, Ethan Ratke was a perfect 3-for-3, with a long of 44, to tie the JMU all-time record with 39 career field goals. He sits atop the field-goals mark with John Coursey, who made 39 between 1993-96.

JMU held Chattanooga without a point after the opening stanza, limiting the Mocs to 245 total yards. The rush defense excelled once again, holding UTC to 84 rushing yards and 2.9 per carry. Dimitri Holloway turned in a team-high seven tackles (all solo), while Ron'Dell Carter added five tackles, a season-best 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Mike Greene also had 2.0 tackles for loss, and D'Angelo Amos recorded his first career interception in the second half.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU led 14-0 early on rushing touchdowns by Agyei-Obese and Jawon Hamilton, but the Mocs tied it up, scoring two touchdowns in a span of 22 seconds to knot it at 14-14 after the first. Ratke's first two field goals gave JMU 20-14 halftime lead.

Leading 23-14 in the third, Chattanooga was threatening in the red zone before Amos picked off Nick Tiano's pass inside the five to preserve the nine-point lead. Six plays later, DiNucci connected on a hitch pattern to Polk, who turned and ran for a 48-yard score to extend the lead to 30-14.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- JMU more than doubled up Chattanooga in the total-offense department, gaining 532 yards, to the hosts 245. That included holding the Mocs to just 133 yards over the final three quarters.
- JMU tallied 7.0 tackles for loss, while Chattanooga only had two stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- The Dukes finished 8-of-13 on third down, holding UTC to a 4-of-13 mark.
- JMU cashed in on all four red-zone trips, while the Mocs were 2-of-3.
- Tiano led Chattanooga with 161 passing yards with a touchdown and interception, and no Mocs running back gained more than 27 rushing yards.

Strong Rushing Attack Leads Way to #2 JMU's 45-10 Win at #24 Elon

ELON, N.C. – Behind a dominant rushing attack which saw James Madison gain 336 yards on the ground, the second-ranked Dukes bulldozed their way to a 45-10 victory at #24 Elon on Saturday afternoon at Rhodes Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 4-1 on the year and 1-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Phoenix fell to 2-3 and 1-1. JMU also remained unbeaten at Rhodes Stadium, moving to 3-0 all-time at Elon.

JMU had four rushers with at least 50 yards, led by Jawon Hamilton, who ran for a season-best 81 yards and a touchdown. Latrelle Palmer had the best outing of his young career, running eight times for 78 yards (9.8 avg.) and two touchdowns. Solomon Vanhorse tallied 63 rushing yards and two touchdowns, while Percy Agyei-Obese added 59 yards. Additionally, of JMU's 56 rushes, none were for negative gain, as it averaged 6.0 yards per rush as a team.

Ben DiNucci was 13-of-21 for 185 passing yards while rushing for 26 yards and a score. He also moved into JMU's career top 10 for passing yards, as he now stands at 3,341. DiNucci had balance through the air, as three receivers had three receptions. Jake Brown had a team-high 53 yards, which included a 42-yard catch. Devin Ravenel had 40 receiving yards, and Riley Stapleton contributed 44 receiving yards.

After a touchdown on Elon's opening drive, JMU's defense shut down the Phoenix, allowing just 152 more yards over their final 11 drives. JMU had a +303 advantage on the ground, limiting Elon to only 33 yards and 1.4 per carry. The Dukes had 10 tackles for loss and five sacks, led by John Daka, who tied his career high with a pair of sacks. Ron'Dell Carter and Mike Greene also had a solo sacks. JMU's five sacks resulted in a loss of 40 yards for Elon.

After missing all of last season to an injury, Rashad Robinson stepped in front of a Davis Cheek pass to record his first interception in 659 days, as he moved into a tie for seventh all-time with 11 career picks. JMU also recorded its third block of the season, as MJ Hampton blocked a punt in the second half.

KEY MOMENTS

Elon led 7-0 after a 66-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive, but the Dukes answered less than 2:30 later with the equalizer, sparking a 38-point run through the end of the third quarter. Leading 31-7 in the third, Hampton blocked a punt, setting up a JMU touchdown four plays later to make it 38-7. In the fourth, Robinson's interception set up JMU's final scoring drive to make it a five-touchdown win.

A NEW KICKING KING AT JMU

Ethan Ratke now stands alone atop the field goal charts at JMU, as he kicked home a 44-yard field goal with 12:19 to play in the third quarter. It was his 40th career field goal, passing former leader John Coursey, who made 39 from 1993-96.

The 44-yard field goal matched his season long from last week at Chattanooga and was tied for the second-longest field goal in his career.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- JMU out-gained Elon 521 to 227, which included 336 to 33 on the ground.
- The Dukes averaged 6.7 yards per play, as opposed to Elon's 4.1.
- The Dukes did not have one negative play from scrimmage, while forcing 10.0 TFLs and 5.0 sacks.
- JMU converted 8-of-13 on third down, and Elon was only successful on 3-of-14 tries.
- The Dukes dominated the time of possession by a margin of 34:23 to 25:37.
- JMU more than doubled up Elon on first downs, 28-13.
- Harry O'Kelly averaged a career-best 51.7 yards per punt, which was his best average with at least three punts in a game.
- JMU's average starting field position in the second half was its own 48, which was 22 yards better than Elon's starting field position in the third and fourth.
- Elon was paced by Cheek, who passed for 189 yards and a touchdown with an interception. He completed just 44% of his passes, going 14-of-32. Robinson's interception was Cheek's first pick in 241 pass attempts.
- Avery Jones had game highs of six catches for 93 yards, which included Elon's opening-possession score.

#2 Dukes Win Overtime Slugfest, 45-38, at #24 Stony Brook

STONY BROOK, N.Y. – Jawon Hamilton rushed for a career-high 105 yards and two touchdowns and second-ranked James Madison held off #24 Stony Brook 45-38 in an overtime thriller on Saturday night at LaValle Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 5-1 on the year and 2-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Seawolves fell to 4-2 and 1-1 in league play. It was JMU's first overtime game since 2014 when Delaware upended JMU 30-23 on Sept. 27, 2014. It also snapped Stony Brook's 12-game home win streak.

Hamilton turned in his first career 100-yard game and first two-touchdown game on just 13 carries, averaging 8.1 per carry. With the game tied at 38-38 in overtime, Hamilton capped off the drive with a three-yard touchdown to put the Dukes ahead.

On the ensuing drive, Stony Brook had a look at the end zone on fourth down, but the pass was dropped to allow JMU to improve to 2-0 all-time at LaValle Stadium.

Percy Agyei-Obese also ran for 96 yards and tied his career high with a pair of touchdowns, and Solomon Vanhorne added 48 rushing yards. Ben DiNucci accumulated 298 yards of offense, going 13-of-17 for 218 yards with a touchdown and interception through the air while adding 80 rushing yards and a score.

His top target, Brandon Polk turned in his first career 100-yard receiving game, making 4 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown, which included a career-long 54-yard catch. Riley Stapleton also had three catches for 30 yards, including a 20-yard catch in overtime.

JMU forced Stony Brook into 10 tackles for loss, including five sacks, most of which came late in the game. John Daka had seven tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Mike Greene had 2.0 TFLs and a sack, while Landan Word and Wayne Davis each joined him with a solo sack. Dimitri Holloway led the Dukes with 10 tackles and 1.5 for loss, while Ron Dell Carter had nine stops and eight Dukes tallied at least five tackles.

KEY MOMENTS

In a game pitting the CAA's top-two defenses, it was an offensive show in the first half, with a total of seven touchdowns scored, giving JMU a 28-21 halftime lead. Ethan Ratke's 24-yard field goal early in the third gave JMU the first two-possession lead, at 31-21, but Stony Brook converted on fourth-down touchdown pass to make it a 31-28 game late in the quarter.

JMU made it a 38-28 game on the first play of the fourth on an Agyei-Obese touchdown carry. After a turnover, Stony Brook drove 97 yards to pull within three, at 38-35, with 7:20 to play.

Stony Brook would get the ball back with 1:44 on the clock and no timeouts. The Seawolves used 11-plays to travel 51-yards in 1:39 to kick a 47-yard field goal to tie the game and send it to overtime.

In the first overtime period, the Dukes had a 20-yard pass to Stapleton and scored on a three-yard touchdown run from Hamilton. The Dukes' defense held strong during Stony Brook's possession to defeat the Seawolves.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- The Dukes collected 547 yards of total offense on Saturday, including 218 through the air and 329 on the ground.
- James Madison was 11-16 on third downs, while holding the Stony Brook offense to 5-14.
- JMU turned the ball over four times, losing three fumbles, while the Seawolves only had one turnover on a lost fumble. Of JMU's four turnovers, two occurred in the red zone.
- The Dukes produced five sacks, compared to SBU's two.
- Tyquell Fields led SBU with 318 passing yards and two touchdowns, while Ty Son Lawton rushed for 108 yards and three scores.
- Nick Anderson led all players with seven catches for 154 yards and a score.

#2 JMU Erases Fourth-Quarter Deficit to Rally Past #5 Villanova

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Second ranked James Madison forced four turnovers and scored 21 points in the fourth quarter to rally past fifth ranked Villanova, 38-24 in Colonial Athletic Association action on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium on Saturday.

The Dukes improved to 6-1 on the year and 3-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Wildcats fell to 6-1 and 3-1. It was JMU's fifth straight win over Villanova and marked the first time since JMU's 13-10 win against Stony Brook on Oct. 27, 2018 that the Dukes rallied in the fourth.

Trailing 24-17 heading to the fourth, the Dukes forced a turnover on the opening play of the quarter, leading to a 26-yard touchdown pass from Ben DiNucci to Brandon Polk three plays later to tie the game at 24-24.

On the ensuing drive, Villanova was driving before MJ Hampton picked off his first pass and returned it 83 yards for a pick-six, giving JMU a 31-24 lead with 10:48 to play. After a Villanova missed field goal, Latrelle Palmer busted off a 69-yard touchdown rush to put the Dukes up 38-24 with 7:28 left. The Dukes answered with back-to-back interceptions by Rashad Robinson and Adam Smith sealed the win.

Palmer rushed for a game- and career-high 103 yards and a score in the fourth quarter alone, picking up 12.9 yards per carry along the way. Percy Agyei-Obese also tacked on 41 yards on the ground.

DiNucci led JMU's passing attack with 216 yards through the air, tossing three touchdowns without throwing an interception. Riley Stapleton reeled in five catches for 44 yards and two scores, tying his career high, and Polk made four grabs for 44 yards and a score.

John Daka led the JMU defense with career highs of nine tackles, 5.0 for loss and 2.0 sacks, to go with a forced fumble. Smith matched Daka with nine stops, adding his second interception of the season. Hampton tied his career high with six tackles and his day was highlighted by his go-ahead touchdown on his interception. Eight players had at least four tackles in the win.

The Dukes won the turnover battle in Saturday's game, forcing four turnovers (all in the fourth) while avoiding any giveaways. JMU turned those takeaways into 14 points. The JMU offense did a good job extending drives, converting on 56.2 percent of third-down attempts (9-16).

JMU's defense was dominant against the run, limiting Villanova to just 44 yards on the ground. JMU out-rushed Villanova by 114 yards, gaining 158. The Dukes' defense disrupted the Villanova passing attack late on their way to pulling down three interceptions and breaking up seven Wildcats passes.

- JMU won the turnover battle 4-0 after intercepting three passes and recovering one fumble.

Strong Defensive Effort Leads Dukes to 38-10 Victory at W&M

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. – Behind a dominant defensive effort that limited William & Mary to only 194 total yards, #2 James Madison knocked off the Tribe 38-10 in Colonial Athletic Association football action on Saturday afternoon at Zable Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 7-1 on the year and 4-0 in CAA play, while the Tribe fell to 2-5 and 0-3. It was JMU's fourth straight victory against W&M and the seventh straight victory this season for the Dukes.

Ron'Dell Carter showed out for the JMU defense, collecting career highs of 10 tackles and 6.0 tackles for loss, to go with one sack. Eight different Dukes tallied at least a full TFL, as Mike Greene had 1.5 sacks and Wayne Davis produced 1.5 tackles for loss. John Daka also made a full sack, marking his fourth straight game with a sack.

Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack, going 23-of-36 for 250 yards and two touchdowns and an interception.

DiNucci's most prolific target in the ballgame was Brandon Polk, who caught a career-high seven passes for 77 yards and a score. Dylan Stapleton also hauled in four balls for 54 yards, and Riley Stapleton made four catches for 43 yards, moving him into fourth all-time at JMU in career receptions. Kyndel Dean also had three grabs for 47 yards, including a 37-yard touchdown catch.

Percy Agyei-Obese totaled 68 yards to lead the Dukes' ground attack and added two touchdowns in the game. Jawon Hamilton also tacked on 49 rushing yards and Latrelle Palmer scored a fourth-quarter touchdown.

The Dukes won the turnover battle by forcing three interceptions while coughing the ball just once. JMU turned W&M's turnovers into 14 points. The JMU offense did a good job extending drives, converting on 47.1% (8/17) of third-down attempts. The Dukes also went 1-for-1 on fourth down.

Defensively, JMU did an excellent job neutralizing the William & Mary offensive attack, holding the Tribe to 194 total yards, allowing 119 passing and 75 rushing. The Dukes badgered the William & Mary passing attack all game long, registering four sacks, a season-high 15 tackles for loss and grabbing three picks.

JMU's offense made the most of its visits to the red zone, scoring on all five trips, with four of those scores being touchdowns.

KEY MOMENTS

After William & Mary opened the game with an interception and a 73-yard run to set up the game's opening score with a field goal, JMU responded with three straight first-half touchdowns to lead 21-3 at the break. After allowing the 73-yard scamper, JMU only allowed 33 total yards the rest of the half.

William & Mary closed the gap to 21-10 in the third on a fake field goal, but the Dukes responded with 10 points in less than a two-minute span with an Ethan Ratke 32-yard field goal and DiNucci's deep touchdown pass to Dean to make it 31-10.

After a late turnover, JMU capped off the scoring with Palmer's one-yard run with 59 seconds to play.

- * JMU outgained William & Mary 376-194, including a 250-119 advantage through the air.
- * JMU scored 21 straight points to build a 21-3 lead and closed the game with 17 straight.
- * JMU converted 8 of 17 third downs while William & Mary was successful on 5 of 16.
- * JMU won the time of possession battle 32:36 to 27:24.
- * Three Dukes in the secondary recorded interceptions in Wayne Davis, D'Angelo Amos and Adam Smith. Amos also broke up a pass the play before intercepting his second of the season. Smith now leads JMU with three picks this year.

#2 JMU Bottles Up #16 Towson in 27-10 Homecoming Victory

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Second-ranked James Madison registered seven sacks and shut out #16 Towson in the second half, surging to a 27-10 Colonial Athletic Association win on Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improved to 8-1 on the year and 5-0 in CAA play, while the Tigers fell to 4-4 and 1-3. JMU has won four straight against Towson and is now 11-1 against the Tigers in conference games.

Percy Agyei-Obese rushed for 111 yards and a touchdown to lead the ground attack, averaging 5.6 yards per carry. Jawon Hamilton also tacked on 64 rushing yards with 5.3 yards per run.

Ben DiNucci was 14-of-25 for 201 yards and two touchdowns with an interception. He has now thrown two or more touchdowns in three straight games and five times this season. His top target, Brandon Polk, pulled in career highs of eight catches for 121 yards, scoring a touchdown on a career-long, 60-yard pass. Riley Stapleton also recorded four receptions for 62 yards and a touchdown.

John Daka led the JMU defensive effort, totaling seven tackles, a career-high 2.5 sacks, and one fumble recovery. Mike Greene added five tackles and a career-best two sacks, and Ron'Dell Carter registered 2.0 sacks, including a strip sack in the fourth quarter. Dimitri Holloway tied his season high with 13 tackles, which led all players. Five different players recorded at least 1.0 TFL, as the team had nine, seven of which went for sacks.

The Dukes won the turnover battle in Saturday's game, forcing two turnovers which turned into 10 points off takeaways.

JMU put together a stellar performance on the ground, totaling 249 rushing yards while averaging 5.8 yards per carry and out-rushing Towson by nearly 200 yards, holding the visitors to 60. The Dukes conceded just 270 total yards to Towson's offense, which included allowing just 29 yards (0 passing) in the third quarter alone.

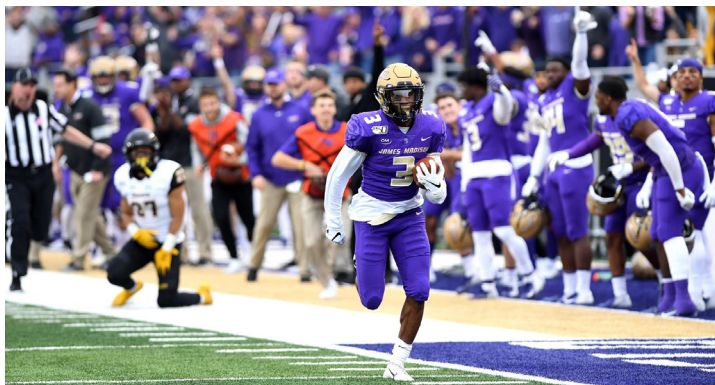
KEY MOMENTS

After an opening-quarter score by the Dukes, Towson answered with 10 straight in the second to take a 10-7 lead with 9:15 to go in the half. The Dukes came back with a 17-point spurt over the final 4:56 of the first half, with touchdown passes by DiNucci and an Ethan Ratke field goal after a Towson turnover.

Ratke added his second field goal of the night on the opening drive of the third quarter for the game's final score. In the fourth, After Towson failed to score on a drive lasting more than 7:30, the Dukes used 10 plays to run out the final 6:30.

- * JMU outgained Towson 450-270, including a 249-60 advantage on the ground.

Offensive Explosion Lifts #2 JMU Past #23 New Hampshire, 54-16

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Five different players reached the end zone, led by a career-high three scores from Percy Agyei-Obese, as No. 2 James Madison football rolled past No. 23 New Hampshire 54-16 on Saturday afternoon inside Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 9-1 on the year and 6-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Wildcats fell to 5-4 and 4-2. JMU, which won its ninth in a row, clinched at least a share of the 2019 CAA title after Villanova beat Richmond earlier Saturday.

Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack with 293 yards through the air, tossing two touchdowns without throwing an interception. The signal caller also added one touchdown on the ground. DiNucci's first touchdown to Brandon Polk eclipsed 5,000 total yards of offense for the quarterback.

Agyei-Obese led all Dukes rushers with 130 yards, a new single-game high, and three touchdowns, picking up 6.2 yards per carry. Cole Johnson also added 33 yards and one touchdown on the ground, averaging 33 yards per carry.

DiNucci's most prolific target in the ballgame was Polk, who caught five passes for a career-high 136 yards and one score. With his performance Saturday, he became the first JMU receiver to reach 800 receiving yards in a season since 1998.

John Daka led the JMU defensive effort, collecting five tackles and 2.0 sacks. MJ Hampton added a career-high seven tackles and 1.0 TFL, and Wayne Davis had a season-best seven stops. Mike Greene made six tackles, and Adeeb Atariwa contributed 1.5 TFL in the win.

The Dukes won the turnover battle in Saturday's game, forcing one turnover while avoiding any giveaways, with JMU turning Adam Smith's team-leading fifth interception into seven points.

JMU also had an outstanding day offensively, racking up 537 total yards, 221 on the ground and 316 through the air, while averaging 7.9 yards per play. The JMU offense did a good job prolonging drives, converting on 71.4 percent of third-down attempts going 10-for-14 on the day. The Dukes also went 1-for-1 on fourth down.

Defensively, JMU held up fairly well against the New Hampshire offensive attack, holding the Wildcats to 243 total yards.

JMU's offense made the most of its trips to the red zone, scoring on five of its five trips, with four of those scores being touchdowns.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU put points on the board on nine different occasions, on their way to scoring 54 points. It scored on its first seven possessions, which included six straight touchdowns after falling behind 10-3 in the first.

The Dukes took the lead for good with 10:23 left in the second quarter, opening up a 17-10 advantage on the Wildcats. Agyei-Obese powered in a 24-yard touchdown run to finish an eight-play, 80-yard drive. The Dukes then rode that lead to victory, increasing their advantage by 31 points along the way.

JMU Secures Outright CAA Title with Blowout Win over Richmond

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Second-ranked James Madison had five players score touchdowns while forcing four turnovers to roll past Richmond, 48-6, to clinch the outright conference championship on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improved to 10-1 on the year and 7-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Spiders fell to 5-6 and 4-3. It was JMU's 10th straight victory and the fourth against Richmond. It is just the third time in series history a team has won four straight and the first since JMU won five in row between 1987 and 1991.

Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack, throwing 11-of-13 for 179 yards and three touchdowns without throwing an interception. The signal caller also added 39 yards and one touchdown on the ground to tie his season high for total touchdowns.

Jawon Hamilton paced the rushing attack with 80 yards, averaging 8.0 yards per carry. Percy Agyei-Obese also added 55 yards and one touchdown on the ground for his 13th of the season, tying him for fifth in JMU single-season history.

For the third straight week, Brandon Polk surpassed the century mark, making four receptions for 104 yards and a touchdown, which came on an 80-yard pass – both a career-long pass for DiNucci and career-long catch for Polk. Riley Stapleton had a season-best six catches for 72 yards and two touchdowns, tying his career high.

Defensively, Dimitri Holloway recorded a season-high 15 tackles, to go with 1.0 tackle for loss, a half sack and one fumble recovery. Wayne Davis added eight tackles, 1.0 TFL, and an interception, and Ron'Dell Carter tacked on four tackles, 2.0 TFL, 1.5 sacks and three QB hurries in the win. Rashad Robinson also contributed seven tackles and a career-high 2.0 TFL.

The Dukes won the turnover battle, forcing four turnovers while avoiding any giveaways. JMU also blocked a punt when Bryce Maginley got to the punter on a botched snap. The Dukes turned the four turnovers into 17 points, which included the first 10 points of the game.

JMU put together a stellar showing on the ground, rushing for 235 yards and 5.0 per carry, out-rushing the Spiders by 174 yards (235-61). JMU scored on all seven trips to the red zone, scoring five touchdowns, while holding Richmond to 2-of-3, conceding a pair of field goals.

KEY MOMENTS

Richmond was driving to take the early lead, but Wesley McCormick forced a fumble at the one, and Holloway recovered in the end zone for a touchback. On the ensuing play, DiNucci went deep, connecting on an 80-yard touchdown to Polk. After Richmond fumbled the next kickoff, JMU took a 10-0 lead on an Ethan Ratke field goal. JMU tacked on two more touchdowns while getting big stops in the red zone to hold UR to a pair of field goals, making it 24-6 at the half. JMU scored all 24 points in the second half, with three different players finding the end zone.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- » JMU outgained Richmond 423-265, including a 235-61 advantage on the ground.
- » JMU won the turnover battle 4-0 after intercepting one pass and recovering three fumbles.
- » The Dukes scored first with 7:27 remaining in the first quarter and never trailed the rest of the game on their way to victory.

Dukes Finish CAA Perfect with 55-21 Win at Rhode Island

KINGSTON, R.I. – Running backs Jawon Hamilton and Percy Agyei-Obese combined for 255 yards and three touchdowns, as #2 James Madison's rushing attack combined for 394 yards on the ground en route to a 55-21 win at Rhode Island on Saturday afternoon at Meade Stadium.

Six different players reached the end zone, as the Dukes improved to 11-1 on the year and 8-0 in CAA play, while the Rams fell to 2-10 and 0-8.

Hamilton's career-high 150 rushing yards and one score paced the Dukes' rushing attack, as Agyei-Obese added 105 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Quarterback Ben DiNucci added 82 yards on the ground to add to the 394 yards the Dukes accounted for on the ground.

DiNucci passed for 129 yards through the air, tossing two touchdowns and not throwing an interception with just one incomplection. Brandon Polk caught a receiving touchdown for the seventh game in a row, tallying 59 receiving yards, and Riley Stapleton hauled in four catches for 37 yards and a score.

Ron'Dell Carter led the JMU defensive effort, collecting five tackles, 3.0 TFL, and 2.0 sacks. John Daka added four tackles, 2.0 TFL, and 1.5 sacks.

The Dukes won the turnover battle in Saturday's game, forcing four turnovers. JMU turned those takeaways into 10 points. JMU also had an outstanding day offensively, totaling 523 total yards, 394 on the ground and 129 through the air, while averaging 9.2 yards per play and out-gaining Rhode Island by over 300 total yards. The JMU offense did a good job extending drives, converting on 5-of-9 third-down attempts.

JMU's defense limited Rhode Island's offense to 217 total yards, which included limited the hosts to negative seven rushing. The Dukes hassled the Rhode Island passing attack all game long, piling up five sacks and grabbing three interceptions.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU put up 55 points on nine different scoring plays. The Dukes got on the board first, taking the lead for good at 3-0 with 6:06 remaining in the first quarter. Ethan Ratke converted a chance from 42 yards out to cap a seven-play, 36-yard scoring drive. The Dukes then rode that lead to victory, increasing their advantage by 31 points along the way.

No. 2 JMU Routs No. 14 Monmouth 66-21 to Advance in Playoffs

HARRISONBURG, Va. – HARRISONBURG, Va. – Second-seeded James Madison accumulated over 600 yards of total offense, including 332 on the ground, as the Dukes routed No. 14 Monmouth 66-21 on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field in the second round of the FCS playoffs.

The Dukes won their 12th straight game, improving to 12-1, as they advance to next week's FCS quarterfinal against sixth-ranked Northern Iowa. Monmouth's season came to an end at 11-3.

JMU registered playoff program records in both points and total yards, as it out-gained the Hawks by a margin of 623-266.

Seven different players accounted for touchdowns, led by Ben DiNucci, who was 21-of-25 for 273 passing yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 66 yards and two scores. His 339 total yards was a career high and his completion percentage (.840) was a JMU playoff record.

Jawon Hamilton led the Dukes with 95 rushing yards, picking up 6.3 yards per carry, and Percy Agyei-Obese tallied 90 yards and tied his career high of three rushing touchdowns. Eric Kirlaw also contributed 58 yards on the ground.

DiNucci's most prolific target was Riley Stapleton, who had season bests of seven receptions for 87 yards. Brandon Polk made six grabs for 83 yards and a touchdown, extending his touchdown streak to eight straight games. He also surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for the season on his 49-yard touchdown catch. Polk is just the second JMU player to reach 1,000 yards, as he sits at 1,062. Jake Brown also caught a touchdown pass, reeling in four catches for 38 yards.

John Daka led the defense with six tackles, to go with 3.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and a blocked punt. With his back-to-back sacks in the third quarter, Daka set the JMU single-season record with 14.5 sacks, surpassing Sage Harold's 13.5 in 2014.

Dimitri Holloway also tallied six stops with a tackle for loss and breakup, and Ron'Dell Carter has 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack. The lone takeaway of the game came in the fourth quarter on a 79-yard pick-six by Charles Tutt, who scored his first career touchdown with his second career interception.

JMU converted on 69.2% of third-down attempts (9/13) while limited Monmouth to 30% on third down (3/10). The Dukes also went 2-for-2 on fourth down and stopped MU on its only fourth-down attempt. They also took care of business in the red zone, scoring on all six trips inside the 20 – all of which were touchdowns.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU put points on the board on 10 different occasions on their way to scoring 66 points. The Dukes took their first lead with 4:21 left in the first quarter, opening up a 21-14 advantage.

After Monmouth rallied to tie it at 21, JMU got back on top with the first of DiNucci's two rushing scores, giving the Dukes the lead for good at 28-21 with 11:49 left in the first half. That drive sparked a 45-point scoring run, as the Dukes led 38-21 at the break and outscored the visitors 28-0 over the final 30 minutes.

#2 JMU Shuts Out #6 UNI 17-0, Advances to FCS Semifinals

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Behind an impressive defensive performance that produced playoff program records for fewest points, rushing yards and total yards, second-seeded James Madison shut out sixth-ranked Northern Iowa 17-0 on Friday night at Bridgeforth Stadium in the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs.

The Dukes won their 13th straight, improving to 13-1 on the year, while the Panthers' season ended at 10-5. JMU advances to the national semifinals for the fifth time, as it sits one win away from reaching the national title time.

JMU recorded its first shutout in playoff history, limiting UNI to just 114 total yards and zero rushing yards, both programs records in the postseason. The Panthers failed to reach mid-field until the final drive of the game, as JMU held the visitors to just 2-of-12 on third down and 0-of-2 on fourth down.

The Dukes gained 189 yards on the ground, paced by Percy Agyei-Obese, who accumulated 124 rushing yards and one touchdown. Agyei-Obese surpassed 1,000 rushing yards this season. Jawon Hamilton also added 62 rushing yards.

Ben DiNucci was 19-of-28 for 157 yards and a touchdown and one interception. Brandon Polk pulled in seven catches for 59 yards and one score, as he's found the end zone in nine straight games and 11 of the last 12. Dylan Stapleton also caught four passes for 48 yards.

Defensively, Dimitri Holloway led the JMU way, collecting eight tackles, a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss, and 1.0 sack. John Daka made 2.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks, and one forced fumble, and D'Angelo Amos a forced fumble and a recovery in the win. Mike Greene recorded a strip sack in the fourth quarter, while Ron'Dell Carter added another sack.

JMU out-gained UNI 346-114, with all of UNI's yards coming through the air. The Dukes converted 13-of-24 on third down (54.2%) and also moved the chains on their lone fourth-down try.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU grabbed a 7-0 lead over Northern Iowa after opening the scoring with 4:10 left in the first quarter. An Ethan Ratke field goal made it 10-0 at the half. Late in the game, Greene forced a strip sack at the one yard line and JMU capped off the game with an Agyei-Obese rushing score.

- » JMU set playoff records for fewest points (0), total yards (114) and rushing yards (0) allowed.
