DUKES SET TO CLASH WITH IN-STATE RIVAL VIRGINIA

- · JMU opens a huge week at home on Wednesday when it hosts No. 8 Virginia.
- The opening draw is set for 7:30 p.m. at Sentara Park and will be televised on NBC Sports Washington Plus and NBC Sports Philadelphia Plus.
- This marks the 51st meeting all-time between the teams, with Virginia leading 33-16-1. It's the third and final regular-season meeting for JMU against an ACC opponent, as the Dukes are 1-1, with a win at Virginia Tech and a loss at North Carolina.
- The 2019 JMU lacrosse season is presented by O'Neill's Grill.

JMU-VIRGINIA SERIES BY THE NUMBERS

- The JMU-Virginia series dates back to 1974, and the two have only missed playing in one season (1976).
- · The Dukes have only played one other team more than Virginia in history (William & Mary 65 games).
- Though UVA holds a 33-16-1 series lead, JMU has won the past two meetings, taking a 15-10 win in Charlottesville on April 19, 2018, followed by a 15-12 win at home in the second round of the NCAA Championship on May 13, 2018.
- JMU is 8-14 all-time against the Cavaliers at home.
- Through 50 games, Virginia has outscored JMU 502-420 (10.1 to 8.4), but over the past six meeting, both teams have scored 67 goals (11.17 per game).
- JMU has beaten Virginia in consecutive seasons just three times 1974-75, 1983-84 and 2010-11. The Dukes are also seeking its second three-game win streak, as JMU won the first three games (1974, 1975, 1977).

FIRST-HALF SURGE PACES JMU IN WIN OVER TEMPLE

- Three JMU players recorded at least four points and a pair of big scoring runs in the first half set the tone in JMU's 16-10 win over Temple at home on March 16.
- It was the seventh straight victory for the Dukes, and they remained unbeaten at home, at 4-0.
- Logan Brennan turned in a career-high six points off three goals and a career-best three assists, and Halle Duenkel registered three goals and an assist for her third hat trick in four outings.
- Lizzy Fox recorded career highs in every category, with two goals, three assists, five caused turnovers, three
 ground balls and two draw controls.
- JMU opened the game on a 4-0 run, and after TU rattled off three straight, the Dukes held the Owls without a goal for over 24 minutes, leading to a 7-0 surge to put the Dukes up eight.
- The Dukes caused 18 turnovers in the win, a season high, and held an 18-10 advantage in the draw circle.

SCOUTING VIRGINIA

- The Cavaliers enter Wednesday's matchup with a 7-3 record following a 10-9 setback last time out against Notre Dame.
- · UVA, which is 3-2 in road games, averages 13.9 goals per game while allowing 9.5 to its foes.
- · Virginia is 2-0 against the CAA, with wins at Elon (11-4) and at William & Mary (16-8).
- · Maggie Jackson leads the team with 41 points off 19 goals and a team-high 22 assists, to go with a UVA-best 43 draw controls.
- · Sammy Mueller has 37 points off 27 goals and 10 assists, and Avery Shoemaker has tallied 27 goals and nine helpers. Mueller also has 41 draws and 36 ground balls.
- Those three have contributed to 117 of Virginia's 195 points this season.
- · Charlie Campbell has a 9.73 GAA with a .460 save percentage between the pipes.
- · Julie Myers is in her 24th season at Virginia, holding a 319-148 career record. She's guided the Cavs to the NCAA Tournament in each of her first 23 years. She's won three national titles - once as a player in 1991, one as an assistant coach in 1993 and one as head coach in 2004.

RECAPPING LAST JMU-UVA MEETING

- Last season, JMU and Virginia met twice, with the Dukes coming away with wins in both games. The most recent matchup came on May 13, 2018, in the second round of the NCAA Championship.
- · Haley Warden and Kristen Gaudian each scored four goals, and the Dukes used a six-goal run midway through the game and a 3-1 run down the stretch to upend Virginia, 15-12.
- · The win advanced JMU to the quarterfinals and kept the Dukes unbeaten against UVA in the NCAA postseason, moving to 3-0.

DOUGHERTY VS. FORMER TEAMMATES

- Wednesday's game features Molly Dougherty going toe-to-toe against two former teammates from St. Stephens & St. Agnes in Virginia freshmen Annie Dyson and Grayson Offutt.
- · Dougherty was teammates with them for two years, and the trio won the state championship during Dougherty's senior season in 2016 when the Cavalier two were sophomores.

DEFENSE KEEPS ROLLING THROUGH SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK

- In JMU's seven straight wins, the defense has come up big, leading to wins by a margin of 14.57 to 7.43.
- JMU has a +32 margin in draw controls and +17 in caused turnovers over the past seven games.
- The Dukes held Virginia Tech without a goal for over 11 minutes three times in their first win of the year. They followed that up with back-to-back games not allowing a goal for a span of 23 minutes against both UConn and High Point.
- JMU went on a 15-0 run, holding Canisius off the board for almost 37 minutes to turn in its biggest win of the year. PSU was held without a goal for 33 minutes, leading to a 7-0 JMU run to give the Dukes the lead for good in University Park, and JMU conceded just one second-half goal against Rutgers, holding them without a goal for 22 minutes to grind out the home win.
- Last time out, JMU used a 7-0 run while holding Temple scoreless for over 24 minutes to capture the win.

THREE ON TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Three JMU players in Hanna Haven, Caroline Sdanowich and Molly Dougherty were named to the 2019 Tewaaraton Award Watch List.
- It marks the second straight season JMU placed three players on the initial watch list.
- The Tewaaraton Award, now in its 19th season, is presented annually to the top male and female collegiate lacrosse players in the United States. The selection committees are comprised of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed each year by the Tewaaraton Foundation.
- The Dukes were one of nine Division I programs with at least three honorees. Maryland led the country with six while Boston College and Florida also had four picks.

DUKES THE FAVORITE TO WIN CAA

- JMU was voted the favorite to win the Colonial Athletic Association title for a third straight season in 2019.
- The Dukes received six first-place votes and 36 points, while rival Towson was selected second with one
 first-place vote and 31 points. Elon was third, followed by Hofstra, Delaware, Drexel and William & Mary.
- JMU has won the CAA regular-season title in seven of the past nine seasons, winning five tournament championships during that span. The Dukes have claimed the regular-season crown in each of the previous three seasons, winning the tournament in 2017 and 2018.
- Six players were honored, as making the Preseason All-CAA Team were Hanna Haven, Charlotte Haggerty, Emma Johnson, Caroline Sdanowich and Molly Dougherty. Maddie McDaniel was also Honorable Mention.

DOUGHERTY, HAGGERTY PLAY FOR TEAM USA

- A pair of JMU sophomores were afforded the opportunity to compete with the best players in the world, as both were part of Team USA.
- Both Molly Dougherty and Charlotte Haggerty were named to the U.S. National Team's roster at the IWLCA President's Cup in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. in November.
- From there, Dougherty also earned a roster spot for the team's trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the Spring Premiere
 at Stanford in January.
- Additionally, 2018 All-American Elena Romesburg joined Dougherty and Haggerty on Team USA back in November.
