#### DUKES CLOSE NON-CONFERENCE SLATE WITH SAN DIEGO STATE

- JMU plays for the fifth straight time at home this Saturday when it hosts San Diego State in the final nonconference game of the 2019 regular season.
- The opening draw is set for 5 p.m. at Sentara Park.
- This marks the second meeting all-time between the teams, with JMU leading 1-0.
- It is also the program's 800th game, as the Dukes are 485-311-3 (.609) all-time.
- The 2019 JMU lacrosse season is presented by O'Neill's Grill.

#### JMU-SDSU SERIES BY THE NUMBERS

- JMU and SDSU have met just once, back on March 29, 2014, in Harrisonburg.
- The Dukes won the only meeting 20-7, marking the most goals by JMU in a single game that season.
- JMU has faced five California team ever, holding a 10-3 record. The Dukes are also 4-0 vs. Cal 1-0 against both UC Davis and USC and 3-3 vs. Stanford.

# **DUKES HANG ON TO TOP-10 RANKINGS**

- JMU remained in the top 10 of both major lacrosse polls, as it ranked No. 10 in both the IWLCA Coaches Poll
  and Inside Lacrosse Women DI Media Poll.
- JMU is the lone CAA team to be ranked for the third straight week.
- The Dukes have ranked in the top 10 nationally of both polls every week since Feb. 19, 2018.
- Boston College remains first in the country in the coaches poll, followed by No. 2 Maryland, No. 3 North Carolina, No. 4 Syracuse and No. 5 Northwestern. UNC and 'Cuse are flipped for Nos. 3 and 4 by the media.

# **TERRAPINS DOWN DUKES**

- Maryland utilized four scoring runs of at least three straight goals to hand JMU an 18-5 on March 24.
- The 13-goal margin was the widest in the 45-game history of the series.
- UM's Jen Giles scored a game-high four goals with two assists. Kali Hartshorn provided three goals, three assists and seven draw controls, and Grace Griffin scored three times.
- Maddie McDaniel and Daria Lucchesi each scored twice and Halle Duenkel had a goal and two assists. Defensively, Caroline Sdanowich turned in another solid showing with three caused turnovers, four draw controls and five ground balls, which matched her career high.

#### SCOUTING SAN DIEGO STATE

- The Aztecs make the trek to the east coast with an 8-3 overall record, but have lost two straight.
- Last week SDSU fell 17-11 at Cincinnati and 16-10 at Ohio State in the team's first two true road games of the season.
- San Diego State averages 14.64 goals per game while allowing 11.82 to its opponents.
- The Aztecs have scored at least 16 goals in five outings, including a season-best 20 vs. Bucknell.
- Taylor Sullivan leads the team with 30 goals and three assists. Harlowe Steele has scored 28 goals with team highs of eight assists and 33 draws.
- Five other Aztecs have scored double-digit goals, and five have won at least 15 draws.
- Katy Sharretts is 7-3 between the pipes with an 11.45 GAA and .475 save percentage.
- Kylee White is in her eighth season leading the SDSU program, holding a 62-66 record.
   Last season, she guided the Aztecs to their first-ever Mountain Pacific Sports Federation championship with a program-record 11 wins.

#### RECAPPING LAST JMU-SDSU MEETING

- Back on March 29, 2014, JMU used a pair of 8-0 runs to roll past San Diego State, 20-7 to close the non-conference slate.
- Betsy Angel scored four goals, and Ali Curwin tallied five points off two goals and three assists.
- Amy Roguski reached the 100-goal plateau, registering a hat trick in the win.
- Schylar Healy earned the win in cage, making eight saves while holding the Aztecs off the scoreboard for spans of 19:11 and 22:13 to create the pair of eight-goal runs.
- JMU scored six of its 20 goals on free-position opportunities and SDSU went 0-of-3.

#### JOHN CARROLL TEAMMATES REUNITE

- Saturday's game features three former high school teammates from John Carroll with two from JMU and one from SDSU.
- JMU's Caroline Sdanowich and Charlotte Haggerty will take on SDSU goalkeeper Katy Sharretts for the first time since graduating.
- Sdanowich and Sharretts are both 2015 graduates, while Haggerty finished in 2017.

### STAFF TIES BETWEEN JMU AND SDSU

- JMU Associate Head Coach Emily Boissonneault and SDSU Head Coach Kylee White are no strangers, as the two are formerly teammates.
- Both were part of Team Canada's runner-up squad at the 2013 FIL World Cup.
- Boissonneault has participated at World Cups in 2013 and 2017, and White represented Canada at World Cups in 2001, 2005, 2009 and 2013.
- Both are Ontario natives, with Boissonneault hailing from Brooklin and White from London.

- It marks the second straight season JMU placed three players on the initial watch list.
- The Tewaaraton Award, now in its 19th season, is presented annually to the top male and female collegiate
  lacrosse players in the United States. The selection committees are comprised of premier collegiate coaches
  and are appointed each year by the Tewaaraton Foundation.
- The Dukes were one of nine Division I programs with at least three honorees. Maryland led the country with six while Boston College and Florida also had four picks.

#### DUKES THE FAVORITE TO WIN CAA

- JMU was voted the favorite to win the Colonial Athletic Association title for a third straight season in 2019.
- The Dukes received six first-place votes and 36 points, while rival Towson was selected second with one first-place vote and 31 points. Elon was third, followed by Hofstra, Delaware, Drexel and William & Mary.
- JMU has won the CAA regular-season title in seven of the past nine seasons, winning five tournament championships during that span. The Dukes have claimed the regular-season crown in each of the previous three seasons, winning the tournament in 2017 and 2018.
- Six players were honored, as making the Preseason All-CAA Team were Hanna Haven, Charlotte Haggerty, Emma Johnson, Caroline Sdanowich and Molly Dougherty. Maddie McDaniel was also Honorable Mention.

#### DOUGHERTY, HAGGERTY PLAY FOR TEAM USA

- A pair of JMU sophomores were afforded the opportunity to compete with the best players in the world, as both were part of Team USA.
- Both Molly Dougherty and Charlotte Haggerty were named to the U.S. National Team's roster at the IWLCA President's Cup in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. in November.
- From there, Dougherty also earned a roster spot for the team's trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the Spring Premiere at Stanford in January.
- Additionally, 2018 All-American Elena Romesburg joined Dougherty and Haggerty on Team USA back in November.

- · Associate Head Coach Emily Boissonneault was named an assistant coach for Canada's U-19 National Team.
- Boissonneault will be part of a staff that will prepare Canada's future stars for next summer's 2019 FIL U-19
