DUKES CLOSE REGULAR SEASON WITH WILLIAM & MARY

- JMU completes the regular-season slate on Sunday when it hosts William & Mary.
- The opening draw is set for 1 p.m. at Sentara Park.
- This marks the 66th installments of the series, with William & Mary holding a 34-30-1 lead.
- The 2019 JMU lacrosse season is presented by O'Neill's Grill.

JMU-W&M SERIES BY THE NUMBERS

- JMU and William & Mary have met 65 times previously, dating back to the 1974 season.
- The Tribe leads the all-time series 34-30-1, but the Dukes have dominated the series the entire decade.
- Since the 2010 season, JMU has won 11 straight against W&M, including four by double digits.
- JMU is 15-13 at home in the series, which includes an active six-game home win streak.
- W&M's last win came back on April 10, 2009 - a 14-13 win in Williamsburg. The Tribe's last victory in Harrisonburg came on April 4, 2008 - an 11-10 win.
- In the history of the series, the two have gone to overtime eight times, with each team winning four.
- They have also played one-goal games on 21 occasions, with the Tribe leading those games 11-10.
- During the 11-game win streak, JMU has outscored W&M by an average score of 14.73 to 7.09.

DUKES SECURE TOP SEED, PLAYOFF PICTURE TIGHTENS

- Entering Sunday's games, JMU has already clinched at least a share of the regular-season title and the top seed for the CAA Championship, holding a 5-0 conference record.
- Towson is currently second with a 3-1 CAA mark following a win at Hofstra, which is third at 2-2.
- Elon is still fourth, at 2-3 and likely needs a win next week to secure the fourth and final spot.
- Delaware, William & Mary and Drexel all sit at 1-3 with two games to play.
- The top-four teams at the end of the regular season advance to the CAA Women's Lacrosse Championship, which JMU will host on May 3 and 5.
- With a win on Sunday, JMU will capture the outright CAA regular-season title.

HISTORY AS REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPS AND TOP SEED

- JMU set program records in Friday's win vs. Elon, as it marked the first time in school history that JMU clinched at least a share of the regular-season title and secured the top seed for the tournament in four consecutive seasons.
- It's the eighth regular-season championship since 2010 and the 13th time since joining the CAA. JMU will also be the No. 1 seed for the 10th time in team history.

SCOUTING WILLIAM & MARY

- The Tribe enters Sunday's matchup with a 6-7 record and 1-3 mark in CAA play following a split last week.
- William & Mary averages 11.15 goals per game while allowing 12.54 to its foes.
- W&M leads the CAA in ground balls (18.38) and commits the league's most turnovers (18.31).
- Rookie Belle Martire leads the team with 39 goals and four assists, as she ranks third in the CAA in goals (3.0) and fifth in points (3.31).
- Lauren Russell is eighth in the CAA in goals, as she's scored 27, and Meredith Hughes has 20.
- Elsa Rall leads the CAA in ground balls (3.15) and Starr Howard is fourth in draw controls (5.69).
- Hillary Fratzke is in her sixth year at the helm, holding a 29-65 record in Williamsburg. She was an assistant on Northwestern's 2011 and 2012 national title teams after being a two-time CAA Player of the Year as a player at Towson.

RECAPING LAST JMU-W&M MEETING

- Back on April 13, 2018, JMU turned in its biggest win against William & Mary with a 21-4 victory in Williamsburg.
- Four Dukes recorded hat tricks and they utilized three runs of six or more goals in the win.
- Elena Romesburg scored four goals, while Kristen Gaudian, Hanna Haven and Halle Duenkel each scored three times.
- JMU out-shot W&M 38-13, including 32-8 in shots on goal. JMU also had 10 fewer turnovers.

- The Dukes are the top seed and will play the No. 4 seed at 4 p.m. on Friday, May 3.

LAST TIME OUT

- JMU used an 8-1 run to set the tone in a 16-8 victory against Elon on Friday.
- Hanna Haven scored four goals and two assists, and Katie Checkosky tallied a career-high five points off a goal and career-best four helpers.
- Maddie McDaniel scored twice while winning 11 draw controls with two caused turnovers. Rachel Matey and Charlotte Haggerty also scored twice in the win.
- JMU opened the game with five straight and eight of the first nine. The Dukes led by as many as 10 in the second half.

SENIOR SENDOFF FOR JMU SEVEN

- JMU honors its seven seniors this Sunday for their final regular-season home game.
- They are: Reagan Newell, Natalie Fuccillo, Hanna Haven, Shannon Quinlan, Lauren DuVall, Caroline Sdanowich and Ellie Harmeyer.

- James Madison rose in both major polls this week, as it ranked ninth by both the coaches and media.
- JMU moved up two spots in the IWLC Division I Coaches Poll and one spot in the Inside Lacrosse Women DI Media Poll.
- Boston College remains first in the country in the coaches poll, followed by No. 2 Maryland, No. North Carolina, No. 4 Notre Dame and No. 5 Syracuse.

SECOND-WINNINGEST SENIOR CLASS

- Sunday marks the final regular-season home game for JMU's seven seniors.
- The group is the second-winningest class in program history, having amassed a 58-21 since the 2016 season.
- These seniors only trail last year's national-champion seniors, who were 61-23 in their four years at JMU.

JMU CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- March 23-24 marked the 50th anniversary celebration of JMU lacrosse, which began in 1969.
- The 50th season in 2018 was capped off by the team winning the first lacrosse national championship.
- The Dukes have won 11 Colonial Athletic Association championships and has been to the NCAA Championship 15 times.
- JMU has produced 59 All-Americans, 14 CAA Players of the Year and 29 CAA major award winner. Three have also been named finalists for the Tewaaron Award.

THREE ON TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Three JMU players in Hanna Haven, Caroline Sdanowich and Molly Dougherty were named to the 2019 Tewaaron Award Watch List.
- It marks the second straight season JMU placed three players on the initial watch list.
- The Tewaaron Award, now in its 19th season, is presented annually to the top male and female collegiate lacrosse players in the United States. The selection committees are comprised of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed each year by the Tewaaron Foundation.
- The Dukes were one of nine Division I programs with at least three honorees. Maryland led the country with six while Boston College and Florida also had four picks.

DOUGHERTY, HAGGERTY PLAY FOR TEAM USA

- A pair of JMU sophomores were afforded the opportunity to compete with the best players in the world, as both were part of Team USA.
- Both Molly Dougherty and Charlotte Haggerty were named to the U.S. National Team's roster at the IWLC President's Cup in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. in November.
- From there, Dougherty also earned a roster spot for the team's trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the Spring Premiere at Stanford in January.
