TOP-SEEDED DUKES CLASH WITH HOFSTRA IN CAA CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

- No. 1 JMU faces off with No. 3 Hofstra on Sunday in the CAA Championship title game.
- The opening draw is set for noon at Sentara Park.
- This marks the 25th meeting all-time between the teams and the seventh in the CAA Championship.
- The 2019 JMU lacrosse season is presented by O'Neill's Grill.

JMU HISTORY IN CAA CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

- JMU is making its 25th appearance in the CAA Championship and its 18th in the title game.
- The Dukes are 38-13 (.745) all-time in the CAA postseason, and has claimed a conference-best 11 tournament titles - 11-6 record.
- JMU has won the past two tournaments and seeks a third straight crown for the first time in program history.
- JMU has been either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed in each of the last 10 seasons, including the No. 1 seed in five including a program-record four straight tournaments.
- The program is 16-3 when holding the No. 1 seed, and the Dukes have advanced to the title game in nine of 10 appearances as the top seed.
- This is the sixth time JMU has hosted the CAA Championship. The Dukes have won the title in four of the five times it previously served as the host.
- Sunday marks JMU's seventh meeting in the tournament against Hofstra, as it's 4-2. This will mark the fourth CAA title game featuring JMU and Hofstra. JMU won CAA championship games in 2006 and 2010, while Hofstra won the 2007 title.

MCDANIEL BREAKS DRAWS RECORD, DUKES CRUISE PAST ELON

- Maddie McDaniel set JMU's single-season draw controls record and JMU limited Elon to just one second half goal, cruising to a 16-5 win Friday in the CAA Championship semifinals.
- McDaniel tied a career high with a game-best four goals while winning nine draw controls to become JMU's single-season leader on the draw. She now has 111, surpassing last year's record of 108 by Haley Warden.
- Hanna Haven, Logan Brennan and Daria Lucchesi each had two goals and an assist, and Katie Checkosky tallied one goal and two assists.
- JMU trailed 3-2 before going on a 5-0 run to take a 7-3 lead late in the first half. The Dukes held the Phoenix without a score for nearly 16 minutes and later took an 8-4 lead at the break.
- JMU began the second with three goals inside two minutes, sparking a 6-0 scoring run to grab a 14-4 advantage. Elon was held to just one second-half goal and never drew closer than nine the rest of the way.

SCOUTING HOFSTRA

- The Pride enters Sunday's CAA title game with a 12-6 record after downing Towson 11-8 in the semifinals on Friday.
- Hofstra averages 13 goals a games while allowing 9.83 to its opponents.
- HU ranks second in the CAA in both scoring offense and scoring defense.
- Hofstra is led by CAA Player of the Year Alyssa Parrella, who has scored 85 goals with 20 assists.
- Alexa Mattera has 38 goals and Katie Whelan has 30 goals and a team-high 29 assists.
- Darcie Smith leads the league with 118 draw controls and is HU's hustle-stat leader.
- Shannon Smith is in her seventh year at the helm, as she's 61-60 in her career. She's led Hofstra to four CAA tournament appearances and was named 2015 CAA Coach of the Year.

JMU-HOFSTRA BY THE NUMBERS

- JMU and Hofstra have met 24 times previously, with the first meeting coming back in 2002 when Hofstra joined the CAA.
- The Dukes lead the all-time series 18-6, including an 11-0 mark at home.
- Earlier this season JMU rallied for a 9-8 double-overtime win in Hempstead.
- This is the teams' seventh meeting in the CAA Championship and the fourth in the title game.
- JMU beat Hofstra for the 2006 and 2010 championships and the Pride won in 2007.
- JMU is riding a four-game series win streak, with Hofstra last winning on April 3, 2015 in Hempstead. HU is seeking its first win at JMU.

RECAPPING LAST JMU-HU MEETING

- Back on April 14, Maddie McDaniel fired home the game-winning goal 2:55 into double overtime to lift JMU to a 9-8 victory at Hofstra.
- JMU trailed 7-5 late before a 3-0 run gave the Dukes an 8-7 lead with 4:04 to play. Hofstra tied it with 26 seconds left to force overtime.
- Hanna Haven, who assisted on the game winner, had a game-high five points on two goals and three assists.
- McDaniel and Katie Checkosky each scored twice, and Logan Brennan tallied a goal and two assists.
- Molly Dougherty turned away 67% of Hofstra's shots, making 16 saves for the second-highest saves total of her career.

DUKES RAKE IN CAA YEARLY AWARDS

- JMU reeled in three major CAA yearly awards and nine total players were recognized on the 2019 CAA all-conference team in a vote by the league's seven head coaches.
- Caroline Sdanowich was voted CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Molly Dougherty was CAA Goalkeeper of the Year and Head Coach Shelley Klaes-Bawcombe was named Coach of the Year.
- It's the second straight year a JMU player was named the league's top defender. Dougherty was the winner of the inaugural goalkeeping award. For Klaes-Bawcombe, it's her fourth straight Coach of the Year award and the fifth during her tenure at JMU.
- Joining Sdanowich and Dougherty on the All-CAA First Team were Hanna Haven and Maddie McDaniel.
- Taking home Second Team All-CAA honors were Logan Brennan, Kelsey Reed and Emma Johnson. All-Rookie Team accolades went to the JMU pair of Lizzy Fox and Rachel Matey.
- JMU led all teams with seven all-conference selections and nine total honorees.

HISTORY AS REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPS

- JMU clinched the outright regular-season title for the third straight season and claimed at least a share for the fourth consecutive year.
- The Dukes have won eight CAA regular-season crowns since the 2010 season and 13 total since joining the CAA in 1992.
- JMU's 6-0 CAA record this season marked the sixth season the Dukes went unbeaten in conference play.
- This is also JMU's 10th time as the CAA's top seed for the CAA Women's Lacrosse Championship.

- JMU is a win away from claiming its 12th CAA Championship tournament title, as it seeks a program-record three straight crowns.
- JMU is entering its sixth straight appearance in the CAA title game, winning in 2015, 2017 & 2018.
- Following the title game, JMU will learn its postseason fate at 8 p.m. during the NCAA Championship selection show.

2019 SENIOR CLASS TIED WITH 2018

- JMU's 2019 senior class is currently tied for winningest class in the program's 51-season history, amassing a 61-21 record.
- That is tied with the 2018 seniors, who went 61-23 in their careers.
- Should the Dukes win the CAA tournament title, it will set the new wins record by a senior class.
- JMU's 2019 seniors were part of last year's first national-championship team, has made it to the NCAA tournament every season and has won back-to-back CAA tourney championships.

JMU CELEBRATED 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- March 23-24 marked the 50th anniversary celebration of JMU lacrosse, which began in 1969.
- The 50th season in 2018 was capped off by the team winning the first lacrosse national championship.
- The Dukes have won 11 Colonial Athletic Association championships and has been to the NCAA Championship 15 times.
- JMU has produced 59 All-Americans, 14 CAA Players of the Year and 29 CAA major award winner. Three have also been named finalists for the Tewaaron Award.

SDANOWICH A TEWAARATON NOMINEE

- Caroline Sdanowich was honored as one of the top-25 women's collegiate players, as she was named a Tewaaron Award nominee.
- She is the lone CAA player on the list.
- It's the second straight year the Dukes have a top-25 nominee, as both Kristen Gaudian and Haley Warden earned spots last season. Gaudian eventually went on to be one of the program's three all-time finalists.
- Sdanowich is JMU's first true defender to make the top-25 nominee list for the Tewaaron.
- Earlier this season, she, along with Hanna Haven and Molly Dougherty were recognized on the Tewaaron Award Watch List.
- The Tewaaron Award, now in its 19th season, is presented annually to the top male and female collegiate lacrosse players in the United States.
- The selection committees are comprised of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed each year by the Tewaaron Foundation.

SDANOWICH DRAFTED BY WPLL BRAVE

- Caroline Sdanowich became JMU's first defensive player to be drafted into the Women's Professional Lacrosse League, as she was selected in the fourth round and with the 19th overall pick by the Brave.
- She joins former JMU teammate Kristen Gaudian on a team coached by Towson Head Coach Sonia Lamonica.
- JMU now has five players in the WPLL, as the trio of Elena Romesburg, Haley Warden and Katie Kerrigan play for the WPLL Pride.
