JMU's entire 2019 football schedule is broadcast over the airwaves on the JMU Sprint Broadcast Network. JMU Athletics, Learfield-IMG College and Harrisonburg Radio Group have teamed up to manage each live broadcast.

Harrisonburg Radio Group acquired 92.1 FM and 550 AM WSVA in Harrisonburg on August 1, 2015. WSVA continues its long-running service as the flagship station. Fans are able to enjoy a more crisp sound quality with the FM signal, which began transmitting in January 2015. For the past four seasons, the pregame show for football has been expanded to 60 minutes and provides even more comprehensive coverage to prepare JMU fans for the day's game.

Dave Thomas is in his fifth season as the radio play-by-play voice of the Dukes, while Clint Estes provides color commentary both at home and on the road. Nikki Newman will serve as the sideline reporter for her second season.

Thomas began his broadcasting career as a senior at McDowell High School (N.C.) and has been in the industry for 31 years. He moved to Harrisonburg in 2014 and filled in on several JMU broadcasts that year before moving to the primary role in 2015. Prior to his move to the Valley, Thomas was the play-by-play announcer for Lenoir-Rhyne in Hickory, N.C., covering football, men's basketball and women's basketball. Thomas and former JMU Head Coach Mike Houston were at Lenoir-Rhyne during the timeframe. He also provided play-by-play for two seasons on cable television for Western Carolina and was a backup for an NBA D-League team in Asheville, N.C.

A Marion, N.C., native, Thomas is a 1992 graduate of Isothermal Community College with a concentration in radio broadcasting. He is Program Director and Afternoon Drive Host for MORE 96.1 and Program Director for ESPN 106.9 DM & 1360 AM, where he hosts The Daily Sports Feed, a locally-focused sports talk show, airing Monday through Friday at noon and 6 n m noon and 6 p.m.

Estes is in his 10th season on the network and has 30-plus years of radio sports broadcasting experience from the central Virginia area, working for WJMA in Orange, and WINA and ESPN 840 in Charlottesville.

A Charlottesville native, Estes is a graduate of Emory & Henry College and the University of Virginia. He has hosted numerous sports talk shows in addition to broadcasting games. He recently retired after 40 years in the Virginia nublic schools system

No stranger to JMU Athletics, Newman is in her second season serving as the sideline reporter for JMU football. She was one of JMU women's basketball's all-time defensive leaders from 2009-14, as she finished her career with 171 blocks and 859 rebounds.

A native of Staunton, Va., Newman earned her Bachelor's of Science degree in 2013 and Master's of Arts in 2014. She has worked in the public schools system as a teacher since 2016.

WSVA's signal on 550 AM and 92.1 FM translator broadcasts to listeners in the Shenandoah Valley and surrounding areas. The broadcasts are simulcast on wsavonline.com and MadiZONE HD SportsNet free audio.

The Sprint Broadcast Network also produces JMU men's and

Sports Network

Curt Dudley, JMU's director of broadcast services, is the play-by-play voice for all MadiZONE broadcasts. He has broadcast at various times since joining the JMU staff in 1988, and has been a regular since the 2000 football

Dudley, a Norfolk, Va., native, is a 1983 Bridgewater College graduate and serves as the lead play-by-play man for all of JMU's 18 varsity sports.

2019 Football Media Guidelines

The 2019 James Madison University football media guide is designed to assist media with its coverage of JMU football. Additional information, statistics and photographs may be acquired by contacting Chris Brooks in the JMU Athletics Communications Office at brookscp@jmu.edu or at (540) 568-3702. For score updates on game days, call the press box phone at (540) 568-6521.

Press Credentials

Requests for working press space must be made in writing to the James Madison Athletics Communications Office by Wednesday at noon prior to the date of the home contest. The request should be made in writing via e-mail by the sports director of the newspaper, magazine, radio or television outlet wishing to send reporter(s) and/or photographer(s) to the game. Confirmation of the request will be made by James Madison Athletics Communications personnel. Press credentials WILL NOT be issued to spouses, friends or children, in accordance with the working code of the College Sports Information Directors of America and the Football Writers Association of America. The press box is a working area, and cheering will be grounds for removal.

Photographers

Photographers are issued similar credentials to press box media, though any media representatives working at field level must check in at the press box for a vest allowing access. Photographers and videographer must present a valid ID to JMU Athletics personnel to check out a media vest. Vests are to be returned to the press box and checked back in at either halftime or postgame. Failure to return the media vest will result in you being charged for the cost of the vest. Due to HIPAA regulations, we ask all photographers, both television and print, not to photograph any injury evaluations done in the bench/sidelines area. Addiotionally, per the credential policy, there is no selling of game photos taken by media members without the express written agreement from James Madison University.

Parking

Media parking is located in the Champions Drive Parking Deck or nearby lots. Season media members will be issued season parking passes. Single-game parking passes should be requested with media passes and will need to be requested at least a week in advance to allow arrival prior to the game. If a single-game press pass is left at the Will Call window, parking arrangements are the responsibility of the media member. There is no "Will Call" list for parking or credentials requested less than a week in advance, as media parking is limited.

Entering Bridgeforth Stadium

Press credentials can be picked up in the James Madison Athletics Communications Office on or after Wednesday during the week of a home contest. If credentials are approved they will only be mailed if the request is granted at least two weeks prior to the game. Any credentials not picked up will be left at the Will Call window at the south end of the stadium near Gate A. All media must enter through the metal detectors at Gate E on the backside of the parking deck or through the loading dock next to Gate A.

Field Access

Field access for media is limited at JMU. For video, photo and radio media (no writers allowed on sidelines), you are required to show a valid form of identication, as well as your media credential to sign in at the desk in the press box to obtain a media vest. That provides sideline access and access to the closer white dotted lines running from the 25-yard lines to the end zones. Vested media are allowed to move behind the dotted line behind the benches, but no images are allowed from those positions and no filming nor photography of injury evaluations are allowed in compliance with HIPAA.

Visting Radio

Visiting radio stations have a separate booth on the top floor in the press box at Bridgeforth Stadium. Visitors receive one reciprocal phone line for their game broadcasts. Should more lines or ISDN be needed, please contact Chris Brooks for arrangements at least three weeks prior to the game.

Telephone/Internet Access

If media are in need of a phone line for the game or season, please inform Chris Brooks at time of credential request of those needs. For those media that can file over the World Wide Web with laptop computers that can automatically select an IP address, there are hardwire Internet connections as well as wireless access available in the press box. For Comrex units, please provide your MAC address at least two weeks in advance to clear the MAC through JMU's firewall.

Media Information

The James Madison Athletics Communications staff will provide game notes and updated cumulative statistics for both teams to credentialed media prior to all games via JMU's DropBox. Game notes are no longer printed on game days, however flip cards will still be provided. Statistical summaries and play-by-play sheets will be distributed throughout the game and will be available at the conclusion of the contest. Media members will be provided with a pre-game meal from the time the press box opens through halftime.

Game Day Interview Policy

James Madison's post-game interviews will be conducted in the press box at Bridgeforth Stadium and streamed on Facebook Live. Following the 10-minute NCAA-mandated cooling off period, the visiting head coach and requested/approved players will be brought to the press box for the press conference. After that, the requested/approved JMU players will be brought to the press box for the press conference, followed by Head Coach Curt Cignetti. No individual postgame interviews, outside of live TV broadcasts previously agreed upon, will be permitted with any JMU personnel. In addition, the JMU locker room is closed to the media.

Non-Game Day Interview Policy

Head Coach Curt Cignetti will be available to the media by phone during the CAA Teleconference on Mondays at 10:30 a.m. Other phone requests for radio and TV purposes will be handled on an individual basis. Coach Cignetti will be available on Mondays at noon for the weekly Fan/Press Luncheon at O'Neill's Grill, located on University Blvd. An archive of the video will be available on JMUSports Facebook.

Individual approved players are available for interviews following practice on Tuesdays. All player interviews must be cleared with Chris Brooks by 9 a.m. on Mondays. This policy allows us to arrange interviews that do not conflict with any post-practice schedules (i.e. class, meetings), which have top priority. If unavailable for interview, the press will be notified ahead of time. There will be no freshmen available for any interviews until otherwise notified.

One note to the media: Personal phone numbers for players and coaches WILL NOT be given out by the James Madison Athletics Communications Office. During preseason camp and the regular season, media members will be e-mailed a schedule for the week of approved days for interviews.

The Head Coach

Curt Cignetti became the eighth head coach in JMU football history on December 14, 2018.

Cignetti has climbed the ladder throughout a 36-year football coaching career that has included multiple Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) stops and a 67-26 record (.720) in eight years as a head coach, six at NCAA Division II Indiana University of Pennsylvania followed by the last two at Elon.

Most recently, Cignetti paced the sidelines as head coach at Elon, amassing a 14-9 record in two seasons after inheriting a program that went 12-45 in the previous five campaigns. The Phoenix qualified for the FCS Playoffs in both 2017 (8-4) and 2018 (6-5) to attain just the second and third Division I playoff appearances in program history (2009).

The Phoenix achieved a six-win turnaround in Cignetti's first season, going 8-4 after a 2-9 ledger the year prior. Cignetti was named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year as Elon finished second in the CAA, at 6-2, dropped a tough 28-27 decision to Furman in the First Round of the FCS Playoffs and finished 20th in the national rankings.

In 2018, Elon went 6-4 in the regular season before dropping a 19-7 decision at #12 Wofford in the playoffs to finish 6-5. Elon's other losses came to FBS South Florida and against three CAA teams that qualified for the playoffs. All three losses also came after injuries impacted key performers at quarterback and running back. Elon's season was highlighted by the ninth-ranked Phoenix winning at No. 2 JMU 27-24 in October to achieve the program's first-ever win over an FCS top-five opponent and becoming the first CAA team to beat the Dukes following a streak of 22 straight JMU wins over league foes.

Walking in the footsteps where his father coached for 20 years, Cignetti earned his first head coaching job at IUP and went 53-17 in six seasons with three appearances in the Division II playoffs and four top-25 finishes in the national rankings. The Crimson Hawks went 33-11 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference after going 4-10 in the two seasons prior to Cignetti's arrival. IUP was 4-3 in its three NCAA appearances during his tenure and finished as high as 12th in the 2016 final rankings.

An offensive-minded assistant coach at the FBS level for 27 seasons, Cignetti was an original member of Nick Saban's first coaching staff at Alabama, filling the role of recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach for 2007 through 2010. He was part of a staff that returned the Crimson Tide to national prominence, going 12-2 in their second season in 2008 while Cignetti concurrently compiled the nation's top-ranked recruiting class. Alabama went undefeated as national champions the following season in 2009, the only undefeated final record during Saban's run in Tuscaloosa, pending the conclusion of the 2018 campaign. Alabama went 10-3 in Cignetti's final season before he earned his first head coaching job at IUP.

Cignetti joined the staff at Alabama after spending seven seasons (2000-06) as the recruiting coordinator at North Carolina State while also



coaching tight ends from 2000-02 and 2005-06 and quarterbacks during the 2003 and 2004 campaigns. NC State qualified for five bowl games during that time, including the 2002 Gator Bowl, when the team set a school record with 11 victories. One of his last recruits before moving to Alabama was quarterback Russell Wilson, who played at NC State before moving on to Wisconsin as a senior.

The first recruiting coordinator role for Cignetti came during a seven-year stint (1993-99) at Pittsburgh. He also coached the Panthers' tight ends and quarterbacks at various times under College Football Hall of Fame head coach Johnny Majors. Cignetti began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pitt during the 1983 and 1984 seasons and was part of the team's Fiesta Bowl participant his first year. He coached quarterbacks and receivers at Davidson in 1985 and was the quarterbacks coach at Rice (1986-88) and Temple (1989-92).


A quarterback letter winner at West Virginia, Cignetti is a 1982 graduate of WVU with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He is married to the former Manette Lawer. Curt and Manette have three children: Curtis John, Carly Ann and Natalie Elise, who was an honorable mention All-American in volleyball at IUP.

The sport of football runs deep in the Cignetti family. His father, Frank Cignetti, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame after playing at IUP and compiling a coaching record of 199-77-1 at West Virginia (1976-79) and IUP (1986-2005). The field at IUP is named in his honor (Frank Cignetti Field @ George P. Miller Stadium). Nick Saban coached under Frank Cignetti before later employing Curt Cignetti at Alabama. Curt's younger brother, Frank, Jr., was most recently the quarterbacks coach for the Green Bay Packers and has also held positions with the Giants, Rams, 49ers, Saints and Chiefs.

Defensive Coordinator/ Defensive Ends First Season

Corey Hetherman was hired on Dec. 20, 2018 as James Madison University's defensive coordinator and defensive ends coach.

Hetherman came to JMU after spending the previous four seasons at CAA foe Maine (2015-18), where he led the defensive line and served as the defensive coordinator for three of his four seasons in Orono.

He quickly turned Maine into a defensive power in the FCS, which included leading the league in six categories in 2018, highlighted by the FCS-leading rushing defense (79.2). Maine also ranked second nationally in sacks (47). The Black Bears also led the CAA in yards per carry allowed (2.4), interceptions (18), fumble recoveries (13) and fumbles for a touchdown (3) while ranking second in third-down defense (28.4%) and fourth in total defense (313.1).

Hetherman guided six Maine defenders to All-CAA status, led by All-Americans Sterling Sheffield and Manny Patterson. Two members of his defensive line, Kayon Whitaker and Charles Mitchell, also earned all-conference laurels.

In 2017, Maine led the CAA on third down, allowing the opposition to a 27 percent success rate. Whitaker developed in his first year as a starter to all-conference stats after ranking fourth in tackles for loss (14.0) and seventh in sacks (8.5). His first year leading Maine's Black Hole defense, he helped mentor all-conference lineman Pat Ricard to the NFL after he ranked second in the conference in tackles for loss and fifth in sacks. Maine ranked third in the league in pass defense as well, at 217.1 yards per game allowed.

Hetherman's 2015 defensive line gave way to Maine ranking second in the CAA in rushing defense, surrendering just 110.8 yards per game. They also ranked second in the CAA in sacks, with 32. Two linemen earned First Team All-CAA status in Trevor Bates and Ricard. The duo combined for 31.0 tackles for loss and 14.5 sacks, as Bates would go on to be a seventh-round draft pick to the Indianapolis Colts in the 2016 NFL Draft.

Prior to Maine, Hetherman was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Pace University (2014) for one season where he developed the team's defensive game plan and formatted the PAT and field goal block design.

He coached four seasons at Old Dominion (2010-13), He served as defensive rungame coordinator and assistant linebackers coach in his final season, mentoring two-time All-CAA linebacker Craig Wilkins. He also coached outside linebackers for the Monarchs prior to his promotion.

Hetherman also had stops at Northeastern (2009) and Springfield College (2007-08), and spent a year coaching overseas for the Wuerzburg Panthers.

A three-year starting quarterback at Fitchburg State, Hetherman was a team captain in 2005. He went 21-11 as a starter, leading the team to a pair of MASCAC titles, two NEFC championship games and a berth in two ECAC bowl games. Prior to his coaching career, he spent one year with the Carinthian Black Lions of the Austrian Football League before a season with Wuerzburg in the German Football League.

Hetherman graduated from Fitchburg State with a bachelor of science in secondary education.





Shane Montgomery

Offensive Coordinator/ Quarterbacks

First Season

Shane Montgomery was hired on Dec. 28, 2018 as James Madison University's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Montgomery brings over 25 years of Division I coaching experience to Harrisonburg, which includes four years as an FBS head coach and 14 years as an offensive coordinator at both the FCS and FBS levels.

Montgomery came to JMU after spending the 2018 season at Charlotte, where he served as offensive coordinator. The 49ers won five games, which was a program-record at the FBS level. They also finished .500 in Conference USA for the first time, finishing with a 4-4 league record.

Prior to his brief stint with the 49ers, Montgomery led the offense for eight seasons (2010-17) at Youngstown State, coaching the top quarterback and some of the best running backs in school history. In each of his eight seasons, YSU threw and rushed for over 2,000 yards. The Penguins achieved the program's top-four outputs of total offense during his tenure (2011, 2016, 2010, 2017) while Montgomery called the plays.

Montgomery helped four-year starter Kurt Hess rewrite the YSU record books during his first four seasons as offensive coordinator. Hess finished his career as the school's all-time leader in completions (766), attempts (1,135), yards (8,925), touchdown passes (75), yards per game (198.4), 200-yard passing games (24), passer rating (144.96), touchdown responsibility (87), four-touchdown passing games (six), total offensive yards (9,459) and total offense per game (210.2).

He was part of YSU's run to the national championship in 2016, which included playoff victories against Samford, at Jacksonville State, versus Wofford and at Eastern Washington before falling to JMU in the title game. That season ended a 10-year playoff drought for the Penguins.

Before his run in Youngstown, Montgomery spent one season as offensive coordinator at Akron (2009) and eight years at Miami (OH), serving as offensive coordinator (2001-04) and head coach (2005-08). He also led the offensive during his four years at the helm.

While at Miami, Montgomery mentored two-time Super Bowl champion quarterback Ben Roethlisberger, who set 21 program records in three seasons before being the 11th overall pick in the 2004 NFL Draft. Roethlisberger threw for over 10,000 yards and 80 touchdowns in his three-year collegiate career. Montgomery was also a two-time finalist for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes to the nation's top assistant coach.

In his four seasons as head coach with the RedHawks, he guided the team to a share of two Mid-American Conference East division titles (2005, 2007). His first season as head coach saw Miami win five of its last six games, players on the all-conference team and have seven players move on to the NFL the following season.

Montgomery also had stops as an assistant at Chattanooga (1993-00) and at NC State (1991-92) where he was a quarterback from 1986-89. He was a three-year starter and led the Wolfpack to two bowl berths, earning Offensive MVP honors at the 1988 Peach Bowl and 1989 Copper Bowl. He was a Second Team All-ACC selection in 1989 and finished his career with over 5,000 passing yards and 31 touchdowns.

He and his wife, Sandy, have two sons, Tanner and Trent. Tanner is a catcher for the Youngstown State baseball team and Trent is a pitcher at Catawba College.





Damian Wroblewski

Offensive Line/ Assistant Head Coach First Season

Damian Wroblewski was hired on Dec. 17, 2018 as James Madison University's assistant head coach, working primarily with the offensive line.

Wroblewski came to JMU following a five-season stint at Elon (2014-18), where he also led the offensive line.

During his final two seasons in 2017 and 2018, Wroblewski's line propelled the Elon offense to greater heights, leading to a pair of FCS Playoff appearances. In 2018, he guided a pair of seniors to All-America status in Oil Udoh and CJ Toogood. Udoh also shined at both the East-West Shrine Bowl and Reese's Senior Bowl to earn a spot at the 2019 NFL Combine.

Elon's offense led the CAA during the regular season and ranked second overall in rushing offense (199.5) and fourth in total offense (373.5). The Phoenix also allowed the fewest sacks of any league team, at 16, which was an improvement of 15 from the year prior.

In 2017, Elon's offense rushed for 164.5 yards per game, which ranked fourth in the CAA was nearly 40 yards better per game than the 2016 campaign. The Phoenix also ranked fourth in total offense, gaming 370 yards per game. That mark was nearly 100 yards better than their 2016 total. Toogood earned a spot on the All-CAA Second Team and Ikenna Iwwokeji was a Third Team honoree and later signed a free-agent contract with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Wroblewski came to Elon following two seasons as the offensive line coach at Rutgers (2012-13). In 2012, Rutgers allowed just eight sacks all year, ranking eighth in the entire FBS. Rutgers claimed a share of the Big East Conference championship and earned a trip to the Russell Sports Bowl. The following year, the Scarlet Knights surpassed 200 rushing yards in a pair of outings and reached the Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium.

Over his two seasons in Piscataway, Wroblewski coached a three linemen to all-conference accolades. Antwan Lowery was a First Team All-Big East honoree and Kaleb Johnson earned a Second Team spot in 2012, in the programs inaugural year in the American Athletic Conference in 2013, Betim Bujari was Second Team All-AAC

Before Rutgers, Wroblewski spent five seasons leading the offensive line at Delaware (2007-11), where he was also assistant head coach for four years. He additionally served as the recruiting coordinator and run-game coordinator. His time in Newark was highlighted by a pair of appearances in the national championship game.

In 2010 the Blue Hens finished 12-3, won a share of the CAA championship and reached the national championship game after leading the league in first downs and pass efficiency while ranking second in scoring offense, rushing offense and total offense. Running back Andrew Pierce, a two-time all-conference performer and an All-American, amassed 1,655 rushing yards to lead the league.

The Blue Hens also reached the national title game in 2007. That season, All-American running back Omar Cuff rushed for a league-high 1,945 yards. With quarterback Joe Flacco, Delaware's offense led the conference in scoring offense, passing offense and total offense in 2007.

Wroblewski also had coaching stops at Stony Brook (2006), Hofstra (2004-05), Penn (2002-03) and Bryant College (1999-02).

A four-year member of the Lafayette College football team as a center. Wroblewski was a two-time All-Patriot League selection and earned the team's Stony Jones Award as the team MVP as a senior. He earned his degree in history in 1999.

Wroblewski and his wife, Kara, have one son, Damian, Jr.





Matt Birkett

Cornerbacks First Season

Matt Birkett was hired on Dec. 29, 2018, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University football program, working primarily with the cornerbacks.

Birkett came to JMU following a seven-year stint on the Maine football staff, which included five on the defensive side of the ball. He was defensive backs coach for the 2017 and 2018 seasons, while also leading the cornerbacks for three years (2014-16) and running backs (2013) and tight ends (2012) for one season each.

Over the past two years, he was part of leading Maine's defense to ranking as one of the nation's best at the FCS level. In 2018, the Black Bears turned in their best season in program history, winning the CAA championship, reaching the FCS semifinals for the first time ever while leading the league in six defensive categories.

Maine ranked sixth nationally with a CAA-best 18 interceptions Birkett guided Manny Patterson to First Team All-CAA and Second Team All-America status after he led the conference for the second straight year with 22 pass breakups and 25 total passes defended, which was good for third in the entire FCS. Patterson was also a Second Team selection in 2017 after tallying a CAA-high 17 breakups. He also coached freshman Katley Joseph, who ranked second in the CAA with 12 pass breakups and 13 passes defended in 2018.

In 2017, he mentored one of Maine's most veteran units, leading the Black Bears to 11 interceptions. The 2016 season saw Najee Goode earn Third Team All-CAA honors after he ranked tied for third in the conference with three forced fumbles and nine passes defended, which included a pair of interceptions.

In 2015, he mentored a young cornerback tandem, which assisted Maine to ranking third in the CAA in total defense (316.8). Maine produced 12 interceptions, including five coming from the corners. In his first season working with the corners in 2014, he helped the Black Bears to a No. 2 ranking in the CAA in total defense, which was also 15th nationally. They also led the league and ranked eighth in the FCS in defensive pass efficiency while placing second in the league in pass defense (772.2) and producing 14 interceptions. That season produced an all-conference selection in Axel Ofori.

Birkett's running backs rushed for 174.5 yards per game and tallied 21 scores in 2013. He guided three backs to over 500 rushing yards that season and Nigel Jones ranked tied for fifth in the CAA with eight rushing scores. In his first season on staff at Maine, Birkett coached Justin Perillo, who was an All-CAA selection and finished second on the team with five receiving touchdowns before signing a contract with the Green Bay Packers.

Birkett came to Maine following one season at Chaminade High School in California, where he was defensive backs coach, helped the team to a 10-2 record while reaching the 2011 California Interscholastic Federation semifinals. He also had stops at UCLA (2010), Pac-Five High School in Hawaii (2008-09), Rindge and Latin High School in Massachusetts (2007).

He is a 2003 graduate of Edinboro College, where he led the Scots to a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship. He also played at Rhode Island where he named the team's co-MVP in 1999.

Birkett and his wife Sara have two sons, Justus and Massai, and two daughters, Siena and Mischa.





Grant Cain

Special Teams Coordinator/ Tight Ends First Season

Grant Cain was hired on Jan. 3, 2019, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University football program, working primarily with the tight ends. He additionally serves as the team's special teams coordinator.

Cain came to JMU after spending the previous six seasons on the staff at Mercer where led the special teams unit and inside linebackers (2013-18). He was also assistant head coach in 2017 and 2018, seasons in which the Bears were one of the nation's top teams in terms of special teams.

During the 2018 season, Cain guided the Bears to top-12 rankings nationally in four statistical categories, which included leading the country in net punting (40.58). He mentored Matt Shiel to the eighth-best punting average (43.6) in the FCS. Mercer also led the Southern Conference and ranked ninth nationally in kick-return average (25.57) while ranking 12th in both punt-return average (14.17) and punt-return defense (4.35).

In 2017, the Bears paced the nation in kick-return defense while also ranking 10th in punt-return average and 18th in kick returns. Mercer produced top-15 rankings on special teams in five of his six seasons. That season also marked the fourth straight season the team had at lead 21 turnovers, registering 25. The Bears also led the country with 16 fumble recoveries.

Mercer led the SoCon and ranked sixth nationally with 13 fumble recoveries in 2016. The year prior, the Bears led the league in scoring defense, at 21.6 points per game while forcing a SoCon-leading 21 turnovers.

In 2014, Cain's group led a defense that ranked second in the conference in forced turnovers and fourth in total defense. That season, Tyler Ward set the program's single-game record with 18 tackles and eclipsed the 100-tackle mark to earn All-SoCon honors. On special teams, Chandler Curtis led the nation in 2014 with four returns for a touchdown to earn the team's first All-America accolade in school history. In his first season, Mercer ranked second in the FCS in rushing defense, as the linebackers produced two of the four top tacklers, led by Tyler Ward's 101 tackles and 10.5 tackles for loss.

Cain came to Mercer following a seven-year stint at Coastal Carolina (2005-12), where he held various positions with the Chanticleers. After beginning his CCU career as a graduate assistant, he became a full-time assistant in 2007, being appointed the outside linebackers coach. Coastal ranked among the nation's top-23 programs in tackles for loss in 2007, led the conference in TFL's in 2009 and paced the league in sacks in 2009.

During his time in Conway, Cain was part of three Big South Conference championships (2005, 2006, 2010). He also contributed with instructing the special teams unit while at Coastal and also held a role with the inside linebackers.

Cain is a 2003 graduate of Catawba, where he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He also received a master's degree in instructional technology from Coastal Carolina in 2007.

Bryant Haines

Linebackers/ Co-Defensive Coordinator First Season

Bryant Haines was hired on Dec. 17, 2018, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University program, working primarily with the linebackers. He additionally serves as the team's co-defensive coordinator.

Haines came to JMU following two seasons at Elon, where he also led the Phoenix's linebacking corps. This is the third school Haines has been under Curt Cignetti, as he also coached on his staff at Indiana (Pa.).

He mentored Warren Messer to back-to-back seasons on the All-CAA First Team, which included him earning All-America accolades in both seasons. Messer ranked fourth in the CAA with 8.5 tackles per game and fifth in interception return yards, at 86, during his senior campaign. Bryant also coached Matt Baker to Third Team All-CAA status in 2018 after he ranked tied for seventh in the conference with 7.5 sacks.

Prior to Elon, Haines spent the 2016 season as the linebackers coach at UC Davis where he helped Nas Anesi to Second Team All-Big Sky honors.

Before UC Davis, Haines was on Cignetti's staff at IUP for two seasons (2014-15). During his time there, he helped the Crimson Hawks lead the Pennsylvania State Athletics Conference in scoring defense, total defense, third-down defense and redzone defense in 2015. IUP was fourth among all Division II teams in rushing defense in 2014 and 13th nationally in 2015.

Prior to joining Cignetti the first time, he worked with the Ohio State linebackers in 2013, a year in which the Buckeyes finished with an undefeated 12-0 record. He also had stops at Indiana (2012), Adrian College (2010-11) and Manchester College

Haines was a linebacker at Ball State, where he was one of the nation's top defenders. He earned College Football News Second Team Freshman All-America honors in 2005 and was later named to the to the All-Mid American Conference Team and the watch list for the Dick Butkus Award in 2008, which is given annually to the top linebacker in the FBS.

He is a 2009 graduate from BSU, where he earned a bachelor's degree in general





Andrew Jackson

Defensive Tackles First Season

Andrew Jackson was hired on Jan. 3, 2019, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University football program, working primarily with the defensive tackles.

Jackson came to JMU after spending the 2018 season as the defensive quality control coach at Mississippi State, where he helped the Bulldogs to an 8-5 record and berth in the

Outback Bowl. MSU ranked in the top 10 nationally in eight defensive categories, highlighted by leading the country in total defense (263.1). The Bulldogs also ranked second in scoring defense (13.2), third in rushing defense (95.1) and third-down defense (26.6%), seventh in both passing defense (168.0) and red-zone defense (73.5), eighth in tackles for loss (7.9) and ninth in first-down defense (212).

Prior to MSU, Jackson was the defensive line coach at Fordham for one season (2017). The Rams' defense ranked third in the Patriot League in turnover margin (+0.18) and had three players earn All-Patriot League honors, including freshman linebacker Glenn Cunningham, who was a Freshman All-American.

He was a graduate assistant with the defensive line at Penn State for two seasons (2015-16), as he was part of the Nittany Lions' 2016 team that won the Big Ten championship and earned a berth in the Rose Bowl. Jackson was responsible for weekly film breakdowns and scouting reports and was in charge of preparing the scout team before practice. He also works with the defensive tackles during individual drills.

Jackson also spent two seasons as an assistant at Stony Brook (2013-14) and began his career as a GA at LIU Post, where he was a three-year starter on the defensive line.

A 2011 graduate with a degree in physical education science and coaching, Jackson was a three-year captain for LIU Post. He was a Second Team All-PSAC honoree as a senior after recording 12 tackles for loss and five sacks for the Pioneers.





Matt Merritt

Running Backs First Season

Matt Merritt was hired on Dec. 20, 2018, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University football program, working primarily with the running backs.

Merritt came to JMU after spending the 2017 and 2018 seasons on Cignetti's staff at Elon where he also coached the running backs. In his two years with the Phoenix, the program saw drastic improvement in the run dame which included leading the CAA in the 2018 regular season and second overall, at just under 200 yards per game.

Led by CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year Jaylan Thomas and two-time All-CAA selection Malcolm Summers, the Phoenix backs combined to rush for more than 3,800 rushing yards and 30 touchdowns in Merritt's two seasons guiding the group.

Elon ranked second in the CAA in rushing during the 2018 season at 199.5 yards per game. That was a 35 yards per game improvement from the 2017 season, in which the Phoenix rushed for 164.5 yards per game, which was almost 40 yards better than the year prior to Merritt's hire.

Thomas was the league's top offensive rookie threat in 2018, ranking second in the CAA at 95.1 rushing yards per game. He also scored four rushing touchdowns while leading the league with 6.6 yards per carry. He tallied 761 rushing yards in just eight games of action. Summers had been leading the league in rushing yards per game before an injury in the fifth game of the season, accruing nearly 600 rushing yards and three touchdowns in just five games. That included a 185-yard performance in Elon's first win ever against JMU.

In 2017. Summers rushed for over 750 yards and four scores in only six games, leading the CAA and country in rushing yards before a season-ending injury midway through the campaign. Summers, along with De Sean McNair and Brelynd Cyphers combined for almost 1,900 yards and 14 scores to help the Phoenix reach the FCS playoffs after finishing second in the CAA.

Prior to his arrival at Elon, Merritt spent one season as the running backs coach at Division II school Ohio Dominican. ODU rushed for 1,398 yards and 16 scores, as four backs ran for at least 260 yards in 2016.

Before Ohio Dominican, Merritt was an assistant running backs coach and offensive graduate assistant at Ohio State from 2013 to 2015. During Merritt's time at OSU, the Buckeyes won the 2015 national championship, the 2016 Fiesta Bowl. and a Big Ten championship. They also made an appearance in the 2014 Orange Bowl.

While at OSU, he helped coach wide receivers, running backs, special teams and the defensive scout team. He played a role in the development of Ezekiel Elliott and Curtis Samuel while with the Buckeyes, in addition to coaching Carlos Hyde and Braxton Miller.

Merritt also had stops at St. Charles Preparatory and Capital University, where he was a running back and wide receiver.

As a collegian, Merritt had 542 rushing yards, aiding in Capital's 2007 playoff berth. He tallied 1,099 career rushing yards and 12 touchdowns and helped Capital make a pair of Division III playoff appearances.

Merritt earned his bachelor's degree in education from Capital before picking up master's in sport management from Ohio State and coaching education from Ohio University.

He is married to the former Brittanie Duty and they reside in Harrisonburg.





Mike Shanahan

Wide Receivers/ Recruiting Coordinator First Season

Mike Shanahan was hired on Dec. 17, 2018, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University program, working primarily with the wide receivers. He additionally serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Shanahan came to JMU following two seasons at Elon, where he also led the receiving unit for the Phoenix.

In his first year at Elon, he guided Kortez Weeks to Third Team All-CAA and Freshman All-America accolades. Weeks led three Phoenix receivers over 500 yards that season, including his team-high 709. The receivers aided in Elon averaging more than 50 passing yards per game from 2016 to 2017, tallying 205.5 receiving yards per outing.

In 2018, Cole Taylor was one of the league's top deep-threat receivers, as he averaged 16.9 yards per catch, which ranked fifth in the CAA. He led the squad with 524 receiving yards, while Weeks was second with 484 yards.

Shanahan followed Cignetti to Elon after spending the 2016 season as his wide receivers coach at Indiana (Pa.). In his lone season at IUP, Shanahan helped Walt Pegues to Second Team All-PSAC honors. Pegues ranked 11th in NCAA Division II with 94.1 receiving yards per game.

IUP finished the 2016 campaign at 10-2 overall, finishing the year ranked 12th after advancing to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Prior to IUP, Shanahan spent two seasons at Pittsburgh (2014-15). While at Pitt, he worked primarily with the receivers, guiding NFL prospect Tyler Boyd to First Team All-ACC honors with 91 catches for 926 yards and six scores in 2015. He was part of a Panthers' team that went 8-5 and advanced to the Military Bowl that year.

He also saw time coaching alongside offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jim Chaney during spring practice as he transitioned from a volunteer coach in 2014 to the offensive graduate assistant.

Shanahan graduated from Pitt in 2012 after four years on the gridiron where his 159 receptions and 2,276 yards both rank in the top 10 in school history. A four-year letterman and two-time team captain, Shanahan earned Second Team All-Big East honors in 2012 after catching 62 passes for 983 yards and six touchdowns while helping the Panthers to a BBVA Compass Bowl appearance.

He was also a four-time All-Big East Academic Team selection and was the recipient of Pitt's annual Senior of Distinction Award.

After graduation, Shanahan had stints as a member of the New York Jets and Tampa Bay Buccaneers' preseason squads. He was also a member of the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League as a wide receiver and tight end.

Shanahan earned Associated Press first team Class AAAA All-State honors as a high school senior. He earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Pitt as he studied history as an undergrad and social studies education as a grad student.





Ryan Smith

Safeties/ Pro Scout Liaison First Season

Ryan Smith was hired on Dec. 17, 2018, as an assistant coach with the James Madison University football program, working primarily with the safeties. He additionally serves as the team's pro scout liaison.

Smith came to JMU following two seasons at Elon, where he also led the defensive backfield for the Phoenix.

The unit saw improvements from 2017 to 2018, as the defensive backs accounted for 12 of the team's 13 interceptions in 2018, which was two better than the 10 they intercepted the season prior. The group also broke up 31 passes in his second season, one better than the 30 they achieved in 2017.

He guided two players to All-CAA status in 2018 in Greg Liggs, Jr., who was a Second Team member, and Tyler Campbell, who was a Third Team selection. Liggs, as well and Connor Christiansen were two of the league's best defensive backs, as the duo were tied for third in the CAA with four interceptions apiece. Liggs was also third in passes defended (13) and tied for fourth in fumble recoveries (2). He additionally led Chris Blair to Third Team All-CAA accolades in 2017.

Prior to Elon, Smith spent two seasons at Penn State, serving as a defensive graduate assistant. At PSU, Smith was part of a Nittany Lion squad that won the 2016 Big Ten Championship, earned a berth in the Rose Bowl and finished 11-3 overall. Penn State's defense picked off 10 passes and broke up 60 more in 2015. During his time in University Park, Pa., he helped develop three NFL players in 2016 Miami Dolphins draft pick Jordan Lucas, 2018 Pittsburgh Steelers draft pick Marcus Allen and current Los Angeles Charger Trevor Williams.

Before heading to Penn State, Smith was a defensive GA at the University of Texas at San Antonio for the 2014 season.

A 2014 graduate of the College of William & Mary, Smith helped the Tribe to a 2009 FCS semifinals appearance. As a senior, Smith tallied 47 tackles, one sack and one interception at cornerback. Smith was a two-time CAA Academic All-Conference honoree. He earned his bachelor's degree in process management from the College of William and Mary and a master's degree in educational leadership from Penn State University





Brian Phillips

Director of Strength & Conditioning First Season

Brian Phillips was hired on Dec. 17, 2018 as James Madison University's Director of Strength & Conditioning.



CAA Football

CAA Football has established itself as one of the nation's premier FCS power conferences for more than a decade due to its on-field success, national exposure and the achievements of its student-athletes in the classroom, in the community and at the next level.

CAA Football made history in 2018 by becoming the first conference to ever have six teams (Delaware, Elon, James Madison, Maine, Stony Brook and Towson) receive berths in the NCAA Division I Football Championship. Ten of the CAA's 12 teams have made the playoffs since 2015. The league has had multiple teams in the playoffs for the past 28 years and at least three squads in the field for the past 13 seasons. A CAA team has competed for the national championship in eight of the past 14 years.

CAA Football continued its success against non-conference opponents in 2018, finishing 22-9 against FCS foes and 24-19 overall. The league posted two victories over FBS competition for the third year in a row as Villanova knocked off city rival Temple, 19-17, and Maine rallied past Western Kentucky, 31-28. CAA Football teams have now recorded 38 wins over FBS opponents in its history.

A strong presence in the national rankings was another constant in 2018 as CAA Football led all conferences with six teams in the final Top 25 polls. Maine, James Madison, Stony Brook, Elon, Towson and Delaware were ranked in both the STATS and AFCA polls, with Rhode Island among other teams receiving votes. Ten of the 12 CAA teams were either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls at some point during the season.

A total of 19 CAA Football players were named to one or more All-America teams in 2018, while six players and one coach were selected as finalists for national Player/Coach of the Year awards from STATS.

CAA Football continues to provide a path to the next level, with three players selected in the 2019 NFL Draft. Delaware safety Nasir Adderley was picked in the second round by the Los Angeles Chargers, Elon offensive tackle Oli Udoh was chosen in the sixth round by the Minnesota Vikings and JMU cornerback Jimmy Moreland went to the Washington Redskins in round seven. The conference has had multiple players picked in each NFL Draft since 2006.

CAA Football begins a new broadcast agreement this season with partner FloSports, which will televise at least 50 games across their digital platform. In addition, several teams will have contests televised on regional sports networks. The CAA's national appeal was showcased in 2017 when ESPN's iconic College Gameday show aired live from James Madison on Oct. 14 prior to the Dukes' conference showdown with Villanova. It was College Gameday's second trip to Harrisonburg in a three-year period.

CAA Football's emphasis on its players' off-the-field achievements was evident again in 2018. Stony Brook's Chris Infantino was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award, which honors the player who best embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, teamwork and sportsmanship in his academic and athletic pursuits. Richmond's Griffin Trau was selected as CAA Football's Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was honored on the FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team

Showing a desire to unite behind a common cause, all 12 CAA Football schools partnered with the Be the Match Foundation in 2018. Former Villanova coach Andy Talley has been a driving force nationally for the program, which raises awareness of the need for bone marrow donors.

CAA Football has enjoyed a tremendous record in the postseason, earning 108 total playoff berths and placing at least three teams in the field every year since 2006. The league's 108 all-time wins in the NCAA playoffs are second-most of any FCS conference, and the conference has further established its presence at the national level by placing 14 teams in the national semifinals over the past 13 seasons.

James Madison took home the national championship in 2016 with a 28-14 victory over Youngstown State. It was the third title in a decade and sixth overall for CAA Football. Villanova captured the 2009 national championship and Richmond claimed its first FCS crown in 2008. In 2004, JMU won the national championship, becoming the first team since the field expanded to 16 teams in 1986 to reach the final after winning three road playoff games. Delaware rolled past Colgate, 40-0, to capture the first title-game shutout in 2003. Former league member Massachusetts earned a national championship in 1998.

CAA Football boasts a total of 30 individual national award winners in league history. Villanova quarterback John Robertson (2014), Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke (2012), New Hampshire quarterback Ricky Santos (2006), William & Mary quarterback Lang Campbell (2004), Villanova running back Brian Westbrook (2001), Nova wide receiver Brian Finneran (1997), UNH running back Jerry Azumah (1998) and Towson running back Dave Meggett (1998) all earned the Walter Payton Award as the top offensive player in FCS under the league banner. UNH linebacker Matt Evans (2011), James Madison defensive lineman Arthur Moats (2009), and JMU linebacker Derrick Lloyd (2001) each received the



Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in FCS, while JMU defensive lineman Andrew Ankrah was chosen as the FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year in 2017. Robertson (2012) and Towson's Terrance West (2011) are past recipients of the Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in FCS. New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell (2005 and 2014), Towson's Rob Ambrose (2011), JMU's Mickey Matthews (1999 and 2008), Villanova's Andy Talley (1997) and Boston University's Dan Allen (1993) are past Eddie Robinson Award winners from the league as the top coach in FCS. Maine's Joe Harasymiak (2018), JMU's Mike Houston (2016), McDonnell (2014), Matthews (2004), Talley (1997 and 2009), Delaware's K.C. Keeler (2010), Richmond's Mike London (2008), and Massachusetts' Mark Whipple (1998) have all garnered the AFCA National Coach of the Year honor. Stony Brook's Chris Infantino received the STATS Doris Robinson Scholar-Athlete Award in 2018.

The league remains successful beyond the collegiate playing field. CAA Football has had 119 players drafted by NFL franchises dating back to 1948. A total of 41 players have been selected in the draft over the last 14 years, including 2013 Super Bowl MVP Joe Flacco of Delaware (18th overall to the Baltimore Ravens in 2008). More than 30 players currently join Flacco on active NFL rosters.

CAA Football's geographic footprint extends up and down the East Coast, with schools located from Maine to North Carolina. Members include UAlbany, Delaware, Elon, James Madison, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Richmond, Stony Brook, Towson, Villanova and William and Mary. Joe D'Antonio is in his fourth year as commissioner of CAA Football and the Colonial Athletic Association.

While CAA Football officially began March 1, 2007, its roots date back more than 60 years. On December 3, 1946, the Code of the Yankee Conference went into effect. Established as an all-sports conference for the New England land grant colleges, the six charter members included Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. Upon the formation of Division I-AA football in 1978, the league disbanded all sports except for football. Delaware and Richmond were admitted to the conference in 1986, Villanova was added in 1988 and James Madison, Northeastern and William and Mary joined the league in 1993. The Atlantic 10 assumed operational control of the conference from 1997-2006, with Hofstra becoming part of the league in 2001 and Towson joining the group in 2004. With the conference under the CAA Football banner, UAlbany and Stony Brook were welcomed in 2013, followed by Elon in 2014.

Dukes Drop Opener, 24-13, at NC State

RALEIGH, N.C. - Second-ranked James Madison scored the game's first touch-down and limited NC State to only 2.9 yards per rush, but a 17-point spurt in the second quarter gave way for a 24-13 Wolfpack win on Saturday afternoon at Carter-Finley Stadium.

NCSU improved to 1-0 on the young season while the Dukes fell to 0-1, marking their first season-opening loss since the 2014 campaign at Maryland.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU passed for 202 yards, 197 of which came from junior Ben DiNucci, who also threw a touchdown pass in his debut with the Dukes.
- DiNucci also led JMU in rushing, going for 79 yards, which included a game-long 24-yard run
- Redshirt junior Riley Stapleton led the team with a career-high nine catches for 88 yards and a touchdown, which put JMU up 7-0 late in the first.
- Senior Marcus Marshall ran for 65 yards, including a long of 26 yards, while playing against his hometown team.
- The Wolfpack overcame the early deficit with three scoring plays in the second quarter, with a field goal and two passing touchdowns by Ryan Finley – the latter coming with only 18 seconds to go in the first half.
- Redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke cut into NC State's lead with a pair of second-half field goals – both from 19 yards out – to make it 17-13 with 6:59 to play.
- NCSU answered with an 84-yard drive over 11 plays, capped off by a rushing touchdown by Reggie Gallaspy with just over a minute to go.
 - JMU increased the longest winning streak in all of Division I football to 13 games while improving to 2-0 all-time against American Conference teams (48-45 at SMU in 2015). The Dukes also snapped a 25-game winning streak for ECU against FCS opponents.

STARTING ON A HIGH

- Three receivers redshirt junior Mack Cullen and redshirt freshmen Josh Sims and Kyndel Dean all made their first career catches Saturday.
- Sims was second for JMU with four catches for 32 yards and Cullen and Dean each reeled in a pair of passes.
- Junior Adam Smith led the Dukes with a career-high 10 tackles (7 solo) in his first start at safety, while four others produced at least seven stops.
- Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter paced the defense up front, with career bests of seven tackles and three tackles-for-loss. He also added the team's lone sack.
- Redshirt junior Dimitri Holloway tallied nine tackles and a forced fumble in his first game since last year's opener, and redshirt freshman KeShaun Moore put
 together a career-high eight stops and a tackle for loss in his first career game.
- Redshirt sophomore D'Angelo Amos also registered a career-high seven tackles at safety while adding a breakup.
- · Also making his first start at defensive line, sophomore Mike Greene recovered a fumble in the first quarter off the Holloway force.
- Freshman Mateo Jackson came off the bench to record five stops in his first career outing.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- JMU, playing in its 47th year, is now 25-21-1 all-time in season openers.
- The Dukes nearly doubled NC State in the run game, out-rushing the 'Pack 163-83.
- NCSU had 25 first downs, to JMU's 23, and held a 392-365 total yards advantage
- Finley threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns, and Jakobi Meyers had a huge receiving game, with 14 catches for 161 yards. CJ Riley and Thayer Thomas
 each caught second-quarter touchdowns.
- The teams were even in yards per play, at 5.4 per snap.
- JMU won the time-of-possession battle, with the offense on the field for 31:42, and each team forced one turnover, later resulting in a touchdown.

NORFOLK, Va. - Multiple lightning delays and three scoring drives in the first quarter is all that was in store for second-ranked James Madison, as the Dukes claimed a 17-0 victory at Norfolk State after the teams agreed to end the game following lengthy weather delays on Saturday night at William "Dick" Price Stadium

The Dukes evened their record to 1-1 on the year, while the Spartans fell to 1-1. JMU is now 2-0 all-time against NSU with wins in consecutive seasons. It's the second straight season the Dukes registered a shutout win, as it beat New Hampshire 21-0 on Oct. 28, 2017.

QUICK SUMMARY

- The Dukes opened the game's scoring on their opening drive on a 5-yard touchdown run by redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci. The drive, which spanned 8 plays, 69 yards and only 2:37 of action, was highlighted by Di-Nucci's 56-yard run during the drive.
- Two plays later, redshirt senior cornerback Jimmy Moreland tied JMU's alltime interceptions record with his 14th career pick on a deep pass.
- With 4:24 to play in the quarter, redshirt sophomore returner D'Angelo Amos returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown, marking the second straight year he records a punt for a score.
- Redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke added a 28-yard field goal with 36 seconds to play.

WEATHER NOT COOPERATING

- JMU and Norfolk State sat through numerous delays before being able to kick off Saturday night.
- Lightning forced a 90-minute delay to start the game, with the opening kick coming at 7:35.
- At 8:20, the game was delayed again until the teams agreed to end the game 50 minutes later.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- DiNucci registered his second career rushing touchdown and his first in a JMU uniform, as he led the team in rushing for the second straight week with four carries for 67 yards (16.8 per carry).
- Moreland is now tied with former JMU safety Raven Greene with 14 career interceptions after his first-quarter pick.
- Amos averaged 51.5 yards per return, as he added a 27-yard punt return after his 76 yarder.
- The Dukes came out on top despite the Spartans maintaining possession for 9:04 during the 15 minutes of play.
- JMU out-gained Norfolk State 118 to 29 in the game, including 106 to 24 on the ground.

#2 Dukes Cruise Past Robert Morris 73-7 in Home Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Second-ranked James Madison exploded for 52 first-half points and gained 667 yards of offense en route to a decisive 73-7 home-opening victory against Robert Morris on Thursday night at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 2-1, utilizing 11 scoring drives to catapult past the Colonials, who fell to 1-2 on the year.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci accounted for a career-high five total touchdowns in the first half, with three passing and two rushing. He was 14-of-17 for 184 yards and ran for 39 yards on seven carries.
- A JMU record was set, as redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland picked off a pass and ran it back 20 yards for a touchdown. It was Moreland's 15th career interception, surpassing Raven Greene, who had 14. Coincidentally, both Moreland and Greene set the interceptions record with a pick-six.
- JMU rushed for 386 yards as a team, with five players accounting for at least 40 yards. Senior Marcus Marshall led the way with six carries for 95 yards (15.8 avg.) and a touchdown, while also making a 39-yard touchdown reception to open the scoring. His 81-yard scamper to open the second-half scoring was the second-longest run of his career and tied for 10th longest in school history.
- Sophomore Percy Agyei-Obese had five rushes for 93 yards (18.6 avg.), which included an 80-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Also finding the end zone on the ground were redshirt sophomores Jawon Hamilton and Eric Kirlew their first career scores with the Dukes.
- Redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton reeled in a game-high seven receptions for 67 yards and a score, which was one better than the entire RMU team, which
 had six catches. Redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean also scored his first career touchdown on a 15-yard catch in the first.
- The Dukes scored on 10 of their 11 first drives to take a commanding 66-0 lead in the third quarter. JMU's 66-point win was the fifth largest in school history.
- In addition to Moreland's interception, two players recorded their first career interceptions, as junior safety Adam Smith tallied his in the second and freshman defensive lineman Drew Painter came up with his first late in the fourth.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- Following a stellar first half, JMU led in both rushing yards (207-42) and passing yards (184-40).
- With 52 first-half points, JMU tied the program record for most points in a half. The previous record was set against Morehead State in the 2016 season opener.
- JMU's 73 is the most points ever allowed by Robert Morris and the fifth-most ever produced by the Dukes.
- Five Dukes ran in touchdowns in tonight's victory, while eight total players made it to the end zone.
- Head Coach Mike Houston has led JMU to four of its five top-scoring performances since his hire before the 2016 season.
- JMU outgained RMU in total offense by a margin of 667 to 223.
- The Dukes successfully completed their first fourth-down conversion of the season the lone conversion of the night.
- JMU had three interceptions, spanning 43 yards on returns, while RMU did not produce a single interception. RMU's lone takeaway came on a fourth-quarter fumble.

JMU Claims 17-0 Victory in Lightning-Shortened Game at NSU

HARRISONBURG, Va. - No. 2 James Madison used an excellent defensive performance and a three-touchdown third quarter to blow past William & Mary, 51-0, in Colonial Athletic Association football on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes (3-1, 1-0 CAA) won their 19th straight home game, which leads all of the FCS, and also claimed their 19th consecutive conference victory, extending the CAA record. The Tribe (1-2, 0-1 CAA) dropped their second straight outing, as JMU turned in the biggest win in the 41-game series.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU turned in its second shutout in three weeks, and the first in the series versus William & Mary. It was tied for the second-highest shutout win in school history, falling just short of its 56-0 romp of Hofstra in 2008.
- The Dukes forced four turnovers in the game, with a pair of interceptions for a touchdown and two fumble recoveries. Redshirt senior cornerback Jimmy Moreland had a 56-yard pick-six for his 16th career interception and fifth defensive touchdown, and junior linebacker Bryce Maginley had 24-yard pick-six late in the game for his first career interception.
- Redshirt sophomore safety D'Angelo Amos tallied both fumble recoveries for a new career high.
- JMU allowed the visitors to reach the first-down marker just once on third down, holding the Tribe to a 1-for-15 conversion rate.
- The Dukes out-gained W&M 444-132, including a 247-55 advantage in the run game.
- For the first time in school history, siblings scored a touchdown in the same game for the Dukes, as redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton and junior tight end Dylan Stapleton each found the end zone. R. Stapleton had a game-high eight catches for 78 yards, while D. Stapleton made three grabs for 20 yards. D. Stapleton struck first, opening the scoring on a 5-yard reception late in the first quarter, and R. Stapleton opened the second half with an 11-yard TD to make it 24-0 at that point.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 17-of-23 for 160 yards and two touchdowns with an interception.
- Graduate student running back Cardon Johnson led the ground game with 83 yards, while senior Marcus Marshall gained 65 yards with a touchdown. Senior Trai Sharp also added 42 rushing yards and a score.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway led the team with nine tackles (1.0 for a loss) and a forced fumble, and Moreland made five stops (1.0 for a loss) and his interception for a score. Junior defensive linemen Ron'Dell Carter and Matt Terrell each had 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack in the win.
- In the kicking game, redshirt sophomore Ethan Ratke matched the program record with three made field goals, marking the 17th time in school history the Dukes had a player with three makes in a game.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- With 25,130 fans in attendance, this was the eighth largest attendance in Bridgeforth Stadium history.
- For the second time since 2015, JMU scored over 50 points in a shutout. Today's score matched JMU's win back on Oct. 17, 2015, when the Dukes beat Elon 51-0 on the road.
- This was JMU's biggest win over the Tribe, besting the 46-14 win last season, and was the biggest margin of victory by either team in the series, besting W&M's 33-0 win back in 1979.
- W&M did not convert a third down until late in the second half, going 0-for-12 to start.
- Of JMU's seven offensive scoring drives, it had great field position, needing to go over 50 yards on just two of them. JMU's average starting field position was
 on the positive side of the field, at the William & Mary 49.
- On the flip side, the Tribe had a starting field position average of its own 21.

#2 JMU Blasts Richmond in Largest Road Win Ever

RICHMOND, Va. - Second-ranked James Madison turned in the biggest road win in school history, amassing 543 yards of offense along with five takeaways in a 63-10 triumph over Richmond on Saturday afternoon at Robins Stadium.

The Dukes improve to 4-1 on the year and 2-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Spiders fall to 2-3 and 0-2. It was JMU's biggest win in the 36-game history against the Spiders, as it registered its third straight win at UR.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 19-of-26 for 248 yards and three touchdowns with an interception.
- The Dukes averaged 5.3 yards per carry, rushing for 200 yards, led by senior running back Marcus Marshall, who had 99 yards and two scores on just 10 carries. Marshall had a game-long run of 55 yards on his second touchdown, and senior Trai Sharp, who gained 62 yards, had a long of 45. JMU scored in all three phases Saturday, as redshirt sophomore receiver Jawon Hamilton took the opening kickoff 93 yards for his first career return for a score. The Dukes forced five turnovers including a 100 yard intercent
- for a score. The Dukes forced five turnovers, including a 100-yard interception for a touchdown by redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland, who set the JMU all-time record with his sixth defensive touchdown.

- Jimmy Moreland turned in his third straight game with a touchdown, with a 100-yard pick-six in the second quarter.
- JMU scored back-to-back offensive possessions with touchdowns off fumble recoveries, as John Daka had a strip sack and sophomore running back Percy Agyei-Obese had a force and a recovery on the ensuing kickoff.
- In all, the JMU defense racked up four sacks, 10 tackles for loss, three interceptions, five pass break-ups and three forced fumbles, holding Richmond to 55 yards in the second half.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- The Dukes scored four touchdowns in the second and three in the third to pull away for their third straight win while scoring at least 50 points.
- JMU out-gained Richmond 543-337, which including a 200-83 margin in the run game and a season-best 343 passing yards, as opposed to UR's 256.
- JMU had a plus-4 turnover margin, making three interceptions with a pair of fumble recoveries. The Dukes also had four sacks in the win.
- JMU has scored at least 47 points in each of its last three road matchups against Richmond, averaging 55.0 points per game. The Dukes and Spiders are now tied at 18-18 through 36 meetings, as JMU is now 10-8 all-time in Richmond.

Last-Minute Touchdown Lifts #10 Elon Past #2 JMU, 27-24

HARRISONBURG, Va. - A Davis Cheek 15-yard touchdown pass to Avery Jones with 1:17 to play sent 10th-ranked Elon past No. 2 James Madison 27-24 in Colonial Athletic Association football action on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes fell to 4-2 on the year and 2-1 in CAA play, while the Phoenix improved to 4-1 and 2-0. The loss snapped JMU's 20-game conference win streak and 19-game home win streak. It was also Elon's first win in the seven-game series history.

The game was seen in front of 25,484 spectators, which was the fourth-largest crowd in Bridgeforth history.

A WILD FOURTH QUARTER

- Elon trailed 12-10 before a Skyler Davis 33-yard field goal gave them the lead early in the fourth, and a Malcolm Summers 59-yard touchdown rush put the Phoenix ahead 20-12 with 11:26 to play.
- Quarterback Ben DiNucci completed a 47-yard pass to receiver Riley Stapleton, setting up a Trai Sharp six-yard touchdown run with 9:39 to go. JMU trailed 20-18 after a failed two-point conversion.
- After a defensive stop, DiNucci went to the air again, connecting with receiver Kyndel Dean for a 39-yard gain. Two plays later, DiNucci found Stapleton in the
 end zone for a 10-yard score, giving the Dukes the lead back at 24-20 with 7:22 to go.
- JMU stopped Elon, but a fumble gave the visitors the ball back on its own 26 with 4:16 to play. Elon proceeded to go on a 10-play, 74-yard drive, which was capped off by Cheek's touchdown toss to Jones.
- On the ensuing drive, DiNucci was intercepted by Connor Christiansen to seal the game.

QUICK SUMMARY

- DiNucci finished 24-of-41 for a career-high 316 yards and a touchdown. His completion total and attempts were also single-game highs.
- Stapleton led all players with seven receptions for 99 yards and a touchdown. Receiver Kyndel Dean set new career highs for the second straight week, with six catches for 96 yards, including a career-long 39 yarder.
- Kicker Ethan Ratke set the program record for field goals in a game, with four. It was the third time in his career he had made three or more.

 his first career sack.
- For Elon, Cheek threw for 286 yards and a touchdown, and Summers led the game with 186 rushing yards and a score. Corey Joyner led the game with 109 receiving yards, including a long of 51.
- Zack Monson led the Phoenix defense with 12 tackles, including 2.0 for loss and 1.5 sacks. Matt Baker and Warren Messer each had 4.0 tackles for loss, combining for 3.0 sacks.

Dukes Dominate All Three Phases in Shutout Win at 'Nova

VILLANOVA, Pa. - Sixth-ranked James Madison used two punt return touchdowns from redshirt sophomore D'Angelo Amos and its second four-quarter shutout of the season to race past Villanova 37-0 in Colonial Athletic Association Football action on Saturday afternoon at Villanova Stadium.

JMU improves to 5-2 on the year and 3-1 in CAA play, while Villanova falls to 3-4 and 0-4. It was the second-largest victory against the Wildcats and the second time JMU has shutout VU, joining a 17-0 win on the road in 2004. It also marked JMU's fourth straight win in the series.

It was JMU's 13th straight true road win against a Football Championship Subdivision opponent.

QUICK SUMMARY

- Amos tied JMU single-season records for punt return touchdowns (2), longest punt return (89) and total punt return yards (183), as he matched JMU Hall of Famer Gary Clark, who accomplished each of these stat lines back on Sept. 17, 1983 at Virginia.
- Redshirt sophomore receiver Jake Brown hauled in a career-high eight receptions for 72 yards, while redshirt junior Riley Stapleton and redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean each tallied three catches on the afternoon.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci was 21-of-31 for 171 passing yards while also scoring a one-yard rushing touchdown late in the fourth
- On the ground, senior running back Trai Sharp rushed for 62 yards and graduate running back Cardon Johnson added 46.
- For the third time in the last four weeks, redshirt sophomore kicker Ethan Ratke converted at least three field goals, going 3-for-3, as he's now tied for fourth in JMU single-season history with 14. It also matches his 2017 total and he's one shy of tying the single-season mark.
- JMU's defense registered season highs of 13.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks, as the Dukes held Villanova to 157 total yards. VU also went 0-for-2 on fourth down and JMU forced five three-and-outs.
- Redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland was active both defensively and on special teams, as he had a strip sack, which was recovered by JMU and blocked a punt - the sixth of his career and first since 2014.
- Sophomore defensive lineman Mike Greene made five tackles, including 2.5 for loss and was one of six JMU players to make a sack in the win. Redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Adeeb Atariwa had 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack, and redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway tied for game-high honors with nine tackles and 2.0 for loss. Junior safety Adam Smith also made nine total stops, including seven solo.

D'ANGELO'S HOUSE

- D'Angelo Amos accomplished three things in the punt-return game that only a former JMU star and Super Bowl champion had done before for the program and that man is Gary Clark.
- Amos took back-to-back punt returns to the house for scored over a span of 2:10 in the third quarter.
- His first was from 89 yards, tying for the longest punt return in school history. His second went for 81 yards, as he now has three punt return touchdowns this season and four for his career.
- His 89 yarder surpassed his former career long of 76, in which he achieved week two at Norfolk State.
- He tallied 183 punt return yards over his three returns, matching Clark's total from the 1983 game at Virginia.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- JMU converted on all five red-zone opportunities, with three Ratke field goals and a pair of rushing touchdowns.
- For the game, JMU out-gained Villanova 302-157, which included limiting the hosts to 94 passing yards and 63 rushing yards (1.5 per carry).
- The Dukes were 9-of-17 on third down, while Villanova was held to a 6-of-16 conversion rate.
- JMU also committed just one penalty.

NORFOLK, Va. - Third-ranked James Madison shut out 15th-ranked Stony Brook in the second half and used one final defensive stand in the last two minutes to secure a 13-10 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

Leading 13-10 with 2:06 to play, Stony Brook converted twice on fourth down to keep the drive alive, reaching the JMU 33-yard line with two seconds remaining. The Dukes were able to hold on as Alex Lucansky's 51-yard field goal fell short to put the Dukes in a four-way tie atop the CAA standings.

With the win, JMU improves to 6-2 overall and 4-1 in CAA play, while the Seawolves fall to 6-3 and 4-2.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU limited Stony Brook to 120 yards in the second half over its seven drives
- Five of SBU's seven second-half possessions resulted in punts, as the Seawolves were only 1-of-8 on third down. Another drive resulted in a tipped pass that produced a Landan Word interception and the final drive ended with the missed kick as time expired.
- Dimitri Holloway set a new career high with 18 tackles, to go with 2.0 tackles for loss.
- Landan Word turned in a career-best 10 tackles, including one for a loss and his first career interception. Wayne Davis also tallied career highs of six solo tackles and two tackles for a loss, to go with his first career sack.
- Adam Smith added six stops and intercepted a first-quarter pass, the second of his career, and Jimmy Moreland had five tackles and two pass breakups.
- Offensively, Ben DiNucci threw for 140 yards and a touchdown. Kyndel Dean had four catches for 45 yards and a first-quarter touchdown, and Jake Brown also added for catches for 30 yards.
- Cardon Johnson led the ground attack with 60 rushing yards, including a long of 23.
- Despite being out-gained 305-243 on the afternoon, JMU held the CAA's top-rushing offense to only 113 yards, which is over 100 yards below Stony Brook's season average.
- SBU's Joe Carbone threw for 192 yards and two interceptions. Donald Liotine ran for 71 yards and a score and Jordan Gowins, who entered the week as the CAA's leading rusher, ran for just 54.

- JMU intercepted two Joe Carbone passes, including one on Stony Brook's first possession.
- With the Seawolves driving, Adam Smith corralled his second career pick inside the 10, which set up JMU's first scoring drive.
- In the third, Mike Greene tipped a pass at the line of scrimmage and Landan Word came down with it for his first career interception.

Dukes Drop Road Contest at New Hampshire

RALEIGH, N.C. - New Hampshire forced six turnovers, returning two first-half interceptions for a touchdown and third-ranked James Madison was unable to overcome the deficit, falling 35-24 on Saturday afternoon at Wildcat Stadium.

The Wildcats won for the second straight week, improving to 3-6 overall and 2-4 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Dukes fell to 6-3 and 4-2. The loss snapped JMU's 13-game win streak in true road games against FCS opponents, as well as its 11-game win streak in CAA road matchups.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU threw a season-high four interceptions, allowing multiple defensive touchdowns for the first time since 2002.
- JMU out-gained UNH 486-315, but the Wildcats had a plus-six turnover margin, producing four picks and two fumble recoveries.
- JMU did outscore the Wildcats 21-14 in the second half, including 14-0 over the final 9:21.
- UNH's Trevor Knight passed for 181 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 76 yards and one score to lead the offense.
- The Wildcats scored two of their three first-half touchdowns on a pick-six. Rick Ellison had a 44-yard interception for a touchdown just over four minutes into the game, and Evan Horn had a 75-yard score early in the second to give UNH a 21-3 lead.
- Junior quarterback Cole Johnson was 31-of-48 for a career-high 398 yards, as he replaced junior Ben DiNucci in the first quarter.
- Johnson's passing total was the third highest in school history, trailing only Vad Lee's 433 and 406 back in 2014. He also added a fourth-quarter rushing touch-down.
- Redshirt junior receiver Riley Stapleton made a game-high eight catches for 116 yards, redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean tied his career high with six receptions for 77 yards and senior David Eldridge had four grabs for a season-best 84 yards.
- JMU's running backs found the end zone twice in the second half, as graduate Cardon Johnson scored from a yard out in the third and senior Trai Sharp added a two-yard score in the fourth.
- Defensively, JMU was led by redshirt junior linebacker Dimitri Holloway, who had 11 tackles and one for loss. Junior defensive lineman John Daka added eight tackles and a sack.

Dukes Win Slugfest on Senior Day Against Rhode Island

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Behind a five-touchdown performance by redshirt junior quarterback Ben DiNucci, ninth-ranked James Madison outlasted Rhode Island for a 48-31 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 7-3 on the year and 5-2 in CAA play while the Rams fell to 5-5 and 3-4. It also marked JMU's ninth straight win over URI in the series.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU scored three straight touchdowns to bridge the first and second quarters and added two late field goals in the first half to grab a 27-14 lead at the break.
- URI and JMU traded scores all through the second half and the Rams never drew closer than 10 down the stretch.
- DiNucci was 18-of-25 for 227 passing yards and a career-high four touchdowns, to go with a pair of interceptions. He also rushed for 44 yards and a score, marking his second career game with five total touchdowns.
- The Dukes rushed for 192 yards, averaging 4.5 yards per rush. Seniors Cardon Johnson and Trai Sharp led the way with 73 and 62 rushing yards, respectively. Johnson added a third-quarter touchdown to move into 10th place all-time in career rushing touchdowns.
- Three Dukes had at least four receptions, led by redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean, who had a JMU-best five catches for 86 yards and a touchdown.
- Redshirt junior Riley Stapleton tallied four receptions for 35 yards and two touchdowns, while redshirt sophomore Jake Brown made four grabs for 55 yards.
- Defensively, JMU was led by junior linebacker Landan Word, who made a game-high 10 tackles, matching his career best. Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter and
 redshirt senior Darrious Carter each made 1.5 sacks, and junior John Daka added a sack of his own in the win.
- Redshirt senior corner Jimmy Moreland picked off his fifth pass of the season to tie himself atop the CAA leaders in the interceptions department.
- URI was led by JaJuan Lawson, who passed for 255 yards and three touchdowns, with Marven Beauvais reeling in all three passing scores.

MEMORIES MADE AT BRIDGEFORTH

- Saturday marked the final regular-season home game for JMU's 11 seniors, as the group won for the 44th time in 52 games. The JMU seniors have gone 26-3 over the past four seasons at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- Tabb Patrick was commissioned into the Army during halftime of Saturday's game and later made his first career fumble recovery in the second half on special teams.
- After the win, senior kicker Tyler Gray stood at midfield, surrounded by his teammates, and proposed to his girlfriend Abby.

Strong Rushing Attack Powers JMU to 38-17 Win at Towson

TOWSON, Md. - Seventh-ranked James Madison rushed for a season-high 395 yards as a team and the defense shut down No. 15 Towson over the final three quarters to earn a 38-17 Colonial Athletic Association Football victory on Saturday afternoon at Johnny Unitas Stadium.

The Dukes conclude the regular season with an 8-3 record and finish second in the CAA standings with a 6-2 conference mark. The Tigers fall to 7-4 and 5-3 with the defeat.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU produced a trio of 100-yard rushers in the win, led by graduate Cardon Johnson, who notched a game-high 162 yards on 13 carries (12.5 avg.), which included a season-long 76-yard touchdown in the first.
- Senior Trai Sharp ran for 107 yards and score with a long of 40. He averaged 7.1 yards on 15 carries.
- Redshirt junior Ben DiNucci accounted for 285 yards of total offense in the win. He was 15-of-22 for 181 passing yards while also rushing for 104 yards and three touchdowns, marking his first career 100-yard game. The three rushing scores were also a career best.
- On the receiving end, redshirt sophomore Jake Brown led the team with six catches for 41 yards, and redshirt freshman Kyndel Dean had three
- Defensively, redshirt junior Dimitri Holloway led the way with a game-high 14 tackles, the second-highest tackle total for him this season. Junior Landan Word turned a career-high 11 tackles, including 1.5 for loss and a sack.
- JMU forced four sacks as a team, as junior John Daka registered a career-high two sacks and a forced fumble. Redshirt junior Ron'Dell Carter also had a sack to up his season total to 7.5, leading all JMU defenders during the regular season.
- The Dukes also had a season-best seven pass breakups, led by redshirt senior Jimmy Moreland's two. He also recovered his second career fumble recovery late in the first half.
- Towson's Tom Flacco was 31-of-50 for 372 yards and two touchdowns while leading the team with 52 rushing yards. Shane Leatherbury had a game-best 10 catches for 88 yards and a score and Jabari Allen led all receivers with 135 receiving yards.

THREE OVER 100 FOR JUST THIRD TIME EVER

- JMU achieved a feat it had only done twice before in program history, as three players rushed for over 100 yards in the same game.
- Cardon Johnson (162) turned in his ninth career 100-yard game. Trai Sharp (107) went over the century mark for the fifth time at JMU and Ben DiNucci (104) eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career.
- Ironically, back on Sept. 3, 2016 against Morehead State, JMU quarterback Bryan Schor, as well as Sharp and Johnson were the three to earn the mark. Bryan Schor ran for 129 yards in that game, while Sharp and Johnson added 110 and 104, respectively.
- The first occurrence came in the 2015 in the opener against Morehead, when Johnson, Vad Lee and Khalid Abdullah achieved the mark.

Defensive Dominance Propels JMU Past Delaware in FCS First Round

HARRISONBURG, Va. - Sixth-ranked James Madison limited Delaware to a pair of field goals and 185 total yards en route to a 20-6 triumph in the first round of the 2018 NCAA FCS Playoffs on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

The Dukes improve to 9-3 on the year after conceding the fewest points in a single playoff game in program history. The Blue Hens season ends at 7-5.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU allowed just 69 rushing yards, limiting Delaware to just 2.8 yards per carry. The Blue Hens converted just 2-of-14 on third down and the Dukes registered five sacks and 10 tackles for loss with a pair of interceptions.
- The Dukes dominated the first half defensively, as UD gained just 52 yards
 of offense with two first downs, grabbing a 12-3 halftime lead.
- In the second half, JMU forced two turnovers on downs and produced a pair
 of fourth-quarter interceptions to seal the win.
- Jimmy Moreland posted a season-high 10 tackles with 2.5 for loss and a half sack. Landan Word and Dimitri Holloway each had eight stops and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- John Daka tied his career high with 2.0 sacks, while Paris Black and Darrious Carter both added another.
- Charles Tutt recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter and added a career-high three pass breakups, while Wayne Davis secured the win with a late-game interception, the second of his career.
- Offensively, Ben DiNucci was 23-of-31 for 223 yards and a touchdown.
- Three receivers tallied five catches in the win, as Kyndel Dean had a gamehigh 64 yards, while Riley Stapleton and Jake Brown each had 43 yards. Brown tacked on his second career touchdown catch in the third quarter and Stapleton's second grab was the 100th of his career.
- Trai Sharp led the game with 42 rushing yards, DiNucci had 29 and Marcus Marshall ran for 28 yards and a score.

OTHER GAME NOTES

- JMU dominated the time of possession, possessing the ball for 37:04, compared to UD's 22:56.
- The Dukes held Delaware to only six yards in the first quarters and the Hens did not achieve a first down until their seventh offensive drive.
- JMU had 23 first downs, compared to 12 for the visitors.
- Ethan Ratke's first-quarter field goal was the 15th of his season, tying him for the JMU single-season record with three other players.
- UD's Pat Kehoe was 13-of-32 for 116 yards and two interceptions. Vinny Papale had 44 receiving yards and Charles Scarff added 36. Troy Reeder paced the
 UD defense with a game-high 16 tackles.

Colgate Hits Walk-Off Field Goal to Upend Dukes in Second Round

HAMILTON, N.Y. - Chris Puzzi split the uprights on a 38-yard field goal as time expired to lift No. 8 seed Colgate to a 23-20 victory against James Madison on Saturday afternoon at Andy Kerr Stadium in the second round of the 2018 NCAA FCS Playoffs.

Colgate improves to 10-1 and advances to the FCS quarterfinals, while the Dukes' season ended at 9-4.

QUICK SUMMARY

- JMU led 13-6 early in the third before Colgate put together back-to-back scoring drives to take its first lead, at 20-13, with 3:51 to go in the quarter
- Early in the fourth, D'Angelo Amos returned a punt into Colgate territory, setting up JMU's game-tying drive. Ben DiNucci finished the possession with a seven-yard run, his ninth rushing touchdown of the season to tie the game at 20-20 with 8:22 to play.
- JMU got the ball back after a defensive stop, but the Raiders stalled the Dukes on a fake punt attempt with 2:46 to play, setting up the game-winning drive
- Colgate produced five interceptions while only turning the ball over once.
 The five picks were one off the record for most picks by JMU.
- JMU's defense produced four sacks, including 1.5 by John Daka. Adam Smith had a sack, while three others added a half sack. Eight players resorted a tackle for less in the game on Miles Croppe and light Norseland.
- corded a tackle for loss in the game, as Mike Greene and Jimmy Moreland added 1.5 each.
- Dimitri Holloway led the game with 13 tackles, while Adeeb Atariwa and Ron'Dell Carter each registered career highs, with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.
- The Dukes rushed for 200 yards on the afternoon, led by DiNucci's 76 yards. Cardon Johnson also had 66 yards and score.
- JMU out-gained Colgate 392-330 and went 4-for-4 on red-zone scoring opportunities.
- Colgate was led by Grant Breneman, who passed for 190 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 33 more and a score. James Holland led all players with 89 rushing yards, and Owen Rockett had five catches for 104 yards and a TD.

SENIORS LEAVE LEGACY

- JMU's group of 11 seniors finish their career with a compiled 46-9 career overall record, which includes a 27-3 mark at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- JMU's seniors have been part of one of the program's most successful stretch runs, as the Dukes won three straight Colonial Athletic Association championships
 from 2015-17, advanced to the NCAA Division I Championship game in the two previous seasons, which included winning the national title in 2016.



Charles Haley ~ Pro Football Hall of Fame



Former football All-American Charles Haley became the first James Madison student-athlete to be enshrined into a major professional hall of fame as he took his rightful place into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Saturday, August 8, 2015, at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium.

Haley was introduced by Edward DeBartolo, Jr., former owner of the San Francisco 49ers prior to his speech to the capacity crowd in Canton. He was one of eight individuals to join pro football's most exclusive club, as he was accompanied by linebacker Junior Seau, guard Will Shields, running back Jerome Bettis, wide receiver Tim Brown, center Mike Tinglehoff and NFL executives Bill Polian and Ron Wolf.

A four-year letterwinner for the Dukes from 1982-85, he was twice named an Associated Press All-American. As a senior, Haley was named the Richmond Touchdown Club's Defensive Player of the Year and a First Team AP I-AA All-American.

"I am truly blessed," Haley said during his enshrinement speech. "I have played with some of the greatest players in the history of football and I've learned a lot. The one thing I learned from all the guys was unselfish play. Team matters — we need to go back to that. It's not about individuals, it's about team and that's the only way we can have success."

Haley capped off his speech by stating, "When I stepped out on the field, I was determined to be the best every play, not just some plays."

He is JMU's all-time leader in total tackles with 506 and led the Dukes in single-season tackles twice in his career, recording 143 in 1983 and 147 in 1984. Haley had a career-high 22 tackles at Shippensburg during the 1983 season, currently tied for the eighth-highest, single-game total in Madison history. A three-time JMU Defensive MVP, he was also named the JMU Male Athlete of the Year in 1985-86. Haley graduated from JMU in 1987 and in 1999 the athletic department named the Defensive MVP award after him.


Haley became the first player in JMU history selected in the National Football League Draft when he was selected by the San Francisco 49ers in the fourth round of the 1986 draft. He immediately made an impact, playing in 16 games as a rookie, recording 12.0 sacks. He played 12 seasons in the NFL, seven with the 49ers in two different stints and five with the Dallas Cowboys.

He earned five Super Bowl rings (two in San Francisco and three in Dallas), the first of two players in NFL history to have played on five Super Bowl champion teams. A five-time Pro-Bowler and two-time First Team All-Pro selection, Haley finished his career with 100.5 career sacks, including

a career-high 16 in 1990, the first year he was honored as an All-Pro. He was also a two-time NFC Defensive Player of the Year and played on 10 division championship squads during his 12-year career.

A native of Gladys, Va., Haley was inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

The Hall of Fame committee consists of 32 votes of writers from the NFL cities, 13 at-large members and one from the Pro Football Writers of America. Each candidate was required to receive at least 80 percent approval votes from the Committee to be enshrined.



Charles Haley ~ College Football Hall of Fame



Former James Madison All-American Charles Haley was enshrined to the College Football Hall Of Fame on July 15-16 in South Bend, Indiana, becoming the first athlete from a Colonial Athletic Association school and sixth overall to be elected to the Hall, as five coaches were previously enshrined.

Haley was a four year starter at JMU from 1982-85. He was a two-time All-American and a three-time Defensive MVP at Madison. As a senior at JMU, Haley was voted a 1985 Associated Press First-Team I-AA All-American and both the Richmond Touchdown Club and Roanoke Times & World News' State Defensive Player of the Year.

He leads JMU's all-time tackles list with 506, including three seasons of more than 100 tackles, and his 22 tackles at Shippensburg during the 1983 season still ranks as the eighth-highest single-game total in JMU history. He also added three interceptions and 17 quarterback sacks to his total.

In 1986, after his senior season Haley was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers, as he was the No. 96 pick overall, the highest ever in school history. The first ever JMU player to be drafted into the NFL, Haley went on to become the only player in the league's history to win five Super Bowls, two with the 49ers and three with the Dallas Cowboys.


He was also selected to five Pro Bowls during his career, as well as being a two-time First-Team All-Pro and 1990 NFC Defensive Player of the Year. He finished his professional career with 100.5 sacks, including a career-high 16 in 1990. He had eight fumble recoveries and scored one touchdown in the NFL. He retired in 1999 before becoming an assistant coach for the Detroit Lions.

A 2006 inductee to the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame and a member of the JMU Sports Hall of Fame, the Dallas native has also served as a recruiter for the National Marrow Donor Program.

Haley was enshrined with fellow divisional inductees Dexter Coakley (Appalachian State), Mike

Favor (North Dakota State), Mickey Kobrosky (Trinity), Mike Kelly (Dayton), and Bill Manlove (Widener, Delaware Valley, La Salle).

Haley joined an elite list from the CAA to be inducted to the College Football Hall of Fame, joining coaches Lou Holtz (William & Mary), Dick MacPherson (UMass), Dave Nelson (Delaware and Maine), Tubby Raymond (Delaware) and Eddie Robinson (Maine).

National Champions!!! Dukes Defeat Montana 31-21

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - National champion.

That's a title that forever will be used with the 2004 JMU football team.

The Dukes earned that distinction Friday at Finley Stadium/Davenport with a 31-21 victory over Montana in the finals of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

The Dukes, as they have for most of the season, used a stingy defense, a strong running game, and good special teams play to post the biggest win in their 33-year football history.

JMU allowed a first-quarter touchdown for the only time during the 2004 season and trailed twice, but the Dukes rallied to dominate the final minutes of the game as they did for most of the season.

JMU went in front to stay 24-21 on a one-yard touchdown run by sophomore tailback Maurice Fenner with 3:25 left in the third quarter, added an insurance score on sophomore quarterback Justin Rascati's six-yard run with eight minutes left in the game, and ran the final 6:14 off the clock after getting an interception from junior cornerback Clint Kent.

The Dukes used 14 straight rushing plays in running out the clock at the end of the game and nine straight rushing plays during the 72-yard drive that put them in front to stay.

JMU ran for 314 yards overall – 257 during the second half – and had a 318-202 overall yardage advantage during the final two periods.

Fenner led JMU's attack with 164 rushing yards on 29 carries and ran for two touchdowns. Sophomore tailback Alvin Banks added 88 rushing yards on 13 carries, and Rascati ran 11 times for 57 yards and two scores. Rascati also hit on 13 of 18 passes for 132 yards and wasn't intercepted.

In addition to the score that put JMU in front to stay, Fenner scored on a one-yard run with 0:16 left in the first quarter to give JMU a 10-7 edge. Rascati ran 11 yards for a touchdown on JMU's first third-quarter series in addition to his fourth-period scoring carry.

"We went into the game planning to throw the ball, but we were making so many yards rushing that we didn't need to throw," said sixth-year JMU coach Mickey Matthews.

"Our league is great; that was Atlantic 10 football in the second half," Matthews added. "Our league is by far the best in the country. Playing in our league really prepared us to play in this environment against Montana. Our guys thought they were going to win."

The victory was JMU's fifth straight overall and its fourth in the playoffs away from home. The Dukes completed the year with a 13-2 record and became the second straight Division I-AA champion from the Atlantic 10 (Delaware was the 2003 playoff winner). No other team previously had advanced to the championship with straight road wins.

JMU's effort off set an outstanding performance by Montana quarterback Craig Ochs, a transfer from Colorado. Ochs completed 29 of 38 passes for 371 yards and three touchdowns, but the Grizzlies had only 44 rushing yards against JMU's defense.

NATIONAL CHAMPS! JMU Tops Youngstown State 28-14

FRISCO, Texas - James Madison held Youngstown State to 292 total yards on Saturday afternoon and rolled to a 28-14 victory, as the Dukes captured the 2016 NCAA Division I Football Championship, the second title in program history.

The Dukes, who finished the season 14-1 and undefeated against FCS foes, saw their defensive line dominate from start to finish, holding the Penguins (12-4) to just 21 rushing yards after YSU entered the contest averaging 257.5 yards on the ground.

Senior linebacker Gage Steele paced an all-around dominant performance by the JMU defense, racking up six tackles, including five solo stops, a pair of sacks and a pass breakup as the Dukes forced a pair of crucial turnovers in the third quarter to put the game away.

No defensive player had more tackles for the Dukes than junior defensive back Jordan Brown's seven, but nine different players had at least three, while sophomore defensive back Curtis Oliver picked off his second pass of the season and sophomore Darrious Carter scooped up a fumble.

Senior running back Khalid Abdullah ended his career in style, rushing 26 times for 101 yards and a pair of scores for an afternoon that put him atop the JMU record books in career touchdowns, single-season touchdowns and single-season rushing yards.

The Dukes needed just 12 passes to take home the trophy, as junior quarterback Bryan Schor went 7-of-12 for 112 yards with a pair of first-quarter touchdowns to junior tight end Jonathán Kloosterman and senior wide receiver Rashard Davis.

JMU put the Penguins in an early hole, as Abdullah stretched the lead to 21-0 on a 1-yard touchdown plunge with 8:17 to play before halftime, though YSU responded with a touchdown of its own less than five minutes later.

Abdullah scored from two yards out with 10:10 to play in the third quarter for an advantage that proved to be all the Dukes' defense needed, as Youngstown State managed just one more scoring drive that ended with 10 seconds left before the final whistle.

TITLE HISTORY

JMU captured its second NCAA Division I Championship in program history, joining the 2004 team that defeated Montana 31-21 in Chattanooga. The Dukes are the eighth FCS program to earn multiple national titles and the first ever with multiple in the Colonial Athletic Association. JMU ended the five-year national-title run by North Dakota State and became the first CAA national champion since Villanova in 2009.

HOUSTON'S HEIGHTS

Head Coach Mike Houston earned his first career national championship, having finished runner-up in the NCAA Division II title game at Lenoir-Rhyne in 2013. Houston improved to 5-1 all-time in the FCS playoffs, 4-0 at JMU thanks to the 2016 run.

FINAL NUMBERS

- JMU won its 12th game in a row for the longest active streak in FCS football and second-longest in all of Division I behind Alabama (26)
- · JMU's 14-1 overall record included a perfect 14-0 mark against FCS opponents and set a new school record for victories
- JMU finished as the nation's leader in scoring margin at +25.5 points per game, second in points per game (46.7) and 16th in points allowed (21.2)
- JMU went 6-0 vs. ranked opponents this season, all during the last seven contests

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

JMU finished the season 16th nationally in points allowed after ranking 77th in 2015 in that category. In addition to allowing 21.2 points per game, the Dukes limited opponents to 16.4 points per game over the last eight games and 15 per game in the playoffs, all against ranked teams. Also, 21 of the 60 postseason points allowed came in the final two minutes of games in which the outcome was already decided.

Key Dates in JMU History

- July 17, 1972 Athletic Director Dean Ehlers announced that JMU would start football in 1972 and named Challace McMillin head coach.
- Oct. 7, 1972 JMU played its first football game, losing 6-0 to Shepherd's junior varsity team on what is now a practice field adjacent to Godwin Hall.
- Sept. 22, 1973 JMU won its first game, a 34-8 triumph over Anne Arundel Community College, held at Harrisonburg High School.
- Sept. 21, 1974 JMU began its first varsity season with a 24-22 win at Washington and Lee
- Oct. 12, 1974 JMU defeated Bridgewater 41-13 in the first game ever at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- **1975 Season** JMU finished 9-0-1 with a season-opening scoreless tie at Glenville (W.Va.), its only non win of the season. JMU won the Virginia College Athletic Association title and won seven straight games by seven points or fewer.
- Sept. 18, 1976 JMU beat Towson 28-26 at home, raising its record to 3-0 and its winning streak to 12 games, earning a tie for first place with C.W. Post in the NCAA Division III poll.
- **Sept. 25, 1976** JMU played in the first Division III regular-season game televised by a major network (ABC), falling 21-14 at Hampden-Sydney.
- Oct. 16, 1976 JMU won 17-12 at Davidson, marking the program's first win against a Division I opponent.
- Oct. 14, 1978 JMU's Board of Visitors unanimously approved moving football to Division I
- Nov. 11, 1978 JMU won 42-12 at Emory and Henry to finish the year 8-2 and ranked ninth nationally in Division III.
- **Dec. 18, 1978** JMU announced it would offer 25 scholarships in 1979. Quarterback Frankie Walker and fullback Joe Curro, transfers from Lees-McRae College, were the team's first scholarship signees on Jan. 17, 1979.
- **1982 Season** JMU finished 8-3 and appeared in the Division I-AA top-20 poll for seven straight weeks, ranking as high as ninth at the midway point of the season.
- **Sept. 18, 1982** JMU earned its first win over a I-A opponent, defeating Virginia 21-17 in Charlottesville.
- **Jan. 4, 1984** Wide receiver Gary Clark became JMU's first player to be drafted to a professional football team, going as the sixth overall pick to Jacksonville in the United States Football League Draft.
- Dec. 20, 1984 Joe Purzycki became JMU's second head coach, replacing Challace McMillin.
- **April 29, 1986** Linebacker Charles Haley, JMU's first Division I-AA First Team All-American, became the first Duke to be selected in the National Football League Draft, going in the fourth round to San Francisco.
- **1987 Season** JMU turned in its best record to date during the scholarship era, going 9-3 and reaching the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the first time. JMU was nationally ranked for nine straight weeks, ranking as high as third.
- Dec. 14, 1990 Rip Scherer became JMU's third head coach, replacing Joe Purzycki.
- **1991 Season** JMU reached the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the first time, finishing 9-4 on the year. They were nationally ranked for nine straight weeks and beat four ranked teams, including three on the road.
- 1993 Season JMU first played in the Yankee Conference after joining the league in 1991
- **1994 Season** JMU set a team record for wins to that point, at 10-3, and reached the second round of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs for the second time. JMU was nationally ranked for 10 of last 11 weeks and beat four of five ranked teams it faced.
- Jan. 23, 1995 Alex Wood became JMU's fourth head coach, replacing Rip Scherer, who took the head coaching job at Memphis.
- **1995 Season** The 8-4 Dukes returned to the playoffs for the second straight season and were ranked in every poll during the season by The Sports Network.
- **1997 Season** The Atlantic 10 Football Conference assumed the operations of the Yankee Conference.
- March 19, 1999 Mickey Matthews became JMU's fifth head coach, replacing Alex Wood, who resigned to take an assistant job with the Minnesota Vikings.

- **1999 Season** JMU won its first Division I conference crown, tying for first in the Atlantic 10. Mickey Matthews was named Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the Sports Network and Curtis Keaton was drafted to the NFL in the fourth round by Cincinnati. Keaton was A-10 Offensive Player of the Year while Chris Morant was Defensive Player of the Year.
- **2000 Season** Delvin Joyce became the first Division I-AA player to reach 1,000 career yards in rushing (1,260), receiving (1,009), kickoff returns (1,902) and punt returns (1,488).
- **2001 Season** Derrick Lloyd won the Buck Buchanan Award, recognizing the Division I-AA's top defensive player.
- **June 6, 2003** JMU broke ground on the Robert and Frances Plecker Athletic Performance Facility, adjacent to Bridgeforth Stadium.
- **Dec. 17, 2004** JMU won the NCAA Division I-AA national title, beating Montana 31-21 in Chattanooga, Tenn. The 13-2 Dukes set a team record for wins and became the first I-AA team to win three road playoff games in the same season. Mickey Matthews was named Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.
- 2006 Season The 9-4 Dukes made their second playoff appearance in three seasons, and held national rankings in every poll by The Sports Network, including a top-10 ranking in the final seven polls.
- 2007 Season The Colonial Athletic Association assumed the operations of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference. JMU went 8-4 and made its third NCAA appearance in four seasons, ranking in every poll by both The Sports Network and FCS coaches.
- 2008 Season JMU won the CAA title, going 8-0 in conference play, and was the top seed for the NCAA FCS playoffs, finishing 12-2. It was JMU's fourth postseason appearance in five years and Mickey Matthews was named National Coach of the Year by The Sports Network and Liberty Mutual.
- Sept. 11, 2010 JMU stunned No. 13 Virginia Tech 21-16 in Blacksburg, Va., outscoring the Hokies 14-3 in the second half. Drew Dudzik rushed for two touchdowns and threw for a third as the Dukes knocked off the preseason ACC favorites in the second-ever upset of a ranked FBS team by an FCS opponent.
- July 16, 2011 Charles Haley became the first JMU and CAA player to ever be enshrined to the College Football Hall of Fame.
- Dec. 20, 2013 Everett Withers became JMU's sixth head coach, replacing Mickey Matthews
- **2014 Season** JMU broke nearly every passing record in program history, going 9-4 to return to the FCS playoffs for the first time since 2011. JMU won its final seven games of the regular season.
- Aug. 8, 2015 Charles Haley became JMU's first player to be enshrined to the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- **Sept. 26, 2015** Vad Lee was the first Division I (FCS or FBS) player to pass and rush for 275 yards in the same game, leading JMU to a 48-45 win at FBS foe SMU.
- Oct. 24, 2015 ESPN College GameDay came to James Madison's campus, broadcasting live from the Quad and Wilson Hall. The Dukes broke the Bridgeforth Stadium attendance record (26,069) for Homecoming against Richmond.
- Jan. 18, 2016 Mike Houston became JMU's seventh head coach, replacing Everett Withers.
- Oct. 29, 2016 JMU scored a program-record 84 points in Homecoming win against Rhode Island.
- **Dec. 9, 2016** JMU produced second-largest margin of victory in FCS playoff history with 65-7 victory against previously undefeated Sam Houston State, which was ranked #1 in both major FCS polls.
- **Dec. 16, 2016** JMU ended North Dakota State's five-year reign as national champion with a 27-17 win in Fargo, N.D., in the FCS semifinals.
- **Jan. 7, 2017** JMU defeats Youngstown State, 28-14, to win program's second national championship in Frisco, Texas.
- Oct. 14, 2017 ESPN College GameDay returned to JMU's campus for its second nationally-televised broadcast from the Quad and Wilson Hall. The Dukes saw more than 14,000 fans attend the show, followed by a victory that afternoon against Villanova.
- **DEC. 8, 2017** JMU set a FCS playoff record by forcing 10 turnovers in its 51-16 victory against South Dakota State in the national semifinals.
- Sept. 29, 2018 JMU registered its largest road win in school history with a 63-10 victory at Richmond.
- Dec. 14, 2018 Curt Cignetti became JMU's eighth head coach, replacing Mike Houston.

Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field was built in 1975, enlarged in 1981, and in 2011, completed a major \$62 million renovation that increased the capacity to 24,877, added multiple amenities and made it one of the premier facilities in the Football Championship Subdivision.

The stadium was named for William E. Bridgeforth, a long-time supporter and board of visitor member whose family remains very active with JMU.

The playing surface was named for Harrisonburg-area businessman Zane Showker, a long-time supporter and university board of director and for whom the JMU business school facility is named.
