DUKES TO MEET MORGAN STATE FOR FIRST TIME IN OVER 20 YEARS

- JMU is home again this Saturday, Sept. 14 when it hosts Morgan State out of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field and will be televised on NBC Sports Washington and streamed on FloFootball. Pregame coverage on the JMU Sprint Broadcast Network begins at 3 p.m.
- There will be no out-of-market linear coverage through DirecTV and Dish Network for this game.
- Saturday marks the second meeting all-time, with JMU winning the lone meeting 24 seasons ago in 1995. JMU is also 6-2 all-time against the MEAC.
- Saturday's game is sponsored by the Pepsi and the 2019 season is presented by CarMax.

BREAKING DOWN THE SERIES

- JMU's second home game of the season also marks the second meeting between the Dukes and Bears. JMU won the first meeting back on Sept. 2, 1995 by a 76-7 margin.
- Up until the 2016 season, when JMU scored 80 and 84 points, the 76 points had been the program record for most points in a single game. It still ranks third all-time in the 48-season history of the program.
- JMU set a program record for most points in a single quarter, scoring 35 in the second quarter of that game. That is tied with the 35 that JMU put up against Norfolk State in the second quarter of the 2017 meeting.

DUKES ROLL PAST SAINT FRANCIS IN HOME OPENER

- JMU rushed for nearly 300 yards and used a stifling defensive effort to upend Saint Francis 44-7 last Saturday.
- The Dukes limited SFU to only 69 total yards through the first three quarter, scoring the game's first 37 points. The defense forced the Red Flash into 10 consecutive three-and-outs to set the pace for the game.
- Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack with 221 yards and two touchdowns. The signal caller also added 51 yards on the ground to be one of four players to rush for at least 50 yards.
- Solomon Vanhorse rushed for a career- and game-high 86 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half, averaging 6.1 yards on his 14 carries. Jawon Hamilton and Percy Agyei-Obese had 54 and 51 yards, respectively, while Austin Douglas ran for 33 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown on a 19-yard catch.
- Brandon Polk had another career outing, making six catches for 95 yards.
- Three defenders recorded at least six tackles in the win, paced by Sam Kidd, who had a career-high seven tackles. Adam Smith and MJ Hampton each had six, as Hampton's tackles total was a career high while also forcing his first fumble.
- JMU is 37-11 in home openers dating back to 1972. The Dukes have won 17 straight home openers.

VANHORSE NAMED CAA'S TOP ROOKIE

- Solomon Vanhorse was named CAA Football Rookie of the Week after turning in a career performance in just one half.
- Making his first career start, Vanhorse rushed for a career-high 86 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries.
- He gave JMU a 7-0 lead with a two-yard run in the first quarter and found the end zone from nine yards out in the second quarter. He averaged 6.1 yards per carry.

SCOUTING MORGAN STATE

- The Bears come to town with an 0-1 record after falling 46-3 at Bowling Green over the opening weekend.
- MSU was on a bye last week and begin a stretch of 11-straight weeks with a game.
- Morgan State was limited to just 70 yards in the opener, rushing for only 46 and passing for 24.
- Lavelton Williams led the team with 41 rushing yards.
- Defensively, the Bears allowed 620 yards, including 326 rushing and 294 passing.
- Ian McBorough and Rico Kennedy each had 10 tackles and Maurice Lewis Jr. had an interceptions.
- MSU is led by first-year head coach Tyrone Wheatley. He was most recently running backs coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars for two seasons. He has seven years of collegiate coaching experience, including two as RBs coach at Michigan, while also having NFL stops with the Buffalo Bills.
- Wheatley was the 17th overall pick in the 1995 NFL Draft, spending four seasons with the New York Giants and six with the Oakland Raiders. He rushed for 4,962 yards and 40 touchdowns in his 10-year career.

LAST TIME JMU & MSU MET

- JMU and Morgan State will share the field for the first time in 24 years, as JMU rolled to a 76-7 win in Harrisonburg back on Sept. 2, 1995.
- The Dukes had set a program record for most points in a game and in a single quarter (35), as the game-record stood for 21 years and the quarter record remains tied for the lead.

DUKES REMAIN #2 IN RANKINGS

- Following a convincing home-opening win, JMU comfortably held on to its #2 ranking in both the STATS FCS Top 25 and AFCA FCS Coaches' Poll.
- The Dukes garnered nine first-place votes from the media, trailing just defending champion, North Dakota State, which took home 149 first-place votes.
- The top five remained the same once again this week, as South Dakota State, Eastern Washington and UC Davis rounded out the top five.
- Elon entered the rankings this week, as six CAA teams were ranked this week. Following JMU were #7 Maine, #8 Towson, #18 Delaware, #22 Villanova and #25 Elon.

DEFENSE DOMINATES SFU

- Saint Francis gained 15 and 16 yards on its first two plays from scrimmage, but that would be the last first downs until early in the fourth quarter.
- JMU forced the Red Flash into 10 consecutive three-and-outs, as SFU was held to only 69 yards through the first three quarters.
- That allowed JMU to take a 37-0 lead heading to the final 15 minutes, as the Dukes led wire-to-wire.
- JMU held a +20 first downs advantage, moving the chains 29 times, to SFU's nine.
- The Dukes outgained Saint Francis 533-175 in the win.

POLK CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

- Brandon Polk has been the most prolific receiver in each of JMU's first two games, making 10 catches for 161 yards (16.1 per catch).
- In JMU's 44-7 win versus Saint Francis, Polk caught a career-high six receptions for 95 yards.
- He also averaged 26.0 yards per kick return on his two tries in the opener at West Virginia.
- Through two weeks, Polk ranks tied for fourth in the CAA in receptions per game (5.0), fourth in receiving yards (80.5) and ninth in all-purpose yards (111.0).

EFFICIENT DINUCCI

- Ben DiNucci is once again off to a strong start, as he's one of the league's most efficient passers through the first two weeks.
- DiNucci is second in the league with a 159.2 efficiency rating, as he's completed 70.7 percent of his passes.
- He's 29-of-41 for 377 yards and two touchdowns with one interception through two weeks.
- DiNucci is also the team's second-leading rusher, with 87 yards and 4.1 yards per carry.

DEFENSE RANKS AT THE TOP OF CAA

- After a pair of solid defensive performances, JMU is once again atop the league's rankings through the first two weekends.
- JMU leads the CAA in total defense (234.5), rushing defense (56.5), third-down defense (25%) and first-down defense (11.0).

JMU AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- The Dukes have faced 15 teams from the Commonwealth since beginning football in 1972.

Curt Cignetti became the eighth head coach in JMU football history on December 14, 2018.

Cignetti has climbed the ladder throughout a 36-year football coaching career that has included multiple Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) stops and a 67-26 record (.720) in eight years as a head coach, six at NCAA Division II Indiana University of Pennsylvania followed by the last two at Elon.

Most recently, Cignetti paced the sidelines as head coach at Elon, amassing a 14-9 record in two seasons after inheriting a program that went 12-45 in the previous five campaigns. The Phoenix qualified for the FCS Playoffs in both 2017 (8-4) and 2018 (6-5) to attain just the second and third Division I playoff appearances in program history (2009).

The Phoenix achieved a six-win turnaround in Cignetti's first season, going 8-4 after a 2-9 ledger the year prior. Cignetti was named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year as Elon finished second in the CAA, at 6-2, dropped a tough 28-27 decision to Furman in the First Round of the FCS Playoffs and finished 20th in the national rankings.

In 2018, Elon went 6-4 in the regular season before dropping a 19-7 decision at #12 Wofford in the playoffs to finish 6-5. Elon's other losses came to FBS South Florida and

against three CAA teams that qualified for the playoffs. All three losses also came after injuries impacted key performers at quarterback and running back. Elon's season was highlighted by the ninth-ranked Phoenix winning at No. 2 JMU 27-24 in October to achieve the program's first-ever win over an FCS top-five opponent and becoming the first CAA team to beat the Dukes following a streak of 22 straight JMU wins over league foes.

Walking in the footsteps where his father coached for 20 years, Cignetti earned his first head coaching job at IUP and went 53-17 in six seasons with three appearances in the Division II playoffs and four top-25 finishes in the national rankings. The Crimson Hawks went 33-11 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference after going 4-10 in the two seasons prior to Cignetti's arrival. IUP was 4-3 in its three NCAA appearances during his tenure and finished as high as 12th in the 2016 final rankings.

An offensive-minded assistant coach at the FBS level for 27 seasons, Cignetti was an original member of Nick Saban's first coaching staff at Alabama, filling the role of recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach for 2007 through 2010. He was part of a staff that returned the Crimson Tide to national prominence, going 12-2 in their second season in 2008 while Cignetti concurrently compiled the nation's top-ranked recruiting class. Alabama went undefeated as national champions the following season in 2009, the only undefeated final record during Saban's run in Tuscaloosa, pending the conclusion of the 2018 campaign. Alabama went 10-3 in Cignetti's final season before he earned his first head coaching job at IUP.

Cignetti joined the staff at Alabama after spending seven seasons (2000-06) as the recruiting coordinator at North Carolina State while also coaching tight ends from 2000-02 and 2005-06 and quarterbacks during the 2003 and 2004 campaigns. NC State qualified for five bowl

games during that time, including the 2002 Gator Bowl, when the team set a school record with 11 victories. One of his last recruits before moving to Alabama was quarterback Russell Wilson, who played at NC State before moving on to Wisconsin as a senior.

The first recruiting coordinator role for Cignetti came during a seven-year stint (1993-99) at Pittsburgh. He also coached the Panthers' tight ends and quarterbacks at various times under College Football Hall of Fame head coach Johnny Majors. Cignetti began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pitt during the 1983 and 1984 seasons and was part of the team's Fiesta Bowl participant his first year. He coached quarterbacks and receivers at Davidson in 1985 and was the quarterbacks coach at Rice (1986-88) and Temple (1989-92).

A quarterback letter winner at West Virginia, Cignetti is a 1982 graduate of WVU with a bachelor's degree in business administration. He is married to the former Manette Lawer. Curt and Manette have three children: Curtis John, Carly Ann and Natalie Elise, who was an honorable mention All-American in volleyball at IUP.

The sport of football runs deep in the Cignetti family. His father, Frank Cignetti, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame after playing at IUP and compiling a coaching record of 199-77-1 at West Virginia (1976-79) and IUP (1986-2005). The field at IUP is named in his honor (Frank Cignetti Field @ George P. Miller Stadium). Nick Saban coached under Frank Cignetti before later employing Curt Cignetti at Alabama. Curt's younger brother, Frank, Jr., was most recently the quarterbacks coach for the Green Bay Packers and has also held positions with the Giants, Rams, 49ers, Saints and Chiefs.

WVU Uses Quick Scores in Fourth to Push Past JMU in Opener

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – West Virginia scored 10 points in a span of 1:43 of the fourth to hold off James Madison 20-13 in the 2019 football opener on Saturday afternoon at Milan Puskar Stadium.

WVU moved to 1-0 on the young season in front of a capacity crowd of 61,891, while the Dukes, ranked No. 2 in the STATS FCS Top-25, fell to 0-1.

With the game all square at 10-10, the Mountaineers nailed a 43-yard field goal with 10:26 to play to take a 13-10 lead. On the next play, JMU turned the ball over on an interception, and WVU connected on a 22-yard touchdown pass three plays later to Tevin Bush. JMU added a field goal later in the fourth and forced WVU into a punt with 58 seconds to play, but was unable to muster a game-tying scoring drive to fall by a score.

The Dukes dominated the line of scrimmage, holding the Mountaineers to only 34 rushing yards and 1.4 yards per carry. JMU also produced eight tackles for loss, led by 2.0 apiece from redshirt junior safety Wayne Davis and redshirt senior defensive end Ron'Dell Carter. Redshirt senior linebacker Dimitri Holloway paced the defense with 13 tackles (8 solo), while six others tallied four tackles.

The Dukes held a 328-294 advantage in total offense, though the Mountaineers finished +3 turnover margin, committing no giveaways on the day. The Dukes ran for 172 yards, led by redshirt freshman running back Solomon Vanhorse, who had 12 carries for 55 yards and his first college touchdown.

Redshirt senior quarterback Ben DiNucci had 192 yards of offense, going 13-of-20 for 156 yards, adding 36 more on the ground. Two receivers tied for team-high honors, with four receptions, as redshirt senior Brandon Polk had 66 yards and redshirt sophomore Kyndel Dean had 63, which included a team-long, 29-yard grab.

The Dukes got on the board first, taking a 7-0 lead with 1:47 left in the first on a nine-yard touchdown by Vanhorse, capping a seven-play, 80-yard drive. WVU added a field goal before the half to bring the margin to 7-3.

The Mountaineers opened the third quarter with a quick score on a 28-yard touchdown pass by Austin Kendall to George Campbell to give WVU a 10-7 advantage. A 29-yard field goal by Ratke knotted it up at 10-10 heading to the fourth.

GAME FACTS

- JMU limited West Virginia to only 107 total yards in the first half, including 18 rushing (1.8 per carry).
- Redshirt junior safety D'Angelo Amos recorded the team's lone sack, the first full sack of his career.
- Redshirt junior kicker Ethan Ratke was 2-of-3 on field goals, knocking down a 29 yarder in the third and a 31 yarder in the fourth. He now stands at third place all-time at JMU with 33 career field goals.
- Junior punter Harry O'Kelly averaged 42.8 yards per punt on his five attempts, which is nearly three yards higher than his career average. That included a long of 51.
- JMU finished 5-of-14 on third down, while WVU was just 6-of-18. The Dukes were also 3-of-4 in the red zone, with WVU's stop coming on a blocked field goal.
- Kendall was 27-of-42 passing for 260 yards and two touchdowns, finding Sam James and Kennedy McKoy six times each. Bush led all players with 74 yards receiving, which including the game-clinching touchdown.

Dukes Breeze Past Saint Francis, 44-7, for Home-Opening Victory

HARRISONBURG, Va. – No. 2 James Madison football rushed for nearly 300 yards and used a stifling defensive effort to upend Saint Francis 44-7 in Saturday night's home opener at Bridgeforth Stadium/Zane Showker Field.

JMU improved to 1-1 on the season, while the Red Flash's record was evened to 1-1. The Dukes improved to 4-0 all-time against SFU and 7-0 against teams from the Northeast Conference.

The Dukes' defense limited SFU to only 69 yards of offense through the first three quarters, scoring the game's first 37 points to lead wire-to-wire.

Redshirt senior quarterback Ben DiNucci led JMU's passing attack with 221 yards and two touchdowns. The signal caller also added 51 yards on the ground.

Redshirt freshman running back Solomon Vanhorse rushed for a career- and game-high 86 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half, averaging 6.1 yards on his 14 carries. Two other JMU running backs surpassed 50 on the ground, as redshirt junior Jawon Hamilton and junior Percy Agyei-Obese had 54 and 51 yards, respectively. JMU's fourth back, freshman Austin Douglas ran for 33 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown on a 19-yard catch.

DiNucci's top target, redshirt senior receiver Brandon Polk, caught six passes for 95 yards, both career highs. That included catches of 28 yards and a season-long 29 yards. Redshirt junior receiver Jake Brown tallied four catches for 52 yards, which included a 45-yard touchdown strike, and senior tight end Dylan Stapleton added three receptions for 39 yards.

Three defenders recorded at least six tackles in the win, paced by redshirt sophomore safety Sam Kidd, who had a career-high seven tackles. Senior safety Adam Smith and junior safety MJ Hampton each had six, as Hampton's tackles total was a career high while also forcing his first fumble. Up front, junior defensive lineman Adeeb Atariwa had 1.5 tackles for loss with a pass breakup, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Ron'Dell Carter and redshirt junior safety Wayne Davis each had 1.0 TFL.

JMU tallied 533 yards of offensive in the win, with 295 on the ground and 238 more through the air, averaging 6.7 yards per play. SFU was held under 100 yards both in passing and rushing, being limited to 175 yards of total offense.

KEY MOMENTS

JMU scored a pair of first-quarter touchdowns on its way to tallying the first 37 points of the game. Saint Francis had a pair of first downs on its opening drive but was held to 10 consecutive three-and-outs, failing to move the chains until the fourth quarter.

ADDITIONAL GAME FACTS

- DiNucci completed 76.2% of his passes, including 80% in the first half. He also surpassed 3,000 career yards at JMU, moving to 3,172 yards.
- Redshirt junior kicker Ethan Ratke was perfect in the kicking game, going 3-for-3 on field goals and 5-for-5 on PATs. Ratke is only four field goals off the JMU all-time record.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Cole Johnson was also 4-for-4 in relief, passing for 17 yards and a touchdown, which he threw to junior tight end Clayton Cheatham in the fourth quarter.
- The Dukes won the time of possession battle by a margin of 34:59 to 25:01.
- JMU scored 37 unanswered points to start the game, before Saint Francis finally scored with 9:14 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- James Madison recorded 29 first downs, with 20 on the ground and nine in the air. SFU moved the chains just nine times.
