DUKES FACE OFF WITH GRIZ FRIDAY NIGHT IN FCS QUARTERS

- James Madison will be in primetime on Friday, Dec. 10 when it hosts #5 Montana in the FCS Quarterfinals.
- Kickoff from Bridgeforth Stadium is set for 7 p.m. and will be televised nationally on ESPN2 while being streamed on ESPN3.
- Friday's matchup between the Dukes and Griz is America's only college or pro football game of the day.
- Pregame radio coverage on the Morris Insurance & Financial JMU Radio Network begins at 6 p.m.
- JMU's run through the 2021 FCS Playoffs is presented by Excel Heating & Cooling.

BREAKING DOWN THE SERIES

- Friday marks the third meeting all-time, with each team winning once.
- Both of the previous meetings have occurred during the month of December and in the postseason.
- JMU won its first national championship on Dec. 17, 2004 with a 31-21 victory against the Griz in Chattanooga.
- Montana evened the series with a 35-27 semifinal triumph over the Dukes in Harrisonburg on Dec. 12, 2008.

JMU IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS

- JMU is making its 18th appearance in the FCS Playoffs and for a program-record eighth straight season.
- The Dukes are 23-15 all-time in the postseason and have won a pair of national championships (2004, 2016).
- JMU is 15-4 in home playoff games while also being 6-9 in true road games and 2-2 in neutral matchups.
- The Dukes have won 12 consecutive home playoff games, dating back to the 2016 national-title run.
- JMU is a national seed for the seventh time in program history, which includes three straight playoffs and six of the past seven since 2015.
- All-time, the Dukes were a No. 1 seed in 2008 and 2017, No. 2 in 2019, No. 3 in 2020 and 2021, No. 4 in 2016 and No. 5 in 2015.
- The Dukes have won a playoff game in each of the past six seasons and have multiple playoff wins six times.
- They went 4-0 in both national-championship runs, 3-1 in its 2017 and 2019 runner-up finishes and 2-1 in both 2008 and 2020.

DUKES VERSUS THE BIG SKY

- Friday is JMU's 6th meeting against a Big Sky Conference team, with all but one coming during the postseason.
- It's the second Big Sky game this season, as JMU won 37-24 at Weber State on Sept. 18.
- JMU is 4-1 against the Sky, going 3-0 against WSU while splitting its past playoff showdowns with Montana.
- This is the second quarterfinal matchup for JMU with the league, beating Weber 31-28 in 2017.
- The Dukes are 1-1 in semifinals vs. the Big Sky, beating Weber in 2019 and falling to Montana in 2008, and 1-0 in national title games, claiming a win over the Griz in 2004.

DUKES DOMINATE IN ALL PHASES

- Behind a six-touchdown performance by Cole Johnson and five turnovers forced by the defense, JMU cruised to a 59-20 win against Southeastern Louisiana on Dec 4.
- JMU out-gained the nation's top-ranked offense by a 484-439 margin, despite 22 fewer plays.
- Johnson was 12-of-22 for 321 yards and five touchdowns while rushing for 44 and a score. The five touchdown tosses tied JMU's single-game postseason record.
- Antwane Wells Jr. also set a JMU playoff record with three receiving touchdowns, making six catches for 123 yards.
- Kris Thornton scored twice, with one touchdown through the air and another on the ground.
- Diamonte Tucker Dorsey forced three turnovers, with a strip sack and a pair of interceptions, with the latter being a 43-yard pick-six.
- Trailing 10-7, JMU scored 52 of the game's next 55 points to capture its third-largest playoff win.

TUCK GOES WILD ON LIONS

- Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey turned in the best performance of his career in JMU's second-round win against the Lions.
- He recorded eight tackles with a sack, two interceptions, one forced fumble, a pass breakup and two quarterback hurries.
- Tucker-Dorsey tallied a strip sack and interception in the first half, allowing JMU to score 17 points over the final three minutes to lead 38-13 at the break.
- He opened the second half with a 43-yard pick-six, the first touchdown of his career to push the lead to 45-13.

CIGNETTI ONE WIN SHY OF 100

- JMU Head Coach Curt Cignetti is just one win shy of 100 wins for his career.
- In his 11th season as a head coach, Cignetti holds a 99-30 record, including a 32-4 mark at JMU.
- He previously went 14-9 at Elon and 53-17 at IUP.
- At Bridgeforth, he's 21-1 all-time, which includes a 20-1 mark as JMU head coach. He also earned a win in Harrisonburg while at Elon in 2018.
- Cignetti has had taken eight of his 11 teams to the postseason, which include a trip to the national title game in 2019.
- He's a two-time Eddie Robinson Award finalist and has guided 20 players to All-America status at the FCS level.

RECEIVER DUO ROLLING

- Antwane Wells Jr. and Kris Thornton may be the best 1-2 punch in all of FCS football.
- The duo have combined for 144 receptions, 2,085 receiving yards and 27 total touchdowns.
- Wells Jr. paces the Dukes in each category, with 73 receptions, 1,117 yards and 14 receiving TD.
- Thornton has 71 grabs, 968 yards and 12 receiving scores with one rushing touchdown.
- Wells Jr. ranks second nationally in receiving touchdowns, 11th in receiving yards per game (93.1) and 18th in catches per outing (6.1).
- Thornton is 7th in receiving touchdowns, 22nd in receiving yards per game (80.7) and 19th in catches per contest (5.9).
- 32 more receiving yards for Thornton would mark the first time in school history two players reached 1,000 yards in a season.
- Wells Jr. is also one receiving TD away from the outright JMU single-season record.

TURNOVER MARGIN BEEN KEY

- JMU leads the country in turnover margin, at +21.
- It paces the FCS in both turnovers forced (29) and fewest turnovers (8).
- The Dukes are also #1 nationally in fewest interceptions (3).
- The defense ranks third in fumble recoveries (13) and ninth in interceptions (16).
- During its current seven game win streak, JMU is +15, forcing 20 turnovers to its opponents.
- This comes after a spring season in which the Dukes were just +1 in turnover margin.

THE NCAA KICKING KING

- He previously set JMU, conference and FCS records for field goals and scoring by a kicker.
- On Saturday, Nov. 13, Ethan Ratke became the NCAA all-division record holder for most career field goals and scoring.
- Ratke is the only kicker in college football history to make 100 field goals and score 500 points, as he's currently at 101 makes and 536 points.
- He did so making a JMU and CAA-record six field goals in JMU's 32-22 win at William & Mary.
- His 536 points also ranks 2nd amongst all players in FCS history, as he needs just 9 more points for the subdivision record.
- Ratke is 13th all-time in scoring by any college football player at any division.
- He also broke his own JMU and league single-season record for field goals, as he's made 29 on 31 attempts in 2021. That bested his previous record of 27 in 2019.
- The 29 field goals is tied for the FCS single-season mark.
- He has 13 career games with three or more field goals and four with 4+. Zane Gonzalez holds the NCAA records for games with 3+ (15) and 4+ (6).

BIG-TIME ON THIRD DOWN

- JMU's defense has made it difficult for foes to convert on third down, as the Dukes once again rank amongst the FCS's best.
- This season, the Dukes lead the CAA and rank 2nd nationally on third-down defense, at 25.5%.
- JMU has held its opponents to under 50% on third down in 20 straight games, dating back to the season opener last spring.
- North Dakota State was right at 50% in the 2019 national title game, and no team has been over 50% in 47 straight games.
- The last team to do so was in the 2018 season opener, when NC State was 11/16.
- JMU has not allowed an FCS team over 50% in the past 61 games against the subdivision, with Richmond in 2016 being the last squad to achieve the feat, at 7/12.
- Elon's 7-of-16 mark was a season-high against the JMU defense, and no other team has converted more than four in a game.

DOUBLE-DIGIT VICTORIES

- JMU capped off the regular season with its sixth straight win to finish with a 10-1 overall record.
- It's the seventh time JMU has won at least 10 games in a season.
- The Dukes have also won 10 or more four times since their 2016 national-title campaign.
- JMU has claimed a program-record 14 victories on three occasions, going 14-1 in 2016 and 2017 and 14-2 in 2019.

HETHERMAN NATIONAL ASST. OF YEAR

- Defensive Coordinator Corey Hetherman was named AFCA FCS Assistant Coach of the Year.
- In his third year with the Dukes, he's consistently had JMU's defense ranking at the top nationally.
- JMU leads the FCS in turnover margin (+17) and takeaways (29) while ranking second in third-down defense (25.5%) and tackles for loss (8.8).
- The Dukes are also 3rd in fumble recoveries (13), 5th in total defense (267.7) and rushing defense (76.1) and 9th in scoring defense (15.8) and interceptions (16).

HOME COOKIN' AT BRIDGEFORTH

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Bridgeforth Stadium has treated JMU and its fans very well.
- The Dukes have turned in four unbeaten seasons at home over the past five-plus seasons, going 43-2 on their home turf during that span.
- JMU won a single-season program record nine home games both in 2017 and 2019, had eight home victories in 2016 and five three other times.
- That includes 21 games over 50 points, nine over 60, four over 70 and two over 80.
- JMU's first home loss during this span came on Oct. 6, 2018 to current head coach Curt Cignetti when he led Elon's program.
- The Dukes saw their 19-game home win streak end on Oct. 9, 2021 in a 28-27 loss to Villanova.

.500 OR BETTER IN 19 STRAIGHT YRS

- JMU's success from year to year has come to be expected, as the Dukes have secured at least a .500 record or better for a league-best 19 straight seasons.
- The Dukes cemented its 17th winning season on Oct. 23 in their road win at Delaware, improving to 6-1 on the year. JMU is the only CAA team to achieve such a feat.
- The Dukes have secured a winning record in 32 of 50 seasons since beginning football in 1972.
- JMU tallied 9+ wins in a record 5 straight seasons from 2015-19 and again in 2021.

JMU AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- The Dukes have faced 15 teams from the Commonwealth since beginning football in 1972.
- In 155 games, JMU has racked up an 94-61 record against teams from around the state.
- With JMU's wins at William & Mary (Nov. 13) and Richmond (Oct. 16) this season, it has now claimed 15 straight wins over state schools.
- The Tribe was the last state team to beat JMU in a 44-41 triumph on Oct. 31, 2015 in Williamsburg.
- The Dukes have played William & Mary (27-17) more than any other state team, at 44 games, and have faced Richmond (21-18) 39 times and Liberty (12-6) on 18 occasions.

CELEBRATING 50 SEASONS

- James Madison University began sponsoring football in 1972, as this fall marks the 50th season for the Dukes.
- JMU will celebrate the 50th all season long, honoring specific decades at each home game.
- It began with the 1970's in the opener versus Morehead State, with the 1980's, 1990's, 2000's, 2010's and 2020's following.
- JMU also recognized the 1972 team and remembered Dr. Challance McMillin, the program's first coach, who passed away in 2020.
- Other content, such as video features, alumni interviews, Throwback Thursdays and On This Date will highlight the history of JMU football.
- JMU has won two national championships, 10 conference titles and has made 18 postseason appearance.

2021 #NFLDUKES

- A total of 11 former JMU football standouts are currently affiliated with NFL franchises, with eight on rosters and three coaching.
- Five Dukes made 53-man rosters while two more are on practice squads and one is on IR.
- Three JMU stars are with the world-champion Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Aaron Stinnie and Josh Wells are on the active roster, and Earl Watford was placed on IR.
- Dean Marlowe made a new home with Detroit this season, while Daniel Brown is back with the New York Jets.
- Jimmy Moreland, who spent the past two seasons and the preseason in Washington was picked up by Houston.
- Ben DiNucci is on the practice squad with Dallas, while Ron'Dell Carter signed with Arizona's practice squad.
- Additionally, three former Dukes serve on NFL coaching staffs.
- John DeFilippo is pass game coordinator and quarterbacks coach with Chicago, Justin Rascati is offensive quality control coach with Denver and Blaine Stewart is the assistant wide receivers coach in Pittsburgh.

Dukes Set Multiple Records in Season-Opening Win Against MSU

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison kicked off the 50th season of football in style, setting two team records while matching another in a 68-10 victory against Morehead State on Friday night at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The second-ranked Dukes limited the Eagles to an astounding -57 rushing yards, shattering the previous record of -35 against Bloomsburg in 1989. JMU also scored 51 second-half points, the most in a second half in school history and the second most in any half.

Quarterback Cole Johnson threw for a career-high five touchdowns and the Dukes had six total passing touchdowns, tying both JMU records for passing touchdowns by an individual and a team.

The Dukes out-gained MSU by nearly 500 yards, as they racked up 687 yards of total offense, the fifth most in school history. JMU rushed for 345 yards and threw for 342.

Running back Kaelon Black rushed 12 times for 100 yards, the second 100-yard game in just his third career outing. Fellow running back Latrelle Palmer also ran for 98 yards and a pair of touchdowns for his third career two-touchdown game. Peyton Rutherford finished the game strong, adding 58 yards in the fourth quarter, which included a game-long 56-yard rush.

Johnson was 19-of-28 for 298 yards with his five scores, while rookie quarterback Billy Atkins finished the game 4-of-7 for 44 yards and his first career touchdown.

The quarterback duo found four different Dukes for touchdowns in the passing game, led by Kris Thornton, who had four catches for 82 yards and a pair of scores. Antwane Wells made four grabs for 60 yards and a touchdown, Kevin Curry had three receptions for a career-best 50 yards and a touchdown while Solomon Vanhorse reeled in three passes for 39 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, safety Chris Chukwuneke turned in a career-high six tackles with one for loss. Safety Que Reid made five stops with an interception and a breakup, as he was one of four Dukes to produce a takeaway. Cornerbacks Greg Ross and Taurus Carroll each had an interception, while defensive lineman Abi Nwabuku-Ononji registered his first career fumble recovery.

JMU led 17-3 at the half, before turning on the jets, scoring four touchdowns in the third to extend the lead to 45-10. Palmer sparked the offense with a 47-yard touchdown on the fourth play of the second half, and the Dukes followed that with Johnson touchdown passes to Thornton and Vanhorse. In the fourth, the Dukes found the endzone four times, with three touchdowns and a safety. That included first career touchdowns for both Atkins and quarterback Patrick Bentley, who capped off the scoring with a four-yard touchdown run in the final minute.

MSU's Mark Pappas threw for 243 yards and three interceptions, finding his All-PFL receiver BJ Byrd nine times for 127 yards.

#3 Dukes Dominate Black Bears, 55-7, in CAA Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – #3 James Madison produced scoring production in all three phases and out-gained Maine by over 300 yards en route to a dominant 55-7 victory in its Colonial Athletic Association Football opener on Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 2-0 (1-0 CAA), while the Black Bears fell to 0-2 (0-2 CAA).

JMU was prolific in the pass game, as quarterback Cole Johnson was 25-of-30 for 379 yards and four touchdowns, which included 305 in the opening half alone.

Wide receiver Antwane Wells Jr. turned in one of the program's top receiving performances, reeling in eight receptions for 179 yards and two touchdowns, all of which were career highs.

His 179 yards was the ninth-highest receiving total in JMU history, as both of his touchdowns came on plays exceeding 50 yards.

In addition to Wells, Kris Thornton and Scott Bracey both had 71 receiving yards, with Bracey finding the end zone for the first time this season. Tight end Noah Turner also caught his first career touchdown on a 27-yard grab to open the scoring.

JMU racked up 133 rushing yards against the solid defensive front of Maine, led by Kaelon Black's 55 yards on nine carries. Latrelle Palmer rushed for 41 yards, while Lorenzo Bryant Jr. scored his first JMU touchdown in the second half.

The Dukes also got plenty of production from the defense and special teams, scoring touchdowns in both areas. Francis Meehan intercepted his first career pass on a 31-yard pick-six in the fourth quarter, while Mateo Jackson and Desmond Green blocked a third-quarter punt, with Green scooping and scoring on a 6-yard punt return for a score.

Ethan Ratke also broke the FCS all-time scoring record by a kicker while tying the FCS record for most career field goals. He tied Dan Carpenter's scoring field goals record with his 413th point and 75th career field goal with 10:59 remaining in the third. Minutes later, he broke the scoring record on a PAT following Green's blocked punt for a touchdown.

Defensively, Greg Ross and Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey each tallied seven tackles, which was a career high for Ross and season best for Tucker-Dorsey. Tucker-Dorsey also added his first career full sack and a pass breakup. Isaac Ukwu was a force up front, collecting his first two career sacks with a breakup, while Bryce Carter tacked on 1.5 TFLs.

Leading 10-0 after the first, the Johnson-to-Wells connection put together back-to-back long touchdowns, as Johnson and Wells each had a career-long, 73-yard touchdown with 9:34 remaining in the half, followed by a 51-yarder to make it 24-0 at the break.

Following Ratke's scoring-record PAT that made it 34-0, Maine got on the board on a Derek Robertson 22-yard touchdown pass to Andre Miller. JMU responded with three more touchdown drives, as Bracey and Bryant Jr. found the end zone for the first time, while Meehan capped off the game with his pick-six.

JMU Wins Big on the Road, Downs #9 Weber State, 37-24

OGDEN, Utah – Cole Johnson produced three total touchdowns and #3 James Madison used timely defensive plays en route to a 37-24 triumph at #9 Weber State on Saturday night in front of 11,222 fans at Stewart Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 3-0 on the year while the Wildcats fell to 1-2. JMU also improved to 3-0 all-time against Weber, capturing the program's first road win at a Big Sky Conference foe.

Johnson was 20-of-28 for 177 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for one more. Antwane Wells Jr. scored a pair of second-half touchdowns, as he corralled eight receptions for 76 yards. Kris Thornton was efficient, especially on third down, tallying eight catches for 57 yards.

JMU's rushing attack heated up in the second half, led by Latrelle Palmer's 80 yards with a long of 46. Austin Douglas contributed a career-long 45-yard run and finished with 49 yards, while Lorenzo Bryant Jr. added 32.

Ethan Ratke drilled three field goals, setting the FCS all-time field goals record with his 76th-career make on a 44-yarder six minutes into the first quarter. He later added his 77th in the third and 78th in the fourth.

Defensively, Kelvin Azanama finished with 10 tackles and one for loss. Isaac Ukwu was a force up front with 2.0 TFLs and a sack. Bryce Carter and Mike Greene each had 1.5 tackles for loss, as Carter made seven total stops. Chris Chukwuneke and Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey also produced seven tackles.

Leading 10-3, Josh Sarratt made a game-changing play, as he picked up a fumble by the Weber quarterback and returned it 88 yards for his first JMU touchdown to put the Dukes up 17-3 with 6:38 left in the half.

After Douglas' 45-yard run in the first minute of the third, Johnson connected with Wells on his first of two touchdown tosses on a five-yard pass. Weber trimmed the lead to 24-10, but the Dukes answered with Ratke's second kick and another Johnson-to-Wells touchdown, making it 34-10 with 14:13 to play. Ratke tacked on his third field goal to extend the lead to 37-10, and WSU added a pair of touchdowns late to complete the scoring.

#3 JMU Rallies in Fourth to Upend #25 New Hampshire, 23-21

DURHAM, N.H. – Despite conceding a 10-point lead, #3 James Madison football used a Kris Thornton touchdown reception and a game-clinching interception by Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey in the fourth to fend off #25 New Hampshire, 23-21, on Saturday afternoon at Wildcat Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in Colonial Athletic Association play, while the Wildcats fell to 3-2 on the year and 2-1 in league action.

UNH took a 21-17 lead heading to the fourth quarter after scoring off three JMU turnovers. Facing a third-and-long, Cole Johnson found Kris Thornton on a 30-yard touchdown with 8:20 to play, giving the Dukes a 23-21 lead.

After teams traded drives, UNH's Bret Edwards was intercepted by Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey with 1:45 to go to seal the win.

Johnson finished 33-of-44 for 273 yards and three touchdowns with an interception and fumble. Thornton made a career-best 12 receptions for 112 yards and two touchdowns, while Reggie Brown made four grabs for 37 yards and his first career touchdown. Thornton's 12 catches was the third-most in JMU single game history.

Antwane Wells Jr. also made six catches for the Dukes, and Latrelle Palmer led the charge on the ground, rushing for 57 yards. Johnson also added 37 rushing yards.

Defensively, Kelvin Azanama made a team-best nine tackles while Wayne Davis tallied eight stops. Tucker-Dorsey finished with five tackles, to go with first career interception. Bryce Carter also finished with five stops and his first JMU sack.

JMU opened the game with a 10-0 lead before a fumble gave way to a UNH 93-yard fumble return for a touchdown to make it a three-point game. The Dukes extended the lead to 17-7 right before halftime on Johnson's pass to Brown with 17 seconds to go.

UNH completely changed the complexion of the game with two more takeaways in the third. Randall Harris picked off Johnson on JMU's first offensive play of the second half for a touchdown. UNH later scored after a sack and fumble on the ensuing drive to make it 21-17 midway through the quarter.

After a crucial third-down stop in the fourth, Johnson found Thornton once again on a 30-yard touchdown pass to put the Dukes back in front for good.

GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained UNH 432-162, including a 159-31 advantage on the ground. JMU also had a 273-131 lead through the air.
- UNH forced JMU into its first three turnovers of the season, with the first two being returned for a touchdown. All three JMU turnovers eventually resulted in all 21 points for the Wildcats.
- The Dukes were 12-of-20 on third down, while holding the Wildcats to 2-of-10. JMU also went 1-of-1 on fourth down.
- JMU dominated first downs by a 28-11 margin.

#11 Villanova Edges #3 JMU, 28-27

HARRISONBURG, Va. – #11 Villanova overcame an 11-point halftime deficit, holding #3 James Madison without a point in the second half, to rally for a 28-27 Colonial Athletic Association football win on Saturday afternoon in front of 25,035 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Wildcats improved to 4-1 on the year and 2-0 in CAA play, while the Dukes fell to 4-1 and 2-1.

The win for Villanova snapped JMU's 15-game win streak against conference opponents and 14-game CAA win streak. It was also the first setback for the Dukes at home in 20 games and ended a 20-game regular-season win streak.

JMU held a 27-16 halftime lead, but a pair of Cole Bunce field goals and a 57-yard touchdown pass from Daniel Smith to Rayjoun Pringle late in the third quarter put Villanova ahead by one. The Dukes had a pair of scoring chances in the fourth but missed on two field-goal opportunities, and Villanova secured the win by converting on a fourth-and-one from its own 29.

Playing in his first home game this season, Percy Agyei-Obese rushed for 83 yards and two touchdowns. He moved into JMU's career top five with 31 rushing touchdowns, which is tied with Rodney Landers for fourth all-time.

Cole Johnson was 24-of-40 for 174 yards while rushing for 25 yards and a touchdown. Kris Thornton turned in another solid performance, making eight receptions for 61 yards, with 53 yards after the catch. Antwane Wells Jr. become the latest JMU player to reach 1,000 career receiving yards in just his 13th game, as he stands at 1,000 after making four catches for 47 yards.

Defensively, Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey turned in a career-high 10 tackles, and Mike Greene was one shy of his career best with eight stops with a half tackle for loss. Isaac Ukwu had a strip sack in the first half for his second forced fumble of the season, and Abi Nwabuku-Onkonji fell on the loose ball for his second fumble recovery of 2021.

Villanova was led by Smith, who threw for 258 yards and a touchdown, as Pringle had a game-high eight catches for 132 yards and his score. Justin Covington ran for a game-high 86 yards, which including a 56-yard touchdown and a 2-yard rush to seal the win.

VU's defense was paced by Forrest Rhyne, who made 20 tackles, and Mike Ruane and Qwahsin Townsel had 11 stops apiece.

Villanova produced more than 200 yards in the first quarter alone, taking an early 13-7 lead, but finished the first half with just 194 after JMU held the visitors to -11 total yards in the second quarter. Trailing 16-10, the Dukes scored 17 in a row over the last 8:30 of the second to grab a 27-16 lead at the break.

The Wildcats, known for their solid second-half offense, recaptured the lead with three consecutive scoring drives in the third. After Bunce's field goals, Smith's long touchdown toss to Pringle put VU up 28-27 heading into the fourth.

JMU drove deep into enemy territory midway through the fourth quarter, but Ethan Ratke's 27-yard field goal missed right, keeping VU ahead by one. After a JMU stop, the Dukes had another chance to take the lead but Ratke's 36-yarder missed off the left goal post and Villanova converted a first down on the ensuing drive to run out the clock.

GAME NOTES

- Villanova had big offensive bursts in the first and third quarters to out-gain JMU by a 388-339 margin. That ended JMU's 21-game streak of winning the total-offense battle.
- The Wildcats had a 258-174 advantage through the air, while JMU held a slim 165-130 lead on the ground.
- The Dukes were 9-of-20 on third down while holding VU to a 2-of-9 mark. JMU was also 4-of-4 on fourth down. JMU has now held opponents under 50% on third down in 13 straight games.
- It was the first time since the 2014 FCS First Round against Liberty that JMU did not score a point in the second half.
- Ethan Ratke converted two field goals to extend his FCS record to 81 for his career, as he's now made a kick in 26 straight games. His first in the fourth snapped a streak of 24 straight makes, dating back to the 2019 season.

JMU Defense Shuts Down Spiders in 19-3 Road Win

RICHMOND, Va. – #8 James Madison used a stifling-defensive effort, shutting down Richmond's offense, en route to a 19-3 Colonial Athletic Association football road win on Saturday afternoon at Robins Stadium.

The Dukes improved to 5-1 on the year and 3-1 in CAA play while the Spiders fell to 2-4 this season and 0-3 in league action.

The Dukes limited Richmond to just 188 total yards and just three trips across midfield, including just once in the second half alone. JMU has now held the Spiders without a touchdown in three straight games, having given up just six points in both the 2019 and 2020-21 meetings.

JMU racked a season-best six sacks, with two each from defensive linemen Bryce Carter and Tony Thurston, with Thurston's serving as the first two of his career. Mike Greene and Kelvin Azanama also registered their first sacks of the season.

Linebacker Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey led the Dukes with 10 tackles and a half TFL, while safety MJ Hampton tallied six stops. Greene and safeties Wayne Davis and Chris Chukwuneke each made five tackles, while Chukwuneke recovered the first fumble of his career.

Offensively, quarterback Cole Johnson was 19-of-29 for 270 yards and a touchdown. Richmond native Antwane Wells Jr. had a solid homecoming, making six receptions for 125 yards, which included a 47-yard catch. Kris Thornton also had seven grabs for 81 yards, with a game-long, 49-yarder. Percy Agyei-Obese had a game-high 72 rushing yards to pace the JMU ground attack.

Ethan Ratke bounced back this week, tying his career high with four field goals, which is also tied for the most field goals by any JMU player in a game. He now has 85 career field goals and his 13 points scored today moved him into fifth place all-time in FCS history with 457 points.

JMU struck twice late in the first quarter, as Ratke's first field goal put JMU up 3-0 with 5:54 left in the quarter. On the ensuing drive, the Dukes took care of a short field, and Johnson connected on a 25-yard touchdown pass on a third-and-long to running back Solomon Vanhorse to make it 10-0 after on.

The teams traded field goals in the second to make it 13-3 at halftime, and Ratke added two more kicks in the third to complete the game's scoring. After Richmond's field goal, JMU limited Richmond to just 64 total yards on the host's final nine drives.

GAME NOTES

- The Dukes have now won six straight against the Spiders, which is a series record in the 39-game history.
- Over the past five wins (2017-present), JMU has conceded just 38 points to UR, only allowing two touchdowns.
- JMU out-gained Richmond by a wide margin, at 370-188.
- The Dukes had a 270-84 lead through the air while the run game was fairly even, as UR held a 105-100 advantage.
- Both teams struggled with the rainy elements on third down, as JMU was 4-of-15 and UR was only 2-of-15.

Ratke Breaks Record, JMU Defense Smothers Delaware in 22-10 Triumph

NEWARK, Del. – Kicker Ethan Ratke converted a JMU single-game record five field goals and James Madison's defense forced three turnovers and limited #23 Delaware to 109 total yards en route to a 22-10 Colonial Athletic Association football win on Saturday afternoon at Delaware Stadium.

The seventh-ranked Dukes improved to 6-1 on the year and 4-1 in CAA play, while the Blue Hens fell for the third straight time, dropping to 3-4 and 2-3. It was also JMU's fifth straight win in the series.

Ratke, the FCS all-time leader in career field goals did something he'd never done before in Newark, as he kicked a JMU-record five goals, outscoring JMU's opponent by himself for the second straight week.

Adding his extra point, his 16 points moved him into fourth place all-time in FCS history with 473, surpassing Eastern Washington's Cooper Kupp (464).

JMU's defense once again rose to the occasion, giving Delaware very little in terms of offense. The Dukes held the Blue Hens to just 109 total yards, including 25 in the second half alone to shut out the hosts over the final 30 minutes.

Linebacker Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey led JMU with nine tackles, while safety Chris Chukwuneke made six stops with a half tackle for loss and a key fumble recovery. Safety MJ Hampton had five tackles and his second career interception, while cornerback Greg Ross recorded his team-leading third interception of the year.

Offensively, quarterback Cole Johnson threw for 119 yards while rushing for a career-best 53 rushing yards and a touchdown. Running back Latrelle Palmer ran for a game-high 74 yards, and Percy Agyei-Obese added 45 on the ground. Wide Receiver Antwane Wells Jr. led all players with 43 receiving yards as well.

JMU led 6-3 after one, but a James Collins 26-yard touchdown pass from Zach Gwynn gave Delaware a 10-6 lead early in the second. Ratke's third field goal of the day made it 10-9 at the break.

After regaining the lead with Ratke's fourth made kick, at 12-10, early in the third quarter, Abi Nwabuoku-Ononji strip sacked Gwynn and Chukwuneke came away with the ball in the pile. Three plays later, Johnson faked out the entire stadium on a keeper, taking it 36 yards to the house to make it 19-10. Ratke added his record field goal in the fourth to complete the game's scoring.

GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained Delaware 314-109, which included a 204-25 mark in the second half.
- The Dukes held the Blue Hens to just 85 passing yards and 24 rushing yards in the game.
- JMU went 9-of-22 on third down while holding UD to just 2-of-13. It was the 15th straight game a team failed to convert 50% on third down against JMU.
- JMU had 10 tackles for loss and three sacks, marking the fourth time this season JMU had double-digit TFLs.

Career Day Through Air Leads #5 JMU Past Elon, 45-21

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Behind a JMU single-game record six touchdown passes by quarterback Cole Johnson, #5 James Madison dominated the middle quarters en route to a 45-21 Colonial Athletic Association football victory over Elon on a rainy afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes won their third straight, improving to 7-1 on the year and 5-1 in CAA play, while the Phoenix saw their three-game win streak end, as they evened their record at 4-4 overall and 3-2 in league action.

Johnson was 22-of-25 for 307 yards and six touchdowns, as a record five different receivers found the end zone through the air. After starting 1-for-2, Johnson ended the first half with 20 straight completions, throwing for 276 of his 307 yards with a single-half record five scores in the opening 30 minutes.

Nine Dukes caught a pass in the win, led by Antwane Wells Jr., who turned in his third 100-yard game of the season after making eight receptions for 114 yards with a pair of touchdowns. Kris Thornton tallied five catches for 95 yards, which included a 58-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Clayton Cheatham, Reggie Brown and Devin Ravenel also caught touchdowns. Running back Latrelle Palmer paced all players on the ground, rushing for 83 yards.

With the game tied after a furious offensive start, JMU took control over the course of just seven plays. Thornton's 58-yard touchdown catch gave JMU a 21-14 lead with 10:17 left in the second. Three plays later, Taurus Carroll intercepted his second pass of the season on an underthrown ball by Davis Cheek, setting up the Dukes at the Elon 8.

Two plays later, Johnson hooked up with Wells Jr. on the first of his two scores, making it 28-14 with 7:23 to play in the half. JMU closed the second with another Johnson-to-Wells touchdown with 50 seconds to play, making it 35-14 at the break.

The Dukes tacked on 10 more in the third quarter, with Johnson's 31-yard strike to Ravenel giving Johnson the single-game touchdown record and JMU a 45-14 lead. Elon scored midway through the fourth to complete the scoring.

Defensively, safety Chris Chukwuneke made seven tackles with a tackle for loss and safety Sam Kidd had six stops, 1.5 TFL and his first career sack. Defensive end Isaac Ukwu had a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, while defensive tackle Mike Greene had a season-best 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack. JMU made 10 tackles for loss, marking the fifth time it achieved that feat this season.

For Elon, Cheek threw for 198 yards with two touchdowns, an interception and a lost fumble. Bryson Daughtry made seven catches for 112 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown reception. On the opposite side of the ball, Marcus Hillman led all players with 11 tackles, and Devonte Chandler added nine stops.

GAME NOTES

- JMU dominated offensively, holding a 454-287 lead in total offense. That included a 307-198 lead through the air and a 147-89 edge in the run game.
- JMU converted 6-of-11 on third down while holding the Phoenix to 7-of-16 on third. It was JMU's 16th straight game limiting an opponent under 50%.
- JMU had an average starting field position of its own 45, as opposed to Elon starting on average at its own 20.
- The Dukes registered 21 first downs, while Elon moved the chains 14 times.

- He also moved into eighth all-time at JMU in career passing yards (4,729), seventh in career completions (372) and ninth in total offense (5,081).
- Wells Jr. moved into a tie for 10th place at JMU with 13 career receiving touchdowns in only his 16th career game.
- JMU improved to 9-1 all-time against Elon, having now won three straight in the series.

Thornton's Record Performance Leads #3 JMU Past Campbell on Homecoming

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison wide receiver Kris Thornton registered a school-record four receiving touchdowns, and the Dukes scored points on nine of 11 offensive drives en route to a dominant 51-14 victory against Campbell on Homecoming Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The third-ranked Dukes improved to 8-1 on the year, while the Camels fell to 3-6 in the teams' inaugural meeting.

Thornton, who entered the day with five receiving touchdowns this season, turned in a masterful performance through the air, making eight receptions for a season-high 142 yards and a program-best four touchdowns. It was his second 100-yard game of the season and the most receiving yards since he transferred into the program.

Cole Johnson was 11-of-21 for 259 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 22.8 yards per completion. Billy Atkins closed the game in relief, going 5-of-5 for 27 yards and a touchdown, as his second score of the season vaulted Thornton into the record books.

The Dukes were more efficient on the ground, averaging 5.3 yards per carry. They gained 190 yards, led by Latrelle Palmer's 92 yards. Solomon Vanhorne also added 47 rushing yards and 47 receiving yards on his three catches.

In addition to Thornton, Antwane Wells Jr. made three grabs for 74 yards and a touchdown, as he now has eight scores on the season.

On the defensive side of the ball, Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey tied his career high with a team-best 10 tackles with a half tackle for loss. Kelvin Azanama produced eight tackles and a half TFL, and Sam Kidd made six stops with a full TFL.

Isaac Ukwu and Bryce Carter led the Dukes with 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack each. Carter also forced two fumbles and recovered one. Josh Sarratt had a sack with a forced fumble, while Jailin Walker added five tackles and a forced fumble. Greg Ross additionally had four stops with two pass breakups, as JMU finished with six PBU.

Leading 10-7 after one, the Dukes opened the game up in the second, with a pair of Thornton touchdown catches and a field goal to make it 27-7 at the break. The Dukes extended the lead to 30 early in the second half after Ethan Ratke converted his third field goal and Johnson kept it for an 8-yard scamper. Campbell never drew closer than 37-14, as the Dukes cashed in on a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns.

Haji-Malik Williams paced Campbell's offense with 268 passing yards and two touchdowns, both of which went to Caleb Snead, who finished with 11 catches for 198 yards. The Camels' defense was led by CJ Tillman, who had 11 tackles and one tackle for loss.

GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained Campbell 476-359, which including a 190-91 advantage in the run game.
- The Dukes had a +3 turnover margin, recovering three fumbles while not turning it over once.
- JMU was 6-of-12 on third down and 1-of-1 on fourth, while holding Campbell to 4-of-13 on third down. The Camels converted 2-of-4 on fourth.

Ratke Breaks Two National Records, Dukes Down Tribe 32-22 on Road

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. – James Madison kicker Ethan Ratke turned in a career day, setting two NCAA career records while breaking his own single-season record, as the 2nd-ranked Dukes held off #25 William & Mary, 32-22, on Saturday evening at Zable Stadium.

The Dukes won their fifth straight, improving to 9-1 on the year with a 6-1 record in conference play. The Tribe fell to 6-4 overall and 4-3 in league games, as JMU won its sixth in a row against W&M.

Ratke became the NCAA kicking king, setting all-division records for both career field goals (100) and career scoring by a kicker (517), after connecting on a JMU-record six field goals with a pair of extra points. He also broke his own JMU single-season record, as he's now made 28-of-30 on the year, besting his 27 makes in 2019.

He ironically set these records inside the same stadium in which he converted his first two career field goals in 2017.

Cole Johnson accumulated 380 yards of total offense, as he was 24-of-42 for 334 yards and a touchdown, to go with 46 rushing yards and a score. It was his third 300-yard game of the season, as he moved into fifth place at JMU with 43 career passing scores.

Antwane Wells Jr. set a career high with nine receptions for 134 yards, marking his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the year. Kris Thornton made five catches for 75 yards and a touchdown for his 10th of the season. In addition to Johnson's 46, Latrelle Palmer led the Dukes with 48 yards on the ground.

Defensively, Kelvin Azanama turned in a season-best 11 tackles, which tied a career high that he set during the spring season at William & Mary. He also had a career best with a pair of tackles for loss. Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey turned in eight stops with 1.0 TFL and a forced fumble, while Sam Kidd added six tackles with a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and his first career interception.

JMU led 6-0 late in the second quarter before Johnson's 30-yard touchdown pass to Thornton extended the advantage to 13-0 at the break. Ratke set the NCAA field goals record with his third make early in the third, and Johnson's rushing score made it 23-0 with seven minutes left in the quarter.

The Tribe battled back, producing a pair of long touchdowns to make it 23-15 early in the fourth, but the leg of Ratke proved crucial, as he tacked on three more field goals to give JMU a 32-15 lead. His sixth and final field goal broke his own single-season record, as he reset that record in six fewer games than the previous mark from two seasons ago.

GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained William & Mary 446-335, including a 334-128 lead in the passing game.
- After being held to 55 rushing yards in the first half, the Tribe finished with 207 on the ground.
- The Dukes were 6-for-17 on third down while W&M failed to convert once, going 0-for-10.
- JMU won the turnover battle 2-0, producing both an interception and fumble recovery.
- The Dukes tallied 10 tackles for loss with just one sack, while W&M had five TFL.

Dukes Steamroll Towson on Senior Day, Win 10th Conference Title

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison quarterback Cole Johnson broke the program's single-season passing touchdown record and the Dukes celebrated their seniors in style, cruising to a 56-10 victory against Towson to win a share of the conference championship on Saturday at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes closed the regular season with a 10-1 overall record and 7-1 mark in league play, tying Villanova for the 2021 conference title. The Tigers saw their season end at 4-7 and 3-5.

With the win, JMU secured its 10th conference championship in program history and the ninth and final time as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association (previously the Yankee and Atlantic 10).

Johnson tied his own JMU-record by throwing for six touchdowns to reset the single-season record for passing touchdowns. He has registered 32 touchdowns through the air this season, surpassing Vad Lee's 2014 record of 30. He finished 21-of-25 for 363 yards, as Johnson rose to fifth on the JMU career passing charts (5,685).

Antwane Wells Jr. and Kris Thornton both had big days in the passing game, as the duo combined for 14 receptions for 223 yards and four scores. Wells Jr. made nine grabs for 107 yards and a career-best three touchdowns, while Thornton had five catches for a game-high 116 yards and a score.

One Duke also produced a hat trick of touchdowns, as Solomon Vanhorse had a career-high three touchdowns, scoring on a kickoff return, a catch and a rush. He finished with a game-high 171 all-purpose yards, including 139 on kickoff returns.

Other notable players in the receiving game, included Scott Bracey, who had three catches for 53 yards, and Reggie Brown, who caught two passes for 71 yards and a score.

Three Dukes led the way with eight tackles apiece in MJ Hampton, Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey and Kelvin Azanama. Azanama added 1.5 tackles for loss, while Tucker-Dorsey picked off his second pass of the season. Bryce Carter made 3.0 tackles for loss with a sack and forced fumble. The Dukes forced Towson into four total turnovers, as Mateo Jackson recovered a fumble and both Seth Naotala and Que Reid had interceptions in the win.

JMU opened the game with a bang, as Vanhorse returned the opening kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown. After Tucker-Dorsey's interception, Johnson found Wells Jr. on the first of his three touchdown catches to make it 14-0 less than four minutes in.

After a Towson score made it 14-7 after one, the Dukes blew the game wide open in the second, with four more touchdowns.

JMU's 83-yard touchdown pass from Johnson to Thornton was a career-long play for both players. The Dukes found the end zone three more times through the air with two more to Wells Jr. and another to Brown, making it a 42-7 game at the break.

Vanhorse completed his trio of scores with a 10-yard catch and three-yard rush in the third, as JMU led by as many as 49, at 56-7. Towson closed the scoring with a fourth-quarter field goal, just their fourth made kick of the season.

Jerry Howard paced the Tiger offense with a game-high 162 rushing yards. Towson's two quarterbacks combined just 14-of-30 for 151 yards and three interceptions, though Caleb Smith was a bright spot, making seven receptions for 87 yards and a score.

GAME NOTES

- JMU captured its third straight conference championship and its sixth over the past seven years with Saturday's win.
- The Dukes will head to the FCS playoffs for the 18th time in school history and for a program-record eighth straight season.
- JMU out-gained Towson 439-293, including a 381-151 advantage in the passing game.
- Both teams struggled on third down, as JMU was 2-of-7 and Towson was just 3-of-13.
- JMU had 8.0 tackles for loss, as well as a +3 lead in the turnover margin (4-1).

Dukes Surge Past #18 Southeastern Louisiana, Advance to FCS Quarterfinals

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Cole Johnson tied a JMU playoff record with five passing touchdowns, and the defense forced five turnovers, as #2 James Madison routed #18 Southeastern Louisiana 59-20, in the FCS second round on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes improve to 11-1 on the year and advance to the quarterfinals to face #5 Montana either on Friday, Dec. 10 or Saturday, Dec. 11. ESPN will announce the date and time following the conclusion of the second round. The Lions ended their season with a 9-4 overall record.

Johnson accounted for six total touchdowns, as he was 12-of-22 for 321 yards and five touchdowns. He also added 44 yards and a score on the ground. His five touchdown passes matched Bryan Schor's postseason single-game mark, as he also had five in the 2016 second round versus New Hampshire.

Antwane Wells Jr. also set a playoff record for the Dukes, as he became the first receiver in school history to record three receiving touchdowns. He finished with six receptions for 123 yards, marking the eighth 100-yard game of his career.

Kris Thornton also scored twice, once through the air and another on the ground. He finished with a pair of catches for 72 yards while adding a few in the run game. Solomon Vanhorse also caught a 63-yard touchdown pass, the longest catch of his career. Austin Douglas, who bested his twin brother Justin at SLU, led the game with 51 rushing yards, averaging 10.2 per carry.

After a back-and-forth first quarter, with JMU leading 14-10, the Dukes broke the game open with 24 points, including 17 over the final 2:56 of the half. The Dukes used three one-play drives for touchdowns in the frame, taking a 38-13 lead into the break.

The Dukes tacked on 21 more in the third quarter, as Diamonte Tucker-Dorsey's 43-yard pick-six to open the quarter. Wells Jr. caught the fifth Johnson touchdown pass on the ensuing drive and Thornton's end-around run put JMU up 59-13 late in the third.

JMU's defense forced SLU into five turnovers, with each of the first four takeaways resulting in points. The Dukes also held the Lions just 42 rushing yards and 1.7 per carry. Tucker-Dorsey led the defense with eight total tackles, a strip sack and his pair of interceptions.

Chris Chukwuneke also had eight stops with a pair of tackles for loss and a sack and forced fumble. Tony Thurston made six tackles with 2.0 TFL and a half sack, and Kelvin Azanama had six stops and a fumble recovery. Isaac Ukwu grabbed five tackles and a sack, Greg Ross also had his team-leading fourth interception of the season, while Taurus Jones recovered his first fumble.

Southeastern Louisiana was paced by Cole Kelley, who was 36-of-50 for 397 yards and two touchdowns with three interceptions and a lost fumble. Austin Mitchell had nine grabs for 129 yards and a score.

GAME NOTES

- JMU's 59 points were the third-most in its program history in the playoffs, and it's the fifth time JMU has scored at least 50 points in the postseason.
- The 39-point victory was also the third-largest margin of victory in a JMU playoff game.
- JMU out-gained the nation's #1 offense by a 484-439 margin, despite running 22 fewer offensive plays.
- The Dukes averaged 9.1 yards per play, as opposed to SLU's 5.9.
- The teams combined for 718 passing yards, with SLU at 397 and JMU at 321, while the Dukes held a commanding 163-42 lead on the ground.
- JMU was +4 in the turnover battle, at 5-1, as it is now +21 for the season.
- Teams were perfect in the red zone, as JMU was 2-for-2 and SLU was 3-for-3. Though, the Lions settled for field goals on two of their three trips.
- Johnson averaged 26.75 yards per completion, with a long of 63.
- He surpassed 3,000 passing yards this season, as he now stands at 3,274, which is third in single-season history. He also crossed the 6,000 career mark, as he's at 6,006, good for third all-time at JMU.
- Johnson additionally has a JMU-record 37 touchdown passes this season and 54 for his career to rank second behind Bryan Schor's record of 62.
- Wells Jr. now leads the Dukes and the Colonial Athletic Association this season in receptions (73), receiving yards (1,117) and receiving touchdowns (14).
- He's also fourth all-time at JMU with 20 career touchdowns and ninth with 1,720 receiving yards.
- Ethan Ratke tacked on 11 more points to move into 13th place on the NCAA career scoring list (536). He needs just nine more points to own the FCS record.

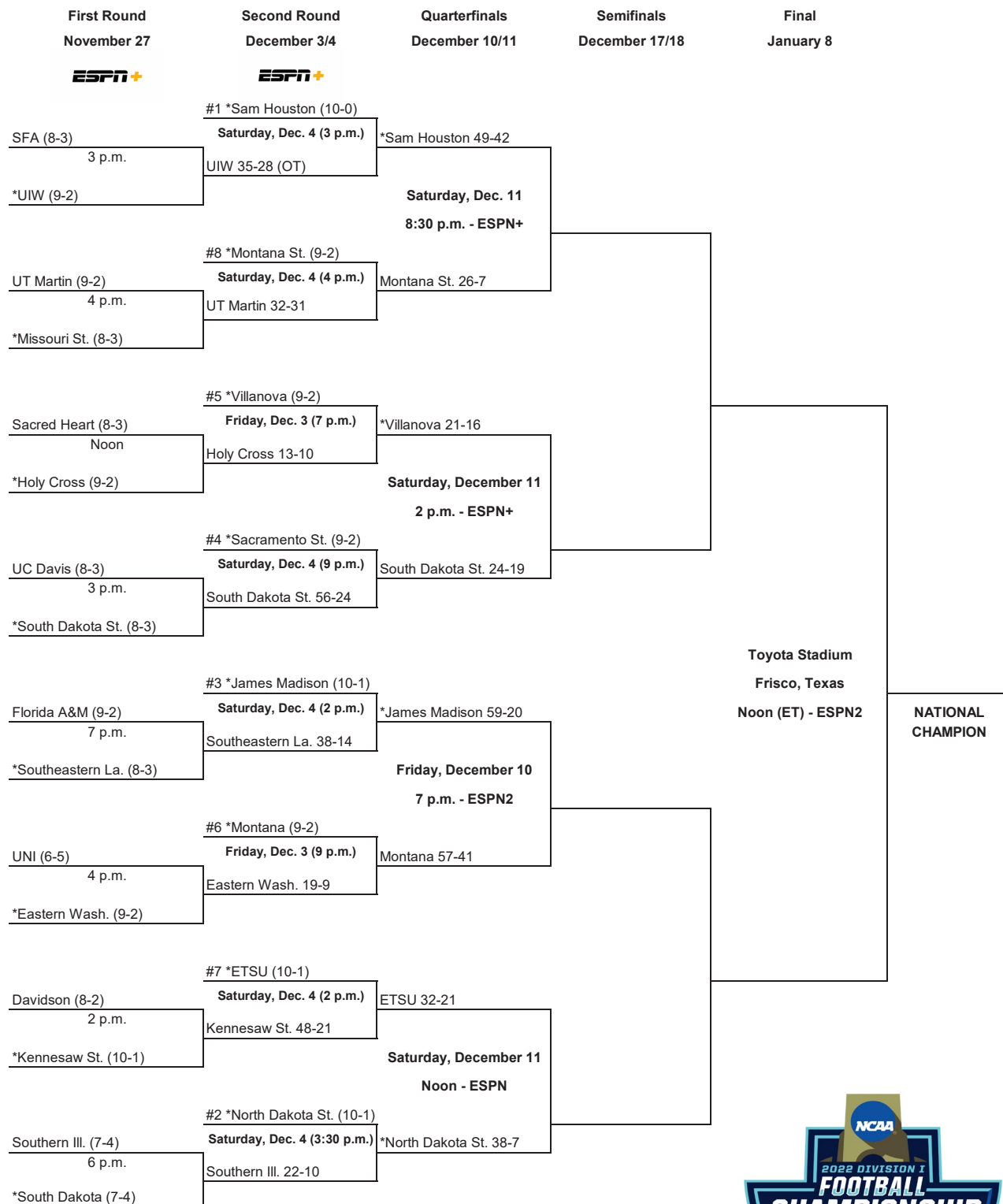
