QUICK HITS...

WELCOME TO THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF, JMU!

- James Madison finished the year as the fifth highest-ranked conference champion to earn the 12th and final spot in the College Football Playoff, as it heads to Eugene, Ore., to face fifth-seeded Oregon on Saturday, Dec. 20 in the opening round.
- Kickoff from Autzen Stadium is set for a 7:30 p.m. ET (4:30 p.m. PT) start, and the game will be nationally televised on TNT, truTV and HBO Max.
- This is JMU's inaugural appearance in the CFP in just its second year as an eligible FBS program.
- JMU's run through the 2025 postseason is presented by Door Gorilla.

FIRST-TIME MATCHUP FOR THE DUKES

vs

- Saturday's CFP opening-round matchup will be a first for JMU and Oregon.
- It will also be JMU's furthest west game in program history, as its showdown with the Ducks will be its first in the Pacific Time Zone
- JMU has only faced a Big Ten Conference team on one other occasion, as it fell at Maryland in the 2014 opener.

HISTORY MADE WITH CFP SELECTION

- JMU's inclusion in the College Football Playoff was a first for the Dukes but also marked additional milestones.
- . The Dukes are the first Sun Belt Conference team to ever make the CFP field.
- They are also the first team from Virginia to compete for a CFP national championship.
- JMU also punched its ticket to the CFP in just year four playing a Football Bowl Subdivision schedule and its second as a full-fledged FBS eligible program.

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS

- JMU won its 11th straight game on Dec. 5, using a pair of late touchdowns to pull away from Troy for a 31-14 victory to capture the 2025 Sun Belt Football Championship.
- It is JMU's first conference crown at the FBS level, the 11th in program history and its first since 2021 when JMU closed its chapter in the Football Championship Subdivision.
- The win moved JMU to the 12-win mark for the first time since that 2021 season.
- JMU is the second straight East Division team to win the Sun Belt title and the fourth to claim the trophy in the seven overall SBC championship games.
- Wayne Knight was named the championship's MVP after rushing for a career-high 212 yards and setting an SBC title game record with 234 all-purpose yards.
- Sahir West also set title records with career bests of 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks to lead the defense.

Head Coach Bob Chesney



Bob Chesney was hired as James Madison's ninth head coach in the history of the JMU football program on December 7, 2023, being awarded a five-year contract to lead the Dukes.

Now in his 16th season as a head collegiate coach, he's guided JMU to a 21-5 overall record while leading the Dukes to their first Sun Belt Football Championship and berth into the College Football Playoff in 2025.

Chesney has led JMU to a 12-1 overall record and went unbeaten in Sun Belt Conference play, at 8-0, which marked JMU's first 8-0 league mark since 2019. It's the most wins for JMU in a single season since reclassifying to the FBS.

Voted the 2025 Sun Belt Coach of the Year, he mentored Alonza Barnett III to Player of the Year, Trent Hendrick to Defensive Player of the Year and Sahir West to Freshman of the Year while the program took home a single-season record 20 all-conference honors.

Wayne Knight was a Second Team All-American while Sahir West garnered Freshman All-America laurels.

In his first year at the helm of JMU in 2024, he guided the program to a 9-4 overall record and to its first bowl championship, winning the 2024 Boca Raton Bowl with a 27-17 triumph against Western Kentucky.

He started the season with a 4-O record, becoming the program's first head coach to win their first four games in their inaugural year. Following the conclusion of the season, Chesney was voted Virginia Sports Information Directors University Division Coach of the Year.

He coached two players to All-America status in Terrence Spence and Eric O'Neill while 13 total players were selected to the 2024 All-Sun Belt Team. JMU's season was highlighted early



with a 70-50 win at North Carolina, which garnered the Dukes the National Team of the Week. It was the most points JMU has ever scored against an FBS opponent and set a Kenan Stadium record for points scored by an opponent in Chapel Hill.

Chesney has now led programs in the Football Bowl Subdivision, Football Championship Subdivision, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III. He's won eight conference championships with a career record of 132-51 (.721) entering the 2025-26 College Football Playoff.

Chesney joined James Madison after six seasons at Holy Cross (2018-23), guiding the Crusaders to unprecedented success with a program-record five consecutive Patriot League Championships since 2019 and an overall record of 44-21.

In 2022, he led Holy Cross to its third undefeated regular season and an FCS quarterfinal berth for the first time in nearly 40 years, finishing #6 in the final AFCA Coaches Poll. HC's stretch run from 2021-23 were the team's best three-year run since the 1989-91 seasons, going 29-8.

While at Holy Cross, Chesney recorded wins in back-to-back seasons against FBS opponents, defeating UConn, 38-28, in 2021 and Buffalo, 37-31, in 2022. During the 2023 campaign, the Crusaders dropped a pair of three-point contests to Boston College and Army West Point.

His 2023 squad featured a pair of Walter Payton Award finalists in quarterback Matthew Sluka and receiver Jalen Coker and a Buck Buchanan Award finalist in Jacob Dobbs. Dobbs additionally was a finalist for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, while Sluka was voted Patriot League Player of the Year.

Chesney is a three-time Patriot League Coach of the Year (2019, 2021, 2022) and twice was named the New England Football Writers Coach of the Year (2021, 2022). He was additionally honored as the AFCA FCS Region 1 Coach of the Year following Holy Cross' historic 2022 season.

Prior to Holy Cross, he was head coach at Division II Assumption College, going 44-16 from 2013-17. A two-time Northeast-10 Conference Coach of the Year, he led the Greyhounds to five straight winning seasons for a program that had posted just two winning records in the 17 years prior to his arrival. Chesney took Assumption to the NCAA Division II playoffs in each of his final three seasons, reaching the quarterfinal in 2017.

He began his head coaching career at Division III Salve Regina, posting a 23-9 record in three seasons at the helm from 2010-12. Chesney rebuilt a Salve Regina program with three consecutive winning seasons after it had gone through eight straight losing seasons. In 2011, he guided Salve Regina to the ECAC North-West Bowl, and in his final season in 2012, his team reached the New England Football Conference championship game.

Before becoming a head coach, Chesney had coaching stops as an assistant at Johns Hopkins (2005-09), King's College (2003-04) Delaware Valley College (2002) and Norwich University (2000-01).

A native of Kulpmont, Pa., Chesney was a four-year letterwinner as a defensive back at Dickinson College, where he earned his degree in 2000. He was a Second Team All-Centennial Conference selection in 1998 and 1997 and was the 1997 recipient of the team's Vincent Correal MVP Award.

Chesney and his wife Andrea have two daughters, Lyla and Hudson, and one son, Bo.



MORE ABOUT THE TITLE WIN

- JMU's defense pitched its sixth second-half shutout of the season and scored touchdowns just 54 seconds apart to fend off a feisty Troy bunch in the Sun Belt Football Championship.
- Leading 17-14, a 40-yard Wayne Knight run set up Alonza Barnett's 26-yard touchdown rush with 4:11 to play.
- On the ensuing drive, Sahir West had a strip sack, which was picked up by Drew Spinogatti for a 22-yard scoop-and-score.
- JMU's defense held Troy to -26 rushing yards, the fewest allowed by any team since JMU joined the FBS ranks.
- In addition to Wayne Knight's and Sahir West's SBC championship game records, JMU set team title marks in tackles for loss (14) and sacks (8).
- In the second half, Troy managed just 45 total yards, which included -17 in the run game.
- The 212-yard rushing performance by Knight was JMU's first over 200 since Marcus Marshall's 203 in the FCS semifinals vs. South Dakota State on Dec. 16, 2017.
- He also had the longest run in SBC title history, as his touchdown went for 73 yards.
- Additionally, his mark was the 10th-most rushing yards in JMU single-game history and secondmost in the postseason.

JMU'S CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

- JMU has now claimed 11 conference titles in its history, with nine as a member of the Colonial Athletic Association (formerly Atlantic 10) and its first back in 1975 as a Division III squad in the Virginia College Athletic Association.
- JMU won six CAA championships over its last seven FCS seasons, winning three straight between 2015 and 2017 and 2019 and 2021.
 The Dukes won their first CAA championship in 1999 and later added titles in its 2004 national championship season and in 2008.
- JMU's 11th as a program and first in the Sun Belt was the first won in a championship game format, as all previous titles were awarded based solely on regular-season finishes ahead of the FCS Playoffs.

11 STRAIGHT VICTORIES

- JMU enters the College Football Playoff with an 11-game win streak to set an FBS-era record for wins in a season (12).
- JMU's active win streak is the second most in the country, trailing only #1 Indiana (13).
- The win streak is the highest by any Group of Six program by five games.
- JMU is also on a five-game road win streak after dropping its initial road game in September. That's also tops in the G6 and tied for the fourthlongest by any team.
- By virtue of winning each game since Sept. 20, JMU is the only G6 program not to lose a game to another G6, going 11-0.
- Against G6 opponents since joining the Sun Belt in 2022, JMU has gone 34-8 (.810).
- The Dukes were one of just three teams to go unbeaten in conference play in 2025, as the Big Ten's Indiana and Ohio State also finished 9-0.

NUMBERS DURING THE WIN STREAK

- During its 11-game win streak, JMU is averaging victories by 23.4 points per game, scoring 38.7 per game while allowing 15.3 per outing.
- The Dukes have scored north of 50 points four times - all in Sun Belt play.
- Nine of 11 wins were by double digits and four were by at least 25 points.
- In the 11-game stretch, JMU is gaining 464.3 yards per game, as opposed to 255.2 to its foes.
- In the second half alone since Sept. 20, JMU has conceded just 34 points, equating to 3.1 points per second half.
- In the ground game, JMU has allowed just 73.9 rushing yards per game.
- Against the nine Sun Belt teams in the second half, the squads combined for just 143 rushing yards over the final 30 minutes.
- Marshall gained 141 in the second half, meaning the other eight teams combined for two yards.

WHAT AWAITS THE WINNER?

- The victor of the CFP opening-round game between JMU and Oregon will advance to the Capital One Orange Bowl to face fourth-seeded Texas Tech, winners of the Big 12 Conference.
- That game kicks off at noon on Jan. 1, 2026, from Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla.
- JMU has never faced Texas Tech, while Oregon owns a 3-0 series lead with the Red Raiders, having last faced them in 2023.

RANKINGS HEADING INTO CFP

- JMU was ranked #24 in the final College Football Playoff Selection Committee Rankings to finish as the fifth-ranked conference champion.
- This is up one spot from the #25 spot it held leading into championship weekend.
- Additionally, JMU stood strong at #19 in both the AP Top 25 and US LBM Coaches Poll.
- The rankings are a season best for JMU in all three, and the highest ever in both the CFP and Coaches Polls.
- JMU has an all-time high ranking of #18 in the AP Top 25 back in 2023.

STACKING WINS SINCE MOVE UP

- Since joining the FBS ranks in 2022, JMU has won 40 of 50 games (.800).
- That is tied for the ninth-most wins by any teams in the four seasons and second amongst G6 programs, trailing just Tulane (43).
- JMU's 80% win percentage as an FBS member is the fifth-highest in the country and tops the G6 by 1.8% (Tulane - 78.2%).
- It's also the most wins by any SBC team, as Troy has 35 since the start of the 2022 season, while Marshall has 30
- On the road, JMU is 17-6, which is tied for the third-most road wins in the country and sixth in road win percentage (.739).

BILLY NAPIER HIRED TO LEAD JMU

- Billy Napier returns to lead a program in the Sun Belt Conference in 2026, as JMU hired him as its 10th head coach in program history.
- Napier boasts a career record of 62-35 as a head coach and most recently led Florida out of the SEC from 2022-25.
- He also was head coach at Louisiana from 2018-21, where he went 40-12 with berths in the Sun Belt Football Championship each season.
- He's won three bowl games as a head coach, most recently in 2024 in the Gasparilla Bowl.

CHESNEY TO DEPART FOR UCLA

- Bob Chesney, who's led JMU to a 21-5 record in two seasons at the helm, will head west to become UCLA's head coach at the conclusion of JMU's season.
- With JMU making the CFP field, Chesney and his entire staff will coach JMU through its postseason run.
- Chesney was voted Sun Belt Coach of the Year after leading JMU to an 11-1 regular-season record and an unblemished 8-0 mark in conference play.

WAYNE KNIGHT - ALL-AMERICAN

- Running back Wayne Knight has cemented himself as an FBS All-American as an allpurpose player, making the Second Team from four organizations as of Monday.
- Knight has received All-America nods from the Associated Press, USA Today, Sports Illustrated and On3
- Entering the CFP, Knight is the Sun Belt's rushing leader (1,263) and ranks third nationally in allpurpose yards (147.0). He's also seventh in yards per carry (6.65), 17th in rushing average (97.2) and 26th in punt returns (9.47).
- Knight has four 100-yard games this season.

RUNNING THE TABLE IN THE SBC

- JMU's 59-10 victory at Coastal Carolina in the regular-season finale capped off an 8-0 Sun Belt season for the Dukes, as they became just the third team to go unbeaten in conference in the league's championship game era.
- It's the first time since 2021 that a team finished 8-0 in SBC play, as Louisiana went undefeated that season, while Coastal Carolina achieved the feat in 2020.
- JMU is also the seventh Sun Belt team to ever finish conference play with an 8-0 mark.
- This is the first time since 2019 that JMU finished undefeated in league games and the sixth time overall in the program's history.

THIRD TIME ATOP THE SBC EAST

- JMU captured its first Sun Belt Conference East Division championship with an unblemished 8-0 league record, punching its ticket to the Sun Belt Football Championship.
- Prior to 2025, JMU finished atop the Sun Belt East Division during both the 2022 (6-2) and 2023 (7-1) seasons, though were not able to be crowned division champions due to FCS to FBS reclassification rules.
- Had JMU been eligible, it would have gone to Troy for the 2022 championship and hosted the Trojans in 2023
- Now eligible, it was third time's the charm for JMU and Troy to meet up for the SBC crown.

DUKES AGAINST THE SUN BELT

- Following the Sun Belt Football Championship, JMU is 26-7 all-time against Sun Belt foes, which includes a 14-3 record at home and 12-4 away.
- On Oct. 11, Louisiana was JMU's 13th and final Sun Belt team for JMU to play since joining the league in 2022.
- With its Nov. 29 win at Coastal, JMU ran the table in SBC play for the first time as a member.
- Against the East, JMU is 18-6, which includes a 4-0 mark versus Coastal, Old Dominion and Georgia State.
- It's also split the four outings with App State Marshall and Georgia Southern.
- JMU holds an 8-1 record against Sun Belt West Division squads, as ULM is the only team to best JMU, taking a 21-19 win in Monroe last season.
- The Dukes have beaten all other west teams in Arkansas State (42-20), Louisiana (24-14), South Alabama (31-23), Southern Miss (32-15), Texas State (40-13 & 52-20) and Troy (16-14 & 31-14).
- Texas State became JMU's first west division team to play for the second time when it took the trip to San Marcos on Oct. 28.
- Troy was the second team in the west to play for a second time by virtue of the SBC title game.

HORNUNG AWARD RUNNER-UP

- Wayne Knight proved to be one of the most elusive, versatile backs in college football, as he was selected as a finalist for the Paul Hornung Award.
- Knight was the first JMU player ever to be a finalist for the award, which is given out annually to college football's most versatile player.
- In the award's closest vote ever, KC Concepcion of Texas A&M won the honor, as Knight was runnerup in the vote.
- · Other finalists included
- He's joined by Louisville's Caullin Lacy, Notre Dame's Jadarian Price, Texas Tech's J'Koby Williams and Washington's Jonah Coleman.

THE SIX OG'S

- Of JMU's seniors who are in their final collegiate season, only six will leave JMU having played for the Dukes for their entire careers.
- They include fifth-year seniors Brett Davis (OL), Brandon Fique (LB), Kye Holmes (S) and Josh Toner (OL) and true seniors Trent Hendrick (LB) and Jacob Thomas (S).
- Both Hendrick and Thomas were part of JMU's initial FBS signing class, beginning their careers in 2022, and have combined for 69 starts between the two of them.
- Both are also captains for their senior seasons.

CAREER WATCH FOR AB3

- Alonza Barnett III has emerged in career top 10's at JMU in his second season as the starter.
- This week, he's within reach of becoming the fifth quarterback at JMU to reach 50 touchdown passes while moving up as high as tie for third in passing touchdowns, sixth in both completions and pass attempts and seventh in pass yards.

SEASON RECORDS WATCH

- Wayne Knight is approaching a JMU singleseason record this weekend, as he currently sits 114 all-purpose yards shy of the JMU record.
- Knight currently ranks third with 1,911 all-purpose yards, which is 81 shy of Khalid Abdullah (1992 in 2016) for second place.
- Leading the way is Curtis Keaton, who tallied 2,024 all-purpose yards in 1999.
- Knight is also at 1,263 rushing yards, which is the seventh most in JMU single-season history.
- He's only 11 yards away from sixth, 22 from fifth and 42 from fourth on the JMU season list.
- Alonza Barnett is at 14 rushing touchdowns this season and is one shy of becoming the fifth JMU player ever to rush for 15 scores in a season. He's also two away from tying Rodney Landers for the QB rushing TD mark, of 16, which he set back in 2007.

JMU'S SUCCESS AT HOME

- Since 2016, visitors have not seen much success against the Dukes inside Bridgeforth Stadium.
- Over the last decade, JMU has turned in a 65-5 record (.929) at home, which has included five unbeaten regular seasons in Harrisonburg.
- That also includes winning all 31 non-conference home games, 11 of which occurred in the FCS playoffs between 2016 and 2021.
- Since joining the FBS, JMU is 22-3 (.880) at home, as Marshall (2022, 2024) and App State (2023) are the only squads to walk out with a win against JMU on its home field.
- JMU has produced a pair of 19-game home win streaks this decade (2016-18 and 2018-21).
- During its FCS powerhouse days, JMU went 9-0 at home twice, holding homefield advantage to the FCS title game in both 2017 and 2019.
- Since the 2016 national title campaign, JMU has never finished worse than 5-1 at home.
- The last non-conference opponent to defeat JMU in Harrisonburg was Colgate on Dec. 5, 2015, in the second round of the FCS Playoffs.

JMU NATION GOES 6-FOR-6

- James Madison sold out the regular season, going six-for-six at Bridgeforth Stadium for the first time since the venue's expansion in 2011.
- It was the 16th sellout over the past 18 home games, having sold out five of six during the 2023 and 2024 campaigns.
- JMU hosted a season-high 25,298 fans in its 48-point win over App State.
- The Dukes have also hosted 25,232 for Homecoming versus ODU, while bringing in 25,156 in the finale with Wazzu, 25,128 against Louisiana, 25,029 for Family Weekend with Georgia Southern and 24,965 in the opener against Weber State.
- The season opener was also a season-best attendance for JMU since moving up to the FBS.
- JMU is averaging 25,135 spectators per game, which is up slightly from its 2024 average.

BRIDGEFORTH TOP ATTENDANCES

- In 2023, JMU set a single-season attendance record with 152,234 fans watching the Dukes at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- That was an average of 25,372 spectators per game, which is 102% of the stadium's capacity.
- The 2024 season brought in 150,427 fans for an average of 25,071.

KINGS OF THE COMMONWEALTH

- JMU earned a pair of in-state wins this season, beating both Liberty on Sept. 20 and Old Dominion on Oct. 18.
- With the victories, JMU has now won 21 straight against Commonwealth foes.
- The triumph at Liberty also marked the 100th alltime victory versus a state opponent since the start of the program in 1972.
- JMU is now 101-61 (.623) against Virginia squads.
- Since joining the Sun Belt, JMU has won all four matchups with Old Dominion and is now 7-0 over Virginia teams since moving up to FBS, adding in a 2023 win at Virginia and a 2022 home victory versus Norfolk State.
- William & Mary was the last state team to beat JMU in a 44-41 decision on Oct. 31, 2015, in Williamsburg.

SCARY DEFENSE IN OCTOBER

- James Madison's defense was unstoppable in the second half during the month of October, holding all four opponents without a single point over the final 30 minutes each game.
- JMU outscored its Sun Belt opponents 90-0 in the second half, rallying in two, while earning 30+ point wins in the other two.
- JMU out-gained its October foes in the second half by an 862-228 margin, averaging 57 yards of total defense in those latter halves.
- Those teams also combined for just 46 secondhalf rushing yards (11.5 per game).





MCMURTRIE'S 50TH START

- At Texas State, Pat McMurtrie played and started in his 50th career game at right tackle.
- · He celebrated postgame by leading the post-win fight song in the locker room.
- · An Outland Trophy Watch List and 2024 First Team All-Sun Belt honoree, McMurtrie has started all 26 games since joining JMU prior to the 2024 season and 55 total for his career.
- · While at Holy Cross with Bob Chesney, he started all 29 games between the 2020 and 2023 seasons, which included a 2023 campaign that saw him earn Second Team All-Patriot League.

FIRST SEVEN TEAMS HELD UNDER 300

- JMU became the final FBS team to allow 300 yards in a game this year, as Texas State managed 352.
- · The Dukes created history though, as it is the only Sun Belt team in conference history to hold opponent under 300 vards in seven consecutive
- . JMU was also the first Sun Belt squad to ever do so in six straight games.
- Now at 7-1, JMU was additionally the league's first bowl eligible team and the first SBC team to start 5-1 or better in four straight seasons.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT ON ODU

- JMU's offense scored 42 unanswered in the ODU win to earn its largest win in the series.
- JMU gained a season-best 624 yards, tying the record for most yards ever allowed by ODU.
- The 63 points were also JMU's most ever against a Sun Belt opponent and tied for second most versus an FBS opponent.
- · The Dukes scored TDs on nine of 13 drives, as it accrued more than 300 passing and 300 rushing for the first time ever against an FBS foe.
- ODU, on the other hand, scored offensive touchdowns on three of their first four drives, but late in the first half, a three-and-out forced by JMU's defense began a string of eight straight scoreless drives
- · Counting the final drive of the first half, JMU's defense gave up just eight total yards while producing five three-and-outs, a four-and-out and two intercentions the rest of the way

JMU IN LEAGUE OPENERS

- · On Sept. 27, JMU played in its 33rd conference opener since it joined a league back in 1993.
- · With the win over Georgia Southern, JMU is now 24-9 in league openers.
- This comes after a setback in the conference opener last year at ULM, which snapped a nine-game conference-opening win streak that spanned the 2015 and 2023 seasons between the Colonial Athletic Association and the Sun
- Before 2025, JMU opened conference play on the road in five of the last six seasons, as Saturday's matchup is JMU's first home conference opener since 2021, which was its final year before making the FBS jump.
- . Since joining the Sun Belt, JMU is 3-1 in league openers, adding in wins at App State (32-28) and Troy (16-14) and a loss at ULM (19-21). In its first SBC game in 2022, JMU trailed 28-3 before storming back for the win.
- JMU conference openers by league: 3-1 in Sun Belt (1-0 home, 2-1 road); 21-8 in CAA (11-3 home, 10-5 road).

MOVING TO 3-0 AGAINST CUSA

- With its Sept. 20 win at Liberty, JMU is now 3-0 all-time against the Conference USA.
- · JMU first matched up with the conference in its first game as a member of the FBS when it hosted and rolled to a 44-7 victory at home against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 23, 2022.
- Last year, JMU capped off the 2024 campaign with a 27-17 win against WKU in the Boca Raton Bowl on Dec. 18, 2024.
- JMU has outscored CUSA opponents by a wide margin, at 102 to 37.

10 SCHEDULED GAMES FOR JMU-LU

- Earlier in September, JMU and LU announced the formation of the Battle of the Blue Bidge.
- · The teams had previously signed contracts for six games, but the start of the football rivalry also came with the addition of four more game dates, reaching as far as 2040.
- The game on Sept. 15, 2040, in Lynchburg is the furthest signed contract for any game in all of college football.
- · Liberty makes a trip to JMU next September before the rivalry takes a five-year hiatus.
- · Beginning in 2031, the teams begin a stretch of eight games over a 10-season span, with consecutive matchups from 2031 to 2034 and 2037 through 2040.

JMU STRONG AFTER OPEN WEEKS

- Since the 2014 season, JMU has turned in solid results coming off an open week, posting a 12-1 record after not having played the week prior.
- · Over its last four games coming off a bye, JMU has won each by at least three scores.
- In addition to the 31-13 victory at Liberty last on Sept. 20, JMU handled North Carolina (70-50) and Georgia State (38-7) in 2024 and Georgia Southern (41-13) in 2023.
- In JMU's first FBS season, an early open weekend gave way to its thrilling 32-28 comeback win at App State in 2022, which was JMU's first Sun Belt game ever.
- · While a member of the FCS and Colonial Athletic Association, JMU was a perfect 7-0 following a bye week between 2014 and 2021 (excluding the 2020 spring CoVID season).
- That stretch included an 84-7 Homecoming win against Rhode Island in 2016, which to date is JMU's largest scoring game and largest margin of victory in the history of the program.

SIX STRAIGHT WINS IN OPENERS

- · With its 45-10 win over Weber State, JMU has now won six straight season openers.
- · The Dukes have won the six by an average margin of 46.2 to 6.2, as no team has scored more than 10 points during the span.
- · Dating back to the 1972 inaugural season, JMU is now 31-22-1 in season openers.
- The win also moved JMU to 43-11 in home openers, having won 23 in a row since 2003.
- JMU has produced north of 40 points in 17 of those 23 home-opening triumphs.

2024 FBS STATISTICAL CHAMPIONS

- Playing in its first season as a full-fledged FBS member in 2024, JMU captured a pair of statistical title from the NCAA members.
- JMU finished atop the Football Bowl Subdivision in both turnover margin and fewest interceptions thrown
- The Dukes finished 2024 with a +1.54 turnover margin, producing 20 more takeaways than turnovers. JMU ranked third nationally with 29 takeaways, intercepting 17 passes (7th in FBS) and recovering 12 fumbles (6th in FBS).
- The Dukes were also third in the subdivision with just nine turnovers, two off the nation's leader, Vanderbilt.
- Offensively, JMU finished in a four-way tie for fewest interceptions thrown, with just four.
- The Dukes were matched by Marshall, Army West Point and Vanderbilt.
- However, JMU finished alone in first in fewest interceptions per pass attempts, at one in every 95.5 passes, as opposed to Marshall's one per 83.25 tries.

BEST RECORD IN A TRANSITION

- JMU completed its reclassification from FCS to FBS with the best record in history.
- Over two seasons, JMU put together a 19-5 overall record while playing full FBS schedules.
- That also included finishing atop the Sun Belt Conference East Division in each of those seasons, going a combined 13-3 in conference bouts.
- In 2023, JMU went 11-1 during the regular season and 7-1 in Sun Belt play, finishing with an 11-2 mark after facing Air Force in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.
- It was JMU's first Bowl Season berth, and despite going through reclassification and due to a lack of bowl-eligible teams, both JMU and Jacksonville State, both in year two of FCS to FBS earned bids
- Prior to last season, no team had ever won more than its first five games during a transition up to the FBS level, though JMU was one of those teams in 2022.
- The Dukes won 10 games over FBS opponents in 2023, which is a record for any year-two transitioning team.
- Georgia Southern previously beat eight FBS foes during the 2014 season.
- In 2022, JMU started 5-0 and became the inaugural first-year transition team to earn an AP Top 25 ranking.
- The Dukes were ranked in the AP Top 25 for seven straight polls entering the 2023 postseason and in the US LBM Coaches Poll for six of seven.

Incoming Head Coach Billy Napier



Billy Napier was hired as James Madison's 10th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2025, and he will assume the lead role following the conclusion of JMU's run in the College Football Playoff.

Napier boasts a 62-35 career record as a head coach and most recently led Florida of the Southeastern Conference for the last four years, highlighted by an 8-5 record in 2024 and a win in the Gasparilla Bowl over Tulane.

That team won its last four games, including back-to-back top-25 triumphs over No. 22 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss, followed by topping Florida State on the road and the bowl win over Tulane. Other ranked wins included 2025 over No. 9 Texas, 2023 over No. 11 Tennessee and 2022 in his Florida debut over No. 7 Utah.

Prior to Florida, Napier authored a dominant run at Louisiana, going 40-12 in four seasons from 2018-2021 with four appearances in the Sun Belt Conference Championship game as West Division Champions and two league titles in his last two seasons in 2020 and 2021.

In his first season as a college head coach in 2018, the Ragin' Cajuns went 7-7 overall but won the Sun Belt West at 5-3 with a tie for first. But Louisiana improved in each of Napier's seasons, including 11-3 (7-1 SBC) in 2019, 10-1 (7-1 SBC) and a league title in 2020 and 12-1 (8-0) and a title in 2021.

The 2019 and 2020 squads won appearances over Miami (Ohio) in the LendingTree Bowl and over UTSA in the First Responder Bowl, respectively. The 2021 team went on to defeat Marshall in the New Orleans Bowl following Napier's departure for Florida. The Ragin' Cajuns were ranked as high as 15th in the AP Poll in 2020 and 16th in 2021.



Widely touted for his recruiting and player development, each of Napier's recruiting classes at Florida were ranked top 20 in the nation. Meanwhile, he had 14 NFL Draft selections in three years of drafts at Florida and another seven picks in four years at Louisiana. Most recently, seven Gators were taken in the 2025 NFL Draft. In 2024, wide receiver Ricky Pearsall was a first round pick by the 49ers, which followed a first-round selection of quarterback Anthony Richardson in 2023. He coached an additional 20 NFL Draft picks as an offensive position coach across four FBS assistant jobs. That group featured five first-round selections, consisting of four wide receivers and a running back.





Incoming Head Coach Billy Napier





Fifteen years of experience as an assistant coach helped prepare Napier for his head coaching roles, with 14 coming at the FBS level and all 15 on the offensive side.

He spent two years as a GA at Clemson before then returning to Tommy Bowden's staff in roles as tight ends and recruiting coordinator coach, then quarterbacks and offensive coordinator when Dabo Swinney took the helm.

In 2011, Napier joined Nick Saban's staff at Alabama as an offensive analyst, then followed Jim McElwain from Alabama to Colorado State to serve a season as assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach.

He returned to Alabama as wide receiver coach for four seasons (2013-2016) and then spent one year as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona State in 2017 prior to earning the Louisiana job.

Napier was a four-year contributor at Furman (FCS/then I-AA) and was a two-time All-Conference quarterback in the Southern Conference.

He led the Paladins to two conference championships and, in 2001, led Furman to a national runner-up finish in I-AA.

He set a Furman career record by completing 64.8% of his passes. As the team captain during a record-setting senior season, Napier compiled a Furman-record 2,475 passing yards and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award as the nation's most outstanding offensive player.

Napier grew up in Chatsworth, Georgia, and graduated from Murray County High School in 1998. He is married to the former Ali Gunn, and the couple has a daughter, Annie, and sons, Sammy and Charlie. He earned his bachelor's degree in health & exercise science from Furman in 2002.

Strong Rushing Attack Leads JMU Past Weber in Season Opener

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Running backs George Pettaway and Wayne Knight combined for 188 of James Madison's 313 rushing yards, as the Dukes opened the season with a 45-10 rout of Weber State on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes (1-0) won their season opener for the sixth consecutive season while also improving to 4-0 all-time against the Wildcats (0-1).

The 313 team rushing yards were the most by JMU since moving up to the Football Bowl Subdivision in 2022 and its first 300-yard game since Sept. 4, 2021. JMU out-gained Weber by a 458-148 margin, as the visitors didn't cross 100 total yards until early in the fourth quarter.

Pettaway rushed for 99 yards on 10 carries, while Knight had a career-high 89 yards on seven attempts, highlighted by his career-long 59-yard touchdown run.

Three quarterbacks recorded touchdowns, including two apiece from Alonza Barnett III and Matthew Sluka. Barnett, making his return from a season-ending injury last November, threw for 130 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 30 more and a score. Sluka had 45 total yards, finding the end zone both on the ground and through the air. JC Evans also scored once on his lone rush to cap off the scoring.

Eight Dukes caught a pass, led by freshman receiver Michael Scott, who made four receptions for 38 yards. Isaiah Alston caught three passes for 31 yards and a touchdown, while Landon Ellis caught the team's other score after making a pair of grabs.

JMU's defense forced three turnovers, all on interceptions by safeties, while the special teams unit blocked a punt, resulting in a touchdown a few plays later. Linebacker Trent Hendrick led the way with seven and a tackle for loss, while Mychal McMullin made a career-high five tackles with a TFL. Safeties Tyler Brown and Kye Holmes each made four stops with their first career interceptions. Brown also broke up a pair of passes, while Jacob Thomas recorded his fourth-career interception.

For Weber, Jackson Gilkey was 10-for-24 for 84 passing yards with a touchdown and three interceptions. Zach Hrbacek ran for a team-high 39 yards on 12 carries. Noah Kjar caught Weber's lone touchdown on a 14-yard reception.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- · JMU opened the scoring with 28 straight points, with both Barnett and Sluka providing two touchdowns each.
- · Barnett made his return in style, taking his first drive 78 yards, capping it off with an 11-yard touchdown run, the ninth of his career.
- On his next drive, Barnett found Alston on a 20-yard touchdown pass to give JMU a 14-0 lead after one.
- Midway through the second, JMU drove down to the one, where Sluka walked in for his 40th career touchdown run.
- · After a Chase Regan blocked punt, Sluka connected with Ellis on a 14-yard touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone.
- Weber scored after a takeaway late in the first half to make it 28-7 at the break.
- · Teams traded field goals, making it 31-10 midway through the third.
- · Knight electrified the crowd to start the fourth, rushing down the far sideline 59 yards to the house for the longest touchdown of his career.
- · In the closing minutes, Evans closed the scoring with a five-yard touchdown for his second career rushing score.

- JMU out-rushed Weber by a 313 to 64, as the Dukes averaged 7.1 per carry.
- On third down, JMU converted 7-of-13 (54%) while the Wildcats to 3-of-14 (21%).

- This is the second straight game that JMU has had multiple quarterbacks score a touchdown in the same game. Billy Atkins threw for one, while Evans had one rushing and one passing touchdown in the Boca Raton Bowl.

Late Touchdowns Down Dukes at Louisville

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Louisville scored three unanswered touchdowns in the second half to hold off James Madison, 28-14, in a defensive slugfest on Friday night in front of 48,717 at L&N Stadium.

With the game tied at 14-14 entering the fourth quarter, Louisville (2-0) had a game-changing play with a strip sack in the end zone that was recovered by the Cardinals to give the hosts a 20-14 lead with 13 minutes remaining.

Following the Dukes' (1-1) touchdown to take a 14-6 lead, JMU punted three times, committed two turnovers and ended the game at Louisville's one-yard line.

JMU ran its most diverse offensive set in recent years, featuring quarterbacks Alonza Barnett III and Matthew Sluka. Barnett finished 15-of-25 for 102 yards and a touchdown, while Sluka rushed for 83 yards and his second score on the ground of the season.

George Pettaway, Jordan Fuller and Wayne Knight also split a combined 17 carries, accruing 64 rushing yards, led by Fuller's 31 yards.

Defensively, Gannon Weathersby had a career-high seven tackles with a sack, while Jacob Thomas made six stops with a strip sack and two breakups. Louisville's defense tallied six team sacks, as T.J. Quinn paced the UL defense with 11 tackles, one sack and one tackle for loss. Meanwhile, Clev Lubin totaled 10 stops to go along with 1.5 sacks and a 1.5 TFL.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU opened the scoring with four minutes left in the first, taking advantage of a fourth-down stop. Needing just 39 yards, JMU took a 7-0 lead, as Barnett found Lacota Dippre for his first career catch and score on a three-vard pass.
- The Cardinals threatened to tie it in the second, but a third-down breakup in the end zone by Jacob Thomas forced UL to settle for a Cooper Ranvier 22-yard field goal, making it 7-3 with 5:21 to go before halftime.
- · After a short punt, the Cardinals trimmed the JMU lead to 7-6 at the break on a Ranvier 38-yard field goal.
- Teams combined for 163 total yards of offense in the first half and 15 first downs, as JMU's defense recovered a fumble on a strip sack and made a fourth-down stop, while the UL defense also held once on fourth down.

Big Second Half Propels JMU Past Liberty in Inaugural Battle of the Blue Ridge

LYNCHBURG, Va. – Down 13-10 midway through the third quarter, James Madison scored 21 unanswered points to come away with a 31-13 victory at Liberty in the inaugural Battle of the Blue Ridge matchup on Saturday afternoon at Williams Stadium.

JMU (2-1) outscored Liberty (1-3) by a 21-3 margin the second half, holding Liberty to only 92 yards over the final 30 minutes, and outgaining the Flames 440-233 in total. The Dukes rushed for 231 yards, led by Wayne Knight's 89 yards and his second touchdown of the year. Ayo Adeyi added 87 yards on 13 carries.

Alonza Barnett III accounted for three touchdowns, grabbing one through the air and a pair on the ground. He finished 17-of-25 for 213 passing yards while adding 45 yards in the run game to tally 258 total yards.

Jaylan Sanchez had his most efficient outing at JMU, as he caught a season-high four passes for 51 receiving yards. Landon Ellis caught his second touchdown of the season, finishing with three grabs for 40 yards.

For Liberty, Ethan Vasko, who was limited to just the first half due to injury, threw for 37 yards on 4-of-10 passing while adding 52 rushing yards and a score. Evan Dickens led the Flames with 67 rushing yards. Michael Merdinger took over signal-call duties in the second half, finishing 2-of-6 for 21 passing yards and 18 rushing yards.

Defensively, JMU limited Liberty to just 3.7 per play and produced three sacks, led by Aiden Gobaira, who registered the first two sacks of his career. Trent Hendrick had a team-high six tackles, while Xavier Holmes and Jacob Thomas each had five stops. Elijah Culp added four tackles and two pass breakups.

The victory marked JMU's 21st straight against an in-state opponent and the 100th all-time, dating back to 1972.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- Teams traded field goals on their respective opening drives, as Morgan Suarez knocked down a 39-yard field goal, while Jay Billingsley answered with a 47-yarder to knot the game at 3-3 with just under five minutes to play in the first.
- JMU out-gained Liberty 120-46 in the opening frame, but its second drive was thwarted in the red zone on the final play of the first on a Liberty interception in the end zone.
- · Liberty took its first lead with 5:34 to play in the half, as Vasko converted a fourth down to get in the red zone and scored two plays later from two yards out to give the hosts a 10-3 lead.
- JMU answered back in the closing minutes of the half, as Barnett guided the Dukes on a 77-yard drive, capped off by a 21-yard touchdown strike to Ellis for his second receiving score of the year. That tied the game at 10 apiece heading into the half.
- JMU held a 213-141 lead in total offense in the first half, including a 110-37 margin in the pass game.
- · Liberty opened the second half with nearly a seven-minute drive, aided by JMU penalties, and regained the lead at 13-10 on a 35-yard field goal from Billingsley.

Record-Setting Ground Performance Lifts JMU Past Georgia Southern

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison set its rushing record against an FBS opponent, piling up 331 yards on the ground to cruise past Georgia Southern, 35-10, in front of a sold-out Family Weekend crowd Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes (3-1, 1-0 Sun Belt) turned in their second 300-yard rushing game of the year, joining the 313 they tallied in the season opener versus Weber State. The ground attack allowed JMU to surge to a 21-3 halftime lead and it never led by fewer than 25 down the stretch to earn its third all-time win against the Eagles (2-3, 0-1 Sun Belt).

Wayne Knight ran for a career-high 151 yards and a touchdown, averaging 7.9 per carry. Jordan Fuller also turned in his eighth career 100-yard game, as he rushed for 137 yards and a score. As a team, JMU produced 6.2 yards per rush and out-gained GS by a 479-192 margin in total offense.

Alonza Barnett III threw 148 yards and a touchdown while rushing for 32 more and a score on the ground. It's the third time in four starts he's found the end zone both through the air and on the ground this season.

Knight was also JMU's leading pass catcher, making four grabs for 35 yards, as he finished with a career-best 199 all-purpose yards. Lacota Dippre also caught a pair of passes for 42 yards and his second touchdown, while Nick DeGennaro and Landon Ellis each contributed two receptions.

Defensively, JMU shut down Georgia Southern's offense for the most part, limiting the Eagles to 3.8 yards per play and only 27 rushing yards (1.0 per carry), due in large to JMU's seven sacks.

Trent Hendrick led the way with a career-high three sacks while matching his career best with 11 total tackles (eight solo). He also forced a fumble and broke up a pass. Tyler Brown accrued a career-high six tackles, while Gannon Weathersby and Amar Thomas each had four stops with a TFL, including a Thomas sack. Immanuel Bush and Sahir West also produced 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

The 10 team TFL and seven sacks were both season highs for JMU.

For Georgia Southern, JC French IV finished 14-of-24 for 165 yards and a touchdown, while David Mbadinga produced 14 of the Eagles' 27 rushing yards. Wide receiver Camden Brown registered his second straight 100-yard game with 111 receiving yards on five catches.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- · Knight opened the scoring midway through the first, bouncing off a wall of defenders and hitting a seam outside for a 40-yard touchdown to put JMU up 7-0.
- · JMU nearly doubled its lead, but a holding penalty negated the score. A missed JMU field goal kept the score at 7-0 heading into the second.
- On the ensuing JMU possession, JMU rushed for 44 of the 57 yards needed, as Barnett kept it and ran it in from four yards out for his 12th career rushing touchdown and a 14-0 JMU lead.
- · A fourth-down conversion and 30-yard completion set up GS's first score, as Tripp Bryant knocked down a 26-yard field goal to make it 14-3 with 4:15 remaining in the half.
- · JMU immediately responded with its first kickoff return for a score this year, as Curtis Harris-Lopez took it 88 yards to the house to extend the lead to 21-3 heading into halftime.
- · The Dukes opened the second half with their first passing score, as Barnett converted a third-and-long to Dippre from 17 yards out to move the lead to 28-3.
- Fuller found the end zone for the first time at JMU and for the 47th time in his illustrious career, going 26 yards down the JMU sideline for the score. Georgia Southern came back with its first touchdown drive, as French threw a 12-yard strike to make it 35-10 heading into the fourth and cap the scoring.

- Saturday's rushing performance marked the first time since April 24, 2021, that JMU had a pair of 100-yard rushers. The duo of Jawon Hamilton (171) and Percy Agyei-Obese (110) each crossed 100 against VMI in the first round of the 2020 FCS Playoffs.
- · After registering just six sacks over its first three games, JMU produced seven sacks on the day, including the first career sacks for both Immanuel Ezeogu and West.
- The kickoff return for a touchdown was the second of Harris-Lopez's career and his first at JMU. It was also the 20th kickoff return for a score in the program's history.
- · Twenty-seven rushing yards are the fewest by Georgia Southern since being held to 12 by the Dukes on Oct. 15, 2022.
- The game featured no turnovers for either team.
- JMU dominated time of possession by a margin of 35:50 to 24:10.
- JMU didn't allow a sack for the second-straight week.
- JMU was 8-for-13 (.615) on third down while limiting GS to just 4-for-14 (.286).
- The Dukes scored touchdowns on both of their red-zone trips, while the Eagles were stopped once in the red zone on fourth down, finishing 2-for-3

JMU Holds Off Georgia State With Second-Half Effort

ATLANTA - The James Madison defense posted a shutout over the final three quarters while the offense broke through with a pair of rushing touchdowns in the second half for a 14-7 victory over Georgia State on Saturday afternoon at Center Parc Stadium.

The Dukes were held scoreless in the first half but responded in the second with 14 unanswered points, with Wayne Knight punching in the go-ahead touchdown with 9:50 remaining in the contest. After being out-gained 164-145 in the first two quarters, JMU flipped the script in the second half, holding a 140-85 yards advantage in the second half.

The JMU (4-1, 2-0 Sun Belt) defense was especially stingy in the final two quarters, holding the Panthers (1-4, 0-1 Sun Belt) to -1 yards on the ground and producing two sacks.

JMU improved to 5-0 in the all-time series versus GSU and has limited the Panthers to seven points in each of the last two meetings.

Jordan Fuller led the Dukes with 94 rushing yards on 18 carries, while Wayne Knight ran for 85 yards and a touchdown while returning four punts for 50 yards. Adding in 10 receiving yards on three catches, Knight finished the day with 145 all-purpose yards.

Alonza Barnett finished 11-of-22 for 74 passing yards while rushing for a score.

Lacota Dippre had a career day on offense, making a career-high three catches for 19 receiving yards while also rushing for 31 yards on a pair of fake punts, finishing with 50 total yards.

Gannon Weathersby made a career-high nine stops, while Trent Hendrick and Jordan Thomas each came away with eight tackles. Aiden Gobaira notched 1.5 tackles for loss, notching his third consecutive game with a TFL. Xavier Holmes recorded his first sack of the season, a 12-yard loss to push the Panthers back on their side of the 50.

For GSU, Finley connected on 19-of-28 passes and connected with Camden Overton-Howard for a 19-yard touchdown in the first quarter for the Panthers' only score of the game. Overton-Howard finished with a game-best seven catches for 65 yards, while Ted Hurst accrued 60 yards on three grabs.

Javon Robinson paced Georgia State's defense with 11 tackles and a break-up. Jaylen Jones made nine stops, while Bishop Thomas recorded the Panthers' lone sack of the afternoon.,

HOW IT HAPPENED

- GSU struck first, taking advantage of multiple down-field penalties to set up a 19-yard pass from Finley to Camden Overton-Howard for the game's opening score with just over four minutes remaining in the first.
- · GSU out-gained JMU 104-47 in the opening period.
- · Lacota Dippre converted first downs for JMU off back-to-back fake punts, gaining eight and 23 yards, respectively, on his direct snaps. The Dukes drove into the red zone but were stopped on fourth down to keep the score 7-0 for GSU.
- JMU was shut out in the first half for the first time since the opening half at Georgia Southern on Oct. 19, 2024, as GSU took a 7-0 lead into the break.
- After a Xavier Holmes sack to open the second half, JMU quickly raced down the field, as Knight's 22-yard run down to the one set up Barnett's fifth rushing score of the year. That made it a 7-7 ballgame with 6:50 to play in the quarter, as the score would remain unchanged heading into the fourth.
- Following another sack and stop, JMU was driving to take the lead, but a third-down sack gave the ball back to GSU with 12:30 to play.
- · GSU nearly had a long pass, but a drop forced another punt for the hosts, and Knight returned the ensuing punt 22 yards to the Panther 28, JMU's best starting field position of the game.
- Fuller moved JMU inside the 10 and Knight finished off the four-play drive with a nine-yard touchdown, giving JMU its first lead of the day, at 14-7, with 9:50 to play. That was Knight's fourth rushing score of the year.
- Trailing 14-7 with 3:59 remaining, Georgia State had an opportunity to respond as it started its final drive at the Panthers' 19-yard line. After picking up a first down, GSU committed three false starts, ultimately resulting in a fourth-and-18 that it was unable to convert, giving the ball to the Dukes with 1:49 to go.
- JMU managed to get one final first down thanks to the Panthers jumping offsides on fourth down, allowing the Dukes to run the clock out for the win.

- JMU held a 285-249 advantage in total yards, including a lopsided 211-37 effort on the ground.
- The Dukes went 4-for-14 (.286) on third downs compared to GSU's 7-for-15 (.467) mark.
- Alonza Barnett III moved into the JMU career top 10 for completions, as he now sits 10th with 285 completions. He passed both Jordan McCloud (2023) and Justin Thorpe (2008-12), who both tallied 281 while at JMU.
- · With his third-quarter PAT, Morgan Suarez moved to 100/100 on career extra points.
- JMU moved to 5-0 all-time against Georgia State and 2-0 in Atlanta.

Ellis Scores Three Times, Defense Posts Another Second-Half Shutout to Beat Cajuns

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Landon Ellis scored a career-high three touchdowns, and James Madison used another second-half defensive shutout to down Louisiana, 24-14, on Saturday afternoon at Bridgeforth Stadium.

Trailing 14-7 at halftime, the Dukes (5-1, 3-0 Sun Belt) scored 17 unanswered points, outgaining the Ragin' Cajuns (2-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) 227-59 over the final two quarters. Tied at 14 entering the fourth, JMU took advantage of a short field, needing just 25 yards to take its first lead, at 21-14, with 12:33 to play.

JMU's defense held Louisiana to eight three-and-outs, including three down the stretch, allowing the Dukes to extend the lead to 24-14 on a Morgan Suarez 24-yard field goal with three minutes to play. Louisiana nearly cut it back to a single score, but a Jacob Thomas toe-tapper interception on a tipped pass with 1:41 to play sealed the victory.

With the win, JMU becomes the first Sun Belt Conference team to start 5-1 in four consecutive seasons, and first in league history to hold teams to under 300 yards in six straight games.

Alonza Barnett III recorded season highs in passing yards (290) and touchdowns (3), going 26-for-40 through the air while adding 28 yards on the ground. Ellis' 120 yards on six catches were the most receiving yards by a Duke this season, while his three receiving scores were the most for a JMU player since the 2023 regular-season finale. Braeden Wisloski also had a career day, making seven catches for 69 receiving yards.

Wayne Knight surpassed the century mark for the second time this is season, rushing for 111 yards on 20 carries (5.6 avg). He also caught five passes or 23 yards and added 39 punt return yards to account for 173 all-purpose yards. JMU ran for 187 as a team, averaging 4.6 per rush, as Jordan Fuller added 50 yards on the ground.

Louisiana took a 14-7 lead due in large to 218 yards and a pair of long touchdown drives in the second quarter. After the break, JMU's defense shut down the Cajuns, allowing just 59 total yards with a clean sheet on the scoreboard, as the Dukes held Louisiana to just 288 yards of total offense.

Elijah Culp and Tyler Brown each led the JMU defense with career highs of eight tackles apiece, while Brown added a half tackle for loss, which aided in goal-line standing UL's offense at the end of the second quarter. Sahir West also had a career-best six tackles with 1.5 TFL and a sack, and both Jacob Thomas and Trent Hendrick added five stops, as Thomas' interception late was the fifth of his career.

For Louisiana, Lunch Winfield was 14-of-28 for 243 passing yards and two touchdowns with an interception. He also led the Cajuns with 23 rushing yards on 15 carries. Bill Davis had just 21 yards on the ground, as UL was held to 1.6 yards per rush and 45 total rushing yards. Robert Williams also made five grabs for a game-high 134 receiving yards.

Jaden Dugger led all players with 12 tackles and two breakups, while Tyree Skipper added nine tackles and a forced fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- Both teams had a pair of possessions in the opening stanza with no points on the board despite a 133-11 yards advantage for JMU. UL went three-and-out twice, while JMU lost a fumble and had a turnover on downs in the red zone.
- After being held to 19 yards and a trio of three-and-outs, Louisiana finally found a rhythm, using a deep pass and multiple penalties to find the end zone on a Winfield five-yard pass to Brock Chappell with 8:28 remaining in the half.
- · After a Justin Eaglin block on a field goal, Knight broke free for a 49-yard run, and Barnett found Landon Ellis on a four-yard strike to tie the game at 7-7 with 4:47 left in the second.
- After not converting on its first four third-down tries, Louisiana broke through with a 69-yard touchdown pass by Winfield to Dale Martin to make it 14-7 for the Cajuns just over a minute later. It was UL's longest pass play of the year.
- · UL nearly doubled the lead on the final play of the half, but Tyler Brown and Mychal McMullin stuffed the rush, keeping it 14-7 heading into the locker room.
- · On the first play of the second half, Barnett connected with Ellis on a double-reverse pass for a 62-yard touchdown, tying the game at 14 apiece.
- After a shanked punt by Louisiana, JMU started on the plus-25 and took its first lead early in the fourth, at 21-14, six plays later, as Barnett connected on a four-yard strike in the back of the end zone to Ellis.
- · Suarez tacked on a 24-yard field goal with just over three minutes to go, before Thomas capped off the defense's second-half prowess with his second pick of the year on a tip in the end zone.

- · Saturday's matchup was the inaugural meeting between JMU and Louisiana, as the Dukes have now played all other 13 teams since joining the Sun Belt in 2022.
- JMU's 62-yard touchdown pass to open the third was the longest pass play of the season for JMU and a career-long catch for Ellis.
- The Dukes recorded their third blocked kick of the year, as Justin Eaglin got his hands on a first-half field goal.
- With his 111 rushing yards, Wayne Knight eclipsed 1,000 career rushing yards (1,001).
- Ellis became the eighth player in JMU history to record at least three receiving touchdowns in a game, as Dukes have combined for 12, dating back to 1981.
- JMU held a sizable lead in total offense, out-gained UL by a 477-288 margin.
- JMU was 8-of-17 on third down, while UL was just 3-of-14.
- · JMU was able to pull out the win despite turning the ball over three times, to UL's one. Louisiana scored zero points off those three takeaways.
- JMU ran 24 more plays than Louisiana, holding an 81-57 plays advantage.
- JMU has now recorded victories against six of the seven Sun Belt West Division teams, as ULM (2024) is the only team from the opposite division to beat JMU through the initial meetings since the 2022 season.

Barnett Scores Six Times, Dukes Roll Past ODU on Homecoming

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison football scored 42 unanswered points and forced three second-half turnovers while Alonza Barnett III accounted for six touchdowns in a dominant 63-27 Homecoming victory over Old Dominion in Sun Belt Conference action on Saturday in front of a sold-out Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes' (6-1, 4-0 Sun Belt) defense set the tone in the second half, holding the Monarchs (4-3, 1-2 Sun Belt) to 10 total yards on 21 plays and limiting them to a single first down. Additionally, JMU has now posted three consecutive second-half shutouts and has yet to allow a single team to gain 300 yards, as ODU was held to 285.

JMU trailed ODU 27-21 in the second quarter before reeling off six consecutive scoring drives over the final two-plus quarters. During that stretch, ODU's final eight offensive drives resulted in five three-and-outs, two interceptions, one turnover on downs and a muffed punt on special teams.

The Dukes, who gained a season-best 624 yards, which also tied the program record for most yards ever allowed by any ODU team, scored touchdowns on nine of their first 13 drives.

JMU's offense was fueled by six Barnett touchdowns, which included two through the air and a career-high four on the ground. His totaled 448 total yards, completing 17 of 25 for 295 yards while rushing for a career-high 153 yards on 9.0 yards per carry.

Wayne Knight aided the run game with 74 rushing yards on 12 carries while making a pair of catches for 27 yards. JMU finished the game with 311 rushing yards, averaging 5.9 per rush. It marked JMU's third 300-yard rushing performance of the season.

Nick DeGennaro made three receptions for 106 yards and two touchdowns, as he found the end zone for the first time at JMU. It was his fifth career 100-yard game and his first multi-TD game since 2023. Landon Ellis led all players with six receptions for 97 yards, while Za'Ron Collins recorded his first JMU touchdown with an incredible 18-yard catch to cap the game's scoring.

Defensively, Tyler Brown tied his career high with eight tackles, while Jacob Thomas made seven stops with a sack. Aiden Gobaira had a career-best five total stops, while Justin Eaglin recorded two interceptions and a breakup for a career-high three passes defended. Elijah Culp also added 1.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

For ODU, Colton Joseph was 13 of 21 for 209 yards and three touchdowns with a pair of interceptions. Tre Brown led the game with 138 receiving yards on four catches, highlighted by an ODU-record 98-yard touchdown catch. Devin Roche had a team-best 34 rushing yards, while Joseph was held to just four rushing yards after entering the game leading the SBC in yards per carry.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- After ODU took the early lead off a fumble recovery on the opening kickoff, JMU responded on the ensuing possession as Barnett took it 58 yards to the house for his longest career run to tie it at 7-7.
- Pinned at its own two, Joseph connected with Brown for the 98-yard touchdown, which also was the

longest player ever allowed by JMU. The Dukes once again tied it two plays later on a 65-yard pitch-and-catch from Barnett to DeGennaro.

- ODU took a 20-13 lead after one following an 11-yard strike to Brown for his second score.
- JMU took its first lead, at 21-20, three minutes into the second on a DeGennaro seven-yard catch to cap off a seven-play, 75-yard drive. ODU came right back with a 16-yard touchdown from Joseph to Dawson Johnson for his first career score to make it 27-21 for the visitors.
- · JMU ended the half with a Jordan Fuller two-yard touchdown to take a 28-27 halftime lead. That score gave the JMU the lead for good.
- After Eaglin intercepted a pass on the opening play of the second half, Knight ran it in from 13 yards out to make it 35-27. After another stop, Barnett recorded his first of three straight rushing-touchdown drives on a six-yard scamper to make it 42-27. He later scored from three yards out to extend the lead to 49-27 after three.
- In the fourth, he added an eight-yard touchdown run to complete his six-touchdown day, and JMU closed the game with Collins' 18-yard touchdown catch from Matthew Sluka.

GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained Old Dominion 624-285, which included an overwhelming 258-10 margin in the second half.
- JMU finished a remarkable 12-of-16 on third down, while the Monarch were 4-of-11 (1-of-6 in second half).
- JMU had a lopsided lead in time of possession, at 41:26 to 18:34. JMU also ran the ball 53 times, while ODU had just 50 total plays.
- · JMU cashed in on all seven red-zone trips, while ODU was two for two.
- JMU also scored 21 points off its three takeaways.
- Barnett's four rushing touchdowns ranked tied for the third-most in JMU single-game history and were the most by any Duke since 1999 when Curtis Keaton had five against UConn on Nov. 23. He's also the second QB to achieve the feat, joining Mike Cawley, who had four against UConn in 1994.
- His 448 yards of total offense were the seventh most by a JMU player in school history.
- Eaglin, who had his first multi-interception game, became the first JMU player to do so since Sept. 21, 2024, when Terrence Spence had a pair at North Carolina.
- The 63 points were the most ever scored by JMU in the Old Dominion series and were also the most ever against a Sun Belt opponent, besting its 56 at Coastal Carolina on Nov. 25, 2023.
- The 90 total points marked the highest-scoring game in the six-game history of JMU and ODU.
- · JMU also moved to 4-2 all-time against the Monarchs, having won each meeting since moving up to the FBS.

Dukes Win Sixth Straight, Down Bobcats 52-20

SAN MARCOS, Texas — Behind another explosive performance by the offense and a three-takeaway evening by the defense, James Madison reeled off its sixth straight win, upending Texas State, 52-20, on Tuesday night at UFCU Stadium.

The Dukes (7-1, 5-0 Sun Belt) registered their second straight game over the half-century points mark to remain atop the Sun Belt Conference East Division standings. The loss for Texas State (3-5, 0-4 Sun Belt) was the host's fourth in a row, as JMU improved to 2-0 all-time against the Bobcats.

Alonza Barnett III scored five touchdowns and accrued 362 total yards to pace the offense. The signal caller finished 12-of-18 for 264 passing yards and four touchdowns while rushing for 98 yards and a score on just 10 carries.

Nick DeGennaro turned in his second consecutive 100-yard game, as he finished with three catches for 101 receiving yards and two touchdowns, which included a career-long, 76-yard grab.

Wayne Knight combined for over 100 yards, as he ran for 48 yards and made two catches for 69 receiving yards, which included a 57-yard pitch-and-catch. Jordan Fuller also ran for two scores, reaching 46 yards on the ground. Two days removed from National Tight Ends Day, Josh Phifer and Logan Kyle each scored touchdowns through the air.

On the defensive end, DJ Barksdale, Justin Eaglin and Xavier Holmes all came away with interceptions. Trent Hendrick and Tyler Brown tied for the team lead in total tackles with eight, while Andrew Taddeo finished with two sacks in the win.

JMU led 28-20 at the break before forcing back-to-back interceptions while scoring 21 in the third to null away

JMU out-gained Texas State by a 511-352 margin, including 236-74 in the second half, as the Dukes posted their fourth consecutive second-half shutout against a Sun Belt opponent.

For Texas State, Brad Jackson was 18-of-32 for 230 passing yards and a touchdown with three interceptions. He also rushed for 43 yards and a score.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- Braeden Wisloski set up JMU's first score with a 26-yard catch on a screen, as Barnett found De-Gennaro on a six-yard touchdown pass just before the midway point of the first.
- After a three-and-out, JMU doubled its lead to 14-0, as a career-long, 57-yard reception by Knight set up Fuller's third rushing score of the season from eight yards out.
- After an interception, TXST cut into the lead two plays into the second on a 14-yard touchdown pass to Mavin Anderson.
- · JMU regained a two-score lead on Fuller's second touchdown of the night to cap off a 75-yard drive early in the second.
- · After a Tyler Robles 35-yard field goal, Barnett used a 51-yard run and a 14-yard touchdown strike to Josh Phifer to extend the lead to 28-10.
- TXST trimmed JMU's lead to 28-20 at the break on a Jackson three-yard touchdown and a Robles 36-yard field goal.
- Out of the break, JMU recaptured a three-score lead with a pair of touchdowns with a takeaway in between.
- On the second play of the third, Barnett went deep and connected with DeGennaro on a 76-yard bomb, which was a career-long pass and catch for both the QB and receiver. After a 42-yard return on Justin Eaglin's third interception of the year, Barnett found a wide-open Logan Kyle for the score, making it 42-20.
- · An Xavier Holmes interception on the ensuing drive set up Barnett's fifth of the night, as he scampered in from four yards out to make it 49-20 after three.
- · Early in the fourth, Morgan Suarez knocked down his fourth field goal of the year, a 31-yarder, extending the lead to 52-20.

GAME NOTES

- · The game-opening interception by Barksdale was his first of the season and the third of his career.
- · Fuller now has 13 multi-touchdown games in his career.
- The first half featured 553 combined yards, as TXST used a late surge in the second to out-gain JMU, 278-275.
- It was JMU's second straight game forcing three turnovers, and the third time this season, tying a season high.
- In JMU's two games against TXST, it has outscored the Bobcats by a 92-33 margin after winning 40-13 in 2022.

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. – Alonza Barnett III threw for 270 passing yards and three touchdowns, as James Madison football held off a second-half push from Marshall to win, 35-23, on Saturday afternoon at Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

JMU (8-1, 6-0 Sun Belt) held a 28-12 second-half lead before Marshall (4-5, 2-3 SBC) trimmed the lead to 28-23 on a touchdown following a fake punt and field goal. The Dukes secured a crucial fourth-down stop with 3:15 to go before a 49-yard touchdown from Wayne Knight with 2:16 left proved enough for JMU to hang on for the road win.

Knight led the Dukes in rushing, as he ran for 87 yards and a touchdown. He also added four catches for 79 receiving yards and a touchdown to finish with 166 all-purpose yards. Three Dukes had at least three catches, as Jaylan Sanchez scored his first JMU touchdown on an 80-yard pass to finish with 86 receiving yards on three receptions. Landon Ellis finished with 49 receiving yards on a trio of grabs.

On the other side of the ball, five Dukes finished with career highs in tackles, led by Tyler Brown and Trent Hendrick, who had 13 and 12, respectively. Gannon Weathersby made 11 stops while Amar Thomas added nine. Aiden Gobaira also contributed eight tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss to go along with the game-sealing sack.

For Marshall, Carlos Del Rio-Wilson finished with 227 total yards, as he was totaled 154 passing yards and a touchdown while adding 73 yards on the ground. Antwan Roberts led the ground attack with 121 rushing yards and a score.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU struck first, as Barnett connected with Braeden Wisloski on a 26-yard touchdown pass, which saw Wisloski go over the top of the defender in the end zone.
- Marshall got on the board with a Roberts 15-yard touchdown rushing score to make it a 7-6 game.
- · Knight put JMU in the red zone on a 22-yard pitch and finished the drive with a six-yard touchdown, giving JMU a 14-6 edge with 8:38 to go in the half.
- · After a Marshall field goal, JMU upped its lead to 21-9 on a Jordan Fuller one-yard rush, and the Herd quickly answered with a 52-yard field goal to make it 21-12 at the break.
- · Sanchez extended the lead to 28-12 midway through the third with his first JMU touchdown on a career-long 80-yard strike from Barnett. It was also the longest pass of Barnett's career.
- After a fake-punt pass to extend their drive, the Herd got within a score, at 28-20, late in the quarter on a four-yard touchdown by Del-Rio Wilson to Tracy Stephens. The two-point try was also good on Del-Rio Wilson's pass.
- Marshall forced the first turnover of the game, as Barnett was picked off on a tipped pass in Herd territory. On the ensuing possession, JMU's defense held Marshall to a field goal, making the score 28-23 with 10:15 to go.
- · After a crucial fourth-down stop with 3:15 remaining, Knight scored from 49 yards out on a swing pass to put the game out of Marshall's reach.
- On the final drive and in the red zone, Marshall was halted on Gobaira's fourth-down sack.

GAME NOTES

- · JMU won its first game of the year after being out-gained on the day, as Marshall's final drive gave the hosts a 414-409 edge in total yards.
- JMU registered a season-high nine pass breakups, including two each by Jacob Thomas and Sahir West.
- Marshall had 25 first downs, as opposed to 20 by JMU. It was the most first downs JMU has allowed all season.
- Neither team played over 50% on third down, as JMU was 5-of-12 and MU finished 6-of-17.
- · Teams combined for just 11 TFL and two sacks, as JMU had five TFL, to Marshall's six.
- JMU's 7-0 lead after one marked just the second time this season Marshall has trailed after the opening quarter.
- · Barnett's first touchdown pass was the 40th of his career and his game-clinching third score in the fourth marked the 60th total touchdown of his career.
- Marshall's third-quarter touchdown ended a second-half scoreless streak of 149:46 (second-half time only).
- Since both teams joined the Sun Belt in 2022, the road team has won all four meetings.

Dukes Dominate App State for Eighth Straight Victory

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison dominated in all three phases, as the Dukes set a season high in total offense while rushing for seven touchdowns to roll to a 58-10 victory against App State on Saturday evening at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes (9-1, 7-0 Sun Belt) ran their win streak to eight straight games, all against Group of Six opponents, after winning the total offense battle by an astounding 627-146 margin over App State (4-6, 1-5 Sun Belt). The win Saturday was also the largest margin of victory for JMU ever against both a Sun Belt Conference opponent and in the 20-game history of the App State series.

By virtue of their win and Georgia Southern's victory against Coastal Carolina, JMU won the Sun Belt Conference East Division title to punch their ticket to the Sun Belt title game in December.

JMU never trailed and scored on all nine red-zone trips, building a 55-point lead in the fourth quarter. With 4:45 remaining in the game, JMU held a 627-70 yards advantage after the visitors had -11 alone in the third quarter.

JMU rushed for 324 yards, marking the fourth time this season JMU has eclipsed 300 rushing and for the third time versus a conference foe. It was also a season-high allowed by App. Jobi Malary turned in his best performance since joining the JMU program, rushing for 105 yards on just eight carries (13.1 avg.) with three touchdowns. It was his fifth career 100-yard game.

Wayne Knight was active in both the run and pass game, as well as on special teams, accruing 197 all-purpose yards, two shy of his career high. He rushed for 94 yards and a touchdown while making a game-best six catches for 55 yards. He also averaged 9.6 per punt return on five tries.

Alonza Barnett turned in his third career 300-yard passing game, as he finished 22-of-35 for 303 yards while rushing for two touchdowns. Matthew Sluka added 70 rushing yards and a 35-yard score on the ground in the fourth quarter.

Eleven different Dukes caught a pass in the win, as Nick DeGennaro had three grabs for 31 yards while Jaylan Sanchez made two catches for a team-high 69 receiving yards.

Defensively, JMU dominated the trenches, conceding just one rushing yard on 15 carries (0.1). The secondary tallied 10 pass breakups and an interception, as the Mountaineers totaled 145 passing yards on a combined 14-of-37 passing. Trent Hendrick led a balanced defensive attack with six tackles. JMU had six tackles for loss, as Sahir West, Jayden Studio and Xavier Holmes each made 1.5 TFL. DJ Barksdale intercepted his second pass of the year, and Elijah Culp had a two pass breakups as well

For App, AJ Swann was 8-of-28 for 64 yards and an interception, while J.J. Kohl was 6-of-8 for 81 yards and a touchdown down the stretch. Rashod Dubinion, the SBC's leading rusher, was held to 25 rushing yards on 10 attempts, as the Mountaineers gained just one on 15 total carries (0.1 avg.).

HOW IT HAPPENED

- · JMU took advantage of a short field after a Barksdale interception, with Knight punching it in from one yard out to open the scoring at the 6:54 mark of the first.
- · Suarez bookended the second guarter with makes from 45 and 38, while Malary and Barnett found paydirt to give the Dukes a 27-0 lead at the half.
- The Mountaineers were forced to punt on six of their seven possessions in the first half, with the other drive ending in a pick.
- A failed fake punt by App State deep in their own territory resulted in a JMU touchdown four plays later, capped off by Barnett's second and final rushing touchdown of the evening.
- · Suarez added to the Dukes' lead with a 26-yard field goal at the 4:06 mark of the third after a 14-play, 79-yard drive to give JMU a commanding 37-0 lead.
- Malary found the endzone two more times in the fourth, while Sluka wrapped up JMU's scoring with a 35-yard scamper.
- · App State managed to get on the board with a 48-yard field goal early in the fourth, followed by a 19-yard connection from Dozier to Kohl for the 58-10 final.

- JMU dominated time of possession by a 42:18 to 17:42 margin, as JMU ran 37 more plays than App State.
- · JMU out-gained App by an average of 7.0 to 2.8 yards per play.
- The Dukes were 8-of-14 on third down while holding App to just 1-of-12. JMU also converted its lone fourth-down try, while App was 1-of-2.
- · Suarez tied his career high with three field goals on three makes.
- JMU dominated the trenches in the third, holding App State to -11 yards on four attempts (-2.8), compared to 145 yards for the Dukes, including going 6.1 yards on the ground.
- · With his two rushing scores, Barnett now has 12 on the year, which is tied for seventh in JMU single-season history.
- The seven rushing touchdowns were the most since JMU had seven against Norfolk Stateon Sept. 16, 2017.
- The margin of victory (48) bested JMU's previous high versus a Sun Belt foe when it beat Coastal Carolina by 42 (56-14) in Conway on Nov. 25, 2023.

JMU Uses Second-Half Heroics in 24-20 Victory Over Washington State

HARRISONBURG, Va. – Trailing 17-10 at halftime, #21 James Madison flipped the script in the second half, out-gaining Washington State 239-75 while Wayne Knight scored the game-winning, 58-yard touchdown in the fourth for a 24-20 triumph on Saturday afternoon in front of 25,156 fans at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The win marked the Dukes' (10-1, 7-0 Sun Belt) ninth straight and their third victory this season when behind at the intermission. It was also JMU's first fourth-quarter comeback of the year. The Cougars (5-6, 0-1 Pac-12) recorded a 34:58-25:02 advantage in time of possession and went 3-for-3 in the red zone but were held to two field goals and just one touchdown inside the 20 in the loss.

JMU also capped off an undefeated regular season at home for the first time since 2020, as it wrapped up a 6-0 home slate at Bridgeforth Stadium.

After a first that half that produced zero offensive touchdowns, JMU began to move the ball downfield in the second half. Despite being stopped once in the red zone, JMU produced a pair of long touchdowns, as Alonza Barnett III connected on a 68-yard touchdown to Braeden Wisloski, while Knight closed the game with his 58-yard score up the middle.

Leading 24-20, JMU's defense needed one more stop and got that by virtue of a fourth-down pass breakup by DJ Barksdale with 2:58 to play. JMU needed just two more first downs to milk the rest of the clock, as Barnett and Knight each moved the sticks to set up victory formation.

Knight finished with a game-high 126 rushing yards and a touchdown, averaging 8.4 per carry for his third 100-yard game of the year. Barnett was 9-of-18 for 144 passing yards and a touchdown with a pick while rushing for 32 more on the ground.

Seven JMU players recorded a catch, with Jaylan Sanchez and Lacota Dippre both coming away with a pair of grabs. Wisloski's 68-yard touchdown catch, his lone grab of the game, was also a career long.

On the opposite side of the ball, Drew Spinogatti made a career-high 16 stops – the most by a Duke in the 2025 campaign – to go along with five solo tackles and two breakups. Justin Eaglin tallied his fourth interception of the season with a pick-six early in the second quarter. Trent Hendrick also finished with double-digit tackles (10), while Amar Thomas and Sahir West both produced 1.5 tackles for loss

For WSU, Zevi Eckhaus was 19-of-31 for 171 passing yards and a touchdown with an interception. He also ran for 26 yards and a score. The duo of Maxwell Woods and Kirby Vorhees combined for 104 rushing yards, as WSU tallied 130 rushing yards as a team. In the pass game, Tony Freeman made six catches for 81 yards, which was highlighted by a 48-yard touchdown reception.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- Both teams converted field goals, including a career-long, 45-yarder by Morgan Suarez, to tie things up at 3-3 after one.
- · Early in the second, pressure forced an errant WSU pass, and Eaglin returned his fourth interception of the season 37 yards for a pick-six and 10-3 lead.
- The Cougars answered with a 48-yard touchdown strike from Eckhaus to Freeman, knotting things up at 10-10 with 7:26 to go in the half.
- Just before halftime, Wazzu needed just 54 yards to regain the lead, as Eckhaus evaded multiple defenders and ran it in from four yards out to put WSU up 17-10 at the break.
- · After a stop, Barnett faked a run and stepped back in the pocket, connecting on a 68-yard touchdown to Wisloski to square the game at 17-17 heading to the fourth.
- The third quarter saw JMU out-gain WSU 136 to 29
- · WSU recaptured the lead with just under 10 minutes to play, as a Stevens 36-yard field goal doinked in off the goal post, giving the Cougars a 20-17 lead.
- On the ensuing possession, with the Dukes making their way downfield, Knight got a lead block by Riley Robell to break off a 58-yard scamper up the middle to make it 24-20 with 6:24 remaining.
- · Washington State converted on one fourth down and made its way to midfield before being stopped on a 4th and five with a pass breakup by Barksdale.
- JMU took over with 2:56 to play and picked up two first downs to burn clock and come away with the 24-20 victory.

- JMU finished with a narrow victory in total offense, out-gaining WSU by a 319-301 margin. WSU controlled the pace early, though, holding a 226-80 lead in the first half (161-3 in second).
- Wayne Knight surpassed 1,500 all-purpose yards in the game, as he now sits at 1,592. That ranks fifth in JMU single-season history, as he moved up from his 10th-place spot from pregame.
- With his third-quarter touchdown, Barnett is now in sole possession of sixth place at JMU with 43 career touchdowns through the air, passing Mike Cawley (42 1993-95).
- The second-quarter pick-six was JMU's first since Oct. 19, 2024, when DJ Barksdale took one back to the house against Georgia Southern.
- The win for JMU was its 30th consecutive victory at home against a non-conference opponent, a streak that spans the start of the 2016 season.
- JMU remains the lone Group of Six team to be undefeated against G6 foes, moving to 9-0 this season.

Dukes Cap Off Undefeated Sun Belt Season, Roll Past Coastal 59-10

CONWAY, S.C.. – Alonza Barnett III accounted for four total touchdowns, and James Madison completed a perfect Sun Belt Conference season with a 59-10 victory at Coastal Carolina on Saturday at Brooks Stadium.

The Dukes (11-1, 8-0 Sun Belt) ran its win streak to 10 straight, as they became the third Sun Belt team to finish unbeaten in league play during the championship era and the first since Louisiana did so in 2021.

JMU is also the seventh Sun Belt squad ever to finish conference play with an 8-0 mark.

Barnett finished 15-of-21 for 207 passing yards and three touchdowns while rushing for 31 yards and a score. Jobi Malary rushed for a JMU-best 154 rushing yards and a touchdown, highlighted by a 73-yard scoring run. Wayne Knight also had 85 rushing yards, as JMU combined for 286 as a team.

Eight different Dukes caught a pass, led by Braeden Wisloski, who caught four balls for 64 yards and a touchdown. Nick DeGennaro made three grabs for 47 yards, in addition to a two-point conversion, while Lacota Dippre, Isaiah Alson and Michael Scott also caught touchdown passes.

JMU dominated the yards game by a 525-170 margin, which included holding Coastal to -5 rushing yards. It marked the third time JMU has held a Sun Belt team to negative rushing yards, as it limited Troy to -12 on Sept. 16, 2023, and Marshall to -4 on Oct. 19, 2023. It was also the first time Coastal failed to gain a rushing yard in any game in the program's history.

Leading 20-10 at half, JMU turned on the boosters, scoring five second-half touchdowns to run away with its fifth straight victory against the Chanticleers and its largest in the history of the series.

On the defensive side, Jacob Thomas tallied six stops and breakup. KJ Flowe recorded his first career interception, a fourth quarter pick-six, to go along with a pair of tackles. Drew Spinogatti finished with five tackles, including three for a loss, and grabbed his first career sack. Aiden Gobaira registered four solo tackles and five total.

For CCU (6-6, 5-3 Sun Belt), Tad Hudson finished 16-for-38 with 148 yards, a touchdown, and an interception. Karmelo English caught two passes for 46 yards, including a 42-yard haul in the third quarter. Cameron Wright and Dominic Knicely each made four grabs, combining for 73 yards. Bryson Graves made three catches for 21 yards, highlighted by a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- After forcing a three-and-out on the opening drive, capped by an Xavier Holmes sack, JMU quickly scored, as Barnett ran it in from three yards out behind a Knight lead block to give JMU a 7-0 lead with 10:36 to go in the first.
- · After a Morgan Suarez 33-yard field goal, Wisloski went up and made an incredible catch on a 39-yard touchdown pass from Barnett to extend the lead to 17-0 after one.
- Suarez made it a 20-0 lead on a career-long, 47-yard field goal early in the second.
- · Coastal got on the board with an answering field goal and later used a trick play to set up a Bryson Graves 12-yard touchdown, trimming JMU's advantage to 20-10 at the break.
- · CCU opened the second half attempting its second onsides kick, but JMU recovered, resulting in Suarez knocking down his third field goal to move the lead to 23-10.
- JMU upped the lead to 31-10 with just over five minutes remaining in the third, as Barnett connected over the middle with Dippre, who rumbled into the endzone from 25 yards out. A Barnett two-point pass to DeGennaro capped off the eight-point drive.
- · JMU scored four more touchdowns, all by different players to finish the rout.

- Wayne Knight became the first JMU player to surpass 1,000 rushing yards since Percy Agyei-Obese has 1,216 yards in 2019.
- · Suarez tied his career high with three made field goals.
- · Alonza Barnett became the eighth QB in JMU history to surpass 5,000 career passing yards.
- JMU now has a pick-six in consecutive games.
- Since joining the Sun Belt, JMU has now outscored CCU by a 201-38 margin.
- · JMU finished 8-0 in conference play for the first time since 2019 and recorded an 11-1 regular-season mark for the second time in its FBS era.
- Its 28 points in the fourth quarter tied a program record for highest-scoring final stanza.

Top Dogs: James Madison Captures 2025 Sun Belt Football Championship

HARRISONBURG, Va. – James Madison pitched a second-half shutout and added two fourth-quarter touchdowns to claim the 2025 Credit Union 1 Sun Belt Football Championship in a 31-14 triumph over Troy on Friday night at Bridgeforth Stadium.

Holding on to a 17-14 lead late in the fourth quarter, Alonza Barnett III bounced off multiple defenders for a 26-yard rushing touchdown to cap off an 83-yard drive to make it 24-14 with 4:11 to play. On Troy's (8-5, 6-2 Sun Belt) ensuing possession, a strip-sack by Sahir West was recovered by Drew Spinogatti, who returned it 22 yards to the house for the final score of the evening.

JMU's (12-1) victory was fueled by Wayne Knight, who set a Sun Belt Football Championship game record with 234 all-purpose yards to earn MVP honors. Knight went for a career-high 212 yards on the ground, highlighted by a 73-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

The Dukes' defense stood tall, producing Sun Belt title game records in tackles for loss (14) and sacks (8). In the second half, the Trojans were limited to 45 total yards, including -17 on the ground. Additionally, Troy was held to 1-of-7 (.143) on third downs and 0-for-2 on fourth downs over the final two quarters.

Barnett finished 10-for-25 for 93 yards with a touchdown and an interception and rushed for 85 yards and a score. Braeden Wisloski made a pair of catches for 31 yards and hauled in the Dukes' lone receiving touchdown. Nick DeGennaro, Jaylan Sanchez and Knight all came away with two receptions in the win.

For Troy (8-5), Goose Crowder was 15-of-34 for 196 yards while being sacked five times. Tae Meadows scored a touchdown but managed just 10 rushing yards, as the Trojans were held to -27 as a team. That mark was the lowest JMU has ever held a FBS opponent and the fourth time it's allowed negative rushing yards since 2023.

HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU got on the board first late in the first quarter on a Morgan Suarez 40-yard field goal.
- Troy cashed in on a penalty-extending drive, as Crowder ran it in from a yard out to give Troy a 7-3 lead.
- JMU answered one play later on Knight's 73-yard touchdown scamper, most of which came after contact.
- The lead extended to 17-7 on Wisloski's acrobatic 26-yard touchdown catch, but Troy cut it to 17-14 on a Meadows two-yard touchdown before the half.
- Late in the fourth, Barnett sprung free for a 26-yard touchdown run to make it 24-14 with 4:11 to play.
- On the ensuing drive, West and Spinogatti clinched it with a strip sack for a touchdown with 3:17 to go.

- The win marks James Madison's first conference crown since the 2021 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) title. It is the 11th conference championship in program history.
- · JMU notched its 12th win of the season, the first time it has eclipsed 12 wins since the 2021 season.
- The Dukes have now won 11 straight games. It is the longest in-season winning streak since rattling off 14 consecutive wins in the 2019 season.
- Knight is the first JMU player with 200 or more rushing yards since Marcus Marshall had 203 versus South Dakota State on Dec. 16, 2017.
- · Additionally, Knight's 212 rushing yards are the 10th-most in a single game in program history and the second-most in a postseason game.
- JMU pitched a second-half shutout for the sixth time this season, holding Troy to 45 total yards in the second half.
- Troy finished with -26 rushing yards, including -17 in the second half. Taking out the 141 in the second half Marshall gained, the other eight SBC opponents managed just two rushing yards in the second half.
- JMU finished with eight sacks and 14 tackles for loss both setting Sun Belt title game records.
- Wayne Knight's 73-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was a career-long run and the longest in Sun Belt Championship history.
- · Sahir West finished with a career-high 3.0 sacks and 5.5 tackles for loss. Both marks set a Sun Belt title game record.
- Wayne Knight notched his fourth 100-yard rushing effort of the season making him the first JMU player to record four 100-yard games in the same season since Percy Agyei-Obese had five in the 2021 spring season.
- Knight sits No. 3 on the JMU single-season all-purpose yards list and eighth in single-season rushing.
