## TIPOFF TIDBITS

Senior forward Christian Cunningham needs just three rebounds to become JSU's Division I career rebounding leader. Three boards will surpass current rebounding king Nick Murphy, who has held the record at 679 since 2011. Cunningham will break into the program's all-time rebounding top 10 by reaching 699 boards, tying Bill Brantley who graduated in 1969.

Christian Cunningham played in his 100th career game Dec. 8 at Delaware State, while also receiving his 80th starting nod. He now ranks sixth in program history for games started. With five more games played, the senior will break into the program's top 10 for games played.

Jason Burnell has averaged 16.4 points per game with 21 assists and 41 rebounds over the past five games. During the five-game winning streak, the senior forward has totaled a team-leading 82 points, along with six steals and six blocks.

Jason Burnell scored a career-high 23 points in Jacksonville State's 83-78 win over North Florida on Nov. 21 in Cancun.

Jamall Gregory made his first start of the season Dec. 8 at Delaware State in place of Detrick Mostella (injury).

## BURNELL ON FIRE

Senior forward Jason Burnell averaged 16.4 points per game with 21 assists and 41 rebounds over the past five games. During the five-game winning streak, the senior forward has totaled a team-leading 82 points, along with six steals and six blocks. He scored a career-best 23 points in the second game of the winning streak on Nov. 21 vs. North Florida.

## A RIVALRY RENEWED

## GAMECOCKS CLAIM CANCUN CHALLENGE MAYAN DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP

The Gamecocks picked up back-to-back wins over Western Carolina and North Florida on Nov. 20 and Nov. 21 to earn the title of Cancun Challenge Mayan Division Champions while abroad in Cancun, Mexico. The Cancun Challenge was the first international tournament for Jacksonville State since competing in the British Virgin Islands during 2013-14.

## GREGORY NAMED CANCUN CHALLENGE MVP, BURNELL EARNS ALL-TOURNAMENT

Seniors Jamall Gregory and Jason Burnell earned Cancun Challenge All-Tournament recognition, while Gregory was named the tournament's MVP, for their play Nov. 20-21. Gregory totaled 31 points and eight steals in the two-day tournament, while Burnell scored a career-high 23 points in the championship contest. Burnell ended the week with 30 points and 14 rebounds.

Following a Gamecock turnover, Gregory chased down Harrar and swatted the attempted dunk just before the Nittany Lion reached the goal. The play debuted at No. 2 before being promoted to No. 1.

Pete Mathews Coliseum, the home of Jacksonville State basketball, received extensive damage. The roof was torn from the west end of the building, allowing rain to fall onto the court, into the team's locker rooms and the coaches offices.

As a result, the basketball coaches offices are temporarily located inside the football stadium and the team has no locker room. During the summer, the team practiced on high school and elementary school courts before a Campus Recreation court could be refinished.

## MOST PROGRAM WINS IN A SINGLE DI SEASON

With the March 19 win over Central Arkansas in Conway, Ark., the Gamecocks pushed their Division I record for most wins in a single season to 23. The previous record for wins in a D1 season by a JSU team was set in 2002-03 by head coach Mike LaPlante at 20 and later tied by Ray Harper in 2016-17. The school record for wins in a single season is 31, posted in 1984-85 under then-head coach Bill Jones. JSU was 31-1 that season, going on to win the Division II National Championship.

## JSU COMPETES IN CBI

For just the second time in JSU's Division I history, the Gamecocks competed in a national postseason tournament with their appearance in the 2018 CBI. Ray Harper, in his first season at the helm last year, led Jacksonville State to its first OVC Tournament title and appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

## GREGORY RECEIVES PRESEASON HONORS

Senior Jamall Gregory was named to the All-OVC Second Team by Lindy's Sports in the publication's basketball preview issue.

## CROSS SCORES FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Sophomore Jacara Cross picked up his first career double-double on March 19, scoring 13 points and grabbing 13 rebounds against Central Arkansas in the quarterfinals of the CBI. It was his highest-scoring game of the season and the first time he had scored in double-figures since totaling 10 against Tennessee Tech on Feb. 18, 2017.

## JSU IN THE OVC TOURNAMENT

JSU completed a historic championship run in 2017, winning three games as the No. 4 seed to claim its first OVC Championship and first D-I title in program history. JSU now owns a 6-5 record in the OVC Championships, earning just two wins in four tourney appearances prior to last year. Before its semifinal loss to Murray State on March 2, JSU had won four consecutive OVC Tournament games.

## BACK-TO-BACK 20-WIN SEASONS

Head coach Ray Harper and the Gamecocks locked up their second consecutive 20-win season on Feb. 24 with a 66-57 win over Tennessee Tech to close out the regular season. It's the first time Jacksonville State has claimed consecutive 20-win seasons since joining the Division I ranks, and just the third time in the program's DI era it has won 20 games in a single season (first was 2002-03). The last time JSU posted consecutive 20-win seasons was 1990-91 and 1991-92 under former head coach Bill Jones as members of the Gulf South Conference at the Division II level.

## ROAD WARRIORS

The Gamecocks are set to play 19 games away from home in 2018-19. It's the most since playing 21 regular season games away from Pete Mathews Coliseum in 2016-17. The Gamecocks will host just three non-conference games before OVC play begins with the New Year.

## JSU ADDS THREE FRESHMEN

After having just one true freshman on roster last season, Ray Harper added three for the 2018-19 season. Cam Jones, De'Torrior Ware and Maros Zeliznak represent the largest freshman class under Harper since five true freshmen made up two-thirds of the 2016-17 team.

The floor at Pete Mathews Coliseum was deemed "Bill Jones Court" on Feb. 22 during halftime of the Gamecocks' matchup with Belmont. The former head coach was recognized on the court during the ceremony. Jones, who coached for 24 seasons and was a two-year letterwinner for the Gamecocks, amassed a 449-210 record and led JSU to the 1985 D-II National Championship. He was elected to Alabama Sports Hall of Fame and inducted on Saturday, April 28, 2018.

## GAMECOCKS' RPI

At the end of the 17-18 season, the Gamecocks' RPI stood at 135. The mark was third-best in the OVC and third-highest in the state behind Auburn (16) and Alabama (41).

## HIGHEST JSU PENPOM RATING

Prior to JSU's Dec. 16 game against USC Upstate, the Gamecocks' KenPom College Basketball rating reached a program-best 95. JSU ended the season at 142.

## TWO 2017-18 TRANSFERS NOW ACTIVE

Redshirt senior Detrick Mostella and redshirt junior Ty Hudson will be active for the 2018-19 season after sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. Mostella comes to JSU from Tennessee to finish up his collegiate career, and Hudson comes to Jacksonville State from Clemson with two years of eligibility remaining.

# Jacksonville State 72, Samford 92

Nov. 9, 2018 - Pete Hanna Center

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Despite a second-half surge from the Gamecocks offense and record-setting night for senior Christian Cunningham, the Jacksonville State men's basketball team was unable to overcome a 19-point halftime deficit at Samford on Friday. The Gamecocks fell 92-72 in the 2018-19 debut, dropping their first season opener of the Ray Harper era.

Cunningham became JSU's career blocks leader in Friday's contest, picking up two rejections before the end of the first half. A block of Brandon Austin tied the record, and his swat on a Ruben Guerrero shot was the 163rd of his career. He surpassed the previous record of 162, held by Amadou Mbodji since 2010.

Bulldogs guard Josh Sharkey highlighted the Samford victory with a double-double performance on 22 points and 10 assists, while pitching in eight steals and five rebounds.

Jacksonville State found itself down by as many as 26 points in the first half after a one-point lead lasted just four minutes into the game. Led by Sharkey, the Bulldogs were able to open up a double-digit lead by the 10-minute mark. During the remaining 16 minutes of the first period, Sharkey scored a half-best 13 points and recorded six steals.

Unrelenting, the Gamecocks closed out the first half with seven unanswered points, carrying momentum to the locker room. Following the 15-minute break, Jacksonville State went on a 12-6 tear to begin the second half. Cunningham began the scoring with a big two-handed dunk that helped propel the offense to a 10-point run at the 15:46 mark. In the four minutes, the JSU defense forced four Samford turnovers.

Despite the hot start to the second period, it wasn't enough to stifle the hot-handed Bulldogs. Samford ended the second half shooting 56 percent, knocking down 114 of 25 shots and out-scoring Jacksonville State 45-44 in the period.

Four Gamecocks ended the night with double-digit points. Jason Burnell led the attack with 16 points, followed by 13 each from Ty Hudson and Marlon Hunter. Cunningham finished with 10 points and four blocks.

# Jacksonville State 61, Penn State 76

Nov. 12, 2018 - Bryce Jordan Center

UNIVERSITY PARK, Penn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team came up short at Penn State on Monday, falling 76-61 to the Big 10 foes.

Jacksonville State's Jason Burnell scored the first double-double of the season for the Gamecocks (0-2), posting 14 points and 10 rebounds. The senior reeled in 10 defensive rebounds and was 5-for-12 from the floor.

Lamar Stevens and Rasir Bolton scored 25 points each for Penn State, accounting for more than 65 percent of the Nittany Lions' point total. Bolton, who was not in Patrick Chambers' starting five, helped PSU to 30 points off the bench.

"I thought we put ourselves in a good position to win tonight," head coach Ray Harper said. "I thought our team played extremely hard. On the road against a Big 10 team, I thought we were right there with a chance.

"We're going to get better. We're still missing some things offensively, as far as ball movement, but that will come. I thought we were better tonight, but we need to improve offensively and rebound the ball better."

The Gamecocks led by as much as four halfway through the first period, up 18-14 with 9:21 to go before halftime. Burnell had scored 10 points, thus far, and the JSU defense had held the Penn State shooters to 0-for-8 from long range.

The Nittany Lions flipped the script soon after, erasing the four-point deficit by hitting five of their next eight 3-point attempts. PSU outscored the Gamecocks 23-14 through the final eight minutes to take a 37-32 lead to the locker room.

After scoring 12 first-half points, the Penn State defense shortened its leash on Burnell. For the remainder of the game, Burnell was held to two points with one of six shots falling. Christian Cunningham stepped up during Burnell's drought, scoring all 10 of his points in the second half. This coming after Cunningham didn't take a shot in the opening period.

The PSU lead was whittled down to six points, 61-55, with 4:44 remaining, but 15-6 run by the Nittany Lions put away any chance Jacksonville State had of escaping Bryce Jordan Center with a win.

Redshirt-senior Detrick Mostella scored a season-high 17 points, eclipsing Burnell's 16 scored at Samford. The first-year Gamecock was 7-for-16 with one 3-pointer.

# Jacksonville State 65, Bradley 74

Nov. 14, 2018 - Carver Arena

PEORIA, Ill. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team was not able to overcome a stagnant first half at Carver Arena, falling 74-65 to Bradley University in the final game of the Cancun Challenge's U.S. Regional.

Despite three Gamecocks scoring in double-figures, led by a 13-point performance by redshirt senior Detrick Mostella, the late-game rally accompanied by early scoring droughts handed Jacksonville State its third loss of the season.

"They answered every time we would make a run," head coach Ray Harper said. "It's hard to overcome when a team keeps answering back with runs of their own.

"I saw some positives, but we still had way too many breakdowns defensively. Especially in the first half. We had to go zone because we couldn't guard ball screen or get the ball leveled off. They did whatever they wanted, and some 3-pointers early in the game came in transition where we didn't communicate."

The Braves (3-0) stout defense held the Gamecocks (0-3) to their lowest-scoring period of the year, yielding 23 first-half points. Jacksonville State took 32 shots – seven more than Bradley – but hit just 11. For seven minutes, Jacksonville State was held to 1-for-10 shooting with Christian Cunningham ending the drought with a layup at 8:06.

Following the Cunningham basket, momentum temporarily swung the JSU's direction. Jacksonville State hit a 13-5 run that saw Mostella score five, including JSU's first 3-pointer, and De'Torrior Ware hit his first collegiate basket. The under-four media timeout brought an end to the run, however, and Bradley scored six consecutive to end the half.

The second half saw the Gamecocks and Braves trade baskets the entire 20 minutes. JSU outscored the home team 42-40 in the period thanks to seven 3-point baskets. Maurice Dunlap, who was held to two shots the first half, was 3-for-4 from beyond the arc. Mostella added two more treys to bump Jacksonville State's shooting percentage from 34.4 percent in the first to 60 percent in the closing half.

Although JSU answered its worst-scoring half with its best-scoring half, Bradley answered the Gamecocks nearly shot-for-shot to hang onto a nine-point advantage. Five Braves finished with 10-or-more, led by Koch Bar's 20 points.

The Gamecocks achieved a small team goal by seeing their assists outnumber their turnovers. JSU had 22 helpers, the most in a single game this season, while also cutting their turnover total to 14 – their lowest of the season.

# Western Carolina 53, Jacksonville State 84

Nov. 20, 2018 - Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya

PLAYA DEL CARMEN, Mexico – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team earned its first win of the season Tuesday with a record-setting 84-53 defeat of Western Carolina in the first game of the Cancun Challenge at the Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya.

The Gamecock defense forced 35 turnovers with the help of 19 team steals. The 19 pickoffs broke a Cancun Challenge single-game record of 14 steals, previously held by VCU since 2008. Jacksonville State scored 45 of its points off turnovers.

Guards Jamall Gregory and Derek St. Hilaire provided the spark off the bench as each led the Gamecocks in scoring with 15 points. Gregory's 15 points were accompanied by five steals to tie his career high. St. Hilaire's 15 is a career-high in a JSU uniform. Of Jacksonville State's 84 points, 46 came from the bench.

Marlon Hunter scored six of the Gamecocks' first 12 points within the first five minutes of the game, giving Jacksonville State a nine-point lead.

The WCU defense put the clamps on Hunter soon after, allowing the senior just three points the remainder of the stanza, and erasing the JSU lead six minutes before the break. The Catamounts tied the contest 22-22 with 5:55 to play, but that's when Gregory struck with his second dunk of the day and turned momentum to the Gamecocks.

With a steal and thunderous two-handed dunk, Gregory ignited an 11-0 run to push the season's best lead to 11, 33-22, with 1:10 left in the period. The run saw the senior lead scoring with four points, while Hunter hit a jumper and free throw for three points.

The second half was all Gamecocks. JSU outscored WCU 51-29, recording its highest-scoring period of the season. Beginning with a couple of Detrick Mostella free throws at 16:54, the Gamecocks went on a near-five-minute, 21-0 run to put WCU down 56-31.

Eleven of St. Hilaire's 15 points came in the second half, while freshman De'Torrior Ware impressed with 10 points in nine minutes of play in the closing period. All 10 of Ware's points came in less than nine minutes – between 11:03 and 2:22.

Senior Christian Cunningham was the fourth Gamecock to score in double-digits with 10 points. Jason Burnell shared the rebounding effort with four and recorded a game-high five assists. In addition, freshman Maros Zelnjak scored his first collegiate points with a basket in the second period.

FLORENCE, Ala. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed its fourth consecutive win after taking the first NCAA Division I meeting between JSU and North Alabama, 76-65, on Saturday in Flowers Hall on the UNA campus.

The Gamecocks improved to 4-3 on the season, while the Lions dropped to 2-6 overall. The same two clubs will usher in the renovated Pete Mathews Coliseum on Dec. 18 in Jacksonville. Tip off is set for 7:30 p.m.

JSU started strong from the opening tip and led the entire contest, including a double digit lead from the 13:16 mark of the opening half until the UNA cut the lead down to nine at 67-58 with 3:24 left in the game. The Gamecocks led by as many as 20 points early in the second half at 50-30 with 17:45 in the second half. The quick start was attributed to a solid shooting performance in the first 20 minutes as JSU put together a 43 percent shooting half (18-of-41). The Gamecock defense limited the Lions to just 27 percent from the field (7-of-27). UNA made a late run in the final three minutes as they got deficit down to three possessions 72-65 before JSU sealed the win at the free throw line.

As a team, the Gamecocks finished shooting 45 percent from the field, while UNA improved to 37 percent from the field in the second half. JSU held UNA to 32 percent shooting for the contest.

Senior guard Marlon Hunter turned in a career-high 23 points in the win along with six rebounds and two assists in 30 minutes of action. Hunter, from Panama City, Florida, established his new career mark for points at the free throw line late in the contest. His previous high was a 22 point effort against Southeast Missouri last season. Hunter finished 7-of-14 from the field and 9-of-11 from the free throw line.

Hunter was one four Gamecocks in double figures in the scoring column. Junior Ty Hudson posted 12 points, while Jason Burnell added 11 points and credited with five assists. Burnell also pulled down a game-high nine rebounds. Senior Detrick Mostella finished with 10 points in the road win. Derek St. Hilaire came off the bench for seven points.

UNA's Christian Agnew paced the home squad with 22 points, while Kendarius Smith and Kendall Stafford came off the bench for 12 points and 10 points respectively.

DOVER, Del. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team picked up its fifth consecutive win with a 81-54 victory over Delaware State at the Hornet's Memorial Hall on Saturday.

The streak is the longest under head coach Ray Harper, who led the Gamecocks to two four-game winning streaks during the 2016-17 season. It's the longest JSU winning streak since the 2014-15 Gamecocks won five in a row.

Senior Jason Burnell led the attack against the Hornets, earning his third double-double of the season on 22 points and 11 rebounds. The forward was 7-for-9 from the field and knocked down seven of seven free throws.

"He is playing at another level right now, and he's doing it on both ends of the court," Harper said. "We almost have to have him on the floor. We're just a different team when he is on the floor. He's one of those guys you need."

"Like a good point guard can make an entire team look good, he does that from the four. We can put the ball in his hands and let him make decisions. He can score from the inside and from the outside. There's not many categories he doesn't lead us in right now"

The 22-point showing – one point shy of his career-high – upped his scoring average to a team-high 14.6 points per game this season. The 6-foot-7 senior leads the Gamecocks with 117 points, 65 rebounds, .545 3-point average and 38 baskets scored.

After leading JSU to a 43-22 advantage with eight points in the first half, Burnell helped Jacksonville State to an 8-0 run to begin the second half. He tied his first-period total within the first six minutes. The senior finished with 14 points in the closing period.

Senior Jamall Gregory totaled 14 points – 10 in the second half – in front of a small home crowd. Just 90 miles away from his hometown of Washington, D.C., the guard received a large ovation when he slammed an alley-oop feed in the second period.

Senior forward Christian Cunningham was the third of three Gamecocks to score in double-digits, logging his first double-double of the year. He had 10 points and 10 rebounds in what was his 100th game played in a Jacksonville State uniform. The Albuquerque, N.M., native is just nine games away from breaking into JSU's all-time games played rankings, and just one rebound from tying the program's Division I record for career rebounds.

On the other end of the court, Delaware State was led by Saleik Edwards who scored 19 points on 5-for-11 shooting. He, along with Kevin Larkin's 10 points, represented more than half of the Hornets' points scored.

## HEAD COACH

April 6, 2016, Gamecocks athletics director Greg Seitz announced the hiring of Ray Harper as the program's 11th head coach and the fifth to run the Gamecocks at the Division I level.

In his second year as head coach in 2017-18, Harper led Jacksonville State to 20 wins in back-to-back season for the first time in the program's Division I history and for the first time since legendary head coach Bill Jones accomplished the feat in 1990-91 and 1991-92. The Gamecocks' 23-13 record represented just the third 20-win season in their D-1 history and the second under Harper.

The 2017-18 season also brought Jacksonville State its second appearance in a national postseason tournament. After leading JSU to its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament only a year ago, Harper took the Gamecocks to the semifinals of the College Basketball Invitational. Jacksonville State claimed wins over Canisius and Central Arkansas in the first and quarterfinal rounds, respectively, en route to its first ever wins in a major postseason tournament.

The second-year head coach also delivered a second consecutive berth in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament in 2018 - a first in JSU's OVC history. Jacksonville State had not appeared in consecutive conference tournaments since making the Atlantic Sun Tournament in 2003 and qualifying for the OVC Tournament in 2004. While at the Ford Center in Evansville, Ind., Harper helped the Gamecocks to a 73-70 win over Tennessee Tech in the first round, handing JSU its seventh OVC Tournament win in school history. Coupled with its three wins in the 2017 OVC Championships, the four-game winning streak stood as the longest undefeated streak in the OVC Tournament in the program's history.

In his first season as head coach, Harper inherited a 2016-17 team that was 8-23 the season prior and had not qualified for an OVC Tournament since 2012. The Gamecocks were picked to finish 12th out of 12 teams during preseason polling, and since joining the Division I ranks in 1993, JSU had never won a conference championship or appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Less than one year after his hire date, the first-year head coach completely changed the perception of Jacksonville State basketball.

The Gamecocks went on to complete one of the most successful seasons in the program's history in 2016-17. Harper led JSU to its first ever Ohio Valley Conference title, first appearance in the Division I NCAA Tournament and just the second 20-win season in the program's Division I history. JSU finished the 2016-17 campaign as the sixth-most improved team in the nation (+10.0 wins). The Gamecocks clinched a berth to just their fifth OVC Tournament since joining the league in 2003-04 with a 70-61 road win over Morehead State to cap the regular season. JSU entered the conference tournament as the No. 3 seed, earning a first-round bye. Jacksonville State defeated No. 5 seeded Southeast Missouri 74-51 in the first round, upset top-seeded Belmont 65-59 in the second round and downed No. 2 seeded UT Martin 66-55 to claim its first Division I title.

Harper became only the second head coach in JSU history to lead the Gamecocks to a 20-win season as a D1 program. He is just the second Jacksonville State head coach to win 20 games in his first season at the helm, tying Jones who began his tenure in 1974 with a 20-7 clip. Harper was one of three first-year head coaches to enjoy a .500+ record; Jones was the last to accomplish the feat in a premiere season 42 years prior.

A veteran with over 30 years of experience at the collegiate ranks, Harper boasts a 474-155 career record in 19 years as a head coach. That career includes four national championships - two at the Division II level and two in NAIA. His .754 career winning percentage is best among all active OVC coaches.

Harper came to Jacksonville after a five-year stint at Western Kentucky that saw him post an 89-64 mark that included three 20-win seasons and two trips to the NCAA Tournament. After serving over two years as an assistant at WKU, he took over as the Hilltoppers' interim coach in January of the 2011-12 season and was named the full-time head coach in early February.

At WKU, he went to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and 2013 and won 20 games in his first three full seasons, making him the first coach in WKU history to achieve the feat.

After taking the helm at Western Kentucky, the Hilltoppers went 11-8 (interim) and 7-1 after he was named full-time head coach, which came after starting the season with a 5-11 record.

His debut with the Hilltoppers saw him rally them to the Sun Belt Conference Tournament title and a win over Mississippi Valley State in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton. A 20-12 record in 2012-13 ended with the Hilltoppers' second trip to the Big Dance in as many years.

Prior to joining the WKU program as an assistant in 2009, Harper built a head coaching resume that included four national championships, five national runner-up finishes, eight conference titles, five national coach-of-the-year honors and a 342-63 record over 12 years at Kentucky Wesleyan and Oklahoma City University.

Harper was named the NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year four-straight years from 1999-2002, while earning the honor at the NAIA Division I level once with Oklahoma City following the 2008 title run. He was selected conference coach of the year on seven occasions, as well as the region coach of the year twice.

In nine years at his alma mater Kentucky Wesleyan in Owensboro, Ky., Harper laid claim to seven NCAA coaching records, surpassing Division I record-holders in all instances, including becoming the fastest to 200 wins (224 games), holding the most consecutive 30-win seasons (6) and compiling the most wins in each of the first four-through-eight seasons of his career.

With NCAA Division II title game appearances each season from 1998-03, he became the first NCAA head coach since John Wooden to appear in six-straight NCAA National Championship games. He won in '99 and '01.

The NCAA requires a minimum of 10 seasons at the Division II level to officially qualify for its list of head coaching records, but Harper's nine-year record of 247-46 at Kentucky Wesleyan would give him the best winning percentage in Division II history at .843.

At Kentucky Wesleyan, he coached two National Players of the Year, seven All-Americans and nine NABC Great Lakes All-Region players. He had 11 players selected All-Great Lakes Valley Conference and two that were named the league's player of the year.

Through seven seasons, he had more victories than any coach at the NCAA Division I and II levels (210). Harper reached 200 wins in 224 games, which was faster than NCAA Division I record holder and Hall of Famer Clair Bee, who won 200 in 231 games.

On February 17, 2008, Harper's number 12 jersey was retired at Kentucky Wesleyan, and the floor at Jones Gymnasium was named "Ray Harper Court."

From Kentucky Wesleyan, Harper went to Oklahoma City, where in three seasons at the NAIA Division I institution, Harper put together a 95-17 record that featured back-to-back national titles in '07 and '08.

He has also coached on the international level, having led USA Basketball men's junior team to a 7-1 record and a fifth-place finish at the 2003 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

The native of Bremen, Ky., and a 1985 graduate of Kentucky Wesleyan, Harper was a two-year starter for the Panthers after transferring from Texas. He became the school's first All-American as a senior, and he also earned most outstanding player in the regional as well as all-region and all-conference accolades. The 1981 Southwest Conference Rookie of the Year at Texas after averaging 9.8 points and 3.9 assists per outing, Harper finished his college career with 1,187 points and 605 assists at the two schools.

In April of 2010, Harper was named to Kentucky Wesleyan's All-Century Team. Harper coached 12 of the 30 players on the All-Century Team

Harper scored 3,033 points during his high school playing career, earning all-state honors as a senior and District Player of the Year acclaim twice. He earned his Master's degree from WKU in 1995.
