TIPOFF TIDBITS

Jacksonville State ended the regular season with its best OVC record in program history with a 15-3 mark. Fifteen conference wins is the Gamecocks' Division I record for league wins in a single season.

Jacksonville State broke the program's D1 record for wins in a single season in its 88-81 win over UT Martin in the semifinals of the OVC Tournament Thursday, earning its 24th win of the season.

Thursday's win over UT Martin at the Ford Center was also the Gamecocks' eighth win in a row, pushing Jacksonville State's winning streak to a new Division-I, program-best record.

JSU secured its third 20-win season in a row with its Feb. 21 win over Morehead State. The last time the Gamecocks won 20 games in three consecutive seasons was 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1991-92 at the Division II level.

JSU's third-place finish in the OVC standings and No. 3 seed for the OVC Basketball Championships are both Division I records for the program. Prior to this season, no Gamecock squad finished higher than fourth place in a D1 conference final standings or received a seed higher than four in a D1 conference tournament.

JSU ADVANCES TO OVC TOURNAMENT SEMIFINALS FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

For the third year in a row, the Gamecocks are playing in the semifinals of the OVC Men's Basketball Championships. Prior to the 2017 and 2018 tournaments, JSU's only other appearance in the semifinals came in 2006. Jacksonville State owns a 1-2 semifinals record with its lone win coming in the 2017 tournament (2017 OVC Tournament champions).

With its March 7 win over UT Martin in the quarterfinals, JSU is now 3-1 in the second round and ups the Gamecocks' OVC Tournament record vs. the Skyhawks to 2-0.

GAMECOCKS IN THE OVC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Jacksonville State owns a 7-5 overall record in seven appearances in the league's tournament. The Gamecocks won their first OVC title in 2017, topping UT Martin in the finals for the crown as the No. 4 seed. Last year, JSU defeated Tennessee Tech 73-70 in the quarterfinals as the No. 4 seed before falling to eventual-champion and No. 1 seed Murray State in the semifinals 70-63. This is JSU's first time seeded higher than No. 4, entering this season's tournament as the No. 3.

JSU BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON WIN RECORD

Jacksonville State's March 7 win over UT Martin in the quarterfinals of the 2019 OVC Championships brought the Gamecocks their 24th win of the 2018-19 season, breaking the program's Division-I record for wins in a single season. Last season, JSU won 23 games; the most wins in a single Division-I season prior this year.

LONGEST WINNING STREAK IN PROGRAM'S DIVISION-I HISTORY

Jacksonville State's March 7 win over UT Martin in the quarterfinals of the 2019 OVC Championships pushed the Gamecocks' winning streak to eight consecutive games, breaking the previous record of seven for the program's longest winning streak of its Division-I era.

BURNELL IS SINGLE-SEASON REBOUNDING, SCORING KING

With 14 rebounds against Eastern Illinois on Feb. 28 pushing his single-season total to 276, senior Jason Burnell became Jacksonville State's Division I, single-season rebounding record-holder. Burnell surpassed team mate Christian Cunningham for the title, besting the follow-senior's mark of 275 set in 2016-17.

He then became the program's Division-I, single-season scoring leader with 19 points vs. UT Martin March 7 to up his 2018-19 points total to 528. He surpassed Courtney Bradley's record of 510 points that stood since 2007.

MOSTELLA SCORES JSU-BEST 21 VS. UT MARTIN AT OVC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Redshirt senior Detrick Mostella scored a JSU single-game best 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting with six 3-pointers March 7 in the quarterfinals of the OVC Championships vs. UT Martin. The best single-game performance of his career still stands at 25 points, scored Dec. 22, 2016 at ETSU as a member of the Tennessee Volunteers.

BURNELL REACHES 500 REBOUNDS

Jason Burnell reached the 500-rebound plateau Feb. 21, totaling 12 rebounds against Morehead State to bring his Division I career total to 502 boards. The stat includes 38 rebounds at Georgia Southern from his freshman season and 464 in two years at Jacksonville State. He then recorded his 500th rebound as a Gamecock March 7 vs. UT Martin in the quarterfinals of the OVC Championships with eight boards, bringing his JSU total to 507. He is one of two active Gamecocks with more than 500 rebounds, trailing just Christian Cunningham (852).

HARPER GETS THIRD WIN OVER MURRAY

Head coach Ray Harper delivered the JSU program just its third win over Murray State in 25 meetings with an 88-68 victory on Jan. 31 at Pete Mathews Coliseum. It was his second at the Gamecocks' head coach (Jan. 11, 2018; 76-71) and his third all-time. JSU's record against MSU now stands at 3-22; Harper's at 3-5.

BURNELL, HUNTER NAMED ALL-OVC

Jason Burnell was named to the All-OVC First Team and Marlon Hunter was named Second Team All-OVC, as announced by the league office Tuesday, March 5. It is the third All-OVC honor for Burnell, earning a spot on the 2017-2018 All-Newcomer Team and named Preseason All-OVC prior to the start of the 2018-19 campaign. It is the first All-OVC nod for Hunter.

BURNELL GARNERS OVC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Jason Burnell was named the league's Player of the Week Monday, March 4 following a week that saw the senior score 56 points, 27 rebounds and his team-leading 14th and 15th double-doubles of the season. During JSU's regular season-finale at SIUE, Burnell put on his third 30-point performance of the season, hitting 13 of 16 shots, including three from 3-point range.

In addition to being named the conference's top player by the league office, Burnell was also named the OVC's Player of the Week by College Sports Madness. It was the second time this season the web site has recognized Burnell as the player of the week.

JACKSONVILLE STATE GETS BEST FINISH, SEED IN DIVISION I HISTORY

For the first time since joining the Division I ranks in 1995-96, the Gamecocks finished higher than fourth place in the final standings and received a seed higher than fourth to its conference tournament. Including its time as a member of the TAAC/A-Sun, JSU's third-place finish and No. 3 seed to the 2019 OVC Championships stands as program-bests in both categories.

GAMECOCKS PUTS TOGETHER UNMATCHED CONFERENCE SEASON

JSU finished 15-3 in Ohio Valley Conference play, recording the best league record in the program's Division I history. The Gamecocks' best finish prior to this season was a 12-8 record during the 2005-06 campaign.

Jacksonville State's campus was struck by a tornado March 19, 2018 while the team was in Conway, Ark., competing in the CBI. The University was on spring break at the time of the EF3, hence one of the major reasons no deaths were reported as a result of the storm.

Pete Mathews Coliseum, the home of Jacksonville State basketball, received extensive damage. The roof was torn from the west end of the building, allowing rain to fall onto the court, into the team's locker rooms and the coaches offices.

As a result, the basketball coaches offices are temporarily located inside the football stadium and the team has no locker room. During the summer, the team practiced on high school and elementary school courts before a Campus Recreation court could be refinished.

The first game back at Pete Mathews Coliseum was Dec. 18 vs. North Alabama.

GAMECOCKS HAVE 20/20/20 VISION

Jacksonville State secured its third consecutive 20-win season with its Feb. 21 win over Morehead State. It's the first time JSU has won 20 games in three consecutive seasons since 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1991-92 at the Division II level.

GAMECOCKS ENJOYING HISTORIC ROLL

Jacksonville State has won 24 of its last 29 games and has racked up its most wins in its Division-I era. The last time a JSU team experienced more success in a span of 29 games was during the 1991-92 season when then-head coach Bill Jones was 28-1 as a member of the Division-II Gulf South Conference.

HARPER NEARING 500-WINS MARK

Head coach Ray Harper enters tonight's game with a 498-162 record as he guides the Gamecocks during his 20th season as a college head coach. The mark includes his Division II and NAIA head coaching records, while his Division I head coaching record stands at 156-99.

BURNELL GETS 15TH DOUBLE-DOUBLE, THIRD 30-POINT GAME

Jason Burnell recorded his team-leading 15th double-double and third 30-point game of the season March 2 during JSU's 97-72 win over SIUE. The DeLand, Fla., native totaled 30 points and 13 rebounds against the Cougars. He ranks 15th in the nation in double-doubles this season. He now owns 18 double-doubles and three 30-point games in his JSU career.

BACK-TO-BACK DOUBLE-OT GAMES

After going 11 seasons, a total of 332 games, between double overtime contests, Jacksonville State has played two in its last two games. JSU won 104-101 over EKU on Feb. 23 at Pete Mathews Coliseum, and won 89-84 over EIU on Feb. 28 at Lantz Arena. In total, JSU has played three overtime games this season, tying the program's Division I record for OT games in a single season. The only other season JSU was 3-0 in OT games was 1999-00.

WARE HAS CAREER NIGHT AT EIU

Freshman De'Torrian Ware delivered a much-needed spark off the bench for the Gamecocks Feb. 28 at EIU, scoring 20 points on 5-of-8 shooting during the 89-84, double-OT win. The Hopkinsville, Ky., native was 4-for-6 from beyond the arc and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line. Five of his points came in overtime, including two big free throws with 17 seconds left to make it a two-possession game. He scored the majority of his points in the second half, 12, along with two 3-pointers.

GAMECOCKS AMONG TOP-REBOUNDING TEAMS IN THE NCAA

Jacksonville State ranks third in the nation and leads the OVC in total rebounds with 1,238 boards this season. NCAA-leader ETSU leads the way with 1,238 rebounds. Jason Burnell (289) and Christian Cunningham (226) account for more than one-third of JSU's total rebounds.

GAMECOCKS WIN FIRST DOUBLE-OT GAME SINCE 2008-09 SEASON

Jacksonville State's 104-101, double-overtime win over Eastern Kentucky on Feb. 23 at Pete Mathews Coliseum was the first played and won since an 80-73 win over Georgia State on Nov. 22, 2008 - a span of 332 games. It now also serves as the last time JSU allowed an opponent to score 100-or-more points in a game since allowing 103 to Belmont in a loss on Jan. 29, 2015. It's the first time the Gamecocks have scored 100-or-more points against a D-I opponent since, dating back to a 101-82, OT win against Stetson in 2002.

HUNTER POCKETS FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Marlon Hunter scored his first career double-double Feb. 9 at Southeast Missouri with 27 points and 12 rebounds during the 81-64 win. Both numbers were career-bests for the Panama City, Fla., native. His previous high in points scored was 26 at West Virginia on Dec. 22, and his previous high in rebounds was seven.

CUNNINGHAM IS JSU DIVISION I REBOUNTING LEADER

Christian Cunningham became JSU's Division I career rebounding leader during the first half of the Gamecocks' Dec. 12 game at Wichita State. His third board of the night surpassed Nick Murphy, who held the record at 679 since 2011. Cunningham also ranks as one of the program's top 10 all-time rebounders.

JSU CRACKS MID-MAJOR TOP 25 FOR FIRST TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The Gamecocks reached No. 25 in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 Poll on Jan. 21 for the first time in school history after receiving votes during the preseason and week of Nov. 12. The Gamecocks currently rank 24th. Belmont, who JSU is 2-0 against this season, sits No. 4, while Murray State, who JSU is 1-0 against, is No. 5 in the poll. Austin Peay is also receiving votes.

TY HUDSON NAMED OVC NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK FOR JAN. 17-19

Ty Hudson was named the OVC Newcomer of the Week on Jan. 21. The redshirt junior totaled 32 points with a .519 shooting percentage and snagged 10 rebounds in wins over Belmont and Tennessee Tech. He scored a career-high 18 points on a career-best seven baskets during JSU's 91-80 overtime win over Belmont on Jan. 17. Hudson is the first and only Gamecock to receive OVC weekly honors this season.

BURNELL ON FIRE IN OVC PLAY

Jacksonville State is enjoying one of its best seasons in its Division I history, and Jason Burnell has a lot to do with it. Along with his impressive overall numbers, the forward has averaged a team-best 19.3 points, 10.6 rebounds and 6.9 baskets per game since the beginning of OVC play. In 17 games, Burnell also has 45 assists, 12 blocks and 16 steals.

He has scored double-digits in 26 of 30 games and ranks 16th in the NCAA with 14 double-doubles this season.

Jacksonville State 72, Samford 92

Nov. 9, 2018 - Pete Hanna Center

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Despite a second-half surge from the Gamecocks offense and record-setting night for senior Christian Cunningham, the Jacksonville State men's basketball team was unable to overcome a 19-point halftime deficit at Samford on Friday. The Gamecocks fell 92-72 in the 2018-19 debut, dropping their first season opener of the Ray Harper era.

Cunningham became JSU's career blocks leader in Friday's contest, picking up two rejections before the end of the first half. A block of Brandon Austin tied the record, and his swat on a Ruben Guerrero shot was the 163rd of his career. He surpassed the previous record of 162, held by Amadou Mbodji since 2010.

Bulldogs guard Josh Sharkey highlighted the Samford victory with a double-double performance on 22 points and 10 assists, while pitching in eight steals and five rebounds.

Jacksonville State found itself down by as many as 26 points in the first half after a one-point lead lasted just four minutes into the game. Led by Sharkey, the Bulldogs were able to open up a double-digit lead by the 10-minute mark. During the remaining 16 minutes of the first period, Sharkey scored a half-best 13 points and recorded six steals.

Unrelenting, the Gamecocks closed out the first half with seven unanswered points, carrying momentum to the locker room. Following the 15-minute break, Jacksonville State went on a 12-6 tear to begin the second half. Cunningham began the scoring with a big two-handed dunk that helped propel the offense to a 10-point run at the 15:46 mark. In the four minutes, the JSU defense forced four Samford turnovers.

Despite the hot start to the second period, it wasn't enough to stifle the hot-handed Bulldogs. Samford ended the second half shooting 56 percent, knocking down 114 of 25 shots and out-scoring Jacksonville State 45-44 in the period.

Four Gamecocks ended the night with double-digit points. Jason Burnell led the attack with 16 points, followed by 13 each from Ty Hudson and Marlon Hunter. Cunningham finished with 10 points and four blocks.

GAME 2

Jacksonville State 61, Penn State 76

Nov. 12, 2018 - Bryce Jordan Center

UNIVERSITY PARK, Penn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team came up short at Penn State on Monday, falling 76-61 to the Big 10 foes.

Jacksonville State's Jason Burnell scored the first double-double of the season for the Gamecocks (0-2), posting 14 points and 10 rebounds. The senior reeled in 10 defensive rebounds and was 5-for-12 from the floor.

Lamar Stevens and Rasir Bolton scored 25 points each for Penn State, accounting for more than 65 percent of the Nittany Lions' point total. Bolton, who was not in Patrick Chambers' starting five, helped PSU to 30 points off the bench.

"I thought we put ourselves in a good position to win tonight," head coach Ray Harper said. "I thought our team played extremely hard. On the road against a Big 10 team, I thought we were right there with a chance."

"We're going to get better. We're still missing some things offensively, as far as ball movement, but that will come. I thought we were better tonight, but we need to improve offensively and rebound the ball better."

The Gamecocks led by as much as four halfway through the first period, up 18-14 with 9:21 to go before halftime. Burnell had scored 10 points, thus far, and the JSU defense had held the Penn State shooters to 0-for-8 from long range.

The Nittany Lions flipped the script soon after, erasing the four-point deficit by hitting five of their next eight 3-point attempts. PSU outscored the Gamecocks 23-14 through the final eight minutes to take a 37-32 lead to the locker room.

After scoring 12 first-half points, the Penn State defense shortened its leash on Burnell. For the remainder of the game, Burnell was held to two points with one of six shots falling. UNIVERSITY PARK, Penn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team came up short at Penn State on Monday, falling 76-61 to the Big 10 foes.

Jacksonville State's Jason Burnell scored the first double-double of the season for the Gamecocks (0-2), posting 14 points and 10 rebounds. The senior reeled in 10 defensive rebounds and was 5-for-12 from the floor.

Lamar Stevens and Rasir Bolton scored 25 points each for Penn State, accounting for more than 65 percent of the Nittany Lions' point total. Bolton, who was not in Patrick Chambers' starting five, helped PSU to 30 points off the bench.

The Nittany Lions flipped the script soon after, erasing the four-point deficit by hitting five of their next eight 3-point attempts. PSU outscored the Gamecocks 23-14 through the final eight minutes to take a 37-32 lead to the locker room.

After scoring 12 first-half points, the Penn State defense shortened its leash on Burnell. For the remainder of the game, Burnell was held to two points with one of six shots falling. PEORIA, Ill. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team was not able to overcome a stagnant first half at Carver Arena, falling 74-65 to Bradley University in the final game of the Cancun Challenge's U.S. Regional.

Despite three Gamecocks scoring in double-figures, led by a 13-point performance by redshirt senior Detrick Mostella, the late-game rally accompanied by early scoring droughts landed Jacksonville State its third loss of the season.

"They answered every time we would make a run," head coach Ray Harper said. "It's hard to overcome when a team keeps answering back with runs of their own."

"I saw some positives, but we still had way too many breakdowns defensively. Especially in the first half. We had to go zone because we couldn't guard ball screen or get the ball leveled off. They did whatever they wanted, and some 3-pointers early in the game came in transition where we didn't communicate."

The Braves (3-0) stout defense held the Gamecocks (0-3) to their lowest-scoring period of the year, yielding 23 first-half points. Jacksonville State took 32 shots – seven more than Bradley – but hit just 11. For seven minutes, Jacksonville State was held to 1-for-10 shooting with Christian Cunningham ending the drought with a layup at 8:06.

Following the Cunningham basket, momentum temporarily sung the JSU's direction. Jacksonville State hit a 13-5 run that saw Mostella score five, including JSU's first 3-pointer, and De'Torrian Ware hit his first collegiate basket. The under-four media timeout brought an end to the run, however, and Bradley scored six consecutive to end the half.

The second half saw the Gamecocks and Braves trade baskets the entire 20 minutes. JSU outscored the home team 42-40 in the period thanks to seven 3-point baskets. Maurice Dunlap, who was held to two shots the first half, was 3-for-4 from beyond the arc. Mostella added two more treys to bump Jacksonville State's shooting percentage from 34.4 percent in the first to 60 percent in the closing half.

Although JSU answered its worst-scoring half with its best-scoring half, Bradley answered the Gamecocks nearly shot-for-shot to hang onto a nine-point advantage. Five Braves finished with 10-or-more, led by Koch Bar's 20 points.

The Gamecocks achieved a small team goal by seeing their assists outnumber their turnovers. JSU had 22 helpers, the most in a single game this season, while also cutting their turnover total to 14 – their lowest of the season.

PLAYA DEL CARMEN, Mexico – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team earned its first win of the season Tuesday with a record-setting 84-53 defeat of Western Carolina in the first game of the Cancun Challenge at the Hard Rock Hotel Riviera Maya.

The Gamecock defense forced 35 turnovers with the help of 19 team steals. The 19 pickoffs broke a Cancun Challenge single-game record of 14 steals, previously held by VCU since 2008. Jacksonville State scored 45 of its points off turnovers.

Guards Jamall Gregory and Derek St. Hilaire provided the spark off the bench as each led the Gamecocks in scoring with 15 points. Gregory's 15 points were accompanied by five steals to tie his career high. St. Hilaire's 15 is a career-high in a JSU uniform. Of Jacksonville State's 84 points, 46 came from the bench.

Marlon Hunter scored six of the Gamecocks' first 12 points within the first five minutes of the game, giving Jacksonville State a nine-point lead.

The WCU defense put the clamps on Hunter soon after, allowing the senior just three points the remainder of the stanza, and erasing the JSU lead six minutes before the break. The Catamounts tied the contest 22-22 with 5:55 to play, but that's when Gregory struck with his second dunk of the day and turned momentum to the Gamecocks.

With a steal and thunderous two-handed dunk, Gregory ignited an 11-0 run to push the season's best lead to 11, 33-22, with 1:10 left in the period. The run saw the senior lead scoring with four points, while Hunter hit a jumper and free throw for three points.

The second half was all Gamecocks. JSU outscored WCU 51-29, recording its highest-scoring period of the season. Beginning with a couple of Detrick Mostella free throws at 16:54, the Gamecocks went on a near-five-minute, 21-0 run to put WCU down 56-31.

Eleven of St. Hilaire's 15 points came in the second half, while freshman De'Torrian Ware impressed with 10 points in nine minutes of play in the closing period. All 10 of Ware's points came in less than nine minutes – between 11:03 and 2:22.

Senior Christian Cunningham was the fourth Gamecock to score in double-digits with 10 points. Jason Burnell shared the rebounding effort with four and recorded a game-high five assists. In addition, freshman Maros Zaleznak scored his first collegiate points with a basket in the second period.

Carver College 61, Jacksonville State 101

Nov. 28, 2018 - Cherokee Center & Arena

CENTRE, Ala. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed its third consecutive win with a 101-61 victory over Carver College on Wednesday. The win came before a near-capacity crowd at Cherokee Arena on Gadsden State's Centre campus.

Six different Gamecocks scored in double figures, led by a 19-point performance from Jason Burnell. For the third time this season, the senior paced JSU (3-3) in both points and rebounds, snagging seven boards in 25 minutes of play.

Freshman De'Torriion Ware scored a career-high 16 points on 4-for-6 from the field with two 3-pointers and 6-of-8 shooting from the free-throw line. Detrick Mostella and Jamall Gregory each tallied 12 points, Derek St. Hilaire pocketed 11 points and Christian Cunningham finished with 10. It was the first time five or more Gamecocks have scored double-digit points since five accomplished the feat Feb. 22, 2018 against Belmont.

Despite a 40-point victory in the end, Carver (0-11) kept within striking distance for most of the first half. It wasn't until the 7:37 mark that the Gamecocks put more than 10 points between them and the Cougars, going up 26-15 on a St. Hilaire jumper. Before the end of the half, JSU widened the gap to 18 points, 45-27, with the help of an eight-point rally by Hilaire that saw the sophomore score a basket at the buzzer.

"We were very lackadaisical on the defensive end in the first half," head coach Ray Harper said. "I was just wanting to get to halftime so I could speak my mind. We had to be better in the second half, and I thought the group that finished the first half was the best group we had."

Following the break, a focused JSU squad outscored Carver 56-34 in the final period. Of Ware's 16 points scored, 15 came in the second half. It was the freshman's final basket, a dunk with 35 seconds to go, that put the Gamecocks' point total over the century mark.

Jacksonville State's 101-point showing on Wednesday marks the first time a JSU team has reached 100 points in a single game since last season's opener Nov. 10, 2017 against Tennessee Wesleyan.

On the defensive side of the court, the Gamecocks blocked 10 Carver shots. Junior Jacara Cross had the majority of the rejections, swatting six. It's the second time in his career he blocked five-or-more shots. Meanwhile, Gregory led JSU in steals with four while the rest of the defense totaled 12.

FLORENCE, Ala. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed its fourth consecutive win after taking the first NCAA Division I meeting between JSU and North Alabama, 76-65, on Saturday in Flowers Hall on the UNA campus.

The Gamecocks improved to 4-3 on the season, while the Lions dropped to 2-6 overall. The same two clubs will usher in the renovated Pete Mathews Coliseum on Dec. 18 in Jacksonville. Tip off is set for 7:30 p.m.

JSU started strong from the opening tip and led the entire contest, including a double digit lead from the 13:16 mark of the opening half until the UNA cut the lead down to nine at 67-58 with 3:24 left in the game. The Gamecocks led by as many as 20 points early in the second half at 50-30 with 17:45 in the second half. The quick start was attributed to a solid shooting performance in the first 20 minutes as JSU put together a 43 percent shooting half (18-of-41). The Gamecock defense limited the Lions to just 27 percent from the field (7-of-27). UNA made a late run in the final three minutes as they got deficit down to three possessions 72-65 before JSU sealed the win at the free throw line.

As a team, the Gamecocks finished shooting 45 percent from the field, while UNA improved to 37 percent from the field in the second half. JSU held UNA to 32 percent shooting for the contest.

Senior guard Marlon Hunter turned in a career-high 23 points in the win along with six rebounds and two assists in 30 minutes of action. Hunter, from Panama City, Florida, established his new career mark for points at the free throw line late in the contest. His previous high was a 22 point effort against Southeast Missouri last season. Hunter finished 7-of-14 from the field and 9-of-11 from the free throw line.

Hunter was one four Gamecocks in double figures in the scoring column. Junior Ty Hudson posted 12 points, while Jason Burnell added 11 points and credited with five assists. Burnell also pulled down a game-high nine rebounds. Senior Detrick Mostella finished with 10 points in the road win. Derek St. Hilaire came off the bench for seven points.

UNA's Christian Agnew paced the home squad with 22 points, while Kendarius Smith and Kendall Stafford came off the bench for 12 points and 10 points respectively.

DOVER, Del. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team picked up its fifth consecutive win with a 81-54 victory over Delaware State at the Hornet's Memorial Hall on Saturday.

The streak is the longest under head coach Ray Harper, who led the Gamecocks to two four-game winning streaks during the 2016-17 season. It's the longest JSU winning streak since the 2014-15 Gamecocks won five in a row.

Senior Jason Burnell led the attack against the Hornets, earning his third double-double of the season on 22 points and 11 rebounds. The forward was 7-for-9 from the field and knocked down seven of seven free throws.

"He is playing at another level right now, and he's doing it on both ends of the court," Harper said. "We almost have to have him on the floor. We're just a different team when he is on the floor. He's one of those guys you need."

"Like a good point guard can make an entire team look good, he does that from the four. We can put the ball in his hands and let him make decisions. He can score from the inside and from the outside. There's not many categories he doesn't lead us in right now."

The 22-point showing – one point shy of his career-high – upped his scoring average to a team-high 14.6 points per game this season. The 6-foot-7 senior leads the Gamecocks with 117 points, 65 rebounds, .545 3-point average and 38 baskets scored.

After leading JSU to a 43-22 advantage with eight points in the first half, Burnell helped Jacksonville State to an 8-0 run to begin the second half. He tied his first-period total within the first six minutes. The senior finished with 14 points in the closing period.

Senior Jamall Gregory totaled 14 points – 10 in the second half – in front of a small home crowd. Just 90 miles away from his hometown of Washington, D.C., the guard received a large ovation when he slammed an alley-oop feed in the second period.

Senior forward Christian Cunningham was the third of three Gamecocks to score in double-digits, logging his first double-double of the year. He had 10 points and 10 rebounds in what was his 100th game played in a Jacksonville State uniform. The Albuquerque, N.M., native is just nine games away from breaking into JSU's all-time games played rankings, and just one rebound from tying the program's Division I record for career rebounds.

Jacksonville State 65, Wichita State 69

Dec. 12, 2018 - Charles Koch Arena

WICHITA, Kan. – A late-game surge wasn't enough to lift the Jacksonville State men's basketball team over Wichita State on Wednesday, falling 69-65 at Charles Koch Arena and bringing an end to the Gamecocks' five-game winning streak.

JSU trailed by nine points at the 14:21 mark of the second half after the Shockers outscored the visitors 8-2 in a two-minute span. Despite falling into its largest deficit of the night, 50-41, Jacksonville State answered with a nine-point run to take a 58-57 lead with 6:12 remaining in the game.

JSU and Wichita State traded baskets over the next four minutes until Shocker point guard Samajae Haynes-Jones hit a 3-pointer with less than two minutes to go to widen the gap to four. WSU created a seven-point advantage, but a last-second 3-pointer from Ty Hudson provided the game's final score.

"It was right there for us," head coach Ray Harper said. "We had some bad possessions late. I mean, we gave up six points on missed free throws. We fouled a guy taking a 40-footer and gave them three points that way. Down by two, we didn't block out on a free throw and ended up giving up another three. There's 12 we just gave them."

"I told our kids I was really proud of them for their effort. I thought we competed and it was right there for us, but we'll watch film tomorrow and learn from it. Hopefully we will be a better basketball team because of it."

The first half saw the two teams combine for 70 points. Wichita State's four-point lead, 37-33, was their smallest advantage at a halftime for the year, but the highlight of the stanza came on an offensive rebound at 7:48 by senior Christian Cunningham. His third of five rebounds on the night was the 680th of his career, making him Jacksonville State's all-time Division I rebounding leader. The four-year Gamecock surpassed Nick Murphy's previous record of 679 and ended the night with 682.

Senior Marlon Hunter collected 11 points in the first period, hitting 4-for-11 shots and two free throws, while the WSU defense was able to hold Jason Burnell to zero. The senior forward was 0-for-3 and ran into early foul trouble with three in the first period. As a result, Wichita State outscored 24-6 in the paint for the first half, 42-18 overall.

Burnell caught fire in the second period and became one of four Gamecocks to record double-digit points. He and Jamall Gregory each tallied 10, while Hudson and Hunter led the way with 15 each. Ten of Hudson's 15 came in the second half, as well.

Haynes-Jones was the Shockers' leading scorer with 17 points, going 7-for-16 with three 3-pointers. Meanwhile, the JSU defense held the American Conference's leading scorer, Markis McDuffie, to 11 points – 8.5 points below his average.

Jacksonville State 55, Evansville 50

Dec. 16, 2018 - Ford Center

EVANSVILLE, Ind. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team handed Evansville its first home loss Saturday, downing the Purple Aces 55-50 at the Ford Center.

In their return to the home of the Ohio Valley Conference Championships, the Gamecocks (6-4) claimed the program's first win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. The win ended a stretch of 34 consecutive non-conference home wins for EU (5-5).

Seniors Christian Cunningham and Jason Burnell each tallied double-doubles in a game that came down to points in the paint. Cunningham had 13 points and 15 boards, while Burnell has 10 points and 12 rebounds.

With just 21 of Jacksonville State's 55 points coming on jumpers, the JSU bigs received a boost from forward Jacara Cross off the bench. The junior scored seven, blocked two shots and pitched in two assists in 14 minutes of action.

A slow offensive start saw the Gamecocks leading on two 3-point baskets, 6-5, after the first six minutes. Cunningham followed up with two dunks, including a one-handed put-back, that sparked the JSU shooters.

Cunningham and Burnell each tacked on four points each over the next six minutes to help the Gamecocks to a 23-11 lead on a 15-3 run.

Through the final five minutes of the first half, the JSU defense held Evansville to just five points on 2-of-9 shooting. A Ty Hudson 3-pointer at the buzzer gave the Gamecocks a 30-22 lead going to the break. JSU outscored UE 16-2 in the first.

Evansville flipped the script in the second half and tied the game 38-38 by the under-12 media timeout.

Following Hudson's third 3-pointer, a basket to begin the second half, the Aces went on an 13-6 run to bring the Gamecock lead to one, 36-35, after five minutes. A 3-pointer from Shamar Givance knotted the score for the first time since early in the first period.

The Aces' corrected their first-half miscues on the inside and scored 16 points in the paint in the final 20 minutes. The home team outscored JSU 28-25 in the closing period, but it wasn't enough to catch the Gamecocks.

Following the tie, Jacksonville State pulled away and kept a three-point buffer through the last six minutes of play. A defensive rebound for the Aces with less than a minute to go threatened overtime, but two Cunningham free throws with a second to go put the game out of reach.

North Alabama 50, Jacksonville State 64

Dec. 18, 2018 - Pete Mathews Coliseum

JACKSONVILLE – Head coach Ray Harper led the men's basketball team to a historic win inside Pete Mathews Coliseum with a 64-50 victory over North Alabama on Tuesday.

The win was important for three reasons: it was the Gamecocks first game inside The Pete since the devastating March 19 tornadoes, the program's 450th all-time win at The Pete and Harper's 50th JSU coaching win.

In its 45th season hosting Gamecock basketball, Jacksonville State now owns a 450-159 record on its home court – a .739 winning percentage. Saturday's game was the first true home game for JSU during the 2018-19 season, scheduling its first 10 games on the road and at neutral sites.

Harper became JSU's fastest Division I head coach to claim 50 wins at the helm of the program. He ranks second all-time at JSU for fastest coach to 50 wins behind hall-of-famer Bill Jones. Harper accomplished the feat in 82 games, while Jones did it in 80.

The Gamecocks' swept the season series over the Lions with the 14-point win. Senior Jason Burnell tallied a team-high 19 points, followed by 15 from Marlon Hunter and 11 from Ty Hudson. With a game-high nine rebounds, Burnell came up just one board from scoring his third double-double in four games.

Following four lead changes within the first five minutes of the game, Jacksonville State took an 8-6 lead at the 15:21 mark and never saw the Lions climb back ahead.

JSU carried out a balanced attack in the first half with six scoring a combined 31 points. Burnell was the half's leading scorer with seven, but only four points separated him from Christian Cunningham who scored a half-low three points.

Jacara Cross added four points in the first with three coming on the junior forward's first 3-point attempt and make.

The Gamecocks outrebounded the Lions by three, 19-17, in the first, but it was on the offensive boards that JSU held the advantage. Of Jacksonville State's 19 boards, nine were offensive, leading to 14 second-chance points for the home team. Burnell led the period's rebounding effort, as well, pulling down three offensive and two defensive.

North Alabama's Aleska Matic hit a 3-pointer to begin the second half, whittling Jacksonville State's lead down to four, but a 14-0 JSU run helped to put the game out of reach early. The Gamecock defense held the Lions scoreless for nearly five minutes to go ahead 45-27. Harper's squad maintained the lead for the remaining 15 minutes, allowing no less than a 10-point buffer between them and UNA.

The Lions' offensive leader was the ASUN's leading freshman scorer, Jamari Stafford, who tallied eight points and played 36 minutes. The Hoover, Ala., native also led on the boards with nine rebounds.

Jacksonville State 72, West Virginia 74

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team nearly received an early Christmas present on Saturday, but a career-game from Marlon Hunter wasn't enough to top West Virginia on the road. JSU fell 74-72 at WVU Coliseum, coming up three points shy of a win over the Power-5 Mountaineers.

"We had a chance," head coach Ray Harper said. "We got what we wanted on our last possession and you have to credit our kids for that. We had a great opportunity here today, and hopefully this helped prepare us for January and February."

Down two with eight seconds left, Ty Hudson found Jason Burnell just left of the key for a 3-point attempt. Burnell, who was 1-for-3 from long range, fired up the shot but had it miss short on the front iron.

"I thought we executed well," Harper said. "They went zone late, and I thought our kids did a terrific job of making the next play. Christian Cunningham was terrific today. I thought that was a good as he has played, and Marlon Hunter was good, as well."

Hunter recorded a career-best 26 points, topping his previous high of 23, while Cunningham was 6-for-8 with a free throw for 13 points. Burnell led on the boards with nine rebounds.

West Virginia forward Wesley Harris led the Mountaineers with 20 points, knocking down four of four 3-point attempts. Meanwhile, the Gamecock defense limited WVU's leading scorer Esa Ahmad to just two points.

The Gamecocks jumped on West Virginia early with a 13-5 lead thanks to an 8-0 run that included four points from Jacara Cross. The JSU defense kept the Mountaineers scoreless for more than four minutes during the stretch, forcing four turnovers for five points.

WVU found its shot shortly after, outscoring the Gamecocks 23-11 through the next eight minutes to take a half-best six-point lead. After missing two treys during the opening minutes, the Mountaineers hit four of nine 3-point attempts to take a 30-24 advantage.

The Gamecocks regained the lead briefly, 31-30 with two minutes to go before the half, but saw it disappear with six consecutive WVU points. Hunter made it a three-point game at the horn with a tip-in, 36-33.

The second half began with West Virginia firing up three 3-pointers, and all three fell. James Bolden, who did not score in the first, bucketed five points within the first five minutes of the second, while Wesley Harris matched the total with a 3-pointer and jumper.

Despite the Mountaineers' success from long range, Jacksonville State stayed competitive inside the paint. The Gamecocks outscored WVU 20-6 under the basket to hold a 39-38 advantage in the period.

Reinhardt University 77, Jacksonville State 109

Dec. 29, 2018 - Pete Mathews Coliseum

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team found itself back in the win's column Saturday with a 109-77 home victory over Reinhardt University to close out non-conference play.

A career-high 20-point performance from freshman De'Torrian Ware helped JSU land its second win in as many tries at Pete Mathews Coliseum this season. The Hopkinsville, Ky., native was 7-for-13 from the floor, including a 6-of-11 clip from beyond the arc to total the most 3-point buckets made by a Gamecock in a single game this year.

De'Torrian Ware made a lot of shots for us tonight, head coach Ray Harper said. "He is going to be a very good player. He's getting better every day, and he gave us a good lift here tonight in a game that needed him."

Prior to Saturday's game, the Gamecocks were a combined 4-for-32 from beyond the arc for their last two games. Including Ware's six buckets from downtown, Jacksonville State totaled 39 points on 13-for-30 shooting from 3-point range against the Eagles.

Along with improving to 8-2 over its last 10 games, Jacksonville State bucketed 100 points for the second time this season, coupled with a 101-61 win over Carver College on Nov. 28. It is the first time since the 1995-96 season – Jacksonville State's first year at the Division I level – that the Gamecocks have recorded multiple 100-point games in a single season.

JSU clung to a seven-point advantage at the half, leading 48-41 in a period dominated by 3-point shooting. During the stanza, Jacksonville State was 8-for-18 and RU was 9-for-14 from long range.

Ware was 5-for-8 during the period, with every shot coming from behind the line, for a half-best 15. But double-digit scoring efforts from Reinhardt's Latroy Strong, Cody Carden and Michael Mays kept the Eagles competitive through the first 20 minutes. The three combined for 34 of their 41 points and accounted for all nine 3-pointers in the half.

And the Gamecocks did just that, finding their second gear to outscore the Eagles 61-36 in the closing period. Ware added five points to his first-half total to arrive at 20, while redshirt sophomore lit it up with 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting to tie his career-best of 15 points.

Including Ware and St. Hilaire, six Gamecocks wound up scoring in double-figures. Jason Burnell scored a third-most 14 and Ty Hudson had 13, while Christian Cunningham and Marlon Hunter each ended the night with 12 points.

Four Eagles scored in double-digits, led by Strong's 18. Reinhardt's leading scorer, Samuel Bunkley, and Michael Mays each had 15, while Cody Carden had 11 points.

Jacksonville State 83, Belmont 73

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed its fourth consecutive win over Belmont with an 83-73 win Thursday night in the Music City, winning at Curb Event Center for the second season in a row.

The Gamecocks became the first Ohio Valley team to win multiple games at The Curb, handing the Bruins just their third loss at their home venue since Belmont joined the league in 2012. BU is now 47-3 at home against OVC opponents. The last team to defeat Belmont in four straight meetings was Austin Peay from 2004 to 2008.

The 10-point victory marks the fourth Ohio Valley Conference opener the Gamecocks have won and snaps a nine-game winning streak in league openers for BU.

Senior Jason Burnell came up just two assists short of a triple-double, totaling 19 points, 12 rebounds and eight helpers, and fellow senior Detrick Mostella had his best game of the season after missing six games with an injury. Mostella tied Burnell with 19 points – his highest total of the season – and pitched in three 3-pointers.

Jacksonville State jumped out to a quick 16-10 advantage through the first five minutes with the help of 4-for-5 shooting from the 3-point line. Point guard Ty Hudson knocked down two triples and hit a jumper for half of the opening points.

The long-range game fell cold soon after for the Gamecocks, however, as they missed their next nine shots from beyond the line. It wasn't until Mostella hit a big basket with 1:10 left in the half that JSU had its fifth 3-pointer, pushing the JSU lead to eight.

The half came to a close with Jamall Gregory bouncing an open layup off the back of the rim, but Mostella rushed in and tipped the ball in to give Jacksonville State a 40-32 advantage at the break.

The second half didn't start favorably for the Gamecocks with Belmont outscoring JSU 19-13 through the period's first 11 minutes. A Dylan Windler 3-pointer at 11:24 that pulled the Jacksonville State lead down to two, 53-51, warranted a Harper timeout to stop the momentum.

After the timeout with less than 12 minutes to play, the Gamecocks answered with back-to-back baskets from Burnell and Derek St Hilaire to shift the momentum to the visitor's bench.

Belmont traded baskets with the Gamecocks nearly shot-for-shot until the two-minute mark when Mostella's final 3-pointer and six straight free throws, divided between Mostella and Maurice Dunlap, totaled a nine-point run.

The Bruins put up eight points in the final two minutes, but it wasn't enough to catch the Gamecocks. Two points each from Mostella, Hudson and Marlon Hunter kept a 10-point buffer until the clock expired.

Jacksonville State 69, Tennessee State 62 Jan. 5, 2019 - Gentry Center

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team improved to 2-0 to begin Ohio Valley Conference play for the third season in a row under head coach Ray Harper with a 69-62 win over Tennessee State on Saturday.

A couple of late 3-pointers from senior Detrick Mostella and junior Ty Hudson lifted the Gamecocks (10-5, 2-0 OVC) over the Tigers (3-11, 0-2 OVC) for just the third time in 17 trips to TSU's Gentry Center.

"We did some things really out of character tonight," Harper said. "We weren't mentally there in the first half, but we gained our composure and made some plays down the stretch. Mostella banged a big 3-pointer and we hit our free throws there at the end."

After leading at the half, a couple of technical fouls that went against the Gamecocks midway through the second period allowed Tennessee State to climb back into the lead. TSU guard Tripp Davis converted all four free throws before hitting a 3-pointer to give the Tigers a 48-47 lead at 10:44.

The TSU advantage grew to as much as four until Hudson and Mostella struck in the last four minutes of play. Down by one, Hudson hit a 3-pointer to make it a 58-56 game in favor of the Gamecocks, and Mostella dropped a triple two possession later to give JSU a five-point lead.

Jacksonville State then proceeded to hit eight straight free throws in the closing minute to push the game out of reach by seven points.

Mostella didn't miss a shot all night, going 4-for-4 from the field with three 3-pointers and four free throws. The guard tallied 15 points – his third-highest total of the season – along with a steal and two rebounds.

A neck-and-neck first half saw the Gamecocks pull away within the last 10 minutes to take a 34-25 lead to the locker room. Tied 15-15, Mostella and Jacara Cross combined for eight straight points in the next two minutes to put the Gamecocks ahead with 7:18 remaining before the half. Mostella was 2-for-2 from the free-throw line with a 3-pointer, while Cross hit three freebies during the stretch.

JSU put up 11 points to the Tigers' 10 to push the Gamecock advantage to nine before the half's horn.

Hudson finished with six points from beyond the arc and six points from the free-throw line, while Marlon Hunter raked up 13 points. Jason Burnell snagged his sixth double-double of the season with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

The win completes the Music City sweep for the first time in the Jacksonville State's OVC history. It is the first time the Gamecocks have won their road games at both Belmont and Tennessee State in the same season, becoming just the second OVC team to accomplish the feat. Eastern Kentucky was the first to do it in 2015-16.

Eastern Illinois 62, Jacksonville State 69 Jan. 10, 2019 - Pete Mathews Coliseum

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team improved to 3-0 to begin Ohio Valley Conference play Thursday night with 69-62 win over Eastern Illinois in front of a rowdy crowd at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

Ray Harper's Gamecock squad is the first to begin league play with a 3-0 record since the 2002-03 team when Jacksonville State was a member of the Atlantic Sun. It is the first 3-0 start in JSU's OVC history. Coincidentally, that was also the last team to win 10 of its last 12 games. Thursday, Harper led the Gamecocks to their 11th win in 13 games, matching a feat not achieved since the 1999-2000 season under then-head coach Mark Turgeon.

Harper gave a lot of credit to the crowd of 2,275 at The Pete for helping push Jacksonville State to the finish line.

"We were just talking about the crowd in the locker room," Harper said postgame. "That's one of the best crowds we've had since I've been here. I can't thank the students enough for coming out tonight. We only have eight more home games. That's eight of their nights that I don't know that they could have more fun anywhere else for a couple of hours than right here. If they keep coming, I'll make it even more entertaining for them."

The Gamecocks took a narrow one-point lead to the locker room at halftime after a first period that saw the lead change hands five times. Marlon Hunter scored a team-best eight points in the opening stanza, going 4-for-5 from the field, while the reigning OVC Newcomer of the Week, Josiah Wallace, paced EIU with nine points.

Three big runs made for an exciting second half, kicked off by a 9-0 JSU stretch.

Jason Burnell hit back-to-back 3-pointers, forcing EIU head coach Jay Spoonhour to take a timeout, and Ty Hudson hit a third trey following the timeout to give JSU a 39-29 advantage after just two minutes of play.

Eastern Illinois found its footing and answered with a stunning 12-1 run that yielded just a Hunter free throw. EIU guard Ben Harvey scored five points during the clip, helping the Panthers to a 49-44 lead with 11:44 to play.

The Gamecocks rallied back immediately with a 13-0 run that kept Eastern Illinois scoreless for more than seven minutes. Jacksonville State forced three of EIU's 16 turnovers during the stretch, while Burnell and Ty Hudson each tallied six points to help JSU to a 57-49 lead.

For the remaining five minutes of the game, the Gamecocks outscored the Panthers 13-12 to claim a seven-point win.

Burnell finished the night with a team-best 18 points, while Hunter followed closely with 15 points on 7-for-11 shooting. Detrick Mostella rounded out double-digit scoring with 12 points along with three assists. Hudson led the assists effort with four.

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed its fourth Ohio Valley Conference win in a row Saturday night with a historic 90-54 victory over Southern Illinois University Edwardsville at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

Jacksonville State's 36-point win over the Cougars is the largest margin of victory over an OVC opponent in program history, and it marks the first time JSU has begun an OVC season with an undefeated 4-0 start. It is the best start to league play in the Gamecocks' Division I history since going 6-0 to begin Atlantic Sun play in 1999-00.

JSU's smothering defense held SIUE nearly 22 points below its 75.4-points-per-game average and kept the Cougars shooting average to 30.4 percent for the contest. SIUE had just 17 buckets on 56 attempts.

Cross' 15 points sets a new career-high for the forward, surpassing his previous high of 14 scored his freshman year at Tennessee Tech.

Jacksonville State owned the glass, totaling 47 boards. JSU's rebounding performance is the best against a D1 program this season, while SIUE's 24 rebounds are the least allowed to an opponent all year.

The Gamecock defense limited SIUE to just two points through the game's first eight minutes. The Cougars shot 10 percent, 1-for-10, until a basket at 12:10 gave them their third and fourth points. By that time, Jacksonville State had amassed a 10-point lead.

The Cougar's 24 first-half points was the second-lowest point total for a JSU opponent in the first period this season.

Senior Marlon Hunter scored a half-best 10 points to pace the Gamecocks in the first. The senior was 5-for-8 from the floor with all 10 points coming on 2-point field goals, ensuring his 12th double-digit scoring effort of the season.

Jacksonville State's 14-point lead at the half, 38-24, was the largest of the season against an OVC opponent.

The Gamecocks blasted SIUE 52-30 in the second period to record their highest-scoring half against a Division I opponent this year. Burnell led the offensive barrage in the closing stanza with 10 points, while redshirt sophomore Derek St. Hilaire pitched in nine off the bench.

Starting forward Jason Burnell played 29 minutes Saturday – the least minutes he's seen since playing just 25 minutes against Reinhardt – and recorded a game-best 17 points and nine rebounds.

In total, Jacksonville State led for nearly 39 minutes while the score was tied 2-2 for just more than one minute. JSU outscored SIUE by a whopping 48-18 and 21-13 off turnovers.

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team overcame a 14-point deficit to top Belmont 91-80 in overtime-thriller on Thursday at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

The Gamecocks (13-5, 5-0) earned their fifth consecutive win over Belmont (12-4, 3-2 OVC) and improved to 5-0 in Ohio Valley Conference play with a 16-5 OT period.

Seniors Jason Burnell and Jamall Gregory each tallied career-highs, scoring 30 and 25, respectively. Burnell's 30 is the most scored in a game since former Gamecock Norbertas Giga posted 30 against Louisville in the 2017 NCAA Tournament.

JSU trailed 47-43 at the half following a poor defensive period. Belmont was 18-for-37 and hit eight 3-pointers en route to the 14-point advantage. Kevin McClain tallied 16 points and was 4-for-4 from long range to lead the Bruins in the opening stanza.

The Gamecocks and Bruins traded baskets through the first seven minutes of the second as Belmont was able to keep the JSU deficit to 11, 59-48. It wasn't until redshirt senior Detrick Mostella was called for a foul that Harper did not agree with, giving the fiery coach the chance to pick up a technical foul at 13:05.

Following Harper's tech, Jacksonville State went on a 20-9 run to tie the game 67-67. Gregory scored nine during the stretch, while the defense forced three of Belmont's seven turnovers.

Each team scored eight points through the remaining five minutes to send the game to overtime. Belmont's Nick Hopkins bucketed a 3-pointer with 48 seconds remaining to tie the game 75-75. Hopkins took a second 3-point shot with two seconds to play, but had it clang off the rim.

Following a dismal first-half score, the Gamecocks routed the Bruins 42-28 in the second. And JSU's scoring did not end with regulation.

Jacksonville State walloped Belmont 16-5 during the five-minute overtime period. The Bruins' Dylan Windler snagged the first point of OT with a free throw, but it was all Gamecocks after that.

Burnell tallied seven during JSU's 16-4 run to close out the game, including a dagger 3-pointer to begin the stretch. Senior Marlon Hunter pitched in four while just Nick Muszynski and McClain accounted for Belmont's four points.

It is the second season in a row the Gamecocks have swept the season series against Belmont.

Jacksonville State extends its program-record OVC streak to 5-0 and is now just one win away from tying the school record for best start to a Division I conference schedule. The Gamecocks have now won 13 of their last 15 games – their best stretch of the program's Division I era.

Tennessee Tech 48, Jacksonville State 65

Jan. 19, 2019 - Pete Mathews Coliseum

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team improved to 6-0 in conference play for just the second time in program history with its 65-48 win over Tennessee Tech Saturday night at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

Ray Harper's Gamecocks tied Mark Turgeon's 1999-00 team for the best conference start in the program's Division I history, and also matched the school's longest winning streak of the D-1 era at seven in a row with the Saturday victory.

With Austin Peay's 85-83 loss to Eastern Kentucky and Murray State's 82-72 win over SIUE, the Gamecocks and Racers remain the only two unbeatens in the Ohio Valley Conference.

After going down eight, Tennessee Tech got rolling with a 7-0 run halfway through the first period. The Golden Eagles pulled within two points of Jacksonville State's lead, 18-16, with the help of a couple of layups along with a 3-pointer from freshman forward Garrett Golday.

With the advantage in jeopardy, Jacksonville State answered with an 11-point run that kept TTU scoreless for more than five minutes. From the 7:54 mark until halftime, the Gamecocks outscored the Golden Eagles 23-14.

Senior forward Christian Cunningham scored eight points off the bench to pace JSU's offensive effort through the first 20 minutes, leading to a 34-21 lead at the half. Ty Hudson tallied a second-best six while Jamall Gregory, Jacara Cross, Jason Burnell, Marlon Hunter and Detrick Mostella scored four each.

Cross and Cunningham were impossible for the TTU offense in the half, rejecting a combined five would-be baskets. Cross swatted three shots while Cunningham had two. Six in the half by the Gamecocks tied the season's best mark for rejections against a Division I opponent.

Jacksonville State struggled in the second half to the Golden Eagles but was able to overcome a Tennessee Tech spark that dwindled a 20-point lead to just seven points with 7:20 left in the game.

JSU led 41-21 early in the closing period. A seven-point run to begin the half was highlighted by a 3-pointer from Gregory forced TTU head coach Steve Payne to call a timeout less than two minutes in.

Following the called timeout, Payne's Eagles outscored Jacksonville State 21-8 for the next 11 minutes. Four of JSU's 16 turnovers came during the stretch, pushing the Gamecocks' turnover total to its highest in nine games.

The under-eight media timeout came just in time for Harper, allowing the coach to make a couple of subs and slow TTU's momentum.

Burnell scored six of his 14 points for the remainder of the game. Hudson pitched in two and Gregory added a massive dunk that rocked Pete Mathews Coliseum. The Gamecocks finished the game on a 14-6 run.

Jacksonville State 70, Eastern Kentucky 88

Jan. 24, 2019 - Seabury Center (Berea College)

BEREA, Ky. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team dropped an 88-70 decision to Eastern Kentucky on Thursday at Berea College's Seabury Center, receiving its first Ohio Valley Conference loss of the season.

The loss brought JSU's winning streak to an end at seven; tied for the program's best at the Division I level. The Gamecocks' 6-0 start to OVC play prior to tonight's game also goes down as tied for the best start to a Division I conference start in school history.

The Gamecocks (14-6, 6-1 OVC) outscored the Colonels (10-10, 3-4 OVC) 43-35 in the second half, but the comeback fell short as Eastern Kentucky put the game out of reach early with a 53-point first half.

Eastern Kentucky's press defense forced 20 turnovers, which is tied for the most in a single game by JSU this season.

Senior Jamall Gregory led the Gamecocks in scoring with 15 points, while junior point guard Ty Hudson totaled 14 for a second consecutive game.

Following a 7-0 run to begin the game for JSU, Eastern Kentucky called a timeout that seemed to fix every problem it had within the game's first three minutes. Following the timeout, the Colonels went on a 43-10 tear over the next 10 minutes.

Eastern Kentucky reached its largest lead with three seconds to go before the half, going up 53-25 on a Cameron Carmical 3-pointer. The 28-point deficit was both the largest the Gamecocks had seen all year.

Jacksonville State trailed 53-27 at the break, but the Gamecocks found second life and some energy to begin the second stanza. Back-to-back baskets from Christian Cunningham sparked the start, including a two-handed dunk. JSU's run reached 21-4 clip after five minutes of action.

After the Eastern Kentucky lead was whittled down to a half-best nine by a Jason Burnell 3-pointer, the Colonels regained their composure and began matching baskets to take the advantage back to double-digits for the remainder of the game.

The Colonels' Nick Mayo went for 22 points to pace the offense, going 8-for-14 from the floor. As a team, EKU hit 9-of-22 3-point attempts. On the other hand, JSU was held to 40 percent from the floor and 4-for-24 from 3-point range.

Jacksonville State 77, Morehead State 71

Jan. 26, 2019 - Ellis T. Johnson Arena

MOREHEAD, Ky. - The Jacksonville State men's basketball team got back on track in its final day in the Bluegrass State with a 77-71 win over Morehead State at Ellis T. Johnson Arena on Saturday.

Redshirt senior Detrick Mostella scored a Jacksonville State-best 19 points on a single-game-high eight baskets, while senior Jason Burnell earned his ninth double-double of the season with 19 points and 13 rebounds.

Head coach Ray Harper keeps Jacksonville State in a tie for first place atop the Ohio Valley Conference standings by winning his third-straight, and fourth-out-of-five, over Morehead State.

"Mostella came alive and made some big shots for us, and Burnell created some mismatch problems for them, as well," Harper said. "It wasn't our best defending game, but sometimes you have to find a way to win and we did that today."

Jacksonville State dominated in the paint early on, outscoring the Eagles 24-14 on the inside in the first half. Bigs Jacara Cross, Burnell and Christian Cunningham each scored six points in the period, combining for 18 of the Gamecocks' 38 points at the break.

Only three JSU points came from beyond the arc in the first with Ty Hudson connecting on one of the Gamecocks' seven attempts from long range. On the other hand, Morehead State relied on the 3-pointer for 15 of its 35 points in the half. MSU's Djimon Harris was 2-for-4 from long for all six of his points.

Morehead State stormed back in the first seven minutes of the second half to climb into a five-point lead. The Eagles' offense was sparked by two 3-pointers each from Lamontay Hicks and James Baker. With 12:22 remaining in the contest, MSU had taken a 55-50 lead; its first multi-point lead since 7:16 to play in the first half.

"We didn't defend well in the second half," Harper said. They started banging threes, and you have to give them a lot of credit. Hicks is not a 3-point shooter, but he came out and hit two in a row, and we lost Baker on a couple."

Five proved to be the largest deficit of the period, however, as Mostella helped the Gamecocks regain the advantage with 13 points in 10 minutes. The transfer knocked down the first of his three 3-pointers with 11:32 to play. He hit four more baskets, including two more treys, to surpass his first-half total by six.

Along with Mostella and Brunell, Cunningham finished in double-digits with 12 points and came up one rebound short of a double-double.

JACKSONVILLE - The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed the top spot in the Ohio Valley Conference Thursday in front of a sellout-crowd at Pete Mathews Coliseum, downing Murray State 88-68.

Senior Jason Burnell recorded his team-leading 10th double-double of the year on 21 points and a career-high 15 rebounds. Fellow senior Marlon Hunter led the offense with 24 points, while junior point guard Ty Hudson pocketed 15 points with five assists.

The Gamecocks (16-6, 8-1 OVC) now sit atop the league standings, breaking the tie for first over the Racers (16-4, 7-2 OVC) in just the program's third win over MSU. Ray Harper now owns two of those three wins as JSU's head coach.

"These were the top two teams going into the game," Harper said. "This was a big game and our kids responded – especially on the defensive end. We put up 88, so I guess we did a little on the offensive end, too."

"It was a complete effort. Everybody played and contributed, but the biggest thing was that we competed."

The Gamecocks received a major boost from their 3,718 fans in attendance; a historic gathering that represents Pete Mathews Coliseum's first Division I capacity crowd.

Jacksonville State took a 41-34 to the locker room after shooting better than 53-percent in the first half. Hunter tallied 10 of his 24 points on four-for-four shooting and four free throws.

Murray State led by two on a KJ Williams layup to begin the game, but it would prove to be one of the largest advantage the Racers could muster for the game. MSU's last lead came at 9:08 on a Ja Morant 3-pointer, 23-21. After the trey from the NBA prospect, Jacksonville State went on a 20-11 run to close out the period.

JSU opened its lead up to double digits just three minutes into the second half. Burnell capped off an 8-4 stretch to begin the period with a layup to put Jacksonville State up 11. The lead dipped below 10 just once for the remainder of the game as the Gamecocks outscored the Racers 47-34 through the final 20 minutes.

Burnell totaled 11 points in the second half and out-rebounded his first-half total by eight, and Hunter matched his first-half points total of 12. The two helped a dominating effort in the paint that saw the Gamecocks win 50-24 on the inside game.

The JSU defense forced 11 turnovers and outscored the Racers 16-5 on miscues. The league's best field-goal percentage defense and second-best scoring defense also limited Murray State to 40-percent shooting for nearly 16 points below its scoring average.

Top prospect Morant scored a Murray State-best 22 points and added 11 helpers.

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team came back from 19 points down in the first half Saturday night to take a one-point lead over Austin Peay in the game's final minute, but a late Govs' layup helped hand the Gamecocks their first home loss of the season at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

Senior Jamall Gregory led the Gamecocks (16-7, 8-2 OVC) with 19 points and was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line, and fellow senior Marlon Hunter pitched in 17 off the bench on 6-of-17 shooting.

After trailing the entire game, JSU went up 71-70 with 39 seconds to play on a couple of Ty Hudson free throws. The two freebies were part of a 6-1 run that erased a five-point Austin Peay lead in the last two minutes of the contest.

On the ensuing APSU possession following Hudson's free throws, Jabari McGhee rolled in a layup and was fouled on the play. The forward knocked down the layup to make it a two-point game. Austin Peay added a third insurance point on a Terry Taylor free throw with two seconds to go, capping off the win over the Gamecocks.

The game got off to a horrendous start for the Gamecocks as the home team found itself in a 19-point hole halfway through the first period. Austin Peay jumped on top 23-4 while JSU shot just 10-percent (1-for-10) through the first 10 minutes. It wasn't until Hudson bucketed a shot at 12:57 that JSU had its first field goal of the game.

The Gamecocks stormed back minutes later with the help of two different runs that went for eight and seven points, respectively. After a cold 1-for-10 start from the field, JSU's offense finished the period 7-for-12 (58.3%).

Hunter came off the bench to score a half-best 10 points on 4-for-9 shooting. The Panama City, Fla., native was also perfect from the free-throw line at 2-for-2. Meanwhile, starting guard Gregory pitched in nine points in 10 minutes of play.

A 6-0 run for the Gamecocks began the second half, forcing Austin Peay to take a timeout just two minutes into the period. The stretch that included a couple of layups from Gregory and a jumper from Hunter cut the Govs' lead down to two, 39-37.

After Jacksonville State tied the game 44-44 on a Hunter basket at 16:04, Austin Peay found a 13-2 spark that put the lead back to double-digits. It wasn't until the Gamecocks' 6-1 run in the last two minutes of the APSU's advantage dipped below five points.

Along with the Gamecocks' 15 missed 3-pointers, JSU turned the ball over 16 times – the most since coughing up 20 at Eastern Kentucky – and allowed Austin Peay to score 19 points off the miscues.

On the other end of the court, 15 of the Governors' points came off 3-pointers. Terry Taylor, who knocked down one of the five, lead the Govs on offense with 30 points. He was 10-for-17 from the field and hit 9-of-11 from the free-throw line.

MARTIN, Tenn. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team dropped a 66-64 decision to UT Martin at the Elam Center Thursday night, falling out of first place in the Ohio Valley Conference standings.

The Skyhawks (7-15, 2-9 OVC) outscored the Gamecocks (16-8, 8-3 OVC) 35-26 in the second half to overcome a seven-point deficit at the half.

The loss is the first for Jacksonville State after leading at halftime.

"We weren't good from the start tonight," head coach Ray Harper said. "We didn't execute down the stretch, we made some key turnovers and we missed some point-blank shots. We did everything to not win the game.

"Good teams will execute to finish games off. We just didn't do it."

Senior Marlon Hunter led the Gamecocks with a 16-point performance in his 17th double-digit scoring game of the year, but it wasn't enough to overcome a high-scoring second half from UT Martin.

The Skyhawks received a big boost off the bench from Quintin Dove who scored a game-high 21 points on 10-of-13 shooting, including a 3-pointer. He split his scoring over the two periods near even, getting 11 in the first and 10 in the second.

No more than three points separated the Gamecocks and Skyhawks through the game's first 19 minutes that saw the lead change hands seven times. It wasn't until the minute of the period that Jacksonville State found a 7-0 run to take a 38-31 advantage to the locker room.

Freshman De'Torriion Ware and senior Christian Cunningham hit back-to-back

layups to stretch the JSU lead to four, 35-31, before senior guard Jason Burnell knocked down a 3-pointer at the buzzer to give Jacksonville State the momentum at the break.

UT Martin quickly answered the Gamecocks' run with a 7-0 run of their own to begin the second half, tying the game 38-38. The Skyhawks run grew to 13-4 through the first four minutes, led by six points and a dunk from Dove.

After seven more lead changes in the second, UTM claimed the lead for good with just over a minute to play on a Preston Parks 3-pointer, going ahead 66-64.

Jacksonville State had the opportunity to tie the game with five seconds to go, but a couple of missed chances at the free-throw line saw the Gamecocks' first-place hopes dashed in the final moments of the road contest.

With Murray State (18-4, 9-2 OVC), Austin Peay (17-7, 9-2 OVC) and Belmont (18-4, 9-2 OVC) winning their Thursday games, JSU dropped to fourth in the league with seven games remaining in the regular season.

CAPE GIRARDEAU, Mo. – Marlon Hunter's first-career double-double helped the Jacksonville State men's basketball team to an 81-64 win over Southeast Missouri at the Show Me Center on Saturday.

The senior guard had career-highs in both points scored (27) and rebounds (12) during the Gamecocks (17-8, 9-3 OVC) 17-point road win over the Redhawks (8-17, 3-9 OVC).

"We had a lot of kids compete today," head coach Ray Harper said. "I thought we had some guys really step up. Marlon Hunter, obviously. He had a great day with 27 points and 12 rebounds."

"Our kids did what they needed to get a win today."

Hunter helped the Gamecocks to a 42-28 lead at the break with 19 first-half points. The Panama City, Fla., native set a new career-best within the first 20 minutes, hitting three 3-pointers. He came just two boards shy of earning his double-double in the first period.

In total, Hunter finished the game with five 3-pointers; three more than his previous career-high.

Trailing 5-4 three minutes into the game, Jacksonville State found its second gear and went on a 26-11 run over the following eight minutes to go up 30-15. Harper played a small five for part of the period, getting an extra four points from sophomore Derek St. Hilaire and five from freshman De'Torriion Ware off the bench.

Southeast Missouri began the second half with a 6-0 run, cutting the JSU advantage to eight, then found a 5-0 streak a few minutes later to shave the lead to eight again, but both times the Gamecocks answered and stretched their advantage back to double-figures.

Jacksonville State's lead reached a game-high 20 with 38 seconds left to play. A 3-pointer from SEMO's Gabe McGlothan saved the Redhawks from taking a 20-point loss in the scorebook.

McGlothan paced Southeast Missouri with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Ledarius Brewer pitched in 11 points from the guard position, and Alex Caldwell added 10 of the Redhawks' 23 bench points.

Jacksonville State now 9-2 in conference games this season, representing the best league record in the program's Division I history after 12 games played.

COOKEVILLE, Tenn. – Senior Jason Burnell collected his 12th double-double of the season while leading the Jacksonville State men's basketball team to a 67-57 win over Tennessee Tech Thursday night at Hooper Eblen Center.

Burnell led the Gamecocks (18-8, 10-3 OVC) in scoring and rebounding with 21 and 12, respectively. He shared his 21st double-digit scoring effort of the year with Marlon Hunter, who registered 20 on nine baskets.

It was Hunter's second 20-point game in a row, following a 27-point performance against Southeast Missouri last Saturday at Cape Girardeau's Show Me Center.

"I thought our guys were good," head coach Ray Harper said. "We had three good days of preparation and it showed."

A four-point run brought Tennessee Tech within four points of the JSU lead, 12-8, but that was as close as the home team would get to a lead before the break.

The Gamecocks took a 34-19 advantage to the half thanks to a stout defensive showing and domination on the boards. Along with holding TTU to 25-percent shooting, JSU out-rebounded the Eagles 34-19. That led to Jacksonville State holding a 12-6 advantage on second-chance points.

Tennessee Tech outscored the Gamecocks 38-33 in the second half to keep the final score's damage to 10, but Jacksonville State led by as much as 22 with 10 minutes to play. Two eight-point runs, including a 15-point half from point guard Junior Clay, whittled JSU's lead to single-digits with a minute left.

Clay paced the Eagles in scoring with 17 points; scoring just two in the first half.

"We kind of lost our heads there in the second half," Harper said. "We got out of character, but fortunately we made some plays and were able to stretch the lead back out."

Jacksonville State moved into a tie for third in the OVC standings with the victory, following an Austin Peay loss to Murray State. Belmont and the Racers sit atop the league tied, while the Govs and JSU are third.

JSU's defense held Tennessee State to just 20 points and forced 13 turnovers through the first 20 minutes. The Gamecocks outscored the Tigers 16-4 off mistakes, and a 37-20 rebounding matchup helped Jacksonville State to a 17-point advantage at halftime.

"I thought we were really good during the first half," Harper said. "I didn't think we were as good defensively in the second half. We had too many breakdowns that we have to get corrected by next week."

TSU scored the game's first basket and reclaimed a one-point lead after three minutes of play, but Jacksonville State answered with a Burnell layup and took a double-digit lead by the under-12 media timeout.

Burnell tallied 15 points in the first period, coming up just three points short of his record for points scored in a single half. It was his highest scoring total in a first half for the Deland, Fla., native.

Jacksonville State edged the Tigers with a 47-45 second-half score. The Tigers' Stokley Chaffee scored nine of his team-leading 17 points in the period, but it wasn't enough to out-work Burnell. The JSU senior tacked on 14 more points.

The Gamecocks reached their largest lead just three minutes into the stanza, going ahead by 25.

Senior Jamall Gregory scored 13 points for the game and added another highlight-reel dunk to his already-impressive resume, while junior point guard Ty Hudson tallied 10 on the night. Hudson was 4-for-7 from the field with a 3-pointer.

Morehead State 64, Jacksonville State 65

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team earned a thrilling come-from-behind win over Morehead State Thursday at Pete Mathews Coliseum, 65-64, securing its third 20-win season in a row.

The Gamecocks (20-8, 12-3 OVC) have now won 20-or-more games over the last three seasons, setting a new Division I record for the program. The last time a JSU team accomplished the feat was during the 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1991-92 seasons under then-head coach Bill Jones.

Jacksonville State also tied its Division I record for conference wins in a single season with 12.

Both senior forwards Christian Cunningham and Jason Burnell recorded double-doubles against the Eagles (10-18, 6-9 OVC). Burnell paced the Gamecocks with 19 points with 12 rebounds, while Cunningham tallied a game-best 13 rebounds with 13 points.

Jacksonville State trailed nearly the entire second half and did not see a lead until 41 seconds left to play in the game.

Down by six, five consecutive points from Burnell pulled the Gamecocks within one point of the MSU lead with two minutes to go. Ty Hudson then stepped to the line two baskets later to sink two free throws, giving Jacksonville State a 62-61 lead. A third Hudson free throw and two more from Burnell extended the Gamecocks' lead to four with six seconds remaining on the clock.

Morehead State's AJ Hicks hit a near-half-court 3-pointer to cut the game to one, but time expired while the ball was in flight to end the contest before another possession could be had.

Burnell secured his team-leading 13th double-double of the year in the second half, tallying 13 points and 10 boards in the final 20 minutes. Cunningham added seven points and seven rebounds in the period.

The Gamecocks got off to a slow start, trailing 7-2 after the first four minutes of play. Marlon Hunter then went and scored nine of JSU's next 11 points, including a 3-pointer that gave Jacksonville State a one-point lead.

The momentum from Hunter's streak propelled the Gamecocks to a 9-0 run that yielded a four-point lead; the largest of the period for JSU.

The lead was short-lived, however, as the Eagles outscored Jacksonville State 12-4 to finish off the half. Morehead State took a 34-30 lead to the locker room, giving JSU just its fourth deficit at the half against OVC opponents.

Jacksonville State's win after trailing at the break was just its third win in that situation, improving to 3-7 when down at the break.

Eastern Kentucky 101, Jacksonville State 104 (2OT)

JACKSONVILLE – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team wrapped up its home slate in dramatic fashion Saturday night at The Pete, outlasting Eastern Kentucky 104-101 in double-overtime.

Tied at 82 at the end of regulation and knotted at 92 at the end of the first overtime, Jacksonville State (21-8, 13-3 OVC) battled for 50 minutes and overcame a three-point deficit to claim the victory in the game's final minute.

A Colonels' 3-pointer put the Gamecocks down 99-96 with 1:32 left in the third OT, but a deuce-and-damage layup from Marlon Hunter tied the game just 15 seconds later. With Pete Mathews Coliseum rocking, Ty Hudson fought for a layup to give Jacksonville State the lead.

EKU (12-17, 5-11 OVC) called its final timeout after the Hudson basket, but was unable to get the ball inbounds in five seconds, turning the ball over with 26 seconds remaining. Detrick Mostella added an insurance points on a free throw, pushing the lead to 102-99, and a missed 3-pointer from the Colonels' Nick Mayo gave the ball back to the Gamecocks. Hudson then hit two free throws in a row to put the game out of reach. A last-ditch layup from EKU cut it to three points, but with no timeouts left to call the Colonels had to watch the clock run down to zero.

Senior Christian Cunningham tallied a double-double in his final game at The Pete, scoring 17 with 14 rebounds, while Jason Burnell registered his seventh 20-point game of the season.

Hudson finished with a team-leading and career-high 21 points, surpassing his previous high of 18.

Eastern Kentucky jumped out to a six-point lead in the game's first two minutes, but the JSU offense erased the deficit before the first media timeout on a 13-0 run. By the midway point of the first period, the Gamecocks led 28-20 with their largest lead of the game.

Jamall Gregory and Cunningham got the crowd into the game with a couple of big dunks. First, Gregory fed Cunningham on an alley-oop to make it 21-18, and then a steal and fast-break slam from Gregory made it 28-20 in favor of the Gamecocks.

Eastern Kentucky cut back into the JSU lead in the final three minutes of the period, coming within one point of tying the contest, but the Gamecocks were able to manage a 45-41 buffer at the break.

Gregory hit back-to-back baskets in the final 30 seconds of regulation to send the game to overtime. He hit an open-lane layup to pull JSU within two points of the Colonels, 82-80, and a big dunk with 11 seconds to go tied the game.

A near-3-pointer by Mostella almost ended the game at the end of regulation, and a Hudson jumper at the end of the first overtime came close to falling, but both missed.

CHARLESTON, Ill. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team gutted out a second-straight double overtime win Thursday night, topping Eastern Illinois 89-84 in 50 minutes of nail-biting action at EIU's Lantz Arena.

Freshman De'Torriion Ware put on a tremendous second-half and overtime performance off the bench to give the Gamecocks (22-8, 14-3 OVC) a much-needed spark. The Hopkinsville, Ky., native scored 12 in the second half and five in the two overtime periods en route to tying his single-game best of 20 points.

A 3-pointer and four made free throws within the final five minutes of regulation from Ware brought the game down to one possession, and senior Jason Burnell tied the game 66-66 to send it to overtime.

Eastern Illinois (14-16, 7-10 OVC) found itself up again with eight seconds remaining in the first overtime period, but junior point guard Ty Hudson was able to maneuver his way to a layup with three seconds left to tie the game 75-75, sending the Gamecocks to their second double-OT situation in as many games.

JSU pulled away in the last moments of the second overtime period to claim the five-point victory. With EIU ahead by two with 2:57 left, Jacksonville State outscored the Panthers 11-4 through the remainder of the game.

All 11 points came on free throws. Detrick Mostella was 5-for-6 during the run, while Burnell was 4-for-4.

Burnell finished with a game-best 26 points and 14 rebounds for his team-leading 14th double-double of the year. His 14 boards pushed his single-season total to 276, making him Jacksonville State's new single-season rebounding leader. The senior surpassed fellow senior Christian Cunningham for the record, set in 2016-17 with 275 rebounds.

Eastern Illinois got off to a hot start through the first four minutes of the game, going ahead 11-2 on 4-of-5 shooting, including three 3-pointers. Following a jump ball to stop the clock, Harper subbed out four of five starters, leaving just Burnell on the court.

With Derek St. Hilaire, Jacara Cross, Maurice Dunlap and Mostella on the floor, the next four minutes looked much different. The Gamecocks outscored the Panthers 12-5 over the stretch, and the defense kept the home team to 2-for-5 shooting.

Following a Josiah Wallace jumper to give EIU a two-point lead, and break a 27-27 tie with 13 seconds left in the first half, Jacksonville State answered right back to take a one-point advantage to the locker room. St. Hilaire dished to Ware in the far corner, who banged a 3-pointer to put JSU up 30-29 at the end of the first 20 minutes.

Eastern Illinois had two score in the 20s; Mack Smith totaling 24, while Wallace finished with 23. Smith hit nine of his 15 shot attempts, including four 3-pointers.

EDWARDSVILLE, Ill. – The Jacksonville State men's basketball team claimed the season sweep over Southern Illinois University Edwardsville with a 97-72 win Saturday night at the Vadalabene Center.

The victory secured at least third place in the Ohio Valley Conference regular season standings and made the Gamecocks (23-8, 15-3 OVC) at least the No. 3 seed in the upcoming OVC Basketball Championships in Evansville, Ind. The standings and seedings will be finalized at the end of the night once league play has ended.

The program's highest-ever seeding in a Division I tournament buys JSU a first-round bye. The Gamecocks are scheduled to play the winner of the No. 6 seed and No. 7 match-up Thursday, March 7 at 8:30 p.m. at the Ford Center.

Seniors Jason Burnell and Christian Cunningham each recorded double-doubles and were two of five Gamecocks to score in double-figures. Burnell tied his career-best with 30 points and 13 rebounds for his team-leading 15th double-double of the year, while Cunningham had 11 points and 10 rebounds for his 20th-career double.

Along with Burnell and Cunningham, Ty Hudson, Detrick Mostella and De'Torriion Ware finished with 11, 11 and 15 points, respectively.

Jacksonville State led the Cougars (10-20, 6-12 OVC) 50-20 at the end of the first half following a tough defensive showing through the first 20 minutes. JSU held SIUE to just 23.3 percent shooting, allowing just seven of 30 shots to fall. Edwardsville committed seven turnovers, including one steal each from Jamall Gregory and Hudson. Cunningham tallied two blocks, as well.

On the offensive end, Burnell led the Gamecocks with 21 points at the break. He was just two rebounds shy of his double-double when the clock hit zero at the end of the opening period.

The 30-point halftime advantage was the largest of the season for JSU, and widest since leading 38-24 over SIUE in the season's first meeting Jan. 12 at Pete Mathews Coliseum.

Edwardsville made up some ground in the second, cutting the JSU lead to 25 with the help of seven 3-pointers in the final 20 minutes. The Cougars had just one trey the entire first half. David McFarland and Tyresse Williford were each 3-for-4 from 3-point range in the half.

Jacksonville State took care of business, however, totaling 47 points to keep SIUE 25 points away. Ware had a half-best 12 points on 4-of-9 shooting with all four goals coming from long range. That 12 went with three from the first to give him 15 for the game.

UT Martin 81, Jacksonville State 88

March 7, 2019 - Ford Center

EVANSVILLE, Ind. – Redshirt senior Detrick Mostella led the Jacksonville State men's basketball team to a comeback, 88-81 win over UT Martin in the quarterfinals of the Ohio Valley Conference Men's Basketball Championships Thursday at the Ford Center.

The first-year Gamecock scored a game-best 21 points; his single-game high since coming to Jacksonville. The Decatur, Ala., native was 7-for-13 from the field and 6-for-11 from 3-point range.

Jacksonville State (23-9, 15-3 OVC) overcame a 10-point, 43-33 deficit at the half, rallying to outscore the Skyhawks (12-9, 6-12 OVC) 55-38 in the game's final 20 minutes.

After leading by as much as nine points in the first half, a 7-0 Skyhawk run erased the JSU advantage. A layup by UTM's Quintin Dove at 7:24 put the opposition ahead for the first time since its first goal of the game.

Dove scored a whopping 29 points for the Skyhawks in the first half, accounting for all but 14 of UT Martin's first-half total of 43. The guard knocked down seven of nine 3-point attempts after entering the game with six 3-pointers on the entire season.

The Gamecocks found their footing in the second period and used a 17-2 run to climb back into the competition. JSU's best run of keeping the Skyhawks off the board lasted more than 11 minutes and added 11 points to the scoreboard for the designated home team.

Following a six-point half that included two 3-pointers, Mostella went off for 15 points in the last period. Mostella was 5-for-7 and hit four treys along the way, while also dishing out four helpers and grabbing four rebounds. He came up just four points of his career-high of 25, scored in his junior season at Tennessee.

Trailing by just three points at the 13:33 mark, Mostella tied the game 51-51 with a 3-pointer, and only two minutes later gave Jacksonville State its first lead in nearly 15 minutes on a dunk. He then extended the advantage to five with his fourth 3-ball of the night.

Fellow senior Jason Burnell turned in a 19-point performance, hitting eight of 14 shots with five assists, and senior Marlon Hunter bucketed 16 points with seven baskets.

The victory was Jacksonville State's 24th of the season, setting a new Division-I record for the program. The previous mark for most wins in a single season came last season when head coach Ray Harper led the 2017-18 Gamecocks to 23 wins.

It also extended the Gamecocks' winning streak to eight games, making it the longest winning streak in Jacksonville State's Division-I history.

With the win, JSU moves on to the semifinals of the OVC Tournament to take on Murray State at 9 p.m. on ESPNU. It is Jacksonville State's third appearance in the semifinals of the OVC Championships in as many seasons.

HEAD COACH

April 6, 2016, Gamecocks athletics director Greg Seitz announced the hiring of Ray Harper as the program's 11th head coach and the fifth to run the Gamecocks at the Division I level.

In his second year as head coach in 2017-18, Harper led Jacksonville State to 20 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in the program's Division I history and for the first time since legendary head coach Bill Jones accomplished the feat in 1990-91 and 1991-92. The Gamecocks' 23-13 record represented just the third 20-win season in their D-1 history and the second under Harper.

The 2017-18 season also brought Jacksonville State its second appearance in a national postseason tournament. After leading JSU to its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament only a year ago, Harper took the Gamecocks to the semifinals of the College Basketball Invitational. Jacksonville State claimed wins over Canisius and Central Arkansas in the first and quarterfinal rounds, respectively, en route to its first ever wins in a major postseason tournament.

The second-year head coach also delivered a second consecutive berth in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament in 2018 - a first in JSU's OVC history. Jacksonville State had not appeared in consecutive conference tournaments since making the Atlantic Sun Tournament in 2003 and qualifying for the OVC Tournament in 2004. While at the Ford Center in Evansville, Ind., Harper helped the Gamecocks to a 73-70 win over Tennessee Tech in the first round, handing JSU its seventh OVC Tournament win in school history. Coupled with its three wins in the 2017 OVC Championships, the four-game winning streak stood as the longest undefeated streak in the OVC Tournament in the program's history.

In his first season as head coach, Harper inherited a 2016-17 team that was 8-23 the season prior and had not qualified for an OVC Tournament since 2012. The Gamecocks were picked to finish 12th out of 12 teams during preseason polling, and since joining the Division I ranks in 1993, JSU had never won a conference championship or appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Less than one year after his hire date, the first-year head coach completely changed the perception of Jacksonville State basketball.

The Gamecocks went on to complete one of the most successful seasons in the program's history in 2016-17. Harper led JSU to its first ever Ohio Valley Conference title, first appearance in the Division I NCAA Tournament and just the second 20-win season in the program's Division I history. JSU finished the 2016-17 campaign as the sixth-most improved team in the nation (+10.0 wins).

The Gamecocks clinched a berth to just their fifth OVC Tournament since joining the league in 2003-04 with a 70-61 road win over Morehead State to cap the regular season. JSU entered the conference tournament as the No. 3 seed, earning a first-round bye. Jacksonville State defeated No. 5 seeded Southeast Missouri 74-51 in the first round, upset top-seeded Belmont 65-59 in the second round and downed No. 2 seeded UT Martin 66-55 to claim its first Division I title.

Harper became only the second head coach in JSU history to lead the Gamecocks to a 20-win season as a D1 program. He is just the second Jacksonville State head coach to win 20 games in his first season at the helm, tying Jones who began his tenure in 1974 with a 20-7 clip. Harper was one of three first-year head coaches to enjoy a .500+ record; Jones was the last to accomplish the feat in a premiere season 42 years prior.

A veteran with over 30 years of experience at the collegiate ranks, Harper boasts a 474-155 career record in 19 years as a head coach. That career includes four national championships - two at the Division II level and two in NAIA. His .754 career winning percentage is best among all active OVC coaches.

Harper came to Jacksonville after a five-year stint at Western Kentucky that saw him post an 89-64 mark that included three 20-win seasons and two trips to the NCAA Tournament. After serving over two years as an assistant at WKU, he took over as the Hilltoppers' interim coach in January of the 2011-12 season and was named the full-time head coach in early February.

At WKU, he went to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and 2013 and won 20 games in his first three full seasons, making him the first coach in WKU history to achieve the feat.

After taking the helm at Western Kentucky, the Hilltoppers went 11-8 (interim) and 7-1 after he was named full-time head coach, which came after starting the season with a 5-11 record.

His debut with the Hilltoppers saw him rally them to the Sun Belt Conference Tournament title and a win over Mississippi Valley State in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament in Dayton. A 20-12 record in 2012-13 ended with the Hilltoppers' second trip to the Big Dance in as many years.

Prior to joining the WKU program as an assistant in 2009, Harper built a head coaching resume that included four national championships, five national runner-up finishes, eight conference titles, five national coach-of-the-year honors and a 342-63 record over 12 years at Kentucky Wesleyan and Oklahoma City University.

Harper was named the NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year four-straight years from 1999-2002, while earning the honor at the NAIA Division I level once with Oklahoma City following the 2008 title run. He was selected conference coach of the year on seven occasions, as well as the region coach of the year twice.

In nine years at his alma mater Kentucky Wesleyan in Owensboro, Ky., Harper laid claim to seven NCAA coaching records, surpassing Division I record-holders in all instances, including becoming the fastest to 200 wins (224 games), holding the most consecutive 30-win seasons (6) and compiling the most wins in each of the first four-through-eight seasons of his career.

With NCAA Division II title game appearances each season from 1998-03, he became the first NCAA head coach since John Wooden to appear in six-straight NCAA National Championship games. He won in '99 and '01.

The NCAA requires a minimum of 10 seasons at the Division II level to officially qualify for its list of head coaching records, but Harper's nine-year record of 247-46 at Kentucky Wesleyan would give him the best winning percentage in Division II history at .843.

At Kentucky Wesleyan, he coached two National Players of the Year, seven All-Americans and nine NABC Great Lakes All-Region players. He had 11 players selected All-Great Lakes Valley Conference and two that were named the league's player of the year.

Through seven seasons, he had more victories than any coach at the NCAA Division I and II levels (210). Harper reached 200 wins in 224 games, which was faster than NCAA Division I record holder and Hall of Famer Clair Bee, who won 200 in 231 games.

On February 17, 2008, Harper's number 12 jersey was retired at Kentucky Wesleyan, and the floor at Jones Gymnasium was named "Ray Harper Court."

From Kentucky Wesleyan, Harper went to Oklahoma City, where in three seasons at the NAIA Division I institution, Harper put together a 95-17 record that featured back-to-back national titles in '07 and '08.

He has also coached on the international level, having led USA Basketball men's junior team to a 7-1 record and a fifth-place finish at the 2003 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

The native of Bremen, Ky., and a 1985 graduate of Kentucky Wesleyan, Harper was a two-year starter for the Panthers after transferring from Texas. He became the school's first All-American as a senior, and he also earned most outstanding player in the regional as well as all-region and all-conference accolades. The 1981 Southwest Conference Rookie of the Year at Texas after averaging 9.8 points and 3.9 assists per outing, Harper finished his college career with 1,187 points and 605 assists at the two schools.

In April of 2010, Harper was named to Kentucky Wesleyan's All-Century Team. Harper coached 12 of the 30 players on the All-Century Team

Harper scored 3,033 points during his high school playing career, earning all-state honors as a senior and District Player of the Year acclaim twice. He earned his Master's degree from WKU in 1995.
