#### THE GAME

Kent State will spend the Thanksgiving weekend in Las Vegas playing three games in the Play4Kay Showcase, which is regard as the best women's basketball tournament in the country during the early part of the season.

In their first trip to Las Vegas since 1988, the Golden Flashes are tasked with playing No. 14 Stanford in the opening round on Thursday at 8:30 p.m. ET.

Kent State has already played a pair of neutral site contests and went 1-1 at the Akron Classic last weekend. The Flashes fell to Mid-Major Poll No. 2 FGCU, 80-62, in the opening game Friday and then took care of Southeastern Louisiana, 81-60, on Saturday.

Senior forward Jordan Korinek (22.3 ppg, 5.0 rpg) scored 50 points in just 49 minutes and shooting 16-for-26 (.615) from the floor and 17-for-18 (.944) at the free throw line over the two games. Korinek scored a career-high 31 points against Southeastern Louisiana and combined with graduate student forward McKenna Stephens (7.8 ppg, 8.8 rpg), who grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds in both games, to dominate play around the basket. The Flashes outrebounded their opponents by an average of 15.0 per game and held advantages of 35-17 in second-chance points and 66-44 in points in the paint over the two contests.

Coming off a trip to the Final Four and ranked 9th in the preseason, Stanford opened the season with a pair of 20-plus point losses to top-ranked UConn and No. 5 Ohio State. The Cardinal returned home last weekend to take care of UC Riverside (53-43) and Cal State Bakersfield (57-34).

Stanford has played its last two games without guard Brittany McPhee (16.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg), a John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 30 selection. Guard DiJonai Carrington (10.5 ppg, 10.3 rpg) is enjoying a breakout season, as she poured in a career-high 21 points against UConn and then went for 13 points and 22 rebounds against UC Riverside. Center Alanna Smith (8.8 ppg, 5.8 rpg) was named to the watch list for the Lisa Leslie Award, which recognizes the nation's top center.



#### CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line continues to be a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan under second-year head coach Todd Starkey. A season ago, the Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794). Kent State made 48 more free throws on the season than its opponents attempted (546).

The Flashes have made more free throws than its opposition in each of its first four games and rank second in the country in free throws made and fifth in free throw attempts. Kent State is 84-for-111 (.757) at the charity stripe so far this season compared to 37-for-53 (.698) for its opponents.

#### THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, The Years of Youth, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

Second Season / Montreat College, '93

Todd Starkey enters his second season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016.

Starkey was named 2017 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and

I the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous ison, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked inish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular ison ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of iference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined. Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes eived an at-large bid to the WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament aited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the shes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, -60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

he 20-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, reduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the paiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance 1 grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and was a perfect 0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest iference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the paiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and ke the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

lis first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenior-Rhyne University in kory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest ach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic ference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 is per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, luding a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II Coach the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program tory. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular ison and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first AA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling he second round.

Second Season / Virginia Tech, '04

Fran Recchia enters her second season as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff and mentors the team's wings in addition to serving as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Recchia helped guide Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during the 2016-17 season, which concluded with the first Mid-American Conference East Division title since 2004-05 and a WNIT postseason berth. The Golden Flashes, who compiled a 19-13 overall record, had the nation's

gest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and fifth most-proved record in the country.

AAC Player of the Year Larissa Lurken enjoyed a breakout senior season under chia's tutelage, setting program records for points (752) and scoring average (23.5  $\S$ ) while making an NCAA Division I record 280 free throws. She was the only Division ayer in the nation that averaged 20 points, six rebounds, two assists, two blocked its, two three-pointers and one steal per game.

Before arriving in Kent, Recchia had spent five of the previous six seasons as an istant coach at Radford. Upon returning in 2013, she served as the program's ruiting coordinator and was responsible for wing player development, scouting, idemics and compliance. Overall, she helped guide the Highlanders to one WNIT searance and two Big South runner-up finishes while mentoring five All-Big South actions.

Recchia served as an assistant coach at Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tennessee ing the 2012-13 season and was head coach at William Byrd High School in Vinton, finia from 2007-10

Prior to that, she spent five years at Virginia Tech, playing guard from 2001-05 I then serving as a graduate assistant during the 2005-06 season. She helped Hokies to four 20-win seasons and five postseason appearances, including four secutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

A four-year letterwinner and member

of three Mid-American Conference championship teams (2006, 2008, 2010) as a student-athlete, McKee has been associated with Kent State since the 2005-06 season. He spent the 2010-11 season as a graduate assistant before moving into the operations role. During that time, the Golden Flashes boasted six conference championship teams and participated in the postseason nine times.

McKee contributed to three of Kent State's six all-time NCAA Tournament appearances. He was a member of teams that won both the MAC regular season and tournament championships in 2006 and 2008. The Flashes also appeared in the 2017 NCAA Tournament to conclude his time with the program.

A celebrated three-point marksman, McKee wrapped up his time on the court in style by leading the Golden Flashes to their second MAC Championship in three seasons in 2010. Kent State compiled a 24-10 overall record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Also a member of the 2008 Kent State team that went 28-7 and earned a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, McKee drained 143 career three-pointers during his time with the Blue and Gold, ending his career tied for ninth all-time in school history. Additionally, he ranked eighth at Kent State with 128 games played and ninth with 92 wins to his credit.

The Plum, Pa. product was a member of the Chi Alpha Sigma National College Athlete Honor Society and earned Academic All-MAC honorable mention accolades in 2009. McKee is a two-time graduate of Kent State University, earning his undergraduate degree in education in December of 2009 and his master's in sports and recreation management in May of 2011.
