Kent State plays its third game in six days at No. 24/21 Michigan at 2 p.m. Sunday inside of the Crisler Center, as the Golden Flashes visit the site where last season came to an end in a 67-60 loss to the Wolverines in the first round of the WNIT.

After grinding out a come-from-behind overtime victory on the road Tuesday night at Eastern Kentucky, Kent State had one of its worst offensive performances of the season in a 72-60 loss at home to Wright State less than 48 hours later on Thursday. After hitting eight of their first 10 shots in the game, the Flashes went without a field goal over the next 15 possessions, a span of 8:40 on the game clock, and shot just 11-for-42 (.262) the rest of the game.

Senior **Jordan Korinek** led the way with 22 points and eight rebounds. Junior **Alexa Golden** shot 3-for-4 from the three-point line and finished with 13 points. Senior **Naddiyah Cross** registered a season-best eight assists.

Korinek has been very efficient in scoring a team-high 19.8 ppg. She is shooting 53.7 percent from the floor, including 10-for-20 from the three-point line, and 80 percent at the foul line. She ranks 10th nationally in free throws made (56) and 11th in free throw attempts (70). Graduate student **McKenna Stephens** leads the team with 6.1 rpg and adds 10.3 ppg. **Cross** is averaging a career-best in every major statistical category, including 5.2 apg.

Michigan has won three straight after holding off a late rally to defeat Marquette, 82-76, on Thursday. Both of the Wolverines' losses came against Top 5 opponents, a 75-49 loss at No. 5 Louisville and an 83-63 setback to No. 3 Notre Dame. Michigan has scored more than 80 in each game of its current winning streak and averages 74.1 points per game on the season.

All-America guard Katelynn Flaherty ranks sixth in the nation in scoring at 23.4 points per game and has leads the team with 4.0 assists per game. Flaherty is Michigan's career leading scorer with 2,230 points and needs just 77 points to cracking the top 10 in scoring in Big Ten history. All-Big Ten forward Hallie Thome (17.1 ppg, 6.2 rpg) has made 65.2 percent of her field goal attempts this season and ranks seventh nationally. Forward Jillian Dunston hauls in 9.7 rebounds per game and has more assists (30) than points (26).

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line continues to be a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan under second-year head coach Todd Starkey. A season ago, the Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794). Kent State made 48 more free throws on the season than its opponents attempted (546).

The Flashes have made more free throws than their opposition in six of the first 10 games and rank third in the country in free throws made and sixth in free throw attempts. Kent State is 173-for-235 (.736) at the charity stripe so far this season compared to 101-for-145 (.697) for its opponents.

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, The Years of Youth, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

KENT STATE - MICHIGAN NOTES

- Kent State is 0-4 all-time vs. Michigan with each game being played in Ann Arbor.
- The Golden Flashes saw last season come to an end at the hands of the Wolverines in a 67-60 loss at the Crisler Center in the first round of the WNIT.
- This will be the first regular season meeting between the schools since Dec. 30, 1981, which Michigan won, 79-63.
- Kent State is 5-31 all-time vs. schools currently in the Big Ten.

FLASH BACK: (MARCH 16, 2017) MICHIGAN 67, KENT STATE 60

- Kent State's second-half rally fell short in a 67-60 loss in the first round of the WNIT on March 16, 2017.
- The Golden Flashes shot just 6-for-32 (.188) in the first half and trailed by 21 but fought to get the deficit to just five with two minutes to play.
- Kent State was relentless on the glass and held a 46-34 rebounding advantage.
- The Flashes grabbed 22 of their own missed shots and converted them into 20 second-chance points.
- Merissa Barber-Smith set career-highs (at the time) with 8 points and 13 rebounds (7 offensive) in 19 minutes off the bench.
- Larissa Lurken scored a team-high 19 points on just 4-for-20 shooting and had eight rebounds.
- Kent State started its comeback by winning the third quarter, 21-12 and held Michigan scoreless until the 6:26 mark of the fourth, but managed just four points in that stretch.
- Megan Carter made a layup to get within 61-56 with 2:03 to play, but that is as close as it got.

KENT STATE PROJECTED TO FINISH SECOND IN MAC EAST DIVISION

Second Season / Montreat College, '93

Todd Starkey enters his second season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016.

Starkey was named 2017 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of its biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and

1 the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined. Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. The angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament defeated Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 60-40. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 20-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and was a perfect 10-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in a season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Lenoir, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first AA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Last season, Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country with a CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 3-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.

Second Season / Virginia Tech, '04

Fran Recchia enters her second season as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff and mentors the team's wings in addition to serving as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Recchia helped guide Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during the 2016-17 season, which concluded with the first Mid-American Conference East Division title since 2004-05 and a WNIT postseason berth. The Golden Flashes, who compiled a 19-13 overall record, had the nation's

largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and fifth most-improved record in the country.

MAC Player of the Year Larissa Lurken enjoyed a breakout senior season under Recchia's tutelage, setting program records for points (752) and scoring average (23.5 ppg) while making an NCAA Division I record 280 free throws. She was the only Division I player in the nation that averaged 20 points, six rebounds, two assists, two blocked shots, two three-pointers and one steal per game.

Before arriving in Kent, Recchia had spent five of the previous six seasons as an assistant coach at Radford. Upon returning in 2013, she served as the program's recruiting coordinator and was responsible for wing player development, scouting, academics and compliance. Overall, she helped guide the Highlanders to one WNIT appearance and two Big South runner-up finishes while mentoring five All-Big South selections.

Recchia served as an assistant coach at Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tennessee during the 2012-13 season and was head coach at William Byrd High School in Vinton, Virginia from 2007-10.

A celebrated three-point marksman, McKee wrapped up his time on the court in style by leading the Golden Flashes to their second MAC Championship in three seasons in 2010. Kent State compiled a 24-10 overall record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Also a member of the 2008 Kent State team that went 28-7 and earned a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, McKee drained 143 career three-pointers during his time with the Blue and Gold, ending his career tied for ninth all-time in school history. Additionally, he ranked eighth at Kent State with 128 games played and ninth with 92 wins to his credit.

The Plum, Pa. product was a member of the Chi Alpha Sigma National College Athlete Honor Society and earned Academic All-MAC honorable mention accolades in 2009. McKee is a two-time graduate of Kent State University, earning his undergraduate degree in education in December of 2009 and his master's in sports and recreation management in May of 2011.
