Kent State will attempt to even its record heading into finals week when it plays at Robert Morris on Friday night at 7 p.m. Due to construction to replace RMU's previous arena, the game will be played at the North Athletic Complex Student Rec Center.

The Golden Flashes have lost two in a row and are coming off their worst offensive performance in a 61-55 setback Sunday at Wright State. In addition to posting a season-low scoring total, Kent State shot below 30 percent from the field and went just 2-for-24 from beyond the three-point arc. **Megan Carter** scored 18 points to lead the way with three teammates adding nine apiece. **Merissa Barber-Smith** grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds and **Alexa Golden** added nine boards.

Megan Carter (18.0 ppg) has scored at least 14 points in every game and is the fifth-leading scorer in the MAC. Carter also leads the Flashes in assists (3.0 apg) and is second in rebounding (5.4 rpg). **Asiah Dingle** (12.2 ppg) has provided a scoring threat at the point guard position. **Lindsey Thall** (9.7 ppg, 5.3 rpg) leads Kent State with 12 three-pointers and 10 blocks. **Merissa Barber-Smith** is the team's top rebounder at 6.6 per game. **Alexa Golden** (5.3 ppg) has a team-high 12 steals.

Robert Morris has lost five straight following a 92-63 setback at No. 14/15 Iowa on Sunday. That was the Colonial first loss by more than 10 points, as they have lost three games by five points or less in addition to an overtime loss to Youngstown State in the season opener.

After winning a program-record 25 games a season ago, RMU has struggled offensively to the start the season. The Colonials ranks 307th in scoring (56.9 ppg) and 318th in field goal percentage (.346). RMU has made more three-pointers (63) than free throws (53) and has converted just better than 60-percent of its shots at the charity stripe.

Preseason All-NEC center Nneka Ezeigbo is the Colonials' top scorer at 10.0 ppg and also leads the team with 13 steals and 11 blocks. Forward Nadège Pluviose grabs a team-high 7.0 rpg. Guards Megan Callahan (9.3 ppg), Esther Castedo (7.4 ppg) and Honoka Ikematsu (7.3 ppg) have combined for 44 three-point field goals and 12 two-point field goals.

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, The Years of Youth, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

KENT STATE - ROBERT MORRIS NOTES

- Kent State is 5-5 all-time vs. Robert Morris.
- The Golden Flashes turned in a stellar defensive effort in a 46-31 victory last season in Moon Township.
- Robert Morris had won the previous three matchups, including a 68-65 overtime victory two seasons ago.
- Kent State rallied from a 13-point deficit in the fourth quarter to send the game into overtime.
- This will be the fifth meeting in Moon Township with RMU holding a 2-2 advantage on its home court.

FLASH BACK: (DEC. 19, 2017)

KENT STATE 46, ROBERT MORRIS 31

- Kent State concluded the non-conference portion of the season with one of the best defensive performances in program history.
- The Golden Flashes put together 40 minutes of stifling defense to allow the third-fewest points in program history and the fewest since Dec. 28, 1996.
- Kent State held the host Colonials to just under half of their scoring average entering the contest on 25 percent shooting (13-for-52).
- A collective effort on the boards led to a 43-21 rebounding advantage, as all 10 Flashes who entered had at least one rebound.
- Jordan Korinek** scored a game-high 17 points and grabbed seven rebounds.
- Ali Poole** had a career-high eight rebounds to go with 11 points.
- Alexa Golden** and **Naddiyah Cross** grabbed five rebounds apiece. Golden added a game-high five assists.
- Jocelynne Jones led RMU with nine points.

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the first two seasons of the **Todd Starkey** era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State ranks second nationally in free throws per game (16.58), sixth in free throws made (1,144), eighth in free throw attempts (1,535) and 38th in free throw percentage (.748).

Todd Starkey enters his second season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016.

Starkey was named 2017 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 20-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since

1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Last season, Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.

Fran Recchia was promoted to associate head coach in July 2018. Entering her third season on the women's basketball staff, she mentors the team's wings.

In her first season on staff, Recchia helped guide Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball, which concluded with the first Mid-American Conference East Division title since 2004-05 and a WNIT postseason berth. The Golden Flashes, who compiled a 19-13 overall record, had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and fifth most-improved record in the country. MAC Player of the Year Larissa Lurken enjoyed a breakout senior season under Recchia's tutelage, setting program records for points (752) and scoring average (23.5 ppg) while making an NCAA Division I record 280 free throws. She was the only Division I player in the nation that averaged 20 points, six rebounds, two assists, two blocked shots, two three-pointers and one steal per game.

Before arriving in Kent, Recchia had spent five of the previous six seasons as an assistant coach at Radford. Upon returning in 2013, she served as the program's recruiting coordinator and was responsible for wing player development, scouting, academics and compliance. Overall, she helped guide the Highlanders to one WNIT appearance and two Big South runner-up finishes while mentoring five All-Big South selections.

Recchia served as an assistant coach at Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tennessee during the 2012-13 season and was head coach at William Byrd High School in Vinton, Virginia from 2007-10.

Prior to that, she spent five years at Virginia Tech, playing guard from 2001-05 and then serving as a graduate assistant during the 2005-06 season. She helped the Hokies to four 20-win seasons and five postseason appearances, including four consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament.

A 2004 graduate with a bachelor's degree in physical education from Virginia Tech, Recchia earned a master's degree in education in 2006.

Morgan Toles enters her third season as an assistant coach on the women's basketball staff and first as recruiting coordinator. In addition to mentoring the team's point guards in addition to spearheading community service and marketing efforts.

Toles helped guide Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during the 2016-17 season, which concluded with the first Mid-American Conference East Division title since 2004-05 and a WNIT postseason berth. The Golden Flashes, who compiled a 19-13 overall record, had the nation's largest RPI improvement jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and fifth most-improved record in the country.

For her efforts, Toles was named to the 2017 Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Thirty Under 30 list, which recognizes 30 up-and-coming coaches age 30 and under at all levels of women's basketball.

Prior to Kent State, Toles spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Florida State. The Seminoles posted a 57-13 record (.814) with an Elite Eight and a Sweet 16 appearance during those years.

Toles played the final two years of her collegiate career at Florida State, serving as a co-captain while leading the team to the 2013 NCAA Tournament during her senior season. Before transferring to Florida State, she was a two-year starting point guard at Auburn, where she earned SEC All-Freshman Team honors in 2010. Toles ranked in the top-15 nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio during her freshman and senior seasons.

A 2013 graduate with a bachelor's degree in social science from Florida State, Toles earned a master's degree in sport management in 2016.

A fixture of Kent State basketball since the 2005-06 season, former Golden Flash Mike McKee ('10) enters his second season as an assistant coach with the women's basketball program in 2018-19. He heads the Golden Flashes' player development efforts and primarily works with post players.

After serving as the Director of Basketball Operations for the men's program for six years, McKee was hired by head coach Todd Starkey in April 2017. During his first year on the women's side, he was instrumental in the continued development of All-MAC First Team forward Jordan Korinek. Already a 1,000-point scorer through three seasons, Korinek finished second in the Mid-American Conference at 19.8 points per game and her 634 points are the third-most scored by a Flash in program history.

A four-year letterwinner and member of three MAC championship teams (2006, 2008, 2010) as a student-athlete, He spent the 2010-11 season as a graduate assistant before moving into the operations role. During that time, the Golden Flashes boasted six conference championship teams and participated in the postseason nine times.

A celebrated three-point marksman, McKee wrapped up his time on the court in style by leading the Golden Flashes to their second MAC Championship in three seasons in 2010. Kent State compiled a 24-10 overall record and advanced to the second round of the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). Also a member of the 2008 Kent State team that went 28-7 and earned a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament, McKee drained 143 career three-pointers during his time with the Blue and Gold, ending his career tied for ninth all-time in school history. Additionally, he ranked eighth at Kent State with 128 games played and ninth with 92 wins to his credit.

The Plum, Pa. product was a member of the Chi Alpha Sigma National College Athlete Honor Society and earned Academic All-MAC honorable mention accolades in 2009. McKee is a two-time graduate of Kent State University, earning his undergraduate degree in education in December of 2009 and his master's in sports and recreation management in May of 2011.
