THE GAME

The Kent State returns to action this weekend and will play two games at the Akron Classic inside of James A. Rhodes Arena. The Golden Flashes are slated to take on No. 24 Michigan on Friday at 2 p.m. and then Purdue Fort Wayne at 12 p.m. Saturday.

The Golden Flashes look to begin the season with four wins for the first time since 2010-11, when they started 6-0. Despite trailing for nearly 60 minutes total during the first two games, Kent State has outscored its opponents 51-32 during the fourth quarter and one overtime period to complete comefrom-behind efforts on the road.

Five players have scored in double-figures in both contests and four Flashes are averaging 15 or more points per game. Freshman **Katie Shumate** leads the way with 16.5 points per game and has scored 25 of her 33 points after halftime. Sophomore **Lindsey Thall** (16.0 ppg) matched her career-high with 22 points in the opener at Duquesne and leads the Flashes in three-pointers (6) and blocks (6). Sophomore Asiah Dingle (15.5 ppg) made all three of her field goals and totaled seven points in the overtime period on Saturday at YSU. Redshirt senior Megan Carter (15.0 ppg) has scored half of her points during the final five minutes of the fourth quarter and overtime, including the game-winner with 0.2 on the clock at Duguesne last Tuesday. Freshman **Nila Blackford** adds 12.5 points and 9.5 rebounds per contest.

The 24th-ranked Wolverines coasted to victories against Western Michigan and Bradley last weekend. All five starters are listed at 6'0 or taller, and Michigan has used its size advantage to hold opponents to 56.0 points per game on 30.6-percent shooting. The Wolverines are averaging 6.5 blocks per game and outrebounding the opposition by 9.5.

All-Big Ten First Team performer Naz Hillmon leads UM with 13.0 points per game while grabbing 8.0 rebounds per game. Named to the preseason watch list for the Katrina McClain Award, which recognizes the top power forward in women's basketball, Hillmon served as captain for the USA Basketball team. that captured gold at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup in July. Point guard Amy Dilk (12.5 ppg) leads the team with averages of 10.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists per contest. Forward Kayla Robbins adds 12.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, The Years of Youth, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

STARKEY EARNS CAREER VICTORY #200

- Fourth-year head coach Todd Starkey earned career win #200 on Tuesday, Nov. 20, 2018 as Kent State took care of Youngstown State, 62-34.
- Named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2017, Starkey is already third on the program's career wins list with 42. He passed Richard Keast (1986-89) on Nov. 18.
- Starkey spent nine seasons (2005-14) as the head coach at Division II Lenoir-Rhyne, posting a 165-95 record.

- Tied 19-19 to start the second half, Michigan went on a 12-4 run to take its first lead since the opening minutes of the game. A
- The Wolverines converted four free throw attempts and got a huge three-pointer from Nicole Munger to end the period on a 7-0 and push the lead to double-digits.
- The Golden Flashes held a 32-28 rebounding advantage.
- **Jordan Korinek** led the effort on the glass with 8 rebounds and also scored 10 points.
- Alexa Golden shot 3-for-6 from long range and finished with 15 points to lead all scorers.
- All-American Katelynn Flaherty was held to four points on 2-for-12 shooting. It was tied for the fewest points Flaherty, who is Michigan's all-time leading scorer, has scored since her ninth collegiate game on Dec. 13, 2014.

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the **Todd Starkey** era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State ranks second the nation in free throws per game (15.92), sixth in free throws made (1,576), eighth in free throw attempts (2,125) and 30th in free throw percentage (.742).

FOURTH SEASON Montreat College. '93

Hometown: Canfield, Ohio

Alma Mater: Montreat College, Bachelor's Degree in Outdoor Education Todd Starkey enters his fourth season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State in 2019-20 after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016. Already the third-winningest coach in school history, he has led the Golden Flashes to two Postseason WNIT appearances and one Mid-American Conference East Division title.

Last season, Starkey led Kent State to a 20-win campaign for the first time since 2010-11 while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 22-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and

was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenior-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country during the 2016-17 season with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. Korinek was then named to the first team in 2018. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College, in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.


