The Kent State women's basketball team will make the short drive to Youngstown State Saturday for the second game of the 2019-20 season. Tip-off from the Beeghly Center is scheduled for 1 p.m.

Fourth-year head coach **Todd Starkey** improved to 3-1 in season openers in dramatic fashion Tuesday day, as **Megan Carter** sank a floater in the lane with 0.2 on the clock to take down Duquesne, 77-75. Carter scored eight of her 12 points in the final five minutes of the contest.

The Golden Flashes' youth shined on opening night. The starting lineup consisted of two sophomores and three freshmen. The quintet accounted for Kent State's other 65 points in the game. Forward **Lindsey Thall** scored 22 points to match her career-high and is the only NCAA Division I player to post at least 20 points, six three-pointers and four blocks in a game so far this season. Point guard **Asiah Dingle** scored 10 points in the first half to keep the Flashes in the game. Dingle finished with 12 points, four assists and two steals.

Katie Shumate led a very talented trio of freshmen with 17 points. **Nila Blackford** just missed a double-double with 11 points and nine rebounds. Sharpshooter **Clare Kelly** added three points, two rebounds and a steal in six minutes of action.

Despite coming off a 22-win campaign, Youngstown State is picked to finish fourth in the Horizon League. The Penguins drained 14 three-pointers and assisted on 25 of 33 field goals in Tuesday's season-opening 87-59 victory against Canisius and have won 17 of their last 18 home games.

Guard Chelsea Olson recorded the second triple-double in program history with 13 points, 11 assists and 10 rebounds. The All-Horizon League performer led the conference in assists (4.6 apg) last season when she was the only underclassman in Division I to average at least 10 points, seven rebounds and 4.5 assists. All-conference forward Mary Dunn was the team's top scorer a year ago (14.3 ppg) and scored 13 in the opener. Guards Ny'Dajah Jackson (22 points) and Taylor Pettit (15 points) had outstanding performances in their YSU debuts.

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, The Years of Youth, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

STARKEY EARNS CAREER VICTORY #200

- Fourth-year head coach **Todd Starkey** earned career win #200 on Tuesday, Nov. 20, 2018 as Kent State took care of Youngstown State, 62-34.
- Named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2017, Starkey is already third on the program's career wins list with 42. He passed Richard Keast (1986-89) on Nov. 18.
- Starkey spent nine seasons (2005-14) as the head coach at Division II Lenoir-Rhyne, posting a 165-95 record.

- The Golden Flashes blocked seven shots in limiting the Penguins to 11-for-64 shooting and sent their guests to the free throw line for only eight attempts.
- YSU missed all 17 of its shots and scored just two points in the third period.
- Merissa Barber-Smith** led the defense with five blocks and 11 rebounds.
- Megan Carter** led all scorers with 20 points and grabbed career-high seven rebounds.
- Making her first career start in place of Dingle, **Mariah Modkins** scored a career-high 14 points to go with three assists and two steals.
- McKenah Peters led YSU with 13 points.

KENT STATE PROJECTED TO FINISH THIRD IN MAC EAST DIVISION

- The Mid-American Conference Women's Basketball Preseason Poll was released on Oct. 30 with Kent State picked to fourth second in the East Division, as was voted upon by the conference's 12 head coaches.
- The Golden Flashes, which finished fourth in the division last season, received 50 points in the poll.
- Redshirt senior guard **Megan Carter**, an All-MAC Third Team selection last season, was named to the Preseason All-MAC East Team.
- Ohio was unanimously selected to win the overall regular season and East Division titles.
- Central Michigan (60 points) edged Northern Illinois (59 points) as the favorite to win the West Division. Five of the six teams in the division received a first-place vote.

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the **Todd Starkey** era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State ranks second the nation in free throws per game (15.86), sixth in free throws made (1,538), ninth in free throw attempts (2,067) and 32nd in free throw percentage (.744).

Todd Starkey enters his fourth season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State in 2019-20 after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016. Already the third-winningest coach in school history, he has led the Golden Flashes to two Postseason WNIT appearances and one Mid-American Conference East Division title.

Last season, Starkey led Kent State to a 20-win campaign for the first time since 2010-11 while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 22-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and

was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country during the 2016-17 season with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. Korinek was then named to the first team in 2018. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College, in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.
