The Kent State women's basketball team returns to the "Entertainment Capital of the World" for the second time in the past three years this week to participate in the Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic. The Golden Flashes are scheduled to play Georgia Southern on Thursday, December 19 and Troy on Friday, December 20. Both games from South Point Arena will tip at 3 p.m. ET.

Prior to breaking for final exams, the Flashes lost at Purdue, 77-64, on December 9. The contest was extremely competitive with the exception of the final 5:06 of the first half in which the Boilermakers used a 12-2 run to lead by 14 at halftime. Despite being undersized, Kent State held its own around the basket. The Flashes finished even in paint scoring (28-28) and were outrebounded by just one (35-34). **Asiah Dingle** led the way with 16 points and three assists. **Lindsey Thall** shot 3-for-5 from downtown and totaled 11 points. **Megan Carter** added 10 points and a career-high nine rebounds.

All five starters are scoring in double-figures. **Nila Blackford** (14.6 ppg, 8.3 rpg) is one of only two MAC players among the top-10 in the conference in both scoring and rebounding. **Lindsey Thall** (14.3 ppg) made a school record eight three-pointers and had a career-high 32 points in the home opener against Ohio State. **Megan Carter** (12.5 ppg) has provided the game-winning shot in the final 2.2 seconds on two occasions already this season. **Katie Shumate** (11.1 ppg) has displayed a versatile skill set and ranks in the top-two on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg), steals (17) and blocked shots (11). **Asiah Dingle** (11.9 ppg) averages a team-best 3.4 assists per game.

Georgia Southern missed two game-winning shot attempts in the final seconds of the fourth period and fell at Ole Miss, 69-66, in overtime on Monday. This is the Eagles' only game this season that has been decided by single-digits. Georgia Southern ranks in the bottom 50 nationally in field goal percentage (.336), field goal percentage defense (.439), three-point field goal percentage (.252), assists per game (9.4) and assist-to-turnover ratio (0.56).

Guard Tatum Barber scores a team-high 12.3 points per game. All-Sun Belt Second Team Guard Alexis Brown adds 11.8 points per game and a team-high 10 three-pointers. Brown has gone 34-for-35 at the foul line and ranks second in the country in free throw percentage (.971). Guard Nikki McDonald (10.3 ppg), a grad transfer from Louisiana Tech, poured in a career-high 26 points against Ole Miss and is the Eagles' top rebounder (6.5 rpg).

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, *The Years of Youth*, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

STARKEY EARNS CAREER VICTORY #200

- Fourth-year head coach **Todd Starkey** earned career win #200 on Tuesday, Nov. 20, 2018 as Kent State took care of Youngstown State, 62-34.
- Named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2017, Starkey is already third on the program's career wins list with 57. He passed Richard Keast (1986-89) on Nov. 18.
- Starkey spent nine seasons (2005-14) as the head coach at Division II Lenoir-Rhyne, posting a 165-95 record.

- **Jamie Hutcheson** led Kent State with 10 points.
- Barroilhet, **Amber Dunlap** and **Ashley Evans** added eight points apiece.
- Kent State held a 42-39 advantage on the glass with Barroilhet grabbing a game-high nine boards.
- MiMi DuBose led Georgia Southern with 21 points, which including 5-for-10 from beyond the three-point arc.

KENT STATE PROJECTED TO FINISH THIRD IN MAC EAST DIVISION

- The Mid-American Conference Women's Basketball Preseason Poll was released on Oct. 30 with Kent State picked to fourth second in the East Division, as was voted upon by the conference's 12 head coaches.
- The Golden Flashes, which finished fourth in the division last season, received 50 points in the poll.
- Redshirt senior guard **Megan Carter**, an All-MAC Third Team selection last season, was named to the Preseason All-MAC East Team.
- Ohio was unanimously selected to win the overall regular season and East Division titles.
- Central Michigan (60 points) edged Northern Illinois (59 points) as the favorite to win the West Division. Five of the six teams in the division received a first-place vote.

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the **Todd Starkey** era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State leads the nation in free throws per game (16.06) and ranks fifth in free throws made (1,670), sixth in free throw attempts (2,241) and 30th in free throw percentage (.745).

THALL'S NIGHT TO REMEMBER

- Sophomore **Lindsey Thall** will always remember the 2019-20 season opener in which she scored 32 points and made a Kent State single-game record eight three-point field goals against Ohio State.
- The Strongsville, Ohio native made a statement against the school she grew up hoping to play for by going 8-for-13 from long range.
- Thall led the Golden Flashes' dominant fourth quarter by outscoring the Buckeyes 19-12 over the final 10 minutes of the contest. All nine OSU players in uniform saw at least 17 minutes of action, so the late run did not come with end-of-the-bench players on the court.
- The 6-foot-2 forward is on pace to be one of the most prolific three-point shooters in Kent State history.
- Thall drained a team-high 66 three-pointers, which puts her third on the Golden Flashes' single-season list. She has added 25 this season to give her 91 and just 16 away from program's the top-10 list.
- Her 41.6-percent from beyond the arc is the second-highest in KSU history.

CARTER IS CLUTCH

- Redshirt senior guard **Megan Carter** has already provided two game-winning shots in the final seconds during the first month of the season.
- Carter's heroics began on opening night with a driving floater from just outside of the paint with 0.2 remaining on the clock to give Kent State a 77-75 win over Duquesne inside of PPG Paints Arena.
- The Preseason All-MAC East Division selection received a return pass after inboundng the ball with 4.3 seconds remaining and was able to create enough separation to get the shot over the defender.
- Carter had dealt with a thumb injury that kept her on the sideline for much of preseason practice and actually came off the bench and had a slow start to the night before scoring eight of her 12 points in the final period.
- Her layup with 2.2 second to play capped the Golden Flashes' 13-point rally over the final 4:54 to defeat Robert Morris, 82-81, on November 24.
- Following a three-pointer by **Lindsey** to get within 81-80 with 6.2 to play, Kent State knocked the ensuing entry pass out of bounds.
- With RMU out of timeouts and inboundng from a spot, the Flashes put two defenders on the ball. The strategy paid off, as **Katie Shumate** got her hand of the pass, which landed in Carter's arms with an open path to the basket to lay it in.
- Carter scored 11 of her 16 points over the final 3:33 of the contest.
- During her redshirt freshman season, Carter's elbow pullup with 2.2 seconds to play lifted Kent State to an 80-78 victory over Bowling Green inside of the M.A.C. Center of January 28, 2017.

Todd Starkey enters his fourth season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State in 2019-20 after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016. Already the third-winningest coach in school history, he has led the Golden Flashes to two Postseason WNIT appearances and one Mid-American Conference East Division title.

Last season, Starkey led Kent State to a 20-win campaign for the first time since 2010-11 while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 22-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and

was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country during the 2016-17 season with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. Korinek was then named to the first team in 2018. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College, in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.
