### THE GAME

Kent State will begin the 2020-21 home slate with a rematch from last season's home finale when Ohio visits the M.A.C. Center for a 2 p.m. contest Friday.

That game was played on March 4 and won by the Golden Flashes, 81-77, behind 20 points and eight rebounds by then-freshman Katie Shumate. The teams split the season series and shared the Mid-American Conference East Division title. A rubber match seemed likely to follow 10 days later, as each team was the highest-remaining seed on its side of the MAC Tournament bracket, but the event was forced to be canceled, and the teams will finally meet again just more than nine months later.

Kent State dropped a back-and-forth battle at Saint Francis (Pa.), 67-64, on Wednesday afternoon. The Flashes started the fourth quarter with a 12-2 run to lead by five but shot just 1-of-12 from the floor over the 6:41 of the contest. A corner three-pointer from the corner by **Linsey Marchese** was off the mark as time expired and the host Red Flash escaped with their first victory of the season. **Lindsey Thall** scored a game-high 17 points and grabbed a team-high seven boards. **Nila Blackford** added 13 points. **Mariah Modkins** played a solid floor game and finished with nine points, four rebounds, four assists and two steals.

The Bobcats (2-0) have not played since upsetting No. 22 Notre Dame, 86-85, on Black Friday. Two days earlier, Ohio started the season with a 76-74 win against Liberty. The Bobcats are averaging 81.0 points per game, which leads the MAC in the opening weeks of the campaign.

Erica Johnson (27.5 ppg) and Cece Hooks (25.0 ppg) are the top scoring duo in the country. Both were named to the Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year preseason watch list. Johnson, who was named to the watch list for the Cheryl Miller Award given to the nation's top small forward, leads the Bobcats with nine three-points and seven assists while averaging 7.0 rebounds per game. Hooks, who was named to the watch list for the Nancy Lieberman Award given to the nation's top point guard, is the two-time reigning MAC Defensive Player of the Year and is Ohio's top rebounder at 7.5 boards per game.

## THEGOLDENFLASHESNICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, *The Years of Youth*, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

### KSU IN MAC OPENERS

- Kent State is 18-21 all-time in MAC openers, including a 12-8 mark at the M.A.C. Center.
- The Golden Flashes are 6-2 vs. Ohio in MAC openers, including a 3-1 record in home meetings.
- Kent State has won the past four conference openers between the programs.
- Most recently, the Flashes earned a 70-66 victory in Kent on Jan. 6, 2010.
- Head coach **Todd Starkey** owns a 2-1 record in conference openers. Starkey lost his first MAC contest, 91-78, to eventual regular season champion Central Michigan on Dec. 31, 2016 but has led the Flashes to victories over Eastern Michigan in each of the two conference lid-lifters.

### STARKEY EARNS CAREER VICTORY #200

- Fifth-year head coach **Todd Starkey** earned career win #200 on Tuesday, Nov. 20, 2018 as Kent State took care of Youngstown State, 62-34.
- Named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2017, Starkey is already third on the program's career wins list with 71.

## KENT STATE - OHIO NOTES

- Kent State is 53-33 all-time vs. Ohio.
- The Golden Flashes won both meetings during the 2016-17 season, but the Bobcats have won nine of the last 12 overall.
- Each of the past five matchups have been decided by four points or fewer.
- Kent State is 29-11 as the home team in the series.
- The Flashes' 19-game winning streak from Jan. 10, 1996 through Jan. 28, 2004 is the longest for either school.

## FLASH BACK: (MARCH 4, 2020)

### KENT STATE 81, OHIO 77

- Kent State defeated Ohio, 81-77, in a first-place divisional showdown, clinching at least a share of the MAC East Division championship and a first-round bye in the MAC tournament.
- The Golden Flashes led for nearly 30 minutes of the contest but fell behind, 77-76, when Caitlyn Kroll connected on a corner 3-pointer with 12.1 seconds remaining.
- Asiah Dingle drew a foul on her baseline drive to the basket, and then calmly sank two free throws to regain the lead with 8.0 left.
- Katie Shumate then drew an offensive foul on the Bobcats' Erica Johnson and Dingle added two more foul shots following a technical on Johnson.
- Shumate split a pair of free throws on the next possession for the final score. She finished with team-highs of 20 points and 8 rebounds to go with 2 assists, 2 steals and 2 blocks.
- Megan Carter (14), Nila Blackford (11) and Hannah Young (11) also scored in double-figures for Kent State.
- Erica Johnson scored 25 of her game-high 36 points on 10-of-11 shooting in the first half.

## KENT STATE PROJECTED TO FINISH SIXTH IN MAC PRESEASON POLL

- The Mid-American Conference Women's Basketball Preseason Poll was released on Nov. 19 with Kent State picked to finish sixth overall, as was voted upon by the conference's 12 head coaches.
- The Golden Flashes, which shared the East Division title with Ohio last season, received 88 points in the poll.
- Central Michigan (142 points) received 10 first-place votes and was selected as the favorite to win the MAC regular season title for the fifth season in a row.
- The Chippewas also led the way with six votes to win the 2021 MAC Tournament.
- Ohio received three votes, while one coach selected with Ball State, Buffalo and Eastern Michigan.

## CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the **Todd Starkey** era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State leads the nation in free throws per game (15.59), while ranking sixth in free throws made (2,011) and 12th in free throw attempts (2,730).

Todd Starkey enters his fifth season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State in 2020-21 after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016. Already the third-winningest coach in school history, he has led the Golden Flashes to two Postseason WNIT appearances and two Mid-American Conference East Division titles.

Kent State was playing its best ball of the year and had won seven of its last nine games when a potential season-to-remember was unexpectedly cut short this past March with the cancellation of the MAC Tournament. The East Division champion Flashes knocked off defending champion Buffalo in a quarterfinal matchup and was the highest-remaining seed in the field.

Starkey has found much success in recruiting talented student-athletes, landing two of the highest-touted signing class in school history back-to-back in 2018 and 2019. Both classes had two student-athletes earn spots on the MAC All-Freshman Team, while only one other school had multiple honorees over the two seasons. While Nila Blackford led all conference freshmen in rebounding. Led by Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall, the 2018 class ranked second nationally with 964 points.

For the third time in four seasons under Starkey's guidance, Kent State finished the 2019-20 season in the top-100 of the RPI. The Flashes had five players average more than 11 points per game with guards Megan Carter and Katie Shumate earning All-MAC honorable mention selections. Lindsey Thall was named to the MAC All-Defensive Team after being the top shot blocker in the conference for the second year in a row.

The 2018-19 season saw Kent State post its first 20-win campaign in eight years while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 22-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling, player development and technology applications.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country during the 2016-17 season with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. Korinek was then named to the first team in 2018. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College, in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.
