For the second day in a row, the Kent State women's basketball team will play in a battle between unbeaten teams when its tips against UMass in a Gulf Coast Showcase semifinal matchup at 5 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 27.

The Golden Flashes defeated No. 19 UCLA, 75-69, on Friday for the first 4-0 start to a season since the 2010-11 campaign. After trailing by six just over a minute, Kent State went on a 22-7 run to take its largest lead of the contest, 70-61, with 57.4 seconds remaining. **Lindsey Thall** led the Flashes with a season-high 20 points and shot 5-of-7 from behind the three-point line. **Katie Shumate** scored 10 of her 17 points in the first half.

The Flashes' offensive efficiency has been elite in the early weeks of the season, ranking in the top 25 nationally in three-point field goal percentage (.447), three-pointers per game (9.5) and scoring average (81.8). Kent State ranks second the Mid-American Conference in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.15) and field goal percentage (.480).

**Lindsey Thall** leads the Flashes with averages of 15.0 ppg and team-best 6.8 rpg per game. Thall has made a MAC-best 13 three-point field goals and is shooting 56.4% from the floor overall. **Casey Santoro** has been one of the nation's most productive non-starting players and is averaging 14.8 ppg and a team-high 4.0 apg. **Katie Shumate** (13.3 ppg) and **Nila Blackford** (10.3 ppg) are also double-figure scorers.

The Minutewomen defeated South Dakota State, 81-63, in the tournament's opening game on Friday to mark the best start of a season since the 1978-79 season. UMass scored the contest's first seven points and led by as many as 27 in the decisive victory. The Minutewomen are averaging 78.0 points per game and have put at least 79 on the scoreboard five times.

Sydney Taylor (20.0 ppg) scored a game-high 23 points on Friday. All-A-10 forward Sam Breen (16.2 ppg, 11.2 rpg) has recorded four double-doubles this season. Angelique Ngalakulondi (11.2 ppg) and Ber'Nyah Mayo (10.2 ppg) are also double-figure scorers. Destiney Philoxy (8.8 ppg, 5.5 apg) joined Breen as a Preseason All-A-10 selection

## THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, *The Years of Youth*, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the *Kent Courier Tribune*, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

## STARKEY EARNS CAREER VICTORY

### #250

- Sixth-year head coach **Todd Starkey** earned career win No. 250 on Thursday, Nov. 18, as Kent State took care of John Carroll, 101-40.
- Named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in 2017, Starkey is already third on the program's career wins list with 86 during his time on the sidelines for the Golden Flashes.

## FLASH BACK: (DEC. 17, 2013)

### UMASS 69, KENT STATE 61

- A parade to the free throw line over the final six minutes allowed UMass to score 12 of its final 17 points while being unguarded and leave the M.A.C. Center victorious.
- A total of 55 fouls were whistled in the contest and the team combined for 61 attempts from the charity stripe.
- A 7-3 run over the final 4:35 of the first half allowed Kent State to take a four-point lead into the locker room.
- The Flashes committed four fouls in the first two minutes of the second half, however, and the Minutewomen entered the one-and-one with 13:49 to play.
- **Montia Johnson's** jumper with 8:48 to play got Kent State within a point.
- The Flashes shot just 3-of-12 the rest of the game.
- **Amber Dunlap** and Johnson scored 14 points each to lead Kent State.
- Kim Pierre-Louis finished with a game-high 18 points.

## CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the Todd Starkey era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year Larissa Lurken made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State is third in the nation in free throws per game (15.35), eighth in free throws made (2,302) and 13th in free throw attempts (3,161).

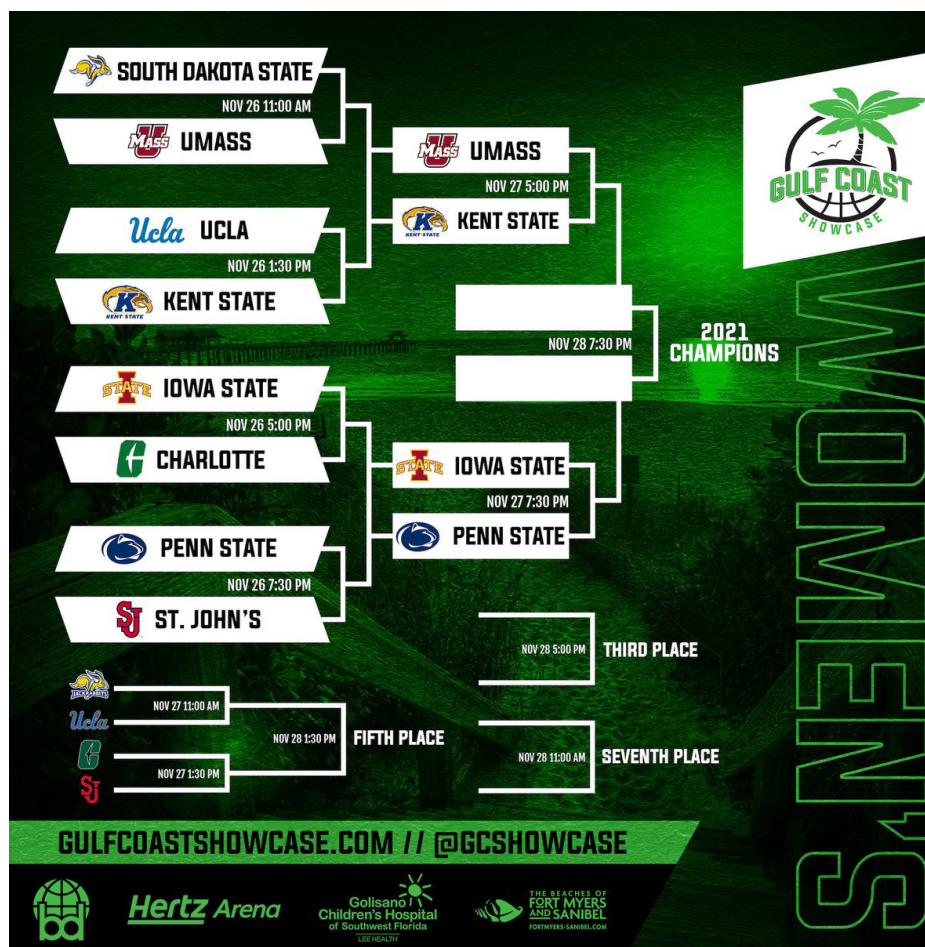

Todd Starkey enters his sixth season as the head women's basketball coach at Kent State in 2020-21 after being hired as the program's sixth head coach in April 2016. Already the third-winningest coach in school history, he has led the Golden Flashes to two Postseason WNIT appearances and two Mid-American Conference East Division titles.

Kent State was playing its best ball of the year and had won seven of its last nine games when a potential season-to-remember was unexpectedly cut short this past March with the cancellation of the MAC Tournament. The East Division champion Flashes knocked off defending champion Buffalo in a quarterfinal matchup and was the highest-remaining seed in the field.

Starkey has found much success in recruiting talented student-athletes, landing two of the highest-touted signing class in school history back-to-back in 2018 and 2019. Both classes had two student-athletes earn spots on the MAC All-Freshman Team, while only one other school had multiple honorees over the two seasons. While Nila Blackford led all conference freshmen in rebounding. Led by Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall, the 2018 class ranked second nationally with 964 points.

For the third time in four seasons under Starkey's guidance, Kent State finished the 2019-20 season in the top-100 of the RPI. The Flashes had five players average more than 11 points per game with guards Megan Carter and Katie Shumate earning All-MAC honorable mention selections. Lindsey Thall was named to the MAC All-Defensive Team after being the top shot blocker in the conference for the second year in a row.

The 2018-19 season saw Kent State post its first 20-win campaign in eight years while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

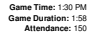
