THE GAME

Kent State looks to begin a new winning streak on Monday when it makes the trip to UPMC Cooper Fieldhouse for a 6 p.m. matchup with Duquesne.

The Golden Flashes trailed by one at halftime Wednesday night at Ohio State, but a third quarter filled with foul and turnover problems resulted in the second half resulted in an 88-68 final score. **Mya Babbitt** had a career night with 30 points on 9-of-13 shooting, including six three-pointers. **Janae Tyler** battled inside against taller players and added 13 points.

Mya Babbitt is the MAC's second leading scorer at 16.5 ppg. Babbitt ranks 21st in the nation with 16 three-point field goals and has scored in double-figures in five consecutive games. The sharpshooter is second on the team with 4.8 rpg. After a slow start, **Janae Tyler** (10.0 ppg) has averaged 15.7 ppg on 51.6% shooting over the last three games. **Corynne Hauser** (9.2 ppg) is averaging 15.0 ppg when playing more than 21 minutes. **Dionna Gray** (4.3 ppg) ranks sixth in the MAC with 4.8 apg and **Riley Rismiller** (7.3 ppg) ranks seventh in rebounding with 7.5 rpg.

Duquesne is no longer unbeaten following a 64-62 loss at Robert Morris on Tuesday. The Dukes have been among the best rebounding teams in the nation and rank third in offensive rebounds per game (21.6), fifth in rebounding margin (+19.2) and sixth in rebounds per game (50.6). Aided by the 10th highest scoring bench in the country (37.0 ppg), Duquesne sits 20th in points per game (86.6).

Six different players are averaging double-digit points. Nadia Moore (15.0 ppg) had almost as many points (30) as minutes played (31) over the first two games but has not appeared in the last three contests. Harriet Ford (13.3 ppg, 9.3 rpg) has recorded a double-double in two of the three games she has played.

THE GOLDEN FLASHES NICKNAME

The origin of the nickname "Golden Flashes" has been a topic of debate. According to documentation in Phillip Shiver's book, *The Years of Youth*, widely regarded as historically correct, the reason for Kent State's nickname is noted in a letter to Linda Baughman, dated Aug. 6, 1959. Merle Wagoner recalled that the change in the name of Kent State athletics teams from "Silver Foxes" to "Golden Flashes" occurred in 1926 after the dismissal of President John E. McGilvrey (Kent State's first nickname originated from McGilvrey, who had a silver fox farm east of campus).

With Acting President T. Howard Winters providing the impetus, a contest was held (with a \$25 first prize) to select the new name. No special significance was attached to the winning suggestion, which was used first in 1927 by the basketball team after it had been approved by the student body and the faculty athletic committee. Also laying claim to the origin was Oliver Wolcott, one-time Kent State grid great who played center on the 1921 and 1922 teams. As former sports editor of the Kent Courier Tribune, the local newspaper, the name "Silver Foxes" seemed pretty frail to him. So, during the 1927 football season, he began referring to the team as "Golden Flashes."

STARKEY RECORDS 300TH CAREER VICTORY

- Head coach **Todd Starkey** earned his 300th career win on Jan. 27 as Kent State defeated Bowling Green, 82-74.
- Now in his 10th season guiding the Golden Flashes' program, Starkey surpassed **Laurel Wartluft** (1977-86) for second on the all-time wins list with 143.
- Varsity K Hall of Fame member **Bob Lindsay** owns the program standard and is the winningest coach in Mid-American Conference history.

KENT STATE 81, DUQUESNE 61

- After close road losses the previous two seasons, Kent State recorded its largest margin of victory in series history.
- **Dionna Gray** scored a career-high 20 points to go with 7 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals in her season debut.
- Gray was in attack mode throughout the contest and drew 10 fouls. She shot 11-for-11 at the free throw line.
- The teams traded the lead nine times in the opening 14 minutes before the Golden Flashes closed the half with a 12-4 run.
- A technical foul with 2:49 left in the third quarter swung momentum back in favor of Kent State, which went on a 34-20 run to end the game.
- A group effort allowed the Flashes to outrebound their guest, 53-39 rebounding advantage.
- **Janae Tyler** led the way with eight boards in her first action of the season. Five additional Flashes grabbed six or more rebounds.
- Megan McConnell led Duquesne with 19 points and 10 rebounds.

CHARITABLE FLASHES

Getting to the free throw line has been a focus of Kent State's offensive game plan during the Todd Starkey era. The Golden Flashes led the country in free throws made (594) and ranked seventh in free throws attempted (794) during the 2016-17 season. That same season, MAC Player of the Year **Larissa Lurken** made a NCAA Division I record 280 free throws, which included a MAC record 22 against WKU on Nov. 26, 2016.

Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Kent State is 14th in the nation in free throws per game (14.11), 26th in free throws made (3,950).

JUNIORS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MAC TEAMS

- Forward **Janae Tyler** and guard **Mya Babbitt** were selected to the 10-member Preseason All-MAC teams, as voted on by the conference's 13 head coaches.
- Despite being sidelined for 10 games last season, Tyler was an All-MAC honorable mention selection with averages of 11.6 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.
- Over her last 10 games played (missed final two games of regular season), Tyler's production rose to 14.3 points and 6.3 rebounds per contest.
- Babbitt had a breakout sophomore season, boosting her scoring output from 2.4 points per game as a freshman to 11.8.
- She made a program record 83 three-point field goals and led the MAC with 41.3% accuracy from behind the arc.

CHARITY STRIPE SUCCESS

- Kent State was among the best free throw shooting teams in the country a season ago, making 78.1% of shots from the charity stripe to rank 15th in the nation. This was the second-best single-season percentage in program history.
- In addition to being efficient, the Golden Flashes were frequent visitors to the free throw line and ranked 42nd in makes per game (13.91).
- In addition to six players who shot above the team average returning this season, redshirt junior **Corynne Hauser**, who was sidelined with an injury last season, is back and is a 79.0% career shooter at the foul line.

BABBITT BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON THREE-POINT RECORD

- After scoring just 50 total points as a freshman, **Mya Babbitt** had a historic sophomore year and drained a Kent State single-season record 83 three-point field goals, breaking the previous program standard set by **Melissa DeGrate** 20 years prior.
- Babbitt made multiple three-pointers in 23 of 33 games and finished the season ranked 25th nationally in both three-point field goals (81) and three-point field goal percentage (.415).

HAUSER'S HEROICS

- Guard **Corynne Hauser** has made two go-ahead shots in the final 15 seconds of victories during her Kent State career, with both coming against Power 4 opponents (Oklahoma State and Missouri).
- In just her fourth collegiate game in a true road environment against previously-unbeaten Oklahoma State, Hauser received the ball on the wing off a dribble-handoff and took three hard dribbles right to the elbow before spinning back to her left and finishing with her off hand while falling to the floor for 57-56 lead with 4.7 left on the clock.
- She added another clutch shot the next year against Missouri on a neutral floor in Daytona Beach.
- Trailing by one with 19.0 seconds remaining, Hauser received a screen on the left wing and beat her defender baseline and scored to make it 65-64 with 12.3 to play.

HEAD COACH TODD STARKEY

Todd Starkey was hired as the sixth head coach of the Kent State Women's Basketball team in April 2016.

Already the second-winningest coach in school history with 164 victories, Starkey has led the Golden Flashes to one NCAA Tournament appearance, four Postseason WNITs and two Mid-American Conference East Division titles. His teams have recorded four 20-win seasons,

including 21 victories each of the past three years.

Starkey has found much success in recruiting talented student-athletes, landing two of the highest-touted signing classes in school history back-to-back in 2018 and 2019. Both classes had two student-athletes earn spots on the MAC All-Freshman Team, while only one other school had multiple honorees over the two seasons. Nila Blackford led all conference freshmen in rebounding during the 2019-20 season. Led by Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall, the 2018 class ranked second nationally with 964 points. Overall, these two classes have combined for four All-MAC honors and a pair of MAC All-Defensive Team nods.

The 2021-22 season ended with a berth in the WNIT for the Golden Flashes and a final record of 19-12. The season was highlighted by wins over two Power 5 programs at the Gulf Coast Showcase in Estero, Florida and a win in the WNIT. First, the Flashes took down #19 UCLA, 75-69 at the showcase. Two days later, Penn State was the victim as the Flashes won 81-74. Later in the year, Youngstown State couldn't handle the Golden Flashes in the WNIT, as Kent came out on top, 68-59. That win was the second postseason WNIT win in program history. The Flashes boasted the second best defense by points per game allowed in the MAC and were second in the MAC for three-point percentage. The 21-22 season also saw Starkey become the third coach to reach 100 wins at Kent State.

The Flashes advanced to the MAC Tournament quarterfinals for the fifth year in a row in the unique 2020-21 season. Kent State's three all-conference selections were tied for the most of any team in the league. In the MAC opener against Ohio, the Flashes set a new program record with 16 three-point field goals. Lindsey Thall was the conference's top shot blocker for the third straight season.

Kent State was playing its best ball of the year, having won seven of its last nine games, when a potential 2019-20 season-to-remember was unexpectedly cut short with the cancelation of the MAC Tournament. The East Division champions knocked off defending tournament champion Buffalo in a quarterfinal matchup and was the highest-remaining seed in the field. For the third time in the first four seasons under Starkey's guidance, Kent State finished in the top-100 of the RPI. Five players averaged more than 11 points per game with guards Megan Carter and Katie Shumate earning All-MAC honorable mention selections.

The 2018-19 season saw Kent State post its first 20-win campaign in eight years while breaking a 25-year-old school record with 241 three-point field goals made. The Flashes finished with the highest RPI ranking (81) in program history and boasted four wins against RPI Top 100 teams, including a victory at Green Bay in the first round of the Postseason WNIT. Guards Megan Carter and Alexa Golden thrived in their third season under Starkey's tutelage, earning All-MAC Third Team and Defensive Team honors, respectively. All-Freshman Team selections Asiah Dingle and Lindsey Thall highlighted the second highest-scoring freshman class (964 points) in the country.

Starkey was named 2017 MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts in guiding Kent State to one of biggest turnarounds in NCAA Division I women's basketball during his first season on the sidelines. The Golden Flashes finished the season with a 19-13 overall record and had the nation's largest RPI improvement, jumping 222 spots from the previous season, and the fifth most-improved record in the country. Despite being picked to finish last in the preseason, Kent State put together a 13-5 conference mark to win the program's first MAC East Division title since 2004-05. The regular season ended with a seven-game winning streak, which surpassed the number of conference games the team had won over the previous two seasons combined.

Behind the strength of five wins against RPI Top 100 teams, the Flashes received an at-large bid to the 2017 Postseason WNIT for the first time since the 2010-11 season. An angry Michigan squad that felt it deserved to play in the NCAA Tournament awaited

Kent State in the opening round. Down by 21 points at halftime, the Flashes fought back to within five with just over two minutes to play before falling, 67-60. The Wolverines went on to claim the WNIT championship.

The 26-year coaching veteran came to Kent State after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, where he was responsible for assisting with the program's recruiting, practice and game preparation, scouting reports, scheduling and player development.

During his second season in Bloomington in 2015-16, he helped lead the Hoosiers to a historic year as the team made its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and grabbed its first win in the NCAA Tournament since 1983. Indiana finished the season with a 21-12 record, tying the school wins record, and was a perfect 14-0 at home. The Hoosiers finished fourth in the Big Ten, the school's highest conference finish in 18 years, and defeated three ranked opponents.

Starkey's time at IU began with a record-setting offensive performance, as the Hoosiers set single-game records for scoring (115) and 3-pointers made (16) in the season-opening win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 15, 2014. The team would go on to post the program's best scoring average (71.9 ppg) since 1995-96 and make the second-most three-pointers (236) in a season.

His first head coaching job came at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. Starkey concluded his nine-year tenure as the winningest coach in program history with a 165-95 record. Over his final six years, he led the Bears to four NCAA Tournament appearances and three Southern Atlantic Conference (SAC) regular season championships while averaging more than 20 wins per season. He received SAC Coach of the Year honors on four occasions, including a conference record three straight from 2009-11.

Starkey was named the 2009 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year after leading Lenoir-Rhyne to one of the greatest seasons in program history. The Bears posted a 27-5 record and won both the conference regular season and tournament titles for the first time ever to earn the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Tournament. Lenoir-Rhyne won the first NCAA Tournament game in program history, 69-58, over Anderson before falling in the second round.

Academics are important to the Youngstown-area native. Kent State was the only Division I women's basketball program in the country during the 2016-17 season with two CoSIDA Academic All-America® selections, as Jordan Korinek and Larissa Lurken both earned second team honors. Korinek was then named to the first team in 2018. In his time at Lenoir-Rhyne, Starkey had 100-percent of the players who remained past their sophomore year graduate, while the team maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher every year.

Prior to his head coaching stint, Starkey served as an assistant coach for Lenoir-Rhyne's men's team for two seasons (2003-05). The team won the 2004 SAC regular season championship and made an NCAA postseason appearance.

Starkey got his coaching career started at his alma mater, Montreat College, in North Carolina. He was an assistant men's basketball coach for five seasons (1998-03), helping the team to an NAIA National Tournament appearance in 2000.

Starkey grew up in nearby Canfield, Ohio, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in outdoor education from Montreat College. His playing career began in basketball and tennis at Mars Hill College.
