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CATS RETURN HOME TO HOST WEST VIRGINIA ON ESPN

K-State will look to bounce back from a narrow three-point loss at Texas this week as the Wildcats welcome West Virginia to Manhattan for an afternoon Big 12 match up. The game, which kicks at 2:30 p.m., will air on ESPN with **Mark Jones** (play-by-play), **Dusty Dvoracek** (analyst) and **Olivia Dekker** (sidelines) on the call.

The contest can be heard across the 39-station K-State Sports Network with **Wyatt Thompson** (play-by-play), former K-State quarterback **Stan Weber** (analyst) and **Matt Walters** (sidelines) calling the action. The game can also be heard on SiriusXM (S: 137, X: 200, Internet: 954) in addition to the TuneIn app.

A LOOK AT K-STATE

- K-State has won three of its last four games and is bowl-eligible under first-year head coach **Chris Klieman**.
- K-State has rushed for 1,789 yards this year on 387 carries which includes 25 rushing touchdowns after tallying only 20 rushing scores a year ago.
- The Wildcats are on pace to finish the 2019 season in the top 10 in school history in team rushing yards.
- K-State's 11 rushing scores over the Oklahoma and Kansas games were the most in the nation over that stretch. Quarterback **Skylar Thompson** had seven of those scores, also the best in the nation during that stretch.
- Thompson's seven rushing scores against OU and KU were the most over a two-game stretch by a K-State quarterback since **Collin Klein** in 2012.
- Thompson – who has four career game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or later – has thrown for 1,589 yards and nine touchdowns with one interception. His current 0.5% interception percentage ranks as the best mark in Big 12 history.
- With 29 rushing yards against WVU, Thompson can become the fourth signal caller in school history with 3,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Receivers **Dalton Schoen** and **Malik Knowles** each have over 300 receiving yards and three touchdowns.
- The K-State defense enters the week ranked highly in many statistical categories, including third down defense (3rd; 26.0%) and first downs allowed (17th; 152).
- K-State has given up just five passing TDs this season, which are tied for the fewest nationally this year (Ohio State).
- The Cats have surrendered only 25 total third down conversions this season, which are tied for the fewest in the FBS, while they were the final team to allow a fourth-down conversion when they did so last week against Texas.
- Linebacker **Elijah Sullivan** and safety **Denzel Goolsby** lead the team with 40 tackles apiece.
- Ten different Wildcats have at least 2.0 TFLs – led by **Wyatt Hubert's** 7.5 – and Hubert leads the team with 5.0 sacks.
- Cornerback **AJ Parker** has a team-high three interceptions to tie for fourth in the Big 12.
- The Wildcats possess a great kicker/punter duo as **Blake Lynch** ranks 10th nationally in field goal percentage (91.7%), while **Devin Anttil** ranks 18th in the nation with a 44.9-yard punting average.

CATS IN NOVEMBER

- Over the past decade, Kansas State has been at its best in the final month of the season as the Wildcats hold a 23-13 record in November since 2010
- K-State has not had a sub-.500 mark in November since 2009.
- The Cats are in the midst of playing five games in the month of November for the first time since 2013 when they finished off the final month of the season with a 4-1 mark.
- **Chris Klieman** owns a 15-5 record in November.

ONE OF THE BIG 12'S BEST

- Kansas State ranks third all-time in Big 12 wins since the league's inception in 1996 with 116, trailing only Oklahoma and Texas.
- The Wildcats also rank third in the conference in winning percentage since round-robin play began in 2011. They sit at .603 (47-31), trailing only Oklahoma (.821; 64-14) and Oklahoma State (.641; 50-28).

CATS ARE BOWL BOUND

- With the win over Kansas, K-State got win No. 6 and became bowl eligible for the 22nd time in school history.
- Since 1990, K-State has qualified for the postseason 21 times, including this season.
- **Chris Klieman** became the second coach in school history to take the Wildcats to a bowl in their first year as coach and the fourth overall to do so.

IN THE CFP TOP 25

- K-State debuted in the initial College Football Playoff Rankings when it landed at No. 16, which marked the first time the Cats were ranked in the CFP poll since the final rankings of the 2014 season (11th).
- **Chris Klieman** is one of six head coaches to be in the first year at his school and debut 16th or better in the initial CFP rankings of a season, joining **Jim Harbaugh** (Michigan, 14th in 2015), **Lincoln Riley** (Oklahoma, 5th in 2017), **Dan Mullen** (Florida, 11th in 2018), **Josh Heupel** (UCF, 12th in 2018) and **Ryan Day** (Ohio State, 1st in 2019).

TRACKING THE REDSHIRTS

- A total of 12 true freshmen have played this season, headlined by wide receiver **Joshua Youngblood** (9 games) and fullback **Jax Dineen** (8 games), both of whom will not be eligible for redshirts this year.

- Linebacker/defensive end **Khalid Duke**, running back **Joe Ervin** and defensive back **Logan Wilson** are right at the four-game line. Linebacker **Levi Archer**, quarterback/wide receiver **Chris Herron** (3) and offensive lineman **Cooper Beebe** (2) and defensive back **Tyrone Lewis** have each played in multiple games this season.

A NEW ERA

- The new era of K-State Football under **Chris Klieman** has opened with a 6-3 record through nine games.
- Klieman, who was named the 35th head coach in school history on December 10, 2018, was just the fourth head coach in K-State history to start 3-0.
- He is the second head coach in school history to lead the Wildcats to bowl eligibility in their first season, while he can tie for the most wins by a first-year head coach in school history with a victory on Saturday.

A WINNING HISTORY

- A proven winner with a championship history, **Chris Klieman** came to Manhattan after capping his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018.
- Klieman guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record, making NDSU just the fifth team in FCS history to go undefeated and untied on the way to a national championship.
- A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Klieman has a career record of 78-16 (.830), as he went 69-6 in his five seasons at North Dakota State, 3-7 in one year as the head coach at Division III Loras College in 2005 and 6-3 so far at K-State.
- Klieman's overall winning percentage ranks eighth among all active NCAA coaches – regardless of division – and tops among active FBS coaches.

FEW FLAGS

- One staple of Kansas State football throughout the years has been limited penalties, and the 2019 Wildcats have continued that trend.
- K-State enters the week ranked third in the Big 12 in fewest penalties penalty yards per game (51.3).
- The Kansas game was an anomaly as the Wildcats were flagged 11 times for 113 yards, the first time they had over 10 penalties and 100 penalty yards since the 2018 season opener.

CATS TOPS IN
NON-OFFENSIVE TDs

- K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 20-plus seasons as it has 115 since 1999, nine more than the next closest team.
- Entering the season, the Wildcats were averaging 5.6 non-offensive touchdowns per year since 1999, while the yearly average for the other 105 teams to play FBS football since 1999 was 3.3.
- Kansas State's average is boosted by the fact that it has at least five non-offensive touchdowns in six of the last eight years.

HIGH T.O.P.

- K-State enters this week fifth nationally in time of possession at 34:26.
- The Wildcats' best season time of possession average since 1985 was 33:55 during the 2011 season.
- K-State has possessed the ball for over 40 minutes twice this season, including a 42:52 mark against Bowling Green to rank eighth in Big 12 history.

THESE CATS ARE SMART

- Kansas State has been one of the top teams in the Big 12 in terms of performance in the classroom as the Wildcats lead the league with 135 All-Big 12 honors over the last five seasons.
- The Wildcats have 29 more than the next closest team, Oklahoma State (106), and the Wildcats and Cowboys are the only two programs to top 100 academic all-conference honors since 2014.
- Additionally, Kansas State is tied for first in the nation with SMU by having 21 graduates on its current roster.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BALANCED ON OFFENSE

- K-State has showcased a balanced offense this season, averaging 198.8 yards per game on the ground and 180.7 passing yards per game.
- Against Oklahoma, K-State was a perfect 50-50 split with 213 rushing yards and 213 passing yards.
- K-State had 573 yards of total offense against Nicholls, which tied for the seventh most in school history and were the most ever in a season opener.
- With 521 yards against Bowling Green, K-State eclipsed the 500-yard total offense mark in the first two games of a season for the first time ever.

FEW OFFENSIVE TURNOVERS

- The Wildcats only have four offensive turnovers in its first nine games (2 INT, 2 FUM), their fewest in the first nine games of a season since 2012 (2 INT, 1 FUM).
- K-State's had a three-game stretch of zero turnovers snapped at Texas (one fumble).
- Of the Wildcats' six lost fumbles this season, three are on punt returns and one is on an interception return.
- K-State was the final team in the nation to commit an offensive turnover this year when it fumbled at OSU. The Cats went the first 189 minutes, 38 seconds of the 2019 season without committing an offensive turnover.

RACKING UP RUSHING YARDS

- The Cats showed at the outset of the year its ability to run the ball, a mark that now stands at 198.8 per game.
- Kansas State has 1,789 total rushing yards this season. The Wildcats hit the 1,000-yard mark in their fifth game, marking the eighth time since 2000 but just the second since 2013 it only took five games to get to 1,000.
- K-State carded over 300 yards rushing in each of the first two games, the first time since at least 1965 that the Cats went over the 300-yard mark twice to open a season.
- Against OU and KU, the Cats ran for 555 yards and 11 scores on the ground. Their 342 rushing yards against Kansas were the most in a Big 12 game since totaling 366 yards at TCU in 2016.

RUNNING TO PAYDIRT

- Seven different Wildcats have tallied rushing touchdowns this year for a team total of 25. Last year, K-State had 20 total rushing touchdowns in 12 games.
- The Wildcats are six rushing scores away from tying for 10th in school history.
- K-State running backs have accounted for 14 rushing touchdowns this season after the position group only had 13 in 2018.

SKYLAR IN CHARGE

- Junior **Skylar Thompson** is now entrenched as the starting quarterback after splitting starting duties in 2017 and 2018.
- Thompson ranks fourth in school history in completion percentage (minimum 300 attempts) at 60.0%, while his 134.4 career passing efficiency rating ranks seventh, his 23 career passing touchdowns are tied for 10th and his 3,669 career passing yards rank 12th.
- Additionally, the Independence, Missouri, has been responsible for 41 career touchdowns rank ninth in school history.

RUN-PASS OPTION

• **Skylar Thompson** has proven to be equally as effective in both the passing and running game as he is close to joining only three other players in school history with 3,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.

SKYLAR RUNS TO PAYDIRT

• **Skylar Thompson** scored seven rushing touchdowns over a two-game stretch against Oklahoma and Kansas, which was the most by a K-State quarterback since **Collin Klein** also had seven in consecutive games against Iowa State (3) and West Virginia (4).

• Thompson scored four touchdowns against Oklahoma, which is tied for the second most by any player in a game this season and is tied for the second most in a single game in school history.

• Thompson has improved his season rushing touchdown total to 10, which is tied for the fourth most in the country among signal callers.

• With 18 career rushing scores, Thompson is tied for sixth in school history among quarterbacks.

TAKING CARE OF THE FOOTBALL

• **Skylar Thompson** has excelled in taking care of the football as his interception percentage this season currently ranks first in Big 12 history.

ICE IN HIS VEINS

• **Skylar Thompson** has led the Wildcats on four touchdown drives in the fourth quarter or later to either tie or take the lead during his career, including two this year.

• Against TCU, Thompson led the Wildcats on an 11-play, 95-yard drive, scoring the game-winning TD on a 3-yard run with 2:45 left. Thompson accounted for 91 of the 95 yards (66 rushing, 25 passing) on the drive.

• At Mississippi State, Thompson threw a touchdown pass with 5:37 left en route to a 31-24 win.

• As a redshirt freshman in 2017, Thompson led a drive and scored on a 1-yard run at Texas Tech to tie the game with 0:42 left. He then threw a touchdown pass on the first possession of overtime for a 42-35 win.

• Then, in the regular-season finale vs. Iowa State, Thompson threw a TD pass with no time left for a 20-19 win.

JAMES JUMPS RIGHT IN

• Senior running back **James Gilbert** was the Wildcats' bell cow the first seven games of the year to help him rank highly among active players.

• Gilbert ranks 10th nationally among active players in career rushing yards (3,364) and tied for eighth in career rushing touchdowns (35).

VETERAN O-LINE

• The 2019 K-State offensive line is one of senior leadership as all five players who have started every game this year are seniors.

• The five starters along the line have combined for 139 starts at K-State with a majority of those coming from left tackle **Scott Frantz** (47), right guard **Tyler Mitchell** (39) center **Adam Holtorf** (34).

• Frantz has started every game since the beginning of 2016, a span of 47-straight starts. His 47-consecutive starts are the most nationally among active Power 5 offensive linemen, while his total starts rank fourth among Wildcat offensive linemen since 1990.

• K-State ranks second in the Big 12 and 32nd nationally in scoring defense (21.1 pts/gm), while the Wildcats are first in the league and 29th nationally in passing yards allowed (194.8 yd/gm).

• Kansas State has finished in the top 25 nationally in scoring defense only twice since 2003. In terms of pass defense, K-State has not finished better than 40th in the country since 2003 when it ranked seventh.

With the NFL in the midst of its 100th season, K-State currently has 12 players NFL rosters. Of the 12 players, seven are on offense and five are on defense. The longest-tenured former Wildcat is **Darren Sproles** (15th year; Philadelphia), while **Tyler Lockett** (Seattle) and **Cornelius Lucas** (Chicago) are set to begin their fifth seasons.



K-State has two players from last year's squad on NFL rosters, which includes second-round draft pick **Dalton Risner** (Denver) and sixth-round pick **Duke Shelley** (Chicago). Their selections extended K-State's Big 12-leading streak with at least one player selected in the NFL Draft to a Big 12-record 26 years.

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

- The K-State defense has excelled in terms of getting off the field on third down during the first nine games of the year as the Wildcats rank third in the nation in third down defense (26.0%) behind Wisconsin (21.6%) and Ohio State (25.8%).
- The Cats have allowed only 25 third down conversions this year, tied for the fewest in the nation with Wisconsin.
- Additionally, K-State was the last team in the nation to allow a fourth-down conversion when Texas converted one last week.

BACK FOR MORE

- Sophomore defensive end **Wyatt Hubert** had an outstanding rookie campaign in 2018 as he earned Freshman All-America honors from *USA TODAY Sports* after carding 8.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks.
- Hubert is trying to improve his game in 2019 as he ranks fifth in the Big 12 in sacks. He tied his career high at Oklahoma State with two sacks, while he also had one against TCU, Oklahoma and Texas.

REGGIE CLOSING IN

- **Reggie Walker** has tied one school record and is close to entering the top 10 in another category.
- The Ponchatoula, Louisiana, native has nine career forced fumbles to tie the school history, joining **Darren Howard** (1996-99) and **Grady Newton** (1983-87).
- Walker also has 16.0 career sacks to sit two away from entering the school's top-10 list.
- His nine career forced fumbles are tied for third among active players, while his 16.0 career sacks are tied for 20th.

STOUT UP THE MIDDLE

- Not to be outdone by the edge, the interior of the defensive line also has a bevy of experience as senior **Trey Dishon** has started 46 games, including 44-straight.
- Senior **Jordan Mittie** has taken a hold of the other tackle spot in 2019. A career 40-game starter, which includes 24 starts in two seasons at Texas State, Mittie had perhaps his best game as a Wildcat at Mississippi State when he had a K-State career-high seven tackles – two shy of his overall career high – and a tackle for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

- Kansas State has been far and away the best team among FBS programs over the last 15 years when it comes to scoring via a kickoff or punt return.
- The Wildcats have a combined 50 kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns since 2005, 19 more than any other FBS school during that stretch.
- **Malik Knowles** got things going for the Wildcats in that department in 2019 with a 100-yard kickoff return at Mississippi State, while **Joshua Youngblood** went 98 yards for a kickoff-return score at Texas.

DEFENSE ON KICKOFFS

- K-State has been consistent in terms of kickoff coverage as the Cats have not allowed a kickoff-return touchdown in the last 84 games, the last being against Louisiana on September 7, 2013. During that stretch, K-State has defended against 315 kickoff returns.
- K-State has ranked in the top 30 nationally in kickoff return defense each of the last five seasons, including a No. 2 national ranking in 2017.
- The Wildcats enter this week ranked eighth in that department by limiting opponents to just 16.54 yards per return.

LYNCH IS ACCURATE

- A former walk-on, **Blake Lynch** has proven to be an accurate kicker as he his career field goal percentage of 89.3% (25-for-28) currently ranks fourth nationally among active players and first in school history.
- Lynch, a 2019 Lou Groza Award candidate who earned a scholarship after the first game last year, is 11-of-12 this season to rank third in school history and 10th nationally with a 91.7% mark.

- A 2019 Ray Guy Award candidate after earning Honorable Mention All-Big 12 honors last year, **Devin Anctil** has averaged 44.85 yards on his 41 punts, a mark that currently stands as the school record and ranks 18th in the country.

- A pair of freshmen have returned kickoffs for scores this year in **Malik Knowles** and **Joshua Youngblood**.
- Knowles, a redshirt freshman, returned one 100 yards at Mississippi State. It was the seventh 100-yard return in school history and first since **Morgan Burns** in 2015 against Iowa State.
- Knowles went on to earn Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors.
- Last week at Texas, Youngblood – a true freshman – returned one 98 yards in the fourth quarter. He became the first K-State true freshman with a KOR touchdown since current Seattle Seahawk **Tyler Lockett** had two in 2011.
- Youngblood is one of two true freshmen this season to return a kickoff at least 98 yards, joining Oregon's Mykael Wright, who went 100 yards against USC.

► Game Notes

• **Isaiah Zuber** hit a milestone against West Virginia as he topped 1,000 career yards during the contest... Zuber, who now has 1,058 career receiving yards, became the 31st player in school history to hit the 1,000-yard mark... He hauled in 10 catches on the day, the most by a Wildcat since **Tyler Lockett** (13) and **Curry Sexton** (10) in the 2015 Alamo Bowl against UCLA.

• **Isaiah Zuber** also came up with the second 100-yard receiving game of his career, each coming over the last two games... He is the first Wildcat with consecutive 100-yard receiving games since **Byron Pringle** had two to close out the 2016 season and one in the 2017 season opener.

• **Duke Shelley** carded two pass breakups to improve his career total to 35... He entered the school's top-10 list for career pass breakups as he is now tied for eighth with **Randall Evans** (2011-14)... Of his 35 career passes defended, seven have come against West Virginia, which includes a career-best four during his true freshman year of 2015.

• **Dalton Risner** notched his 42nd career start on Saturday... He is now tied for fourth since 1989 in starts by offensive lineman (**Nick Leckey** – 2000-03)... Next on the list is **Quentin Neujahr**, who started 45 games from 1990-93... **B.J. Finney** (2011-14) is first on the list with 52, one ahead of **Cody Whitehair** (2012-15).

• Three defensive backs – **AJ Parker**, **Johnathan Durham** and **Jahron McPherson** – each recorded their first-career interceptions against the Mountaineers.

K-STATE BOTTLED UP BY NO. 12 WVU

MORGANTOWN, WVa. — No. 12 West Virginia's passing attack was too much for Kansas State, as quarterback Will Grier threw for five touchdowns, including three to wide receiver David Sills V, to guide the Mountaineers to a 35-6 victory at Milan Puskar Stadium.

Led by Grier, the West Virginia offense registered 464 yards of total offense, including 356 yards through the air.

Defensively, the Mountaineers held the Wildcats to 318 yards of total offense, including just 3-of-14 efficiency on third down. All six points came off the foot of sophomore place kicker Blake Lynch, who made 25-yard and 38-yard field goals in the second half.

Junior wide receiver Isaiah Zuber reached the 1,000-yard mark in career receiving yards, the 31st individual to do so. Zuber, who finished with 133 yards, reached 100-yards receiving in consecutive games for the first time in his career.

Defensively, defensive backs AJ Parker, Johnathan Durham and Jahron McPherson collected their first-career interceptions.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After forcing just two turnovers in their first three games this season, the Wildcat defense made a statement early against the Mountaineers, forcing turnovers on the first two West Virginia possessions.

On the opening possession, Grier fired a pass down the field, which was heavily defended and intercepted by Parker. The interception marked the first of Parker's career and the second interception for K-State this season.

On West Virginia's second offensive possession, the Wildcats shut down the Mountaineer attack by recovering a fumble on the hand-off exchange between Grier and freshman running back Laddie Brown.

WVU responded on its following offensive possession, as Grier found junior wide receiver Marcus Simms open for an 82-yard receiving touchdown to find the first points of the game with 4:46 remaining in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Jordan Mittie and the K-State defense prevented the Mountaineers from putting more points on the board. On third and four from the K-State 30-yard line, Mittie recorded his first sack of the season, wrapping up Grier for a loss of four.

Later in the second quarter, West Virginia went back to the air to expand on their lead, this time from Grier to Sills. Grier and Sills capitalized on two touchdowns in the final three minutes of the first half, both of which came from one-yard out, as the Mountaineers went into halftime with a 21-0 lead.

The Wildcats found their first offensive spark in the third quarter, when sophomore quarterback Skylar Thompson found Zuber open for a 40-yard catch and run. The big play led to a 25-yard field goal conversion by Lynch.

The Mountaineers continued to capitalize through the air in the third quarter, connecting on two more touchdowns from Grier. In the fourth quarter, Lynch converted on a 38-yard field goal to bring the score to 35-6 with 13:48 remaining in the game.

CHRIS KLIEMAN

Head Coach

26th Year in Coaching • Seventh Year as a Head Coach
Northern Iowa '90, '92

Chris Klieman, a proven winner with a championship history, was named the 35th head football coach in Kansas State history on December 10, 2018.

Klieman (pronounced KLY-men) capped his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018. He tied Jim Tressel (Youngstown State) for the most FCS National Championships as a head coach, while he was a part of all seven of NDSU's national championships, the most in FCS history.

Klieman guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record, just the fifth team in FCS history to go undefeated and untied on the way to a national championship. North Dakota State also claimed that feat in 2013 when Klieman as the defensive coordinator.

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Klieman finished first in NDSU history in winning percentage (.920) and third in victories (69).

Klieman's accomplishments as the Bison head coach came despite losing 23 seniors and welcoming seven new assistant coaches prior to his first season at the helm in 2014. That year, the Bison went 15-1 and won the national championship before going 13-2 with another national championship in 2015, 12-2 with a semifinal appearance in 2016 and 14-1 with a third national title in 2017.

"I'm very excited to have Chris Klieman lead our program," Athletics Director **Gene Taylor** said at the time of Klieman's hiring. "He is a perfect fit for us, both from a personal standpoint and as a head coach. He's a tremendous teacher who I had the pleasure to hire at NDSU and watched him turn into a very successful coach. He will bring a ton of energy and excitement. His teams play extremely hard, disciplined football. He's a winner. That's all he does is win, and we're excited to have Chris, Rhonda and the entire Klieman family join our K-State family. They will be a great fit not only for Kansas State Football and Kansas State Athletics, but also the entire community of Manhattan."

"This is an absolute dream job," Klieman, a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award as the FCS Coach of the Year, said. "I'm so happy and thrilled to follow a legend in Coach Snyder. I've followed him from afar, went to his camps while playing in Waterloo, Iowa, and played against his Kansas State team when I was at Northern Iowa. The opportunity to follow in an icon's footsteps is something I don't take for granted and don't take lightly. I know I have huge shoes to fill, and I'm excited to carry on his legacy. I have prepared my entire life for this opportunity and had great experiences at many institutions, most notably North Dakota State, where we've had unmatched success over the last eight years. I can't express how pleased I am, and I thank President Myers, Gene Taylor and the search committee for trusting in me and handing over the keys to this great program."

Klieman holds a 78-16 record in his six-plus seasons overall as head coach, including a 69-6 mark at North Dakota State. His 83.0 winning percentage as a head coach is the eighth-highest mark by an active coach among all NCAA Divisions, while it is the top mark among current FBS coaches.

Klieman's record is even more impressive considering 39 of his 69 wins at North Dakota State (56.5 percent) came over ranked opponents, while he had two wins in two tries over FBS competition — a 34-14 victory at Iowa State in his first game at the helm of NDSU and a 23-21 triumph at 11th-ranked Iowa in 2016. His teams have also been stellar in protecting home field as evidenced by his 43-3 home record at NDSU, which includes winning each of his last 19 games at the FargoDome.

The Bison won the Missouri Valley Football Conference each of his five years as head coach and put together a collective 36-4 (90.0 percent) record against conference foes during that time. He was named the Bruce Craddock MVFC Coach of the Year in 2017, while he was the 2014 Rawlings Football/American Football Monthly FCS Coach of the Year and the 2018 AFCA Region 4 FCS Coach of the Year.

"We're pleased to welcome Coach Klieman to Kansas State University," President **Richard Myers** said. "Athletic Director Gene Taylor conducted a high-quality, thorough search and we are confident Chris puts us in a great position for future success. We know he will receive the tremendous support for which we have become nationally known. This is a great time to be a Wildcat!"

Klieman's teams were a model of success at NDSU, ranking highly in many of the key statistical categories throughout his tenure. The Bison scoring offense ranked in the top 10 each of his final three seasons in Fargo, including a 41.5-points-per-game mark to rank sixth in 2018, and their total offense mark ranked in the top 20 the final two years, including a 271.7-yard mark in 2018 to rank 14th in the nation.

Klieman, who came up through the coaching ranks on defense, has always produced on that side of the ball as NDSU finished his final season ranked in the top 15 in red zone defense (1st), scoring defense (3rd) and total defense (5th). The Bison ranked in the top six in scoring and total defense in four of his five seasons as head coach, including a No. 1 national ranking in total defense in 2017 (237.4).

Elevated from defensive coordinator to head coach at NDSU on December 15, 2013, Klieman's defensive units during his two-year run as coordinator each included top-10 rankings in scoring defense, total defense, rushing defense and passing defense. Highlighting that run were No. 1 rankings in scoring defense in both 2012 and 2013, and total defense in 2012, the latter when he was named the Football Scoop FCS Coordinator of the Year. NDSU also led the nation in scoring defense when he was the defensive backs coach in 2011.

Klieman began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Northern Iowa, in 1991 and 1992 before being promoted to an assistant coach in 1993. He went on to Western Illinois as an assistant coach from 1994 to 1996 before serving as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1997 and an assistant coach at Missouri State in 1999.

Klieman then moved on to Division III Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, where he was the defensive coordinator from 2002 to 2004 before taking over as head coach for the 2005 season. He returned to Northern Iowa in 2006 as an assistant coach before being elevated to defensive coordinator for the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

Klieman was a three-time All-Gateway Conference defensive back at Northern Iowa and four-year letterwinner from 1986-90. He graduated from UNI in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health education and a master's degree in physical education in 1992.

Klieman and his wife, **Rhonda**, are parents of two sons, **Devin** and **Colby**, and one daughter, **Haley**.

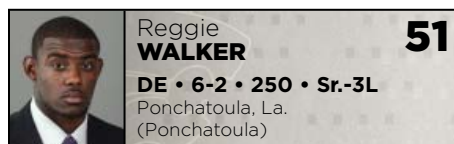

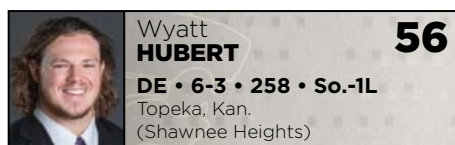

► Game Notes

• Head coach **Chris Klieman** earned a win in his first game leading the Wildcats... The 35-point victory by the Klieman-led Wildcats was the biggest margin of victory by a K-State head coach in their debut... The previous high was 31 points as the **Ward Haylett**-led Wildcats defeated Kansas Wesleyan, 37-6, in 1942.

• K-State finished the game with 573 yards of total offense, which tied for the seventh most for a game in school history and the most ever in a season opener.

• Kansas State finished the game with 361 rushing yards on 58 carries... It was the most rushing yards by any Wildcat team in a season opener since 1981, when the Wildcats rushed for 368 yards in a 31-10 home-opening win over South Dakota (9/12/81).

• Junior quarterback **Skylar Thompson** made his second-straight start in a season opener... He became the first Wildcat quarterback since Collin Klein (2011, 2012) to win two-consecutive season openers.

• Senior running back **James Gilbert** tallied a 100-yard game as he went for 115 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries... It was his ninth-career 100-yard game and first since the 2018 season opener against Central Connecticut when he was playing for Ball State... He was the first Wildcat to reach the 100-yard mark in their Wildcat debut since **Daniel Thomas** went for 104 yards against UMass on 2009.

• A total of 51,189 fans witnessed Saturday's game, marking the 11th-straight sellout of the Wildcats' season opener.

CATS RUN WILD, OPEN KLIEMAN ERA WITH WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Chris Klieman wasn't the only one making his K-State debut on Saturday night. Almost all of K-State's running backs were as well.

All left positive first impressions.

K-State won, 49-14, against Nicholls in front of a sold-out crowd. The Wildcats, who returned zero rushing yards from running backs from last season, amassed 361 rushing yards to open the Klieman era. It marked the most in a K-State season opener since at least 1981.

The Wildcats accomplished this behind, mostly, a trio of K-State newcomers: James Gilbert, Jordan Brown and Harry Trotter. Those three combined for 214 rushing yards, led by Gilbert's 115 yards on 18 carries. Each of them had one touchdown, all coming in a first half that K-State dominated by a 28-0 margin.

Tyler Burns, who returned to K-State's program after a season away, joined the rushing fray late on Saturday. He rushed for 60 yards on 10 attempts, including 56 yards on nine carries on K-State's final scoring drive about midway through the fourth quarter. He finished it with a 1-yard touchdown plunge.

For a position group that started all but empty when Klieman and his staff took over, depth did not look to be an issue after nine months of work.

Gilbert, a graduate transfer from Ball State, became the first Wildcat to eclipse 100 yards rushing in his first K-State game since Daniel Thomas in 2009. Gilbert's longest run, a 24-yard scamper in the second quarter, finished one of K-State's five scoring drives of at least 10 plays.

Trotter, a junior who sat out last season after transferring from Louisville, collected 50 yards on 10 carries. The Atchison native ran through multiple tackles on a 9-yard touchdown run that capped a 12-play, 72-yard drive to open the game. K-State followed with three straight scoring drives.

Brown, a graduate transfer from North Carolina who joined the team in July, added in 49 yards on 11 carries. He scored on a 14-yard run early in the second quarter, but he also snagged a pair of passes for 28 yards from redshirt junior quarterback Skylar Thompson, who finished 16-of-22 through the air for 212 yards and a touchdown.

The run game set the tone, helping K-State eat up more than 41 minutes of clock. But the defense factored into that as well.

K-State allowed only 17 yards in the first quarter and 64 in the first half. AJ Parker jumped a pass for an interception on Nicholls' second offensive play of the day, setting up K-State's second touchdown. The Colonels did not get a first down until the second quarter and finished with only two in the opening half.

Early in the fourth quarter, Jonathan Alexander forced a fumble and scooped it for a 25-yard touchdown. He celebrated with a sledgehammer on the sideline, part of K-State's "Pound the Stone" mantra that Klieman said the team fully bought into coming into this season.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State started 2-0 for the second time in the last three seasons and the eighth time in the last 12 years... Head coach Chris Klieman became the seventh coach in school history to win their first two games... Saturday's victory marked the 23rd-straight victory by a Klieman-led team dating back to 2017 at North Dakota State.

• Kansas State broke the 500-yard mark of total offense for a second-straight game as the Wildcats racked up 521 yards on Saturday and 573 yards last week against Nicholls... It was the first time in school history that K-State began the season with two-straight games of 500 yards total offense, while it was the first overall since 2003... That season, the Wildcats had 502 yards at Iowa State followed by 561 yards at Nebraska.

• Kansas State finished the game with 333 rushing yards on 58 carries... Paired with last week's 361 rushing yards against Nicholls, it was the first time since at least 1965 that the Wildcats started with two-consecutive outings of 300 rushing yards... It was the first time overall with consecutive 300-yard games since playing Kansas (342) and TCU (336) in 2016.

• Following five rushing scores last week, Kansas State added five more on Saturday to bring the season total to 10... It was the most rushing touchdowns by K-State in the first two games of the season since the 2002 team had 10 (5 vs. Western Kentucky, 5 vs. Louisiana Monroe)... Of the 10 rushing touchdowns this season, 9 have been by running backs... Last season, the Wildcats had 13 rushing touchdowns by running backs in 12 games.

CATS DOMINATE BOTH SIDES OF BALL IN 52-0 WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Different opponent, same dominance.

K-State totaled 521 yards of offense, allowed less than 150 yards on defense and rolled to a 52-0 win against Bowling Green.

Like last week, the Wildcats' extreme command of the game could be seen early and all over the field, including the sideline. That's where K-State's defense spent more than 22 minutes in the first half and 42 minutes for the game.

K-State's defense barely played half that on Saturday, with Bowling Green only getting 44 plays of offense.

The Falcons also went 0-for-11 on third down conversions and 0-for-2 on fourth, but the tone was set early. In Bowling Green's first four drives, the Wildcats forced three three-and-outs. They finished with eight such series en route to their first shutout since blanking South Dakota in 2015.

K-State allowed only three first downs and 81 yards of offense in the first half, which ended with the Wildcats up 38-0 — their largest halftime lead since a 42-0 advantage over Florida Atlantic in 2016. Bowling Green finished with a meager 140 yards of total offense against K-State's swarming defense — the first time the Wildcats have limited an opponent to less than 150 since 2011 against Eastern Kentucky.

K-State's offense returned the favor.

The Wildcats scored on their first seven drives in the game. After settling for a 24-yard field goal from Blake Lynch on the first drive of the game, the Wildcats finished their next six drives in the end zone.

K-State's 333 rushing yards helped push the team over 500 yards of total offense. It marked the first time in program history that K-State eclipsed 500 yards of total offense in its first two games of the season and the first time since 2003 for any two-game stretch.

Explosive plays and players were a big part of this.

Jordan Brown broke off a 50-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for K-State's first touchdown. James Gilbert, who recorded 103 yards for his second consecutive game over the century mark, picked up nearly half on a 51-yard scamper in the second quarter. Gilbert scored on the next play, his second touchdown of the day.

Quarterback Skylar Thompson continued to display his trust in redshirt freshman receiver Malik Knowles. Thompson, who finished 10-of-13 for 151 yards, targeted Knowles six times. They connected on five of them for 99 yards, including touchdown grabs of 34 and 20 yards.

K-State's early and continuous success allowed several younger players on the field for the second week in a row. In total, 88 different Wildcats and 11 true freshmen saw game time.

Quarterbacks Nick Ast and John Holcombe II traded off series for most of the second half. Freshman running back Jacardia Wright led the team with 14 carries, all in the second half, while fellow freshman Joe Ervin carried the ball eight times and scored his first touchdown from 6 yards out in the third quarter. Seth Porter and Joshua Youngblood each recorded their first catches in a K-State uniform.

CATS CONTROL FOURTH QUARTER IN 31-24 WIN

STARKVILLE, Miss. — K-State faced roughly no adversity in its first two wins this season. The Wildcats knew that would end in Week 3, but they were prepared to bounce back from it in a 31-24 win at No. 23 Mississippi State in Davis Wade Stadium.

The Wildcats scored 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter, after MSU put up 17 straight, to clinch the program's first road win against a Power Five opponent since topping Miami 28-24 in 2011. It also marked the program's first ever road win over an opponent in the SEC at the time the game was played.

Malik Knowles delivered a momentum-changing blow early in the fourth quarter of a game played in 100-degree humid temperatures. The freshman receiver tied the game at 24 with a 100-yard kickoff return. It ended a long dry spell from K-State, which included only two true offensive series and 15 total yards in the third quarter.

After the special teams score, the Wildcat defense forced two consecutive three-and-outs to give them five such stops for the game. Quarterback Skylar Thompson followed the second fourth quarter stop with a six-play, 53-yard scoring drive to take the lead. He ended it with a 15-yard touchdown pass to senior receiver Dalton Schoen with 5:37 to play.

K-State turned MSU over on downs on the ensuing drive. On fourth-and-16, AJ Parker and Elijah Sullivan capped the stop by hitting a diving MSU quarterback Garrett Schrader, propelling him into a helicopter spin that forced him to fall a yard shy of the first down marker.

K-State overcame a trio of lost fumbles with the strong fourth quarter, two on muffed punt returns and another on a Parker interception return. MSU turned those Wildcat turnovers into 17 points between the second and third quarters.

The Wildcats also turned the Bulldogs over three times, turning two of them into a combined 10 points.

Senior safety Denzel Goolsby, who led the team with 11 tackles, snagged an interception that bounced off the hands of a Mississippi State receiver in the first quarter. It led to a 35-yard field goal from Blake Lynch.

About three minutes before halftime, freshman linebacker Daniel Green scooped up a fumble to set up a 30-yard scoring drive. MSU answered, however, with a 31-second touchdown drive, finished by a 35-yard touchdown pass to take momentum into the half.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State and Oklahoma State met for the 66th time in series history with the Cowboys now holding a 26-40 advantage... OSU snapped a two-game winning streak by the Wildcats... K-State fell to 11-13 all-time in Big 12 openers, while the Wildcats are now 10-14 in Big 12 road openers... Kansas State has now dropped its last five initial Big 12 road contests of the season as its last win in such occasions was at Iowa State in 2014.

• Kansas State added a rushing touchdown on Saturday to bring the season total to 13... Of the 13 rushing touchdowns this season, 11 have been by running backs... Last season, the Wildcats had 13 rushing touchdowns by running backs in 12 games.

• Kansas State was the last team in the nation to commit an offensive turnover when it did so with a fumble in the first quarter... The Wildcats went the first 189 minutes, 38 seconds of the season without an offensive turnover.

• Sophomore defensive end Wyatt Hubert finished the game with four tackles, including 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble... His 2.0 sacks tied a career high he set last year against Texas Tech, while it was his first-career forced fumble.

• Senior Devin Antclit punted seven times for a 45.9-yard average, which included a 54-yarder and a pair of punts inside the 20-yard line... It was the fourth time in his career he held an average of 45 or more yards, including the second-straight game.

K-STATE DROPS BIG 12 OPENER AT OSU

STILLWATER, Okla. — K-State figured if it could win the battle of the red zone against a high-powered Oklahoma State offense, it would have a chance in Boone Pickens Stadium.

The No. 24/22 Wildcats did so defensively, limiting the Cowboys to one touchdown in five red zone opportunities. K-State's offense, however, only reached the red zone twice and struggled to find success for most of a 26-13 loss to start Big 12 play.

OSU, ranked No. 11 nationally in total offense (533.8) and No. 12 in scoring offense (44.5) coming in, put up 526 yards of offense but was held nearly 20 points below its scoring average. The Cowboys' one touchdown in the red zone came off a drive that started on K-State's 26-yard line after a Wildcat fumble in the first quarter.

The Wildcats turned the Cowboys over twice on a pair of interceptions from Elijah Sullivan and Darreyl Patterson in the second half.

Sullivan's pick led to one of Blake Lynch's two made field goals. Patterson's occurred with K-State down 23-6 in the fourth quarter. The Wildcats scored six plays later on a 5-yard touchdown run from James Gilbert to cut their deficit to 10, but the Cowboys answered with a 6:11 drive that ended in a field goal and sealed the game.

Early on, K-State's defense kept its hopes alive. The Wildcats simply struggled to find much success on offense. They finished with 244 total yards, including 163 in the second half.

In the second quarter with K-State down 10-0, sophomore defensive end Wyatt Hubert forced a fourth down fumble to give the Wildcats the ball at the Cowboy 40. K-State failed to move the chains, however. The Wildcats converted 1-of-13 third down chances for the game.

Ultimately, OSU's three-headed attack of quarterback Spencer Sanders, running back Chuba Hubbard and receiver Tylan Wallace were too effective to keep at bay. Sanders threw for 153 yards, 145 of which went to Wallace. Hubbard finished with 296 rushing yards, highlighted by an 84-yard touchdown run in the third quarter to put OSU up 23-3.

K-State's first and biggest jolt of offense arrived after a 1-hour, 12-minute weather delay in the second quarter. Skylar Thompson connected with Sammy Wheeler for a 39-yard gain on the first play after play resumed. It was K-State's first time moving the chains, but it did not lead to a second, as the Wildcats (3-1, 0-1) settled for a 46-yard Blake Lynch field goal.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State finished the game with 123 rushing yards on 40 carries... The Wildcats now have 1,089 rushing yards this season, marking just the eighth time since 2000 and just the second since 2013 they hit the 1,000-yard mark in the first five games.

• K-State's defense logged a season-best 7.0 tackles-for-loss, including a sack by junior defensive end **Bronson Massie**... In all, eight different players contributed to a defensive stop behind the line of scrimmage.

• Senior wide receiver **Dalton Schoen** hauled in six receptions for 69 yards... He moved from 29th to 25th in school history with 1,209 career receiving yards... His six receptions were a new career high, besting the five he had at Texas and Texas Tech in 2017 in addition to the Texas game in 2018.

• Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Phillip Brooks** caught seven passes to lead K-State for the first time in his career... The seven catches were also a new career high, in addition to a career-best in receiving yards (69).

• Junior **Blake Lynch** was true on both of his field goal attempts from distances of 31 and 30 yards... Coupled with two field goals last week at Oklahoma State, it was the second time in his career he had multiple field goals in consecutive games... The first was against UTSA and at West Virginia in September last season.

• Senior **Devin Ancil** punted six times for a 40.8-yard average... Three of his punts landed inside the Bear 20-yard line, including three inside the 10-yard line, doubling his season tally for punts into the red zone to six.

BEARS HAND K-STATE BIG 12 HOME LOSS

MANHATTAN, Kan. — K-State's searching for consistency. The Wildcats could not find much of it in a 31-12 loss to Baylor in Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State forced Baylor into five three-and-outs and six punts, including three straight of the latter to open the game. The Bears, however, collected 295 yards (69 percent) of their 426 yards of total offense on their four touchdown drives.

"We need to get consistent in everything — our fits, our reads and, especially today, tackling. We can't allow that to happen," K-State senior defensive tackle Jordan Mittie said. "(Baylor's) last touchdown was a misfit, and (those are) just things we have to clean up. It can't keep happening if we want to go out and do something in this conference."

Wildcat punter Devin Ancil twice pinned Baylor inside its 10-yard line. The first time, the Bears responded with a six-play, 98-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter to go up 10-3. Early in the third, the Bears went 91 yards in six plays for a touchdown to go up 17-3.

"The (98-yard drive) was the big one because Devin does a great job of pinning them down in a field position game. It was 3-3 and both defenses were playing well," K-State head coach Chris Klieman said. "That hurt. Obviously, it was a poor job by us of not getting the critical stop, where it's 10-3 rather than it's 3-3 and, if they go three-and-out, five-and-out, we potentially get the ball at midfield, but we didn't. That was a big drive, big series."

K-State, offensively, struggled to replicate those types of series.

The Wildcats put together five drives of more than 35 yards for the game and entered Baylor territory five times in the second half. They failed to sustain enough offense for many of them to matter, however.

Two of K-State's longest drives ended in Blake Lynch field goals (31 yards and 29) in the red zone. A lost fumble stopped one series. On another, with 6:24 to play and K-State down 24-6, Skylar Thompson found Dalton Schoen for a 5-yard touchdown. K-State's last drive — of 10 plays, 43 yards — ended with a turnover on downs.

"Consistency. That's the biggest thing," Klieman said. "This year, we just have to be more consistent, especially in the red zone."

K-State finished with 341 yards of offense, with Thompson connecting on 22-of-34 for 218 yards that included one touchdown and an interception that led to a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

James Gilbert carried the ball 18 times and accounted for 94 of K-State's 123 rushing yards. Schoen set a new career high for catches with six that went for 69 yards, including his third touchdown reception of the season. Redshirt freshman Phillip Brooks notched career highs in receptions (seven) and yards (69).

"Offensively, we've got to be able to sustain drives," Klieman said. "We have some good plays but not enough sustained drives together."

K-State enters a bye week before hosting TCU on Saturday, October 19.

"We told the guys, 'We're going to be good, but we've got to fix some problems and some issues that have crept up the last couple of weeks.' We have it in front of us. There's ton to play for," Klieman said. "The one thing we have to do is stay together. We have a bunch of seniors I know want to be great. I'm going to challenge those guys to make sure we keep moving forward."

• Junior quarterback **Skylar Thompson** made his 20th career start... The Independence, Missouri, native also rushed 10 times for 68 yards and a critical game-winning touchdown... With his three total touchdowns, Thompson now has 22 career touchdowns responsible for in his career, tying three others for 10th on K-State's all-time list... Thompson used a 61-yard scamper to key the Wildcats' final scoring drive, the longest run of his career, topping a previous long of 52 yards against Baylor on Oct. 6 last season.

• Junior wide receiver **Wykeen Gill** set a new career high with 45 receiving yards on a team-best-tying three catches to go along with his first-career touchdown... He also tied a career long with a 22-yard reception in the third quarter en route to a K-State field goal.

• Tight end **Nick Lenners** scored on a 21-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter, the first of his career... It was the first time a Wildcat tight end had a touchdown catch since Zach Trujillo went 36 yards for a score at Baylor in 2014.

• Junior **Jonathan Alexander** blocked a TCU punt in the first quarter, which led to a K-State touchdown... It was the Wildcats' first blocked punt since **Brock Monty** had one last season against Texas Tech... Monty's block against the Red Raiders went for a safety while he also had one against Oklahoma State.

LATE DRIVE SEALS FIRST BIG 12 WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Standing 95 yards away from TCU's end zone in a tie game about midway through the fourth quarter, K-State's offense needed a productive series simply to keep the Horned Frogs out of good field position.

A first down or two for K-State, with 190 total yards of offense at the time, would have been positive, especially with the way Devin Ancil was punting.

The Wildcats had other plans, however. They marched the ball down the field in 11 plays, ate up 5:18 of game clock and Skylar Thompson ended the game-winning drive with a 3-yard touchdown run to propel K-State (4-2, 1-2) to a 24-17 win against TCU on Saturday afternoon.

Thompson helped deliver K-State's second-longest touchdown drive of the season (97 yards against Nicholls) and its longest against a Big 12 opponent since a 98-yard scoring drive against Texas Tech in 2017.

It also came at a point when the Wildcats were struggling to move the chains. Their previous three drives ended in punts and a combined 24 yards.

Thompson said he felt like "it was just a matter of time" before the offense got going like it did in the second quarter on a 10-play, 76-yard scoring drive. K-State also scored on a short field in the first quarter, after Jonathan Alexander blocked and recovered a punt on TCU's second possession. Thompson connected with Nick Lenners for a 21-yard touchdown pass two plays later.

Thompson, who finished the drive with his third rushing touchdown of the season, also sparked it with his legs. After a 5-yard completion to Knowles to gain some breathing room, Thompson took off on a designed second-down run for 61 yards, a career long that put K-State in TCU territory.

Two plays later, K-State faced a third-and-11. Again, Thompson put on his playmaking hat. On third down, he connected with Chabastin Taylor for 10 yards. On fourth, he used his legs to turn a play action bootleg into a 2-yard gain when nothing else was open.

Two plays after that gritty run, K-State stared down another third-and-long. This time, the Wildcats needed nine yards. Thompson converted it with a 10-yard completion to Knowles to put K-State inside TCU's 10. After a 4-yard run from Harry Trotter, Thompson broke into the end zone on second-and-goal.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State broke a four-game overall losing streak to the Sooners and snapped an eight-game skid in Manhattan... It was the first win at Bill Snyder Family Stadium against Oklahoma since a 42-35 win on October 26, 1996.

• K-State improved to 4-52 all-time against teams ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25 poll, including a 3-24 mark at home... The Wildcats' last win against a team ranked in the top five was a 45-42 home victory over No. 4 Texas in 2006.

• Skylar Thompson rushed for four touchdowns... His four rushing touchdowns set a new career high as his previous high was one on 11 occasions... He is the first Wildcat with at least four rushing scores in a game since Alex Barnes had four against Oklahoma State in 2018, while he is the first K-State signal caller with at least four rushing scores in a game since Joe Hubener had four against TCU in 2015.

• Wide receiver Joshua Youngblood scored a four-yard jet sweep in the second quarter... It was his first-career rushing touchdown on the first rushing touchdown by a Wildcat true freshman since Logan Dold against Oklahoma on October 25, 2008.

• Devin Anctil averaged a new career-high 53.3 yards on three punts, which included two punts of 50 or more yards... His 53.3 yards per punt average surpassed his previous best of 50.6 earlier this year at Mississippi State.

CATS HOLD OFF NO. 5 OU FOR UPSET VICTORY

MANHATTAN, Kan. — K-State's stadium erupted with cheers. Soon, its student section emptied onto the field to celebrate K-State's 48-41 win against No. 5 Oklahoma.

Most of them — the students and the players — were not alive the last time K-State topped Oklahoma at home in 1996. First-year head coach Chris Klieman was coaching defensive backs at Western Illinois at the time.

Fans had not rushed the field at Bill Snyder Family Stadium since clinching a Big 12 Championship at home against Texas in 2012. This time, the Wildcats knocked off the four-time defending Big 12 champion.

For a little more than three quarters, K-State's execution was something special.

Behind it, the Wildcats overcame 10-0 and 17-7 deficits in the first quarter to take a 24-23 lead to halftime. They outscored Oklahoma 17-0 in the third quarter to build a 25-point lead and they held on in the fourth quarter for the victory.

K-State's win was sealed when an onside kick recovery by Oklahoma with less than two minutes left was overturned by replay review, prompting a loud roar in the stadium and putting K-State's offense into the victory formation.

Thompson and K-State's offense came together quickly after a three-and-out to start the game.

The Wildcats followed that series with three consecutive scoring drives of 10 or more plays that ate up a combined 15:45 of clock. K-State ended up with eight straight scoring drives between the first and fourth quarter — the most against a Big 12 opponent since recording eight in 2012 against West Virginia. K-State's run of scores was capped by a 10-play, 73-yard touchdown drive to go up 48-23 early in the fourth quarter.

The Wildcats used effective offense as a second defense, winning the time of possession by more than 16 minutes (38:08 to 21:52). They did so, in part, with a rejuvenated run game.

K-State rushed for 213 yards, led by James Gilbert's 105 on 13 carries. Jordan Brown, in his first action since K-State's Big 12 opener against Oklahoma State, added 63 yards on 12 carries. Thompson chipped in 39 yards and a career-high four scores on the ground. He also connected on 18-of-28 through the air for 213 yards, hooking up with nine different receivers.

The Wildcats also forced and took advantage of a pair of Oklahoma turnovers, turning them into 14 points.

AJ Parker intercepted a pass off an Oklahoma trick play late in the first half. Thompson scored three plays later on a 14-yard draw on third-and-10.

Senior linebacker Eric Gallon forced a fumble on a pooch kick, and K-State recovered en route to one of Thompson's touchdown runs.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State improved its winning streak over Kansas to 11-straight games, tying the longest streak by either team in the series... It is tied with the Wildcats' 11-game streak over the Jayhawks from 1993-2003... The victory was also the sixth-straight win by K-State in Lawrence, its longest in series history.

• With the win, K-State qualified for its 22nd bowl in school history and the ninth in the last 10 years... It is the earliest in the season (game 8) in which K-State became bowl eligible since 2014 (game 7)... Chris Klieman became the second coach in school history to lead the Wildcats to a bowl game in his first season, joining Ron Prince (2006)... Klieman is the fourth head coach to lead the Wildcats to bowl eligibility, following Jim Dickey (1982), Bill Snyder (1993-2003, 2010-17) and Prince.

• K-State had five rushing touchdowns on Saturday... Paired with its six rushing scores last week against Oklahoma, the Wildcats have at least 11 rushing scores over a two-game stretch in Big 12 play for the first time since 2002... That season, K-State had six against both Iowa State and Nebraska.

• Skylar Thompson made his 22nd career start on Saturday, rushing for 127 yards and three touchdowns on 17 carries... He became the first quarterback with 100 rushing yards and 100 passing yards in the same game since Alex Delton did so against Oklahoma in 2017... He is the first quarterback with a 100-yard rushing game since Delton against UCLA in the 2017 Cactus Bowl... Adding to his four rushing scores against OU, Thompson's seven rushing TDs in a two-week span are the most since Collin Klein in 2012.

K-STATE RUNS SUNFLOWER STREAK TO 11

LAWRENCE, Kan. — No. 22/25 K-State ran over rival Kansas on both sides of the ball in a 38-10 win at Memorial Stadium.

Of K-State's 471 yards of total offense, the Wildcats amassed 342 of them on the ground in their third-straight win. K-State's sweltering defense also limited Kansas, coming off consecutive 500-plus yard games, to a mere 241 in the 117th version of Sunflower Showdown. More than 100 of those yards came after K-State went up 38-3 early in the fourth quarter, too.

Skylar Thompson led the way with a career-high 127 rushing yards, as K-State cruised to its 11th-straight win against the Jayhawks and became bowl eligible the earliest in a season since 2014. Thompson found the end zone three times on the ground, giving him seven rushing touchdowns between his last two games — the most since by a Wildcat since his position coach, Collin Klein, did so as a player in 2012.

With James Gilbert out with an injury and Jordan Brown (2 carries for 8 yards) limited, junior running back Harry Trotter stepped into a bigger role and added in a career-high 92 yards on 20 carries and a touchdown, while freshman Joe Ervin tacked on 46 yards on 10 carries. Tyler Burns contributed 58 rushing yards late in the game, highlighted by a 14-yard touchdown.

K-State's run success led to an 11-of-17 third down success rate, a season high third down total, which helped the Wildcats churn out consecutive 10-play touchdown drives to start the game. The Wildcats added a nine-play, 75-yard touchdown drive early in the third quarter to go up 24-3.

K-State's ground game also kept the clock going and Kansas' offense off the field, as the Wildcats won the time of possession by more than 16 minutes (38:03 to 21:57). It marked the biggest time-of-possession margin in K-State's favor in a Big 12 game since a 2016 win against Texas.

On top of stifling a dangerous Kansas offense, the Wildcats forced a pair of turnovers, recorded a season-high four sacks and stopped the Jayhawks twice on fourth down in the fourth quarter. K-State turned both fourth down stops into touchdowns.

K-State set the defensive tone early, too. The Wildcats held Kansas to 74 yards of total offense, including 27 rushing yards, in the first half — the least yards allowed by a Wildcat defense in a Big 12 game since 2012 against West Virginia.

When K-State hit an early offensive wall, its defense stepped up time after time. Jahron McPherson snagged an interception on Kansas' third drive. Senior Trey Dishon picked up sacks on consecutive drives after that, both on second down to help halt the Jayhawk offense.

Near the end of the first half, K-State linebacker Da'Quan Patton picked off Carter Stanley to help set up a 39-yard field goal from Blake Lynch to end the half up 17-3.

• Kansas State and Texas met for the 20th time in series history with the Longhorns evening the series at 10-10... Texas has now won three-straight games – its longest winning streak in the series – including four-straight games in Austin.

• **Skylar Thompson** threw for a career-high 253 yards and two touchdowns on 17-of-27 aim... Thompson's 253 passing yards bettered his 218-yard performance earlier this season against Baylor... He almost set his career high in the first half as he finished the first frame with 217 yards... Thompson now has 23 career passing touchdowns to tie for 10th in school history with Darrell Dickey (1979-82).

• **Malik Knowles** hauled in a 70-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter... It was the Wildcats' longest pass since Isaiah Zuber had a 72-yarder against UTSA on September 15, 2018... It was K-State's longest pass in a Big 12 game since Dalton Schoen went 82 yards for a score at Texas on October 7, 2017.

• **Joshua Youngblood** returned a fourth-quarter kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, the first kickoff-return score of his career... It was the second by the Wildcats this season after Malik Knowles' 100-yard return at Mississippi State... It marks the first time since 2017 that K-State had multiple kickoff-return scores in a season and the first with two returns of at least 98 yards since Morgan Burns had a pair of 100-yard returns in 2015.

• A pair of K-State starting defenders notched new career high in tackles as linebacker **Elijah Sullivan** and cornerback **Ke'vion McGee** each carded nine stops.

K-STATE RALLIES, FALLS TO HORNS ON FIELD GOAL

AUSTIN, Texas – No. 16 K-State rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to tie the game, but Texas clinched a 27-24 win against the Wildcats with a field goal as time expired at Texas Memorial Stadium.

Joshua Youngblood injected K-State with new life early in the fourth quarter, as the true freshman receiver broke off a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. It ended Texas' run of 24 unanswered points and cut the Wildcat deficit to three, 24-21.

K-State's defense followed suit by forcing a three-and-out, which led to a 45-yard field goal from Blake Lynch to even the game.

Texas answered with the game-winning drive, keyed by a conversion on third-and-14. The Longhorns, who went 67 yards in 13 plays to eat up the final 6:45 of the game, drug the clock down to three seconds before Cameron Dicker notched the game-winner from 26 yards out to end K-State's three-game winning streak.

K-State got off to the exact start it needed. The Wildcats scored the game's first two touchdowns, including one on the third play from scrimmage, to take an early 14-0 lead.

After a pair of runs to start the game, Skylar Thompson found redshirt freshman receiver Malik Knowles on a wheel route out of the backfield for a 70-yard touchdown. Knowles finished with 94 yards receiving on three catches.

Thompson, who finished with a career-high 253 passing yards on 17-of-27 through the air, then engineered an eight-play, 63-yard touchdown drive. The redshirt junior quarterback capped it with a 19-yard touchdown pass to Wykeen Gill for an early two-score advantage. Dalton Schoen, who finished with five catches for 68 yards, snagged a pair of third passes on this drive for 35 of those yards.

K-State's offensive hit a wall afterward, however.

On their first two drives, the Wildcats picked up 138 yards of offense on 11 plays (12.5 yards a play). They managed just 136 yards on their next six drives, 34 plays in all (4.0 yards a play). K-State was also limited to a season-low rushing total of 51 yards on 26 attempts.

Texas scored on only one of its five series in the first half, an 80-yard touchdown drive that accounted for nearly half of its total yards (162) at the break. The Longhorns picked up steam in the second half, tallying 315 yards and 20 points in the final two quarters against K-State

BILL SNYDER FAMILY STADIUM

52ND YEAR – 1968-2019

Renamed in honor of Hall of Fame coach Bill Snyder by a proclamation of the Kansas Board of Regents on Nov. 16, 2005, Bill Snyder Family Stadium is hosting its 52nd season of Wildcat football this fall.

Originally named KSU Stadium, the facility was built at a cost of \$1.6 million and financed from student fees, athletics gate receipts and contributions. The stadium opened its doors Sept. 21, 1968, with a 21-0 shutout of Colorado State. The original seating capacity was set at 35,000, and an expansion in the summer of 1970 added 4,000 permanent bleachers on the east side and 3,000 temporary bleachers on the west side.

Following the 1998 season, the addition of a deck and sky suites on the east side of the stadium increased capacity to more than 50,000. On Nov. 11, 2000, 53,811 fans witnessed Kansas State's 29-28 win over Nebraska. It remains the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Kansas.

Multi-million dollar upgrades to the Vanier Sports Complex were complete in 2006, including the installation of new video and message boards, including a 23' X 61' ProStar VideoPlus display in the south end zone in 2006.

Bill Snyder Family Stadium's most recent changes include a \$75 million project to construct the West Stadium Center in 2013, while the most recent change is the new Vanier Football Complex, with full completion in time for the 2016 season. Prior to the 2018 season, K-State replaced its playing surface as it installed AstroTurf's newest product – RootZone Trionic 3D – becoming the first Division I football program in the country to install the product. Additionally, the east side club was renovated at the cost of \$1.75 million.
