STARTING 5

Five names, numbers or storylines about K-State women's basketball

1. 500TH GAME IN BRAMLAGE

• With its game on Friday against UT Martin, K-State will play its 500th game in the 34-season history of Bramlage Coliseum. K-State owns an all-time record of 352-147 (.705) inside the purple palace.

2. LEE NAMED TO PAIR OF WATCH LISTS

• Ayoka Lee added two more national award watch lists to her 2021-22 mantle, as she was selected for the Women's Preseason 50 for the 2022 John R. Wooden Award and the 2022 Women's Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List.

3. LEE NEARING 1K

• With 23 points, Ayoka Lee will become the 44th player in program history to reach 1,000 or more career points. When she reaches the milestone, Lee will become the 27th player in program history and the sixth center to reach 1,000 or more career points and 500 or more career rebounds.

4. CATS HIT CENTURY MARK IN OPENER

• For the first time since the 1990-91 season, K-State scored 100 or more points in a season-opener. The 103 points in the season-opener marked the fifth time K-State has scored 100 or more points in a season-opener.

5. BRUSHING UP IN THE PAINT

• K-State scored 56 points in the paint against Central Arkansas. The 56 points marked the most since scoring 60 against Tulsa on November 14, 2016.

MITTIE IN 8TH SEASON AT K-STATE

- Jeff Mittie, one of the winningest active coaches in NCAA Division I with over 575 career wins, is in his seventh season at the helm of the K-State program in 2020-21.
- Mittie, the ninth head women's basketball coach in K-State history, owns an overall career record of 580-332 (.636) in 29 years as a head coach, including a 126-97 (.565) mark in his time at K-State. He has won 19 or more games in four of his seven seasons with K-State.
- With his 125 wins at Kansas State, Mittie ranks tied for third for wins at the helm of the K-State program.
- Mittie registered the 575th win of his coaching career, a 74-57 decision over Kansas City on Dec. 14, 2020.
- In the 2016-17 season, K-State's 23 wins were Mittie's most at the helm of the Wildcats and the most for Mittie since registering 23 in the 2007-08 season at TCU.
- He has averaged 20.4 wins per season and experienced only one losing season in his previous 28 seasons.
- Mittie has 20 postseason appearances in his career (NCAA or WNIT Tournaments), in which he has a combined record of 20-18 (.526).

- K-State won its season-opener for the 12th straight season and the eighth time under head coach **Jeff Mittie**.
- The Wildcats scored 64 second half points to ease past the Sugar Bears, which included a school record-tying 34 in the fourth quarter.
- **Ayoka Lee** (43), **Emilee Ebert** (16) and **Rebekah Dallinger** (11) combined for 70 points to become the third K-State trio since 1986-87 to score 70 or more points in a game.

K-STATE AMONG TOP-20 IN NCAA HISTORY FOR WINS

- K-State women's basketball is in its 54th season of action and ranks among the top programs in NCAA history for all-time wins.
- K-State's all-time record stands at 979-626 (.610) and the Wildcats entered the 2021-22 season ranked 19th in NCAA Division I women's basketball history for program wins. The Wildcats are the 19th program in NCAA Division I history to reach 975 or more wins as a program and the third among the Big 12 (Texas, Baylor). K-State is averaging 18.6 wins per season.
- The Wildcats have accumulated 25 20-win seasons and have secured 352 victories inside Bramlage Coliseum.
- K-State has 205 wins in the Big 12 Conference.
- Kansas State has registered 220 victories when they were ranked in the Associated Press top-25 poll and achieved 83 wins against teams ranked in the AP poll.

WILDCATS' DEFENSE FORGES IDENTITY

- K-State has continued to be a force on the defensive end during head coach **Jeff Mittie**'s eight seasons on the bench.
- The Wildcats opened the 2021-22 season by limiting Central Arkansas to 40 points and a field goal percentage of .273.
- During the last 19 seasons, K-State is 115-3 (.975) when holding an opponent to 49 points or less including a 34-0 mark in the Mittie era.
- In the 2020-21 season, Kansas State allowed 67.1 points on a .396 field goal percentage this season. K-State was fifth in the Big 12 in the 2020-21 season in scoring defense and were third in the Big 12 in field goal percentage defense.
- The Wildcats held six opponents last season to a field goal percentage of 35.0 percent or less including a season-low of 17.5 percent at Central Arkansas on December 5.

CATS SEND BACK SHOTS UNDER MITTIE

- Under head coach **Jeff Mittie**, Kansas State has sent back 1,059 shots for 4.75 per game in the 223 games. K-State has 120 or more blocks in each of Mittie's previous seven seasons.
- The 1,059 blocks in the eight seasons are the most in any eight-season span in program history.
- In the 2020-21 season, the Wildcats blocked 123 shots (4.56 bpg) and ranked third in the Big 12 and 39th in the nation for blocks per game. K-State was 23rd in the nation for total blocks.
- The 123 blocks last season were the 14th highest total in program history and marked the seventh straight season K-State has blocked 120 or more shots.

- K-State had a 2020-21 season-high of 11 blocks against Kansas. The 11 blocks are the sixth-most in a game in school history and a K-State record for blocks in a conference game. The Wildcats have blocked 10 or more shots in a game 11 times (10-1) since Mittie's first season in 2014-15.
- K-State had a blocked shot differential of +44 in the 2020-21 season (123-79). Since blocks became official in 1982-83, K-State has 20 seasons with a positive blocked shot differential including a school record +73 (163-90) in the 2005-06 season.

BLOCK & POCKET

- When combining blocks and steal totals in a single-game, K-State is 26-0 over the last 16 seasons when achieving a combination of 20+ steals and blocks in the same game.
- K-State is 17-0 under head coach **Jeff Mittie** when achieving a combination of 20+ steals and blocks in the same game. The Wildcats recorded a combination totalling 20 (11 steals/9 blocks) against Central Arkansas on November 9, 2021.

K-STATE HOLDS FOES TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- Entering the seventh season of the quarter system in women's college basketball, K-State's defense has limited its opponents point production for 10 minute durations.
- Kansas State is 57-21 (.731) when holding an opponent to single digits in any quarter in a game.
- The Wildcats held Central Arkansas to three points in the first quarter on November 9 to begin the season.
- K-State held opponents to 14 single-digit scoring quarters in the 2020-21 season.
- For the first time since the beginning of the quarter system in women's basketball, the Wildcats held a foe to single digits in three of four quarters. K-State kept Central Arkansas on Dec. 5, 2020, in single digits in the first, second and fourth quarters. The Wildcats held the Sugar Bears to four points in the fourth quarter, which tied the school record for the fewest allowed in a fourth quarter.
- The four points allowed were the fewest K-State allowed in any quarter since holding Oklahoma State to three points in the first quarter on January 23, 2019.
- In the quarterfinals of the 2021 Big 12 Championship, K-State held West Virginia to five points in the second quarter. The five points tied the Big 12 record for fewest points allowed in a quarter in Big 12 Championship history.

K-STATE CLEANING THE GLASS

- K-State wiped the glass clean against Central Arkansas on November 9, as the Wildcats held a 46-31 (+15) edge in rebounding including 19 offensive boards.
- Since the 2001-02 season, Kansas State owns a record of 244-43 (.850) when holding the edge on the glass.
- The Wildcats had an advantage on the boards in 2020-21, 36.7 to 34.9. K-State was fifth in the Big 12 for rebound margin at +1.81.
- K-State had 11 games last season with 40 or more rebounds including a season-high 57 against Kansas City on December 14.

SHARING IS CARING

- K-State opened the 2021-22 season with an unselfish night, as the Wildcats handed out 26 assists with just six turnovers against Central Arkansas on Nov. 9. Of the 10 players that saw the floor against the Sugar Bears, eight recorded an assist.
- The 26 assists in the opener were the most by a K-State team since handing out 30 assists against UIW on Dec. 3, 2019.
- The Wildcats are 72-6 when handing out 20 or more assists over the last 15 years.
- In the 2020-21 season, K-State dished out 429 assists (15.89 apg) on 602 made field goals which was an assist percentage of 71.3. The Wildcats ranked third in the Big 12 for all games in assists per game and third in the league for Big 12-only games (16.0 apg).
- The assisted shot rate of 71.3 percent was the highest in school history.
- K-State handed out the most assists per game, 15.9, in the **Jeff Mittie** era. The 15.9 assists per game were the most for the program since the 2005-06 season.
- According to HerHoopStats.com, K-State ranked fifth in the nation in assist percentage and were the top Power 5 program in the category. Since assists became an officially tracked stat in 1981-82, K-State has registered an assisted shot rate of 60.0 percent or higher at the end of a season 21 times in its history.
- K-State had eight games last season with 20 or more assists.

MAGIC NUMBER IS 70 POINTS

- Since the 2001-02 season, K-State is 218-26 (.893) when scoring 70 or more points in a game including a 66-12 (.846) record in the **Jeff Mittie** era.
- Kansas State opened the 2021-22 season with 103 points against Central Arkansas on Nov. 9. This was tied for the fifth-highest single game total since the 1999-00 season.
- The 103 points were the most in a season-opener since the 1990-91 season and marked the fifth time K-State scored 100 or more points in a season-opener.
- In the 2020-21 season, the Wildcats scored a season-high 86 points against Texas Tech on February 24. The Wildcats scored 70 or more points in seven games (5-3) last season.
- This was the 26th time K-State has scored 100 or more points in a game and the third time under Mittie. K-State owns a 26-0 record in games scoring 100 or more points.

CATS CASH IN AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Kansas State continues to earn trips to the free throw line, which is a trend during head coach **Jeff Mittie**'s time at K-State.
- To open the 2021-22 season, K-State was 17-of-24 (.708) from the foul line against Central Arkansas.
- In the 2020-21 season, the Wildcats were 326-of-443 (.736) from the line. K-State received 19.2 percent of its points from the foul line this season. K-State ranked fifth in the Big 12 in free throw percentage.
- K-State's free throw percentage last season ranked second in school history and the highest since the 2009-10 season.
- In Big 12 action, K-State ranked third in the Big 12 for free throw percentage at .768 (228-of-297).
- K-State averaged 16.4 trips to the foul line in the 2020-21 season and are converting 12.1 per game.
- The Wildcats recorded a season-high 29 made free throws against TCU on March 1. The 29 made free throws were the most in the Mittie era and the highest number of made free throws since January 13, 1990, when K-State made 31 against Colorado.
- K-State registered a season-high 34 free throw attempts against TCU on March 1. The 34 free throw attempts were the most since February 27, 2019, against West Virginia when the Wildcats attempted 34 free throws.
- K-State was perfect from the line twice last season: 8-of-8 from the free throw line at West Virginia on January 20 and 10-of-10 against Texas Tech on March 11.

- K-State has a history of exceeding the expectations of the league's coaches.
- Entering the 2021-22 season, the Wildcats were voted tied for eighth in the preseason poll.
- In its history, K-State leads the Big 12 in exceeding preseason predictions, finishing on average +1.17 positions higher than its preseason prediction in the 23 polls that have a preseason prediction and a final standing attached to it. The 1996-97 and 2017-18 seasons are not included in these calculations, as neither had a preseason poll.
- The Wildcats have finished 17 of 23 seasons above its preseason prediction and owns the largest single-season deviation in league history from its preseason prediction and its final place with a +7 by winning the Big 12 in 2007-08.

K-STATE ATTACKING THE PAINT

• K-State was aggressive in its efforts to score in the lane in the season-opening against Central Arkansas. The Wildcats recorded 56 points in the paint, which marked the highest single-game total since Nov. 14, 2016, against Tulsa, when K-State poured in 60 points in the paint.

• The Wildcats used its height advantage to its benefit in the lane in the 2020-21 season, as they outscored opponents 768-708 in the lane or 45.1 percent of its overall points. The Wildcats averaged 28.4 points per game in the paint. K-State had the edge in the lane in 16 games last season.

• K-State's 45.1 percent of its overall point total marks the fourth time in the seven seasons under head coach **Jeff Mittie** that K-State has carded at least 45.0 percent or better of its overall point total from inside the lane including a high of 49.5 percent in the 2019-20 season.

• Under head coach Mittie, Kansas State has scored 900 or more points in the paint in six straight seasons including a high of 1,064 points (31.3 ppg) during the 2016-17 season.

• When K-State shoots 50.0 percent or better in the **Jeff Mittie** era, Kansas State has been victorious. Since the 2014-15 season, the Wildcats are 22-3 (.880) when shooting 50.0 percent or better.

• K-State shot 53.4 percent from the field against Central Arkansas on Nov. 9, while making 39 field goals. The field goal percentage of 53.4 percent was the highest for a K-State team since Dec. 3, 2019, when the Wildcats shot 64.9 percent against UIW, which is the top field goal percentage in the Mittie era.

• The field goal percentage of 64.9 percent against UIW on Dec. 3, 2019, set the K-State Bramlage Coliseum record and the highest for K-State in any game since February 25, 1987, when the Wildcats carded a 65.4 percent (34-of-52) effort against Missouri.

• The Wildcats owned a field goal percentage of 41.1 percent in the 2020-21 season and in Big 12 play, shot 42.0 percent.

• Since the inception of the quarter system in the 2015-16 season, K-State owns an overall record of 80-44 (.645) when scoring 20 or more points in any quarter in a game.

• Against Central Arkansas, K-State tallied three quarters with 20 or more points including 30 in the third quarter and 34 in the fourth quarter. The 34 points tied the school record for points in a quarter.

• Since the 2015-16 season, K-State has registered 189 quarters with 20 or more points with a high of 43 in the 2017-18 season. In the 2020-21 season, K-State had 21 quarters with 20 or more points scored.

• The Wildcats scored 20 or more points in two or more quarters in a game six times last season.

WILDCATS SOLID FROM THE ARC

• K-State fired from beyond the arc in its season-opening win over Central Arkansas on Nov. 9. The Wildcats buried eight 3-pointers, which were the most in a season-opener for K-State since making eight against Chicago State on Nov. 11, 2016.

• Under head coach **Jeff Mittie**, the Wildcats have made five or more 3-pointers in a game 156 times in 223 total games including 22 games with 10 or more connections from deep with K-State notching a 20-2 record in those games.

• In the eight seasons under Mittie, K-State has buried 1,318 three-pointers which is 5.91 per game.

• In the 2020-21 season, Kansas State had 172 connections on 557 attempts (.309) from beyond the arc. K-State received 30.3 percent of its overall point total from beyond the arc.

• K-State's three-point field goal percentage of .309 was the highest for the Wildcats since the 2016-17 season.

• The Wildcats ranked third in the Big 12 for 3-point field goals made per game (6.37).

• K-State's percent of points from three in the 2020-21 season (30.3) was the second-highest in the Mittie era. Since Mittie took over in 2014-15, K-State finished above 30.0 percent of its point total from 3-point range twice, also in 2015-16 (31.7).

• With its 172 connections from beyond the arc in the 2020-21 season, K-State made the most 3-pointers since the 2018-19 season. This was the 22nd time in school history and the sixth season under Mittie which K-State made 150 or more 3-point field goals in a season.

• The Wildcats made a season-high 11 three-pointers against Texas Tech on February 24.

K-STATE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

• The Wildcats are 83-222 (.272) against teams ranked in the Associated Press (AP) poll including a 52-65 (.444) mark against AP ranked teams in Manhattan.

• K-State is 11-46 (.193) against AP ranked opponents in head coach **Jeff Mittie's** seven seasons in Manhattan.

• The Wildcats ended an eight-game losing streak against AP ranked opponents with a 62-53 win over South Dakota State on December 10, 2020. This was K-State's first win against a ranked non-conference opponent since defeating Drake on March 18, 2017, in the NCAA Tournament.

TEAM ODDS & ENDS FROM 2020-21

• Playing a reduced non-conference schedule due to COVID-19 precautions in its 53rd season of action, K-State (9-18, 3-15) Big 12) jumped into its 18-game Big 12 schedule in mid-December. The Wildcats finished tied for ninth in the Big 12 and won four of their last 10 games of the season.

• K-State endured a 30-day gap between games from December 21 to January 20 due to COVID-19 protocols. Due to the postponement of five Big 12 games in early January, the Wildcats would play five games in 12 days to end its regular season schedule.

• Combined with the postponements, the Wildcats also suffered through a 10-game losing streak when action resumed on January 20. This was the longest losing streak for the program since the 1991-92 season.

• Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, K-State played 27 games which marked the fewest since the 1994-95 season. This marked the second consecutive season that K-State played fewer than 30 games in a season.

• With its three Big 12 wins in the 2020-21 season, K-State secured its fewest league wins since the 2000-01 season.

• K-State registered a 62-53 win over (22/21) South Dakota State on December 10. This was K-State's first win over a ranked opponent since defeating Drake on March 18, 2017.

• The Wildcats defeated seven-seed Texas Tech in the first

round of the 2021 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. This marked the 18th time in the 24 Big 12 Championships in which K-State has advanced at least one round.

- K-State registered one road win in the 2020-21 season. The one road win was the fewest since the 2012-13 season.
- Head coach **Jeff Mittie** tied for third in school history for career wins, capturing his 125th victory with the Wildcats on March 11 in the first round of the 2021 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.
- This season's free throw percentage of .736 was second in school history for a single season and the highest in the Mittie era.
- K-State's three-point field goal percentage of .309 was the highest for the Wildcats since the 2016-17 season.
- The 123 blocks this season were the 14th highest total in program history and marks the seventh straight season K-State has blocked 120 or more shots.
- K-State had a blocked shot differential of +44 this season (123-79). This was the fifth-highest block shot differential in program history.
- The Wildcats held opponents to a field goal percentage of less than 40.0 percent for the third straight season and the sixth time in the seven seasons under head coach **Jeff Mittie**.
- **Ayoka Lee**, a 2021 WBCA All-Region 3 selection and WBCA All-America Honorable Mention recipient, led K-State in scoring (19.1 ppg), field goal percentage (.621), rebounds (8.7 rpg) and blocks (2.0).
- Lee, a 2021 All-Big 12 First Team selection, led the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in field goal percentage (.621) and ranked fifth in the Big 12 in free throw percentage (.812). She was the only player in NCAA Division I this season to shoot 60.0 percent or better from the field and 80.0 percent or better from the line.
- Since the 1999-00 season, Lee joins Baylor's Brittney Griner (2011-12) as the only two players in the Big 12 to shoot 60.0 percent or better from the field and 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Lee's field goal percentage in the 2020-21 season ranks eighth all-time in Big 12 history.
- Lee also led the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation, according to HerHoopStats.com, for PER (39.9) which is a measure of a player's value based on their box score stats.
- Lee became the first player in program history with the combination of 450 or more points, 200 or more rebounds and 45 or

more blocks in her first two seasons with the Wildcats.

- Lee's field goal percentage ranked second in school history for a single-season and the second-highest field goal percentage in a sophomore season.
- Lee is the eight players with two or more consecutive seasons with 200 or more rebounds in a season.
- Lee blocked 49 shots and tallied 1.96 blocks per game. Her blocks per game ranked seventh in school history for a single-season.
- **Rachel Ranke** made 55 three-point field goals in the 2020-21 season. She was the 12th player in program history to make 55 or more 3-point field goals in a junior season.
- Ranke was the eighth player in program history to register 50 or more 3-point field goals made and 50 or more assists in a junior season.
- **Emilee Ebert** set the school record for blocks by a guard with her career-high 25.
- Ebert was the only player in the Big 12 in the 2020-21 season to appear in the top-15 in assists per game and blocks per game.

- K-State is 352-147 (.705) all-time inside Bramlage Coliseum, which is in its 34th season of existence.
- The 2018-19 season (12-4) marked the 30th time in 54 seasons that the Wildcats reached double figures in home victories. It marked the 22nd season K-State has won 10 or more games in Bramlage including five straight seasons.
- In his career in games played in his home venue, head coach **Jeff Mittie** is 356-104 (.774) including an 82-39 (.678) record at K-State.
- Kansas State has protected Bramlage Coliseum with determination against non-conference foes with a record of 204-29 (.876). Mittie is 50-8 (.862) in non-conference games in Bramlage Coliseum.

FILLING UP THE PURPLE PALACE

- The Wildcats ranked 37th in the nation and fifth in the Big 12 in average attendance (3,331 average; 15 home games) in the 2019-20 season. In total attendance, K-State ranked 38th in the nation and fifth in the Big 12 (49,958).
- When the crowd is 7,500 or more in Bramlage Coliseum, K-State is 43-12 (.782) including a record of 18-5 when the crowd is 10,000 or more.
- The Wildcats moved into Bramlage Coliseum prior to the start of the 1988-89 season and have seen 1,851,225 fans pass through the doors. K-State reached the 1,500,000 mark for women's basketball attendance on Feb. 21, 2015.

- Ebert handed out a career-high 90 assists in the 2020-21 season.
- Ebert led K-State with a career-best 3.3 assists per game and owned an assist-turnover ratio of 1.61. She ranked 11th in the Big 12 for assists per game and was 12th in the league in assist-turnover ratio.

- She had a career-best 25 blocks. Ebert had five games in the 2020-21 season with two or more blocks including a career-high four against Southern on November 29.

- Her 25 blocks were the most by a K-State guard for a single-season in school history.

NOBODY DOES IT LIKE AYOKA LEE

• **Ayoka Lee** is approaching a career scoring milestone and opened the 2021-22 season with the school record for points in a single-game.

• In her career, Lee has scored 977 points in 55 career games (17.8 ppg). Her career scoring average of 17.8 ranks tied for third in school history. With 23 points, she will become the 44th player in school history with 1,000 or more career points.

• Against Central Arkansas on November 9, Lee scored a career-high and school record 43 points on 17-of-25 shooting from the field and 9-of-12 from the free throw line.

• Her 43 points tied for the 11th highest single-game total in Big 12 history and were the most by any player in the nation in the first game this season.

• She is the fourth player in program history to score 30 or more points in a game four or more times in a career.

• During the 2020-21 season, Lee averaged a career-best 19.1 points per game while scoring a career-high 478 points. She ranked seventh in the Big 12 and 41st in the nation in scoring. Nationally among centers, Lee ranked second in the nation for scoring average.

• Her scoring average in 2020-21 was the highest by a Wildcat since Brittany Chambers set the school record at 21.0 per game in 2012-13.

• With her 478 points in the 2020-21 season, Lee established a new career-high and was the 17th player in program history to register two or more consecutive seasons with 400 or more points scored.

• According to HerHoopStats.com, Lee led the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation in PER (39.9). PER measures a player's value based on their box score stats.

LEE EFFICIENT FROM THE FIELD

• **Ayoka Lee** continues to put the ball in the hoop at a high rate and is among the top-five on the K-State career field goal percentage list.

• In her career, Lee has a field goal percentage of .597 (386-of-647) and ranks second in program history for career field goal percentage. Among active NCAA career leaders for field goal percentage, Lee ranks tied for fifth among all players. Her career field goal percentage ranks fifth in Big 12 history.

• Against Central Arkansas, Lee made a career-high 17 field goals which was tied for second in school history and tied for fifth in Big 12 history for field goals made in a single-game.

• Lee owns 40 career games with a field goal percentage of .500 or better. She has made 10 or more field goals in a game 13 times in her career.

• In the 2020-21 season, Lee shot a career-high .621 (185-of-298) from the field and led the Big 12 and ranked third in the nation for field goal percentage. Among centers, Lee ranked second in the nation in field goal percentage.

• Lee was the only player in NCAA Division I in the 2020-21 season to shoot 60.0 percent or better from the field (min. 5 FGs made/game) and 80.0 percent or better from the foul line (min. 2.5 FTs made/game).

LEE SETS DOUBLE-DOUBLE MARK

- **Ayoka Lee** continues to be a double-double machine in her K-State career.
- Lee had 10 double-doubles in the 2020-21 season and boosted her career total to 29, which ranks fourth in school history for career double-doubles. She is the fastest player in program history to 29 career double-doubles.
- Lee recorded her first double-double of the 2020-21 season in grand fashion with 31 points and 14 rebounds against Kansas City on Dec. 14. Lee was the 11th player in program history to register a double-double with 30 or more points and 10 or more rebounds.
- Lee's fifth double-double of the season put her in exclusive company in school history. Against Oklahoma on Jan. 31, Lee notched a career-high 37 points and pulled in 18 rebounds. She was the fifth player to notch a double-double of 30 or more points and 15 or more rebounds.
- Against Kansas on Feb. 13, Lee tallied 28 points, 16 rebounds and seven blocks. This was her eighth career game with a double-double and five or more blocks, improving on her own school record. This was also her third career game with 20 or more points, 15 or more rebounds and five or more blocks.
- In the 2019-20 season, the center from Byron, Minnesota, set the school record for double-doubles in a season with 19 and ranked tied for 8th in Big 12 history for double-doubles in a single season.
- Lee achieved a rare single-game milestone, as she became the first player in program history with 20 or more points and 20 or more rebounds in the same game, achieving the feat against Oklahoma on January 25, 2020 (23 points, 20 rebounds).

LEE AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

- **Ayoka Lee** has been a solid free throw shooter during her career and etched her name among the top single-game performances in program history.
- The junior from Byron, Minnesota, is shooting 75.9 percent (205-of-270) from the foul line in her career.
- She has 16 career games with five or more connections from the foul line including a career-high 12-of-13 effort at Kansas City on Dec. 14, 2019.
- In the 2020-21 season, Lee shot a career-best 81.2 percent (108-of-133) and ranked fifth in the Big 12. She ranked 38th in the nation in free throws made and 48th in the nation in free throws attempted.
- Her 108 free throws made were a new career-high and were the most free throws made by a Wildcat since Peyton Williams made 115 in the 2018-19 season.
- Against Kansas on Jan. 23, Lee was a perfect 10-of-10 from the line. She was the ninth player in school history and the 10th time overall to finish a game perfect from the line with at least 10 or more attempts.
- Against TCU on March 1, Lee was 11-of-14 from the foul line. The 14 attempts were a career-high.
- Lee made 25 consecutive free throws from December 21 to January 31. It is the fifth-longest consecutive free throw streak in program history.

She is the 24th player in program history to pull in 550 or more rebounds in a career. Her career rebound total ranks sixth in school history by a center.

- **Ayoka Lee** remains one of the top shot blockers in the nation.
- In her career, Lee has 144 career blocked shots and ranks fifth in school history for career blocks. She owns the school record for career blocks per game at 2.62.
- She has 37 career games with two or more blocks and 10 career games with five or more blocks and ranks third in program history for career games with five or more blocks.
- To open the 2021-22 season, Lee recorded four blocks against Central Arkansas.
- In the 2020-21 season, Lee blocked 49 shots (1.96 bpg) in the 2020-21 season. She ranked second in the Big 12 for blocks per game and was 29th in the nation for total blocks.
