### K-STATE HOSTS 7/7 KANSAS IN SUNFLOWER SHOWDOWN

- ► Kansas State (10-7, 2-4 Big 12) returns home to Bramlage Coliseum on Saturday afternoon, as the Wildcats play host to No. 7/7 Kansas (15-2, 4-1 Big 12) at 3 p.m., CT, in the 296th edition of the Dillons Sunflower Showdown. It is the sixthmost played rivalry dating to 1907 and third-most continuously played (116 years) in NCAA Division I history.
- ► K-State will honor the historical accomplishments of **Gene Wilson** (1950-52, 1954-56), who became the first black player to receive a basketball scholarship to the school and was one of the first to break the color barrier in the Big Seven Conference. The team will wear special shooting shirts with Wilson's name and number as well as a patch on the uniform.
- ► Saturday's matchup continues a gauntlet of 4 consecutive games against Top 25 opponents (vs. 19/19 Texas Tech, at 23/22 Texas, 7/7 Kansas and at 5/6 Baylor) to finish off the first half of Big 12 play.

### **OPENING TIP**

- ▶ K-State won its second consecutive game against a Top 25 opponent, as the Wildcats held No. 23/22 Texas scoreless in the last 3:31 of the game en route to posting a 66-65 win over the Longhorns on Tuesday night. Sophomore **Nijel** Pack's layup off a feed from junior Markquis Nowell proved to the gamewinner with 1:13 to play. Nowell, who played perhaps his worst game of the season, proved instrumental in the waning minutes, knocking down a pair of free throws to close the gap to 1 point before the game-winning assist.
- ► The victories over No. 19/19 Texas Tech (62-51) and No. 23/22 Texas (66-65) marked the first time in nearly 3 seasons that K-State has won back-to-back games over ranked opponents since winning 4 straight (No. 20 Iowa State, No. 20 Oklahoma, No. 14 Texas Tech and No. 13 Kansas) from Jan. 12-Feb. 5, 2019. It also snapped losing streaks to both the Red Raiders (4 games) and Longhorns (5 games), while also ending Texas' 11-game winning streak at the Erwin Center.
- ▶ It was reversal of recent fortunes for K-State, which had led or been tied in the second half in each of its first 4 Big 12 losses, including a heartbreaking 60-57 loss to TCU at home on Jan. 12. Six of the 7 losses have come by a total of 25 points, including 8 points to No. 13/12 Arkansas (64-72), No. 14/15 Illinois (64-72), 1 point to Marquette (63-64), 2 points to Oklahoma (69-71) and 3 points to West Virginia (68-71) and TCU. The team is 0-5 when allowing 70 or more points.

► The win at No. 23/22 Texas marked just the second time that all 10 healthy scholarship players this season were available after K-State played short-handed in losses to 14/16 Texas (8 players) and West Virginia (9 players) and without coach Bruce Weber, before nearly everyone except

senior Mike McGuirl returned for the home game vs. TCU on Jan. 12.

- ► As pivotal as the defense was down the stretch against No. 23/22 Texas, the offense was just as impressive, as K-State scored 66 points on the nation's No. 2 scoring defense (54.5), including the most allowed at the Erwin Center this year. The Wildcats connected on 46.3 percent (25-of-54), including 38.9 percent (7-of-18) from 3-point range, and managed just 10 turnovers. The team was even better in the second half, scoring 35 points on 54.2 percent (13-of-24) shooting, including 62.5 percent (5-of-8) from long range.
- Fifth-year senior Mark Smith led 3 Wildcats in double figures with his second 20-point effort of the Big 12 season, scoring 22 points on 9-of-14 shooting, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, while adding a team-best 8 rebounds. The Big 12 leader in rebounding in both overall (8.3 rpg.) and conference-only (9.0 rpg.), he also ranks second in field goal percentage (51.6) in league games.
- ▶ The 3 transfers (Ish Massoud, Nowell and Smith) continue to play a major role in the Wildcats' play this season. The trio have been responsible for 43 percent (503) of the team's scoring and 42 percent (255) of its rebounding. They are averaging 29.6 points, 15.0 rebounds, 7.1 assists and 4.2 steals per game.
- ▶ K-State ranks among the top-30 in 3 defensive categories, including 26th in scoring defense (61.3), 28th in field goal percentage defense (39.4) and fifth in 3-point field goal percentage defense (26.4).

In the 62-51 upset of No. 19/19 Texas Tech on Jan. 15, K-State earned the 100th win under head coach **Bruce Weber** when holding an opponent under 60 points, improving to 100-10 (.909) in those games in his tenure.



K-State's 3 transfers - Markquis Nowell, Ish Massoud and Mark Smith - have combined for 503 of the Wildcats' 1,159 points this season, while they have been responsible for 255 rebounds, 120 assists and 71 steals.

### NOTES ON 7/7 KANSAS

- ▶ No. 7/7 Kansas (15-2, 4-1 Big 12) enters Saturday's game with wins in 11 of its last 12 games, including its current 3-game winning streak (lowa State, West Virginia and at Oklahoma). The Jayhawks, which led the Big 12 by a half game as we near the mid-way point, have just 2 losses this season by a combined 9 points (74-73 to Dayton and 75-67 at Texas Tech). They are 3-1 on the road this season, including wins at Oklahoma State (74-63) and Oklahoma (67-64).
- ▶ The Jayhawks are averaging a Big 12-best 81.0 points per game on 50 percent shooting, including 37.4 percent from 3-point range, while allowing opponents to average 66.2 points on 41.9 percent shooting, including 30.8 percent from long range. The team leads the Big 12 in scoring, field goal percentage and 3-point field goal percentage, while they rank among the top-20 nationally in field goal percentage (sixth), scoring offense (18th) and scoring margin (+14.8/19th) and are 40th in total assists (279).
- ► Kansas has 5 players averaging 8 points or more, including a pair of double-digit scorers who rank in the Big 12% top-5 in scoring average in senior **Ochai Agbaji** (19.9 ppg.) and junior **Christian Braun** (15.6 ppg.). Agbaji is hitting on 52.1 percent, including a team-best 53 made 3-pointers on 47.3 percent, while Braun is connecting on 54.1 percent from the field, including 35.1 percent from long range, and placing second in assists (53) and steals (22). Senior transfer **Remy Martin** is averaging 9.2 points on 46.7 percent shooting, while senior **David McCormack** and sophomore **Jalen Wilson** are averaging 8.6 and 8.4 points per game, respectively. Three players averaging better than 6 rebounds per game led McCormack's 6.4 average. Sophomore **Dajuan Harris** paces the team in both assists (66) and steals (25).
- ► Kansas is led by Hall of Fame head coach **Bill Self**, who has posted a 537-120 (.817) record in his 19th season, which includes the 2008 national title and 3 Final Fours. He is 744-225 (.768) in his 29th season as a head coach, which includes 0ral Roberts (1993-97), Tulsa (1997-2000) and Illinois (2000-03).

### SERIES HISTORY

- ► K-State and Kansas will meet for the 296th time in their histories with the Jayhawks holding a 201-94 advantage in a series that dates to 1907. Kansas is 80-48 all-time in games played in Lawrence, including a 28-5 mark at Bramlage Coliseum. The Jayhawks are 54-6 all-time in the Big 12 era.
- ► The rivalry is one of the oldest in college basketball, as the 295 meetings are sixth-most in Division I, while it is the third-longest active series at 116 years, just behind Maine/New Hampshire (118) and Idaho/Washington State (117).
- ► Kansas has won 5 straight in the series, sweeping the season series in both 2020 and 2021 and the last meeting of the 2018-19 season on Feb. 25, 2019. The Jayhawks have 13 of the last 14 meetings since the Wildcats won back-to-back home games in the series in 2014 and 2015. Last season, they won both matchups by more than 20 points, including a 74-51 win at home on Feb. 2, 2021 and a 59-41 win at Bramlage Coliseum on Feb. 17, 2021. The last win by K-State in the series came in a 74-67 victory at home on Feb. 5, 2019.
- ► Head coach **Bruce Weber** is 3-19 all-time against Kansas with all 3 wins coming at home (2014, 2015, 2019), while he is 4-20 against head coach **Bill Self**. Self is 37-6 vs. Kansas, including 14-5 in Manhattan.

### MORE ON GENE WILSON

- ► Gene Wilson, who became the first black player to receive a basketball scholarship at Kansas State in 1950 as well as one of the first to break the color barrier in the Big Seven Conference in 1951-52, will be honored for his trailblazing accomplishments at Saturday's Dillons Sunflower Showdown.
- ▶ During his two stints from 1950-52 and 1954-56, Wilson, along with Kansas' LaVannes Squires, became the first black basketball players in the Big Seven (forerunner of the Big Eight and Big 12). A two-sport athlete for the Wildcats, Wilson was also one of five to break the color barrier in track and field.

### UP NEXT: 5/6 BAYLOR (16-2, 4-2 Big 12)

► K-State continues action on Tuesday night when the Wildcats hit the road to face defending NCAA champion and No. 5/6 Baylor (16-2, 4-2 Big 12) at 7 p.m., CT at the Ferrell Center. The Bears have won the last 5 meetings, including all 3 in 2020-21. They have won the last 2 at home by 33.5 points per game.

### LAST TIME OUT: K-STATE 66, 23/22 TEXAS 65

- ➤ Sophomore **Nijel Pack's** layup with 1:13 remaining proved to be the gamewinner, as Kansas State held No. 23/22 Texas scoreless in the last 3:31 of the game en route to posting a 66-65 win over the Longhorns on Tuesday night before 11,498 fans at the Frank Erwin Center.
- ► The victory gave the Wildcats consecutive wins over Top 25 opponents for the first time since posting back-to-back road wins over No. 20 lowa State and No. 20 Oklahoma in January 2019. It also snapped a 5-game losing streak to the Longhorns and ended their 11-game winning streak in the Erwin Center.
- ► K-State was led offensively by fifth-year senior **Mark Smith**, who finished with a team-high 22 points on 9-of-14 field goals to go with game-tying 8 rebounds. He was joined in double figures by Pack and senior **Mike McGuirl**, who finished with 16 and 13 points, respectively.
- ▶ In a back-and-forth second half, in which, the lead changed hands 7 times, Texas (13-5, 3-3 Big 12) seemed to have gained the upper hand on the back of senior **Marcus Carr**, who scored 19 of his game-high 25 points after halftime. Carr personally out-scored the Wildcats, 9-3, over a more than 2-minute span that gave the Longhorns a 62-58 lead with 5:26 to play. After 2 free throws by Smith, Carr went 1-of-2 from the line and fellow senior transfer **Timmy Allen** added a lavup that extended the lead to 65-60 with 3:32 remaining.
- ► K-State locked in defensively, holding Texas scoreless the rest of the game despite being over the limit, while getting huge baskets from Pack, including the game-winner on a feed from junior **Markquis Nowell** for a 66-65 lead with 1:13 to play after the latter had closed the gap to 65-64 with 2 free throws.
- ▶ With 12.4 seconds left, the Longhorns had one more chance, but Carr's jumper rimmed off and Smith grabbed the rebound to secure the victory. Smith's last rebound was symbolic as it helped the Wildcats win the rebounding battle, 32-31, as they improved to 10-1 when out-rebounding their opponent.
- As stout as the defense was in the win, the offense was just in impressive as K-State scored 66 points on the nation's No. 2 scoring defense (54.5), including the most allowed at the Erwin Center this season. The Wildcats connected on 46.3 percent (25-of-54) from the field, including 38.9 percent (7-of-18) from 3-point range, and managed just 10 turnovers.

### **QUOTING BRUCE WEBER**

They kind of took it to us to start the game, but we weathered the storm. We kept grinding and fought through it. I'm just thrilled for the guys.



## **TEAM NOTES**

### **LEADING WITH DEFENSE**

- ► K-State has developed a strong reputation as defensive team under head coach **Bruce Weber**, ranking among the top-60 nationally in opponent points per game 6 times in the 9 seasons. The Wildcats ranked fourth in scoring defense (59.6 ppg.) during its Big 12 Championship season in 2018-19, while they placed 36th (60.4 ppg.) in 2012-13 and 46th (67.0 ppg.) in 2017-18.
- ► K-State has held 220 opponents (out of 317 total) under 70 points during **Bruce Weber's** tenure, including a program-best 31 in 2012-13. The Wildcats have also held 110 opponents under 60 points in that span, while 29 have scored less than 50 points in his tenure.
- ▶ In addition to its scoring defense, K-State has ranked among the top-40 in opponent 3-point field goal percentage 3 times (2013-14, 2015-16 and 2018-19) and among the top-50 in steals on 5 occasions (every season from 2015-16 to 2019-20) in the **Bruce Weber** era. Twice (2016-17 and 2019-20) the school has ranked the top-45 in opponent turnovers.
- ▶ K-State struggled mightily across the board during the 2020-21 season, but no more than on defensive end, allowing 80 or more points 7 times in the first 21 games, including allowing 100 or more points in both regular-season games with eventual national champion Baylor. The Wildcats were able to win 4 of their last 7 games in 2020-21 due to their improved defense, as they held 5 of those 7 opponents under 60 points, allowing just 59.3 points per game in that span.
- ► K-State has started the season off where they left off at the end of the 2020-21 season, as the defense is allowing 61.3 points on 39.4 percent shooting, including 26.4 percent from 3-point range. The Wildcats rank among the top-30 in 3 defensive categories, including fifth in 3-point field goal percentage defense, 26th in scoring defense and 28th in field goal percentage defense.
- After allowing 70 or more points in the first 3 Big 12 games, K-State has been better in the last 3 league contests, allowing just 58.7 points on 40.5 percent shooting, including 25.9 percent from long range. The key has been in forcing turnovers, as opponents averaged just 10.0 in the first 3 Big 12 games while have averaged 15.0 in the last 3 games. The Wildcats held the Red Raiders to one of their worst offensive performances on Jan. 15, allowing their second-fewest points (51) and forcing 18 turnovers. It marked the 100th win under head coach Bruce Weber when holding an opponent below 60 points (100-10).
- ► K-State has been able to score points off its opponent turnovers (16.1 ppg.) while forcing an average of 13.5 turnovers per game. The Wildcats has scored 20 or more points off turnovers 3 times, including 22 vs. Nebraska (12/19/21).

▶ The Wildcats are averaging 68.2 points on 43.0 percent shooting, including 34.4 percent from 3-point range, while connecting on 72 percent from the free throw line through the first 17 games. The team is averaging 28.1 points in the paint, 18.4 points off the bench, 16.1 points off turnovers, 8.1 fast-break points and 9.2 points on second-chance opportunities.

- ► K-State's offense shines when the Wildcats share the ball, as the team is averaging 71.7 points and 14.9 assists in their 10 wins compared to just 63.7 points and 11.8 assists in their 7 losses. The squad has scored 294 combined points (29.4 ppg.) in the paint in their 10 wins, including 46 vs. North Dakota, which were the most since scoring 50 vs. Eastern Kentucky in Nov. 16, 2018.
- ► After ranking among the worst 3-point shooting teams in the country in 2020-21, those numbers have improved in 2021-22. The Wildcats are tied with Kansas for second in the Big 12 in 3-point field goals per game (7.9), while they are third in the league in 3-point field goal percentage (34.4).

► The Wildcats' 3-point shooting plays a big part in wins and losses, as the team is averaging 8.6 3-point makes on 37.7 percent shooting in their 10 wins, while they are averaging 6.9 treys on just 29.6 percent shooting in their 7 losses.

### IMPROVED EXPERIENCE/DEPTH

- ▶ It has been well chronicled how young the Wildcats were during the 2020-21 season, as only 11 Division I schools were less experienced than K-State with only Auburn and Duke less experienced among the Power 6. The Wildcats were one of 10 teams to start at least 3 true freshmen in one game with **Davion Bradford, Selton Miguel** and **Nijel Pack** starting in 17 of the 29 games.
- ► The Wildcats have used at least 7 players in each of the first 17 games with all 7 those players totaling double-digit field goals made and 6 averaging nearly 6 points per game, including 3 double-digit scorers (Pack, Nowell and Smith).
- ► K-State is averaging nearly 18.4 points per game from its bench this season, including 28-point efforts against No. 13/12 Arkansas and No. 14/15 Illinois. The team is 8-2 this season when getting 20 or more points from the bench.
- ▶ Before joining the starting lineup, Nowell had provided a spark off the bench, averaging 11.7 points in the first 6 games, while Miguel had 4 of his 6 double-digit scoring games off the bench before starting the last 6 games. Senior **Mike McGuirl** has been big of the bench in the last 2 games, scoring 10 vs. No. 19/19 Texas Tech and 13 at No. 23/22 Texas.

### IMPROVED FREE THROW SHOOTING

- ▶ Despite a dismal night from the line against TCU, K-State has still been solid from the free throw line this season, connecting on 72 percent (195-of-271) from the charity stripe, which ranks third in the Big 12.
- ► That percentage was even better in its 3-game stretch vs. 0maha, No. 13/12 Arkansas and No. 14/15 Illinois, as the Wildcats hit on 81.3 percent (39-of-48) during that stretch, including 78.1 percent (25-of-32) in the games against the Razorbacks and Fighting Illini.
- ► Four players (Nijel Pack, Markquis Nowell, Ish Massoud and Mike McGuirl) are a combined 88.9 percent (96-of-108) from the free throw line, including a perfect 20-of-20 effort by Massoud.
- ► The Wildcats shot just 66.4 percent from the free throw line in 2020-21, while they haven't connected on better than 70 percent from the line since hitting on 73.4 percent as a team in 2017-18.

### PACK OFF TO A STRONG START

- ► Sophomore **Nijel Pack** is off to an impressive start to the 2021-22 season, as he has led or have been tied for the team lead in scoring in 9 of 15 games played, including posting consecutive 20-point outings against No. 14/16 Texas (21) and West Virginia (20) for the first time in his career.
- ▶ Pack is averaging a team-best 15.5 points on 43.9 percent (82-of-187) shooting, including 39.4 percent (43-of-109) from 3-point range, to go with 3.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 30.8 minutes per game. He is the leader in scoring, double-digit scoring games (14), field goals (82) and 3-point field goals (43).
- ▶ Pack ranks among the Big 12's top-10 in 4 categories, including second in 3-point field goals per game (2.87), third in 3-point field goal percentage, sixth in both scoring and field goal percentage. Through 6 Big 12 games, he is third in both scoring (16.3 ppg.) and 3-point field goals per game (3.00).

### **NOWELL PROVIDES SPARK**

- ▶ Junior Markquis Nowell returned to the lineup against West Virginia and provided an immediate spark to the Wildcat, collecting his third points/assists double-double with 10 points and a game-high 10 assists in 32 minutes. He is believed to be the first Wildcat to accomplish the feat in his first league game.
- ► His 3 points/assists double-doubles are the most-ever by a Wildcat in both a single-season and career, as he also posted double-doubles against Marquette (11 points, 11 assists) and McNeese (18 points, 10 assists). He nearly tallied the

school's first recorded triple-double vs. Marquette, as he added 8 rebounds to his 11 points and 11 assists in 37 minutes. He now has 8 such double-doubles in his college career, posting 5 during his 3-year stint at Little Rock (2018-21).

Nowell leads in assists (80) and steals (37), while he is second in scoring (12.0 ppg.), while connecting on 40.4 percent from the field and 87.8 percent from the free throw line. He ranks ninth in the nation and first in the Big 12 in steals (2.5), while he is 27th nationally and second in the Big 12 in assists (5.3).

### SMITH'S IMPRESSIVE NIGHT

- ► The loss at Oklahoma overshadowed a historic performance by senior Mark Smith, who became the first Wildcat in school history to post a game of at least 25 points, 15 rebounds and 5 assists since assists became officially kept by the NCAA in 1976-77. He had career-highs in points (25), rebounds (16) and assists (5), while posting zero turnovers in 39 minutes. His 16 rebounds were the most since Michael Beasley registered 17 boards against Missouri on Feb. 16, 2008.
- ► For his efforts, Smith was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Newcomer of the Week, becoming the first Wildcat to earn the honor since **Dean Wade** in 2016.
- ► Smith, who is averaging a near double-double in Big 12 play (14.8 ppg., 9.0 rpg.), posted his second 20-point game in just his sixth Big 12 game in the win at No. 23/22 Texas with a team-high 22 points on 9-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 3-point range. He has 4 double-doubles this season (5 in his career) and is the Big 12 leader in rebounding (8.3 rpg.) even though he is just 6-foot-4.

## THEY SAID IT

Fifth-year senior Mike McGuirl on what the team has learned from the wins over No. 19/19 Texas Tech and No. 23/22 Texas in the last week.

"We're starting to be the team that we believe we could be from the start, but it's just a start. Long season, long grind and quick turnaround. We play one of the best teams in the country on Saturday, so it's about being ready for the next one."

After holding a 32-31 edge vs. Texas, K-State is now 10-1 when out-rebounding its opponents, while the Wildcats are 0-5 when losing it.

## ■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



- ► K-State has posted a 400-140 (.741) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 400 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.
- ► K-State has registered a 200-60 (.769) record at home over the past 16 seasons, including an 85-48 (.639) mark in Big 12 play. The 200 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 85 league victories at home are among the top in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 26 of its 33 seasons in the arena.
- ► K-State has a 261-82 (.760) record at home, including a 154-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of just over 13 home wins (13.1) per season in that span.
- ► Head coach **Bruce Weber** has recorded a 115-44 (.723) record at Bramlage Coliseum since taking over at K-State in 2012-13 with just 11 non-conference home losses. The 44 losses (34 of which have come in Big 12 play) have come by a total of 435 points or 10 points per game. Weber has posted a 50-34 (.590) record in Big 12 play at Bramlage Coliseum with 19 victories over ranked Big 12 teams, including 6 in the Top 10.

## **TEAM NOTES**

### **MOVING TOWARDS 500**

- ▶ Head coach **Bruce Weber** is working towards a coaching milestone, as he is 7 wins away from earning 500 in his career. He enters Saturday's game with a 493-292 (.628) record in 24 years as a head coach at Southern Illinois (1998-2003), Illinois (2003-12) and K-State (2012-21).
- ► If Weber were to achieve the milestone in 2021-22, he would be among elite company as only 27 current Division I coaches have reached 500 wins in their career with **Herb Sendek** (Santa Clara) recently joining the club.

### HOPING FOR BETTER INJURY LUCK

- ► K-State is hoping for better luck on the injury front in 2021-22 after injuries played a major role in the 2020-21 season, as 9 players combined to miss 75 games, which caused head coach **Bruce Weber** to start 3 true freshmen (**Davion Bradford, Selton Miguel** and **Nijel Pack**) a combined 71 times, which ranked second nationally to Kentucky.
- ▶ Only one other Division I team (Long Beach State) had more players miss time due to injuries in 2020-21.
- ▶ Although that luck has been tested early with big man Seryee Lewis going down with a season-ending knee injury in the preseason, along with injuries slowing down the progress made by junior Carlton Linguard, Jr., and freshman Maximus Edwards. Linguard returned to practice in late December.
- ► The backcourt has been hit of late, as Pack missed 2 games against Wichita State and Marquette due to a concussion, while **Markquis Nowell** missed the first 2 Big 12 games due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols.
- Seven players (Bradford, Edwards, Nowell, junior Kaosi Ezeagu, freshman Logan Landers and walk-ons Jordan Brooks and Trey Harris) plus head coach Bruce Weber missed the game vs. No. 14/16 Texas (1/4/22), while six players (Edwards, Ezeagu, Landers, Brooks, Harris and senior Mike McGuirl) and Weber missed the game at West Virginia (1/8/22) due to health protocols.
- ► K-State has played just 2 games with 10 healthy scholarship players.

### McGUIRL UTILIZES EXTRA SEASON

- ► K-State received some good news on March 23 when senior **Mike McGuirl** announced that he was utilizing his extra season and returning to the Wildcats for the 2021-22 season
- ► An All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection, McGuirl is coming off solid senior season in 2020-21, in which, he either led or was tied for the team lead in 12 categories, including points, field goals, 3-pointers, assists and steals. He was second in scoring (11.8 ppg.) to freshman teammate Nijel Pack.
- ► The only player to start all 29 games, McGuirl showed his versatility by leading the Wildcats in scoring a team-best 11 times, while he also paced the team in rebounding 4 times, in assists 14 times and in steals on 10 occasions.

### THE 'CATS INK 3 HIGH-PROFILE TRANSFERS

► K-State got an infusion of experience with the addition of 3 high-profile Division I transfers in fifth-year **Mark Smith** (Missouri), junior **Markquis Nowell** and sophomore **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** (Wake Forest). The trio have combined to play in 220 games in college with 138 starts.

- ► Smith earned a second senior season due to COVID-19 pandemic and brings 100 games of experience after playing at Illinois (2017-18) and Missouri (2018-21). Nowell, who was a Lou Henson All-American at Little Rock, averaged double figures in each of his 3 seasons as a Trojan. Massoud played in all 53 games at Wake Forest, averaging 8.3 points as a sophomore in 2020-21.
- ▶ The transfers presumably fill the Wildcats' greatest need from the 2020-21 season, which was a lack of production from the 3-point line. The team ranked 319th (out of 340 teams) in 3-point field goal percentage (29.6), while they were 126th in total 3-point field goals made (191) and 243rd in 3-point field goals per game (6.6). The trio have combined for nearly 450 triples (448) in their respective careers on 36.1 percent shooting.
- ► The trio have made their impact in the first 17 games with Smith starting every game, while Massoud and Nowell have 14 and 9 starts, respectively. They have combined for 503 points (29.6 ppg.) on 42 percent (174-of-415) shooting with 255 rebounds (15.0 rpg.), 120 assists (7.1 apg.) and 71 steals (4.2 spg). Nowell has scored in double figures in 10 games, including 3 points/assists double-doubles, while Massoud has 7 double-digit scoring games. Smith has 4 double-doubles and is the Big 12 leader in rebounding (8.3 rpg.).

### A QUICK LOOK AT K-STATE

- ► K-State returns 9 lettermen, including 4 players (Davion Bradford, Mike McGuirl, Selton Miguel and Nijel Pack) who registered starts during its COVID-19 challenging 2020-21 campaign. In addition to these 4 players, the team returned juniors Kaosi Ezeagu and Carlton Linguard, Jr., sophomores Luke Kasubke and Seryee Lewis and walk-on Drew Honas.
- ▶ The freshmen trio of Bradford, Miguel and Pack had to grow up fast in their first season, starting together in 17 games with 12 of those coming in Big 12 play. The 71 combined starts by the three true freshmen in 2020-21 ranked second nationally only to Kentucky (72). The three combined to average 25.4 points, 10.4 rebounds, 5.6 assists and 2.0 steals in 2020-21, as Pack (12.7 ppg.) became the first true freshman to lead the Wildcats in scoring since 2013-14. Bradford (7.7 ppg.) and Miguel (7.2 ppg.) were fourth and fifth in scoring.
- ► Ezeagu started early on for K-State before an injury forced him to miss 10 games. He returned in mid-January as mostly a reserve, averaging 5.2 points of 7.7 percent (21-of-31) in his last 10 games. Linguard and Lewis each showed flashes in their first seasons, playing in 17 and 18 games, respectively, while Kasubke recovered from a preseason injury to play in the final 16 games.



### ■ WELCOME THE NEWEST WILDCAT // TAJ MANNING [Class of 2022]



- ► Head coach **Bruce Weber** announced the signing of Kansas City area standout **Taj Manning** (*Grandview, Mo./La Lumiere School* [*Ind.*]) to a National Letter of Intent on the first day of the Fall National Signing Period on Wednesday (Nov. 10).
- ► A 6-foot-8, 215-pound power forward, Manning currently plays for prep school powerhouse La Lumiere School in La Porta, Ind., after a standout high school careers at both Grandview and Bishop Miege High Schools.
- ▶ Manning is rated among the top 200 prospects nationally (No. 191 by 247Sports), including the top-40 power forwards (No. 38 by 247Sports). He is a consensus 3-star prospects by both 247Sports and Rivals.
- "We are really excited to welcome Taj and his family to K-State," said Weber. "He is not just a great fit for what we were looking for in this class from a position standpoint, but just a great fit for our program."
- ▶ Manning transferred to La Lumiere after guiding Bishop Miege to a 22-1 record and their sixth Class 4A State Championship this past spring. He registered a double-double in the state championship game, posting 18 points and grabbing a team-high 10 rebounds vs. Louisburg.





## **BRUCE WEBER**

### **HEAD COACH**

Wisconsin-Milwaukee '78
24th Season Overall // 493-292 [.628]
10th at K-State // 180-137 [.568]

One of the winningest active Division I coaches with nearly 500 career wins and 13 NCAA Tournament appearances to his credit, **Bruce Weber** is in the midst of his 10th season at Kansas State in 2021-22. He was named the school's 24th head men's basketball coach on March 31, 2012.

Weber is nearing a coaching milestone, as he is just 7 wins shy of 500 in his head coaching career, which includes stints at Southern Illinois (1998-2003), Illinois (2003-11) and now K-State (2012-present). His 493 wins rank 28th among active Division I head coaches, while his .628 winning percentage places 51st among coaches with a minimum of 5 years of Division I experience.

Weber has guided the Wildcats to 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament appearances five times during his tenure, including consecutive 25-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19 for the first time in school history. K-State recorded its first 25-win season in five years and made its 12th trip to the Elite Eight in 2017-18 then followed it with another 25-win campaign and a third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2018-19. The school was one of 24, including 15 in power conferences, to win at least 25 games in the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons. He is the first Wildcat coach to lead the program to multiple 25-win seasons (three).

During the Wildcats' run in the 2018 NCAA Tournament, Weber became just the 10th Division I head coach to take three different schools (Southern Illinois, Illinois and K-State) to the Sweet 16.

In addition to his 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament appearances, Weber has steered K-State to a pair of Big 12 regular-season titles during his tenure, including the school's first conference championship in 36 seasons in his first season in 2012-13. His first Wildcat team won 27 games — the second-most wins in school history and 14 in Big 12 play to tie for its first league title since the Big Eight crown in 1977. In 2018-19, he guided the school to its 21st conference championship with a 14-4 mark in league action. The 14 league wins in 2012-13 and 2018-19 tie for the most in school history, along with the perfect 14-0 Big Eight mark in 1958-59.

Weber's 180 wins are the third-most by a head coach in school history and the most since Jack Hartman retired as the school's winningest coach with 295 victories in 1986. He earned his 175th career victory at K-State in the 65-59 win over Wichita State on Dec. 5, 2021 to become the third coach (joining Hall of Famers Jack Hartman and Fred "Tex" Winter) to eclipse 175 career wins. He is the fourth coach (Hartman, Winter and Frank Martin) to take the school to at least five NCAA Tournaments in a tenure, while only Hartman (seven) has more 20-win seasons.

Weber earned his 450th career victory in the Wildcats' 58-57 upset of No. 20/21 lowa State at Hilton Coliseum on January 12, 2019. He is one of three current Big 12 head coaches to win 450 games in a career, along with a pair of Hall of Famers - West Virginia's **Bob Huggins** and Kansas' **Bill Self**.

Weber is one of 14 active Division I coaches to have been named conference Coach of the Year three times in three different leagues, including the Missouri Valley in 2003 at Southern Illinois, the Big Ten in 2005 at Illinois and the Big 12 in 2013 at K-State. In addition, he was the consensus 2005 National Coach of the Year guiding the Fighting Illini to the NCAA championship game. Most recently, he was the co-recipient of the 2019 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award after helping Team USA win the gold medal at the FIBA U19 World Cup in Greece.

Weber has tutored 14 players named to All-Big 12 teams the past nine seasons, including first team members Rodney McGruder (2013), Dean Wade (2018, 2019) and Barry Brown, Jr. (2019), second team picks Angel Rodriguez (2013), Marcus Foster (2014) and Brown (2018), third team honoree Wes Iwundu (2016, 2017) and honorable mention selections Shane Southwell (2013), Thomas Gipson (2014, 2015), Will Spradling (2014), Foster (2015), Nino Williams (2015), D.J. Johnson (2017), Xavier Sneed (2019, 2020) and Kamau Stokes (2019) and Mike McGuirl (2021).

In addition, Weber has helped mentor a Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year in Brown (2019), four All-Big 12 All-Defensive Team members in Rodriguez (2013), Iwundu (2016) and Brown (2018, 2019) as well as three players selected to the league's All-Newcomer Team, including Brown and Wade, who became the first Wildcat duo to be honored on all-rookie squad in 2015-16.

The Wildcats have also excelled off the court in Weber's nine seasons at the helm, as 19 student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big 12 recognition a total of 26 times, while players have combined to appear on the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll 127 times since 2012. The program has had at least two Academic All-Big 12 selections in eight of Weber's nine seasons, including a school-record five Academic All-Big 12 selections (with four First Team honorees) in 2017. All 28 players who have completed their eligibility under Weber have earned their degrees.

Weber guided K-State through one of the most challenging seasons in its history in 2020-21, as the Wildcats had to navigate COVID-19 protocols on a near daily basis while fielding one of the nation's youngest teams. The team was able to finish on a high note by winning 4 of its last 6 games, including battling eventual national champion Baylor in a 74-68 loss at Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.

K-State returned just four lettermen for the 2020-21 season, including only one senior (Mike McGuirl), while the team welcomed eight newcomers, including five true freshmen. The four returning lettermen were the fifth-fewest in Division I, while the three upperclassmen (one senior and two juniors) were only surpassed by three other teams. The nine total newcomers (including sophomore Kaosi Ezeagu who sat out the 2019-20 season) were the fourth-most among power-conference schools. The Wildcats' average age of 19.6 years ranked 336th out of 347 teams that played during the turbulent 2020-21 season.

In all, the Wildcats had just one player start all 29 games (Mike McGuirl), while it started three true freshmen (Davion Bradford, Selton Miguel and Nijel Pack) in 17 games, including 12 in Big 12 play. The 71 combined starts by true freshmen ranked second nationally to Kentucky's 72, while the 17 games with at least three true freshmen starters trailed just Duke (19) and Kentucky (18).

The trials of 2020-21 came after a rebuilding season in 2019-20 that was cut short after the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship was cancelled due to the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. The non-winning season (11-21) snapped a streak of three consecutive 20-win seasons and was the first since the 2014-15 season.

In 2018-19, Weber led K-State to a 25-9 overall record, which included a share of the Big 12 regular-season title with a 14-4 conference mark, and a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in his tenure, including the third consecutive season.

Known for being one of the top defensive coaches in the game, Weber's 2018-19 Wildcats were one of the top defensive teams in the country, allowing just 59.6 points per game, which ranked fourth nationally. It was the lowest opponent scoring average in school history since the introduction of the shot clock and the lowest since allowing 58.4 points per game in 1982-83.

The 2018-19 Big 12 Championship season came on the heels of perhaps the best coaching performance of Weber's career, in which, he guided a K-State team picked to finish eighth in the preseason Big 12 poll to a second 25-win season and its first trip to the Elite Eight in eight years in 2017-18.

The run to the Elite Eight in 2018 was the second straight NCAA Tournament for Weber's Wildcats, which tallied a 21-14 overall record to go with an 8-10 mark in Big 12 play in 2016-17. He led K-State to its first postseason victory in five seasons with a 95-88 win over Wake Forest in the First Four in Dayton before falling to Cincinnati in the NCAA South Regional.

Weber's record-setting inaugural season is considered one of the best in school history, as the Wildcast stallied a 27-8 overall record and a 14-4 mark in league play en route to its first-ever Big 12 regular season championship and a school-record fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. The 27 wins were the second-most in school history.

For his efforts, Weber was named the 2013 Big 12 Coach of the Year by the league coaches and AP and District Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA). He has now been named conference Coach of the Year on three different occasions in three leagues, the Missouri Valley (2003), Big Ten (2005) and Big 12 (2013).

Weber, 65, has compiled a 493-292 (.628) overall record in his 24 seasons as a head coach, which includes stints at Southern Illinois (1998-2003) and Illinois (2003-11). His teams have participated in postseason play 15 times, including 13 NCAA Tournament appearances. He has won 15 NCAA Tournament games, including trips to the Sweet 16 in 2002, 2004, 2005 and 2018 and the Elite Eight in 2005 and 2018, while he played in the NCAA Championship in 2005.

In all, Weber has 42 years of college coaching experience, which includes 19 seasons as an assistant coach for coaching legend **Gene Keady**, a native of Garden City, Kansas and a 1958 Kansas State graduate. Weber spent his entire assistant coaching career with Keady, first at Western Kentucky (1979-80) and then Purdue (1981-98). In Weber's 18 years at Purdue, the Boilermakers won six Big Ten titles and played in 14 NCAA Tournaments.

All told, he has been a part of more than 900 victories, 28 NCAA Tournament appearances and 15 conference championships in coaching stints at Western Kentucky, Purdue, Southern Illinois, Illinois and K-State.

## **2021-22 BOXSCORES/RECAPS**

### **FLORIDA A&M**

Nov. 10, 2021 | Manhattan, Kan. / Bramlage Coliseum Florida A&M K-STATE \_ 34 33 67

- ► Sophomore reserve **Selton Miquel** scored all 10 of his points in a pivotal stretch in the second half to help propel K-State past Florida A&M, 67-57, in the opener for both teams on Nov. 10 before 5,296 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ Miguel, who went scoreless in the first half, caught fire at the right moment in the second half for the Wildcats, which was in a back and forth affair with the Rattlers (0-1). He scored all 10 of his points in a 12-2 run that flipped a onepoint deficit (42-43) with 13:28 to play into a 9-point advantage (54-45) with 9:17 remaining. He ignited the pivotal run with a layup that gave K-State the lead for good at 44-43 with 12:49 to play then followed with a jumper for a 5point lead (48-43) before capping the run with consecutive 3-pointers.
- ► K-State was able to break open an early back-and-forth contest with a pivotal 10-1 run over a 3-minute span late in the first half. Moments after Pitt State tied the game at 18-all with just over 8 minutes to play before halftime, sophomore **Ish Massoud** ignited the 10-1 run with a pull-up jumper. It was followed by a 3-pointer from junior Markquis Nowell, layups by fifth-year Mark Smith and Miguel and a 3-pointer by fifth-year senior Mike McGuirl.
- ▶ The run enabled the Wildcats to stretch ahead and build as much as a 13point lead en route to the victory. The Rattlers led by as many as 4 points on multiple occasions in the first half, and after falling behind by 5 (31-26) right before halftime, surged back ahead moments after halftime.
- ▶ K-State relied on its usually strong defense to earn its 23rd win in the last 25 home openers, holding a fee below 60 points for the 104th time under **Bruce** Weber. The Wildcats held the Rattlers to 41.5 percent (22-of-53) shooting, including 20 percent (3-of-15) from 3-point range, and forced 18 turnovers.
- ▶ Miguel was joined in double figures by fellow sophomore Nijel Pack, who led the team with 18 points on 6-of-11 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, and fifth-year senior Mark Smith, who collected 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting and 6 rebounds. Junior Kaosi Ezeagu had solid stat line with 7 points, 5 rebounds and 3 assists in just 18 minutes.
- ▶ With the win, K-State moved to 92-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 28-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum. The Wildcats are now 8-2 in season openers under head coach Bruce Weber.

- ► K-State showed a glimpse of its offensive potential, as the Wildcats connected on 50 percent or better from the field in both halves to out-muscle a determined Omaha squad, 79-64, on Nov. 17 at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ In a complete reversal of the nail-biter from last season, in which, K-State won 60-58 on a 3-pointer by Selton Miguel with 9.7 second remaining, the Wildcats led from start to finish against the Mavericks. K-State led by as many 26 points before Omaha scored 13 of the last 15 points to close the gap.
- ► K-State was efficient on the offensive end, converting on 52.8 percent (28of-53) from the field, including 47.4 percent (9-of-19) from 3-point range, and knocking down 14 of 16 free throw attempts. The Wildcats had 18 assists on their 28 made field goals while scoring 34 points in the paint.
- ► Seven Wildcats had at least 8 points, including four double-digit scorers with 15 points each from sophomores Ish Massoud and Nijel Pack and 11 for both fifth-year senior Mark Smith and junior Markquis Nowell. Big men Kaosi Ezeagu and Davion Bradford combined for 16 points on 8-of-14 shooting. Miguel dished out a team-best 6 assists in his first start of the season.
- ▶ The Wildcats connected on 54.8 percent (17-of-31) of their field goals in the first half with 10 assists to build as much as a 21-point lead then followed it by knocking down 50 percent (11-of-22) of their shots in the second half with 8 assists to build as much as the aforementioned 26-point advantage. It marked the first time the team shot better than 50 percent in both halves since a win against Milwaukee on Dec. 11, 2020.
- ► The defense, which showed promise in the opening win over Florida A&M on November 10, struggled at times against an Omaha team that nearly overcame a 29-point deficit against Ball State. Although the Mavericks shot 34.7 percent (23-of-66) from the field, 11 of their 23 field goals came on 3-pointers, while they took advantage of some sloppy Wildcat turnovers to score 20 points.
- ▶ Omaha junior Kyle Luedtke came off the bench to lead all scorers with 16 points on 6-of-14 field goals. Five other Mavericks had at least 6 points.
- ▶ The win gave K-State a 2-0 start for the seventh time in the last 8 seasons but for the first time since the 2019-20 season. The Wildcats have now started 2-0 under head coach Bruce Weber in 8 of his 10 seasons.

- ► K-State nearly dug itself out of an 18-point deficit with a gritty second-half effort, however, No. 13/12 Arkansas made the right plays down the stretch to hold off the rally in a 72-64 win on Nov. 22 in the semifinals of the Hall of Fame Classic before 9,409 fans at the T-Mobile Center.
- ▶ Down by as many as 18 points, including 45-27, just under 2 minutes into the second half, the Wildcats closed to within 62-54 on a pair of free throws by sophomore Nijel Pack with 1:53 to play then to 66-60 on a Pack 3-pointer with under a minute to play. However, reserve Chris Lykes was a perfect 10-of-10 from the line in the last 1:46 to stave off any further attempts at a comeback.
- ▶ Lykes was among five Razorbacks in double figures, tying for the team lead with junior Conner Vanover with 14 points each, while senior Au'Diese Toney added a near double-double with 13 points and 9 rebounds
- ▶ Pack tied for the game-high lead with 14 points on 5-of-12 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, while fellow sophomore **Selton Miguel** had a near doubledouble with a game-tying 14 points on 5-of-11 shooting to go with a careerbest 9 rebounds. Junior Markquis Nowell added 10 points, eclipsing 1,000 points in college in a career that started at Little Rock in 2018-19.
- ▶ K-State dug itself into its double-digit deficit with a poor offensive start, as the Wildcats connected on just 25.9 percent (7-of-27) from the field, including 0-of-10 from 3-point range, in the first half to go with 8 turnovers. The team flipped the switch in the second half, scoring 40 points on 46.9 percent (15-of-32) shooting from the field and 77.8 percent (7-of-9) from the line.
- ▶ The teams were nearly identical shooting the ball with K-State connecting on 37.3 percent (22-of-59) from the field compared to Arkansas' 36.2 percent (21-of-58), as they combined to hit just 6 of 44 3-point attempts (13.6 percent). However, the Razorbacks took advantage of the 45 personal fouls to convert on 27 of 34 free throw attempts (79.4 percent), which was 10 more than the Wildcats (17-of-23: 73.9 percent).
- ► K-State held Arkansas to 12 points under its scoring average (84.3 ppg) and more than 12 percentage points under its field goal percentage (48.4 percent).
- The loss ended a unique streak for K-State, as the Wildcats entered 4-0 vs. SEC opponents in the T-Mobile Center, including 3-0 vs. ranked SEC foes.

- ▶ No. 14/15 Illinois broke open a tight contest with a decisive 21-7 run midway through the second half, which included five 3-point field goals, to pull away from K-State on Nov. 23 in the consolation game of the Hall of Fame Classic in front of 7.255 at the T-Mobile Center.
- ▶ A night after shooting 28.1 percent from the field, including 13.6 percent from 3-point range, in a loss to Cincinnati, the Fighting Illini seemed to make every shot against the Wildcats, as they connected on 5.1 percent (25-of-48) from the field, including 12 makes from 3-point range on 46.2 percent (12-of-26) shooting. Seven of those 12 triples came from senior **Alfonso Plummer**, who finished the night with 21 points on 7-of-9 shooting from long range.
- ► K-State, on the other hand, couldn't find any offensive rhythm, connecting on just 38.5 percent (25-of-65) from the field, including 28.6 percent (6-of-21) from 3-point range, with just 9 assists on 25 made field goals. After shooting 44.8 percent (13-of-29) to help close the deficit to 34-31 at the half, the team couldn't sustain that output in the second half, shooting just 33.3 percent (12-of-36) from the field, including 23.1 percent (3-of-13) from long range.
- ▶ Junior reserve Markquis Nowell had his best night as a Wildcat, coming off the bench to score a team-high 19 points on 7-of-15 field goals to go with team-best in rebounds (6) and steals (2) in 25 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomores Nijel Pack (15) and 1sh Massoud (13). The trio combined for 47 of the Wildcats' 64 points, as the rest of the team managed just 17 points on 8-of-26 shooting, including 1-of-7 from 3-point range.
- After falling behind by as many as 7 points in the first half, the Wildcats seemed to find some momentum in the early part of the second half, rattling off 6 straight points to open the half for a 37-34 lead and force a timeout by Illinois.
- ► The Illini responded out of the timeout with 7 straight point to push back ahead, 41-37, at the 16:24 mark, but Massoud went on a 5-0 run himself, including a 3-pointer to give the Wildcats the lead at 42-41 with 14:40 to play.
- ► However, back-to-back 3-pointers from Plummer and fifth-year senior **Jacob Grandison** started a stretch of 9 straight points by Illinois, which turned into the larger 21-7 run, flipping the 1-point deficit into as much as 13-point advantage. Plummer hit 3 of his game-high 7 3-pointers during this stretch.

- ► K-State responded from its consecutive losses to Top 15 opponents earlier in the week with perhaps its most complete effort of the season, as the Wildcats easily dispatched North Dakota, 84-42, on Nov. 28 at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► The Wildcats connected on 60.3 percent (35-of-58) of their field goals, including 69 percent (20-of-29) in the second half, to post their first 80-point game since scoring 84 against West Virginia on Jan. 18, 2020. More than half of the 84 points came in the paint (46) with the team dishing out a season-high 21 assists. It marked the first time the Wildcats had shot better than 60 percent since hitting on 62.5 percent (35-of-56) vs. Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.
- ► Five Wildcats scored in double figures for the first time this season led by a game-high 18 points from reserve Markquis Nowell, who collected double-figure points for the fourth straight game. Nowell, who hit on 8-of-12 field goals, also added a game-high 5 assists and 5 steals in 22 minutes. Sophomore Nijel Pack, who has double figures in all 5 games, scored 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range, while junior Kaosi Ezeagu and senior Mike McGuirl each added 15 points.
- ► Fifth-year senior **Mark Smith** registered his second career double-double, including his first as a Wildcat, with 11 points on 5-of-11 field goals, and a game-high 10 rebounds in 26 minutes.
- ▶ The defense was equally as potent, as K-State held North Dakota (2-5) to nearly 30 points under their scoring average (70.0 ppg.) on just 29.3 percent (17-of-58) shooting, including 9.7 percent (3-of-31) from 3-point range. The Wildcats harassed the Fighting Hawks into 17 turnores, including a seasonhigh 13 on steals, while converting those into 25 points. It was the fewest points allowed by the team since holding Alabama State to 41 on Dec. 11, 2019.
- ► The game was close in the early going before before the Wildcats rattled off a 19-1 run, which included a stretch of 16 straight points, to push the lead to 36-16 after a 3-pointer by McGuirl with 3:53 to play before the half.
- ▶ Leading 38-20 at the half, K-State had a strong start to the second half, scoring 16 of the first 20 points to take a 54-24 lead into the media timeout with 11:49 to play. Four Wildcats (Ezeagu, Pack, Nowell, McGuirl) had points in the stretch, including a pair of 3-pointers by Pack.

- ► K-State once again used its defense to stifle an opponent at Bramlage Coliseum, as the Wildcats held UAlbany to 31.5 percent shooting, including just 5.6 percent from 3-point range, en route to a 71-43 win on Dec. 1.
- ► Combined with 42 allowed to North Dakota on Sunday, the Wildcats have now held consecutive opponents under 50 points for the first time since 2015, while the 85 combined points in the last 2 games were the fewest since holding Lamar (55) and Alabama-Huntsville (26) to 81 on Nov. 12-13, 2012.
- ► The Great Danes, which hit on their first 3-point field goal before missing their final 17 attempts, were held to the second-lowest 3-point field goal percentage by an opponent in school history and the lowest since Oklahoma connected on a school-record low 4.8 percent (1-of-21) on Jan. 21, 1993.
- ► K-State has now held 29 opponents to 50 or less under head coach **Bruce**Weber, while the Wildcats moved to 96-10 all-time under Weber when holding an opponent to 60 points or less.
- ▶ Offensively, the Wildcats did most of their damage from beyond the arc, knocking down a season-high 10 3-pointers, including 5 from sophomore **Nijel Pack**, who finished with a game-high 17 points. Pack, who leads the Big 12 in 3-point field goals per game (3.0) and is second in 3-point field goal percentage (48.6), has now hit on 3 or more 3-pointers in 15 of his 30 career games. He has now led the team in scoring in 4 of 6 games this season.
- ▶ Pack was joined in double figures by fifth-year senior **Mark Smith** and sophomore **Selton Miguel**, who each registered double-doubles. It marked the first time a pair of Wildcats each collected double-doubles in the same game since March 2014. Smith, who posted his second consecutive double-double and the third of his career, finished with 14 points on 4-of-7 field goals to go with a career-tying 10 rebounds. Miguel earned his first double-double with 12 points on 4-of-8 shooting and a career-best 10 boards.
- ▶ Despite the final score, UAlbany made things difficult for K-State in the early going, taking the lead on several occasions and pulling to within a 17-all tie with 6:35 before halftime. However, the Wildcats responded with an 11-0 run to take the lead for good and pushing to as many as 28 in the second half. Over a 13-minute span between the two halves, K-State outscored UAlbany, 30-10.

- ▶ Junior Markquis Nowell scored 5 of his team-high 16 points in a late 7-0 run, including a dagger of a 3-pointer with 1:35 to play, that helped lift the Wildcats to a 65-59 win over in-state rival Wichita State on Dec. 5 before 14,488 fans at INTRUST Bank Arena.
- ▶ Nowell, who had come off the bench in the first 6 games, drew his first start of the season after starting point guard Nijel Pack was ruled out after going down with an injury in practice on Saturday. Nowell kept the Wildcats in the contest with both his scoring and decision-making, as led the way in points (16), rebounds (8) and assists (4) while playing a team-high 35 minutes.
- ▶ The first meeting between the schools since 2003 did not disappoint, as the near sold-out crowd saw WSU jump out to an 20-8 lead before K-State rallied to take the lead right before halftime on a 17-4 run. However, the Shockers seized the momentum early in the second half by scoring 14 of the first 19 points before the Wildcats rallied yet again to take a 46-44 with 7:35 remaining.
- ▶ All told, the teams battled through 9 lead changes and 9 ties, including 54all, after freshman Ricky Council IV knocked down a 3-pointer with 2:02 to play. Nowell responded with a 3-pointer of his own with 1:35 to play to key the 7-0 run by K-State, as he followed with a pair of free throws before a steal and dunk by senior Mark Smith gave the Wildcats a 61-54 lead with 48 seconds.
- ► K-State held WSU to its lowest point total of the season, allowing just 59 points on 35.2 percent (19-of-54) shooting, including 21.7 percent (5-of-23) from 3-point range. It marked the third straight opponent held under 60 points.
- ▶ Nowell was joined in double figures by three other Wildcats, including junior Kaosi Ezeagu, who scored 14 points on 5-of-6 field goals to go with 6 rebounds in a season-high 25 minutes. Sophomore Selton Miguel chipped in 12 points on 4-of-11 shooting with 6 rebounds and 3 assists off the bench, while senior Mike McGuirl added 10 points and team-tying 4 assists.
- ▶ Offensively, the Wildcats connected on just 33.9 percent (21-of-62) from the field, including 24 percent (6-of-25) from 3-point range, and hit on 17 of 25  $\,$ attempts (68 percent) from the free throw line. However, they held the edge in points off turnovers (15-10), points in the paint (28-20), second-chance points (10-3), fast-break points (7-3) and bench points (20-16).

- Redshirt freshman Oso Ighodaro blocked sophomore Ish Massoud's shot at the rim with 4 seconds left, as Marquette withstood a late K-State rally to post a 64-63 win in the third edition of the BIG EAST/Big 12 Battle on Dec. 8 before 7,184 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ Down 61-54 with 5:42 to play after freshman **Kam Jones** connected on Marquette's 10th 3-point field goal of the game, K-State twice closed to within one point in the last minute of play, lastly on a 3-pointer from the corner by senior Mike McGuirl with 19 seconds left to make it 64-63.
- ► The Wildcats had to foul on 3 straight possessions to put Golden Eagles (8-2) at the free throw line for the 1-and-1 opportunity with 14 seconds, as Jones missed the front end of the free throw to give K-State one last chance to win. With no timeouts, Massoud drove to the basket and attempted to lay the ball off the rim from under the standard but was blocked by Ighodaro with 4 seconds remaining and redshirt freshman Tyler Kolek grabbed the rebound.
- Although the Golden Fagles knocked down 11 3-point field goals on the night, it was their inside game in the second half that proved to be the deciding factor, as they scored 16 of their 33 points in the paint and were a combined 10of-13 from inside the arc after halftime. Jones scored 10 of his team-high 15 points in the second half, including 3 of the team's 4.3-point field goals.
- ▶ It was a gutsy effort by K-State, which was without its leading scorer Nijel Pack for the second consecutive game and got limited action from fellow sophomore Selton Miguel, who was injured in practice on Tuesday.
- ▶ The three newcomers Massoud, fifth-year senior Mark Smith and junior Markguis Nowell — combined for 44 of the Wildcats' 63 points with each scoring in double figures and playing better than 32 minutes. The trio also collected 22 of the team's 41 rebounds and 15 of the 18 assists.
- ▶ Smith led K-State in scoring for the first time with 17 points on 6-of-13 field goals to go with a team-tying 8 rebounds and 3 assists in 33 minutes, while Massoud broke out of a recent shooting slump with a season-high 16 points on 6-of-14 shooting, including a pair of 3-pointers, and 6 rebounds.
- Nowell nearly posted the school's first triple-double, as he scored 11 points on 5-of-13 field goals with a game-high 11 assists, 8 rebounds and 3 steals.

- ▶ Junior Markquis Nowell led three Wildcats in double figures with a seasonhigh 22 points, as Kansas State played perhaps its best all-around offensive game of the season in an 82-64 win over Green Bay on Dec. 12 before 5,437 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State connected on 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including knocking down a season-high 11 3-point field goals on 21 attempts, and were a near perfect 15 of 17 from the free throw line. It marked the first time since an 87-69 win over No. 4 Oklahoma on Jan. 16, 2018, that the Wildcats have shot better than 50 percent from the field, 50 percent from 3-point range and 80 percent from the free throw line in a game.
- ▶ With senior Mike McGuirl out with the flu and sophomore Nijel Pack playing just 14 minutes as he returns from missing two games due to a concussion, K-State relied on its three Division I transfers to lead the way, as Nowell, sophomore Ish Massoud and fifth-year senior Mark Smith combined for 53 of the 82 points while connecting on 56.7 percent (17-of-30) from the field. The trio also accounted for 17 of the 26 rebounds and 12 of its 17 assists.
- Nowell, who was starting for the third straight game in place of Pack, continued his impressive play against Green Bay after nearly posting the school's first triple-double against Marquette. He collected his first 20-point game as a Wildcat, scoring on his game-high 22 points on 7-of-13 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, while adding a game-high 8 assists, 3 rebound and a steal in 34 minutes. He was 2 assists shy of becoming the first player in school history with consecutive points/assists double-doubles.
- ► Massoud was equally as sharp offensively, posting back-to-back doubledigit scoring games with a season-high 17 points on 5-of-5 shooting, including 4-of-4 from beyond the arc, and a 3-of-3 effort from the free throw line. He is the 18th player in school history to go perfect from the field on 5 or more field goals and the second this season (Mike McGuirl vs. North Dakota on Nov. 28).
- ► Smith tallied his third double-double (all coming in the last 5 games) with 14 points on 5-of-12 field goals to go with a career-tying 10 rebounds in 27 minutes, while adding 3 assists on zero turnovers and a pair of steals.
- ▶ Three Wildcats (Selton Miguel, Davion Bradford and Pack) each added 6 points.

### **NEBRASKA**

Dec. 19, 2021 | Lincoln, Neb. / Pinnacle Bank Arena 67 K-STATE 3/1 33

- ► K-State turned to its reliable defense to grind out another road victory, as the Wildcats held Nebraska to more than 17 points under its average in a 67-58 win on Dec. 19 before a sold-out crowd of 15,043 fans at Pinnacle Bank Arena.
- ► K-State has now won 5 of its last 6 games and opened the year with back-toback road victories for the first time since the 2017-18 season.
- ▶ With their offense struggling with consistency, the Wildcats turned up their always solid defensive effort in holding the Cornhuskers to their second-fewest points of the season (58) and second-lowest field goal percentage (32.8). The Huskers, who started the game 5-of-10 from 3-point range, missed their final 18 attempts from long range, including all 11 in the second half.
- ► K-State has now held 5 of 10 opponents this season under 60 points, including back-to-back on the road (Wichita State and Nebraska).
- ▶ Playing for the first time in more than a decade in Lincoln and the first time in Pinnacle Bank Arena, the Wildcats allowed the Cornhuskers to get in rhythm early, falling behind by as many 10 points, including 25-15 with 8:48 to play. However, the team rattled off 16 straight points as part of a larger 18-2 run to end the opening half to take a 33-27 advantage into the locker room.
- ▶ After Nebraska took the momentum back with 9 straight to open the second half, the squads traded the lead back and forth until a 12-2 run keyed by a 3-pointer from sophomore Nijel Pack gave K-State the lead for good with 9:44 remaining. The Huskers made one last run, closing to within 59-55 with 2:41 to play, however, a Pack free throw and a long 3-pointer from fifth-year senior Mark Smith ended any further rally.
- ▶ Pack led the way offensively for the Wildcats with 15 points on 5-of-13 field goals, including 2-of-9 from 3-point range, to go with a career-high 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals, while fellow sophomore **Ish Massoud** added 10 points on 2-of-4 field goals, including 1-of-3 from long range, and a perfect 5-of-5 effort from the free throw line
- ▶ Big men junior Kaosi Ezeagu and sophomore Davion Bradford had their best games of the season with a combined 18 points and 15 rebounds. Ezeagu finished with a near double-double with 9 points and career-tying 9 rebounds, while Bradford added a season-high 9 points and 5 rebounds.

### **McNEESE**

Dec. 21, 2021 | Manhattan, Kan. / Bramlage Coliseum McNeese 28 59 K-STATE 35 39 7/

- ► For the second consecutive game, Kansas State used a decisive 18-2 run to end the first half to flip the momentum and carry the Wildcats to a 74-59 win over McNeese on Dec. 21 before 5,223 fans at Bramlage Coliseum in the final game before the holiday break.
- ▶ Junior Markguis Nowell and sophomores Nijel Pack and Selton Miguel combined for 53 of the Wildcats' 74 points, as Nowell and Pack each scored a game-tying 18 points, while Miguel tied his career-high with 17 off the bench.
- ▶ The Wildcats showed the effects of their second game in 3 days, as upstart Cowboys broke open a 10-all tie with 7 straight points en route to building a 26-17 lead with 5:52 to play before halftime. However, a driving lavup by Nowell seemed to spark the home team, as they scored 12 straight points as part of the larger 18-2 run to end the first half and take a 35-28 lead into halftime.
- ▶ Just 2 days earlier in a 67-58 win over Nebraska on Dec. 19 in Lincoln, Neb., K-State used a similar 18-2 run to flip a 10-point deficit into a 33-27 lead at the half. The Wildcats are now 8-0 this season when leading at the half.
- ► K-State continued the momentum to start the second half, scoring 12 of the first 16 points in building a 15-point advantage (47-32) with over 15 minutes to play. Twice, the Cowboys closed to within 10 points, including 59-49 with 7:14 remaining, but the Wildcats responded with a 7-0 run to extend the lead to 66-49 with 4:03 to play and end any further rally.
- ▶ After K-State allowed McNeese to score 26 points in the first 14 minutes, the Cowboys had just 33 in the last 26 minutes between the first and second halves. The Wildcats have now held 6 of 11 opponents this season under 60 points, including in consecutive games for the second time.
- Starting together for the second straight game, the backcourt duo of Nowell and Pack showed their tremendous potential, as they each scored a game-tying 18 points, while Nowell registered his second points/assists double-double of the season with a game-high 10 assists. The transfer joined Steve Henson. Jacob Pullen and Angel Rodriguez as the only Wildcats to post two such double-doubles in school history.
- ▶ Miguel tied his career-high with 17 points off the bench, as he hit on 6-of-9 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3, and went 3-of-4 from the free throw line.

Oklahoma\_\_ K-STATE 47 69 22

- Despite a near historic night for fifth-year senior Mark Smith, K-State could not complete a valiant second-half comeback against Oklahoma, as the Sooners held on for a 71-69 win in the Big 12 opener for both teams before 6,777 fans at the Lloyd Noble Center on New Year's Night.
- ► Smith collected the first 25-point/15-rebound effort by a Wildcat since All-American Michael Beasley in 2008, as he nearly helped the Wildcats climb out of a double-digit deficit. He finished with career-highs for points (25), rebounds (16) and assists (5) while playing nearly 39 minutes.
- ▶ Down by as many as 15 points in the first half, including 14 just minutes into the second half. K-State rallied to tie the game at 65-all on a 3-point field goal by sophomore Ish Massoud with 1:03 to play. However, senior Elijah Harkless answered out of a Sooner timeout with the go-ahead jumper that gave Oklahoma a 67-65 lead with 35 seconds remaining.
- ► Sophomore Nijel Pack, who scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half. tried to answer on the next possession, but his 3-pointer was off the back of the rim and was rebound by Sooner senior Umoja Gibson, who was fouled and calmly knocked down a pair of free throws to extend the lead to 69-65 with just 17 seconds left. A jumper by Smith on the next possession pulled the Wildcats to within 69-67 and gave them one last chance with 8 seconds to play, but Gibson sank 2 more free throws to clinch the victory for the Sooners.
- ▶ The loss overshadowed the near historic performance by Smith, who posted the first 25-point/15-rebound effort since Beasley collected 30 points and 15 rebounds against Texas on Feb. 25, 2008. His 16 rebounds were the most in a conference game since Beasley had 17 against Missouri on Feb. 16, 2008. It was Smith's fifth career double-double, including his fourth in the last 8 games.
- ▶ Smith was joined in double figures by Pack, who finished with 17 points, and Massoud, who scored 9 of his 13 points in the second half.
- ▶ After scoring a season-low 22 points on 32 percent (8-of-25) shooting in the first half, K-State erupted for 47 after halftime on 51.9 percent (14-of-27). including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from 3-point range. For the game, the Wildcats connected on 42.3 percent (22-of-52) of their field goals, including 45.5 percent (10-of-22) from long range, and hit on 88.2 percent (15-of-17) from the line.

- ► A short-handed Kansas State fought one of the nation's top-ranked teams down to the end, but No. 14/16 Texas exerted its control with a big 18-2 run to start the second half en route to a 70-57 win in the Wildcats' Big 12 home opener before 6,833 fans at Bramlage Coliseum on Jan. 4.
- ▶ Down head coach **Bruce Weber** and 7 players due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols, the pesky Wildcats with their 8 players, including 7 on scholarship, looked primed to spark the upset, scoring the game's first 7 points and leading 35-29 at the half after connecting on 50 percent (14-of-28) from the field, including 44.4 percent (4-of-9) from 3-point range.
- ► However, it was a different story in the second half, as the nation's topranked defense (51.9 ppg.) held the Wildcats to just 22 points on 22.2 percent (6-of-27) shooting, including 0-of-9 from 3-point range, while the Longhorn offense scored the first 8 points out of halftime en route to an 18-2 run that built a double-digit lead (47-37) with just over 12 minutes to play.
- ► K-State got to within 6 points on 4 occasions down the stretch, including 63-57 after a layup by sophomore **Selton Miguel** with 2:42 to play. However, the stingy defense wouldn't allow any further rally as Texas scored the game's final 7 points en route to the double-digit victory.
- ▶ It marked the first time this season that the Wildcats lost when leading at the half (8-1).
- ➤ Sophomore Nijel Pack collected his fourth career 20-point game with a game-high 21 points, including 15 in the opening half where the Wildcats built as much as a 9-point lead. He finished 6-of-12 from the field, including 3-of-7 from 3-point range, and a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line to go with 5 rebounds and a team-high 3 assists.
- ▶ Miguel added a near double-double with 13 points on 6-of-13 field goals and a game-high 8 rebounds, while fellow sophomore **Ish Massoud** chipped in 9 points. Fifth-year senior **Mark Smith** finished with 6 points, 7 rebounds and 3 steals before fouling out late in the second half.
- ► K-State had 8 available players (Miguel, Pack, Massoud, Smith, senior **Mike**McGuirl, junior Carlton Linguard, Jr., sophomore Luke Kasubke and senior walk-on Drew Honas), including 7 scholarship players, for the game.

- ► K-State played short-handed for the second consecutive Big 12 contest, as the Wildcats once again got off to a fast start in the first half before running out of steam in the second half in dropping a 71-68 decision to West Virginia before 11,919 fans at the WVU Coliseum on Jan. 8.
- ▶ Down head coach **Bruce Weber** and at least 6 players due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols for the second straight game, the Wildcats once again got the start they had been lacking at times during the season, leading by 17 points near the midway point of the first half and 13 at the half.
- ▶ However, in a game similar to one against No. 14/16 Texas, West Virginia used a strong start to second half to slowly chip away at the double-digit deficit. The Mountaineers scored 44 points on 50 percent (16-of-32) shooting in the second half after scoring just 27 points on 32.3 percent (10-of-31) in the first half. WVU grabbed its first lead at 53-50 on a 3-pointer by senior **Sean McNeil** with 8:35 to play then took it for good on a 3-pointer by fifth-year senior **Taz**Sherman just over a minute later. McNeil led all scorers with 26 points.
- After falling behind 61-53 with just over 6 minutes to play, the Wildcats tried to rally back, closing to 67-65 on a driving layup by junior Markquis Nowell with 18 seconds then, after a pair of Mountaineers free throws, got it to within 69-68 on a 3-pointer by sophomore Ish Massoud with 5.1 seconds. However, sophomore Jalen Bridges knocked down both of his free throws to extend the lead to 71-68 with 4.8 seconds before Nowell's tying 3-pointer from the top of the arc was off the mark at the buzzer.
- ► Sophomore Nijel Pack led four Wildcats in double figures with a team-high 20 points on 7-of-18 field goals, including 6-of-15 from 3-point range, in playing 33 minutes, while senior Mark Smith and Massoud added 14 and 13 points, respectively. Nowell, playing in his first Big 12 game after missing the last 2 games due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols, collected his third points/assists double-double with 10 points and a game-high 10 assists. His 3 such double-doubles are the most by a Wildcat in a career and single season.
- ► K-State finished with a season-high 13 made 3-point field goals, but they came on a season-high 34 attempts. Overall, the Wildcats connected on 37.3 percent (25-of-67) shooting, including 38.2 percent (13-of-34) from 3-point range, and made 71.4 percent (5-of-7) from the free throw line.

- ▶ Junior **Damion Baugh's** 3-point field goal with 11 seconds put the exclamation point on TCU's 8-0 run to end the game, as the Horned Frogs kept Kansas State winless in Big 12 play with a 60-57 come-from-behind victory on Jan. 12 before 5,623 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► Trailing 57-52 after junior **Markquis Nowell's** layup with 1:48 to play, TCU put together an improbable comeback to earn its third straight win at Bramlage Coliseum. Baugh started the run by making his second of 2 free throws with 1:11 to play. Junior **Emanuel Miller** corralled an offensive rebound off a 3-point miss by sophomore **Mike Miles**, **Jr.**, and scored on a layup to close the gap to 57-55 with 24 seconds
- ▶ After timeouts by both teams, sophomore **Nijel Pack** was whistled for a travel as he received the in-bound pass with 18 seconds, allowing the Horned Frogs to setup Baugh's game-winning 3-pointer that came off an assist from Miles for a 58-57 lead with 11 seconds to play. K-State had one more chance, but sophomore **Davion Bradford** could not connect on a layup and Miles was able secure the rebounds before being fouled with 1.4 seconds.
- ▶ Miles, who led all scorers with 19 points, knocked down both free throw attempts to finish off the victory. Baugh was the only other Horned Frog in double figures, finishing with 12 points. Miller led all players with 10 rebounds.
- ▶ The loss was the fourth in a row for K-State to start Big 12 play, as the Wildcats dropped their third straight game when leading in the second half. The team has lost 4 games by 3 points or less, while 6 of the 7 losses this season have come by a grand total of 25 points.
- ▶ The loss overshadowed a stellar performance by Nowell, who led three Wildcats in double figures with 18 points on 7-of-12 field goals, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range, to go with a career-high 7 steals, 4 assists and 3 rebounds in 34 minutes. His 7 steals tied for the most by a Wildcat in a conference game and were the most since **LaKeith Humphrey** had 7 against Nebraska on Feb. 11, 1989. Overall, Nowell's 7 steals tied for the third-most in all games and were the most since **Dominique Sutton** had 8 vs. Idaho State on January 3, 2009.
- ▶ Pack and fifth-year senior **Mark Smith** each chipped in 10 points, as Smith had a near double-double with a team-high 9 rebounds.

- ► Fifth-year senior **Mark Smith's** corner 3-pointer with 3:28 remaining sparked a 12-2 run by Kansas State to end the game, as the Wildcats earned their first Big 12 victory of the season in impressive fashion over No. 19/19 Texas Tech on Jan. 15 before 5,971 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ The victory not only gave the Wildcats their first win in conference play after 4 narrow defeats, it also snapped a 12-game losing streak in January and a 5game skid against Top 25 opponents. The team's last win in the month came in a 61-53 victory over Oklahoma on Jan. 29, 2020, while it was the first against a ranked opponent since a 62-57 win over No. 7 Oklahoma on Feb. 23, 2021.
- ► K-State forced Texas Tech, one of the nation's hottest teams with back-toback Top 10 wins over No. 6/7 Kansas and top-ranked Baylor, into one of its worst offensive performances of the season. The Wildcats held the Red Raiders to their second-fewest points of the season and 24 points under their scoring average on 39.6 percent (19-of-48) shooting, including 23.5 percent (4-of-17) from 3-point range. They were also forced into 18 turnovers.
- ▶ It marked the 100th win under head coach **Bruce Weber** when holding an opponent below 60 points, improving to 100-10 (.909) in his tenure.
- ▶ The Wildcat offense, which managed just 26 points in the first half on 35.7 percent (10-of-28) shooting, got into a rhythm in the second half, scoring 36 after the halftime break on 50 percent (14-of-28) shooting. For the game, the team connected on 42.9 percent (24-of-56), including 34.6 percent (9-of-26) from 3-point range. The team got 21 points from its bench.
- ► Sophomore Nijel Pack led 3 Wildcats in double figures with 14 points on 5-of-14 field goals, including a pair of 3-pointers, to go with a team-high 7 rebounds, while Smith and Mike McGuirl added 12 and 10 points, respectively.
- Although held in check offensively, junior Markquis Nowell found other ways to star for the Wildcats, posting game-high in both assists (9) and steals (5), while adding 7 points and 4 rebounds in 34 minutes.
- ▶ It was the 400th victory at Bramlage Coliseum, including the 41st vs. a Top 25 opponent. The Wildcats are now 400-140 (.740) all-time in the arena, which opened prior to the 1988-89 season.

- ▶ Sophomore Nijel Pack's layup with 1:13 remaining proved to be the gamewinner, as Kansas State held No. 23/22 Texas scoreless in the last 3:31 of the game en route to posting a 66-65 win over the Longhorns on Jan. 18 before 11,498 fans at the Frank Erwin Center.
- ▶ The victory gave the Wildcats consecutive wins over Top 25 opponents for the first time since posting back-to-back road wins over No. 20 lowa State and No. 20 Oklahoma in January 2019. It also snapped a 5-game losing streak to the Longhorns and ended their 11-game winning streak in the Erwin Center.
- ► K-State was led offensively by fifth-year senior Mark Smith, who finished with a team-high 22 points on 9-of-14 field goals to go with game-tying 8 rebounds. He was joined in double figures by Pack and senior Mike McGuirl, who finished with 16 and 13 points, respectively.
- ▶ In a back-and-forth second half, in which, the lead changed hands 7 times, Texas (13-5, 3-3 Big 12) seemed to have gained the upper hand on the back of senior Marcus Carr, who scored 19 of his game-high 25 points after halftime. Carr personally out-scored the Wildcats, 9-3, over a more than 2-minute span that gave the Longhorns a 62-58 lead with 5:26 to play. After 2 free throws by Smith, Carr went 1-of-2 from the line and fellow senior transfer **Timmy Allen** added a layup that extended the lead to 65-60 with 3:32 remaining.
- ► K-State locked in defensively, holding Texas scoreless the rest of the game despite being over the limit, while getting huge baskets from Pack, including the game-winner on a feed from junior Markquis Nowell for a 66-65 lead with 1:13 to play after the latter had closed the gap to 65-64 with 2 free throws.
- ▶ With 12.4 seconds left, the Longhorns had one more chance, but Carr's iumper rimmed off and Smith grabbed the rebound to secure the victory. Smith's last rebound was symbolic as it helped the Wildcats win the rebounding battle, 32-31, as they improved to 10-1 when out-rebounding their opponent.
- ► As stout as the defense was in the win, the offense was just in impressive as K-State scored 66 points on the nation's No. 2 scoring defense (54.5), including the most allowed at the Erwin Center this season. The Wildcats connected on 46.3 percent (25-of-54) from the field, including 38.9 percent (7-of-18) from 3point range, and managed just 10 turnovers.
