K-STATE TRAVELS TO WEST COAST FOR FIRST ROAD GAME AT CAL

► Kansas State (1-0) makes one of its earliest road trips ever on Friday, as the Wildcats journey west to take on Pac-12 foe California (0-1) at 6 p.m., CT at Haas Pavilion. This will be the eighth all-time meeting (1951, 1954, 1957, 1958, 1995, 2006, 2007) between K-State and Cal, including the fourth in Berkeley.

► Friday's contest at Cal will be the second earliest road trip in school history after the Wildcats played at UNLV in the second game of the 2019-20 season on Nov. 9, 2019 - a 60-56 overtime victory. This will be the ninth true non-conference road game out west since 2006-07, which includes the last visit to Cal Berkeley campus on Nov. 29, 2006.

► Head coach **Jerome Tang**, who became the 10th straight Wildcat coach to win his home debut on Monday's 93-59 win over UTRGV, will look to become the fourth consecutive first-year head coach to win his first road game.



Senior Keyontae Johnson made his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence vs. UTRGV on Monday, posting 13 points on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, in a team-high 26 minutes.

► With the win, Tang picked up his first career win as a college head coach, as he became the fifth straight Wildcat coach to win his debut at home. Tang was a highly-successful head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to four state championships, while he was a perfect 4-0 filling in for **Scott Drew** in his 19 seasons at Baylor. K-State head coaches are now 17-8 in their debuts, including 17-4 when opening at home.

► Johnson made his miraculous return to college basketball on Monday night after a near 2-year absence from a medical emergency while playing against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished with 13 points on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes vs. UTRGV. It marked his 39th game scoring in double figures, while he matched his career-high with 3 triples.

► One of just two returners in 2022-23, Nowell seemed to pick right back up from where he left off last season, as he led the Wildcats in scoring (14), assists (7) and steals (4). It marked the fourth time in his K-State career that he led in all three categories. The Big 12 leader in steals (2.2 spg.) and second in assists (5.0 app.) in 2021-22, he ranked second on the team in double-doubles (3) and 3-point field goals (43) and third in scoring (12.4 ppg.), double-digit scoring games (19) and 20-point games (3). He has more than 1,300 career points, while he is nearing milestones of 500 assists (needs 26) and 200 steals (needs 4).

► Tomlin, a junior college All-American a season ago at Chipola (Fla.) College, had a near double-double in his first Division I game vs. UTRGV, finishing with a game-high 14 points on 6-of-12 shooting with a game-tying 8 rebounds in less than 20 minutes of action. He had 4 double-doubles at Chipola in 2021-22.

OPENING TIP

► K-State opened the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV, as the Wildcats jumped out to a 15-3 lead just 6 minutes into the game behind their hot 3-point shooting and frenzied defensive effort. The team led by as many as 30 points in the first half, as they capped off their 52-point opening half with a ninth 3-pointer at the buzzer. The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half, as all 11 available players saw action with no one playing more than 26 minutes. It was the team's eighth win in their last 9 season openers.

► The 93 points were the most in a season opener since totaling 98 vs. Southern Utah to usher in the 2014-15 season on Nov. 14, 2014. The point total was the fourth-most in an opener at Bramlage Coliseum in the last 25 seasons. It was also the first time the Wildcats have eclipsed 90 points in a game since scoring 95 vs. Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 16, 2018 at the Paradise Jam. It was the largest win by margin in an opener since an 83-45 win over American on Nov. 10, 2017.

► K-State's versatility was on display in the opener, as nine players had at least 5 points while six scored in double figures for the first time in a game in nearly 6 years led by 14 points each from senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**. Seven players had at least 3 made field goals, while six had at least one make from 3-point range, including 3 each from Nowell and senior **Keyontae Johnson**. In addition, the Wildcats had an assist on 25 of their 30 field goals. It was the most assists since dishing out 29 vs. Alabama State on Dec. 11, 2019.

- Redshirt freshman **Bill Walker** had 30 points and 10 rebounds, and **Michael Beasley** hit some big shots after a quiet first half, helping Kansas State hold off California, 82-75, in the last meeting between the schools on Dec. 9, 2007 at Bramlage Coliseum.
- Beasley took just 6 shots in the first half, but scored 12 of his 19 points in the second, including a 3-point play with a minute left that put K-State up 76-71. He also had 11 rebounds, his ninth straight double-double. Walker kept the Wildcats in it early and sealed it late, hitting 4 foul shots in the final minute and finishing 14-of-16 from the free-throw line.

NOTES ON CALIFORNIA

► California enters Friday's contest with a 0-1 record after dropping its opener to UC Davis, 75-65, on Nov. 7. The Golden Bears shot just 38.1 percent (24-of-63) from the field, including 28.6 percent (6-of-21) from 3-point range, while the Aggies connected on 48.2 percent (27-of-56).

► Three players scored in double figures against UC Davis, including 19 by junior transfer guard **Devin Askew** and 17 by 7-foot-1 center **Lars Thiemann**. Senior **Kuany Kuany** added 10 points. The Wildcats are familiar with Askew during his stint at Texas in 2021-22 where he was coached by current associate head coach **Ulric Maligi** with the Longhorns.

► Cal won its lone exhibition game by a score of 62-55 over Chico State on Nov. 2 with the team scoring more than half of their points in the paint (34) while holding Chico to just 29 percent (18-of-62) shooting. Four players scored in double figures, including a double-double by Thiemann.

► Cal was picked 11th in both the preseason coaches and media poll for the Pac-12 with UCLA being selected as the favorite. The Golden Bears posted a 12-20 record, including a 5-15 mark in Pac-12 play, in 2021-22.

► A year ago, Cal averaged 63.1 points on 42 percent shooting, including 30.8 percent from 3-point range, with 35.1 rebounds, 10.7 assists, 4.9 steals and 2.6 blocks per game, while allowing 66.1 points on 42.1 percent shooting, including 30.9 percent from 3-point range.

► The Bears return several lettermen in 2022-23, including junior guard **Jalen Celestine** (7.5 ppg., 3.1 rpg.), senior guard **Joel Brown** (4.8 ppg., 3.5 rpg.) and Kuany (4.8 ppg., 2.4 rpg.). They will also welcome 4 newcomers, including a pair of high-level transfers in Askew (Texas) and **DeJuan Clayton** (Hartford).

► Head coach **Mark Fox** is in his fourth season at Cal, sporting a 35-59 record after being handed a difficult rebuild. He has posted a 321-235 record in his 18th season as a head coach, which includes stints at Nevada (2004-09) and Georgia (2009-18). He guided the Wolf Pack to 4 WAC regular-season titles and 3 NCAA Tournament bids before taking the Bulldogs to 5 postseason appearances.

SERIES HISTORY

► K-State and Cal will meet for the eighth time on Friday with the Wildcats holding a 6-1 advantage in a series that dates back to 1951. This will be the fourth meeting in Berkeley and the first since a 78-48 win by the Golden Bears on Nov. 29, 2006, which also pitted a first-year Wildcat coach in **Bob Huggins**.

► Friday's game is the first in a home-and-home series between the schools with Cal visiting Bramlage Coliseum during the 2024-25 season. The game was also the first struck by head coach **Jerome Tang** and his staff as most of the non-conference schedule was already set by time of his hiring.

► The two schools will meet for the first time since a home-and-home series in 2006 and 2007, as the Bears won 78-48 at home on Nov. 29, 2006, before the Wildcats earned an 82-75 win at home on Dec. 9, 2007.

► K-State and Cal first met 4 times between 1951 and 1958 during the tenures of legendary head coaches **Fred "Tex" Winter** and **Pete Newell**.

► K-State is 140-79 all-time against current members of the Pac-12, including a 46-53 mark in true road games. The last meeting with a Pac-12 opponent came on Dec. 20, 2017 in a 68-65 win at Washington State.

WE MEET AGAIN COACH FOX

► The Bears are led by a familiar face to Wildcat fans in fourth-year head coach **Mark Fox**, who is a native of Garden City, Kansas, and a former assistant coach at K-State from 1994-2000. During his 6-year stint on the coaching staff of head coach **Tom Asbury**, Fox helped the Wildcats post 85 wins with three postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1996 NCAA Tournament.

► Fox's wife, **Cindy**, spent time in the K-State Athletics Department, serving five years as Assistant AD for Marketing and Senior Woman Administrator (SWA).

► This is the second home-and-home series Fox has struck with K-State as his Georgia team split a pair of games with the Wildcats in both 2014 and 2015.

LAST TIME OUT:

K-STATE 93, UTRGV 59

► K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Monday before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.

► Fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.

► Another fifth year **Abayomi "Baybe" Iyiola** posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.

► The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.

► K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.

► The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.

► For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.

► With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

TANG DEBUTS AS HEAD COACH

▶ First-year head coach **Jerome Tang** made his debut on Monday night's 93-59 win against UTRGV, becoming the 24th man and the first full-time black head coach in school history. Tang is the sixth minority men's head coach in K-State Athletics history, including the third in men's basketball following interim coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85) and **Frank Martin** (2007-12).

▶ K-State head coaches are now 17-8 in their debuts, including 17-4 when opening at home. The last 5 Wildcat coaches (**Jim Wooldridge**, **Bob Huggins**, **Frank Martin**, **Bruce Weber** and Tang) have won their debut at home, while the last first-year head coach to lose his debut at home was **Fritz Knorr** in 1944.

▶ This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he served as athletics director and head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships.

▶ In addition, Tang twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record. He helped Baylor to wins over Texas (86-79 in OT) and at Texas Tech (82-48) during the 2012-13 season, while he guided the squad to wins over Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52) to open the 2020-21 season.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

▶ K-State has posted a 160-52 (.754) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have played 27 true road non-conference games, registering a 14-13 record. Among those games is a 78-48 setback to Cal at Haas Pavilion on Nov. 29, 2006.

▶ In addition, K-State has played four other "hostile" non-conference neutral-site games, including vs. UNLV (win) at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas in 2009, Florida (loss) in the Orange Bowl Classic in 2010, Gonzaga (loss) in Seattle in 2012 and Colorado State (win) in Denver in 2016.

▶ The Wildcats posted double-digit non-conference wins in 12 of 13 seasons from 2006-07 to 2018-19, but they have since managed just a 19-16 record in non-conference action in the last 3 seasons.

▶ K-State has a 122-14 (.896) record at home venues (includes home games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play dating back to the 2006-07 season, including a 113-12 (.903) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ K-State finished the 2021-22 non-conference season with an 8-5 record, including a 6-1 mark at Bramlage Coliseum. The Wildcats won their first 4 non-conference games (Florida A&M, Omaha, North Dakota and UAlbany)

before the setback against Marquette. They finished with wins over Green Bay and McNeese, while the final game vs. North Florida was cancelled.

OTHER NEWS/NOTES FROM THE OPENER

▶ The 93 points were the most in the opener since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah to open the 2014-15 season on Nov. 14, 2014. The point total was the fourth-most in an opener in the last 25 seasons.

▶ K-State had 25 assists on 30 made field goals. The 25 assists were 3 shy of cracking the top-10 and the most in any game since 2019.

▶ K-State knocked 12 of 27 attempts from 3-point range, which were just 1 shy of cracking the top-10. Six different players had at least one trey, including 3 each by **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis Nowell**.

▶ K-State scored 31 points off 26 UTRGV turnovers, while registering just 14 of its own. The Vaqueros were held to just 39.2 percent shooting.

▶ K-State also posted advantages in bench points (41-19) and second-chance points (16-9). The Wildcats also out-rebounded the Vaqueros, 40-34, including 14 offensive rebounds, converting them into 16 second-chance points.

A QUICK LOOK AT K-STATE

▶ K-State returns just two lettermen - senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Ismael [Ish] Massoud** - for head coach **Jerome Tang's** first season in 2022-23, as the Wildcats lost 10 lettermen (including eight to transfer) following the 2021-22 season in which the team posted a 14-17 overall record, including a 6-12 mark in Big 12 play. Nowell and Massoud started in 21 and 18 games.

▶ The biggest headliner from these returners would be Nowell, who earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and All-Defensive Team accolades in his first season with the Wildcats after transferring from Little Rock. He led the Big 12 in steals (2.2 spg.) and was second in assists (5.0 apg.), assist/turnover ratio (1.97) and free throw percentage (82.9), ninth in 3-point field goals/game (1.59) and 12th in scoring (12.4 ppg.). He was one of two Big 12 players to rank in the top-15 in scoring and top-5 in assists, steals and assist/turnover ratio.

▶ K-State lost 10 lettermen from the 2021-22 season, including a pair of super seniors in **Mike McGuirl** and **Mark Smith** as well as eight to the transfer portal.

▶ The Wildcats welcome 13 newcomers in 2022-23, including 7 Division I transfers (**Cam Carter** (Mississippi State), **Jerrell Colbert** (LSU), **Tyke Greene** (Manhattan/Stony Brook), **Abayomi Iyiola** (Stetson/ Arkansas/Hofstra), **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida), **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech), **Desi Sills** (Arkansas/Arkansas State), two community college transfers (**Anthony Thomas** and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**) and three true freshmen.

▶ The 7 Division I transfers have combined to play in nearly 500 games (491) with 287 starts, including four players (Greene, Johnson, Sills and Iyiola) who will be entering their fourth or fifth year of college. This quartet have accounted for 3,803 points and 776 rebounds in 403 games played with 283 starts. Greene (1,112) and Sills (1,110) are already 1,000-point scorers in college, while Tomlin had more than 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in junior college.

93 IN SEASON OPENER

K-State's 93 points in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) were the most in a season opener since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014.

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

► Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Monday night after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency on the court against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points on 4-of-8 shooting, including 3-of-5 from long range, to go with 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.

► Johnson looked at his best during a key stretch in the first half, scoring his first points as a Wildcat on a 3-pointer at the 14-minute mark then following with a second triple less than a minute later. He finished the first half with a team-high 11 points on 4-of-7 shooting, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range, to go with 3 assists and 2 rebounds in 16 minutes of action.

► It marked the 39th game of scoring in double figures for the 2020 Preseason SEC Player of the Year, including his first as a Wildcat. His 3 treys matched a career high that has now been done in four career games.

NOWELL STILL RUNNING THE SHOW

► On a team with 13 new players and a new coaching staff, fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** once again demonstrated he is still the guy running the show for the Wildcats in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22). He poured in a team-tying 14 points on 3-of-5 field goals, including 3-of-3 from beyond the arc, to go with a team-high 7 assists (just 1 turnovers and 4 steals).

► It marked the fourth time in his career that he has led the Wildcats in all

three categories, following games against North Dakota (18 points, 5 assists and 5 steals), TCU (18 points, 4 assists and 7 steals) and at Oklahoma State (16 points, 5 assists and 3 steals) last season.

► Nowell led the Big 12 in steals (2.2 spg.), was second in assists (5.0 apg.) and was 12th in scoring (12.4 ppq.) in 2021-22. He has already eclipsed 1,300 career points in his college career, which includes a stint at Little Rock, while he is close to milestones of 500 career assists (needs 26) and 200 career steals (needs 4).

► Nowell has now registered double figures in 66 career games, including 20 at K-State, while he has 47 games (13 at K-State) of at least 5 assists and 54 games (17 at K-State) of at least 2 steals.

BIG PRODUCTION FROM BENCH

► K-State showed off its depth in the opener with UTRGV, as the bench totaled 41 points with three players (**Abayomi Iyiola**, **Ish Massoud** and **Desi Sills**) all posting double-digit points. As a group, the bench connected 14-of-29 from the field, including a collective 11-of-17 effort by Iyiola, Massoud and Sills.

THREE SET FOR REDSHIRT

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** announced after Monday's game with UTRGV that he intends to redshirt sophomores **Jerrell Colbert** and **Anthony Thomas** and true freshman **Taj Manning**. Colbert (LSU) and Thomas (Tallahassee Community College) are both transfers with 3 years of eligibility remaining.

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 403-144 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 403 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State has registered a 203-64 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including an 87-52 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 203 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 87 league victories at home are among the top in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 26 of its 33 seasons in the arena.

► K-State has a 264-86 (.754) record at home, including a 155-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of just over 13 home wins (13.1) per season in that span.

► K-State has defeated 41 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 38 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,000 for the 2022-23 season.

First Season at K-State

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022 in an announcement by Director of Athletics **Gene Taylor**.

Tang agreed to a 6-year contract, which was approved by the K-State Athletics, Inc., Board of Directors and President **Richard Linton**. He will be paid \$2.1 million in 2022-23 and will receive a \$100,000 base salary increase each year remaining on the contract (\$2.2 million in 2023-24, \$2.3 million in 2024-25, \$2.4 million in 2025-26, \$2.5 million in 2026-27 and \$2.6 million in 2027-28).

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at Kansas State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to get to Manhattan and form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang has helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections **Johnathan Motley** (2017) and **Jared Butler** (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in **Davion Mitchell** (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang has helped construct nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (**Perry Jones III**), 2011 (**Quincy Miller** and **Deuce Bello**), 2012 (**Isaiah Austin**, **Prince** and **Rico Gathers**), 2013 (**Ishmail Wainwright**, **Al Freeman** and **Johnathan Motley**) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (**Kendall Brown**, **Langston Love** and **Jeremy Sochan**).

Tang will be the first full-time Black men's head basketball coach in school history and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach **Dave Baker** (1978-83), interim basketball coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85), football coach **Ron Prince** (2006-08), basketball coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach **Jordan Smith** (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Since the 2007-08 season, Tang has been pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, **Jared Butler**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Pierre Glasscock**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Perry Jones III**, **Quincy Miller**, **Davion Mitchell**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Royce O'Neale**, **Taurian Prince**, **MaCio Teague**, **Ekpe Udoh** and **Ish Wainwright**.

In the last three seasons alone, Baylor has tallied an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five conference games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the last two seasons is the nation's best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record since 2019-20 is the second-best nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 overall record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts, Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer **James Akinjo**. Senior **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman **Jeremy Sochan** was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. Teammate **Kendall Brown** followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked opponents. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak by any team in Big 12 history. A school-record three Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection. **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague** were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 overall record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the program's first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a five-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in both 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to his time at Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as both the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to four TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (**Paul & Bano Tang**) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, **Careylyen (Rey)** have a son, **Seven**, and a daughter, **Aylyn**. He also has adopted sons (**Lamar** and **Richard Hurd**).

- K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Nov. 7 before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.
- Fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.
- Another fifth year **Abayomi “Baybe” Iyiola** posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.
- The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.
- K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.
- The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.
- For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.
- With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
