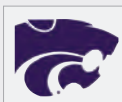

TANG DEBUTS AS HEAD COACH

► First-year head coach **Jerome Tang** enjoyed a successful debut, as the Wildcats earned a 93-59 win against UTRGV on Nov. 7 to help Tang earn his first victory as the 24th head coach and the first full-time black head coach in school history. He is the sixth minority men's head coach in K-State Athletics history, including the third in men's basketball following interim head coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85) and former full-time head coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12).

► K-State's 6-0 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the best by a first-year coach in school history since Hall of Fame coach **Lon Kruger** opened the 1986-87 with 6 straight wins. Tang is one of four first-year head coaches in Division I who are currently unbeaten, joining Missouri's **Dennis Gates** (7-0), Mississippi State's **Chris Jans** (7-0) and Maryland's **Kevin Willard** (6-0).

► This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he served as athletics director and head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships.

► In addition, Tang twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record. He helped Baylor to wins over Texas (86-79 in OT) and at Texas Tech (82-48) during the 2012-13 season, while he guided the squad to wins over Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52) to open the 2020-21 season. Tang is credited with the wins in 2012, moving his college head coaching record to 8-0.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

► K-State has posted a 165-52 (.760) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. Wednesday's contest at Butler will be 29th true road non-conference game in the span with the Wildcats registering a 15-13 record. The team already has a road win after their 63-54 victory at California on Nov. 11.

► K-State has a 123-14 (.898) record at home venues (includes home games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play dating to the 2006-07 season, including a 114-12 (.905) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

► The Wildcats posted double-digit non-conference wins in 12 of 13 seasons from 2006-07 to 2018-19, but they have since managed just a 27-17 record in non-conference action in the last 3 plus seasons (since 2019-20).

► K-State finished the 2021-22 non-conference season with an 8-5 record, including a 6-1 mark at Bramlage Coliseum. The Wildcats won their first 4 non-conference games (Florida A&M, Omaha, North Dakota and UAlbany) before the setback against Marquette. They finished with wins over Green Bay and McNeese, while the final game vs. North Florida was cancelled.

STRONG STARTS

► One of the keys to K-State's success so far has been its strong starts, as the Wildcats are averaging 40.3 points on 50 percent (84-of-168) shooting from the field, including 42.5 percent (31-of-73) from 3-point range, while hitting on 82.7 percent (43-of-52) from the free throw line.

► K-State has out-scored its opponents, 242-178, in the first half, as its defense has been equally impressive in the opening half, allowing 29.7 points on 39.6 percent (63-of-159) shooting, including 31.4 percent (16-of-51) from beyond the arc. The first 6 opponents have scored 142 combined points (23.7 ppg.) off of field goals with a combined 36 points coming from free throws.

► The Wildcats have forced 52 combined turnovers in the first half so far with nearly a third of the total points (69 of 242) coming from offense generated by these turnovers. The team scored 18 first-half points off 12 UTRGV turnovers, had 15 such points off 15 Cal miscues and 17 points off 11 Kansas City turnovers.

► The 52 points vs. UTRGV were the most first-half points in a season opener since scoring 53 vs. South Dakota on Nov. 29, 1986, as K-State's 93 points were the most in an opener since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014. The point total was the fourth-most in an opener in the last 25 seasons.

FORCING TURNOVERS

► K-State's defense has forced 114 turnovers through the first 6 games, which includes 46 steals, while averaging 21.2 points per game off those miscues.

► The 19.0 turnovers forced per game ranks 19th nationally, while it places third in the Big 12 behind Iowa State (21.0) and Texas (20.60). K-State ranks fifth in turnover margin (+3.00) and seventh in steals (7.7), while senior **Markquis Nowell** places fifth in the Big 12 in steals per game (2.00).

► The Wildcats opened the year by forcing 20 or more turnovers from each of their first 3 opponents, which hasn't happened since at least 1995-96. The 2007-08 season was the last time that K-State has forced 20 or more turnovers from each of its first 2 opponents.

► K-State scored 20 or more points off turnovers in 3 of its first 4 games with a season-high 31 points off 26 UTRGV (11/7/22) turnovers in the opener. The Wildcats scored 20+ points off miscues in back-to-back games vs. Kansas City (11/17/22; 26 points) and Rhode Island (11/21/22; 21 points).

BENCH PRODUCTION

► K-State is getting solid production from its bench through the first 6 games, as the Wildcats are averaging 21.5 points per game. Three reserves (**Desi Sills**, **Tykei Greene** and **Ish Massoud**) are averaging better than 4.6 points per game on a collective 45.2 percent (38-of-84) shooting.

► The Wildcats got 41 points from its bench in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) with 3 reserves (**Abayomi Iyiola** (12), Massoud (10) and Sills (10) all posting double-digit points. As a group, the bench connected on 14-of-29 from the field, including a collective 11-of-17 effort by Iyiola, Massoud and Sills.

► The veteran Sills has been particularly impactful from the bench, scoring in double figures 3 times in 6 games, including a season-high 16 points in the win over LSU (11/23/22) at the Cayman Islands Classic Championship game. He averaged 9.7 points on 54.5 percent shooting in the 3-game tournament.

TEAM FULL OF SCORERS

► K-State is one of 13 schools to have at least three 1,000-point scorers on its roster, as Wildcats **Tykei Greene** (1,141 points), **Markquis Nowell** (1,400 points), **Desi Sills** (1,164 points) all have eclipsed the milestone in their careers at the Division I level. Only Nowell has reached the mark while at K-State.

► K-State has 5 1,000-point scorers if you count senior walk-on **Nate Awbrey**, who scored 1,032 points in his 4-year career at Manhattan Christian College, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at Monroe College (2019-20) and Chipola College (2020-22).

► That total could increase this season, as two other Wildcats (**Abayomi Iyiola** and **Keyontae Johnson**) have more than 800 points in their career.

► UAB leads the country with five 1,000-point scorers followed by Notre Dame (4), while K-State is one of 11 other schools to have 3 such scorers, including Drake, Gonzaga, Indiana, Iowa State, Ohio State, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Southern Utah, Texas and Virginia.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

► K-State's overtime 96-87 win over Nevada in the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.

► The Wildcats have a 1,701-1,213 (.586) all-time record as a program, which includes 31 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships.

MAKING THE MOST FROM THE LINE

► K-State has been making the most of its opportunities from the free throw line, knocking down a Big 12-best 79.4 percent (104-of-131). The figure ranks 13th nationally, while the team is 25th in free throws made/game (17.3).

► 3 Wildcats rank in the Big 12's top-10, including seniors **Keyontae Johnson** (2nd; 88.2%, 30-of-34), **Markquis Nowell** (6th; 84.8%, 28-of-37) and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** (7th; 83.3%, 15-of-18). In addition, a fourth Wildcat - senior **Desi Sills** (92.9% 13-of-14) - would be ranked if he met the minimum.

► After hitting on 72.4 percent (21-of-29) in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22), the Wildcats were even better from the free throw line in games vs. California (11/11/22) and Kansas City (11/17/22), combining to make 85.7 percent (30-of-35). Those numbers were equally as solid in crunch time, as the team went a combined 82.4 percent (14-of-17) in the second half when both the Golden Bears and Roos attempted to make comebacks.

► The Wildcats connected on 79.1 percent (53-of-67) of their free throws in winning the Cayman Islands Classic, including near perfect performances by Johnson (24-of-27), Nowell (13-of-15) and Tomlin (8-of-9).

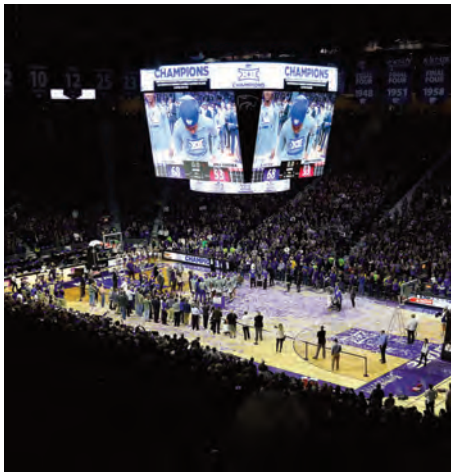
A TEAM OF WINNERS

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** has remarked on a number of occasions that he recruited a team 'full of winners' as exemplified by the number of championship that the collective group has won.

► There are a combined 8 state championships among the 15 players on the roster, including 2 each won by seniors **Desi Sills** and **Abayomi Iyiola** and true freshmen **Taj Manning**. In addition, sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and true freshman **Dorian Finister** also won state titles during their senior seasons.

► In addition to the high school success, a number of players have been apart of winning college programs, including Sills and Iyiola being members of Arkansas' Elite Eight team in 2021 and senior **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida) and junior **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech) being apart of 2 NCAA Tournaments.

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 404-144 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 404 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State has registered a 204-64 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including an 87-52 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 204 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 87 league victories at home are among the top in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 26 of its 33 seasons in the arena.

► K-State has a 265-86 (.754) record at home, including a 156-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of just over 13 home wins (13.1) per season in that span.

► K-State has defeated 41 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 38 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,000 for the 2022-23 season.

PLAYER NOTES

NOWELL RUNNING THE SHOW

► On a team with 13 new players and a new coaching staff, fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** once again has demonstrated he is still the guy running the show for the Wildcats, as he leads the team in both assists (7.8 apg.) and steals (2.0 spg.) while averaging the second-most points (15.3 ppg.).

► On Monday, Nowell was recognized for his MVP performance in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he was selected as the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week. He averaged 18.7 points on 45.2 percent (19-of-42) from the field, including 31.3 percent (5-of-16) from 3-point range, with 9.0 assists and 3.7 rebounds in 33.6 minutes per game. It was his first weekly honor in the Big 12 and his fourth overall after winning it 3 times in the Sun Belt.

► In the wins vs. Rhode Island and Nevada, Nowell became the first Wildcat to record double-digit assists in consecutive games, while he became the second player in school history and the first since 1989 to post a 25-point/10-assist game with his 29-point, 11-assist performance in the 96-87 overtime win over the Wolf Pack. His 12 assists vs. the Rams tied for the fourth-most in single game in school history and the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma State on Feb. 25, 1989.

► Nowell was part of the first Wildcat duo since 2010 to each collect at least 25 points in a game, as he and fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 57 points in the win over Nevada. It marked just the 15th time that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.

► Nowell capped the tournament with a game-high 18 points in the title game win over LSU, as he helped the Wildcats rally from an 11-point second-half deficit. He finished 6-of-14 from the field, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists and 4 rebounds.

► Nowell continues to approach a number of milestones in his career, as he has already eclipsed 1,400 points, 500 assists and 200 steals, which includes a stint at Little Rock. He is the only active Division I player to total more than 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

► Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Nov. 7 in the season opener with UTRGV after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points, 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.

► Johnson continued his impressive play with a near double-double in the win at Cal, scoring a team-high 16 points while grabbing a game-high 9 rebounds to go with 2 steals, 1 assist and 1 block in a game-high 33 minutes.

► Johnson was named the *March Madness* National Player of the Week and the Phillips 66 Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 14, as he averaged 14.5 points on 47.6 percent (10-of-21) shooting, including 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3-point range, to go with 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the Wildcats' 2 wins.

► Johnson continued his stellar play in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent (15-of-28) shooting, including 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range, to go with a team-best 6.0 rebounds in 32.3 minutes per game.

THREE SET FOR REDSHIRT

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** announced after the season opener with UTRGV (11/7/22) that he intends to redshirt sophomores **Jerrell Colbert** and **Anthony Thomas** and true freshman **Taj Manning**. Colbert (LSU) and Thomas (Tallahassee Community College) are both transfers with 3 years of eligibility remaining, while Manning has the full 4 years of eligibility.

A QUICK LOOK AT K-STATE

► K-State returns just two lettermen - senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Ismael [Ish] Massoud** - for head coach **Jerome Tang's** first season in 2022-23, as the Wildcats lost 10 lettermen (including eight to transfer) following the 2021-22 season in which the team posted a 14-17 overall record, including a 6-12 mark in Big 12 play. Nowell and Massoud started in 21 and 18 games.

► The biggest headliner from these returners would be Nowell, who earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and All-Defensive Team accolades in his first season with the Wildcats after transferring from Little Rock. He led the Big 12 in steals (2.2 spg.) and was second in assists (5.0 apg.), assist/turnover ratio (1.97) and free throw percentage (82.9), ninth in 3-point field goals/game (1.59) and 12th in scoring (12.4 ppg.). He was one of two Big 12 players to rank in the top-15 in scoring and top-5 in assists, steals and assist/turnover ratio.

► K-State lost 10 lettermen from the 2021-22 season, including a pair of super seniors in **Mike McGuire** and **Mark Smith** as well as 8 to the transfer portal, including most notably **Nijel Pack** to Miami (Fla.), **Davion Bradford** to Wake Forest, **Luke Kasubke** to Illinois State and **Selton Miguel** to South Florida.

► The Wildcats welcome 13 newcomers in 2022-23, including 7 Division I transfers (**Cam Carter** (Mississippi State), **Jerrell Colbert** (LSU), **Tykei Greene** (Manhattan/Stony Brook), **Abayomi Iyiola** (Stetson/Arkansas/Hofstra), **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida), **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech), **Desi Sills** (Arkansas/Arkansas State), two community college transfers (**Anthony Thomas** and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**) and three true freshmen.

► The 7 Division I transfers have combined to play in nearly 500 games (491) with 287 starts, including four players (Greene, Johnson, Sills and Iyiola) who will be entering their fourth or fifth year of college. This quartet have accounted for 3,803 points and 776 rebounds in 403 games played with 283 starts. Greene (1,112) and Sills (1,110) are already 1,000-point scorers in college, while Tomlin had more than 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in junior college.

► Rich was named First Team Class 3A All-State by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and to the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* All-Metro First Team.

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022 in an announcement by Director of Athletics **Gene Taylor**.

Tang agreed to a 6-year contract, which was approved by the K-State Athletics, Inc., Board of Directors and President **Richard Linton**. He will be paid \$2.1 million in 2022-23 and will receive a \$100,000 base salary increase each year remaining on the contract (\$2.2 million in 2023-24, \$2.3 million in 2024-25, \$2.4 million in 2025-26, \$2.5 million in 2026-27 and \$2.6 million in 2027-28).

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at Kansas State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to get to Manhattan and form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang has helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections **Johnathan Motley** (2017) and **Jared Butler** (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in **Davion Mitchell** (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang has helped construct nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (**Perry Jones III**), 2011 (**Quincy Miller** and **Deuce Bello**), 2012 (**Isaiah Austin**, **Prince** and **Rico Gathers**), 2013 (**Ishmail Wainwright**, **Al Freeman** and **Johnathan Motley**) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (**Kendall Brown**, **Langston Love** and **Jeremy Sochan**).

Tang will be the first full-time Black men's head basketball coach in school history and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach **Dave Baker** (1978-83), interim basketball coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85), football coach **Ron Prince** (2006-08), basketball coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach **Jordan Smith** (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Since the 2007-08 season, Tang has been pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, **Jared Butler**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Pierre Jackson**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Perry Jones III**, **Quincy Miller**, **Davion Mitchell**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Royce O'Neale**, **Taurian Prince**, **MaCio Teague**, **Ekpe Udoh** and **Ish Wainwright**.

In the last three seasons alone, Baylor has tallied an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five conference games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the last two seasons is the nation's best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record since 2019-20 is the second-best nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 overall record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts, Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer **James Akinjo**. Senior **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman **Jeremy Sochan** was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. Teammate **Kendall Brown** followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked opponents. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak by any team in Big 12 history. A school-record three Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection. **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague** were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 overall record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the program's first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a five-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in both 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to his time at Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as both the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to four TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. ▶ K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Nov. 7 before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.

▶ Fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior **Keyontae Johnson** scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.

▶ Another fifth year **Abayomi "Baybe" Iyiola** posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior **Desi Sills** and junior **Ismael (Ish) Massoud** each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.

▶ The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.

▶ K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.

▶ The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.

▶ For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.

▶ With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ Senior **Markquis Nowell's** 4-point play with just over 5 minutes helped ignite an 8-0 run that lifted K-State to a 63-54 win over California on Nov. 11 before 3,607 fans at Haas Pavilion.

▶ Nowell hit a 3-pointer from the corner right in front of the Wildcats bench before being knocked to the ground. He calmly hit the free throw that gave K-State a 51-46 lead with 5:07 to play. Nowell, who finished with 13 points to go along with a game-high 7 assists and 3 steals, followed his 4-point with a layup then had the steal and assist on the dunk by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** that capped the 8-0 run and gave K-State a 55-46 lead with 4:02 to play.

▶ The Golden Bears closed to within 55-50 after a 3-pointer from **Devin Askew** and a free throw by **Joel Brown**, but the Wildcats responded with 6 in a row, including a pair of free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter** to go along with a layup by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and a dunk by senior **Tykei Greene**, that pushed the lead back to double figures with just over a minute to play.

▶ Nowell's clutch shot came with the momentum clearly on the side of the Golden Bears, who had used separate runs of 13-0 and 11-0 run to erase a 20-point deficit and cut the lead to 47-46 with 5:37 to play.

▶ In addition to Nowell's spectacular night, Johnson had a near double-double with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-13 field goals to go with a game-high 9 rebounds and 2 steals in a team-high 33 minutes. He was joined in double figures by Tomlin, who added 11 points to go with 2 rebounds and 2 blocks.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on 36.8 percent (21-of-57), including 26.3 percent (5-of-19) from 3-point range, and hit on a season-high 88.9 percent (16-of-18) from the free throw line. They made just 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from the field in the second half, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from beyond the arc.

▶ K-State's lull in the second half overshadowed a sensational start, in which, the Wildcats built as much as 17-point lead in the first half behind swarming defense (15 forced turnovers) and efficient offense. The lead grew to 20 points (42-22) in the early moments of the second half.

▶ Cal, which is coached by former K-State assistant **Mark Fox**, was led by a game-high 17 points by the Texas transfer **Devin Askew**.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson** continued his impressive play to start the year, as he led three Wildcats in double figures with 19 points in helping K-State to a 69-53 win over Kansas City on Nov. 17 before 7,376 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ The win gave K-State its first 3-0 start to a season since 2019-20.

▶ Johnson, who scored in double figures for the third consecutive game, had a stellar all-around night, adding a team-tying 7 rebounds, a career-tying 6 assists and 2 steals to his 19-point effort in 35 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with a career-high 16 points on 5-of-10 field goals, including 4 treys, and senior **Desi Sills**, who added 11 points.

▶ The Wildcats once again used their defense to generate offense, forcing the Roos (1-4) into 22 turnovers and converting those into 26 points. The team has forced 20 or more turnovers in each of the first 3 games, totaling 76 points off those miscues, an average of 25.3 points per game.

▶ K-State took control of the game in the first half on eight straight points from Johnson, which was capped by the game's first 3-pointer with 15:21 to play. From there, Carter took control of the the game, hitting his first 3-pointer with 11:23 to play. He followed 3 more treys, as his fourth of the first half gave the Wildcats a 34-20 advantage with 2:24 remaining. Johnson and Carter combined for 25 of the team's 41 first-half points.

▶ For the second straight game, K-State built a 20-point advantage in the early moments of the second half only to see its opponent chip away at the deficit. Behind the play of senior **Shemarri Allen**, who finished with a game-high 21 points, Kansas City closed to within 57-47 with just under 7 minutes to play.

▶ However, it was another veteran who stepped up for the Wildcats when they most needed it. Just like senior **Markquis Nowell** who came through in the clutch with his 4-point play in the win at Cal on Nov. 11, it was the veteran Sills who did it against Kansas City, as he scored the next 6 points and finished with 10 of the team's last 12 points to push the lead back up to 18 points.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on 41.4 percent (24-of-58), including 35 percent (7-of-20) from 3-point range, and hit on 82

► K-State again used a huge first-half performance to carry itself to victory, as the Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 77-57 win over Rhode Island on Nov. 21 before 1,256 fans at The John Gray Gym.

► The Wildcats scored 44 points in the first half on a blistering 58.1 percent (18-of-31) shooting to build as much as a 21-point lead. On the defensive end, they held the Rams (1-3) to 31.3 percent (10-of-32) shooting, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from 3-point range.

► Although the second half was plagued by sloppy play with a combined 23 turnovers, including 13 by K-State, the lead never dipped below 15 points, and grew to many as 24 in the waning minutes.

► Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led a balanced attack with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, while senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **David N'Guessan** added 14 and 12 points, respectively. Johnson has now scored in double figures in all 4 games as a Wildcat, while N'Guessan and Tomlin each recorded new season-highs. Tomlin also added 5 blocked shots, which were the most by a Wildcat since **Jordan Henriquez-Roberts** in 2013.

► K-State had 20 assists on 28 field goals, including a stellar performance from senior **Markquis Nowell**, who was responsible for 12 of those assists to go along with 9 points and 5 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 12 assists tied for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and were the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma State on Feb. 25, 1989. The total was one assist shy of Nowell's career-high of 13 that he accomplished twice while playing at Little Rock.

► Nowell now has totaled 9 career games of at least 10 assists, including 4 at K-State. The 12 assists gave him 499 in his career, as he closes on the distinction of being one of just two active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1,300 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

► For the game, K-State connected on a season-high 52.8 percent (28-of-53), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from 3-point range, and hit on 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw line. More than half (38) of the team's 77 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats again took advantage of their opponent's turnovers, turning 16 Ram miscues into 21 points.

The momentum carried the team in the extra period, as they dominated the game by connecting on 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the field and making 6 of their 10 free throws.

► Junior **David N'Guessan** gave K-State the lead for good in overtime with a driving layup with 3:48 to play, which was followed by a jumper and free throw by Johnson for an 87-82 lead. After the Wolf Pack closed to within a possession on 2 free throws by **Kenan Blackshear**, Nowell caught fire offensively, hitting on a 3-point play and a jumper to push the lead to 92-84 with 1:24 remaining.

► The 57 combined points by Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) were the most by Wildcat teammates since **Dean Wade** (34) and **Kamau Stokes** (23) also combined for 57 points in win at Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017. It marked just the 15th time in school history that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.

► Nowell finished with 29 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 free throws and 11 assists in 41 minutes to become just the fifth Wildcat with a 20-point/10-assist game in school history and just the second with a 25-point/10-assist game following **Steve Henson** in 1989.

► Johnson set a career-high with 28 points on 8-of-13 field goals and 10-of-11 free throws to earn his ninth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.

► K-State connected on a season-high 55 percent (33-of-60), including 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range, and hit on 78.6 percent (22-of-28) from the free throw line. Nearly half (44) of the team's 96 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats out-rebounded the Wolf Pack, 36-22, including 13 offensive boards that they converted into a season-high 16 second-chance points.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** jumper with 4.7 seconds helped lift K-State to a 61-59 win over LSU to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic Championship on Nov. 23 before 2,400 fans at The John Gray Gym.

► The in-season tournament title was the 17th in school history and the first since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam.

► Johnson (16 points) and fellow seniors **Markquis Nowell** (18) and **Desi Silks** (16) combined for 50 of the 61 points, including 22 of their 28 second-half points, in which, the team rallied from an 11-point deficit with 17:27 to play.

► Nowell was selected as the Cayman Islands Classic Tournament MVP, while Johnson was selected to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game.

► K-State (6-0) had to survive some nervous moments to earn the victory, as both teams called their full allotment of timeouts (2 each) before the last 4.7 seconds played out. LSU (5-1) was able to dribble up the court and seemingly tied the game at 61-all at the buzzer. However, the officials reviewed the play and waved the shot off after they discovered that the clock didn't start on time and the shot came after the game clock had expired.

► It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who looked like the more rested team after playing in the early sessions in the first 2 days of the tournament and breezing past their first 2 opponents by 16 and 15 points, respectively.

► LSU scored 41 points in the first half on 47.1 percent (16-of-34), including 50 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range, with 3 turnovers, to build as much as a 12-point lead right before halftime. Things changed in the second half, as the Tigers managed just 18 points on 36.8 percent (7-of-19) shooting, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from long range, to go with 14 turnovers.

► Nowell scored his game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists in 33 minutes. Johnson, who played just 13 minutes in the second half due to foul trouble, scored his 16 points on 4-of-7 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Silks, who provided a spark off the bench, scored his season-high 16 points off 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, to go with game-high 5 assists in 33 minutes.

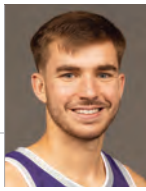

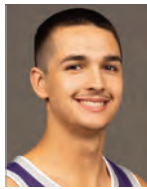
