OPENING TIP

► Kansas State (9-1) renews its longstanding rivalry with former conference foe Nebraska (6-5), as the Wildcats play host to the Cornhuskers in the Wildcat Classic at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. It will be the second in a 3-game series between the schools after K-State earned a 67-58 win over Nebraska at Pinnacle Bank Arena in Lincoln on Dec. 19, 2021. The schools were to open the series at the T-Mobile Center in 2020, but it was pushed back due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This will be the 23rd meeting in Kansas City with the Wildcats holding a 19-3 record, as all of those meetings came in the Big 6/7/8 Holiday and Postseason Tournaments.

KEY STORYLINES

- ► K-State is off its best start since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 record. The Wildcats have already surpassed their non-conference win total from each of the last 3 seasons, as they attempt to win 10 games in non-conference play for the first time since 2018-19.
- ► K-State's 9-1 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the best by a first-year coach in school history, surpassing the previous start of 8-2 by Lon Kruger (1986-87), Tom Asbury (1994-95) and Bruce Weber (2012-13). His 9-1 start ranks among the very best by all first-year head coaches in all of Division I, only surpassed by the 10-0 start by Mississippi State's Chris Jans.
- ▶ This will be the 11th Wildcat Classic at the T-Mobile Center but the first since Dec. 21, 2019 with K-State holding an 8-2 record in those previous matchups. A 66-63 loss to Saint Louis in that last matchup in 2019 snapped a 5-game winning streak, which included victories over No. 23 Alabama, No. 8 Florida, No. 21 Texas A&M, Washington State and Vanderbilt.
- ► K-State has won 3 consecutive games since absorbing its first loss of the **Jerome Tang** era against Butler on Nov. 30 with victories over Wichita State (55-50), Abilene Christian (81-64) and UIW (98-50). The Wildcats have been impressive offensively in the last 2 games, averaging 89.5 points on 58.8 percent (70-of-119) shooting with 50 of those points coming in the paint.
- ► The Wildcats have a dynamic scoring duo in seniors **Keyontae Johnson** and **Markquis** Nowell, as they are averaging 31.4 points per game on 48.8 percent (103-of-211) shooting. They are currently the third-best scoring duo in the Big 12 after the tandem of Kansas' Jalen Wilson and Gradey Dick (37.5 ppg.) and Baylor's L.J. Cryer and Adam Flagler (32.6 ppg.).
- ▶ Johnson, who ranks second in the Big 12 in scoring at 17.3 points per game, is one of just 22 Division I players shooting 50 percent or better from the field (59.2), 45 percent or better from 3-point range (50.0) and 80 percent or better from the free throw line (80.0).
- Nowell continues to be one of the nation's leaders in assists. His 8.2 assists per game rank second nationally, while his 82 total assists place third. He is also 18th in assist/turnover ratio (3.4) with 82 assists to 24 turnovers. He is the only active Division I player with at least 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals, while his 212 career steals are second among active players.

■ UP NEXT: NEBRASKA (6-5)

▶ Nebraska (6-5) enters Saturday's game on the heels of back-to-back losses to start Big Ten play against perhaps the league's 2 best teams with an 81-65 setback at No. 14/11 Indiana before dropping a heartbreaker in overtime at home to No. 4/4 Purdue.



- ▶ Nebraska has faced one of the most challenging schedules in the country with top-40 metrics according to *KenPom*. In addition to its Big Ten start, the team has split road games at St. John's and Creighton on the road and went 1-2 at a neutral site vs. Oklahoma, Memphis and Florida State.
- Nebraska is averaging 68.7 points on 44.8 percent shooting, including 31 percent from 3-point range, with 37.1 rebounds, 14.1 assists, 6.2 steals and 1.8 blocks per game, while allowing 65.5 points on 43 percent shooting, including 33.3 percent from 3-point range. The Cornhuskers are connecting on 64 percent from the free throw line.
- ► Five players are averaging in double figures led by junior and Kansas City native **Derrick Walker**, who is averaging 15.3 points on 69.2 percent (45-of-65) shooting with a team-best 8.8 rebounds per game. Junior transfer **Keisei Tominaga** is providing a big lift off the bench at 11.5 points per game, including a team-best 20 made 3-pointers. Transfer **Sam Griesel** leads in assists (4.8 apg.) to go with 10.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.
- ▶ Head coach **Fred Hoiberg** is in his fourth season at Nebraska with a 30-72 record. Prior to leaving for the Chicago Bulls, Hoiberg had a successful stint at Iowa State, leading his alma mater to a 115-56 record and 4 straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2012-15.

SERIES HISTORY

- ► K-State leads the all-time series, 127-93, which includes a 69-35 mark in games played at home venues. This will be the 221st meeting between the former conference rivals, which ranks as the fourth-most played series in school history behind Kansas (297), Missouri (237) and lowa State (235).
- ► K-State holds a 19-3 mark in games played in Kansas City

LAST MEETING: K-STATE 67, NEBRASKA 58

- ► K-State turned to its reliable defense to grind out a road victory, as the Wildcats held Nebraska to more than 17 points under its average in a 67-58 win on Dec. 19, 2021 at Pinnade Bank Arena in the schools' last meeting.
- ▶ With their offense struggling with consistency, the Wildcats turned up their defensive effort in holding the Huskers to their second-fewest points of the season (58) and second-lowest field goal percentage (32.8). The Huskers, who started the game 5-of-10 from 3-point range, missed their final 18 attempts from long range, including all 11 in the second half.
- ▶ Nijel Pack led the way offensively for the Wildcats with 15 points on 5of-13 field goals to go with a career-high 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals, while fellow sophomore Ish Massoud added 10 points on 2-of-4 field goals and a perfect 5-of-5 effort from the free throw line.

LAST TIME OUT: K-STATE 98, UIW 50

- ► K-State opened the second half with 23 consecutive points to blow open an already lopsided game, as the Wildcats capped an impressive offensive effort with a 98-50 win over UIW on Sunday before 7,042 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State collected its third 90-point scoring effort, narrowly missing the school's first 100-point game since 2010 in the last few minutes before opting to dribble out the ball in the closing seconds against an undermanned UIW. The Wildcats hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) from the field, including 68.8 percent (22-of-32) after halftime, and saw 7 players in double figures.
- ► The 48-point margin of victory is the 10th largest in school history and the most since a 107-48 win over Gardner-Webb on Dec. 14, 2008.
- ► K-State busted open a close contest with a 20-1 run midway through the first half before landing the knockout punch with a 23-0 start to the second half. Six Wildcats contributed in the first-half run, including 5 points each from senior Markquis Nowell and freshman Dorian Finister. The second-half run was much the same with seven players registering points, including 3-pointers from senior Keyontae Johnson and juniors Ish Massoud and Nae'Qwan Tomlin.
- ▶ Johnson led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with 5 assists, 4 rebounds and 3 steals in a season-low 24 minutes of action. The Wildcats' leading scorer (17.3 ppg.) has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Tomlin had a near double-double with 15 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in 23 minutes, while junior reserve **Desi Sills** added 14 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 steals.
- ➤ Sophomore Cam Carter, Finister and Nowell each added 10 points, as Nowell nearly notched another double-double with a game-high 8 assists to go with 5 rebounds. Finister saw his most action of the season in 22 minutes, recording his first career double-digit scoring game to go with 7 rebounds and 4 assists.
- ▶ UIW, which has 9 true or redshirt freshmen on its 16-man roster, connected on 38 percent (19-of-50) from the field, including 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range, and made just 5 of 8 attempts from the free throw line. Freshman **Trey Miller** led the Cardinals with 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

- ► K-State scored its season-high 98 points on a season-best 59.1 percent shooting (39-of-66), including 46.2 percent (12-of-26) from 3-point range, and connected on 57.1 percent (8-of-14) from the free throw line. The Wildcats hit on 67.5 percent (27-of-40) of its field goals inside the 3-point arc.
- ► The 98 points are the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014. The team missed scoring 100 points for the first time since 2010.
- ► K-State scored 48 points in the paint a game after posting a season-high 52 vs. Abilene Christian (12/6/22), which were the most in the paint since 2010.
- ► K-State had an assist on 26 of its 39 made field goals, including 4 players with 4 or more assists (senior **Markquis Nowell** led the way with 8)
- ► K-State scored 28 points off 20 turnovers and have now posted at least 12 points off turnovers in all 9 games, including 5 such games of 20 or more points, while forcing 177 turnovers (17.7 per game).
- ► K-State's 8 turnovers tied for a season-low (Wichita State on 12/3/22).
- ► K-State had 33 points from its bench, which were the second-most this year.
- Seven Wildcats scored in double figures for the first time this season, while all 5 starters registered double-digits for the first time since March 15, 2019.

■ TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

'CATS WINS CAYMAN ISLANDS CLASSIC

- ► K-State won its 17th in-season tournament title, as the Wildcats knocked off Rhode Island (77-57), Nevada (96-87 in overtime) and LSU (61-59) to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic on Nov. 21-23. It was the team's first tournament title since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The 3 wins gave K-State its first 6-0 start since the 2018-19 season.
- ► Senior Markquis Nowell was selected the Cayman Islands Classic MVP and to the all-tournament team, while fellow senior Keyontae Johnson was named to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the 3-game tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game. For his efforts, Nowell was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28.
- After breezing past Rhode Island, 77-57, in the first round, K-State had to fight through tight contests with Nevada in the semifinals and LSU in the finals to earn the title. After surrendering a 9-point lead to the Wolf Pack with 4:08 to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds remaining in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force overtime with 3.5 seconds. The Wildcats were able to carry the momentum in the extra period, as they hit on 5 of 6 from the field and 6 of 10 free throw line to win 96-87
- ► The Wildcats then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to the Tigers in the title game, using their defense to allow 18 points after halftime on 36.8 percent shooting while forcing 14 turnovers en route to a 61-59 victory. Nowell led all scorers with 18 points.

TANG DEBUTS AS HEAD COACH

- ► First-year head coach **Jerome Tang** enjoyed a successful a debut, as the Wildcats earned a 93-59 win against UTRGV on Nov. 7 to help Tang earn his first victory as the 24th head coach and the first full-time black head coach in shistory. He is the sixth minority men's head coach in K-State Athletics history, including the third in men's basketball following interim head coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85) and former full-time head coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12).
- ► K-State's 9-1 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the best by a first-year coach in school history with **Lon Kruger**, **Tom Asbury** and **Bruce Weber** all starting their tenures at 8-2. Tang was one of four first-year coaches in Division I who were unbeaten prior to the Wildcats' loss to Butler on Nov. 30, joining Missouri's **Dennis Gates**, MSU's **Chris Jans** and Maryland's **Kevin Willard**.
- ► This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he served as athletics director and head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships.
- ▶ In addition, Tang twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record. He helped Baylor to wins over Texas (86-79 in OT) and at Texas Tech (82-48) during the 2012-13 season, while he guided the squad to wins over Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52) to open the 2020-21 season. Tang is only credited with the wins in 2013, moving his college head coaching record to 11-1.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- ► K-State has posted a 168-53 (.759) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 126-14 (.899) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 117-12 (.905) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State has a 20-20 all-time record in the T-Mobile Center, including an 8-2 mark in the Wildcat Classic. The Wildcats have lost their last 4 games in the arena (counting the last 2 Big 12 Championships and the 2021 Hall of Fame Classic). Overall, the team is 10-6 in the T-Mobile Center in regular-season matchups.
- ► The Wildcats need 1 more win to post double-digit non-conference wins for the first time since 2018-19. The team collected 10 or more non-conference wins in 12 of 13 seasons from 2006-07 to 2018-19, but they have since managed just a 30-18 record in non-conference action in the last 3+ seasons (since 2019-20).
- ► K-State's current 9-1 non-conference mark is the best since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 record. The Wildcats won a program-best 13 non-conference games in 2009-10, while they won 12 in 2008-09 and 2010-11.

IN NEED OF A STRONG START

- ▶ One of the keys to K-State's 6-0 start to the season had been its strong starts, as the Wildcats averaged 40.3 points on 50 percent (84-of-168) shooting from the field, including 42.5 percent (31-of-73) from 3-point range, while hitting on 82.7 percent (43-of-52) from the free throw line.
- Although K-State scored 45 points on 50 percent shooting in the first half of the UIW win, the team had gotten off to less than desirable starts in the 3 games prior. They scored just 25 points in the first half of the Butler loss before posting 29 against Wichita State and 35 against Abilene Christian. In those 3 games, the Wildcats averaged just 29.7 points on 42.4 percent shooting.
- ► K-State had out-scored its opponents, 242-178, in the first half in the first 6 games, as its defense had allowed 29.7 points on 39.6 percent (63-of-159) shooting, including 31.4 percent (16-of-51) from beyond the arc. However, in that 3-game span, opponents averaged 34.3 points on 50 percent shooting.
- ► The Wildcats have forced 78 combined turnovers in the first half so far with nearly a third of the total points (102 of 376) coming from offense generated by these turnovers. The team scored 18 first-half points off 12 UTRGV turnovers, had 15 such points off 15 Cal miscues and 17 points off 11 Kansas City turnovers.

FORCING TURNOVERS

- ► K-State's defense has forced 177 turnovers through the first 10 games, which includes 80 steals, while averaging 20.7 points per game off those miscues. The team ranks fourth in non-steal turnover percentage (14.0) by *KenPom*.
- ► The 17.7 turnovers forced per game ranks 23rd nationally, while it places third in the Big 12 behind lowa State and Texas. K-State ranks fifth in turnover margin (+4.0) and sixth in steals (8.0), while senior **Markquis Nowell** places sixth in the Big 12 in steals per game (2.00).
- ► The Wildcats opened the year by forcing 20 or more turnovers from each of their first 3 opponents, which hasn't happened since at least 1995-96. The 2007-08 season was the last time that K-State has forced 20 or more turnovers from each of its first 2 opponents.
- ► K-State has scored 20 or more points off turnovers 5 times in 10 games with a season-high 31 points off 26 UTRGV (11/7/22) turnovers in the opener. The Wildcats scored 20+ points off miscues in back-to-back games vs. Kansas City (11/17/22; 26 points) and Rhode Island (11/21/22; 21 points).

BENCH PRODUCTION

- ► K-State is getting solid production from its bench through the first 10 games, as the Wildcats are averaging 19.2 points per game. Three reserves (**Desi Sills**, **Tykei Greene** and **Ish Massoud**) are averaging better than 4 points per game.
- ► The Wildcats got 41 points from its bench in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) with 3 reserves (**Abayomi lyiola** (12), Massoud (10) and Sills (10) all posting double-digit points. As a group, the bench connected on 14-of-29 from the field, including a collective 11-of-17 effort by lyiola, Massoud and Sills.
- ► The veteran Sills has been particularly impactful from the bench, scoring in double figures 5 times in 10 games, including 16 points in the win over LSU (11/23/22) at the Cayman Islands Classic Championship game and a seasonhigh 17 points (all in second half) in the loss at Butler (11/30/22).

TEAM FULL OF SCORERS

- ► K-State is one of 13 schools to have at least three 1,000-point scorers on its roster, as Wildcats **Tykei Greene** (1,155 points), **Markquis Nowell** (1,449 points), **Desi Sills** (1,203 points) all have eclipsed the milestone in their careers at the Division I level. Only Nowell has reached the mark while at K-State.
- ► K-State has 51,000-point scorers if you count senior walk-on **Nate Awbrey**, who scored 1,032 points in his 4-year career at Manhattan Christian College, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at Monroe College (2019-20) and Chipola College (2020-22).

- ► That total could increase this season, as two other Wildcats (Abayomi lyiola [874] and **Keyontae Johnson** [962]) have more than 800 points in their career.
- ▶ UAB leads the country with five 1.000-point scorers followed by Notre Dame (4), while K-State is one of 11 other schools to have 3 such scorers, including Drake, Gonzaga, Indiana, Iowa State, Ohio State, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Southern Utah, Texas and Virginia.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

- ► K-State's overtime 96-87 win over Nevada in the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.
- ▶ The Wildcats have a 1,704-1,214 (.586) all-time record as a program, which includes 31 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships.

MAKING THE MOST FROM THE LINE

- ► K-State has been making the most of its opportunities from the free throw line, knocking down 72.2 percent (143-of-198). That percentage had been the best in the Big 12 until a recent slump dropped the Wildcats to third.
- ▶ Two Wildcats rank in the Big 12's top-10, including seniors Markquis Nowell (6th; 83.7%, 41-of-49) and Keyontae Johnson (7th; 80%, 36-of-45). In addition, two others - junior Nae'Owan Tomlin (75%, 21-of-28) and senior Desi Sills (72.7% 16-of-22) - would be ranked if they met the minimum.

- ► After hitting on 72.4 percent (21-of-29) in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22), the Wildcats were even better from the free throw line in games vs. California (11/11/22) and Kansas City (11/17/22), combining to make 85.7 percent (30-of-35). Those numbers were equally as solid in crunch time, as the team went a combined 82.4 percent (14-of-17) in the second half when both the Golden Bears and Roos attempted to make comebacks.
- ► The Wildcats connected on 79.1 percent (53-of-67) of their free throws in winning the Cayman Islands Classic, including near perfect performances by Johnson (24-of-27), Nowell (13-of-15) and Tomlin (8-of-9),

A TEAM OF WINNERS

- ► Head coach **Jerome Tang** has remarked on a number of occasions that he recruited a team 'full of winners' as exemplified by the number of championships that the collective group has won.
- ▶ There are a combined 8 state championships among the 15 players on the roster, including 2 each won by seniors **Desi Sills** and **Abayomi lyiola** and true freshmen Taj Manning. In addition, sophomore Jerrell Colbert and true freshman **Dorian Finister** also won state titles during their senior seasons.
- In addition to the high school success, a number of players have been a part of winning college programs, including Sills and lyiola being members of Arkansas' Elite Eight team in 2021 and senior Keyontae Johnson (Florida) and junior **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech) being a part of 2 NCAA Tournaments.



- K-State has posted a 407-144 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 407 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.
- ► K-State has registered a 207-64 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including an 87-52 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 207 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 87 league victories at home are among the top in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 26 of its 33 seasons in the arena
- ► K-State has a 268-86 (.754) record at home, including a 159-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of iust over 13 home wins (13.1) per season in that span.
- K-State has defeated 41 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 38 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010. No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.
- Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11.000 for the 2022-23 season.

TAKING A CHARGE

K-State took a season-high 6 charges in the win over LSU, including 3 by David N'Guessan, and now have 33 charges taken in the first 9 games.

PLAYER NOTES

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

- ▶ Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Nov. 7 in the opener with UTRGV after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points, 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.
- ▶ Johnson continued his impressive play with a near double-double in the win at Cal, scoring a team-high 16 points while grabbing a game-high 9 rebounds to go with 2 steals, 1 assist and 1 block in a game-high 33 minutes.
- ▶ Johnson was named the March Madness National Player of the Week and the Phillips 66 Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 14, as he averaged 14.5 points on 47.6 percent (10-of-21) shooting, including 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3point range, to go with 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the Wildcats' first 2 wins.
- ▶ Johnson helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic and was named to the All-Tournament team, as he averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent (15-of-28) shooting, including 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range. to go with a team-best 6.0 rebounds in 32.3 minutes per game.
- ▶ Johnson became just the ninth Wildcat to connect on 9 or more field goals without a miss in the loss at Butler (11/30/22), posting his first double-double as a Wildcat with a team-high 20 points to go with a game-high 12 rebounds. It was his 14th career double-double, including his 6th 20/10 double-double.
- ▶ Johnson has scored in double figures in all 10 games this season, leading the Wildcats and ranking third in the Big 12 in scoring at 17.3 points per game. He leads the league in field goal percentage (59.2), while he is in the top-10 in 3 other categories, including seventh in both rebounding (6.4 rpg.) and free throw percentage (80.0) and ninth in minutes (31.1 mpg.).

NOWELL RUNNING THE SHOW

- On a team with 13 new players and a new coaching staff, fifth-year senior Markquis Nowell once again has demonstrated he is still the guy running the show for the Wildcats, as he leads the team in both assists (8.2 apg.) and steals (2.0 spg.) while averaging the second-most points (14.1 ppg.).
- Nowell ranks second nationally in assists per game (8.2 apg.) and fourth in total assists (82), while he is 18th in assists/turnover ratio (3.42). He is the only active Division I player with 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals. He ranks second (behind Tennessee State's Junior Clay) for most steals (212) by an active Division I player. He is nearing 1,500 career points, just 51 points away.
- Nowell was recognized for his MVP performance in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he was selected as the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28. He averaged 18.7 points on 45.2 percent (19-of-42) from the field, including 31.3 percent (5-of-16) from 3-point range, with 9.0 assists and 3.7 rebounds in 33.6 minutes per game. It was his first weekly honor in the Big 12 and his fourth overall after winning it 3 times in the Sun Belt.
- In the wins vs. Rhode Island and Nevada, Nowell became the first Wildcat to record double-digit assists in consecutive games, while he became the second player in school history and the first since 1989 to post a 25-point/10-assist game with his 29-point, 11-assist effort in the 96-87 overtime win over the Wolf Pack. His 12 assists vs. the Rams tied for the fourth-most in school history and the most since Steve Henson collected 12 assists vs. OSU on Feb. 25, 1989.

- ▶ Nowell was part of the first Wildcat duo since 2010 to each collect at least 25 points in a game, as he and fellow senior Keyontae Johnson combined for 57 points in the win over Nevada. He capped the tournament with a game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 shooting in the title game win over LSU, as he helped the Wildcats rally from an 11-point second-half deficit.
- ▶ Nowell shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state rival Wichita State for the second straight year. He had a strong allaround night, finishing with 11 points, 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals
- ▶ Nowell matched his season-high in assists in the win over Abilene Christian, totaling his 10th career double-double, including his fifth as a Wildcat, with 15 points and 12 assists. He has double-digit assists in 3 games this year.

AN INSTANT IMPACT

- ▶ Junior transfer Nae'Qwan Tomlin has given K-State another scoring threat in the post, as the junior college All-American ranks third on the team in scoring (9.9 ppg.) while connecting 43.4 percent (36-of-83) from the field to go with 5.7 rebounds and 1.0 blocks in 26.7 minutes per game.
- ► Tomlin had a near double-double in his first career Division I game vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) in the opener, as he finished with a team-tying 14 points on 6-of-12 field goals to go with a game-high 8 rebounds in just 20 minutes
- ► Tomlin continued his progress in the road win at Cal (11/11/22), scoring 11 points on 4-of-9 shooting with 2 rebounds, 2 blocks and 1 steals in just under 26 minutes of action. Although he didn't register double figures for the first time this season, he had a solid stat line in the win over Kansas City (11/17/22) with 9 points, a team-tying 7 rebounds and 3 steals in 26 minutes.
- ▶ Tomlin has double-digit scoring games in each of the last 3 games, including 14 points vs. Wichita State (12/3/22) with 6 rebounds, 2 blocks and 2 steals, 12 points vs. ACU (12/6/22) with 8 rebounds and 2 steals and a career-tying 15 points vs. UIW (12/11/22) to go with a season-high 9 rebounds.
- ► Tomlin scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at both Monroe College (2019-20) and Chipola College (2020-21) while connecting on $54.2\,percent$ from the field. He averaged a team-leading $13.8\,points$ on $52.4\,$ percent shooting with 5.9 rebounds during his All-American season at Chipola, as he guided the school to the semifinals of the NJCAA National Tournament.

SILLS OFF THE BENCH

- ► Senior **Desi Sills** has provided a spark for the Wildcats off the bench, as he is averaging 9.3 points on 46.8 percent (37-of-79) shooting with 3.0 rebounds and 2.9 assists in 26.8 minutes per game. He has scored in double figures in 5 of 10 games, including a season-high 17 points in the loss at Butler (11/30/22).
- ► Sills has double-digit points in 2 of the first 3 games, including 10 in his first game as a Wildcat vs. UTRGV (11/7/22). He scored 16 points vs. LSU (11/23/22) in the championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic, hitting on 6-of-9 field goals, before his season-high 17 at Butler.
- ▶ Although Sills went scoreless in the win over Wichita State (12/6/22), he had the play of the game with his block of Shammah Scott's breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.

- ► Ames enters his senior season at Kenwood Academy in Chicago after leading the Broncos to a 26-9 record and their first-ever Sectional title. He averaged 24 points on 58 percent shooting, including 51 percent from 3point range with 4.7 assists, 2.4 steals and 1.2 rebounds per game.
- ▶ Ames was named First Team Class 4A All-State by the AP, while was selected to the Chicago Sun-Times All-Area and First Team All-City teams.



ROBERT "R.J." JONES [6-3 / 175 / SG/ Denton, Texas]

- ▶ Jones will play his senior season at prep powerhouse Wasatch Academy in Utah after leading John Paul II High School in Plano, Texas to a 31-7 record and a second TAPPS Class 6A State Championship in 2021-22. He averaged 19.7 points, 4.1 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.6 steals per game as a junior.
- ▶ Jones was named the 2022 TAPPS Class 6A Player of the Year, a First Team All-State and All-District selection and MVP of District 6A-2



MACALEAB RICH [6-7 / 250 / PF / East St. Louis, Ill.]

- ► Rich heads into his senior season at East Saint Louis High School after guiding the Flyers to a 27-6 record and a berth in the Illinois Class 3A Super Sectionals. He averaged a double-double with team-best in scoring (19.2) ppg.) and rebounding (10.9 rpg.) while connecting on 54.9 percent.
- ► Rich was named First Team Class 3A All-State by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association and to the St. Louis Post-Dispatch All-Metro First Team.

Charter Oak State '07 First Season at K-State [9-1] 30th Season Overall | 20th Season in College

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022 in an announcement by Director of Athletics Gene Taylor.

Tang agreed to a 6-year contract, which was approved by the K-State Athletics, Inc., Board of Directors and President Richard Linton. He will be paid \$2.1 million in 2022-23 and will receive a \$100,000 base salary increase each year remaining on the contract (\$2.2 million in 2023-24, \$2.3 million in 2024-25, \$2.4 million in 2025-26, \$2.5 million in 2026-27 and \$2.6 million in 2027-28).

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at Kansas State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to get to Manhattan and form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach Scott Drew's staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang has helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections Johnathan Motley (2017) and Jared Butler (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in Davion Mitchell (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang has helped construct nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (Perry Jones III), 2011 (Quincy Miller and Deuce Bello), 2012 (Isaiah Austin, Prince and Rico Gathers), 2013 (Ishmail Wainright, AI Freeman and Johnathan Motley) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (Kendall Brown, Langston Love and Jeremy Sochan).

Tang will be the first full-time Black men's head basketball coach in school history and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach Dave Baker (1978-83), interim basketball coach Darryl Winston (1984-85), football coach Ron Prince (2006-08), basketball coach Frank Martin (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach Jordan Smith (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Since the 2007-08 season, Tang has been pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, Jared Butler, Freddie Gillespie, Pierre Jackson, Cory Jefferson, Perry Jones III, Quincy Miller, Davion Mitchell, Johnathan Motley, Royce O'Neale, Taurean Prince, MaCio Teague, Ekpe Udoh and Ish Wainwright.

In the last three seasons alone, Baylor has tallied an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five conference games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the last two seasons is the nation's best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record since 2019-20 is the second-best nationally, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a hearthreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 overall record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts. Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer James Akinjo. Senior Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman Jeremy Sochan was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft, Teammate Kendall Brown followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked opponents. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak by any team in Big 12 history. A school-record three Bears earned All-America honors, including Jared Butler becoming the first consensus First Team selection. Davion Mitchell and MaCio Teague were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 $\,$ record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 overall record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as Curtis Jerrells became the program's first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a fivegame run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in both 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to his time at Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as both the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to four TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - Vakeaton "Von" Wafer - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (Paul & Bano Tang) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. - ► K-State ushered in the **Jerome Tang** era with an emphatic 93-59 victory over UTRGV on Nov. 7 before an energetic crowd of 7,635 fans at Bramlage Coliseum, as six Wildcats scored in double figures en route to helping the team post their most points in an opener since 2014.
- ► Fifth-year senior Markquis Nowell and junior Nae'Qwan Tomlin each had 14 points to lead the Wildcats (1-0), while fifth-year senior Keyontae Johnson scored 13 points in his triumphant return to college basketball after a near 2-year absence from medical emergency on Dec. 12, 2020. He connected on 4-of-8 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, and added 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes of action.
- Another fifth year Abayomi "Baybe" lyiola posted 12 points and 5 rebounds off the bench, while senior Desi Sills and junior Ismael (Ish) Massoud each added 10 points. It marked the first time since a victory over Colorado State on Dec. 17, 2016, that six Wildcats scored in double figures.
- ▶ The 93 points were the most by a K-State team in an opener since scoring 98 against Southern Utah on Nov. 14, 2014, while they are fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons.
- ► K-State was electric on both ends of the court to start the game, jumping out to a 15-3 lead behind 3-pointers from Nowell, Massoud and Johnson. The lead ballooned to as many as 30, as the Wildcats capped off their 52-point opening half with a 3-pointer from senior **Tykei Greene**. The team hit on 51.5 percent (17-of-33) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from beyond the arc.
- ► The lead grew to as many as 36 in the second half after Johnson knocked down a pair of free throws with just over 5 minutes to play.
- ► For the game, K-State hit on 45.5 percent (30-of-66), including 44.4 percent (12-of-27) from 3-point range, and made 72 percent (21-of-29) of its free throws. The Wildcats had assists on 25 of their 30 made baskets. On defense, the team held UTRGV (0-1) to 39.2 percent (20-of-51) shooting, including 29.2 percent (7-of-24) in the first half. The Wildcats scored 31 points off 26 turnovers.
- ▶ With the win, K-State moved to 93-26 all-time in season openers dating back to 1903, including a 29-3 mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

- ► Senior Markquis Nowell's 4-point play with just over 5 minutes helped ignite an 8-0 run that lifted K-State to a 63-54 win over California on Nov. 11 before 3.607 fans at Haas Pavilion.
- Nowell hit a 3-pointer from the corner right in front of the Wildcat bench before being knocked to the ground. He calmly hit the free throw that gave K-State a 51-46 lead with 5:07 to play. Nowell, who finished with 13 points to go along with a game-high 7 assists and 3 steals, followed his 4-point with a layup then had the steal and assist on the dunk by junior Nae'Qwan Tomlin that capped the 8-0 run and gave K-State a 55-46 lead with 4:02 to play.
- ► The Golden Bears closed to within 55-50 after a 3-pointer from **Devin Askew** and a free throw by **Joel Brown**, but the Wildcats responded with 6 in a
 row, including a pair of free throws from sophomore **Cam Carter** to go along
 with a layup by senior **Keyontae Johnson** and a dunk by senior **Tykei Greene**,
 that pushed the lead back to double figures with just over a minute to play.
- Nowell's clutch shot came with the momentum clearly on the side of the Golden Bears, who had used separate runs of 13-0 and 11-0 run to erase a 20-point deficit and cut the lead to 47-46 with 5:37 to play.
- ▶ In addition to Nowell's spectacular night, Johnson had a near double-double with a team-high 16 points on 6-of-13 field goals to go with a game-high 9 rebounds and 2 steals in a team-high 33 minutes. He was joined in double figures by Tomlin, who added 11 points to go with 2 rebounds and 2 blocks.
- ► For the game, K-State connected on 36.8 percent (21-of-57), including 26.3 percent (5-of-19) from 3-point range, and hit on a season-high 88.9 percent (16-of-18) from the free throw line. They made just 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from the field in the second half, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from beyond the arc.
- ► K-State's Iull in the second half overshadowed a sensational start, in which, the Wildcats built as much as 17-point lead in the first half behind swarming defense (15 forced turnovers) and efficient offense. The lead grew to 20 points (42-22) in the early moments of the second half.
- ► Cal, which is coached by former K-State assistant **Mark Fox**, was led by a game-high 17 points by the Texas transfer **Devin Askew**.

- ► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** continued his impressive play to start the year, as he led three Wildcats in double figures with 19 points in helping K-State to a 69-53 win over Kansas City on Nov. 17 before 7,376 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ The win gave K-State its first 3-0 start to a season since 2019-20.
- ▶ Johnson, who scored in double figures for the third consecutive game, had a stellar all-around night, adding a team-tying 7 rebounds, a career-tying 6 assists and 2 steals to his 19-point effort in 35 minutes. He was joined in double figures by sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with a career-high 16 points on 5-of-10 field goals, including 4 treys, and senior **Desi Sills**, who added 11 points.
- ► The Wildcats once again used their defense to generate offense, forcing the Roos (1-4) into 22 turnovers and converting those into 26 points. The team has forced 20 or more turnovers in each of the first 3 games, totaling 76 points off those miscues, an average of 25.3 points per game.
- ► K-State took control of the game in the first half on eight straight points from Johnson, which was capped by the game's first 3-pointer with 15:21 to play. From there, Carter took control of the the game, hitting his first 3-pointer with 11:23 to play. He followed 3 more treys, as his fourth of the first half gave the Wildcats a 34-20 advantage with 2:24 remaining. Johnson and Carter combined for 25 of the team's 41 first-half points.
- ► For the second straight game, K-State built a 20-point advantage in the early moments of the second half only to see its opponent chip away at the deficit. Behind the play of senior **Shemarri Allen**, who finished with a game-high 21 points, Kansas City closed to within 57-47 with just under 7 minutes to play.
- ► However, it was another veteran who stepped up for the Wildcats when they most needed it. Just like senior **Markquis Nowell** who came through in the clutch with his 4-point play in the win at Cal on Nov. 11, it was the veteran Sills who did it against Kansas City, as he scored the next 6 points and finished with 10 of the team's last 12 points to push the lead back up to 18 points.
- ► For the game, K-State connected on 41.4 percent (24-of-58), including 35 percent (7-of-20) from 3-point range, and hit on 82.4 percent (14-of-17) from the free throw line. The team struggled offensively in the second half, hitting on 35.5 percent (11-of-31) from the field and missing all four 3-point attempts.

04 vs. RHODE ISLAND

- ► K-State again used a huge first-half performance to carry itself to victory, as the Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 77-57 win over Rhode Island on Nov. 21 before 1,256 fans at The John Gray Gym.
- ► The Wildcats scored 44 points in the first half on a blistering 58.1 percent (18-of-31) shooting to build as much as a 21-point lead. On the defensive end, they held the Rams (1-3) to 31.3 percent (10-of-32) shooting, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from 3-point range.
- ▶ Although the second half was plagued by sloppy play with a combined 23 turnovers, including 13 by K-State, the lead never dipped below 15 points, and grew to many as 24 in the waning minutes.
- ▶ Junior Nae'Qwan Tomlin led a balanced attack with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, while senior Keyontae Johnson and junior David N'Guessan added 14 and 12 points, respectively. Johnson has now scored in double figures in all 4 agmas as a Wildcat, while N'Guessan and Tomlin each recorded new season-highs. Tomlin also added 5 blocked shots, which were the most by a Wildcat since Jordan Henriquez-Roberts in 2013.
- ► K-State had 20 assists on 28 field goals, including a stellar performance from senior **Markquis Nowell**, who was responsible for 12 of those assists to go along with 9 points and 5 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 12 assists tied for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and were the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma 5 that on Feb. 25, 1989. The total was one assist shy of Nowell's career-high of 13 that he accomplished twice while playing at Little Rock.
- ▶ Nowell now has totaled 9 career games of at least 10 assists, including 4 at K-State. The 12 assists gave him 499 in his career, as he closes on the distinction of being one of just two active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1.300 points. 500 assists and 200 steals.
- ► For the game, K-State connected on a season-high 52.8 percent (28-of-53), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from 3-point range, and hit on 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw line. More than half (38) of the team's 77 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats again took advantage of their opponent's turnovers, turning 16 Ram miscues into 21 points.

- ► Seniors Markquis Nowell and Keyontae Johnson combined for 57 points, including 14 of the team's 16 points in overtime, to help lift K-State to the Championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22 before 1,200 fans at The John Gray Gym.
- ▶ After the Wildcats surrendered a 9-point lead with less than 4 minutes to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds left in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force the overtime period with 3.5 seconds remaining. The momentum carried the team in the extra period, as they dominated the game by connecting on 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the field and making 6 of their 10 free throws.
- ▶ Junior **David N'Guessan** gave K-State the lead for good in overtime with a driving layup with 3:48 to play, which was followed by a jumper and free throw by Johnson for an 87-82 lead. After the Wolf Pack closed to within a possession on 2 free throws by **Kenan Blackshear**, Nowell caught fire offensively, hitting on a 3-point play and a jumper to push the lead to 92-84 with 1:24 remaining.
- ▶ The 57 combined points by Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) were the most by Wildcat teammates since **Dean Wade** (34) and **Kamau Stokes** (23) also combined for 57 points in win at lowa State on Dec. 29, 2017. It marked just the 15th time in school history that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.
- ▶ Nowell finished with 29 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 free throws and 11 assists in 41 minutes to become just the fifth Wildcat with a 20-point/10-assist game in school history and just the second with a 25-point/10-assist game following **Steve Henson** in 1989.
- ▶ Johnson set a career-high with 28 points on 8-of-13 field goals and 10-of-11 free throws to earn his ninth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.
- ► K-State connected on a season-high 55 percent (33-of-60), including 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range, and hit on 78.6 percent (22-of-28) from the free throw line. Nearly half (44) of the team's 96 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats out-rebounded the Wolf Pack, 36-22, including 13 offensive boards that they converted into a season-high 16 second-chance points.

- ► Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** jumper with 4.7 seconds helped lift K-State to a 61-59 win over LSU to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic Championship on Nov. 23 before 2,400 fans at The John Gray Gym.
- ► The in-season tournament title was the 17th in school history and the first since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam.
- ▶ Johnson (16 points) and fellow seniors Markquis Nowell (18) and Desi Sills (16) combined for 50 of the 61 points, including 22 of their 28 second-half points, in which, the team rallied from an 11-point deficit with 17:27 to play.
- Nowell was selected as the Cayman Islands Classic Tournament MVP, while Johnson was selected to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game.
- ► K-State (6-0) had to survive some nervous moments to earn the victory, as both teams called their full allotment of timeouts (2 each) before the last 4.7 seconds played out. LSU (5-1) was able to dribble up the court and seemingly tied the game at 61-all at the buzzer. However, the officials reviewed the play and waved the shot off after they discovered that the clock didn't start on time and the shot came after the game clock had expired.
- ▶ It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who looked like the more rested team after playing in the early sessions in the first 2 days of the tournament and breezing past their first 2 opponents by 16 and 15 points, respectively.
- ► LSU scored 41 points in the first half on 47.1 percent (16-of-34), including 50 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range, with 3 turnovers, to build as much as a 12-point lead right before halftime. Things changed in the second half, as the Tigers managed just 18 points on 36.8 percent (7-of-19) shooting, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from long range, to go with 14 turnovers.
- ▶ Nowell scored his game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists in 33 minutes. Johnson, who played just 13 minutes in the second half due to foul trouble, scored his 16 points on 4-of-7 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Sills, who provided a spark off the bench, scored his season-high 16 points off 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, to go with game-high 5 assists in 33 minutes.

- ► K-State could not quite dig itself out of a first-half deficit, as a hot-shooting Butler hit on nearly 55 percent from the field in a 76-64 win on Nov. 30 in the fourth annual BIG EAST/Big 12 Battle at historic Hinkle Fieldhouse.
- ▶ Butler (5-3), which came into the game averaging 90 points per game on 60.1 percent shooting in 3 home games this season, stayed hot from the field in handing K-State (6-1) its first loss under first-year head coach Jerome Tang.
- ▶ The Bulldogs connected on an opponent-high 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) in the second half, while all 5 starters scored in double figures led by Manny Bates' 22 points.
- ▶ Despite the impressive offensive performance, the Wildcats still had chances to rally from a double-digit deficit twice in the second half. After falling behind by 14 just after halftime, senior Markquis Nowell's first 3-pointer keved a 13-4 run that closed the deficit to 48-43 with just over 14 minutes to play. However, the Bulldogs responded with a 17-2 run that pushed the lead to 20 points.
- ▶ Down 65-45 with 8:29 remaining, senior **Desi Sills** helped spark one more attempt at a comeback for K-State, as the reserve scored 13 of his 17 second-half points in a 15-3 run that cut the deficit to 68-60 with just over 4 minutes to play. However, once again, Butler had a response, rattling off 6 in a row to push the lead back to double figures en route to the 12-point victory.
- ▶ The loss spoiled an impressive night by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who collected his first double-double as a Wildcat, pouring in a team-high 20 points on 9-of-9 shooting to go with a season-high 12 rebounds. It was his 14th career double-double, including his sixth with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds. He became the ninth player in school history to go 9-of-9 or better from the field.
- ▶ Sills came off the bench to provide a big lift in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points after halftime on 8-of-12 shooting. Nowell dished out a game-high 8 assists to go with his 13 points.
- ► For the game, K-State connected on 46 percent (29-of-63), including just 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Wildcats had a season-high 48 points in the paint but posted season-lows in a number of categories, including just 3 free throw attempts while making 2. The team came in averaging 17.3 free throws made per game, which ranked among the top-25 nationally.

Wichita State ___ 50 K-STATE 26 55 29

- ► Senior Markquis Nowell shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state Wichita State on Saturday night before a season-best crowd of 8,957 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ K-State rebounded from its first loss of the season at Butler on Nov. 30 to earn its fourth straight win over its in-state rival in the first meeting between the schools at Bramlage Coliseum since 2003.
- ▶ Although he had an off-shooting night, Nowell had a stellar all-around night for the Wildcats, adding a game-high 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals to his 11 points. He was joined in double figures by fellow senior Keyontae Johnson, who led all scorers with 17 points, and junior Nae'Qwan Tomlin, who kept the team in the game early with 12 of his 14 points coming in the first half.
- ▶ It marked the second year in a row Nowell proved to be difference in a win against Wichita State. Last season, he scored 5 of his team-high 16 points in a late 7-0 run, including a dagger of a 3-pointer with 1:35 to play, that helped the Wildcats to a 65-59 win over the Shockers at INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita.
- ► Nowell's heroics helped spark a late rally by K-State, which trailed for more than 30 minutes and appeared to be heading for a loss until senior Desi Sills made perhaps the biggest play of the night with his block of **Shammah Scott's** breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.
- ▶ Nowell tied the game with a free throw with 1:32 left then forced a steal of senior **Craig Porter, Jr.**, to set up his winning 3-pointer with 54 seconds. After his triple gave the Wildcats a 53-50 lead, he forced another bad pass on the next possession before knocking down 2 free throws for the final margin of victory.
- ► K-State had a season-low offense night across the board, scoring a seasonlow 55 points on 35.8 percent (19-of-53) shooting, including 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Big 12's best free throw shooting team also had an off night from the line, hitting on a season-low 61.9 percent (13-of-21).
- ▶ It was a tale of two halves for Wichita State, which led by as many as 7 points in the first half on 54.5 percent (12-of-22) shooting before scoring just 18 points in the second half on a mere 25.9 percent (7-of-27) shooting. For the game, the Shockers had just 5 assists on its 19 made field goals with 16 turnovers.

- ► A 14-4 run to end the first half helped Kansas State dig itself out of a 14point deficit, as the Wildcats took the lead right before halftime and never looked back in earning an 81-64 win over Abilene Christian on Tuesday before 7,136 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ▶ The Wildcats connected on a season-high 58.5 percent (31-of-53) from the field, including 64 percent (16-of-25) in the second half. They had 23 assists on their 31 made field goals and collected a season-best 52 points in the paint.
- ▶ Despite playing just 7 players for the majority of the game, four Wildcats scored in double figures led by a career night from junior David N'Guessan, who scored a career-best 23 points on perfect 9-of-9 field goals to go along with 5 rebounds, 2 blocks and an assist, N'Guessan eclipsed his previous career-high with 16 first-half points on perfect 6-of-6 shooting while he added 7 more in the second half to collect his first career 20-point game.
- ▶ N'Guessan was joined in double figures by senior Markquis Nowell, who posted his second double-double of the season with 15 points and a seasontying 12 assists to go with 6 rebounds and 3 steals in 39 minutes. It was his 10th career double-double, including his fifth such double-double as a Wildcat. His 12 assists tied his previous season-high of 12 vs. Rhode Island on Nov. 21 with both tying for the fourth-most in school history.
- ► Senior Kevontae Johnson and junior Nae'Owan Tomlin each added 12 points and a combined 15 rebounds.
- ▶ The other purple Wildcats (5-5) made things difficult for the host, running out to a 14-point lead (28-14) behind an impressive shooting performance, as they made 11 of their first 19 field goal attempts, including 6 of 9 from 3-point range. Behind the performance of N'Guessan, K-State slowly chipped away at the deficit, using a 14-2 run to close to within 30-28 with 4:45 to play before using a 7-1 spurt to end the half to take a 35-34 advantage into the locker room. N'Guessan scored 10 of the Wildcats' 21 points during this stretch.
- K-State continued its momentum in the second half, using a 17-7 run out of halftime to build a double-digit lead that it would maintain the rest of the game. ACU got to within 11 points twice in the last 4 minutes, including 73-62 with 2:21 remaining, but could get no closer, as K-State scored 8 of the last 10 points for the 17-point win.

- ► K-State opened the second half with 23 consecutive points to blow open an already lopsided game, as the Wildcats capped an impressive offensive effort with a 98-50 win over UIW on Sunday before 7,042 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State collected its third 90-point scoring effort, narrowly missing the school's first 100-point game since 2010 in the last few minutes before opting to dribble out the ball in the closing seconds against an undermanned UIW. The Wildcats hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) from the field, including 68.8 percent (22-of-32) after halftime, and saw 7 players in double figures.
- ► The 9-1 start is best start by the Wildcats since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 mark, while head coach **Jerome Tang** is off to the best 10-game start by a first-year coach in school history.
- ► The 48-point margin of victory was the 10th-largest in school history.
- ► K-State busted open a close contest with a 20-1 run midway through the first half before landing the knockout punch with a 23-0 start to the second half. Six Wildcats contributed in the first-half run, including 5 points each from senior Markquis Nowell and freshman Dorian Finister. The second-half run was much the same with seven players registering points, including 3-pointers from senior Keyontae Johnson and juniors Ish Massoud and Nae'Qwan Tomlin.
- ▶ Johnson led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with 5 assists, 4 rebounds and 3 steals in a season-low 24 minutes of action. The Wildcats' leading scorer (17.3 ppg.) has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Tomlin had a near double-double with 15 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in 23 minutes, while junior reserve Desi Sills added 14 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 steals.
- ▶ Sophomore **Cam Carter**, Finister and Nowell each added 10 points, as Nowell nearly notched another double-double with a game-high 8 assists to go with 5 rebounds. Finister saw his most action of the season in 22 minutes, recording his first career double-digit scoring game to go with 7 rebounds and 4 assists.
- ▶ UIW, which has 9 true or redshirt freshmen among its 16-man roster, hit on 38 percent (19-of-50) from the field, including 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range, and made 5 of 8 attempts from the free throw line. Freshman **Trey Miller** led with 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range.
