OPENING TIP

► Kansas State (11-1) will conclude the 2022 portion of its schedule by hosting No. 24/24 West Virginia (10-2) in the Big 12 opener at 6 p.m., CT on New Year's Eve at Bramlage Coliseum. The Wildcats, who are on a 5-game winning streak, will face their first ranked opponent of the season against a Mountaineer squad, which has won 4 in a row. K-State is 54-55 in conference openers, including 11-15 in the Big 12 era, while 6-10 vs. ranked conference foes in openers.

KEY STORYLINES

► K-State is off its best start (11-1) since opening the 2016-17 season with having recorded its best non-conference record since going 11-1 in 2011-12. The Wildcats have already surpassed their non-conference win total from each of the last 3 seasons, while the win over Radford on Dec. 21 gave them 11 victories in non-conference play for the first time since 2017-18. The 11 non-conference wins are only eclipsed by the 13 in 2009-10 and 12 in 2008-09 and 2010-11.

► K-State's 11-1 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the best by a first-year coach in school history, surpassing the previous starts of 10-2 by College Football Hall of Famer **Zora G. Clevenger** (1916-17) and **Bruce Weber** (2012-13). Tang's 11-1 start ranks among the very best by all current first-year head coaches in Division I, rivaling 12-1 starts by Missouri's **Dennis Gates** and LSU's **Matt McMahon** and an 11-2 start by Mississippi State's **Chris Jans**.

► K-State has won 5 consecutive games since absorbing its first loss of the **Jerome Tang** era against Butler on Nov. 30 with victories over Wichita State (55-50), ACU (81-64), UIW (98-50), Nebraska (71-56) and Radford (73-65). The Wildcats have been impressive on the defensive end in that 5-game winning streak, allowing 57 points on 39 percent (105-of-269) shooting.

► Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** earned Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Week honors on Tuesday after his recording his first career 20-point game with a season-high 26 vs. Radford. Among his 11 field goals were 4 dunks, a 3-pointer and all 3 free throws attempted. He also tied a season-high with 9 rebounds to go with 2 blocks, 1 assist and 1 steal in 33 minutes. He has now scored in double figures in 5 consecutive games, where he is averaging 16.4 points per game.

► Tomlin (11.7 ppg.) gives the Wildcats a dynamic 1-2-3 scoring punch, as he, along with seniors **Keyontae Johnson** (17.7 ppg.) and **Markquis Nowell** (13.7 ppg.) combine to average 43.1 points per game on 47.8 percent (177-of-370) shooting. They are the third-best scoring trio in the Big 12 after Kansas' **Jalen Wilson**, **Grady Dick** and **Kevin McCullar** (48.4 ppg.) and Baylor's **Adam Flagler**, **Keyonte George** and **L.J. Cryer** (46.6 ppg.) and just ahead of the Texas Tech's **Kevin Obanor**, **Daniel Batcho** and **De'Vion Harmon** (42.1 ppg.).

► Nowell continues to be one of the leaders nationally in assists. His 8.3 assists per game rank second nationally, while his 100 total assists place third. He is also 20th in assist/turnover ratio (3.12) with 100 assists to 32 turnovers. He is one of 2 active Division I player with at least 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals, while his 216 career steals are first among active players.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: WEST VIRGINIA (10-2)

► West Virginia (10-2) enters Saturday's game on a 4-game winning streak after ending its December non-conference slate with a 75-64 win over Stony Brook. The Mountaineers have lost just 2 games all season, including to current No. 1 Purdue (80-68) at a neutral site and at No. 22 Xavier (84-74).



► WVU is averaging 81.3 points on 49.2 percent shooting, including 38.3 percent from 3-point range, with 34.5 rebounds, 15.1 assists, 7.7 steals and 2.6 blocks per game, while allowing 66.3 points on 42.3 percent shooting, including 32.5 percent from 3-point range. The Mountaineers are connecting on 73.9 percent from the free throw line.

► The Mountaineers rank among the top-40 nationally in 10 categories, including 30th in scoring offense, 25th in scoring margin (+15.1), 28th in field goal percentage and 33rd in 3-point field goal percentage.

► Four players are averaging in double figures led by graduate transfer **Erik Stevenson**, who is averaging 14.5 points on 52.5 percent shooting, including 46.6 percent from 3-point range. He is joined in double figures by fellow transfers **Tre Mitchell** (12.8 ppg.), **Emmitt Matthew, Jr.** (10.8 ppg.) and **Joe Toussaint** (10.8 ppg.). Senior **Jimmy Bell, Jr.** leads the way with 6.1 rebounds per game, while fellow senior **Kedrian Johnson** paces the squad in both assists (3.3 apg.) and steals (1.9 spg.).

► Head coach **Bob Huggins** is in his 16th season at his alma mater with a 336-190 record, which includes 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and a trip to the 2010 Final Four. Inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame in 2022, he has a 926-401 record in his 41st season as a head coach, which ranks third on the all-time coaching list, just behind **Mike Krzyzewski** and **Jim Boeheim**.

► Among Huggins' 5 head-coaching stops is a one-year stint at K-State from 2006-07, where he led the Wildcats to their first 20-win season since 1998-99, their highest win total (23) since 1987-88 and a trip to the NIT.

SERIES HISTORY

► West Virginia leads the all-time series, 15-9, which includes a 14-8 mark in the Big 12 era. The Mountaineers are 4-6 in games played in Manhattan with their last win coming on Jan. 23, 2021 by a score of 69-47.

► Last season, the teams met 3 times with each winning on their home court, including 71-68 by WVU on Jan. 8, 2022 and 78-73 by K-State on Feb. 14, 2022, before the Mountaineers won the rubber match, 73-67, in the first round of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship on March 9, 2022.

LAST MEETING:

WEST VIRGINIA 73, K-STATE 67

► Senior **Taz Sherman's** 3-pointer with 4:44 to play ignited an 8-0 run that carried No. 9 seed West Virginia to a 73-67 win over No. 8 seed K-State in the opening game of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship on March 9.

► Three Wildcats - **Nijel Pack** (18), **Mark Smith** (17) and **Ish Massoud** (13) - were responsible for 48 of the team's 67 points.

LAST TIME OUT:

K-STATE 73, RADFORD 65

► Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 26 points, as K-State concluded its December non-conference slate with a 73-65 win over Radford on Dec. 21 before 6,939 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State (11-1) headed into its 10-game holiday break with a 5-game winning streak, as the Wildcats continued their best start to a season since 2016-17. The 11 non-conference wins are the most since 2017-18 and tied six other teams for the third-most in a single season since 2006-07.

► Tomlin, who has now scored in double figures in 5 consecutive games, earned his first 20-point game as a Wildcat by connecting on 11-of-18 field goals, which included 4 dunks, to go with a 3-pointer and all 3 free throws attempted. He also tied a season-high with 9 rebounds to go with 2 blocks, 1 assist and 1 steal.

► Tomlin was joined in double figures by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who shook off a poor shooting night to post 16 points on 6-of-15 shooting, as well as seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Desi Sills**, who each added 10 points. The team has now had at least four double-digit scorers in each of the last four games.

► On the strength of Tomlin's play, K-State took control of the game with a 9-0 run late in the first half then held a double-digit lead for much of the second half before a scrappy Radford (6-7) created some anxious moments for the home team. The Highlanders used a 13-2 run to cut the deficit to 71-65 with less than a minute to play. However, the Wildcats were able to hold off any further rally with a big steal from Sills on a tie-up and a pair of free throws from Johnson.

► In addition to his scoring, Nowell also dished out a game-high 11 assists to record his 11th career double-double, including his sixth at K-State, and his third of the season. His 6 career double-doubles as a Wildcat extended his school record. He reached 100 assists in 12 games, which is the fastest in school history.

► Johnson also reached a milestone, as the first of his two free throws with 20 seconds remaining gave him 1,000 points for his career. He has now scored in double figures in all 12 games this season.

► For the game, K-State connected on 49.2 percent (29-of-59) from the field, including 57.1 percent (24-of-42) from inside the 3-point arc, and hit on 66.7 percent (10-of-15) from the free throw line. The team also tallied 46 points in the paint, which marked the third time in 4 games that they have posted 40 or more points in the paint.

► Six of Radford's 7 losses have now come by 10 points or less, including 79-69 at Marquette on Nov. 7 and 79-76 at Notre Dame on Nov. 10. The Highlanders shot 40.7 percent (24-of-59) from the field, including 35 percent (7-of-20) from 3-point range, and made 55.6 percent (10-of-18) from the free throw line.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

► With the win over Radford, K-State is now 128-14 in home venues in non-conference play since 2006-07, including 118-12 at Bramlage Coliseum... The Wildcats are now 7-0 in home games this season.

► The Wildcats hit on 57.1 percent (24-of-42) from inside the 3-point arc.

► K-State held the advantage on the glass, 41-27, including a season-tying 28 defensive rebounds... The 41 total rebounds are the most this season... Of its 13 offensive rebounds, the Wildcats scored 9 second-chance points.

► K-State had an assist on 20 of its 29 made field goals, including 4 players with 2 or more assists... The team now has 221 assists on 327 made field goals.

► K-State moved to 8-0 this season when leading at the half.

■ TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

'CATS WINS CAYMAN ISLANDS CLASSIC

► K-State won its 17th in-season tournament title, as the Wildcats knocked off Rhode Island (77-57), Nevada (96-87 in overtime) and LSU (61-59) to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic on Nov. 21-23. It was the team's first tournament title since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands. The 3 wins gave K-State its first 6-0 start since the 2018-19 season.



► Senior **Markquis Nowell** was selected the Cayman Islands Classic MVP and to the all-tournament team, while fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson** was named to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the 3-game tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game. For his efforts, Nowell was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28.

► After breezing past Rhode Island, 77-57, in the first round, K-State had to fight through tight contests with Nevada in the semifinals and LSU in the finals to earn the title. After surrendering a 9-point lead to the Wolf Pack with 4:08 to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds remaining in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force overtime with 3.5 seconds. The Wildcats were able to carry the momentum in the extra period, as they hit on 5 of 6 from the field and 6 of 10 free throw line to win 96-87.

► The Wildcats then overcame an 11-point second-half deficit to the Tigers in the title game, using their defense to allow 18 points after halftime on 36.8 percent shooting while forcing 14 turnovers en route to a 61-59 victory. Nowell led all scorers with 18 points.

TANG DEBUTS AS HEAD COACH

▶ First-year coach **Jerome Tang** enjoyed a successful debut, as the Wildcats earned a 93-59 win against UTRGV on Nov. 7 to help Tang earn his first victory as the 24th head coach and the first full-time black head coach in school history. He is the sixth minority men's head coach in K-State Athletics history, including the third in men's basketball following interim head coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85) and former full-time head coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12).

▶ K-State's 11-1 start under head coach **Jerome Tang** is the best by a first-year coach in school history with **Zora G. Clevenger** (1916-17) and **Bruce Weber** (2012-13) each starting their tenures at 10-2. Tang's start is among the best by all first-year head coaches in Division I, trailing just the 12-1 starts by Missouri's **Dennis Gates** and LSU's **Matt McMahon**.

▶ This is not Tang's first time being a head coach, as he served as athletics director and head coach at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas from 1993-2003, leading the school to 5 TAPPS Division A State Championships.

▶ In addition, Tang twice served as interim head coach in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Baylor, leading the Bears to 4-0 record. He helped Baylor to wins over Texas (86-79 in OT) and at Texas Tech (82-48) during the 2012-13 season, while he guided the squad to wins over Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52) to open the 2020-21 season. Tang is only credited with the wins in 2013, moving his overall college head coaching record to 13-1.

A TEAM OF WINNERS

▶ Head coach **Jerome Tang** has remarked on a number of occasions that he recruited a team 'full of winners' as exemplified by the number of championships that the collective group has won in their careers.

▶ There are a combined 8 state championships among the 15 players on the roster, including 2 each won by seniors **Desi Sills** and **Abayomi Iyiola** and true freshmen **Taj Manning**. In addition, sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and true freshman **Dorian Finister** also won state titles during their senior seasons.

▶ In addition to the high school success, a number of players have been a part of winning college programs, including Sills and Iyiola being members of Arkansas' Elite Eight team in 2021 and senior **Keyontae Johnson** (Florida) and junior **David N'Guessan** (Virginia Tech) being a part of 2 NCAA Tournaments.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

▶ K-State's overtime 96-87 win over Nevada in the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.

▶ The Wildcats have a 1,706-1,214 (.586) all-time record as a program, which includes 31 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

▶ K-State has posted a 170-53 (.762) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 128-14 (.901) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 118-12 (.908) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.

▶ The Nebraska win on Dec. 17 also gave K-State double-digit non-conference victories for the first time since going 10-3 in 2018-19. The Wildcats collected their 11th non-conference victory vs. Radford on Dec. 21, giving them their most since also winning 11 in 2017-18. The team earned 10 or more non-conference wins in 12 of 13 seasons from 2006-07 to 2018-19, but they had managed just a 19-16 record in non-conference action from 2019-22.

▶ K-State's current 11-1 non-conference mark is the best since opening the 2016-17 season with a similar 11-1 record. The Wildcats won a program-best 13 non-conference games in 2009-10, while they won 12 in 2008-09 and 2010-11.

POTENT OFFENSIVE ATTACK

▶ K-State is averaging 75.1 points this season on 47 percent (327-of-696) shooting, including 34.2 percent (81-of-237) from 3-point range, while hitting on 71.6 percent (166-of-232) from the free throw line. The Wildcats rank seventh in the Big 12 in both scoring offense and field goal percentage, while they are second in assists and fifth in free throw percentage.

▶ K-State has scored 80 or more points 4 times, including 3 games of 90 or more points for the first time since 2017-18. The 93 points vs. UTRGV (11/7/22) were the fourth-most in a season opener in the last 25 seasons and the most since scoring 98 vs. Southern Utah to open the 2014-15 season.

▶ The Wildcats also topped the 90-point barrier in a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada (11/22/22) at the Cayman Islands Classic, which included two players (**Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson**) scoring 25 or more points in the same game since 2010. The squad fell just 2 points short of their first 100-point game since 2010-11, totaling 98 points vs. UIW (12/11/22) behind a school-record first seven double-digit scorers.

▶ K-State has connected on better than 50 percent of its field goals in 4 games, including back-to-back vs. Rhode Island (11/21/22) and Nevada (11/22/22) and ACU (12/6/22) and UIW (12/11/22). The team hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) vs. UIW, including 67.5 percent (27-of-40) inside the 3-point line.

▶ A key to the K-State offense this season has been its ability to score in paint, as the Wildcats are averaging 37.3 points in the paint. The team has scored 30 or more points in the paint 9 times in 12 games, including 4 games of 40 or more points and one game of 50 points (a season-high 52 vs. ACU (12/6/22).

DISHING THE ROCK

▶ K-State ranks among the best in the country in sharing the basketball, as the Wildcats rank 12th nationally and second in the Big 12 with 18.4 assists per game. Among the 221 assists are 6 players with double-digit totals, including senior **Markquis Nowell**, who ranks third nationally with 100 total assists. He is second nationally in assists/game at 8.3 per game.

▶ The Wildcats also rank in the top-5 nationally with a 67.6 assist percentage according to *KenPom*, which calculates the number of assists (221) to made field goals (327). Only Tennessee (69.2), Lafayette (68.8) and Xavier (68.6) have a better percentage nationally.

▶ Although Nowell gets all the attention for his playmaking ability, the rest of the team has shown the ability to share the ball, as the Wildcats have had 3 or more players dish out at least 2 assists in 8 of 12 games this season. The team had 7 players with 2 or more assists in the opener vs. UTRGV (11/7/22), while 6 did it against Nebraska (12/17/22) and 5 vs. UIW (12/11/22).

TEAM FULL OF SCORERS

► K-State is one of just 3 schools to have at least four 1,000-point scorers on its roster, as Wildcats **Tykei Greene** (1,157 points), **Keyontae Johnson** (1,001 points), **Markquis Nowell** (1,472 points) and **Desi Sills** (1,218 points) have all reached the milestone in their Division I careers. Only Johnson, who did it against Radford (12/21/22), and Nowell have reached the mark while at K-State.

► K-State has now six 1,000-point scorers if you count senior walk-on **Nate Awbrey**, who scored 1,032 points in his 4-year career at Manhattan Christian College, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at Monroe (2019-20) and Chipola Colleges (2020-22).

► UAB has five 1,000-point scorers followed by K-State and Notre Dame (4), while 10 others have 3 such scorers, including Drake, Gonzaga, Indiana, Iowa State, Ohio State, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Southern Utah, Texas and Virginia.

BENCH PRODUCTION

► K-State is getting solid production from its bench through the first 12 games, as the Wildcats are averaging 18 points per game.

► Senior **Desi Sills** has been particularly impactful from the bench, scoring in double figures 6 times in 12 games, including 16 points in the win over LSU (11/23/22) at the Cayman Islands Classic Championship game and a season-high 17 points (all in second half) in the loss at Butler (11/30/22). He has also been among the team's best playmakers, ranking second with 33 assists.

DEFENSE PERFORMING WELL

► In a league known for its defensive prowess, K-State has started the season off well, allowing 60.8 points per game on 41.5 percent (261-of-629) shooting, including 31.2 percent (67-of-215) from 3-point range. The Wildcats rank 26th nationally, including third in the Big 12, in scoring defense, while they place in the top-50 in turnovers forced (33rd/16.92) and turnover margin (45th/+3.3).

► K-State has held 8 of 12 opponents to less than 60 points, including each of its first 4 games for the first time since 2019-20.

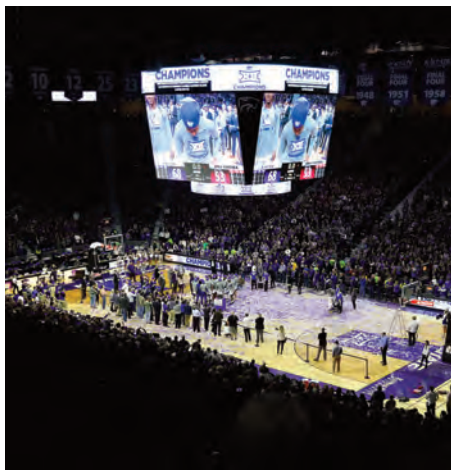
FORCING TURNOVERS

► K-State's defense has forced 203 turnovers through the first 12 games, which includes 95 steals, while averaging 19.5 points per game off those miscues. The team ranks 10th in non-steal turnover percentage (13.0) by *KenPom*.

► The 16.9 turnovers forced per game ranks 33rd nationally, while it places fifth in the Big 12 behind Iowa State, Texas, TCU and Texas Tech. K-State ranks seventh in turnover margin (+3.33) and steals (7.92), while senior **Markquis Nowell** places fifth (2.00 spg.) in the Big 12 in steals per game.

► K-State has scored 20 or more points off turnovers 5 times in 12 games with a season-high 31 points off 26 UTRGV (11/7/22) turnovers in the opener. The Wildcats scored 20+ points off miscues in back-to-back games vs. Kansas City (11/17/22; 26 points) and Rhode Island (11/21/22; 21 points) as well as vs. Abilene Christian (12/6/22; 23 points) and UIW (12/11/22; 28 points).

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 408-144 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 408 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State has registered a 208-64 (.759) record at home over the past 17 seasons, including an 87-52 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 208 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 87 league victories at home are among the top in the Big 12. In all, the program has double-digit victories in 26 of its 33 seasons in the arena.

► K-State has a 269-86 (.754) record at home, including a 160-17 (.901) mark in non-conference action, since the 2001-02 season for an average of just over 13 home wins (13.1) per season in that span.

► K-State has defeated 41 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 38 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,000 for the 2022-23 season.

PLAYER NOTES

JOHNSON MAKES RETURN TO COURT

► Junior **Keyontae Johnson** made his triumphant return to basketball court on Nov. 7 in the opener with UTRGV after a 2-year absence after suffering a medical emergency against Florida State on Dec. 12, 2020. He finished the night with 13 points, 4 assists and 2 rebounds in a team-high 26 minutes.

► Johnson continued his impressive play with a near double-double in the win at Cal, scoring a team-high 16 points while grabbing a game-high 9 rebounds to go with 2 steals, 1 assist and 1 block in a game-high 33 minutes.

► Johnson was named the *March Madness* National Player of the Week and the Phillips 66 Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 14, as he averaged 14.5 points on 47.6 percent (10-of-21) shooting, including 57.1 percent (4-of-7) from 3-point range, to go with 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists in the Wildcats' first 2 wins.

► Johnson helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic and was named to the All-Tournament team, as he averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent (15-of-28) shooting, including 50 percent (4-of-8) from 3-point range, to go with a team-best 6.0 rebounds in 32.3 minutes per game.

► Johnson earned Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors for the second time this season on Dec. 19 after his impressive performance in K-State's win over Nebraska, as he posted game-highs in both points (23) and rebounds (11) to go with his career-tying 4 steals. It was his seventh career double-double with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds, while it was his 11th career 20-point game.

► Johnson has scored in double figures in all 12 games, leading the Wildcats and ranking fifth in the Big 12 in scoring (17.7 ppg.). He places second in field goal percentage (58.0), while he is in the top-10 in 4 other categories, including fifth in minutes (31.7 mpg.), sixth in defensive rebounds (4.67), seventh in rebounding (6.8 rpg.) and eighth in offensive rebounds (2.17).

NOWELL RUNNING THE SHOW

► On a team with 13 new players and a new coaching staff, fifth-year senior **Markquis Nowell** once again has demonstrated he is still the guy running the show for the Wildcats, as he leads the team in both assists (8.3 apg.) and steals (2.0 spg.) while averaging the second-most points (13.7 ppg.).

► Nowell ranks second nationally in assists per game (8.3 apg.) and third in total assists (100), while he is 20th in assists/turnover ratio (3.12). He is one of 2 active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals. He also ranks first among all active Division I players with 216 career steals. He is nearing 1,500 career points, just 28 points away.

► Nowell was recognized for his MVP performance in helping the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic, as he was selected as the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Nov. 28. He averaged 18.7 points, 9.0 assists and 3.7 rebounds in 33.6 minutes per game. It was his first weekly honor in the Big 12 and his fourth overall after winning it 3 times in the Sun Belt.

► In the wins vs. Rhode Island and Nevada, Nowell became the first Wildcat to record double-digit assists in consecutive games, while he became the second player in school history and the first since 1989 to post a 25-point/10-assist game with his 29-point, 11-assist effort in the 96-87 overtime win over the Wolf Pack. His 12 assists vs. the Rams tied for the fourth-most in school history and the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 vs. OSU on Feb. 25, 1989.

► Nowell was part of the first Wildcat duo since 2010 to each collect at least 25 points in a game, as he and fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 57 points in the win over Nevada. He capped the tournament with a game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 shooting in the title game win over LSU, as he helped the Wildcats rally from an 11-point second-half deficit.

► Nowell shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state rival Wichita State for the second straight year. He had a strong all-around night, finishing with 11 points, 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals.

► Nowell matched his season-high (12) in assists in the win over ACU, while he earned his 11th career double-double, including his sixth as a Wildcat, with 10 points and 11 assists vs. Radford. It was his fourth double-digit assist game.

AN INSTANT IMPACT

► Junior transfer **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** has given K-State another scoring threat in the post, as the junior college All-American ranks third on the team in scoring (11.7 ppg.) while connecting 47.7 percent (53-of-111) from the field to go with 6.1 rebounds and 1.2 blocks in 27.8 minutes per game. He ranks 20th in the Big 12 in scoring, 10th in rebounding and fourth in blocked shots.

► Tomlin was selected as the Big 12 co-Newcomer of the Week on Tuesday after his near double-double performance in the win over Radford on Dec. 21. He led four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 26 points, as he hit on 11-of-18 field goals, which included 4 dunks, a 3-pointer and all 3 free throws attempted, to go with a season-tying 9 rebounds in 33 minutes.

► Tomlin's performance vs. Radford highlighted an impressive stretch, as he has scored in double figures in each of the last 5 games, which includes 14 points vs. Wichita State (12/3/22), 12 points vs. ACU (12/6/22) and 15 points vs. UIW (12/11/22) and Nebraska (12/17/22). He is averaging 16.4 points on 58.9 percent (33-of-56) shooting during this 5-game stretch.

► Tomlin scored more than 1,000 points in his junior college career at both Monroe College (2019-20) and Chipola College (2020-21) while connecting on 54.2 percent from the field. He averaged a team-leading 13.8 points on 52.4 percent shooting with 5.9 rebounds during his All-American season at Chipola, as he guided the school to the semifinals of the NJCAA National Tournament.

SILLS OFF THE BENCH

► Senior **Desi Silks** has provided a spark for the Wildcats off the bench, as he is averaging 9.0 points on 45.7 percent (42-of-92) shooting with 3.2 rebounds and 2.8 assists in 27.4 minutes per game. He has scored in double figures in 6 of 12 games, including a season-high 17 points in the loss at Butler (11/30/22). He has at least 3 assists in 8 games, including a season-best 5 on two occasions.

► Silks scored in double figures in 2 of the first 3 games, including 10 in his first game as a Wildcat vs. UTRGV (11/7/22). He scored 16 points vs. LSU (11/23/22) in the championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic, hitting on 6-of-9 field goals, before his season-high 17 at Butler, which all came in the second half. He has 8 or more points in 3 of the last 4 games, including 14 vs. UIW (12/11/22).

► Although Silks went scoreless in the win over Wichita State (12/6/22), he had the play of the game with his block of **Shammah Scott's** breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.

Jerome Tang, one of the chief architects in helping build Baylor into a national powerhouse in his 19 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach, was selected as the 25th head men's basketball coach at Kansas State on March 21, 2022. He agreed to a 6-year contract through the 2027-28 season.

"I am beyond excited to be the next head basketball coach at K-State," said Tang. "Having the opportunity to build on a program with a rich basketball history at a prestigious university is truly a blessing. We look forward to bringing an exciting style of basketball to K-State while helping our student-athletes succeed on the court and in life. My family and I can't wait to get to Manhattan and form deep relationships with our students, former players, alumni and Wildcat fans everywhere. We look forward to making the Octagon of Doom the best home court advantage in the country!"

Tang has K-State off to an 11-1 record, which is the best start to a season since 2016-17. In addition, he helped the Wildcats win the Cayman Islands Classic with wins over Rhode Island, Nevada and LSU, which was the school's first in-season tournament title since 2017. He is tied for the best start by any first-year Division I head coach with MSU's **Chris Jans** and LSU's **Matt McMahon**.

Tang, 55, was an original member of head coach **Scott Drew's** staff and played an instrumental role in building the Bears program from one rocked by scandal and NCAA probation into one that has developed into one of the nation's top programs highlighted by the 2021 NCAA Championship and consecutive Big 12 regular-season titles in 2021 and 2022. He served his first 14 seasons (2003-17) as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2017.

During his time at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears post a 397-222 (.641) overall record, including a 168-155 (.520) mark in Big 12 play, to go with 13 postseason appearances (10 NCAA Tournaments, 3 NITs), one NCAA title (2021), one NIT title (2013) and one NIT runner-up finish (2009). In the process, he has helped coach 11 All-Americans, including consensus selections **Johnathan Motley** (2017) and **Jared Butler** (2021), a National Defensive Player of the Year in **Davion Mitchell** (2021) and 58 All-Big 12 honorees, including nine on the First Team.

In addition to prowess on the bench, Tang assisted in the construction of nine consensus Top 25 recruiting classes while at Baylor, including 2010 (**Perry Jones III**), 2011 (**Quincy Miller** and **Deuce Bello**), 2012 (**Isaiah Austin**, **Prince and Rico Gathers**), 2013 (**Ishmail Wainwright**, **Al Freeman** and **Johnathan Motley**) and the highest-ranked class in program history at No. 4 in 2021 (**Kendall Brown**, **Langston Love** and **Jeremy Sochan**).

Tang will be the first full-time Black head men's basketball coach and just the sixth minority men's head coach in school history, following baseball coach **Dave Baker** (1978-83), interim basketball coach **Darryl Winston** (1984-85), football coach **Ron Prince** (2006-08), basketball coach **Frank Martin** (2007-12) and current women's tennis coach **Jordan Smith** (2018-present).

The head coaching role will not be new for Tang, who built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy in Cleveland, Texas over a 10-year period (1993-2003) before starting his tenure at Baylor in 2003. He also stepped in on four occasions as the Bears' interim head coach, winning the first two games of the 2012-13 Big 12 schedule at home against Texas, 86-79 in overtime, and on the road at Texas Tech, 82-48, and the first two games of the 2020-21 national title season in Las Vegas against Louisiana (112-82) and Washington (86-52).

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

Additionally, 14 Bears have gone on to play in the NBA, including **Quincy Acy**, **Jared Butler**, **Freddie Gillespie**, **Pierre Jackson**, **Cory Jefferson**, **Perry Jones III**, **Quincy Miller**, **Davion Mitchell**, **Johnathan Motley**, **Royce O'Neale**, **Taurean Prince**, **MaCio Teague**, **Ekpe Udoh** and **Ish Wainwright**.

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games.

Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams, while the 81-13 (.862) record from 2019-22 was the second-best, trailing only Gonzaga (90-6). In that span, the Bears were ranked in the top 5 for 29 consecutive AP Top 25 polls and finished the 2021-22 season with the nation's third-longest active streak of 56-straight weeks ranked.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks. For his efforts, Tang was named the 2022 Division I Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC).

Three Bears earned All-Big 12 honors in 2022, including a First Team selection by senior transfer **James Akinjo**. Senior **Jonathan Tchamwa Tchatchoua** was one of three players to share the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman **Jeremy Sochan** was named the league's Sixth Man Award winner.

Sochan became the fourth Baylor player (and second consecutive) to be a lottery pick when he was selected by the San Antonio Spurs with the No. 9 pick of the 2022 NBA Draft. Teammate **Kendall Brown** followed in the second round with the No. 48 selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection. **Davion Mitchell** and **MaCio Teague** were both Third Team All-Americans, while Mitchell swept every major National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 consecutive wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All five starters were named to All-Big 12 teams, a first in league history.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a 5-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of 4 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (**Paul & Bano Tang**) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, **Careylyen (Rey)** have a son, **Seven**, and a daughter, **Aylyn**. He also has adopted sons (**Lamar** and **Richard Hurd**).

▶ K-State again used a huge first-half performance to carry itself to victory, as the Wildcats advanced to the semifinals of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 77-57 win over Rhode Island on Nov. 21 before 1,256 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The Wildcats scored 44 points in the first half on a blistering 58.1 percent (18-of-31) shooting to build as much as a 21-point lead. On the defensive end, they held the Rams (1-3) to 31.3 percent (10-of-32) shooting, including 12.5 percent (1-of-8) from 3-point range.

▶ Although the second half was plagued by sloppy play with a combined 23 turnovers, including 13 by K-State, the lead never dipped below 15 points, and grew to many as 24 in the waning minutes.

▶ Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led a balanced attack with 15 points, including 13 in the first half, while senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **David N'Guessan** added 14 and 12 points, respectively. Johnson has now scored in double figures in all 4 games as a Wildcat, while N'Guessan and Tomlin each recorded new season-highs. Tomlin also added 5 blocked shots, which were the most by a Wildcat since **Jordan Henriquez-Roberts** in 2013.

▶ K-State had 20 assists on 28 field goals, including a stellar performance from senior **Markquis Nowell**, who was responsible for 12 of those assists to go along with 9 points and 5 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 12 assists tied for the fourth-most in a single game in school history and were the most since **Steve Henson** collected 12 assists against Oklahoma State on Feb. 25, 1989. The total was one assist shy of Nowell's career-high of 13 that he accomplished twice while playing at Little Rock.

▶ Nowell now has totaled 9 career games of at least 10 assists, including 4 at K-State. The 12 assists gave him 499 in his career, as he closes on the distinction of being one of just two active Division I players (Tennessee State's **Junior Clay**) with 1,300 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

▶ For the game, K-State connected on a season-high 52.8 percent (28-of-53), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from 3-point range, and hit on 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw line. More than half (38) of the team's 77 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats again took advantage of their opponent's turnovers, turning 16 Ram miscues into 21 points.

▶ Seniors **Markquis Nowell** and **Keyontae Johnson** combined for 57 points, including 14 of the team's 16 points in overtime, to help lift K-State to the Championship game of the Cayman Islands Classic with a 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22 before 1,200 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ After the Wildcats surrendered a 9-point lead with less than 4 minutes to play to trail 80-78 with 14 seconds left in regulation, Nowell drove the lane and was able to convert on a layup in traffic to force the overtime period with 3.5 seconds remaining. The momentum carried the team in the extra period, as they dominated the game by connecting on 83.3 percent (5-of-6) from the field and making 6 of their 10 free throws.

▶ Junior **David N'Guessan** gave K-State the lead for good in overtime with a driving layup with 3:48 to play, which was followed by a jumper and free throw by Johnson for an 87-82 lead. After the Wolf Pack closed to within a possession on 2 free throws by **Kenan Blackshear**, Nowell caught fire offensively, hitting on a 3-point play and a jumper to push the lead to 92-84 with 1:24 remaining.

▶ The 57 combined points by Nowell (29) and Johnson (28) were the most by Wildcat teammates since **Dean Wade** (34) and **Kamau Stokes** (23) also combined for 57 points in win at Iowa State on Dec. 29, 2017. It marked just the 15th time in school history that two players scored 25 or more points in the same game and the first time since **Jacob Pullen** (28) and **Denis Clemente** (25) did it against Xavier on March 25, 2010.

▶ Nowell finished with 29 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 2-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-9 free throws and 11 assists in 41 minutes to become just the fifth Wildcat with a 20-point/10-assist game in school history and just the second with a 25-point/10-assist game following **Steve Henson** in 1989.

▶ Johnson set a career-high with 28 points on 8-of-13 field goals and 10-of-11 free throws to earn his ninth career 20-point game and his first at K-State.

▶ K-State connected on a season-high 55 percent (33-of-60), including 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from 3-point range, and hit on 78.6 percent (22-of-28) from the free throw line. Nearly half (44) of the team's 96 points came in the paint, while the Wildcats out-rebounded the Wolf Pack, 36-22, including 13 offensive boards that they converted into a season-high 16 second-chance points.

▶ Senior **Keyontae Johnson's** jumper with 4.7 seconds helped lift K-State to a 61-59 win over LSU to capture the 2022 Cayman Islands Classic Championship on Nov. 23 before 2,400 fans at The John Gray Gym.

▶ The in-season tournament title was the 17th in school history and the first since winning the 2018 Paradise Jam.

▶ Johnson (16 points) and fellow seniors **Markquis Nowell** (18) and **Desi Silks** (16) combined for 50 of the 61 points, including 22 of their 28 second-half points, in which, the team rallied from an 11-point deficit with 17:27 to play.

▶ Nowell was selected as the Cayman Islands Classic Tournament MVP, while Johnson was selected to the all-tournament team. Nowell averaged 18.7 points and 9.0 assists in the tournament, while Johnson averaged a team-best 19.3 points on 53.6 percent shooting with 6.0 rebounds per game.

▶ K-State (6-0) had to survive some nervous moments to earn the victory, as both teams called their full allotment of timeouts (2 each) before the last 4.7 seconds played out. LSU (5-1) was able to dribble up the court and seemingly tied the game at 61-all at the buzzer. However, the officials reviewed the play and waved the shot off after they discovered that the clock didn't start on time and the shot came after the game clock had expired.

▶ It was a tale of two halves for the Tigers, who looked like the more rested team after playing in the early sessions in the first 2 days of the tournament and breezing past their first 2 opponents by 16 and 15 points, respectively.

▶ LSU scored 41 points in the first half on 47.1 percent (16-of-34), including 50 percent (5-of-10) from 3-point range, with 3 turnovers, to build as much as a 12-point lead right before halftime. Things changed in the second half, as the Tigers managed just 18 points on 36.8 percent (7-of-19) shooting, including 11.1 percent (1-of-9) from long range, to go with 14 turnovers.

▶ Nowell scored his game-high 18 points on 6-of-14 field goals, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range, and 4-of-4 free throws, to go with 4 assists in 33 minutes. Johnson, who played just 13 minutes in the second half due to foul trouble, scored his 16 points on 4-of-7 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Silks, who provided a spark off the bench, scored his season-high 16 points off 6-of-9 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws, to go with game-high 5 assists in 33 minutes.

- K-State could not quite dig itself out of a first-half deficit, as a hot-shooting Butler hit on nearly 55 percent from the field in a 76-64 win on Nov. 30 in the fourth annual BIG EAST/Big 12 Battle at historic Hinkle Fieldhouse.
- Butler (5-3), which came into the game averaging 90 points per game on 60.1 percent shooting in 3 home games this season, stayed hot from the field in handing K-State (6-1) its first loss under first-year head coach **Jerome Tang**.
- The Bulldogs connected on an opponent-high 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) in the second half, while all 5 starters scored in double figures led by **Manny Bates**' 22 points.
- Despite the impressive offensive performance, the Wildcats still had chances to rally from a double-digit deficit twice in the second half. After falling behind by 14 just after halftime, senior **Markquis Nowell**'s first 3-pointer keyed a 13-4 run that closed the deficit to 48-43 with just over 14 minutes to play. However, the Bulldogs responded with a 17-2 run that pushed the lead to 20 points.
- Down 65-45 with 8:29 remaining, senior **Desi Sills** helped spark one more attempt at a comeback for K-State, as the reserve scored 13 of his 17 second-half points in a 15-3 run that cut the deficit to 68-60 with just over 4 minutes to play. However, once again, Butler had a response, rattling off 6 in a row to push the lead back to double figures en route to the 12-point victory.
- The loss spoiled an impressive night by senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who collected his first double-double as a Wildcat, pouring in a team-high 20 points on 9-of-9 shooting to go with a season-high 12 rebounds. It was his 14th career double-double, including his sixth with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds. He became the ninth player in school history to go 9-of-9 or better from the field.
- Sills came off the bench to provide a big lift in the second half, scoring all 17 of his points after halftime on 8-of-12 shooting. Nowell dished out a game-high 8 assists to go with his 13 points.
- For the game, K-State connected on 46 percent (29-of-63), including just 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Wildcats had a season-high 48 points in the paint but posted season-lows in a number of categories, including just 3 free throw attempts while making 2. The team came in averaging 17.3 free throws made per game, which ranked among the top-25 nationally.

- Senior **Markquis Nowell** shook off a subpar shooting night to score the game's last 6 points, including a pivotal 3-pointer with 54 seconds, to help lift K-State to a 55-50 win over in-state Wichita State on Dec. 3 before a season-best crowd of 8,957 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- K-State rebounded from its first loss of the season at Butler on Nov. 30 to earn its fourth straight win over its in-state rival in the first meeting between the schools at Bramlage Coliseum since 2003.
- Although he had an off-shooting night, Nowell had a stellar all-around night for the Wildcats, adding a game-high 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals to his 11 points. He was joined in double figures by fellow senior **Keyontae Johnson**, who led all scorers with 17 points, and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who kept the team in the game early with 12 of his 14 points coming in the first half.
- It marked the second year in a row Nowell proved to be difference in a win against Wichita State. Last season, he scored 5 of his team-high 16 points in a late 7-0 run, including a dagger of a 3-pointer with 1:35 to play, that helped the Wildcats to a 65-59 win over the Shockers at INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita.
- Nowell's heroics helped spark a late rally by K-State, which trailed for more than 30 minutes and appeared to be heading for a loss until senior **Desi Sills** made perhaps the biggest play of the night with his block of **Shammah Scott**'s breakaway layup with 1:42 to play with the Wildcats trailing 50-49.
- Nowell tied the game with a free throw with 1:32 left then forced a steal of senior **Craig Porter, Jr.**, to set up his winning 3-pointer with 54 seconds. After his triple gave the Wildcats a 53-50 lead, he forced another bad pass on the next possession before knocking down 2 free throws for the final margin of victory.
- K-State had a season-low offense night across the board, scoring a season-low 55 points on 35.8 percent (19-of-53) shooting, including 20 percent (4-of-20) from 3-point range. The Big 12's best free throw shooting team also had an off night from the line, hitting on a season-low 61.9 percent (13-of-21).
- It was a tale of two halves for Wichita State, which led by as many as 7 points in the first half on 54.5 percent (12-of-22) shooting before scoring just 18 points in the second half on a mere 25.9 percent (7-of-27) shooting. For the game, the Shockers had just 5 assists on its 19 made field goals with 16 turnovers.

- A 14-4 run to end the first half helped Kansas State dig itself out of a 14-point deficit, as the Wildcats took the lead right before halftime and never looked back in earning an 81-64 win over Abilene Christian on Dec. 6 before 7,136 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.
- The Wildcats connected on a season-high 58.5 percent (31-of-53) from the field, including 64 percent (16-of-25) in the second half. They had 23 assists on their 31 made field goals and collected a season-best 52 points in the paint.
- Despite playing just 7 players for the majority of the game, four Wildcats scored in double figures led by a career night from junior **David N'Guessan**, who scored a career-best 23 points on perfect 9-of-9 field goals to go along with 5 rebounds, 2 blocks and an assist. N'Guessan eclipsed his previous career-high with 16 first-half points on perfect 6-of-6 shooting while he added 7 more in the second half to collect his first career 20-point game.
- N'Guessan was joined in double figures by senior **Markquis Nowell**, who posted his second double-double of the season with 15 points and a season-tying 12 assists to go with 6 rebounds and 3 steals in 39 minutes. It was his 10th career double-double, including his fifth such double-double as a Wildcat. His 12 assists tied his previous season-high of 12 vs. Rhode Island on Nov. 21 with both tying for the fourth-most in school history.
- Senior **Keyontae Johnson** and junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** each added 12 points and a combined 15 rebounds.
- The other purple Wildcats (5-5) made things difficult for the host, running out to a 14-point lead (28-14) behind an impressive shooting performance, as they made 11 of their first 19 field goal attempts, including 6 of 9 from 3-point range. Behind the performance of N'Guessan, K-State slowly chipped away at the deficit, using a 14-2 run to close to within 30-28 with 4:45 to play before using a 7-1 spurt to end the half to take a 35-34 advantage into the locker room. N'Guessan scored 10 of the Wildcats' 21 points during this stretch.
- K-State continued its momentum in the second half, using a 17-7 run out of halftime to build a double-digit lead that it would maintain the rest of the game. ACU got to within 11 points twice in the last 4 minutes, including 73-62 with 2:21 remaining, but could get no closer, as K-State scored 8 of the last 10 points for the 17-point win.

► K-State opened the second half with 23 consecutive points to blow open an already lopsided game, as the Wildcats capped an impressive offensive effort with a 98-50 win over UIW on Dec. 11 before 7,042 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State collected its third 90-point scoring effort, narrowly missing the school's first 100-point game since 2010 in the last few minutes before opting to dribble out the ball in the closing seconds against an undermanned UIW. The Wildcats hit on a season-best 59.1 percent (39-of-66) from the field, including 68.8 percent (22-of-32) after halftime, and saw 7 players in double figures.

► The 9-1 start is best start by the Wildcats since opening the 2011-12 season with a similar 9-1 mark, while head coach **Jerome Tang** is off to the best 10-game start by a first-year coach in school history.

► The 48-point margin of victory was the 10th-largest in school history.

► K-State busted open a close contest with a 20-1 run midway through the first half before landing the knockout punch with a 23-0 start to the second half. Six Wildcats contributed in the first-half run, including 5 points each from senior **Markquis Nowell** and freshman **Dorian Finister**. The second-half run was much the same with seven players registering points, including 3-pointers from senior **Keyontae Johnson** and juniors **Ish Massoud** and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**.

► Johnson led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-9 field goals, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range, to go with 5 assists, 4 rebounds and 3 steals in a season-low 24 minutes of action. The Wildcats' leading scorer (17.3 ppg.) has now scored in double figures in all 10 games this season. Tomlin had a near double-double with 15 points and a season-high 9 rebounds in 23 minutes, while junior reserve **Desi Sills** added 14 points, 4 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 steals.

► Sophomore **Cam Carter**, Finister and Nowell each added 10 points, as Nowell nearly notched another double-double with a game-high 8 assists to go with 5 rebounds. Finister saw his most action of the season in 22 minutes, recording his first career double-digit scoring game to go with 7 rebounds and 4 assists.

► UIW, which has 9 true or redshirt freshmen among its 16-man roster, hit on 38 percent (19-of-50) from the field, including 50 percent (7-of-14) from 3-point range, and made 5 of 8 attempts from the free throw line. Freshman **Trey Miller** led with 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range.

► Senior **Keyontae Johnson** collected his second double-double of the season to pace four Wildcats in double figures, as K-State led from nearly start to finish in earning a 71-56 win over former conference foe Nebraska in the 11th Wildcat Classic on Dec. 17 before 13,184 fans at the T-Mobile Center.

► The win helped K-State (10-1) continue its best start to a season since 2016-17, as the Wildcats snapped a 4-game skid in the T-Mobile Center while handing Nebraska (6-6) its seventh straight defeat in the series.

► Johnson led all scorers with a game-high 23 points on 9-of-13 field goals, including 2-of-3 from 3-point range, to go with a game-best 11 rebounds, 2 assists and a career-tying 4 steals in 34 minutes. It was his 15th career double-double, including his seventh with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds, while it was his 11th career 20-point contest.

► Johnson was joined in double figures by junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin**, who scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including 2-of-5 from long range, along with senior **Markquis Nowell** and sophomore **Cam Carter**, who finished with 13 and 10 points, respectively. Nowell added a game-high 7 assists.

► K-State playing in its first Wildcat Classic since a 66-63 loss to Saint Louis in 2019, used a strong finish to the first half to build a double-digit lead at the break. The Wildcats continued to extend that lead in the first 11 minutes of the second half, building as much as a 19-point lead at 59-40 before Nebraska head coach **Fred Hoiberg** called a timeout with just over 9 minutes to play.

► The timeout seemed to ignite the Cornhuskers, as they rattled off 10 straight points to cut the deficit to 59-50 with under 4 minutes to play before a corner 3-pointer by freshman Jamarques Lawrence got them to within 62-55 with 1:19 remaining. However, they could get no closer as the Wildcats scored 7 straight points and 9 of the last 10 points — all from the free throw line — to close it out.

► After connecting on 48.4 percent (15-of-31), including 40 percent (6-of-15) from 3-point range, in the first half, K-State had to survive a poor second-half shooting performance, where he hit on just 31 percent (9-of-29) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-of-13) from beyond the arc. For game, the Wildcats connected on 40 percent (24-of-60) from the field, including 35.7 percent (10-of-28) from 3-point range, while making 13 of 19 free throws.

► Junior **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** led four Wildcats in double figures with a season-high 26 points, as K-State concluded its December non-conference schedule with a 73-65 win over Radford on Dec. 21 on before 6,939 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

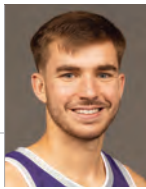

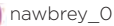
