- **820** Career receiving yards by **Ben Sinnott**, moving into fourth place in school history among tight ends.
- **604** Career passing attempts by **Will Howard**, who is now tied for 10th in school history.
- **99** Distance of a Texas Tech scoring drive in the third quarter, the first 99-yard drive allowed by the Wildcats since 2009 vs. Missouri State.
- **59** Career games played by **Phillip Brooks**, believed to be the most in school history.

RECORDS

Saturday was the 24th all-time meeting between K-State and Texas Tech with the Wildcats now holding a 15-9 advantage in the series, including a 15-6 edge as Big 12 members... K-State extended its winning streak to eight games, the longest streak by either team in the series, while the Wildcats have won 12 of the last 13 in the series... K-State won on the road for the first time this season, while they have now rebounded from a loss with a victory twice this year (defeated UCF after losing at Missouri).

PICKING THEM OFF

The K-State defense, which had two interceptions on the season coming into the game, came up with three interceptions on Saturday night... It was the Wildcats' first game with at least three interceptions since they had four against Missouri last season... Of the three picks, safety **Kobe Savage** had two, the first multi-interception game by a Wildcat since Kevion McGee had two at lowa State in 2018.

JOHNSON JOGS IN

Quarterback **Avery Johnson** rushed for 91 yards and five touchdowns in addition to throwing for 77 yards on 8-of-9 aim... His five rushing touchdowns tied a school record, joining current K-State offensive coordinator **Collin Klein** (2011 vs. Texas A&M) and Jonathan Beasley (2000 vs. North Texas)... It was the most rushing touchdowns by a true freshman in a game in school history... He is the only player in the nation this year with five rushing scores... The last player in the nation with five rushing touchdowns in a game was Pitt's Israel Abanikanda, who had six against Virginia Tech on October 8, 2022.

AMONG TRUE FRESHMEN...

Avery Johnson's five rushing touchdowns were the most nationally by a true freshman since Oklahoma's Samaje Perine had five against Kansas on November 22, 2014... It was the most nationally by a true freshman quarterback since at least 2008.

SINNOTT MOVES UP

Junior tight end **Ben Sinnott** hauled in six receptions for 72 yards... He improved his career yardage total to 820 yards, which ranks fourth in school history among tight ends.

WARD WITH 100

Senior running back **Treshaun Ward** rushed 15 times for 118 yards... It was his most as a Wildcat, topping his 59 yards last week at Oklahoma State... It was Ward's third-career game with 100 rushing yards as he had two last season against Duquesne (127) and at Louisville (126).

HOWARD INTO THE TOP 10

Senior quarterback **Will Howard** started his 21st career game, throwing for 86 yards on 6-of-9 aim... During the game, Howard moved into the top 10 in school history in two career categories as he now ranks 10th in passing yards (4,453) and is tied for 10th in passing attempts (604).
