OPENING TIP

- ► Kansas State (3-2) begins a 4-game homestand on Wednesday night, as the Wildcats return home to Bramlage Coliseum to face Central Arkansas (1-4) at 7 p.m., CT. This will be just the second meeting with the Bears and the first since an 87-54 win at home on Dec. 1, 2013.
- After winning games against Bellarmine and South Dakota State to start the year, K-State has now won 11 straight home non-conference games dating back to 2021-22. The Wildcats have posted a 121-12 record at Bramlage Coliseum since 2006-07.

KEY STORYLINES

- ▶ K-State is coming off a 1-1 showing at the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship, earning a 73-70 overtime win over Providence in the semifinals before falling to No. 12/11 Miami, 91-83, in the championship game. Junior Arthur Kaluma was named to the all-tournament team after averaging 18 points on 55 percent shooting with 9.5 rebounds in two games.
- ► K-State showed some resiliency in splitting the two games in The Bahamas, grinding out an overtime win over an undefeated Providence before nearly rallying back against a hot-shooting Miami squad. After struggling shooting the ball in regulation (32.7 percent) against the Friars, the Wildcats caught fire in overtime, connecting on 4-of-5 field goals, including a monumental 3-pointer from Kaluma, and knocking down 7 of 9 free throw attempts. The team then nearly fought back from a 24-point deficit to the Hurricanes with a 35-19 run, which included 24 points from junior Cam Carter, to close the gap to 7 points in the last 45 seconds.
- ► The K-State offense has shown the ability to be potent, as the Wildcats are averaging nearly 80 points (79.8 ppg.) through 5 games, while hitting on 43.6 percent from the field, including 9.2 3-pointers per game, and 75.8 percent from the free throw line. The scoring average is the best through the first 5 games since the 2009-10 team averaged 82.2 points per game. Four players have scored in double figures in 4 games, while three are averaging in double figures.
- ► Scoring leader **Tylor Perry** currently ranks among the Big 12's top-10 in seven categories, including tops in 3-point field goals/game (3.4) and minutes (36.5), second in free throw percentage (96.9), third in scoring (19.2 ppg.), ninth in assists (4.8 apg.) and assist/turnover ratio (2.67) and 10th in 3-point field goal percentage (37.8).
- ► K-State showed its offense can be more than just 3-pointers, as the Wildcats tied a school record with 56 points in the paint (a stat kept only since 2000-01) against No. 12/11 Miami. The team connected on 74.4 percent (29-of-39) of its field goals inside the 3-point line against the Hurricanes, including 75 percent (18-of-24) in the second half alone.
- Although the Wildcats have had their moments, the defense will need to continue to make strides, as they rank last in the Big 12 in scoring defense (77.2 ppg.) and field goal percentage defense (45.7). The team did show its defensive potential in wins over SDSU and Providence, holding them to an average of 69 points on 38.3 percent (51-of-133) combined shooting.

K-State welcomes 8 newcomers in 2023-24, including 4 Division I transfers in Ques Glover, Arthur Kaluma, Will McNair Jr. and Tylor Perry, a walk-on transfer and 3 true freshmen (Dai Dai Ames, R.J. Jones and Macaleab Rich).



K-State's 2 returning starters (**Cam Carter** and **David M'Guessan**) combined to start in 54 games during its run to the Elite Eight in 2022-23, as Carter was one of four Wildcats to start each of the team's 36 games.



K-State's 4 Division I transfers - **Ques Glover, Arthur Kaluma, Will McNair Jr.**, and **Tylor Perry** - have combined to score 3,499 points in 362 career games. Glover (1,022) and Perry (1,139) have each eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau.

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: CENTRAL ARKANSAS

▶ Under fifth-year coach **Anthony Boone**, Central Arkansas (1-4) is off to a slow start to the season, losing games to Tulsa (53-70), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (83-85), Vanderbilt (71-75) and SE Missouri State (68-70) to go with a home win over Hendrix (82-39).



- ► Central Arkansas is averaging 71.4 points per game on 42.2 percent shooting, including 32.1 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 67.8 points on 40.3 percent shooting, including 30.3 percent from long range. The Bears are shooting 64.6 percent from the free throw line. They are averaging 39.4 rebounds per game with 3 players averaging 6 or more boards.
- ▶ Three players average in double figures led by junior Elias Cato, who is averaging 14.8 points on 56.3 percent shooting, while freshmen Javion Guy-King and Tucker Anderson average 13 and 10.6 points per game, respectively. Guy-King (7.0 rpg.) and Cato (6.2 rpg.) average better than 6 rebounds, while sophomore Ubong Abasi Etim leads with 9.0 boards per game. Sophomore Johannes Kirsipuu averages a team-best 5.2 assists.
- ► Central Arkansas was picked 12th in the preseason ASUN poll after the Bears returned 7 lettermen, including 3 starters, from a team that went 9-22 overall in 2022-23, and was 13th in the standings with a 4-14 mark.
- ▶ Boone, who served as an assistant at UCA from 2014-19, was named interim coach during the 2019-20 season before being elevated to the full-time position in 2020-21. He is 35-77 in his fifth season at the school.

- ► Senior Shane Southwell paced a balanced effort with a then careertying 19 points, as K-State posted an 87-54 win in the first and only meeting with Central Arkansas on Dec. 1, 2013. Joining Southwell in double figures were Thomas Gipson (17) and Marcus Foster (10).
- ▶ The Wildcats dominated the Bears, highlighted by a 52-22 rebounding advantage, which included a 23-5 edge on the offensive glass. K-State also used its size to dominate inside, outscoring UCA 42-22 in the paint, to go with a 19-4 edge in second-chance points. The squad also converted 16 turnovers into 18 points and held a 25-15 advantage from the bench.

LAST TIME OUT: 12/11 MIAMI 91, K-STATE 83

- ► K-State scored 55 points in the second half on 56.8 percent shooting, but it wasn't enough to overcome a double-digit deficit to a hot-shooting No. 12/11 Miami, as the Hurricanes earned a 91-83 victory over the Wildcats to win the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship on Sunday afternoon.
- ▶ Junior guard Cam Carter scored 24 of his game-tying and career-best 28 points in the second half, as the Wildcats (3-2) couldn't rally from a 24-point deficit despite their best efforts. Junior Arthur Kaluma registered his fourth career double and offist as a Wildcat with 18 points and game-high 12 rebounds. Seniors David M'Guessan and Tylor Perry added 10 points each.
- ► For his effort in the two-game tournament, Kaluma was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament after averaging 18.5 points on 52.2 percent shooting with 9.5 rebounds.
- ► Former Wildcat **Nijel Pack**, who set the new event scoring record (43 points) for the two-game Bahamas Championship, was named the Most Valuable Player of the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship. He scored a game-tying 28 points with seven 3-pointers in the championship game.
- ▶ Down by as many as 24 points in the second half, including 66-43 with just over 10 minutes to play, K-State made a furious rally, outscoring Miami, 35-19, to close to within 85-78 with 45 seconds remaining. Carter scored all 24 of his second-half points during this stretch to keep the Wildcats in it until the end.

 The Hurricanes made all six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.
- Miami (5-0) showed why it's among the best shooting teams in the country, scoring its 91 points on 53.3 percent (32-of-60) shooting from the field, including 50 percent (12-of-24) from 3-point range. The Hurricanes connected on 58.1 percent (18-of-31) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from long range, in building a 19-point halftime advantage.
- ► Three-point shooting was a huge storyline, as Miami knocked down 12 3-pointers on 50 percent shooting, while K-State made just 4 of 28 attempts (14.3 percent) from beyond the arc. It was the lowest 3-point field goal percentage by the Wildcats since shooting 13.6 percent vs. Arkansas in 2021.
- ▶ Despite its poor shooting from 3-point range, K-State still connected on nearly 50 percent from the field for the game, hitting on 49.3 percent (33-of-67) from the field, including 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from inside the 3-point arc. The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (21-of-37) in the second half.
- ► K-State scored 56 points in the paint, which tied for the most in school history since the stat began being kept in 2000-01.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

- ▶ K-State is now 181-115 all-time in-season tournament play with Sunday's loss snapping a 4-game winning streak.
- ► The Wildcats fell to 0-2 vs. ranked teams (No. 21/22 USC) this season.
- ▶ The 56 points in the paint tied for the most single game in school history (stat kept since 2000-01), matching the 56 vs. South Dakota on Jan. 3, 2010.
- ▶ Senior **Cam Carter** posted his second 20-point game of the season, as he finished with 28 points on 12-of-22 field goals and 3-of-3 free throws to go along with 5 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals in 38 minutes. He has now scored in double figures in 14 career games, including 4 this season.
- ▶ Junior **Arthur Kaluma** matched his season-high with 18 points, hitting 6-of-13 field goals and 5-of-6 free throws, go with his season-best 12 rebounds. It marked his fourth career double-double and his first in a Wildcat uniform.

'CATS SPENT 10 DAYS IN AUGUST IN ISRAEL, ABU DHABI, U.A.E.

► K-State got a jump start on its preparations for the 2023-24 season with a historic 10-day trip to Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, Israel and Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates [UAE] from August 9-20.



▶ During the Israeli portion of the trip, the team enjoyed walking tours of the Old City Jerusalem, the City of David, Bethlehem and Old City Jaffa, visits to the Yad Vashem — the World Holocaust Remembrance Center — as well as the Western Wall and the Dead Sea. While in Abu Dhabi, they visited the Abraham Peace Accords House and the Grand Mosque.

- ► The Wildcats played 3 games on the tour, defeating the Israeli Select Team, 94-87, on August 15 in Tel Aviv before an 83-81 setback to Team Mexico on August 17 and a 112-72 win over Al-Sharjah on August 18, both in Abu Dhabi. Senior **Tylor Perry** paced 4 Wildcats in double figures on the tour, averaging 22.7 points on 56.8 percent shooting.
- ► K-State, along with the University of Arizona, are the first college teams to ever take a foreign tour to Abu Dhabi.
- ▶ The exhibition tour was generously sponsored by Athletes for Israel and its Founder **Daniel Posner** as well as the Abu Dhabi Tourism Board. In their efforts to combat antisemitism and racism, Athletes For Israel brings athletes to Israel so they can experience the Holy Land and develop a connection with its history, culture, innovation and people.

NEW OFFENSE, MORE 3-POINTERS

- ► K-State made the switch to the 5-out offense in the offseason to utilize its versality in talent, as the offense is structured around spacing with all 5 players required to pass, cut, screen, dribble and shoot.
- ► The Wildcats eclipsed the 100-point barrier in exhibition play for the first time since 1993 with a 102-68 win over Emporia State on Nov. 1 then scored 83 points in the home opener against Bellarmine (11/10/23) before posting 91 vs. South Dakota State (11/13/23) and 83 vs. No. 12/11 Miami (11/19/23) in the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship game.
- ► The current 79.8 scoring average is the best through the first 5 games of a season since the 2009-10 team averaged 82.2 points. It is slightly ahead of the 2022-23 team, which averaged 79.6 points per game.
- ► The new offense has so far increased the number of 3-pointers, as the team has already attempted 139 from beyond the arc, including 33 in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23), which ranked as the seventh-most in a game in school history. The Wildcats followed with 313-point attempts vs. Bellarmine (11/10/23), while hitting on double-digit makes (12) for the first time.
- ▶ In the win over South Dakota State (11/13/23), K-State knocked down 14 3-pointers, which tied for the fifth-most in school history and are the most since hitting 16 at Oklahoma State on Feb. 2, 2019.
- ► The Wildcats have connected on 46 made 3-pointers so far this season, which are the most in the first 5 games of a season since the 1993-94 team racked up 47 triples. The 26 combined 3-pointers games vs. Bellarmine (11/10/23) and South Dakota State are the most consecutive games since also making 26 in games at Oklahoma State and at home to Kansas on Feb. 2 and 5, 2019.
- ► The Wildcats rank third in the Big 12 in 3-point field goals/game (9.2), while they are second in 3-point field goal attempts (27.8). The 139 3-point attempts are the most in the Big 12 just ahead of Houston's 138. Senior Tylor Perry ranks among rank among the top-25 nationally in three 3-point categories, including 12th in attempts (45), 15th in total makes (17) and 21st in makes/game (3.4).

MORE THAN JUST THE 3

- ▶ In nearly overcoming a 24-point deficit to No. 12/11 Miami, K-State showed its offense is more than just the 3-pointer, as the Wildcats connected on 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from inside the 3-point line, including 75 percent (18-of-24) in the second half alone.
- ► K-State scored 56 points in the paint against No. 12/11 Miami, which tied for the most in a single game in school history (stat kept since 2000-01), and the most since scoring 56 against South Dakota on Jan. 3, 2010.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- ► K-State has posted a 174-55 (.762) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 131-14 (.901) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 121-12 (.908) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
- ► K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. The 12 wins last season matched the 2008-09 and 2010-11 teams for the second-most in that span.

1700 WINS AND COUNTING

- ► K-State's 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22, 2022 at the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.
- ► The Wildcats have a 1,724-1,225 (.585) all-time record as a program, which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,724 wins are the 42nd-most in NCAA history.

EXCELLING FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

- ► K-State has had a strong start from the free throw line, knocking down 75.8 percent (75-of-99), which ranks 67th nationally and fourth in the Big 12. The Wildcats were particularly impressive in the two games at the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship, knocking down 81.8 percent (36-of-44), including 85.2 percent (23-of-27) in the overtime win over Providence (11/17/23).
- ► Senior **Tylor Perry** ranks among the best from the free throw line, hitting on 96.9 percent (31-of-32). He ranks 21st nationally and second in the Big 12. He has made 29 straight free throws dating back to the first half vs. USC (11/6/23).
- ▶ Among Perry's 24 points in the win over Providence (11/17/23) was a perfect 14-of-14 performance from the free throw line, which tied for the third-best in school history and the best since **Michael Beasley** went 15-of-15 from the line at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2008. Only Beasley and **Steve Henson**, who went a school-best 17-of-17 from the stripe at lowa State on Feb. 24, 1988, have enjoyed a better performance from the free throw line.

BETTER DEFENSIVE EFFORT

- ► K-State will need to continue to improve its defensive effort after allowing 386 points (77.2 ppg.) in the first 5 games on 45.7 percent shooting, including 34.9 percent (37-of-106) from 3-point range.
- ▶ The Wildcats currently rank 14th in the Big 12 in scoring defense (77.2 ppg.) and field goal percentage defense (45.7), while they are 13th in 3-point field goal percentage defense (34.9). The team is also tied for 13th in turnover margin (-2.00) and 12th in assist/turnover ratio (0.96).
- ► K-State has shown the ability to be a good defensive team, holding South Dakota State (11/13/23) and Providence (11/17/23) to an average of 69 points on 38.3 percent (51-of-133) shooting, including 27.9 percent (12-of-43) from 3-point range. The Wildcats held the Jackrabbits to a season-low 68 points.
- ▶ In the overtime win over Providence (11/17/23), the defense matched and, at times, exceeded that of the Friars (which entered the game 17th nationally in field goal percentage defense), holding them to a season-low 35.3 percent (24-of-68) shooting, including 22.7 percent (5-of-22) from 3-point range.

NEEDING CONSISTENCY

► K-State has had trouble finding rhythm and consistency with key players out at various times. Freshman **Dai Dai Ames** missed the Miami game after he was suspended 1-game by the NCAA for his actions against Providence (11/17/23), while Kaluma missed the South Dakota State (11/13/23) game due to injury. The Wildcats are already playing without a pair of projected starters in seniors **Ques Glover** (injury) and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** (suspension).

PERRY MORE THAN JUST A SCORER

- ► Senior **Tylor Perry** proved that he is more than just a scorer in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23) in Las Vegas, leading the team in assists (6) and steals (4) to go with 6 rebounds and his team-best 22 points. Currently, he is averaging 19.2 points, 4.8 assists, 5.4 rebounds and 1.2 steals in 36.5 minutes per game.
- ▶ The performance was the first in his Division I career that he posted 20 or more points, had 6 or more rebounds, 6 or more assists and 4 or more steals. Only once did he even accomplish three of those stats, as he had 23 points. 7 rebounds and 6 assists against Sam Houston in the 2023 NIT First Round.
- ▶ Perry missed his first 8 field goals, including his first 6 from 3-point range, before making his acrobatic 3-pointer at the halftime buzzer. The shot seemed to spark the fifth-year senior, as he finished the game making 5 of his last 9 field goals, including 4 of his last 6 3-point baskets.
- ▶ Perry's 22 points were the most by a Wildcat newcomer in a debut since Michael Beasley scored 32 points in his first game against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007. In fact, Perry is the first Wildcat to post a 20-point game in a season opener since Mike McGuirl had 22 points vs. Drake on Nov. 25, 2020.
- ▶ Perry has scored in double figures in each of the first 5 games to run his streak to 14 straight games dating to his last season at North Texas in 2022-23. Among those 5 double-digit scoring games is a team-best three 20-point games, which includes 22 vs. USC (11/6/23) and South Dakota State (11/13/23) and a season-best 24 in the win over Providence (11/17/23).

- ▶ Perry has a 20-point game in 7 of last 10 games, also dating to last season.
- ► Perry ranks the Big 12's top 10 in seven categories, including tops in 3-point field goals made (3.40) and minutes (36.5), second in free throw percentage (96.9), third in scoring (19.2 ppg.), ninth in assists (4.8) and assist/turnover ratio (2.67) and 10th in 3-point field goal percentage (37.8).
- ► Perry recently eclipsed 2,000 career points in his college career, which includes stints at Coffeyville Community College (2019-21) and North Texas (2021-23). He currently has 1.105 points at the Division I level.
- ▶ Perry had at least 43-pointers in each of the first 3 games, while he had a season-high 6 treys against South Dakota State (11/13/23). He now has made at least 43-pointers in 26 career games at the Division I level, while he hast 6 or made triples in 4 games (7 vs. San Jose State (11/25/22) and 6 at UAB (2/19/22), 6 vs. Sam Houston (3/19/23) and 6 vs. South Dakota State).

BUCKET GETTER

- Head coach Jerome Tang has said that he wants guard Cam Carter to be a bucket getter and that's what the junior has delivered in the first 5 games, averaging 18 points per game. He leads the Wildcats in field goals made (35) and steals (15), while he is second to **Tylor Perry** in 3-point field goals (12).
- ► After recording his first 20-point game vs. South Dakota State (11/13/23 with a game-high 25 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range, Carter took it to another level vs. No. 12/11 Miami (11/19/23).

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



- K-State has posted a 419-145 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 419 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.
- K-State finished the 2022-23 campaign with a 15-1 record at Bramlage Coliseum, which included an 8-1 mark vs. Big 12 foes. The 15 wins tied for the second-most in the arena's history and are the most since also winning 15 in 2013-14, while the 15-1 record is the best since going 16-1 in 2012-13.
- ► K-State has registered a 219-65 (.759) record at home over the past 18 seasons, including a 95-53 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 219 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 95 league victories at home are among the tops in the Big 12.
- K-State has defeated 46 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 43 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.
- Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11.010 for the 2023-24 season.

BUCKET GETTER (cont.)

- ▶ Carter scored a career-best 28 points vs. the Hurricanes, including 24 in the second half when the Wildcats cut a 24-point deficit to just 7 points in the last 45 seconds. He finished the game 12-of-22 from the field (10-of-16 in the second half) with 5 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals and a block in 38 minutes.
- ► In addition to scoring in double figures in 4 of 5 games, Carter has also posted at least 2 steals in every game, including a career-best 4 vs. Bellarmine (11/10/23) and Providence (11/17/23).
- ► Carter ranks second in the Big 12 in steals (3.0 spg.), third in minutes (35.4), fourth in scoring (18.0 ppg.) and ninth in 3-point field goals madegame (2.40).
- ► Carter has now scored in double figures in 14 games, including 12 times as a Wildcat. Seven of those double-digit totals have come in the last 14 games.

STARTING TO FIND A RHYTHM

- ▶ Junior **Arthur Kaluma** is starting to find a rhythm after a slow start to the season, becoming a double-double threat nearly every night. He is currently averaging 13.5 points to go with a team-best 8.8 rebounds per game.
- ► Kaluma was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament Team after averaging 18.0 points on 5.2.2 percent (12-of-23) shooting with 9.5 rebounds. After scoring 18 in the OT win over Providence, including a pivotal 3-pointer, he had his first double-double as a Wildcat and fourth in his career with 18 points and 12 rebounds vs. 12/11 Miami.

MASTER OF THE BOARDS

- ► Senior **David N'Guessan** has been impressive so far on the glass, ranking third in the Big 12 in rebounding at 7.8 boards per game. He ranks seventh in the league in offensive rebounds (3.2 orpg.), while he is 14th in defensive rebounds (4.6 drpg.). He has double-digit rebounds in 2 of his first 5 games, including a career-best 11 in the win over South Dakota State (11/13/23).
- ► N'Guessan grabbed his first career double-double in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23), as he scored 10 points on 5-of-8 field goals to go with a then career-best 10 rebounds in just over 27 minutes.
- ► N'Guessan gained valuable experience this past summer training with the Dutch National Team, as the Orange Lions competed in the FIBA Olympic Pre-Oualifying Tournament in Istanbul. Turkive August 13-16.
- ► N'Guessan averaged 9 points on 55.6 percent shooting with 6.3 rebounds in the 3-game pool play tournament. He opened with a near double-double of 17 points and 9 rebounds in the Lions' narrow overtime loss to Sweden.

BIG MAN SHOWING PROMISE

- ► Senior **Will McNair** is off to solid start to the season, averaging 8.4 points on a team-best 73.1 percent shooting to go along with 4.0 rebounds through the first 5 games in 18.7 minutes per game.
- ▶ McNair scored 8 points vs. USC (11/6/23) in the opener then has earned starts in each of the last 4 games. He has double figures in 2 of those 4 starts, including 10 points each vs. South Dakota State and Providence.

KALUMA, PERRY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

- ▶ Junior **Arthur Kaluma** and fifth-year senior **Tylor Perry** were each chosen as Honorable Mention selections to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team by the league coaches when the league office announced its annual preseason teams.
- ► Kaluma and Perry are the first Wildcats named to the Preseason All-Big 12 since **Barry Brown Jr.** and **Dean Wade** in 2018-19.

KALUMA NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LIST FOR JULIUS ERVING AWARD

- ▶ Junior **Arthur Kaluma** was one of 20 players named to the preseason Watch List for the 2024 Julius Erving Award, which annually recognizes the nation's top small forward, by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.
- ► This is the second time that Kaluma has been named to a preseason Watch List after he was chosen to the Watch List for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award in 2022-23 while playing at Creighton.
- ▶ Although not named to the preseason team, current Oklahoma City Thunder and former Wildcat **Keyontae Johnson** was selected as a finalist for the Julius Erving Award in 2022-23, along with Alabama's **Brandon Miller**, Gonzaga's **Julian Strawther**, Kansas' **Jalen Wilson** and UCLA's **Jaime Jaquez Jr**.

'CATS CRACK 100 IN LONE EXHIBITION

- ► K-State connected on 52.1 percent from the field, including 55.6 percent in the second half, as the Wildcats eclipsed 100 points in home exhibition play for the first time since 1993 in a 102-68 win over Division II Emporia State.
- ▶ It was the first 100-point game in home exhibition play since a 101-80 win over Fort Hood on Nov. 22, 1993, while it was the most in a home exhibition game since scoring 111 in a win over Michigan AAU on Nov. 15, 1991.
- ▶ Junior **Cam Carter** paced four Wildcats in double figures with a game-high 20 points in just 14 minutes, while sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** added 13 points.

K-STATE, TANG AGREE TO EXTENSION THROUGH 2029-30 SEASON

- ► After a record-setting first season, head coach **Jerome Tang** agreed to a new 7-year contract through the 2029-30 season, Director of Athletics **Gene Taylor** announced on September 25.
- ▶ The new contract replaces his original 6-year deal, leaving him 7 years on his agreement that runs until April 30, 2030. The second-year head coach will be paid \$3 million in 2023-24 and receive a \$100,000 increase in each remaining contract year culminating in a \$3.6 million base in 2029-30. There are also four retention bonuses following 2023-24, 2024-25, 2025-26 and 2026-27.
- Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference the Big 12 with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign.

K-STATE SIGNS DAVID CASTILLO

- ► K-State head coach Jerome Tang said he came to 'elevate' the program and he continued that process on Wednesday (Nov. 8) with the signing of consensus top-50 high school prospect **David Castillo** (Bartlesville, Okla./Sunrise Christian Academy [Kan.]) to a National Letter of Intent.
- ► Castillo is rated among the top 50 players nationally by three of the four recruiting services, including No. 42 by *Rivals*, No. 45 by *247Sports* and No. 50 by ESPN, while is among the top-10 point guards, including No. 7 by *247Sports*, No. 8 by *Rivals* and No. 9 by *On3*.
- ▶ A native of Bartlesville, Okla., Castillo played 3 years at Bartlesville High School before transferring to prep powerhouse Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan., for his senior season in 2023-24. Playing for K-State alum Clent Stewart, he left Bartlesville as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,594 points, averaging 23.7 points per game in his 67-game career. He was twice named to the *Tulsa World* All-State Team (2022, 2023) and was a finalist for the *World*'s 2023 State Player of the Year.
- ▶ In addition to his prep accolades, Castillo has led Team USA to a pair of gold medals, including the 2021 FIBA Americas U16 Championship (14 points vs. Argentina in the gold-medal game) and 2022 FIBA U17 World Cup (12 points vs. Spain in gold-medal game). He was also invited to the 2023 Team USA Junior National Team minicamp but could not play due to a foot injury.

Second Season at K-State [29-12] 31st Season Overall | 21st Season in College



Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is in his second season as the 25th head men's basketball head coach at Kansas State in 2023-24.

Tang is just third coach in the program's history to be selected National Coach of the Year, joining Fred "Tex" Winter (UPI) in 1958 and Jack Hartman (NABC) in 1980, while he is the fourth head coach from a Big 12 institution to earn the honor from the Naismith Trophy. He was a candidate for nearly every other National Coach of the Year honor in 2022-23, including finishing as the runnerup for The Associated Press award. In addition, he was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year, earning the honor from both the league coaches and the AP.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang reenergized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons and was picked last in the preseason Big 12 poll by guiding the school to its third-highest win total (26) and a thrilling run to the Elite Eight in 2022-23. He became the 11th first-year head coach to direct his team to the Elite Eight since 1996-97, while joining North Carolina's Bill Guthridge (K-State alum) in 1997-98 and Hubert Davis in 2021-22 and Kent State's Stan Heath in 2001-02 as one of four firsttime head coaches to accomplish the feat. Tang's win total was the second-most by a first-year Division I head coach in 2022-23.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall $\,$ record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference — the Big 12 — with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner Markquis Nowell and forward Kevontae Johnson. who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Following the season, Johnson became the first Wildcat under Tang and the first since 2017 to be selected in the NBA Draft, as he was taken in the second round with the 50th pick by the Oklahoma City Thunder. He is the 13th draft pick developed by Tang, which includes 11 at Baylor and one at Heritage Christian Academy (**Von Wafer**). In addition, Nowell signed a 2-way contract with the Toronto Raptors on draft night.

The 2022-23 Wildcats set three school single-season records, including the mark for assists (611), while finishing No. 2 in points (2,742), field goals made (961). 3-point field goals made (258), free throw percentage (74.8) and steals (289) in school history. The 46.1 field goal percentage tied for the seventh-best in the shot clock era and the best since 2017-18. Nowell crushed the single-season marks for assists (297) and steals (92) while he and Johnson became just the second duo in school history to each tally 600 or more points in a single season.

Tang helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats played before eight sellouts while posting a 15-1 record at home with 5 wins over Top 25 opponents, including No. 2/2 Kansas, No. 9/10 Baylor, No. 17/19 TCU, No. 19/18 Iowa State and No. 24/24 West Virginia. The 15 wins were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history. The eight sellouts were the most since 2014-15, while the team ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57 percent in the newly configured 11,000-seat arena.

Tang and his coaching staff capitalized on this new excitement, attracting a 3man freshman class of Darrin "Dai Dai" Ames Jr., R.J. Jones and Macaleab Rich for the 2023-24 season that was a consensus top-30 recruiting class, including 22nd by ESPN and 247Sports. All three were ranked in the prestigious Rivals150, while Ames and Jones were both selected to the ESPN 100.

Tang came to K-State in 2022 after helping build Baylor into a national power in his 19 seasons (2003-22) as an assistant and associate head coach.

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games. Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included schoolrecord 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including Jared Butler becoming the first consensus First Team selection.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 straight wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as Curtis Jerrells became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a 5game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of 4 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birththrough-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when Cedrick Hensley scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit - Vakeaton "Von" Wafer - became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (Paul & Bano Tang) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, Careviven (Rev) have a son, Seven, and a daughter, Aylyn. He also has adopted sons (Lamar and Richard Hurd).

- ► K-State could never get on track offensively, as the Wildcats connected on just 31 percent from the field, including 25 percent in the first half, in an 82-69 loss to No. 21/22 USC on Nov. 6 at the Hall of Fame Series Las Vegas before 7,595 fans at the T-Mobile Arena. The 31-percent field goal percentage was the lowest under head coach Jerome Tang and the lowest by the Wildcats since 2022.
- ▶ The Trojans (1-0), which ranked eighth in field goal percentage defense (33.9) in 2022-23, continued that trend to open the new season, as the Wildcats missed their first 8 field goal attempts before junior Arthur Kaluma connected on a second-chance layup with just over 16 minutes to play in the first half.
- ▶ Overall, K-State connected on 31 percent (22-of-71) from the field, including 24.2 percent (8-of-33) from 3-point range, while turning the ball over 17 times. USC also posted 8 blocked shots, including 5 from senior **Joshua Morgan**.
- ▶ Despite the poor shooting, the Wildcats kept it close for most of the first half before the Trojans scored 12 of the last 18 points to take a 40-30 lead into the halftime break. Back-to-back 3-pointers from senior Tylor Perry and junior Cam Carter to open the second half closed the gap to 40-36, but they could get no closer, as USC outscored K-State, 25-11, over the next 5 minutes to take a commanding 65-47 lead with just over 10 minutes to play.
- ▶ Down 70-51 after a 3-point play, the Wildcats made one last charge, using a 13-2 lead capped by a Perry 3-pointer to close the deficit to 72-64 with 2:21 to play. Perry was responsible for 11 of the 13 points in the run. However, the Trojans scored 10 of the last 15 points to close out the game.
- ▶ Perry rebounded from a poor start to pace three Wildcats in double figures with 22 points in his K-State debut, connecting on 5-of-17 from the field. including 4-of-12 from long range. He missed his first 8 field goals before hitting a deep 3-pointer right before halftime. He added team-highs in assists (6) and steals (4) to go with 6 rebounds in nearly 35 minutes.
- ► Carter notched double figures for the 11th time in his career, including the ninth time at K-State, with 15 points to go with 5 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals in 28 minutes. Senior David N'Guessan collected his first double-double with 10 points on 5-of-8 field goals and a career-high 10 rebounds in 27 minutes.
- ▶ USC saw four players score in double figures, including a game-high 24 points by senior Boogie Ellis on 7-of-14 shooting.

- ▶ Powered by 18 points from senior Tylor Perry and a career-best 17 points from junior **Cam Carter**, K-State ushered in a new year at Bramlage Coliseum with a hard-fought 83-75 win over a pesky Bellarmine team in the home season opener on Nov. 10 before 9,947 fans.
- ► K-State led by as many as 19 points in the second half before Bellarmine (0-2) used a late 10-4 rally to close to within single digits with under a minute to play. The Wildcats had a 79-63 lead after a David N'Guessan dunk with 2:11 to play before the Knights scored 7 straight to close the gap to 79-70 with 51.6 seconds.
- ► After Perry knocked down a pair of free throws, they got a 3-pointer from graduate student Bash Wieland, who had team-high 17 points off the bench, to get within 81-73 with 35 seconds left. However, they could get no closer as Perry canned another pair of free throws to extend the game back to double figures. Perry finished a perfect 6-of-6 from the line.
- ▶ In the early moments of an up-and-down game, K-State got a big boost from true freshman Dai Dai Ames, who scored 11 of his 12 points during a pivotal 13-5 run in the first half. He hit his first career 3-pointer to give the Wildcats a 10-4 then showed off his versatility with a step back jumper 32 seconds later to push the lead to 12-7. He finished the run with a pair of 3-pointers to give the Wildcats a 20-9 advantage and force an early Bellarmine timeout with 11:42.
- ▶ After the Knights got to within 24-17 with just over 8 minutes to play before halftime. Carter sparked the home team with the first 6 points in an 18-6 run to push ahead 42-23. The lead stood at 46-31 at the half, as Carter led all scorers with 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting.
- ▶ In all, four Wildcats scored in double figures as Ames (12 points) and junior Arthur Kaluma (12 points) collected their first double-digit scoring games in a K-State uniform. The team also got 8 points each from senior Will McNair Jr. and freshman R.J. Jones, while senior David N'Guessan chipped in 6 points to go with his game-high 9 rebounds.
- ▶ Perry scored his game-high 18 points on 43-point field goals and 6 free throws while adding 5 assists and 4 rebounds. Carter added a career-best 4 steals to go with his career-tying 17 points, going 7-of-14 from the field. Ames went 4-of-9 from the field with 3 triples in his 12-point effort, while adding a game-tying 6 assists and 3 steals. Kaluma scored his 12 points on 5-of-14 shooting with 7 rebounds and a pair of steals.

- ► Kansas State connected on 14 3-point field goals, including a combined 10 from senior Tylor Perry and junior Cam Carter, as the Wildcats led from wireto-wire in an impressive 91-68 win over preseason Summit League favorite South Dakota State before 9,421 fans at Bramlage Coliseum on Nov. 13.
- ▶ The 14 made 3-point field goals tied for the fifth-most in school history and the most since the Wildcats knocked down 16 at Oklahoma State on Feb. 2, 2019.
- ► Carter scored a career-high 25 points, connecting on 10-of-20 field goals, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range, while Perry also netted 20 points, tying his season-high with 22 on 7-of-9 shooting, including 6-of-8 from beyond the arc.
- Freshman R.J. Jones notched the other 4 3-point field goals, finishing with a season-high 14 points on 4-of-6 field goals, including 4-of-5 from 3-point land. In all, four registered double figures, as senior big man Will McNair Jr. tallied a season-high 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting with 7 rebounds.
- ▶ Buoved by the stellar night from 3-point range, K-State (2-1) scored a seasonhigh 91 points on a season-best 57.4 percent (35-of-61) shooting from the field, including 56 percent (14-of-25) from 3-point range. The Wildcats scored 40 points in the paint, while they had an assist on 24 of their 35 field goals.
- ▶ The defense was equally impressive, holding the Jackrabbits (1-2) to 41.5 percent (27-of-65) shooting, including 33.3 percent (7-of-21) from long range, while they made just 46.7 percent (7-of-15) from the free throw line.
- ▶ After South Dakota State (1-2) recovered from a 3-for-16 start to cut a 12point deficit to 27-22, Carter was able ignite an 11-2 run that pushed the lead back into double figures at 38-24. Five straight by the Jackrabbits cut the deficit to single digits at the half.
- ▶ Perry opened the second half was his third 3-pointer then a fourth triple put K-State ahead in double figures for good with just over 16 minutes remaining. The lead grew to 20 points with 9:24 to play after a layup by redshirt freshman **Dorian Finister** and another 3-pointer by Carter.
- ▶ South Dakota State saw three players score in double figures led by senior Charlie Easley's 21 points on 9-of-13 field goals to along with 4 rebounds and a career-best 6 steals. Fellow senior Luke Appel posted 16 points.

- ► K-State got big performances from senior **Tylor Perry** and junior **Arthur Kaluma**, as the Wildcats used a gritty effort to outlast Providence, 73-70, in overtime in the semifinals of the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship on Nov. 17 before raucous crowd of 1,833 fans at the Baha Mar Convention Center.
- ► Perry scored a game-high and season-best 24 points to pace four Wildcats in double figures, while Kaluma added a season-high 18 points on 6-of-10 field goals, including 3-of-4 from beyond the arc, to go with 7 rebounds. Senior Will McNair Jr. and freshman Dai Dai Ames each chipped in 10 points.
- ► Among Perry's 24 points was a perfect 14-of-14 performance from the free throw line, which tied for the third-best in school history and the best since **Michael Beasley** went 15-of-15 from the line at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2008.
- ► In addition to those efforts, senior **David N'Guessan** scored all 6 of his points in overtime on perfect 3-of-3 shooting to go with 6 rebounds, while junior **Cam Carter** tied a career-high with 8 rebounds to go with a game-high 4 steals.
- ► K-State showed it could grind out a game against a stellar defensive team, hitting timely shots and taking advantage of its opportunities at the free throw line, where the Wildcats converted on 85.2 percent (23-of-27).
- ▶ The teams entered overtime tied at 57-all after neither team hit a field goal in the last 3 minutes. Perry started the extra period by making 3 straight free throws after being fouled on a 3-pointer then N'Guessan followed with a layup off a feed from Perry to help the Wildcats score the first 5 points.
- ▶ After Providence (3-1) closed to within 62-61 on a pair of free throws and a layup, Kaluma knocked down his biggest shot of the night on a 3-pointer on an assist from Ames with 2:18 remaining. The Wildcats then back-to-back layups from N'Guessan to push ahead 69-63 with 47.5 seconds left. Perry and Ames both went 2-of-2 from the line to close it out in the last 26 seconds.
- ► K-State ended the night shooting 36.8 percent (21-of-57) from the field, including 36.4 percent (8-of-22) from 3-point range. However, in the extra session, the Wildcats made 4 of their 5 field goals, including Kaluma's 3-pointer, and made 7 of 9 from the free throw line.
- ► The defense matched and, at times, exceeded that of Providence's stellar effort, holding the Friars to a season-low 35.3 percent (24-of-68) shooting, including 22.7 percent (5-of-22) from 3-point range.

- ► K-State scored 55 points in the second half on 56.8 percent shooting, but it wasn't enough to overcome a double-digit deficit to a hot-shooting No. 12/11 Miami, as the Hurricanes earned a 91-83 victory over the Wildcats to win the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship on Nov. 19 before 1.895 fans.
- ▶ Junior guard Cam Carter scored 24 of his game-tying and career-best 28 points in the second half, as the Wildcats (3-2) couldn't rally from a 24-point deficit despite their best efforts. Junior Arthur Kaluma registered his fourth career double-double and first as a Wildcat with 18 points and game-high 12 rebounds. Seniors David N'Guessan and Tylor Perry added 10 points each.
- ► For his efforts, Kaluma was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament after averaging 18.5 points and 9.5 rebounds.
- ▶ Down by as many as 24 points in the second half, including 66-43 with just over 10 minutes to play, K-State made a furious rally, outscoring Miami, 35-19, to close to within 85-78 with 45 seconds remaining. Carter scored all 24 of his second-half points during this stretch to keep the Wildcats in it until the end. The Hurricanes made all six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.
- ▶ Miami (5-0) showed why it's among the best shooting teams in the country, scoring its 91 points on 53.3 percent (32-of-60) shooting from the field, including 50 percent (12-of-24) from 3-point range. The Hurricanes connected on 58.1 percent (18-of-31) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from long range, in building a 19-point halftime advantage.
- ▶ Three-point shooting was a huge storyline, as Miami knocked down 12 3pointers on 50 percent shooting, while K-State made just 4 of 28 attempts (14.3 percent) from beyond the arc. It was the lowest 3-point field goal percentage by the Wildcats since shooting 13.6 percent vs. Arkansas in 2021.
- ▶ Despite its poor shooting from long range, K-State still connected on nearly 50 percent from the field for the game, hitting on 49.3 percent (33-of-67) from the field, including 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from inside the arc. The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (21-of-37) in the second half. The team scored 56 points in the paint, which tied for the most since the stat becan being kept in 2000-01.
- ► The Wildcats played without freshman guard **Dai Dai Ames**, who was suspended by the NCAA for his ejection against Providence.
