

BY THE NUMBERS...

51,481 – Announced attendance on Saturday at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, the 14th-consecutive sellout dating back to the beginning of 2022... It is the first time K-State has sold out every game in consecutive seasons since 2015 and 2016.

5,353 – Total offensive yards this year by the Wildcats, which is the fourth most in school history.

2,994 – Total offensive yards by **Will Howard** this year, which is the ninth most in school history.

2,957 – Passing yards by K-State this year, which is the sixth most in school history.

2,643 – Passing yards this season by **Will Howard**, who now ranks sixth in school history.

1,075 – Rushing yards this season by **DJ Giddens**, who produced the 19th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history and ranks third in school history among sophomores.

676 – Receiving yards this season by **Ben Sinnott**, who has the most single-season receiving yards in school history among tight ends.

458 – Career completions by **Will Howard**, who ranks fourth in school history.

454 – Points scored by K-State this season, which ranks as the seventh most in school history.

244 – Completions this season by the Wildcats, which is the fourth most in school history.

219 – Completions this season by **Will Howard**, which is the fourth most in school history.

175 – Carries in which it took **DJ Giddens** to reach 1,000 rushing yards this season, tied for the third fastest in school history in terms of carries to 1,000 yards.

136 – Receiving yards on Saturday night by **Ben Sinnott**, the fourth most in a game in school history by a tight end.

102 – Plays by the Wildcats on Saturday, the most in school history... The previous record was 100 plays against Kansas in 1970.

65 – Career games played by **Phillip Brooks**, the most in school history.

58 – Total offensive touchdowns by the Wildcats this year, which is tied for fifth in school history.

47 – Career starts by left guard **Cooper Beebe**, the fifth most by a K-State offensive lineman since 1990.

31 – Carries on Saturday night by **DJ Giddens** a new career high (30 vs. UCF) and the most by a Wildcat since Alex Barnes rushed 32 times against Texas Tech in 2017.

28 – Passing touchdowns this season by K-State to stand as the most in school history.

24 – Passing touchdowns this season by **Will Howard**, who tied the school record.

RECORDS

Saturday was the 107th all-time meeting between K-State and Iowa State, each coming in consecutive seasons as this is the ninth-longest uninterrupted series in FBS history... Kansas State hosted the final Big 12 regular season game of the year for a second-straight season after a 47-27 victory over Kansas in 2022... Iowa State now holds a 53-50-4 record in the all-time series... Iowa State has won two-straight games in Manhattan for the first time since 1985 and 1988.

MOST PLAYS

Kansas State set a school record for most plays in a game with 102 on Saturday night... It topped the previous record of 100 plays against Kansas in 1970.

INTO THE TOP 10

The Kansas State offense moved into the school's top-10 lists in several categories on Saturday... The Wildcats now rank sixth in school history in single-season passing yards (2,957) and total offense (5,353)... They are tied for fifth in total offensive touchdowns (58) and rank seventh in total points (454).

HOWARD TIES SCHOOL RECORD

Quarterback **Will Howard** made his 27th career start on Saturday, the fourth most by a Wildcat signal calling dating back to 1990... He went 24-of-48 through the air for 288 yards and a touchdown while adding 46 rushing yards and another score... His 48 pass attempts were a career high and the most by a Wildcat since Jake Waters also had 48 attempts in the 2015 (post-2014 season) Alamo Bowl He tied the school record with 24 passing touchdowns this year, equaling the mark of Eli Roberson (2003)... He now ranks fourth in school history in single-season completions (219), fifth in passing attempts (357) and sixth in passing yards (2,643)... He also ranks ninth in single-season offensive yards (2,994)... For a career, he now ranks fourth in completions (458).

SINNOTT WITH A BANNER DAY

Junior tight end **Ben Sinnott** hauled in 10 catches for 136 yards and a touchdown... It was his second game this season with 100 receiving yards following the season-opening contest against SEMO (100 yards), tied for the second most 100-yard receiving games by a tight end in a season... Dave Jones had three such games in 1966, while Russ Campbell also had two in 1991... His 10 receptions on Saturday night were the most in a single game by a tight end in school history... With his effort, he now has the most receiving yards in a single season by a tight end in school history, a mark that stands at 676 yards... He now has 10 career receiving touchdowns, tied for the most in school history among tight ends.

GIDDENS GOT TO 1,000

Sophomore running back **DJ Giddens** rushed 31 times for 114 yards and a touchdown... He eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark during the game, which came on his 175th carry of the season, tied for the third fastest in school history in terms of attempts... It is behind the 159 carries it took Darren Sproles (2002) and James Johnson (2007) and tied with Jesse Ertz (2016)... He now has 1,075 rushing yards this season, which is the third most by a sophomore in a game in school history... His 31 rushes on Saturday night set a new career high (30 vs. UCF) and were the most by a Wildcat since Alex Barnes rushed 32 times against Texas Tech in 2017.

SELLOUT CROWD

Despite the snowy conditions on Saturday, all tickets were sold for the game against the Cyclones as the announced attendance was 51,481... The Wildcats have sold out every game the last two seasons (14 games), the first time doing so since 2015 and 2016... K-State's average attendance for the 2023 season was 51,957, which equates to 103.91% of capacity full this season.
