OPENING TIP

► Kansas State (4-2) continues its 4-game homestand on Tuesday, as the Wildcats welcome Oral Roberts (2-3) to Bramlage Coliseum at 7 p.m., CT. This will be the seventh meeting with the Golden Eagles and the first since a 77-68 win at home on Nov. 29, 2017.

► After opening the year with wins over Bellarmine, South Dakota State and Central Arkansas, K-State has now won 12 straight home non-conference games dating back to 2021-22. The Wildcats have posted a 122-12 record at Bramlage Coliseum since 2006-07.

KEY STORYLINES

► K-State got back on the winning track last week, as the Wildcats eclipsed 100 points in a home game for the first time since 2010 with a 100-56 victory over Central Arkansas on Nov. 22. It marked the 40th time in school history, including the second time under head coach **Jerome Tang**, that the Wildcats scored 100 points in a game. It was a complete offensive effort, as the team connected on 50.7 percent (38-of-75) from the field, which included 10 3-point field goals and 52 points in the paint, while the defense held the Bears to 27.9 percent (19-of-68) shooting.

► As evident by the 100-point performance against UCA, K-State offense has shown the ability to be potent, as the Wildcats are averaging more than 80 points per game (83.2 ppg.) through 6 games, while hitting on 44.9 percent from the field, including 9.3 3-pointers per game, and 73 percent from line. The scoring average is the best through the first 6 games since the 1997-98 team averaged 88.8 points per game. Four players have scored in double figures in 5 games, while three (**Tylor Perry**, **Cam Carter**, **Arthur Kaluma**) are averaging in double figures.

► K-State continues to show its offense can be more than 3-pointers, as the Wildcats followed up its school-record tying 56-point effort in the paint against No. 12/11 Miami with 52 points in the paint vs. UCA. The team has connected on 67.1 percent (57-of-85) of their field goals inside the 3-point line in the last 2 games, including 74.4 percent (29-of-39) against the Hurricanes.

► K-State ranks among the best rebounding teams in the nation, as the Wildcats rank eighth in offensive rebounds/game (16.3) and 29th in rebounds/game (42.83). The team corralled 63 boards against UCA, which were the most in a game since they had 64 vs. Kansas City on Dec. 3, 1997. Among those 63 rebounds were 26 on the offensive end, which led to a 34-5 advantage in second-chance points. The 26 offensive boards were the most since 2012.

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** is starting to heat up, as the transfer has scored in double figures in 4 consecutive games, including a season-best 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting vs. UCA. He was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament team after averaging 18 points and 9.5 rebounds in games vs. Providence (11/17/23) and No. 12/11 Miami (11/19/23).

► Scoring leader **Tylor Perry** ranks among the Big 12's top-10 in 6 categories, including tops in 3-point field goals/game (3.2) and free throw percentage (96.9), third in assist/turnover ratio (3.0), fifth in scoring (17.0 ppg.) and minutes (34.2) and seventh in assists (5.0 apg.).

TEAM NOTES

■ UP NEXT: ORAL ROBERTS

► Under first-year coach **Russell Springmann**, Oral Roberts is off to a 2-3 start to the season after snapping a 2-game skid with a 65-63 home win over Texas Southern on Nov. 21. The Golden Eagles are 0-3 on the road after dropping games at UT-Arlington (71-75), Missouri State (69-84) and No. 12/13 Texas A&M (66-74).



► Oral Roberts is averaging 69 points per game on 40.8 percent shooting, including 31.9 percent from 3-point range, while allowing 73 points on 39.6 percent shooting, including 34.5 percent from long range. The Golden Eagles are shooting 69.3 percent from the free throw line.

► Four players are averaging in double figures led by senior **Issac McBride**, who is averaging 21.6 points on 38.8 percent shooting, including 37.1 percent from 3-point range. Graduate **DeShang Weaver** is averaging 14.6 points on 52.8 percent shooting with a team-best 6.4 rebounds per game. Graduate **Kareem Thompson** (11.4 ppg.) and junior **Jailen Bedford** (10.8 ppg.) are also averaging in double digits.

► Oral Roberts was picked second in the preseason Summit League poll after the Golden Eagles returned 8 lettermen, including 2 starters, from a team that posted a 30-5 record in 2022-23, including an 18-0 league mark.

► Springmann was elevated to the head coaching role after Paul Mills left to take over at Wichita State. A former assistant coach to **Rick Barnes** at Texas from 2001-15, he was an assistant to Mills from 2018-23, when the Golden Eagles went to a pair of NCAA Tournaments.

FAMILIAR CONNECTIONS

► K-State assistant **Rodney Perry** spent three seasons (2016-18) as an assistant at Oral Roberts.

► Oral Roberts assistant **Sam Patterson** spent 13 seasons (2004-17) at Baylor, where he worked alongside K-State head coach **Jerome Tang**.

► Oral Roberts assistant **Bill Lewit** coached K-State assistant **Jareem Dowling** at Cecil College in North East, Md., from 2000-03. Lewit then gave Dowling his first coaching job at Cecil in 2005, as the pair led the Seahawks to a 97-6 record and 2006 NJCAA Division II National Championship.

SERIES HISTORY

► K-State and Oral Roberts will be meeting for the seventh time with the Wildcats holding a 4-2 advantage, including a 4-0 mark at home. K-State has won 2 straight in the series, including a 71-63 win on Nov. 13, 2013 and a 77-68 win on Nov. 29, 2017.

► K-State is 55-3 all-time against Summit League opponents, including 48-0 at home. The Wildcats already have one win over a Summit League team, defeating South Dakota State, 91-68, on Nov. 13.

LAST MEETING:

K-STATE 77, ORAL ROBERTS 68

► Behind a double-double from then junior **Dean Wade**, K-State won its last meeting with Oral Roberts, 77-68, on Nov. 29, 2017. The Wildcats used a 16-2 run early in the first half to take control of the game en route to a 42-34 halftime lead. The team then got big plays late from junior **Barry Brown Jr.**, to withstand a late second-half rally from the Golden Eagles.

LAST TIME OUT:

K-STATE 100, CENTRAL ARKANSAS 56

► K-State broke the 100-point barrier at home for the first time since 2010, as the Wildcats saw four players score in double figures in a 100-56 win over Central Arkansas on Nov. 22 before a crowd of 8,980 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State (4-2) scored 100 points in a game for the 40th time in school history, including the first time at home in nearly 13 years since a 100-76 win over North Florida on Dec. 31, 2010. It marked the second time hitting the 100-point mark under head coach **Jerome Tang** and the first since scoring a school-record 116 points at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, 2023.

► On a night where no Wildcat player saw more than 26 minutes of action and 11 available players saw action, K-State remained unbeaten at home behind an all-around performance. The Wildcats connected on 50.7 percent (38-of-75) from the field, which included 10 3-point field goals and 52 points in the paint, while the defense held the Bears (1-5) to 27.9 percent (19-of-68) shooting.

► The Wildcats grabbed 63 rebounds, including 26 on the offensive end which they converted into 34 second-chance points. It was the most rebounds in a game in more than 25 seasons since the team had 64 vs. Kansas City on Dec. 3, 1997. Seven players had at least 4 rebounds in the game.

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** led four players in double figures with a season-high 20 points, connecting on 7-of-11 field goals, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range. Freshmen **Dai Dai Ames** and **Macaleb Rich** also hit double digits with 14 and 13 points, respectively, while senior **David N'Guessan** collected his second double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

► K-State picked up right where it left off in The Bahamas, jumping out to a 10-1 advantage before Central Arkansas head coach **Anthony Boone** called his first timeout at the 15:38 mark. Kaluma and N'Guessan combined for the first 10 points, including a pair of dunks by Kaluma.

► K-State continued to build its lead, pushing ahead by as many as 29 points, as 10 players saw action. The Wildcats connected on 51.4 percent (19-of-37) from the field in the first half, including 60.9 percent (14-of-23) inside the 3-point arc. Kaluma led all scorers with 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting, while Ames added 11 points, including a pair of 3-pointers.

► The lead reached 30 points less than 5 minutes into the second half on a pair of free throws by Kaluma. The Wildcats then ran off 10 straight points, which included a pair of 3-pointers from senior **Taylor Perry**, to push the advantage to 74-38 near the midway point of the half.

► The 100-point plateau grew closer after an alley-oop dunk by redshirt **Taj Manning** — his first career points — gave K-State a 91-51 lead with 3:45 to play. Redshirt freshman **Dorian Finister** knocked down the Wildcats' 10th 3-pointer of the night on the next play and was followed by free throws by sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and freshman **R.J. Jones**. Rich's layup with 1:16 to play were the last of the night and enough to eclipse the 100-point mark.

POSTGAME NEWS & NOTES

► K-State has won 12 straight at home at non-conference play since 2021-22.

► K-State scored its 100 points on 50.7 percent (38-of-75) shooting, including 34.5 percent (10-of-29) from 3-point range, and 60.9 percent (14-of-23) from the free throw line. The team dished out 21 assists on its 38 made field goals.

► The Wildcats held advantage in points off turnovers (14-7), points in the paint (52-12), second-chance points (34-5), fast break points (16-12) and bench points (52-10).

► K-State has now had double-digit 3-pointers in 3 of 6 games.

■ ONCE-IN-A-LIFETIME TRIP

'CATS SPENT 10 DAYS IN AUGUST IN ISRAEL, ABU DHABI, U.A.E.

► K-State got a jump start on its preparations for the 2023-24 season with a historic 10-day trip to Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, Israel and Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates [UAE] from August 9-20.



► During the Israeli portion of the trip, the team enjoyed walking tours of the Old City Jerusalem, the City of David, Bethlehem and Old City Jaffa, visits to the Yad Vashem — the World Holocaust Remembrance Center — as well as the Western Wall and the Dead Sea. While in Abu Dhabi, they visited the Abraham Peace Accords House and the Grand Mosque.

► The Wildcats played 3 games on the tour, defeating the Israeli Select Team, 94-87, on August 15 in Tel Aviv before an 83-81 setback to Team Mexico on August 17 and a 112-72 win over Al-Sharjah on August 18, both in Abu Dhabi. Senior **Taylor Perry** paced 4 Wildcats in double figures on the tour, averaging 22.7 points on 56.8 percent shooting.

► K-State, along with the University of Arizona, are the first college teams to ever take a foreign tour to Abu Dhabi.

► The exhibition tour was generously sponsored by Athletes for Israel and its Founder **Daniel Posner** as well as the Abu Dhabi Tourism Board. In their efforts to combat antisemitism and racism, Athletes for Israel brings athletes to Israel so they can experience the Holy Land and develop a connection with its history, culture, innovation and people.

NEW OFFENSE, MORE 3-POINTERS

- ▶ K-State made the switch to the 5-out offense in the offseason to utilize its versatility in talent, as the offense is structured around spacing with all 5 players required to pass, cut, screen, dribble and shoot.
- ▶ After scoring 100 points in the exhibition play for the first time since 1993, the Wildcats eclipsed the 100-point barrier at home since 2010 and the second time under head coach **Jerome Tang** with a 100-56 victory over Central Arkansas on Nov. 22. The team has scored 83 points twice (Bellarmine and No. 12/11 Miami) and 91 points vs. South Dakota State.
- ▶ The current 83.2 scoring average is the best through the first 6 games since the 1997-98 team averaged 88.8 points. It is the fourth time that the team has averaged better than 80 points through the first 6 games in the last 25 seasons, joining 2007-08 (79.8 ppg.), 2008-09 (81.7 ppg.) and 2009-10 (80.2 ppg.).
- ▶ The new offense has so far increased the number of 3-pointers, as the team has already attempted 168 from beyond the arc, including 33 in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23), which ranked as the seventh-most in a game in school history. The Wildcats followed with 31 3-point attempts vs. Bellarmine (11/10/23), while hitting on double-digit makes (12) for the first time.
- ▶ In the win over South Dakota State (11/13/23), K-State knocked down 14 3-pointers, which tied for the fifth-most in school history and are the most since hitting 16 at Oklahoma State on Feb. 2, 2019.
- ▶ The Wildcats have connected on 56 3-pointers, which are the most through the first 6 games. The 26 combined 3-pointers in games vs. Bellarmine and South Dakota State were the most in back-to-back games since also making 26 in games at Oklahoma State and at home to Kansas on Feb. 2 and 5, 2019.
- ▶ The Wildcats rank third in the Big 12 in both 3-point field goals/game (9.3) and 3-point field goal attempts (28.0). The 168 3-point attempts are the second-most in the Big 12 behind BYU's 202. Senior **Tyler Perry** ranks among the top-40 nationally in three 3-point categories, including 17th in attempts (52), 21st in total makes (19) and 34th in makes/game (3.2).

MORE THAN JUST THE 3

- ▶ K-State has showed its offense is more than just the 3-pointer, as the team is averaging 54 points in the paint in the last 2 games, as they are connecting on 67.1 percent (57-of-85) from inside the 3-point line in that span, including 74.4 percent (29-of-39) in near comeback vs. No. 12/11 Miami (11/19/23).
- ▶ K-State scored 56 points in the paint against the Hurricanes, which tied for the most in a single game in school history (stat kept since 2000-01), and the most since scoring 56 against South Dakota on Jan. 3, 2010.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- ▶ K-State has posted a 175-55 (.762) record in non-conference play since the 2006-07 season. During that span, the Wildcats have a 132-14 (.901) mark at home venues (includes games played at Bramlage Coliseum, INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita and the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City) in non-conference play, including a 122-12 (.908) mark at Bramlage Coliseum.
 - ▶ K-State's 12-1 non-conference mark in 2022-23 was the best since the 2009-10 team went a program-best 13-1. The 12 wins last season matched the 2008-09 and 2010-11 teams for the second-most in that span.
- 1700 WINS AND COUNTING
- ▶ K-State's 96-87 overtime win over Nevada on Nov. 22, 2022 at the Cayman Islands Classic represented the 1,700th win in school history. The Wildcats are the 43rd Division I team to eclipse 1,700 wins, including the sixth Big 12 school.
 - ▶ The Wildcats have a 1,725-1,225 (.585) all-time record as a program, which includes 32 NCAA Tournament appearances and 21 conference championships. The 1,725 wins are the 42nd-most in NCAA history.

POINT OF EMPHASIS

- ▶ Ever since the loss to Florida Atlantic in the Elite Eight, in which, K-State was out-rebounded 44-22, rebounding has been a point of emphasis by head coach **Jerome Tang**. So far that message has been received, as the Wildcats rank second in the Big 12 and 29th nationally in rebounds/game (42.83), including first in the league and eighth nationally in offensive rebounds/game (16.33).
- ▶ K-State has been out-rebounded just once this season (44-39 to Providence), while posting an +8.50 rebounding margin.
- ▶ K-State posted its highest rebound total in more than 25 seasons in the win over Central Arkansas (11/22/23), corraling 63 rebounds, which were the most since totaling 64 vs. Kansas City on Dec. 3, 1997. Among those 63 boards were 26 on the offensive end, which they converted into 34 second-chance points. The 26 offensive rebounds were the most since grabbing 29 vs. North Florida on Nov. 18, 2012, while the 37 defensive rebounds were one shy of the top-10.

BETTER DEFENSIVE EFFORT

- ▶ K-State will need to continue to improve its defensive effort after allowing 442 points (73.7 ppg.) in the first 6 games on 42.6 percent shooting, including 32.4 percent (45-of-139) from 3-point range.
- ▶ The Wildcats currently rank last in the Big 12 in scoring defense (73.7 ppg.) and 13th field goal percentage defense (42.6), while they are 10th in 3-point field goal percentage defense (32.4). The team is also tied for 12th in turnover margin (-1.83) and 11th in assist/turnover ratio (1.09).
- ▶ K-State has shown the ability to be a good defensive team, holding South Dakota State (11/13/23) and Providence (11/17/23) to an average of 69 points on 38.3 percent (51-of-133) shooting, including 27.9 percent (12-of-43) from 3-point range. The Wildcats held Central Arkansas to just 56 points on 27.9 percent (19-of-68) shooting, including 17.9 percent (7-of-39) in the first half.
- ▶ In the overtime win over Providence (11/17/23), the defense matched and, at times, exceeded that of the Friars (which entered the game 17th nationally in field goal percentage defense), holding them to a season-low 35.3 percent (24-of-68) shooting, including 22.7 percent (5-of-22) from 3-point range.

NEEDING CONSISTENCY

- ▶ K-State has had trouble finding rhythm and consistency with key players out at various times. Freshman **Dai Dai Ames** missed the Miami game after he was suspended 1-game by the NCAA for his actions against Providence (11/17/23), while Kaluma missed the South Dakota State (11/13/23) game due to injury. The Wildcats are already playing without a pair of projected starters in seniors **Ques Glover** (injury) and **Nae'Qwan Tomlin** (suspension).

PERRY MORE THAN JUST A SCORER

► Senior **Taylor Perry** proved that he is more than just a scorer in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23) in Las Vegas, leading the team in assists (6) and steals (4) to go with 6 rebounds and his team-best 22 points. Currently, he is averaging 17 points, 5.0 assists, 4.8 rebounds and 1.2 steals in 34.1 minutes per game.

► The performance was the first in his Division I career that he posted 20 or more points, had 6 or more rebounds, 6 or more assists and 4 or more steals. Only once did he even accomplish three of those stats, as he had 23 points, 7 rebounds and 6 assists against Sam Houston in the 2023 NIT First Round.

► Perry missed his first 8 field goals, including his first 6 from 3-point range, before making his acrobatic 3-pointer at the halftime buzzer. The shot seemed to spark the fifth-year senior, as he finished the game making 5 of his last 9 field goals, including 4 of his last 6 3-point baskets.

► Perry's 22 points were the most by a Wildcat newcomer in a debut since **Michael Beasley** scored 32 points in his first game against Sacramento State on Nov. 9, 2007. In fact, Perry is the first Wildcat to post a 20-point game in a season opener since **Mike McGuire** had 22 points vs. Drake on Nov. 25, 2020.

► Perry has scored in double figures in 5 of the first 6 games, as his 14-game streak of double-digit scoring games ending 6 points vs. Central Arkansas (11/22/23). Among those 5 double-digit scoring games is a team-best three 20-point games, which includes 22 vs. USC (11/6/23) and South Dakota State (11/13/23) and a season-best 24 in the win over Providence (11/17/23).

► Perry ranks the Big 12's top 10 in six categories, including tops in 3-point field goals/game (3.2) and free throw percentage (96.9), third in assist/turnover ratio (3.0), fifth in scoring (17.0 ppg.) and minutes (34.2) and seventh in assists (5.0 apg.). He is 12th in 3-point field goal percentage (36.5).

► Perry recently eclipsed 2,000 career points in his college career, which includes stints at Coffeyville Community College (2019-21) and North Texas (2021-23). He currently has 1,145 points at the Division I level.

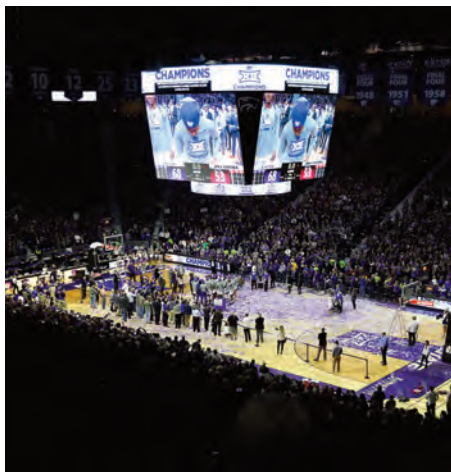
► Perry had at least 4 3-pointers in each of the first 3 games, while he had a season-high 6 treys against South Dakota State (11/13/23). He now has made at least 4 3-pointers in 26 career games at the Division I level, while he has 6 or made triples in 4 games (7 vs. San Jose State (11/25/22) and 6 at UAB (2/19/22), 6 vs. Sam Houston (3/19/23) and 6 vs. South Dakota State).

EXCELLING FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

► Senior **Taylor Perry** ranks among the best from the free throw line, hitting on 96.9 percent (31-of-32). He ranks 11th nationally and first in the Big 12. He has made 29 straight free throws dating back to the first half vs. USC (11/6/23).

► Among Perry's 24 points in the win over Providence (11/17/23) was a perfect 14-of-14 performance from the free throw line, which tied for the third-best in school history and the best since **Michael Beasley** went 15-of-15 from the line at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2008. Only Beasley and **Steve Henson**, who went a school-best 17-of-17 from the stripe at Iowa State on Feb. 24, 1988, have enjoyed a better performance from the free throw line.

■ HOME SWEET HOME // BRAMLAGE COLISEUM [1989-present]



► K-State has posted a 420-145 (.736) all-time record at Bramlage Coliseum since its opening during the 1988-89 season. The 420 wins are the most at a home venue for the Wildcats, surpassing the 378 wins at Ahearn Field House (1950-88). It is the school's third home venue.

► K-State finished the 2022-23 campaign with a 15-1 record at Bramlage Coliseum, which included an 8-1 mark vs. Big 12 foes. The 15 wins tied for the second-most in the arena's history and are the most since also winning 15 in 2013-14, while the 15-1 record is the best since going 16-1 in 2012-13.

► K-State has registered a 220-65 (.759) record at home over the past 18 seasons, including a 95-53 (.626) mark in Big 12 play. The 220 wins rank fourth among all Big 12 schools in that span, while the 95 league victories at home are among the tops in the Big 12.

► K-State has defeated 46 ranked opponents in the history of Bramlage Coliseum, including 43 ranked Big 12 foes. Four No. 1 teams have been knocked off in the arena's history, including No. 1 Missouri in 1990, No. 1 Texas in 2010, No. 1 Kansas in 2011 and No. 1 Oklahoma in 2016.

► Seating changes and construction has reduced capacity over the years to its current total of 11,010 for the 2023-24 season.

PLAYER NOTES

BUCKET GETTER

► Head coach **Jerome Tang** has said that he wants guard **Cam Carter** to be a bucket getter and that's what the junior has delivered in the first 6 games, averaging 16.5 points per game. He leads the Wildcats in field goals made (39) and attempts (93), while he is second to **Taylor Perry** in 3-point field goals (13).

► After recording his first 20-point game vs. South Dakota State (11/13/23) with a game-high 25 points on 10-of-20 field goals, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range, Carter took it to another level vs. No. 12/11 Miami (11/19/23).

► Carter scored a career-best 28 points vs. the Hurricanes, including 24 in the second half when the Wildcats cut a 24-point deficit to just 7 points in the last 45 seconds. He finished the game 12-of-22 from the field (10-of-16 in the second half) with 5 rebounds, 4 assists, 2 steals and a block in 38 minutes.

► In addition to scoring in double figures in 4 games, Carter leads the team and ranks fourth in the Big 12 in steals/game (2.50). He has had at least 2 steals in 5 games, including a career-best 4 twice (vs. Bellarmine and Providence).

► Carter also ranks seventh in both scoring (16.5 ppg.) and minutes (33.1) in the Big 12, 11th in 3-point field goals made/game (2.17) and 12th in 3-point field goal percentage (31.0).

► Carter has now scored in double figures in 14 games, including 12 times as a Wildcat. Seven of those double-digit totals have come in the last 15 games.

STARTING TO FIND A RHYTHM

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** is starting to find a rhythm after a slow start to the season, becoming a double-double threat nearly every night. He has scored in double figures in 4 consecutive games, averaging 17 points on 50 percent shooting (24-of-48) to go with 8.5 rebounds per game.

► Kaluma was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament Team after averaging 18.0 points on 52.2 percent (12-of-23) shooting with 9.5 rebounds. After scoring 18 in the OT win over Providence, including a pivotal 3-pointer, he had his first double-double as a Wildcat and fourth in his career with 18 points and 12 rebounds vs. 12/11 Miami.

► Kaluma scored a season-high 20 points vs. Central Arkansas (11/22/23), hitting on 7-of-11 attempts, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range, to go with 8 rebounds and 3 assists in just under 24 minutes.

► Kaluma ranks fourth in the Big 12 in rebounding at 8.6 per game, while he is fifth in defensive rebounds (5.80), eighth in offensive rebounds (2.80), 11th in minutes (32.3) and 15th in scoring (14.8 ppg).

MASTER OF THE BOARDS

► Senior **David N'Guessan** has been impressive so far on the glass, ranking sixth in the Big 12 in rebounding at 8.3 boards per game. He ranks third in the league in offensive rebounds (3.5 orgp.), while he is 11th in defensive rebounds (4.83 drpg.). He has double-digit rebounds in 3 of his first 6 games, while he twice has tied his career-high with 11 rebounds.

► N'Guessan grabbed his first career double-double in the opener vs. No. 21/22 USC (11/6/23), as he scored 10 points on 5-of-8 field goals to go with a then career-best 10 rebounds in just over 27 minutes.

► N'Guessan broke his career-high with 11 rebounds vs. South Dakota State (11/13/23) then matched it in the win over Central Arkansas (11/22/23) while collecting his second double-double with a season-high 11 points.

► N'Guessan gained valuable experience this past summer training with the Dutch National Team, as the Orange Lions competed in the FIBA Olympic Pre-Qualifying Tournament in Istanbul, Türkiye August 13-16. He averaged 9 points on 55.6 percent shooting with 6.3 rebounds in the 3-game tournament.

BIG MAN OFF TO SOLID START

► Senior **Will McNair** is off to solid start to the season, averaging 7.3 points on 66.7 percent shooting to go along with 4.2 rebounds through the first 6 games in 17.4 minutes per game.

► McNair scored 8 points vs. USC (11/6/23) in the opener then has earned starts in each of the last 5 games. He has double figures in 2 of those 5 starts, including 10 points each vs. South Dakota State and Providence.

FRESHMEN SHOWING PROMISE

► Three-man freshman class of **Dai Dai Ames**, **R.J. Jones** and **Macaleab Rich** have all shown promise after being pressed into early action. The trio were part of a consensus top-35 recruiting class.

► Ames has already scored in double figures in 3 games, including a season-best 14 points vs. Central Arkansas (11/22/23), while he has dished out at least 3 assists in his 5 games played with a season-high 7 vs. South Dakota State.

► Jones is the only freshman to play in all 6 games, averaging 14 minutes per game. He ranks third on the team in 3-pointers (9), scoring in 5 of 6 games with a season-best 14 points vs. South Dakota State (11/13/23).

► Rich, whose dunk against Central Arkansas made the Sportcenter Top 10, has wowed fans with his potential, logging a near double-double vs. the Bears with a season-best 13 points and 8 rebounds in under 18 minutes.

KALUMA, PERRY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** and fifth-year senior **Taylor Perry** were each chosen as Honorable Mention selections to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team by the league coaches when the league office announced its annual preseason teams.

► Kaluma and Perry are the first Wildcats named to the Preseason All-Big 12 since **Barry Brown Jr.** and **Dean Wade** in 2018-19.

KALUMA NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LIST FOR JULIUS ERVING AWARD

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** was one of 20 players named to the preseason Watch List for the 2024 Julius Erving Award, which annually recognizes the nation's top small forward. He was named to the Watch List for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award in 2022-23 while playing at Creighton.

► Although not named to the preseason team, current Oklahoma City Thunder and former Wildcat **Keyontae Johnson** was selected as a finalist for the Julius Erving Award in 2022-23, which was won by Alabama's **Brandon Miller**.

K-STATE SIGNS DAVID CASTILLO

► K-State head coach **Jerome Tang** said he came to 'elevate' the program and he continued that process on Wednesday (Nov. 8) with the signing of consensus top-50 high school prospect **David Castillo** (Bartlesville, Okla./Sunrise Christian Academy [Kan.]) to a National Letter of Intent.

► Castillo is rated among the top 50 players nationally by three of the four recruiting services, including No. 42 by *Rivals*, No. 45 by 247Sports and No. 50 by ESPN, while is among the top-10 point guards, including No. 7 by 247Sports, No. 8 by *Rivals* and No. 9 by On3.

► A native of Bartlesville, Okla., Castillo played 3 years at Bartlesville High School before transferring to prep powerhouse Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan., for his senior season in 2023-24. Playing for K-State alum **Clent Stewart**, he left Bartlesville as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,594 points, averaging 23.7 points per game in his 67-game career. He was twice named to the *Tulsa World* All-State Team (2022, 2023) and was a finalist for the *World's* 2023 State Player of the Year.

► In addition to his prep accolades, Castillo has led Team USA to a pair of gold medals, including the 2021 FIBA Americas U16 Championship (14 points vs. Argentina in the gold-medal game) and 2022 FIBA U17 World Cup (12 points vs. Spain in gold-medal game). He was also invited to the 2023 Team USA Junior National Team minicamp but could not play due to a foot injury.

COACH OF THE YEAR

Jerome Tang, who was selected as the 2023 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year after guiding the Wildcats to a 26-win season and its 13th trip to the Elite Eight in his inaugural season, is in his second season as the 25th head men's basketball head coach at Kansas State in 2023-24.

Tang is just third coach in the program's history to be selected National Coach of the Year, joining **Fred "Tex" Winter** (UPI) in 1958 and **Jack Hartman** (NABC) in 1980, while he is the fourth head coach from a Big 12 institution to earn the honor from the Naismith Trophy. He was a candidate for nearly every other National Coach of the Year honor in 2022-23, including finishing as the runner-up for The Associated Press award. In addition, he was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year, earning the honor from both the league coaches and the AP.

With his relentless passion, energy and positivity, Tang reenergized a K-State program which had endured three consecutive losing seasons and was picked last in the preseason Big 12 poll by guiding the school to its third-highest win total (26) and a thrilling run to the Elite Eight in 2022-23. He became the 11th first-year head coach to direct his team to the Elite Eight since 1996-97, while joining North Carolina's **Bill Guthridge** (K-State alum) in 1997-98 and **Hubert Davis** in 2021-22 and Kent State's **Stan Heath** in 2001-02 as one of four first-time head coaches to accomplish the feat. Tang's win total was the second-most by a first-year Division I head coach in 2022-23.

Armed with just two returning players, the Wildcats posted a 26-10 overall record in Tang's inaugural season, which included a tie for third place in the nation's most difficult conference – the Big 12 – with an 11-7 mark and the school's 13th appearance in the Elite Eight and the first since 2017-18. The 26 wins are the third-most in school history, trailing the school-record 29 in 2009-10 and the 27 in 2012-13, and just the eighth 25-win campaign. His 26 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach in school history.

During the team's historic season, Tang coached a pair of All-Americans in 2023 Bob Cousy Award winner **Markquis Nowell** and forward **Keyontae Johnson**, who became the first duo in school history to each earn the recognition from The Associated Press when they were selected to the Third Team. Both players were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Johnson was the league's Newcomer of the Year. Nowell was selected as the winner of Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame after he finished second nationally in assists/game (8.3 apg.), total assists (297) and total steals (92) while ranking in the top-15 in four others. He was chosen the East Regional Most Outstanding Player after guiding the Wildcats to the Elite Eight, averaging 23.5 points, 13.5 assists and 4.0 steals in his 4-game NCAA Tournament run, which included a tournament and school-record 19-assist performance in the win over Michigan State on March 23. Nowell was also named a Third Team All-American by *The Sporting News*, NABC and U.S. Basketball Writers Association.

Following the season, Johnson became the first Wildcat under Tang and the first since 2017 to be selected in the NBA Draft, as he was taken in the second round with the 50th pick by the Oklahoma City Thunder. He is the 13th draft pick developed by Tang, which includes 11 at Baylor and one at Heritage Christian Academy (**Von Wafer**). In addition, Nowell signed a 2-way contract with the Toronto Raptors on draft night.

The 2022-23 Wildcats set three school single-season records, including the mark for assists (611), while finishing No. 2 in points (2,742), field goals made (961), 3-point field goals made (258), free throw percentage (74.8) and steals (289) in school history. The 46.1 field goal percentage tied for the seventh-best in the shot clock era and the best since 2017-18. Nowell crushed the single-season marks for assists (297) and steals (92) while he and Johnson became just the second duo in school history to each tally 600 or more points in a single season.

Tang helped reestablish the "Octagon of Doom" as one of the toughest places to play in college basketball, as the Wildcats played before eight sellouts while posting a 15-1 record at home with 5 wins over Top 25 opponents, including No. 2/2 Kansas, No. 9/10 Baylor, No. 17/19 TCU, No. 19/18 Iowa State and No. 24/24 West Virginia. The 15 wins were the most in nearly a decade (2014-15) and tied for the second-most in the arena's 35-year history. The eight sellouts were the most since 2014-15, while the team ranked 23rd nationally in percentage capacity at 87.57 percent in the newly configured 11,000-seat arena.

Tang and his coaching staff capitalized on this new excitement, attracting a 3-man freshman class of **Darrin "Dai Dai" Ames Jr.**, **R.J. Jones** and **Macaleab Rich** for the 2023-24 season that was a consensus top-30 recruiting class, including 22nd by ESPN and 247Sports. All three were ranked in the prestigious Rivals150, while Ames and Jones were both selected to the ESPN 100.

Tang came to K-State in 2022 after helping build Baylor into a national power in his 19 seasons (2003-22) as an assistant and associate head coach.

Starting with the 2007-08 season, Tang was pivotal in helping Baylor to a stretch of 15 consecutive seasons of at least 18 wins, including a school-record 30 in 2011-12, en route to a 361-153 (.702) overall record and 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Since 2010, the Bears have appeared in the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 five times (2010, 2012, 2014, 2017, 2021), three times advancing to the Elite Eight (2010, 2012, 2021) and once to the Final Four (2021).

In his last three seasons (2019-22) at Baylor, Tang helped the Bears tally an 81-13 (.862) record, including a 43-8 (.843) mark in Big 12 play, with 22 wins over ranked opponents highlighted by the Bears' first National Championship in 2021, as they defeated No. 1 ranked Gonzaga, 86-70, in the national title game. The 2021 Bears also won their first Big 12 Championship in the league's 25-year history, which was the school's first conference title in 71 years, then followed it up with a second-straight crown in 2022 by winning their last five Big 12 games. Baylor's 55-9 (.859) record over the 2020-21 and 2021-22 season was the best among power conference teams.

Despite a season mired by injuries to key players, Tang helped Baylor navigate a successful 2021-22 season that ended in a heartbreaking 93-86 overtime loss to North Carolina in the NCAA Tournament. Down 25 points with 10 minutes left, the Bears rallied to force overtime before faltering late, 93-86, to finish the season with a 27-7 record, including a tie for first place in the Big 12 with a 14-4 mark. The team ran their winning streak to 21 games, including 15 straight to start the year, ascending to the No. 1 ranking for five consecutive weeks.

Baylor lost just twice during its historic national championship season in 2020-21, posting a 28-2 record and a 14-1 mark in Big 12 play which included school-record 11 wins against ranked foes. The Bears enjoyed the best start in program history with an 18-game winning streak, which was the fourth-longest streak in Big 12 history. A school-record 3 Bears earned All-America honors, including **Jared Butler** becoming the first consensus First Team selection.

Tang helped Baylor to what was then the best season in program history in 2019-20, as the Bears spent five consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 nationally en route to posting a 26-4 record, including a 15-3 mark in league play. The team set a Big 12 record with 23 straight wins and were projected to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tang was part of the Baylor rebuild from the beginning, as he assisted Drew in guiding a Bear program that was crippled by NCAA sanctions into one that has advanced to the postseason 13 times in the last 14 seasons, including a current streak of 11 consecutive seasons, and 15 straight winning seasons.

After going 36-69 in their first four seasons, Tang and the Bears were rewarded with their first NCAA Tournament berth in 20 seasons and just their second at the school since 1950 in 2007-08. The team lost to No. 18 Purdue in the first round to conclude the year with a 21-11 record, including 9-7 in Big 12 play, as **Curtis Jerrells** became the first All-Big 12 First Team selection since 2001.

Baylor posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, as the 2008-09 team advanced to its first Big 12 Championship game before finishing as the runner-up in the NIT. The Bears then made another significant step with two Elite Eight runs in a 3-year period, including the first in the modern era in 2009-10 and to cap a school-record 30-win season in 2011-12.

Tang played a major role in leading Baylor to 23 wins and the program's first national tournament championship in 2012-13 when the Bears went on a 5-game run to the NIT title. The team then ran off a string of 4 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including Sweet 16 runs in 2013-14 and 2016-17.

Prior to Baylor, Tang built a powerhouse at Heritage Christian Academy, a birth-through-high school private school in Cleveland, Texas, as the head coach and athletic director, guiding the Eagles to 4 TAPPS Division A state championships (1995, 1999, 2000, 2001) from 1993 to 2003. His program gained national attention in 2001 when **Cedrick Hensley** scored 101 points in a game. Tang's most-publicized recruit – **Vakeaton "Von" Wafer** – became a McDonald's All-American before playing at FSU and being drafted by the L.A. Lakers in 2005.

Tang earned a bachelor's degree from Charter Oak State College in 2007. He was born in San Fernando, Trinidad. He migrated with his parents (**Paul & Bano Tang**) to St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands until age 10 when his family moved to Texas. He and his wife, **Careylyen (Rey)** have a son, **Seven**, and a daughter, **Aylyn**. He also has adopted sons (**Lamar** and **Richard Hurd**).

► K-State got big performances from senior **Tylor Perry** and junior **Arthur Kaluma**, as the Wildcats used a gritty effort to outlast Providence, 73-70, in overtime in the semifinals of the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship on Nov. 17 before raucous crowd of 1,833 fans at the Baha Mar Convention Center.

► Perry scored a game-high and season-best 24 points to pace four Wildcats in double figures, while Kaluma added a season-high 18 points on 6-of-10 field goals, including 3-of-4 from beyond the arc, to go with 7 rebounds. Senior **Will McNair Jr.** and freshman **Dai Dai Ames** each chipped in 10 points.

► Among Perry's 24 points was a perfect 14-of-14 performance from the free throw line, which tied for the third-best in school history and the best since **Michael Beasley** went 15-of-15 from the line at Baylor on Feb. 23, 2008.

► In addition to those efforts, senior **David N'Guessan** scored all 6 of his points in overtime on perfect 3-of-3 shooting to go with 6 rebounds, while junior **Cam Carter** tied a career-high with 8 rebounds to go with a game-high 4 steals.

► K-State showed it could grind out a game against a stellar defensive team, hitting timely shots and taking advantage of its opportunities at the free throw line, where the Wildcats converted on 85.2 percent (23-of-27).

► The teams entered overtime tied at 57-all after neither team hit a field goal in the last 3 minutes. Perry started the extra period by making 3 straight free throws after being fouled on a 3-pointer then N'Guessan followed with a layup off a feed from Perry to help the Wildcats score the first 5 points.

► After Providence (3-1) closed to within 62-61 on a pair of free throws and a layup, Kaluma knocked down his biggest shot of the night on a 3-pointer on an assist from Ames with 2:18 remaining. The Wildcats then back-to-back layups from N'Guessan to push ahead 69-63 with 47.5 seconds left. Perry and Ames both went 2-of-2 from the line to close it out in the last 26 seconds.

► K-State ended the night shooting 36.8 percent (21-of-57) from the field, including 36.4 percent (8-of-22) from 3-point range. However, in the extra session, the Wildcats made 4 of their 5 field goals, including Kaluma's 3-pointer, and made 7 of 9 from the free throw line.

► The defense matched and, at times, exceeded that of Providence's stellar effort, holding the Friars to a season-low 35.3 percent (24-of-68) shooting, including 22.7 percent (5-of-22) from 3-point range.

► Junior guard **Cam Carter** scored 24 of his game-tying and career-best 28 points in the second half, as the Wildcats (3-2) couldn't rally from a 24-point deficit despite their best efforts. Junior **Arthur Kaluma** registered his fourth career double-double and first as a Wildcat with 18 points and game-high 12 rebounds. Seniors **David N'Guessan** and **Tylor Perry** added 10 points each.

► For his efforts, Kaluma was named to the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship All-Tournament after averaging 18.5 points and 9.5 rebounds.

► Down by as many as 24 points in the second half, including 66-43 with just over 10 minutes to play, K-State made a furious rally, outscoring Miami, 35-19, to close to within 85-78 with 45 seconds remaining. Carter scored all 24 of his second-half points during this stretch to keep the Wildcats in it until the end. The Hurricanes made all six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.

► Miami (5-0) showed why it's among the best shooting teams in the country, scoring its 91 points on 53.3 percent (32-of-60) shooting from the field, including 50 percent (12-of-24) from 3-point range. The Hurricanes connected on 58.1 percent (18-of-31) in the first half, including 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from long range, in building a 19-point halftime advantage.

► Three-point shooting was a huge storyline, as Miami knocked down 12 3-pointers on 50 percent shooting, while K-State made just 4 of 28 attempts (14.3 percent) from beyond the arc. It was the lowest 3-point field goal percentage by the Wildcats since shooting 13.6 percent vs. Arkansas in 2021.

► Despite its poor shooting from long range, K-State still connected on nearly 50 percent from the field for the game, hitting on 49.3 percent (33-of-67) from the field, including 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from inside the arc. The Wildcats shot 56.8 percent (21-of-37) in the second half. The team scored 56 points in the paint, which tied for the most since the stat began being kept in 2000-01.

► The Wildcats played without freshman guard **Dai Dai Ames**, who was suspended by the NCAA for his ejection against Providence.

► K-State broke the 100-point barrier at home for the first time since 2010, as the Wildcats saw four players score in double figures in a 100-56 win over Central Arkansas on Nov. 22 before a crowd of 8,980 fans at Bramlage Coliseum.

► K-State (4-2) scored 100 points in a game for the 40th time in school history, including the first time at home in nearly 13 years since a 100-76 win over North Florida on Dec. 31, 2010. It marked the second time hitting the 100-point mark under head coach **Jerome Tang** and the first since scoring a school-record 116 points at No. 6/6 Texas on Jan. 3, 2023.

► On a night where no Wildcat player saw more than 26 minutes of action and 11 available players saw action, K-State remained unbeaten at home behind an all-around performance. The Wildcats connected on 50.7 percent (38-of-75) from the field, which included 10 3-point field goals and 52 points in the paint, while the defense held the Bears (1-5) to 27.9 percent (19-of-68) shooting.

► The Wildcats grabbed 63 rebounds, including 26 on the offensive end which they converted into 34 second-chance points. It was the most rebounds in a game in more than 25 seasons since the team had 64 vs. Kansas City on Dec. 3, 1997. Seven players had at least 4 rebounds in the game.

► Junior **Arthur Kaluma** led four players in double figures with a season-high 20 points, connecting on 7-of-11 field goals, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range. Freshmen **Dai Dai Ames** and **Macaleb Rich** also hit double digits with 14 and 13 points, respectively, while senior **David N'Guessan** collected his second double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

► K-State scored 10 of the first 11 points, holding Central Arkansas without a field goal for the first 5 minutes, then extended its lead to more than 20 points on a 16-2 run less 8 minutes into the game. The lead hit 30 points early in the second half and grew to as much as 45 in the waning minutes.

► The 100-point plateau grew closer after an alley-oop dunk by redshirt **Taj Manning** – his first career points – gave K-State a 91-51 lead with 3:45 to play. Redshirt freshman **Dorian Finister** knocked down the Wildcats' 10th 3-pointer of the night on the next play and was followed by free throws by sophomore **Jerrell Colbert** and freshman **R.J. Jones**. Rich's layup with 1:16 to play were the last of the night and enough to eclipse the 100-point mark.
